and forms no part of the claimed design.

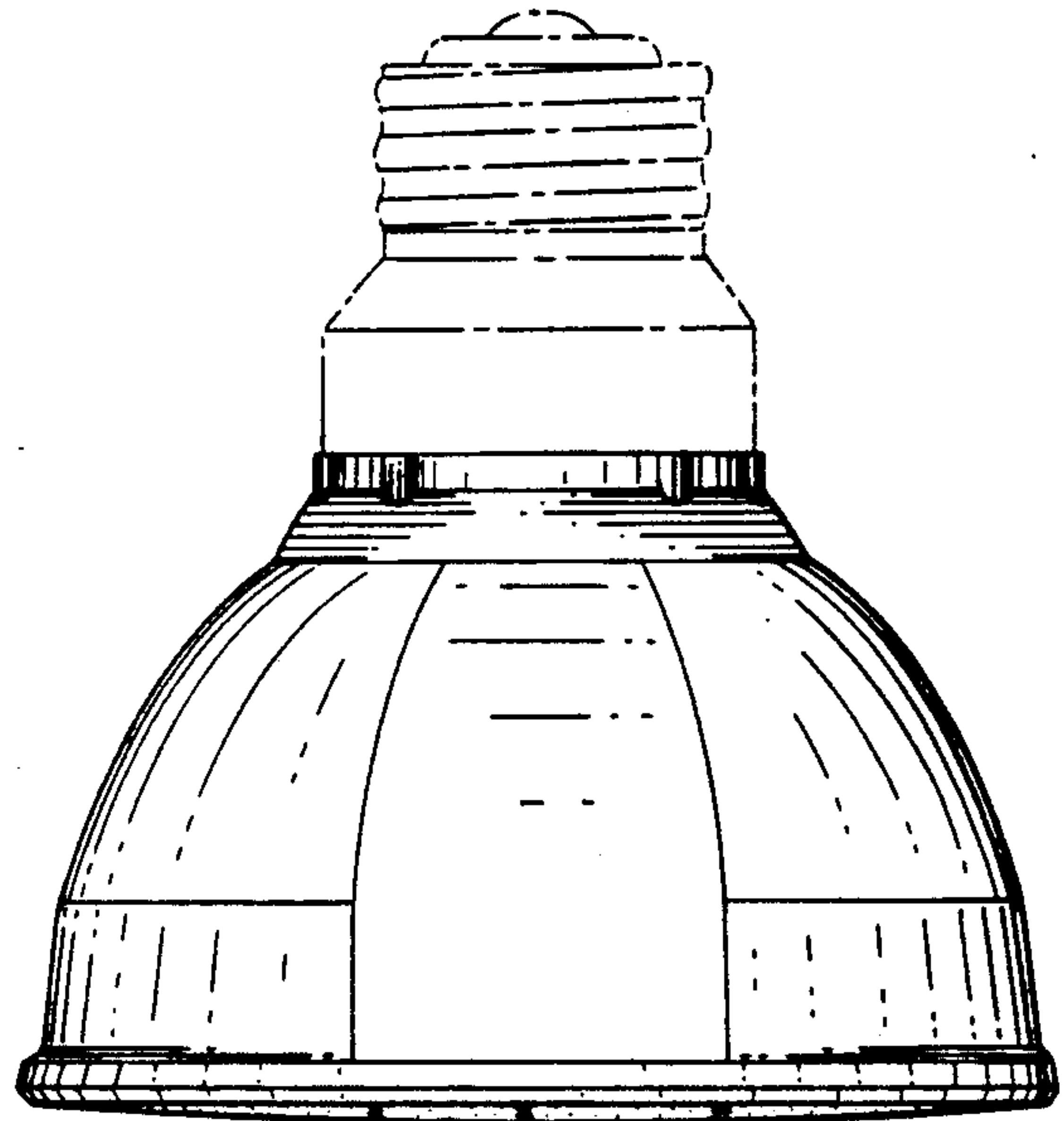
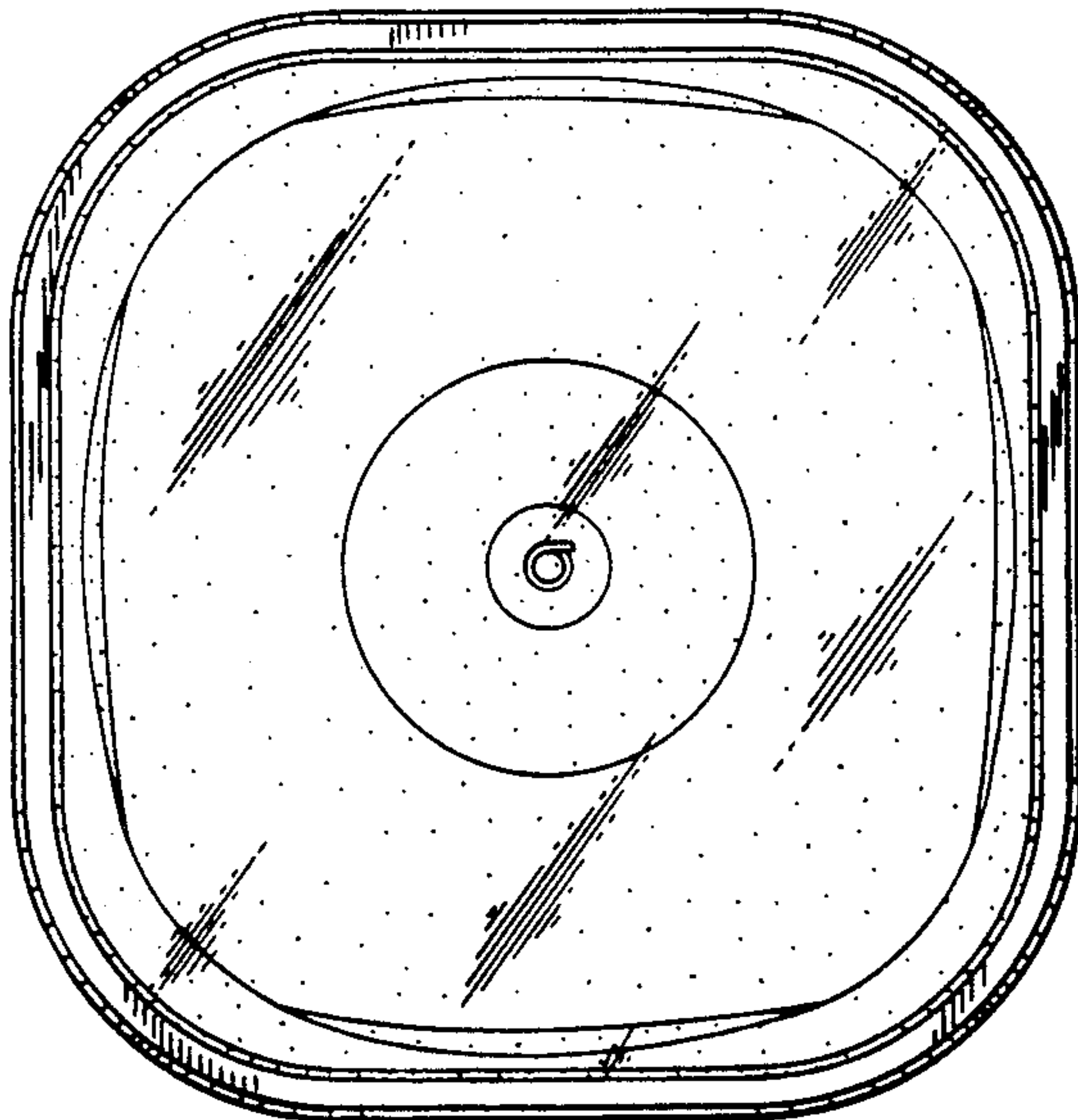

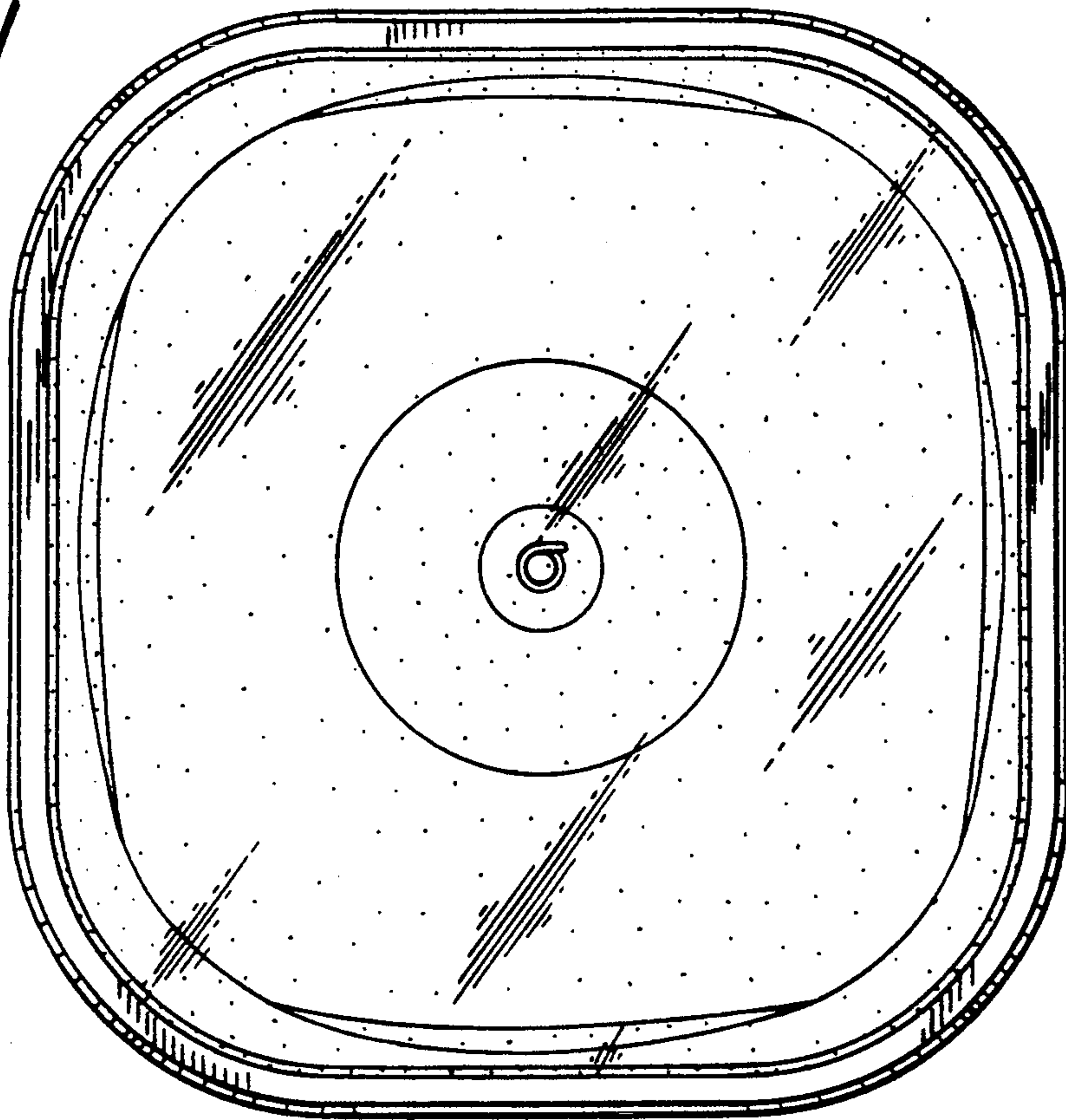

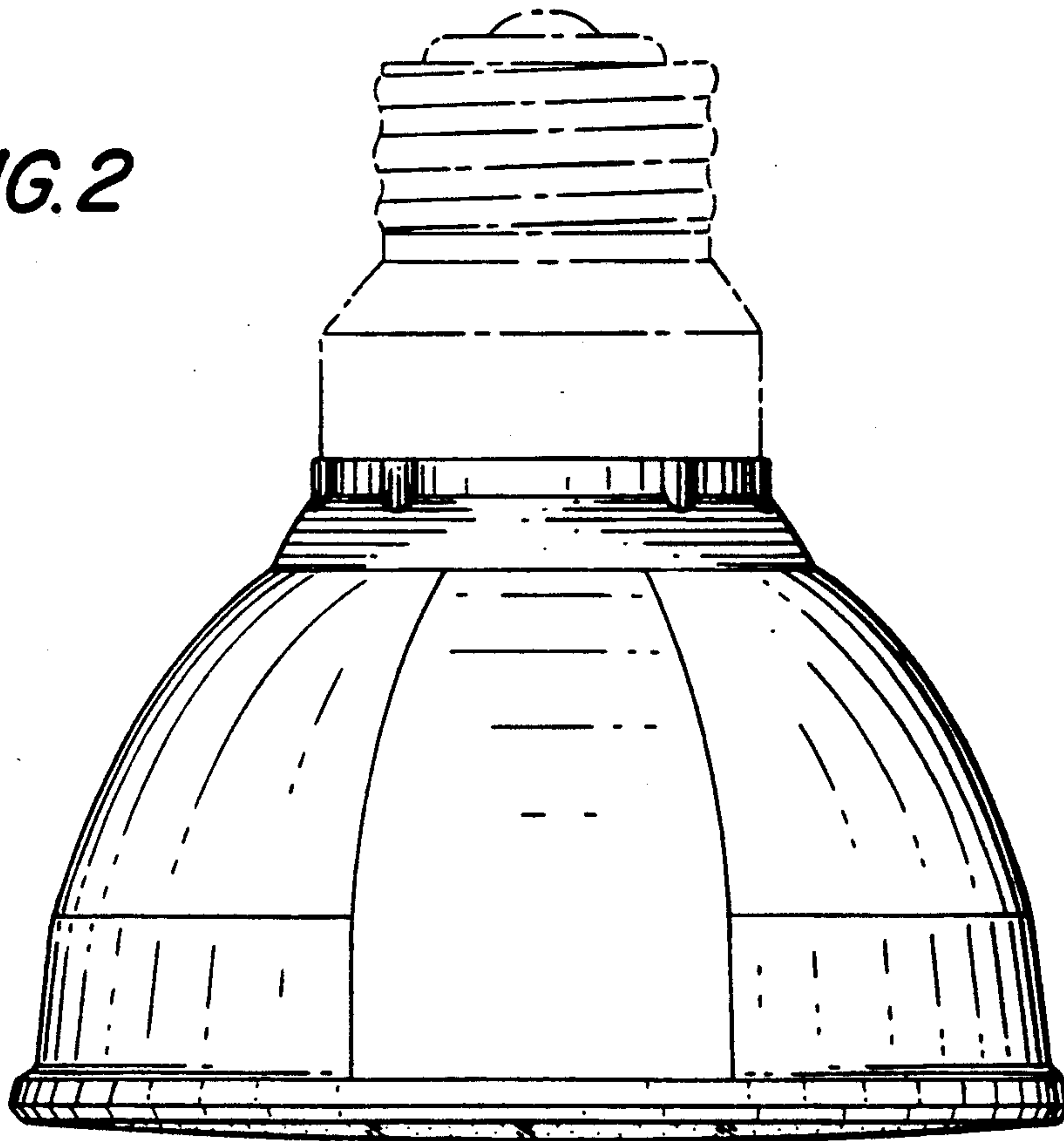

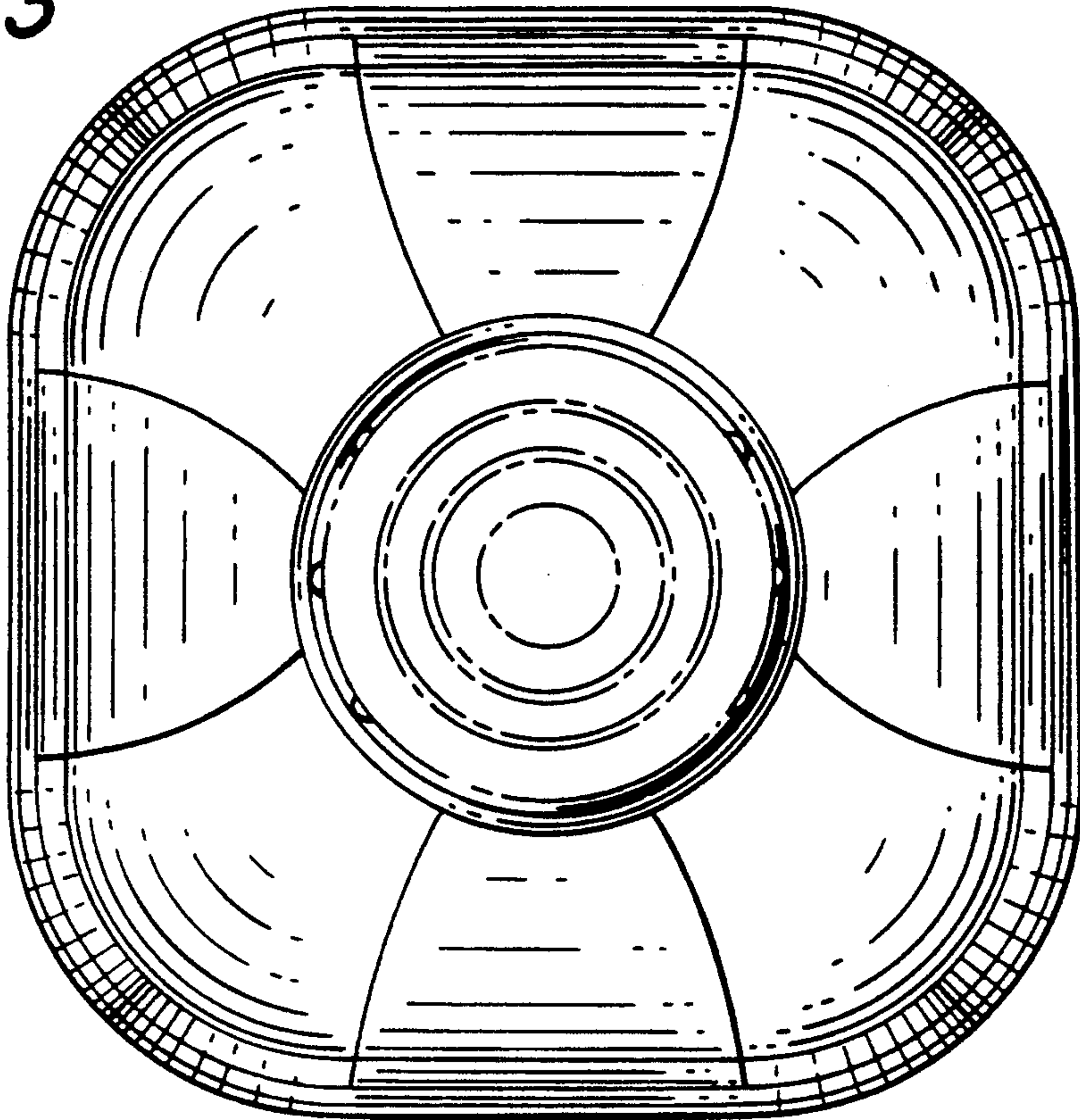

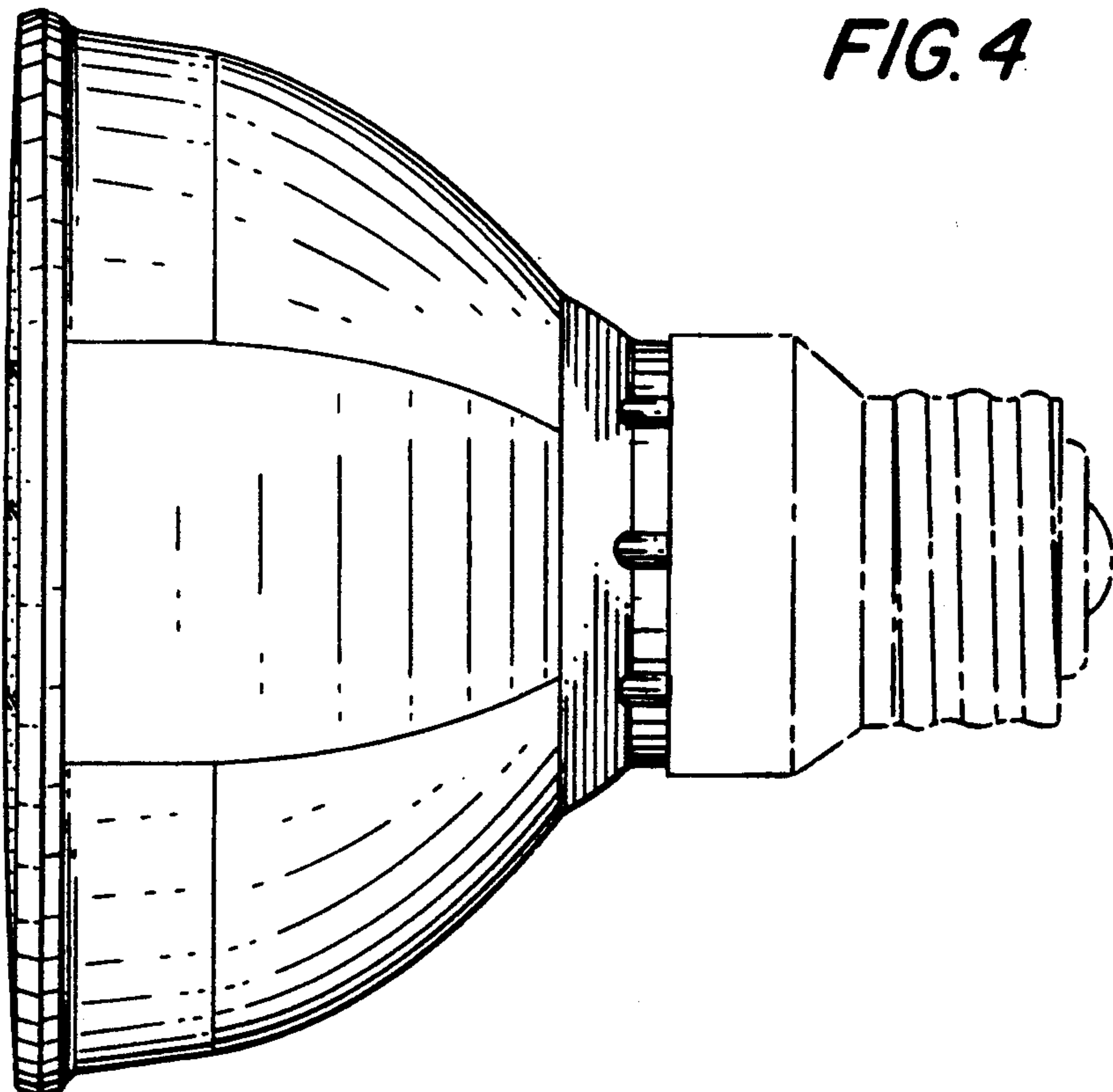

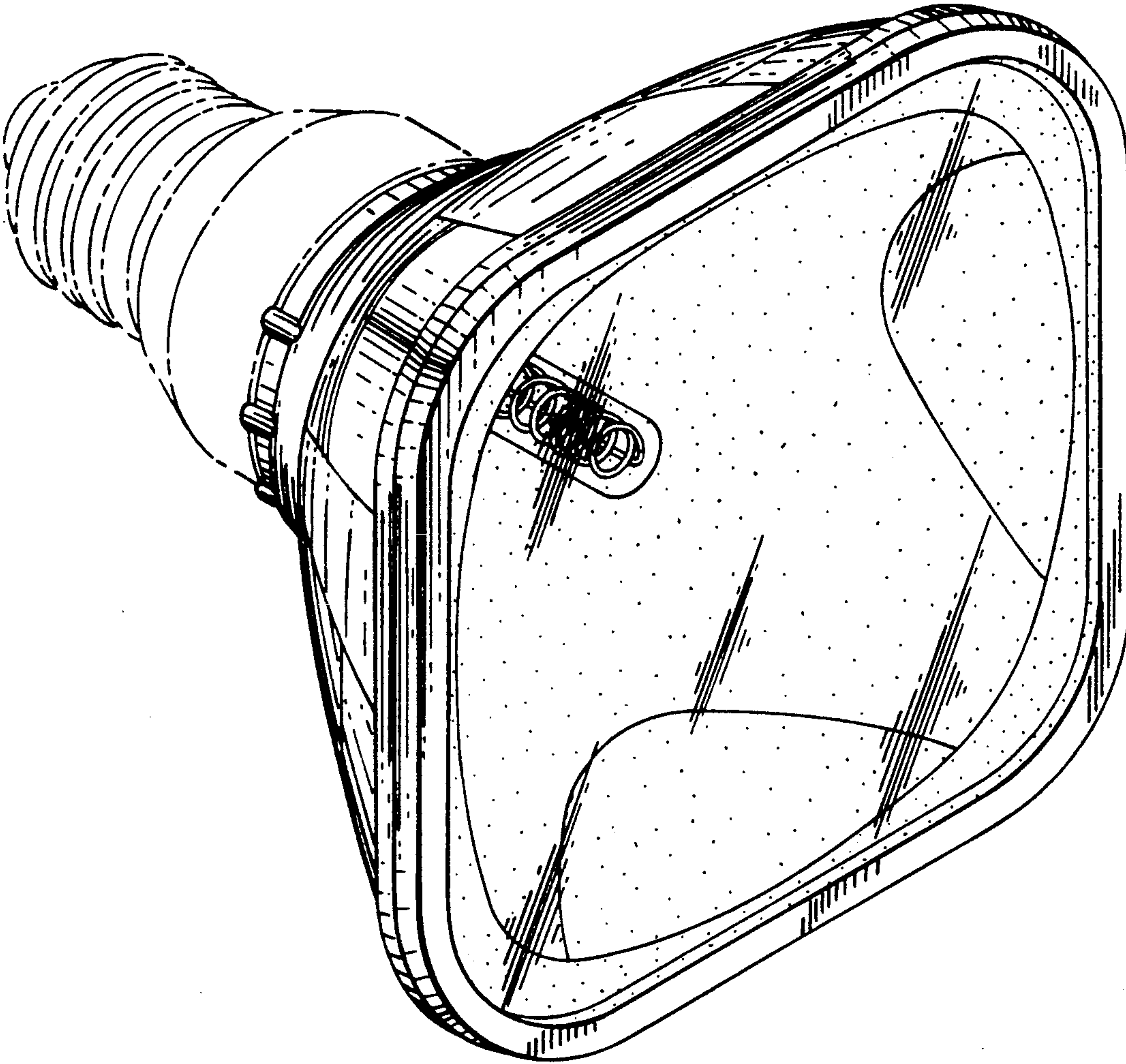
