DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a handler holster showing my new design in closed position;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof in open position;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view of a handler holster showing a second embodiment of ny new design in closed position;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof in open position;

FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a right side elevational view of the first embodiment;

FIG. 7 is a left side elevational view of the second embodiment;


FIG. 8 is a top plan view of the second embodiment;

FIG. 9 is a bottom plan view of the second embodiment; FIG. 10 is a rear elevational view of the first embodiment;


FIG. 11 is a left side elevational view of the first embodiment;


























