[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a pistol with two grips, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a left side elevational view of a pistol with two grips showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top, front perspective view thereof; and
FIG. 7 is a bottom perspective view thereof.

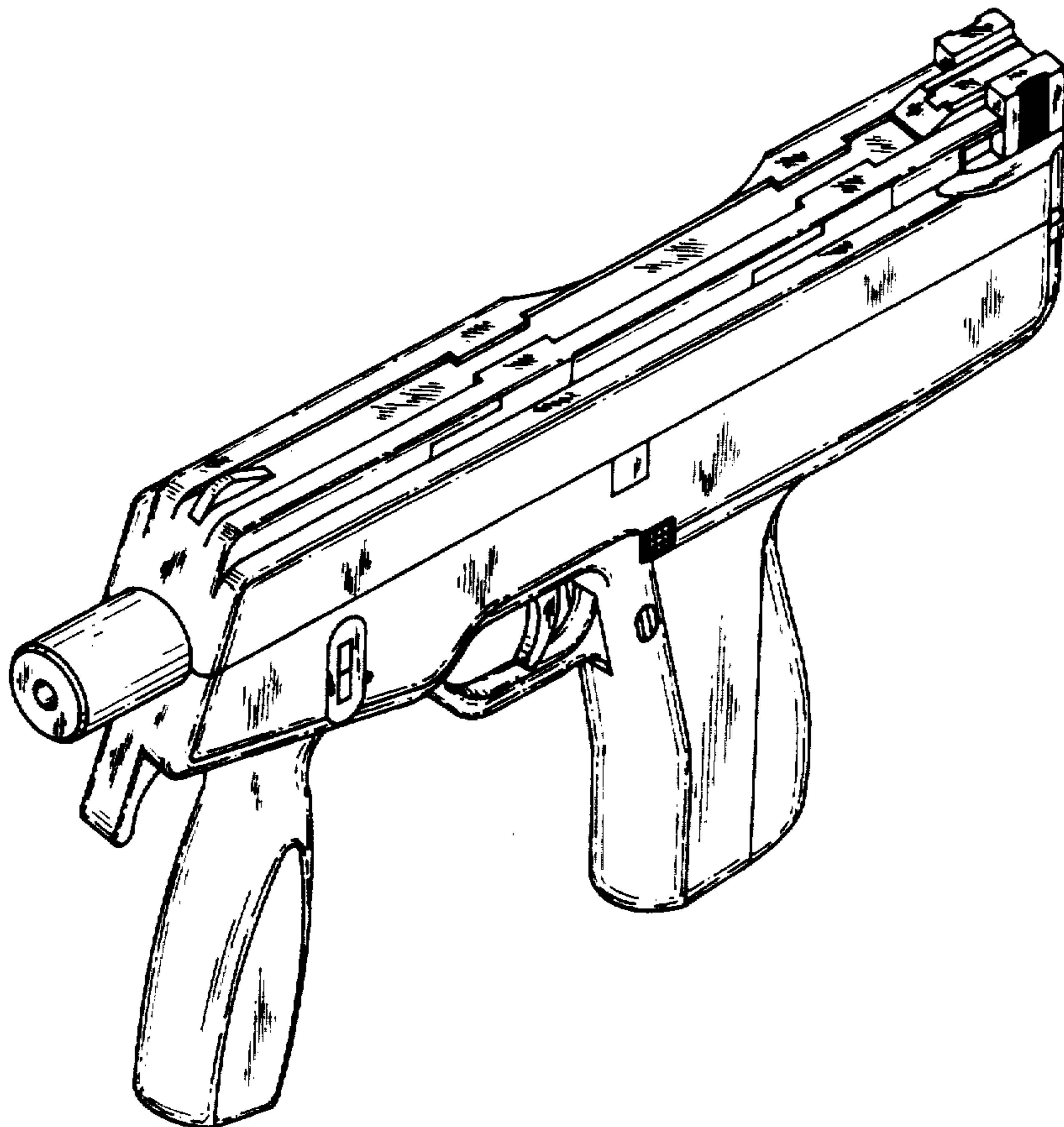

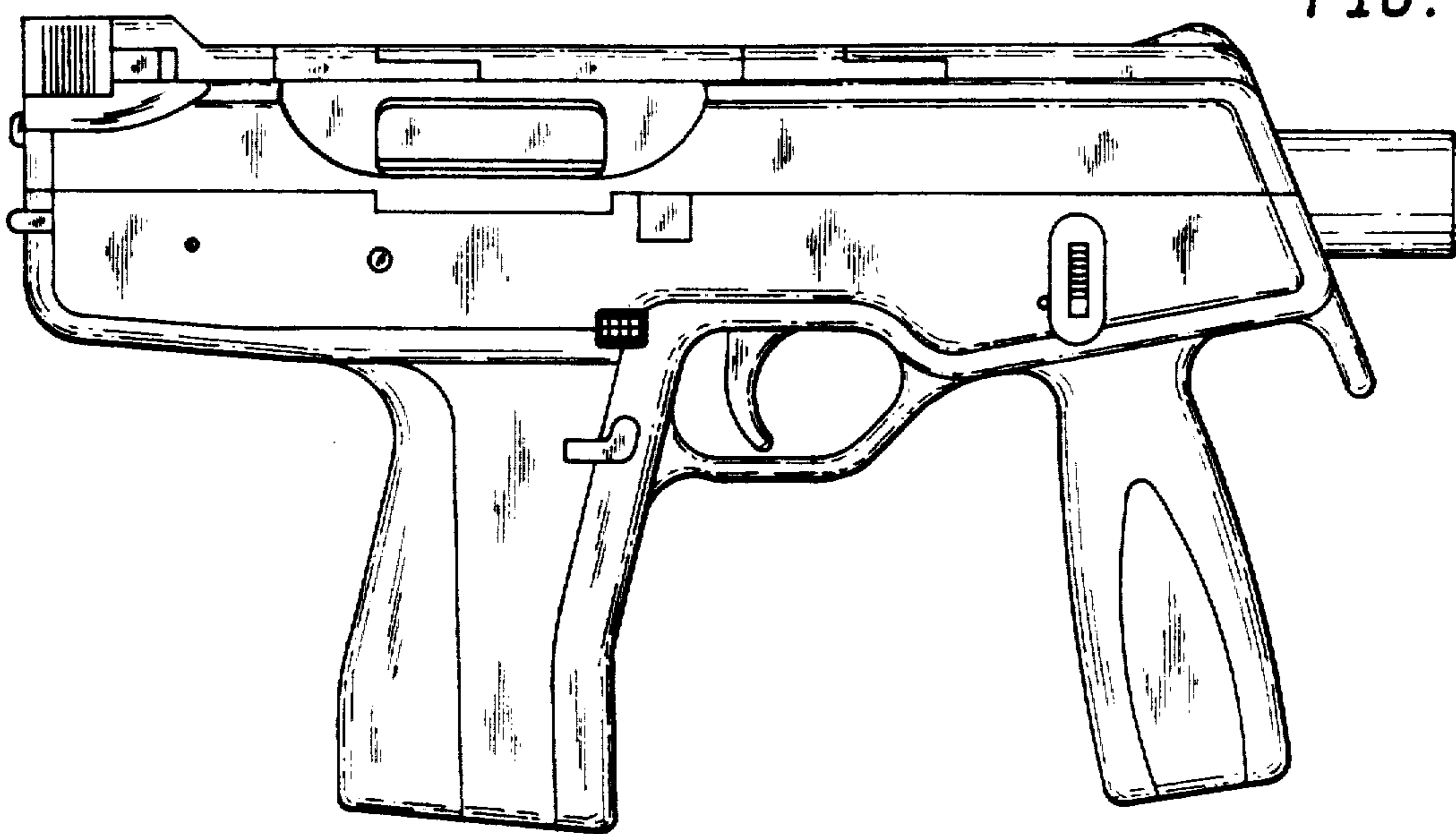

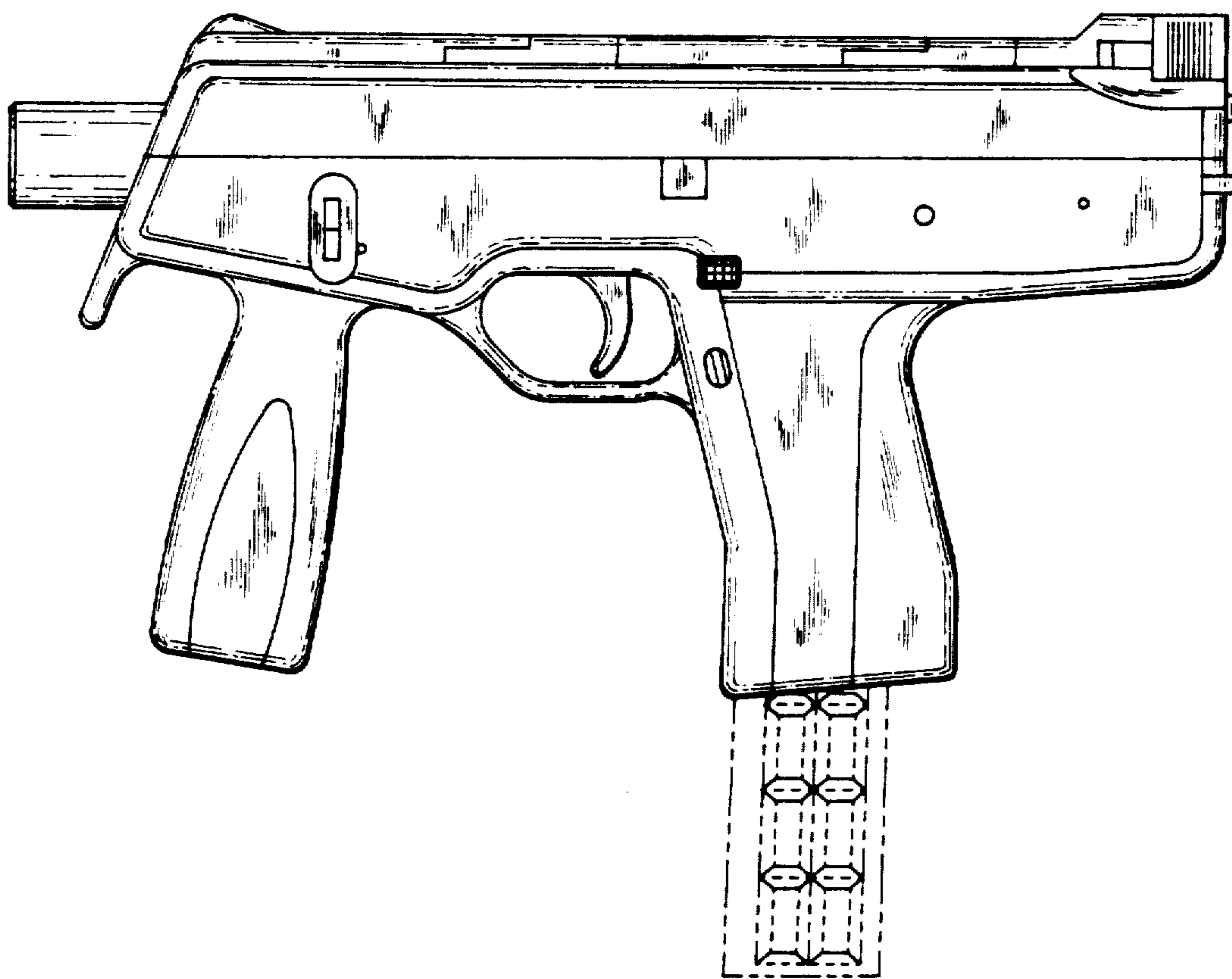

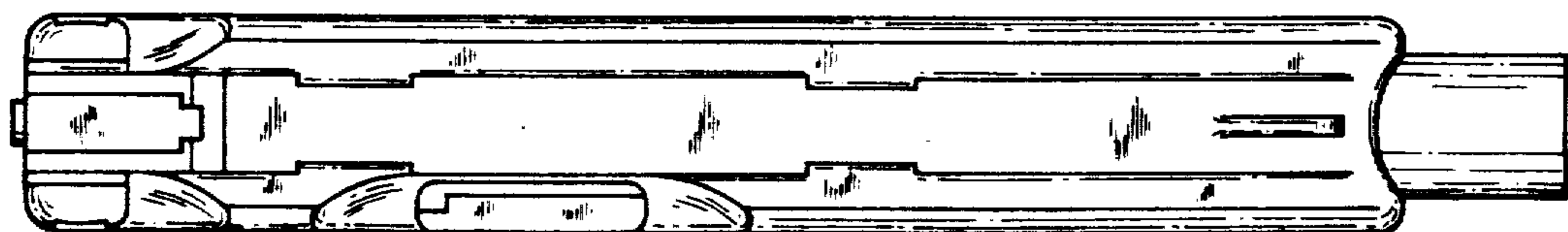

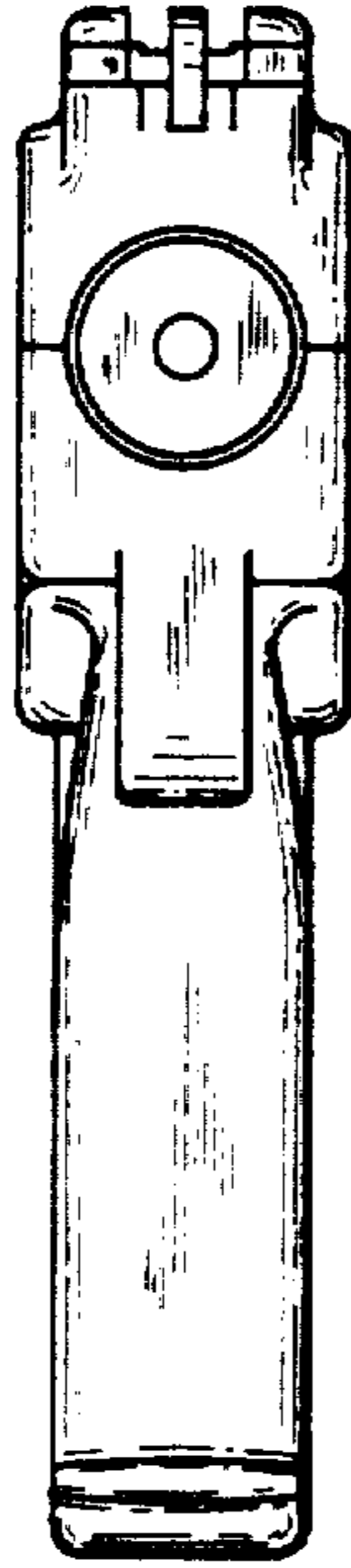

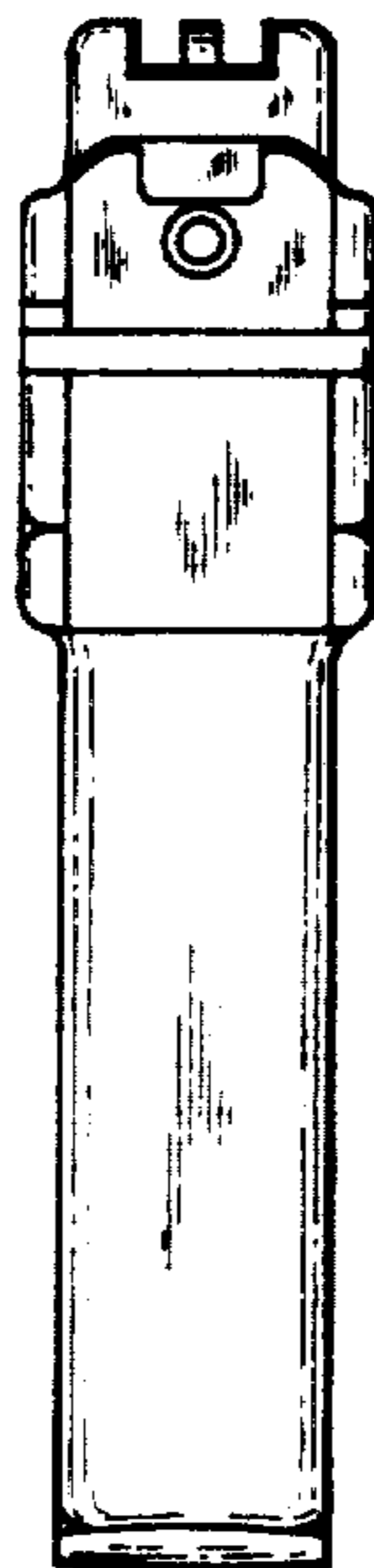

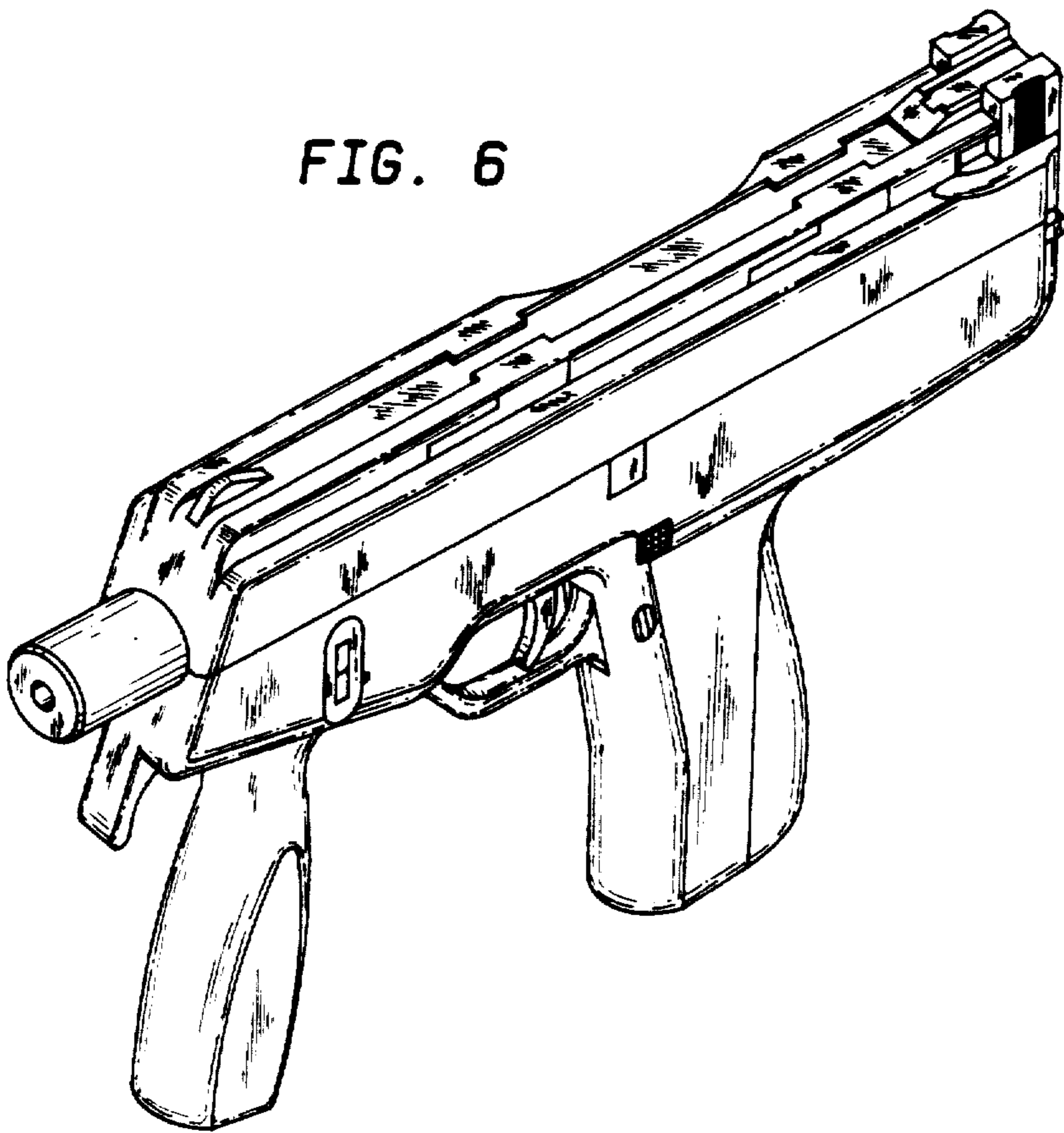
