and described.**DESCRIPTION**FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a reflector lamp
showing our new design;FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof, the bottom being a
mirror image;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view thereof, the opposite
side being a mirror image;

FIG. 5 is a front perspective view thereof; and,

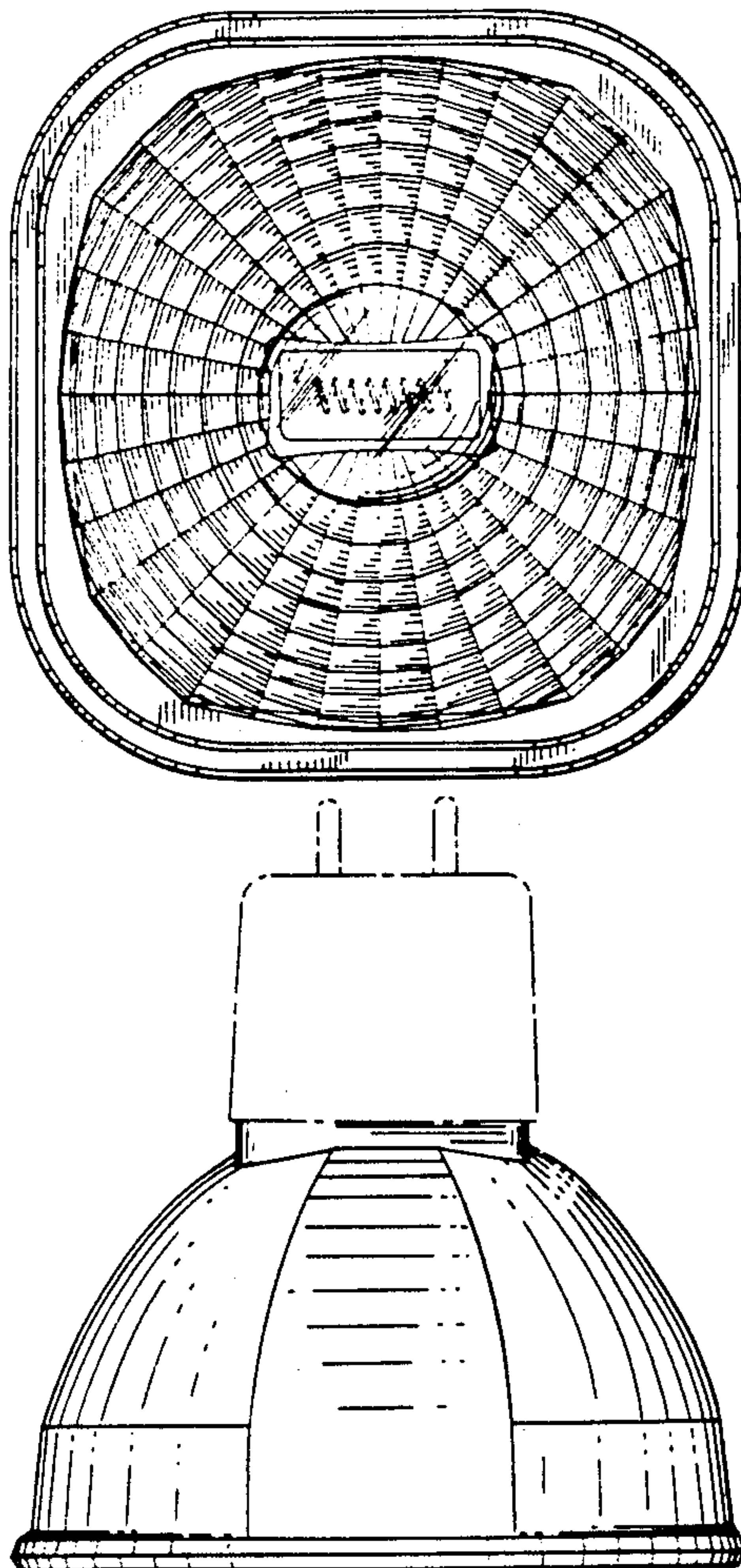
FIG. 6 is a front perspective view of a second embodi-
ment of our new design.The second embodiment differs from the first only in
that the front of the reflector is closed by a glass cover,
the front of the first embodiment being open. The base
of the lamp is shown in broken lines in both embodi-
ments for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of
the claimed design.

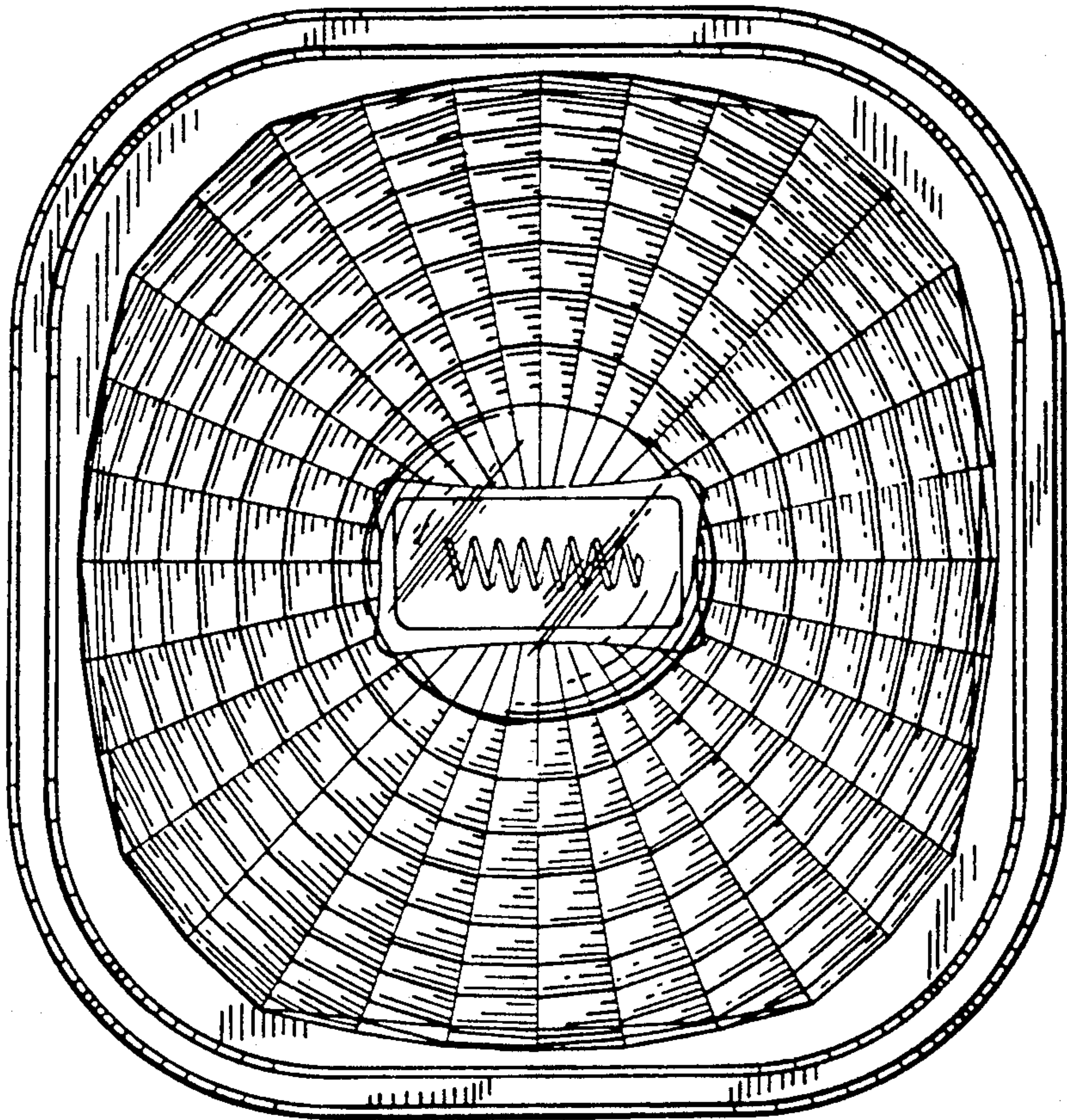

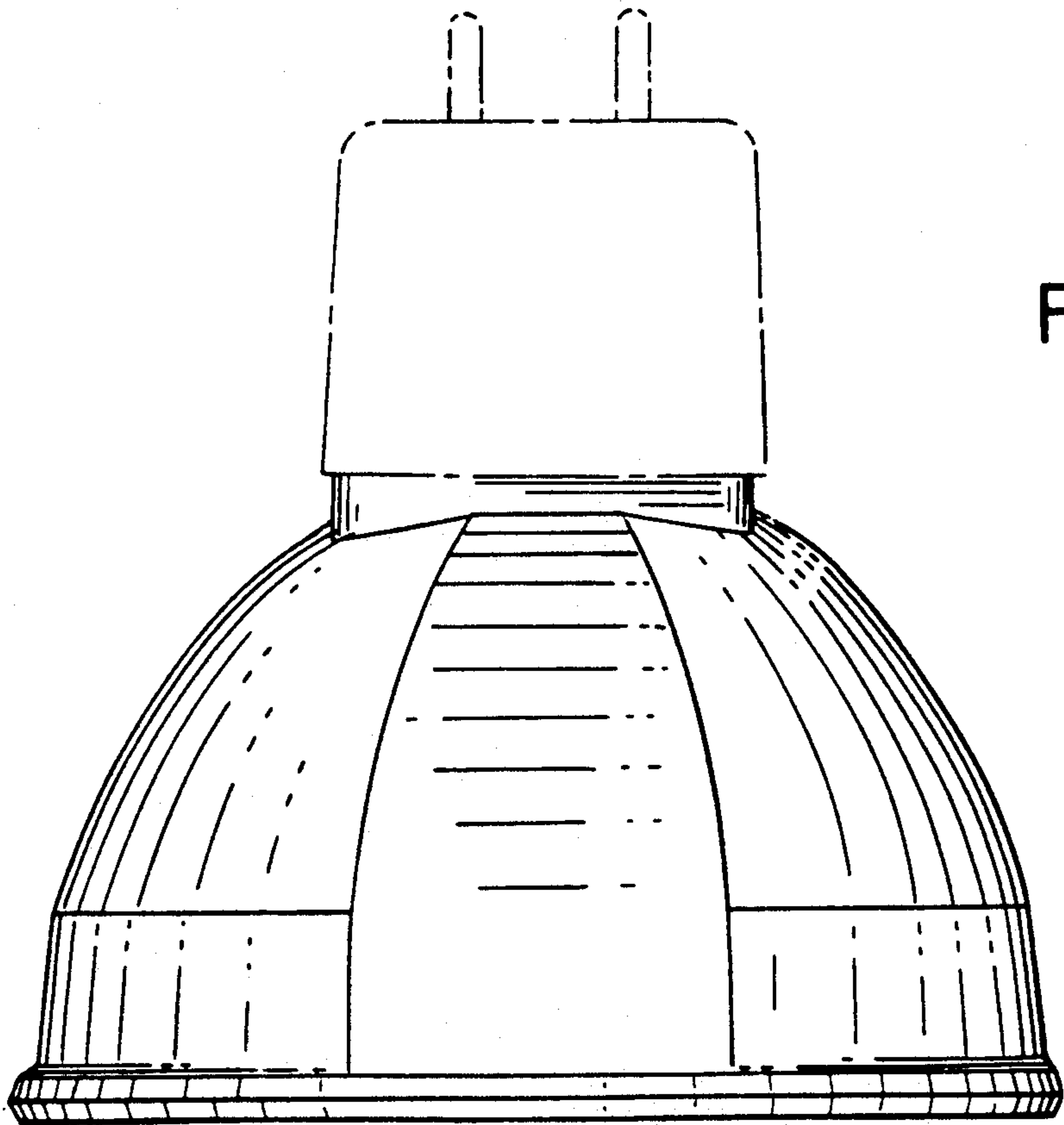

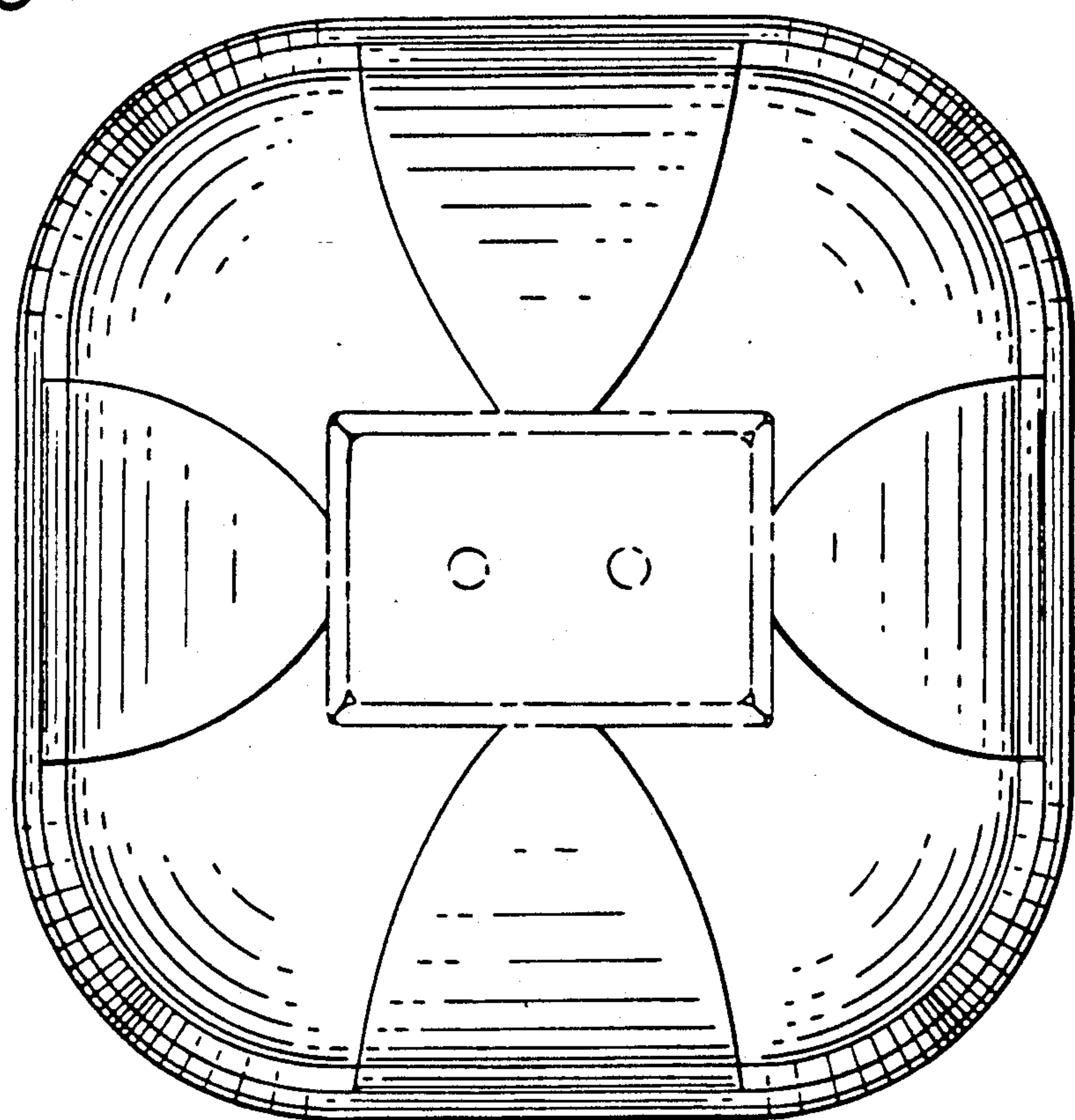

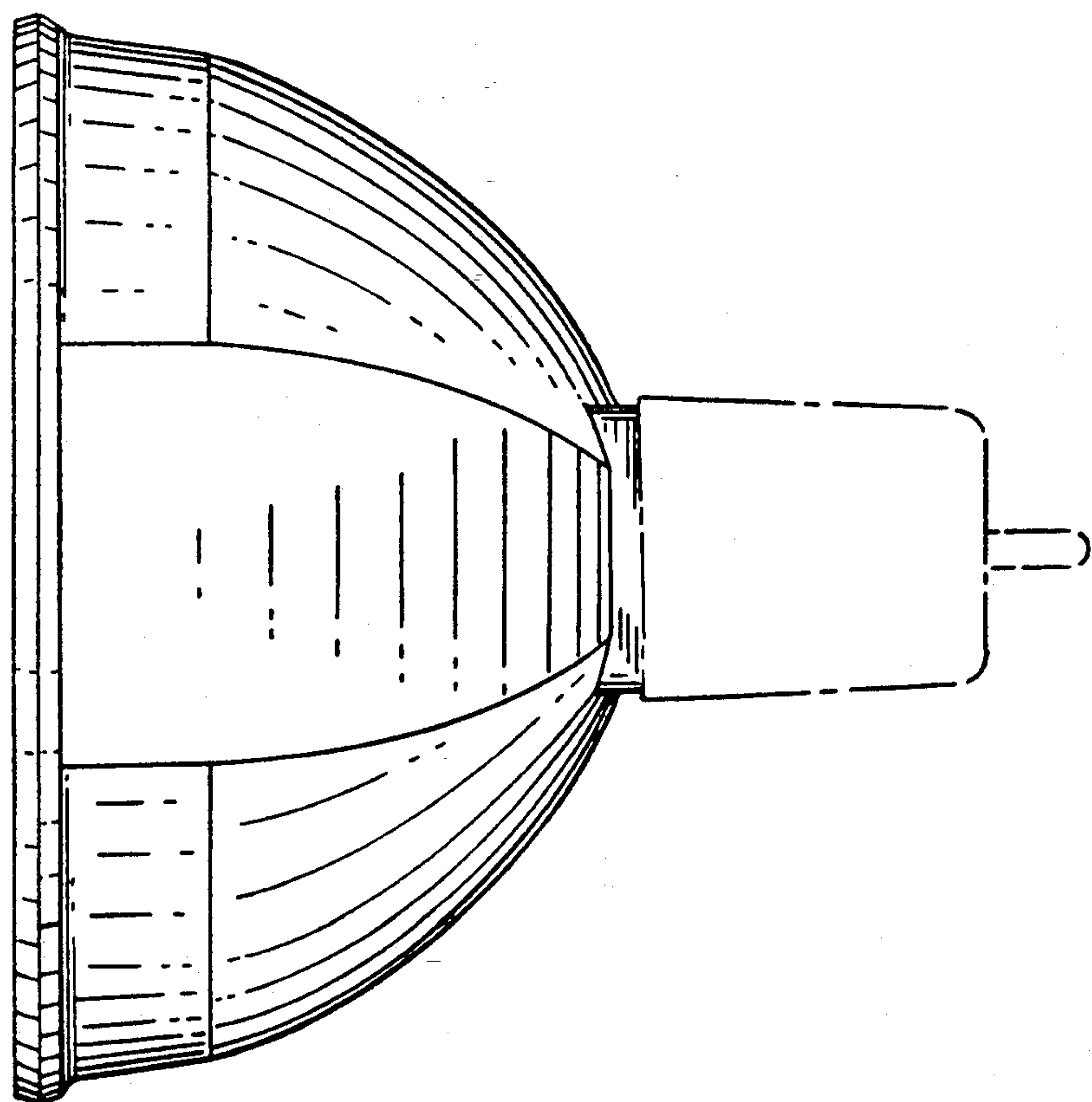

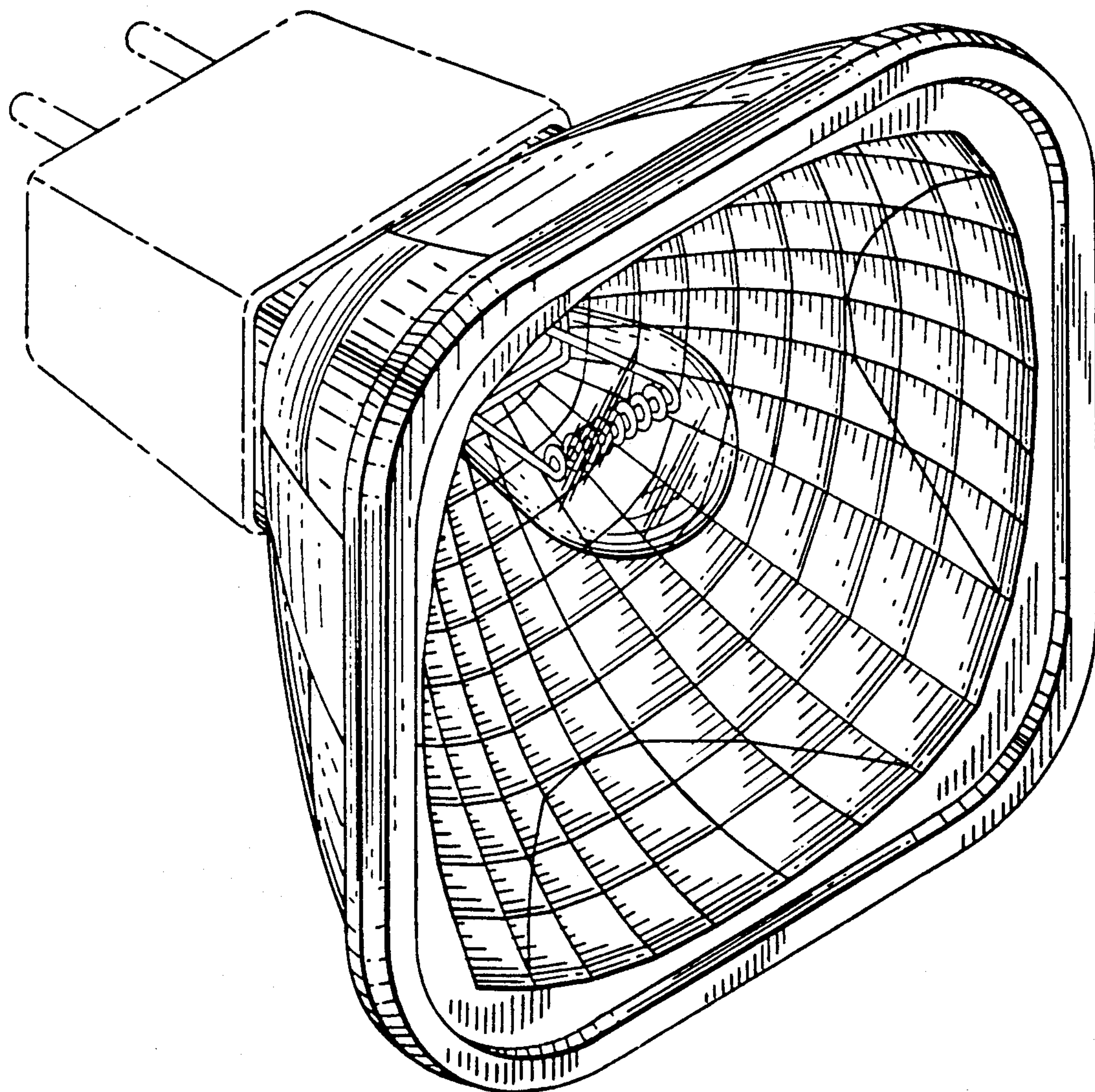
