## DESCRIPTION

FIG. 11 is a rear elevation thereof;

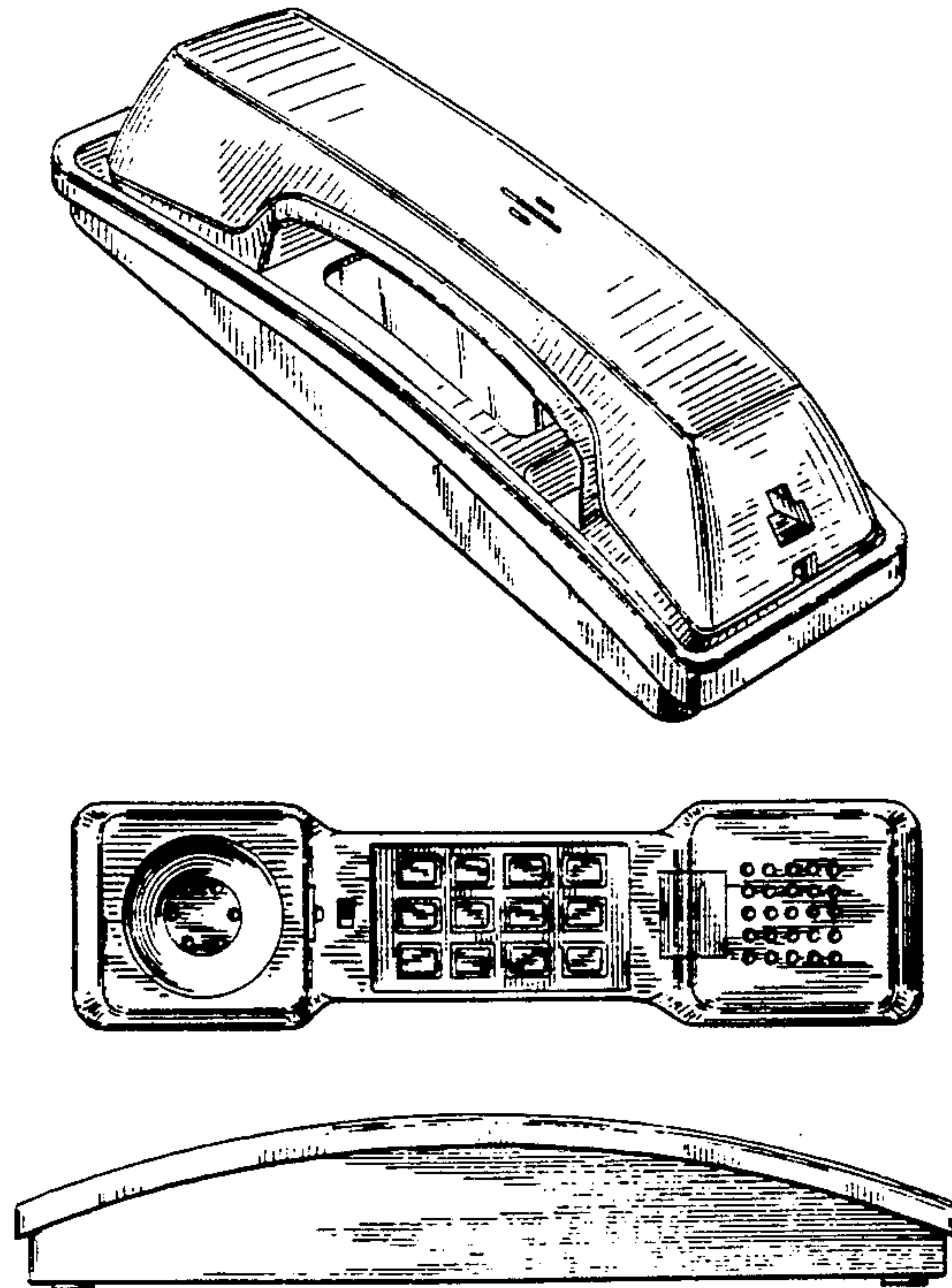
FIG. 12 is a perspective view of a telephone base unit, showing our new design;

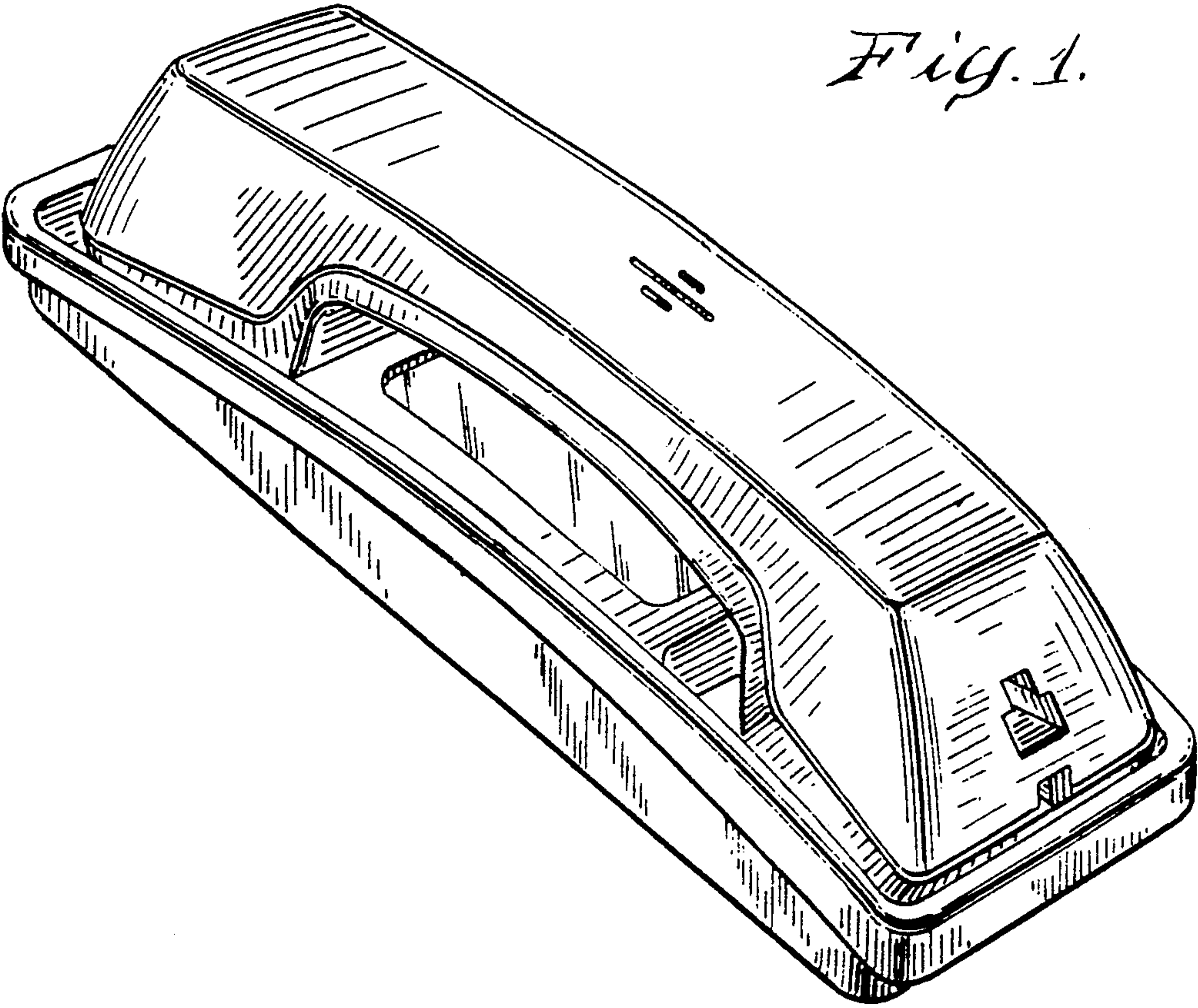
FIG. 13 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 15 is a front elevation thereof; and,

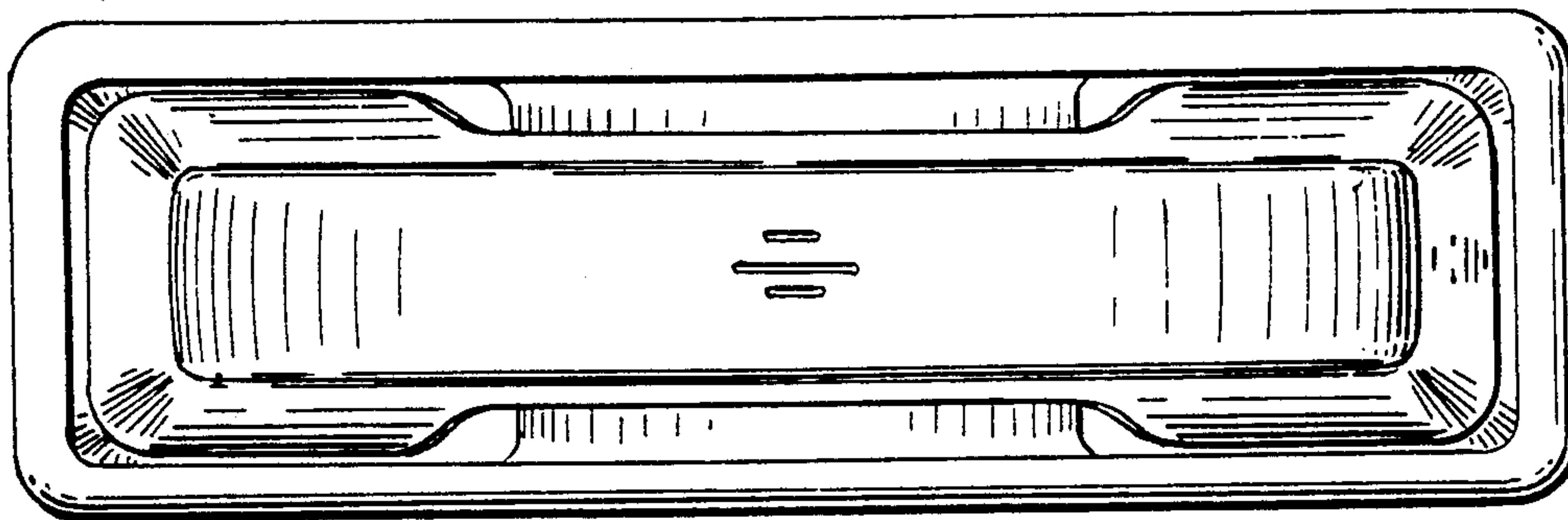
FIG. 16 is a rear elevation thereof.



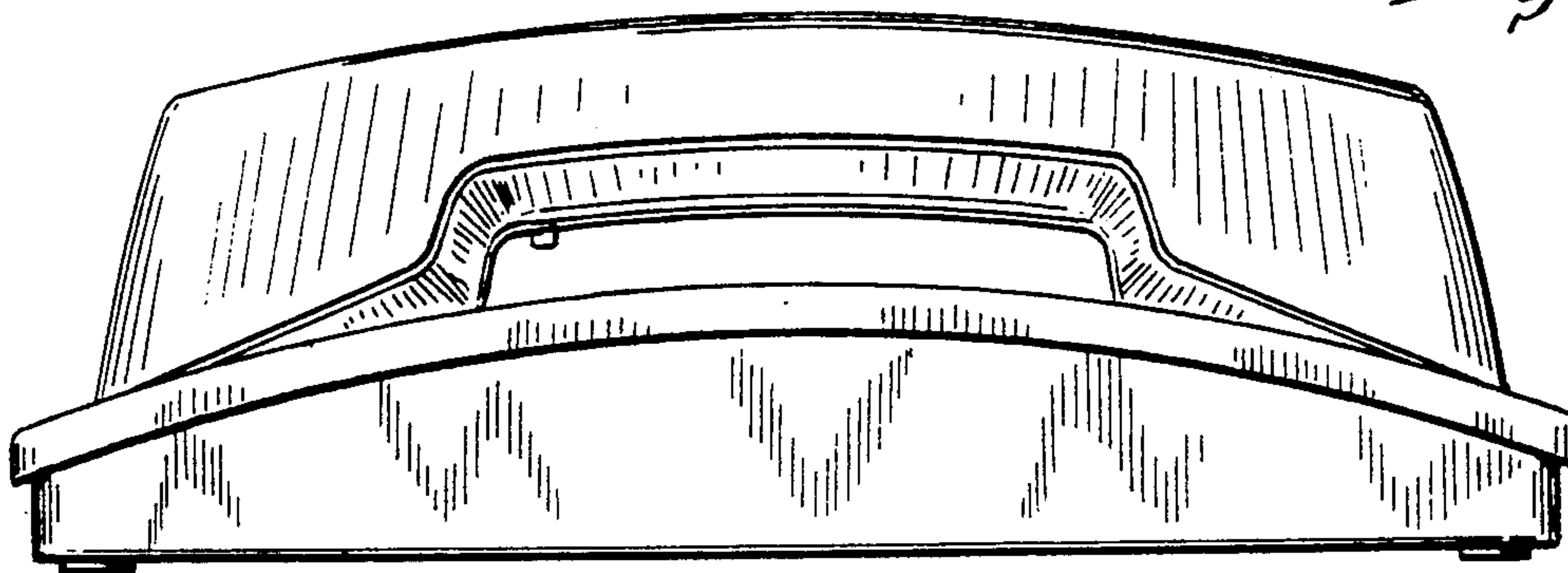

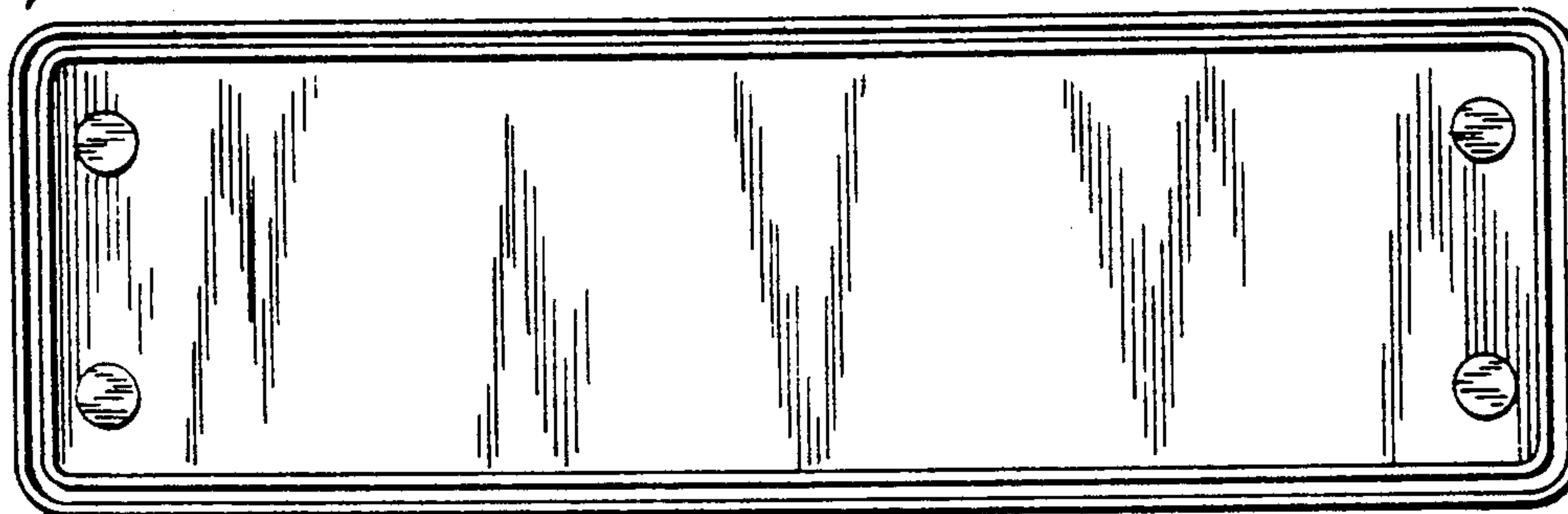

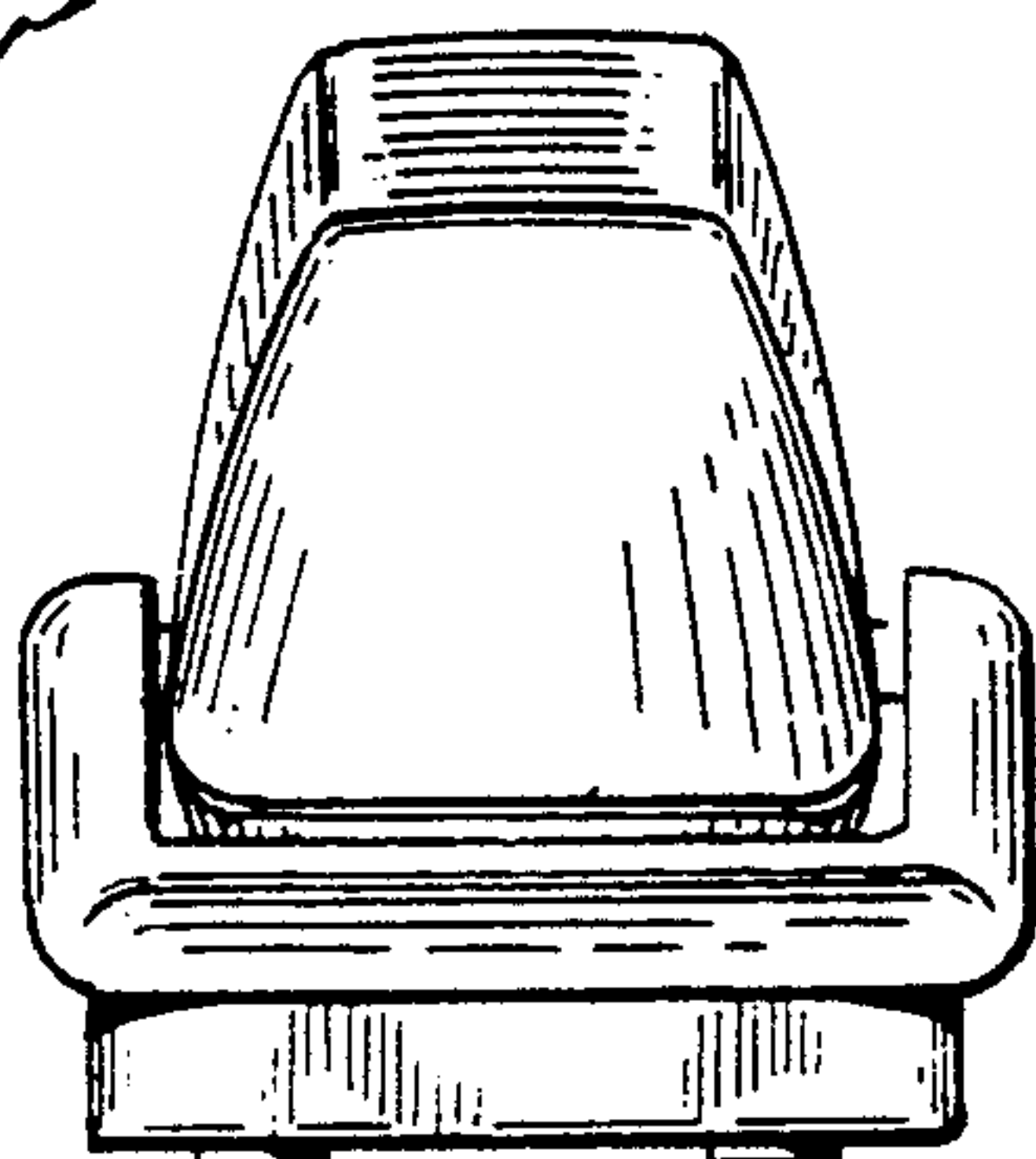

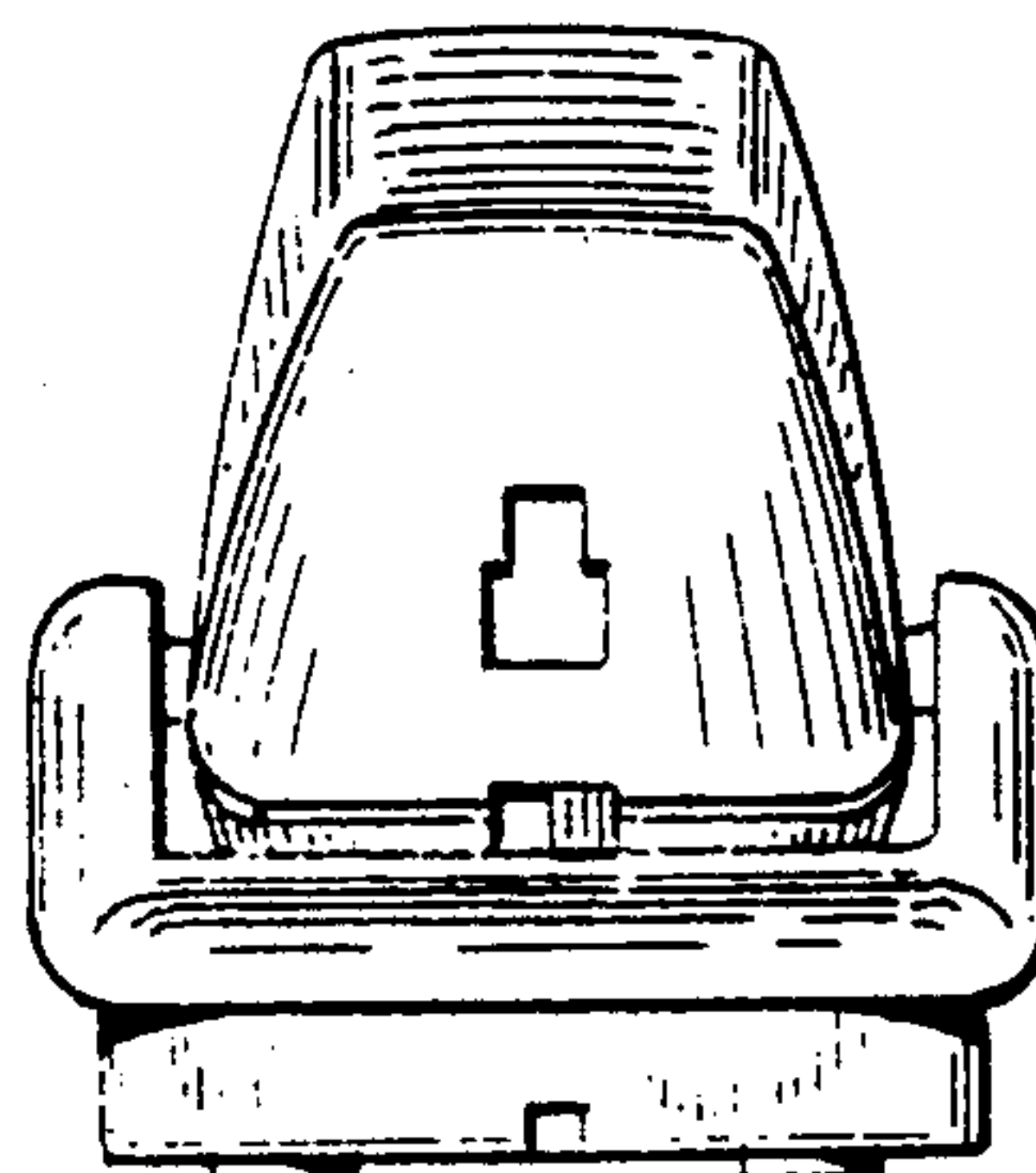

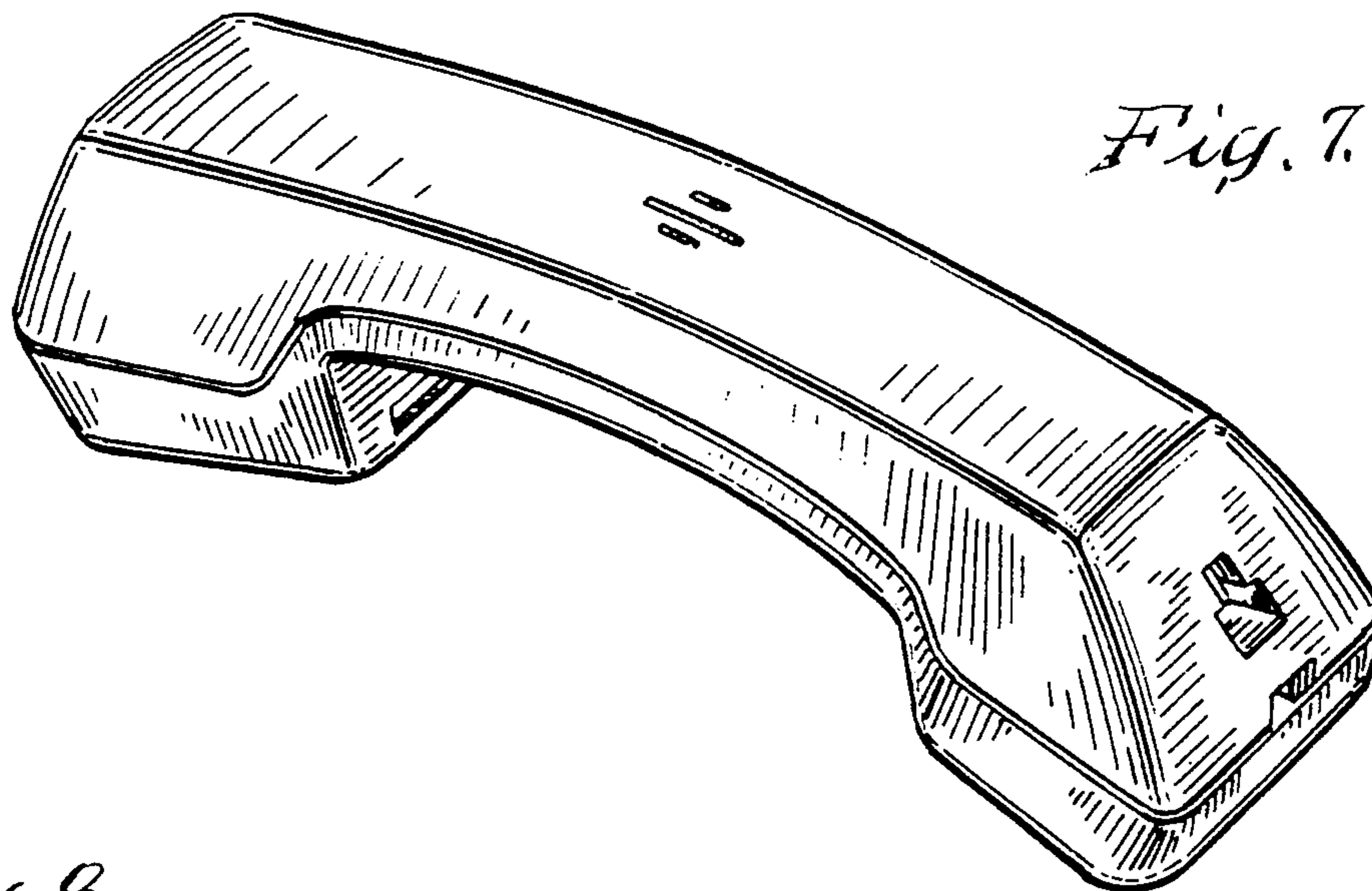

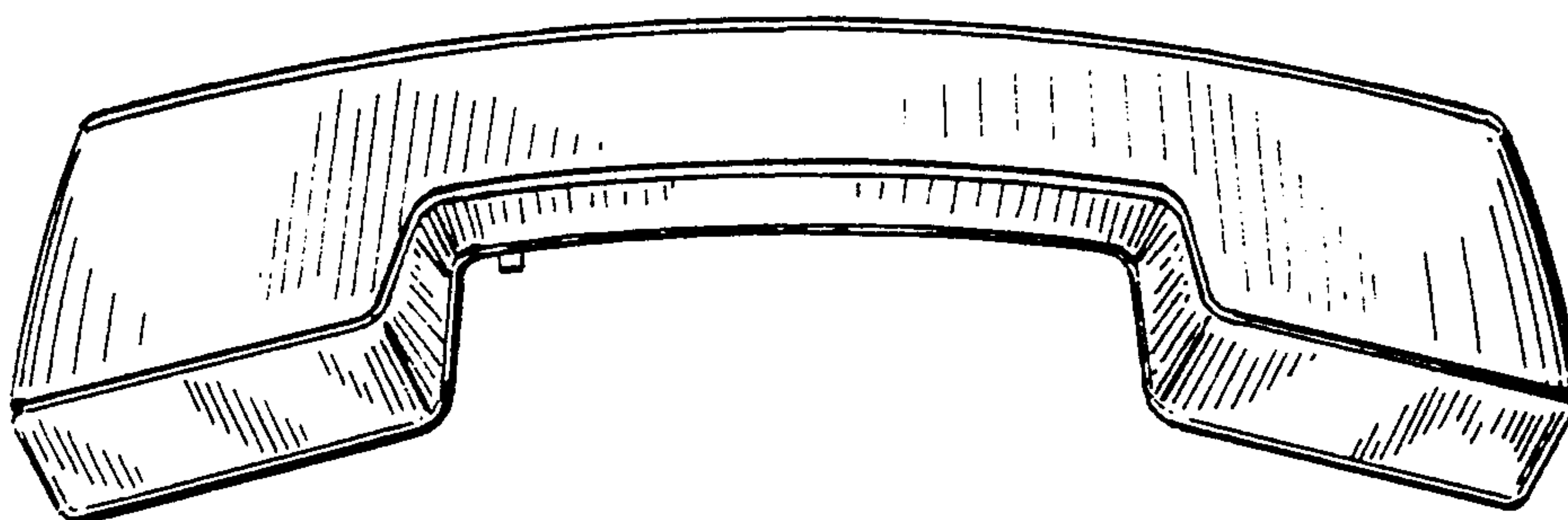

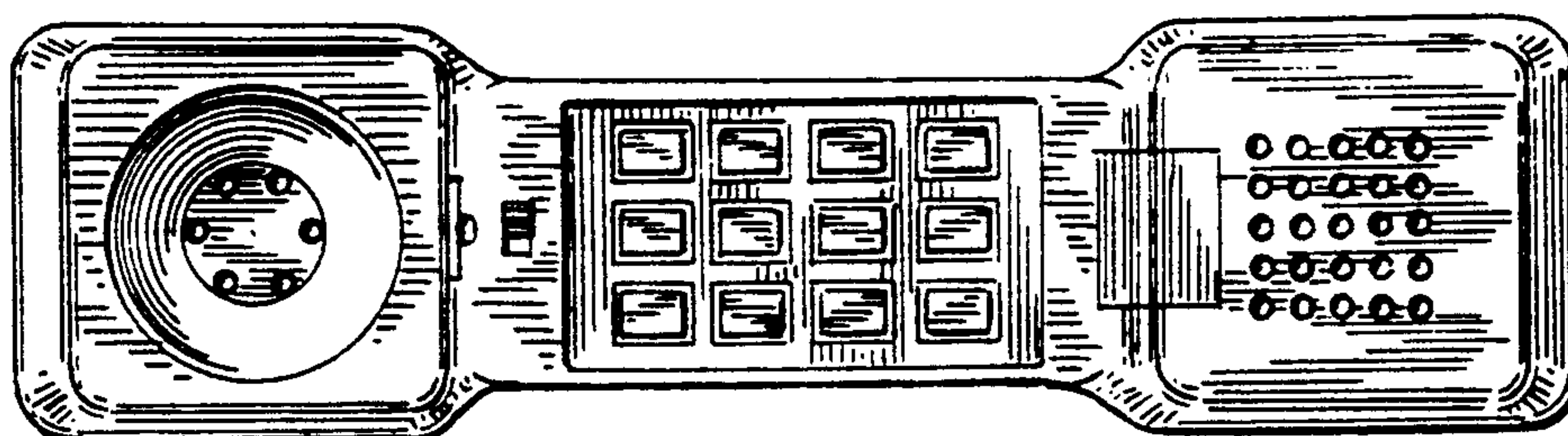

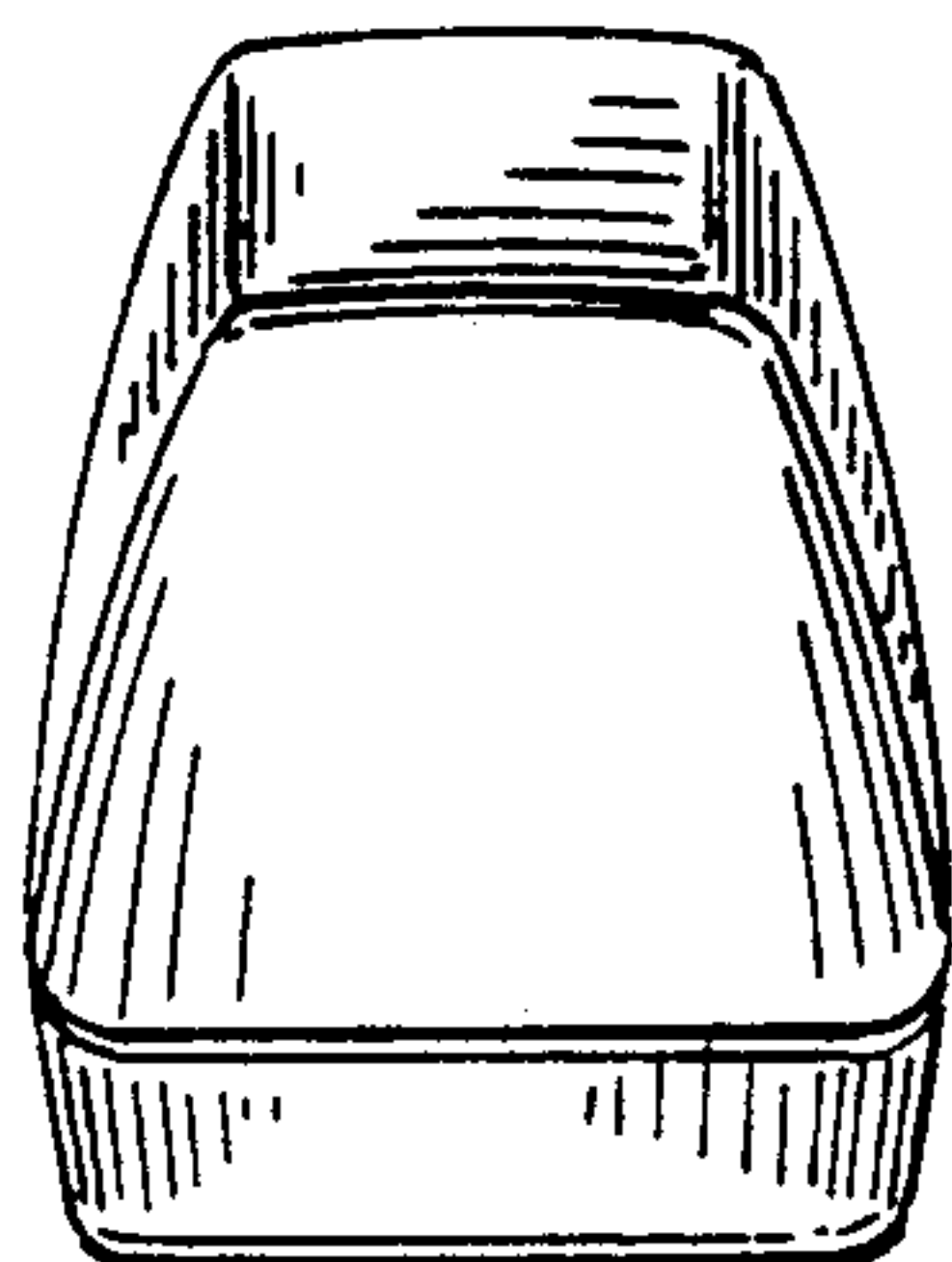

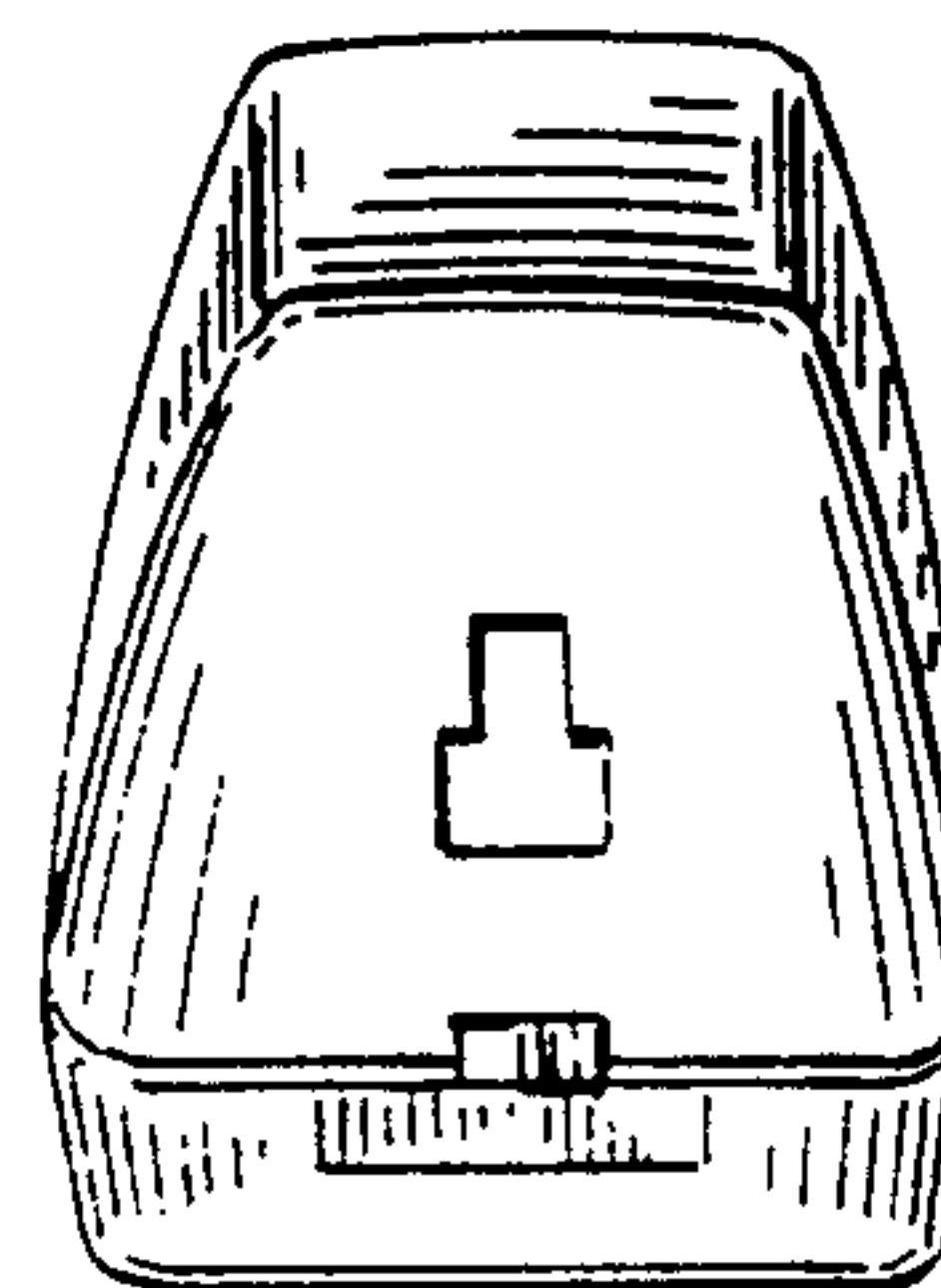

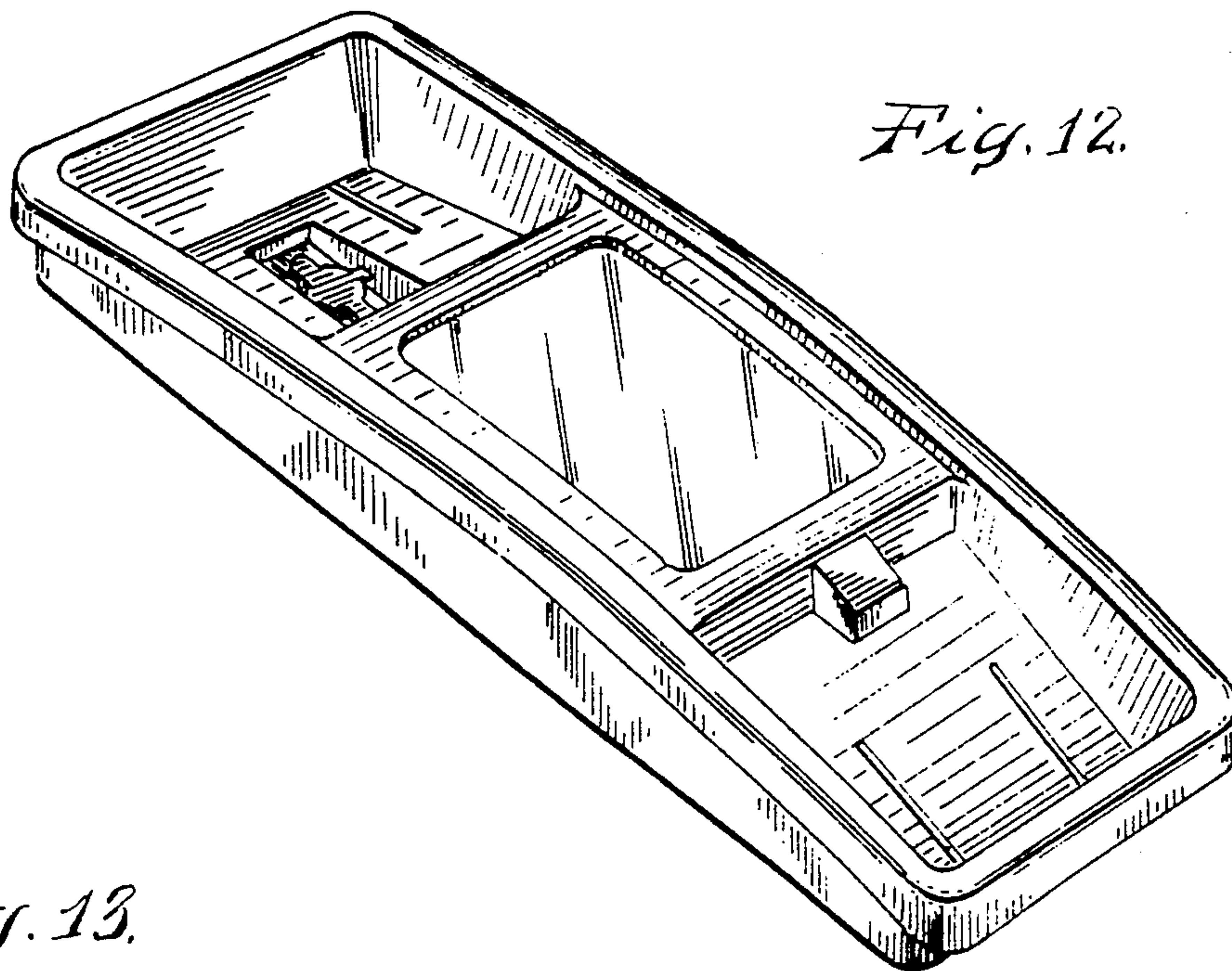

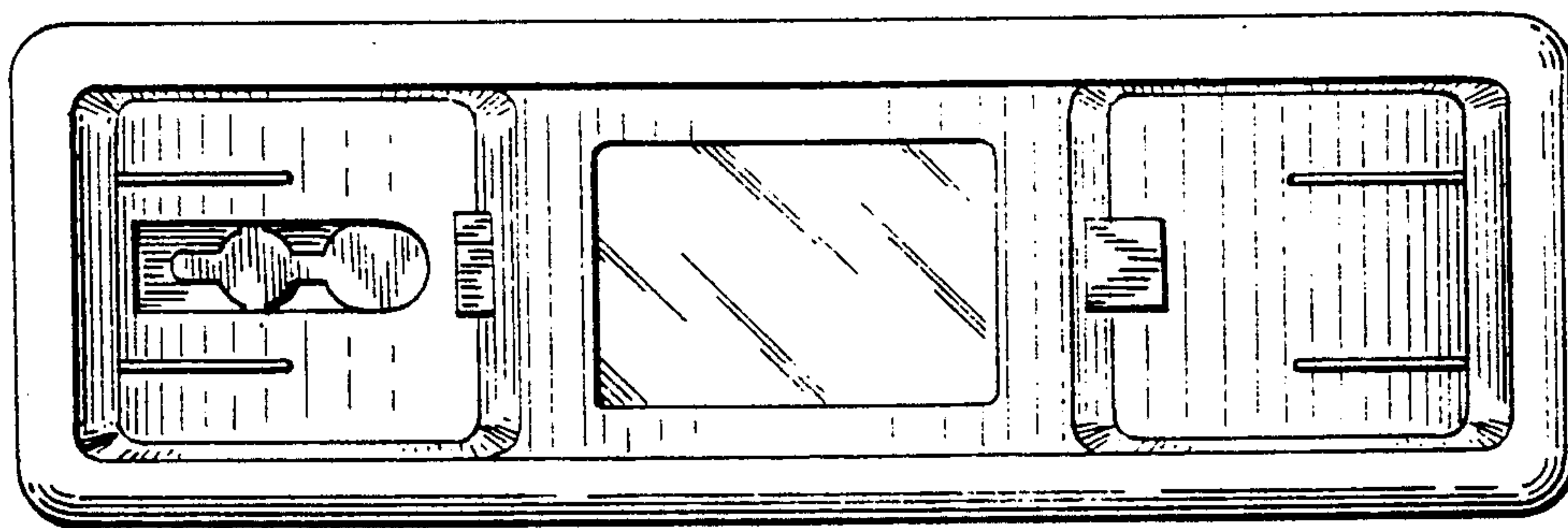

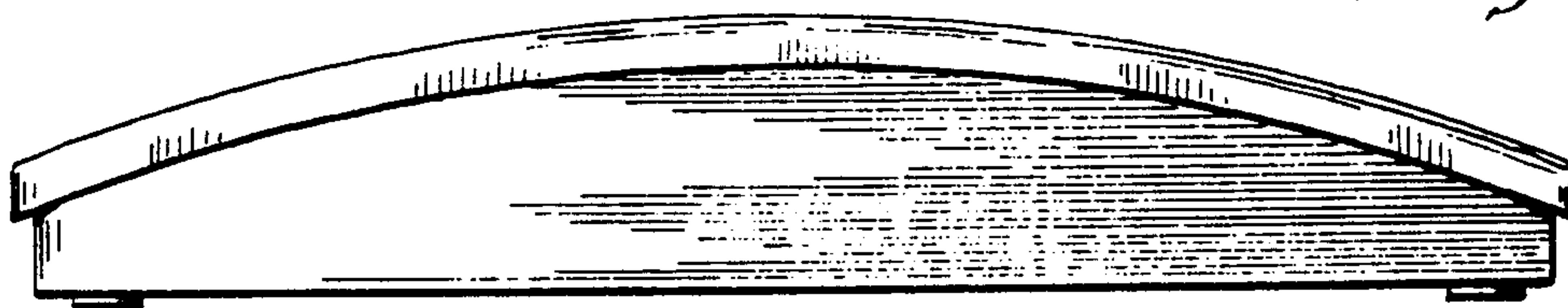

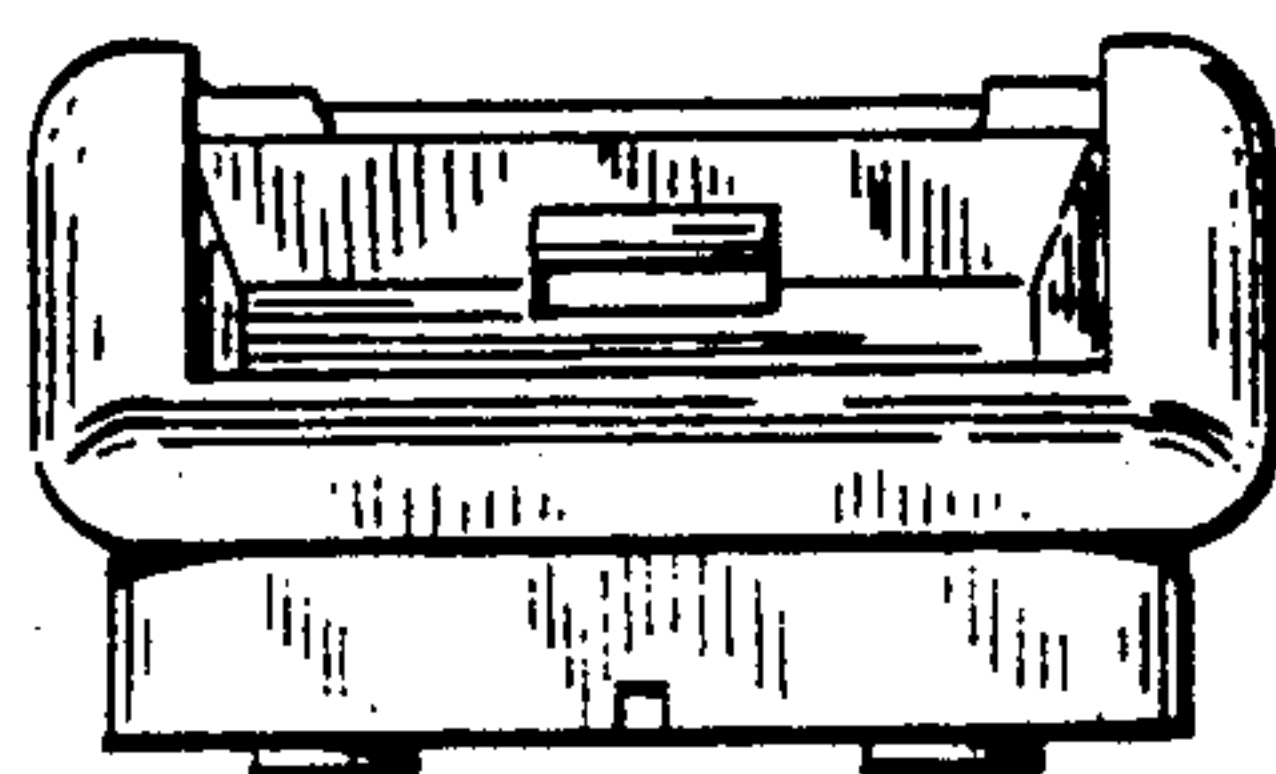
