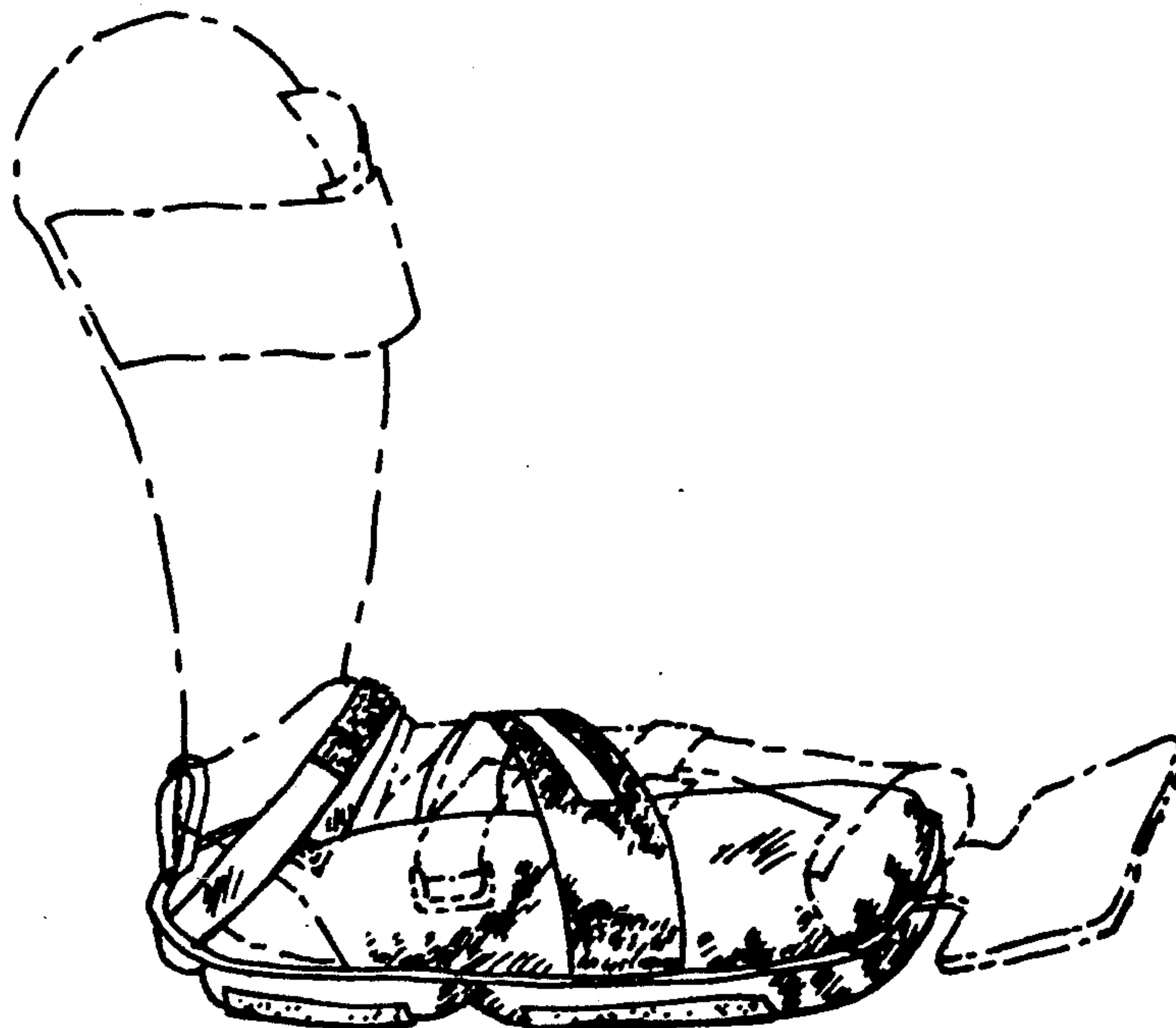
FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an ambulatory slipper or the like showing my new design;

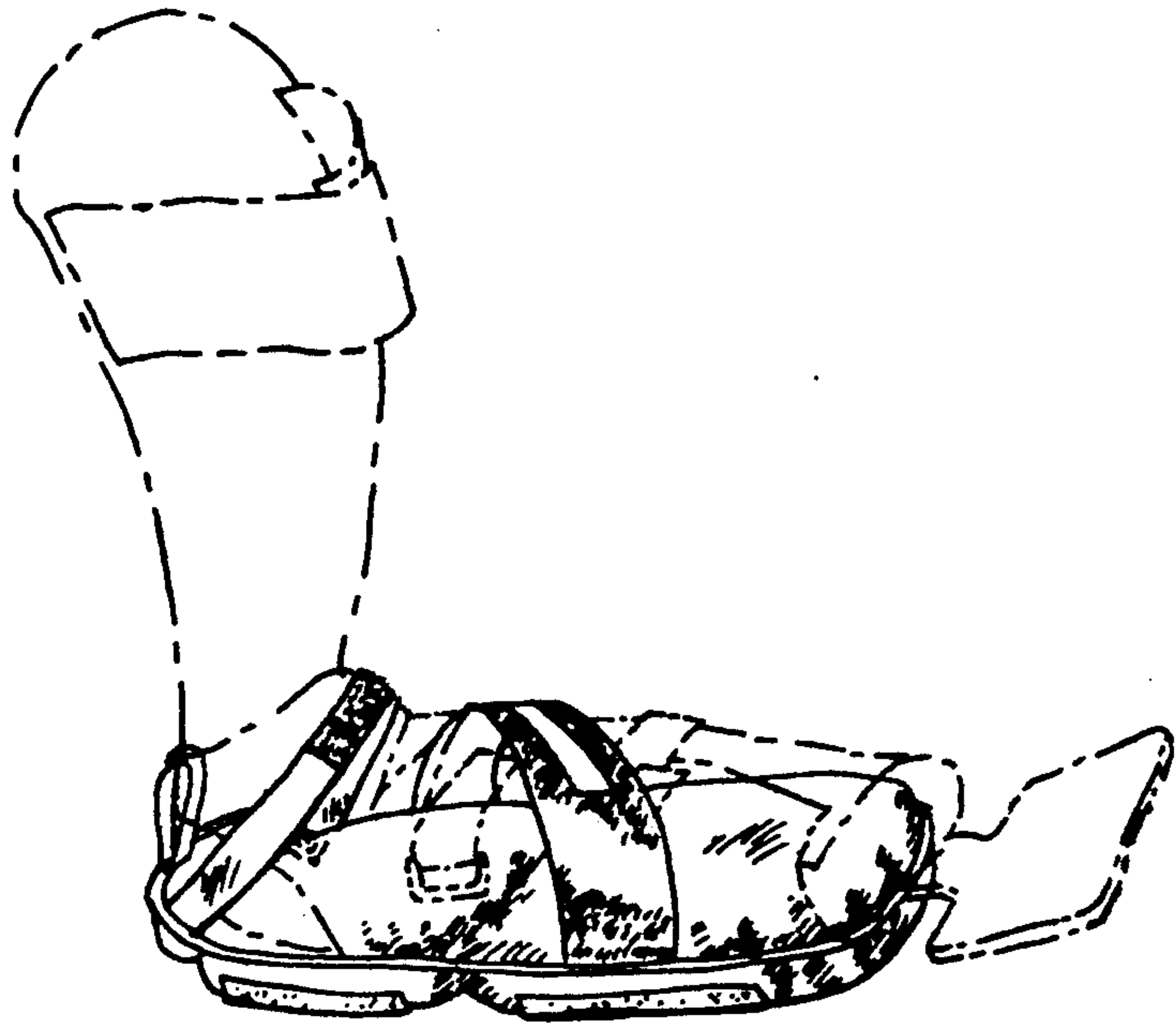

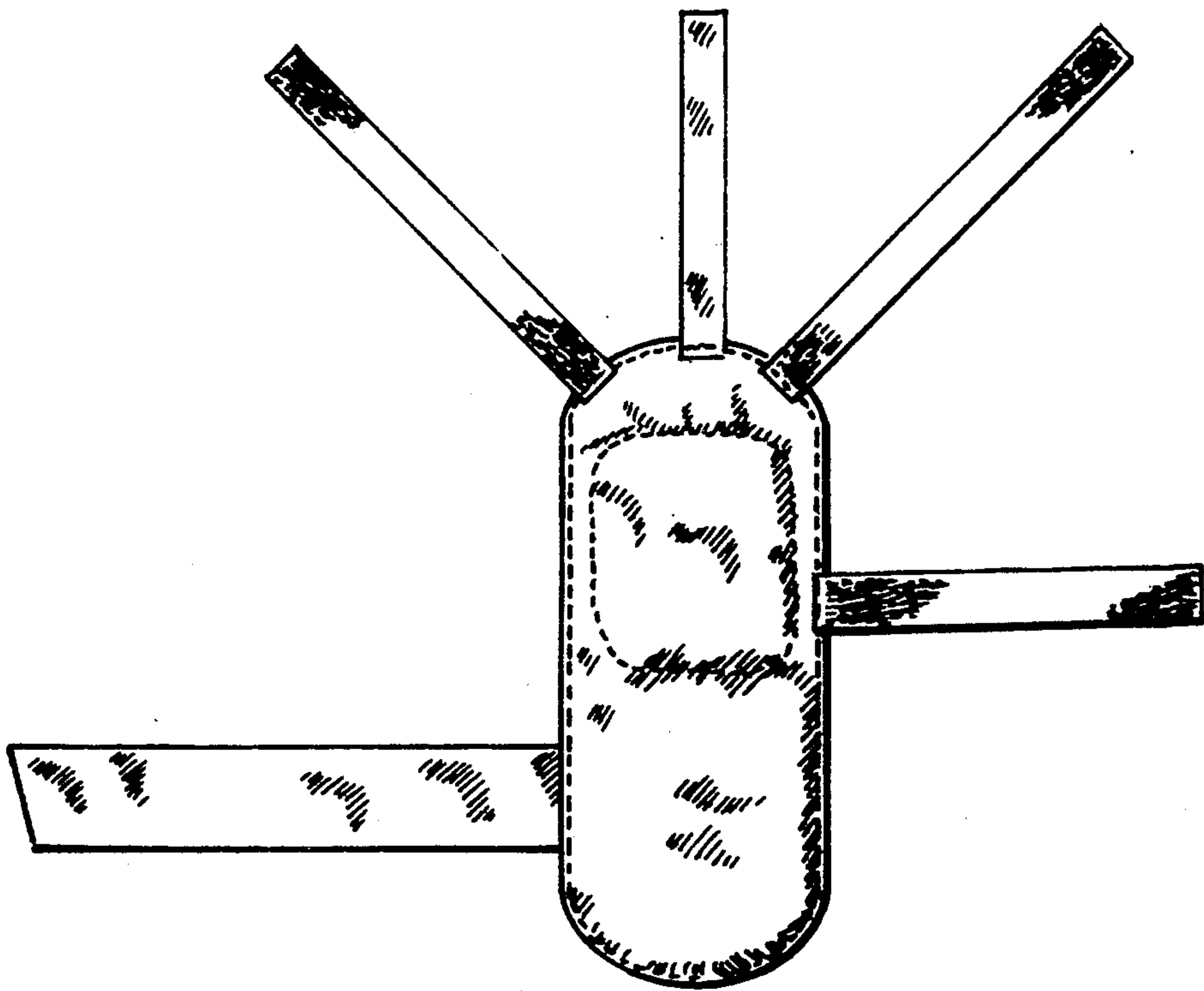

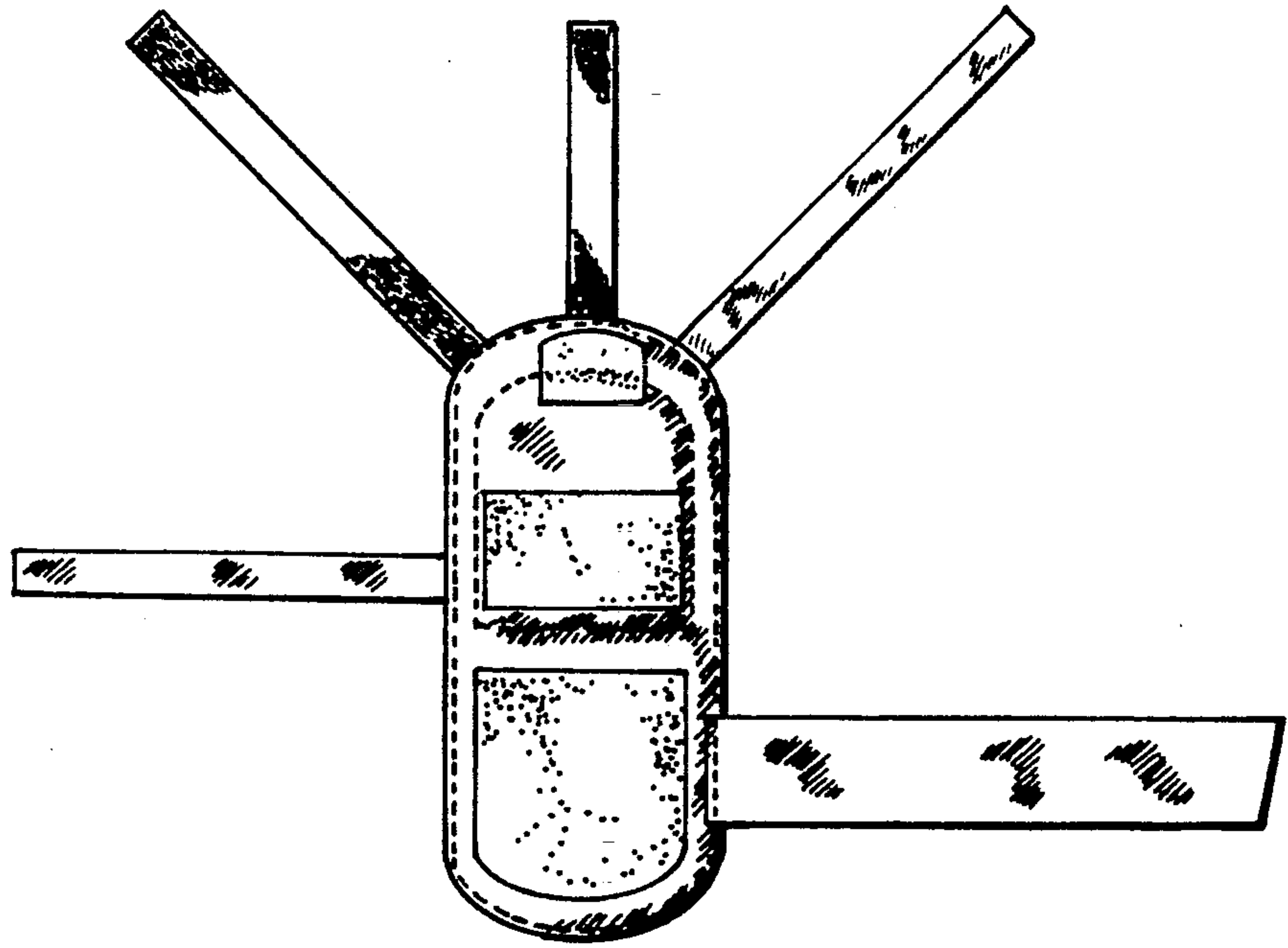

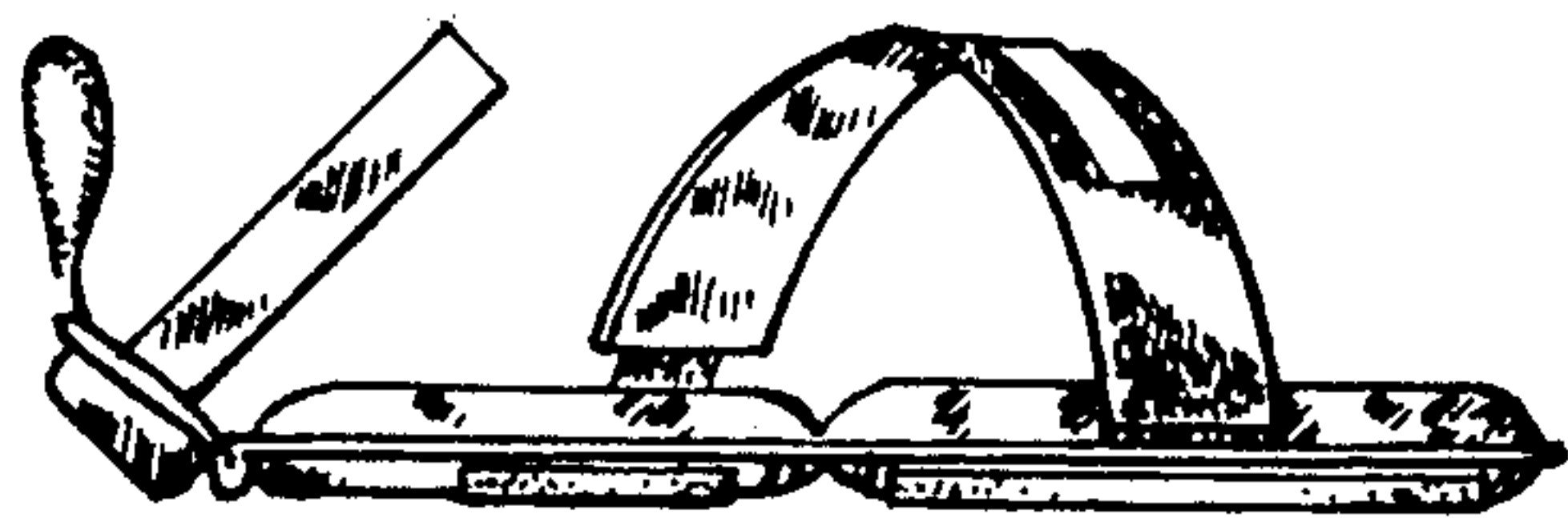

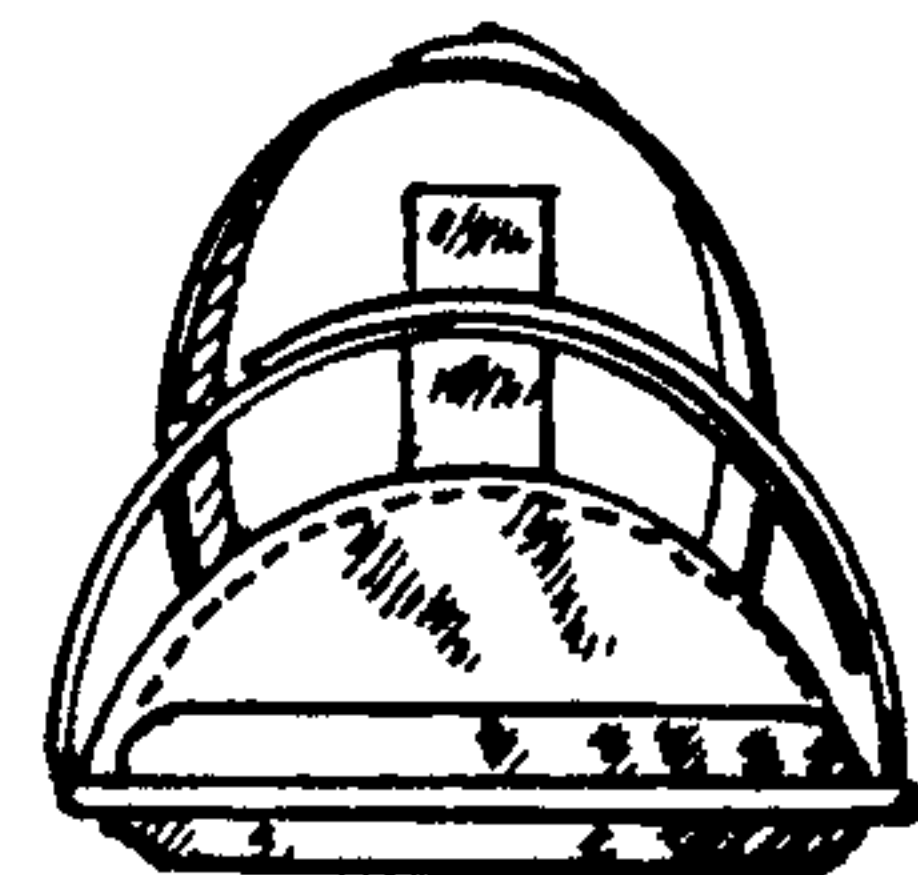

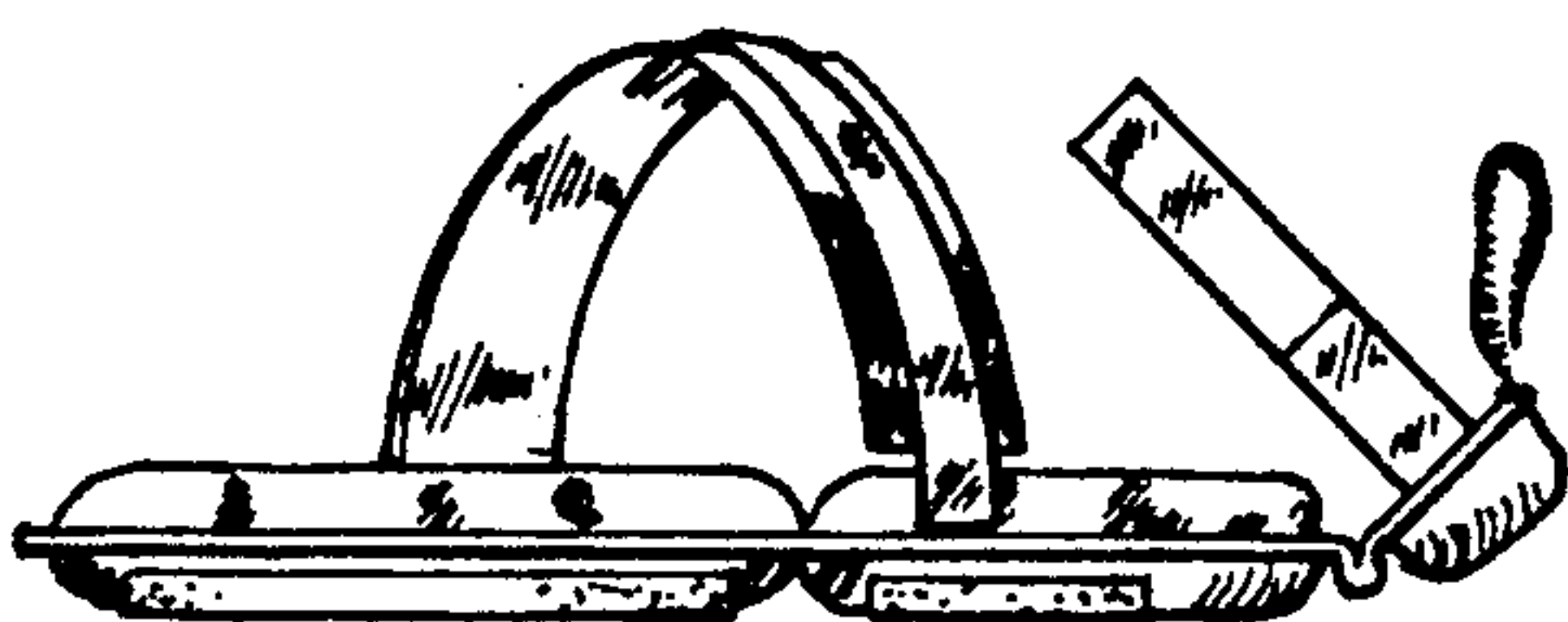

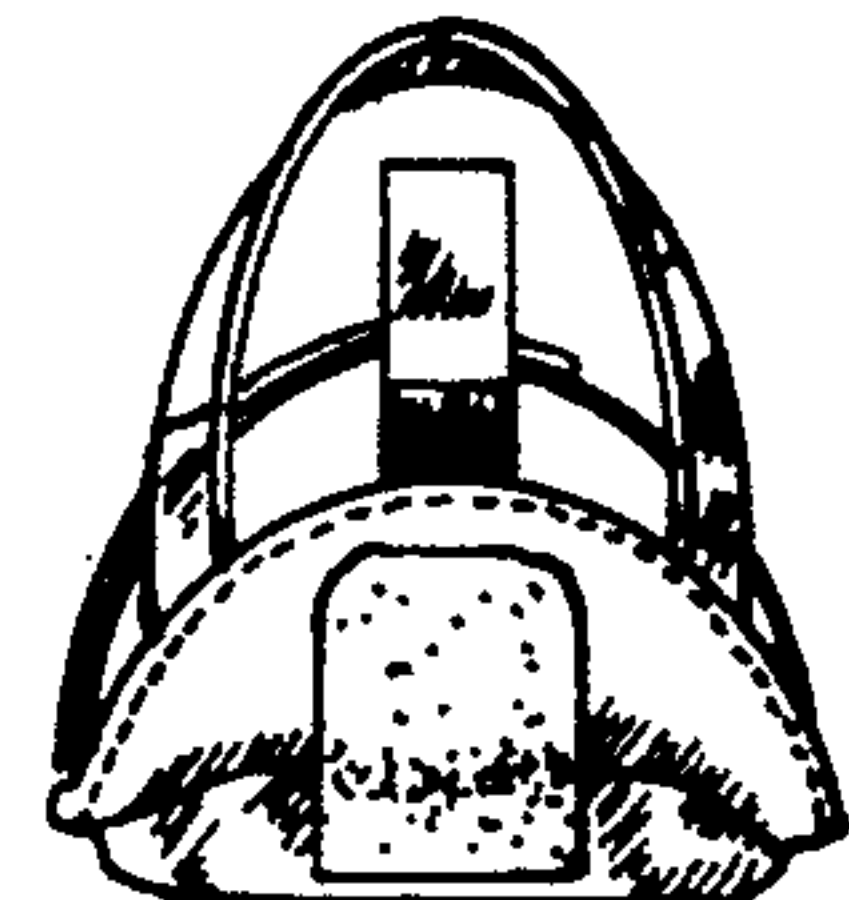
