FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

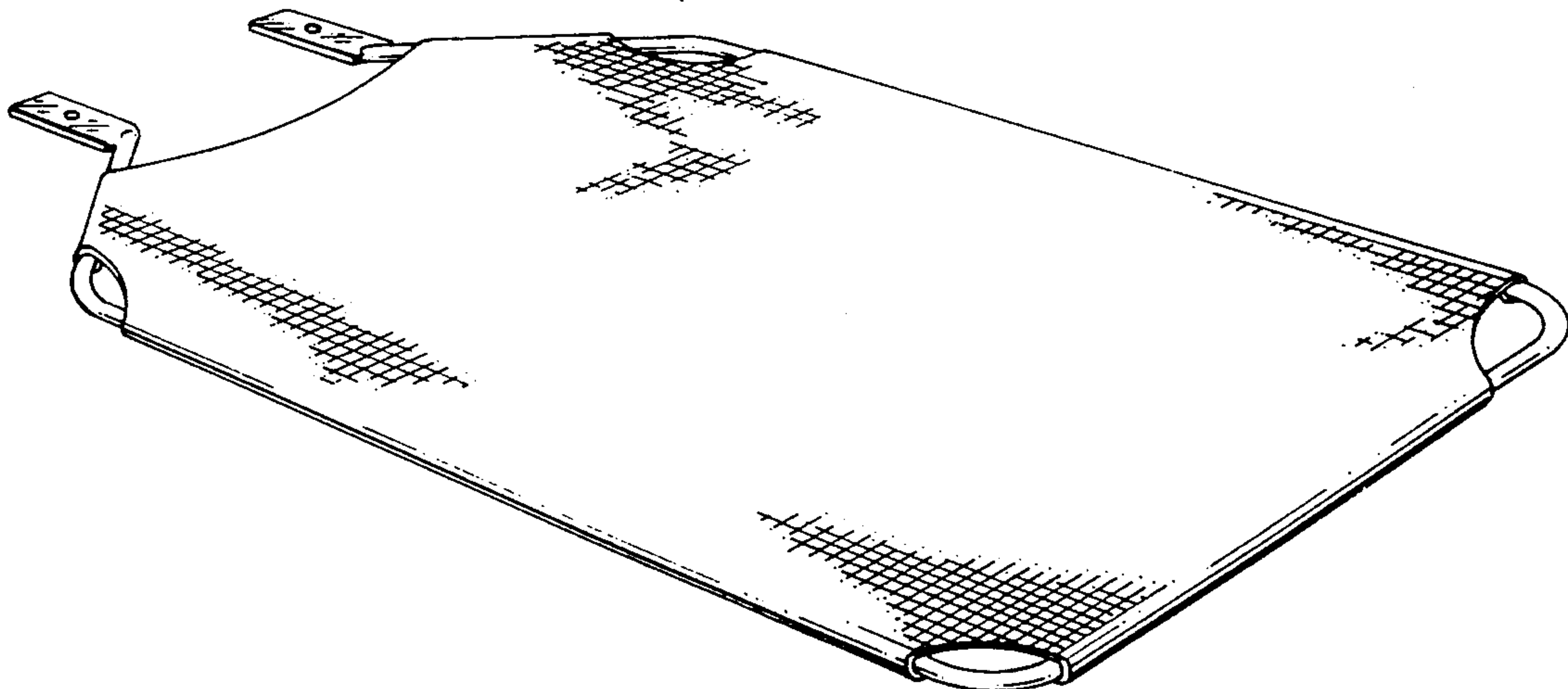
FIG. 3 is a right end elevational view thereof;

the panel.



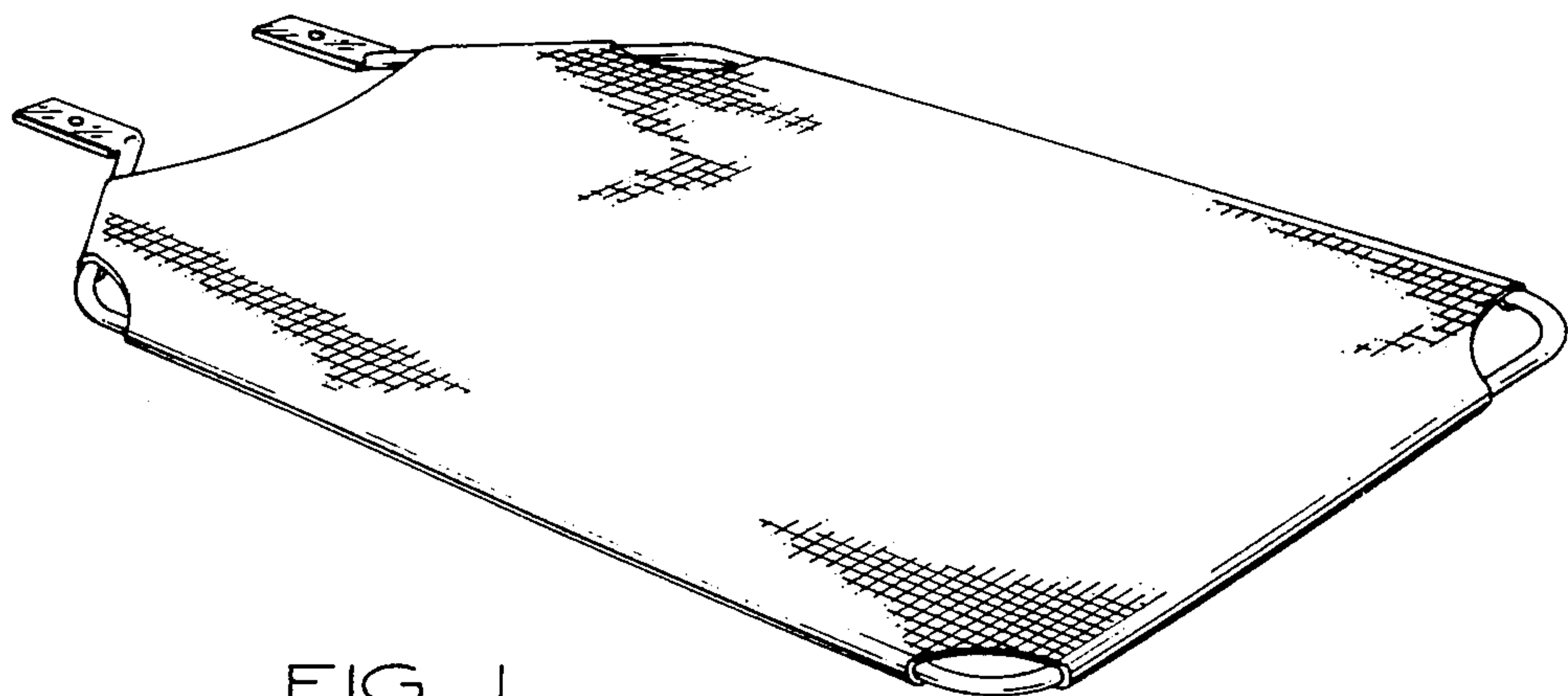

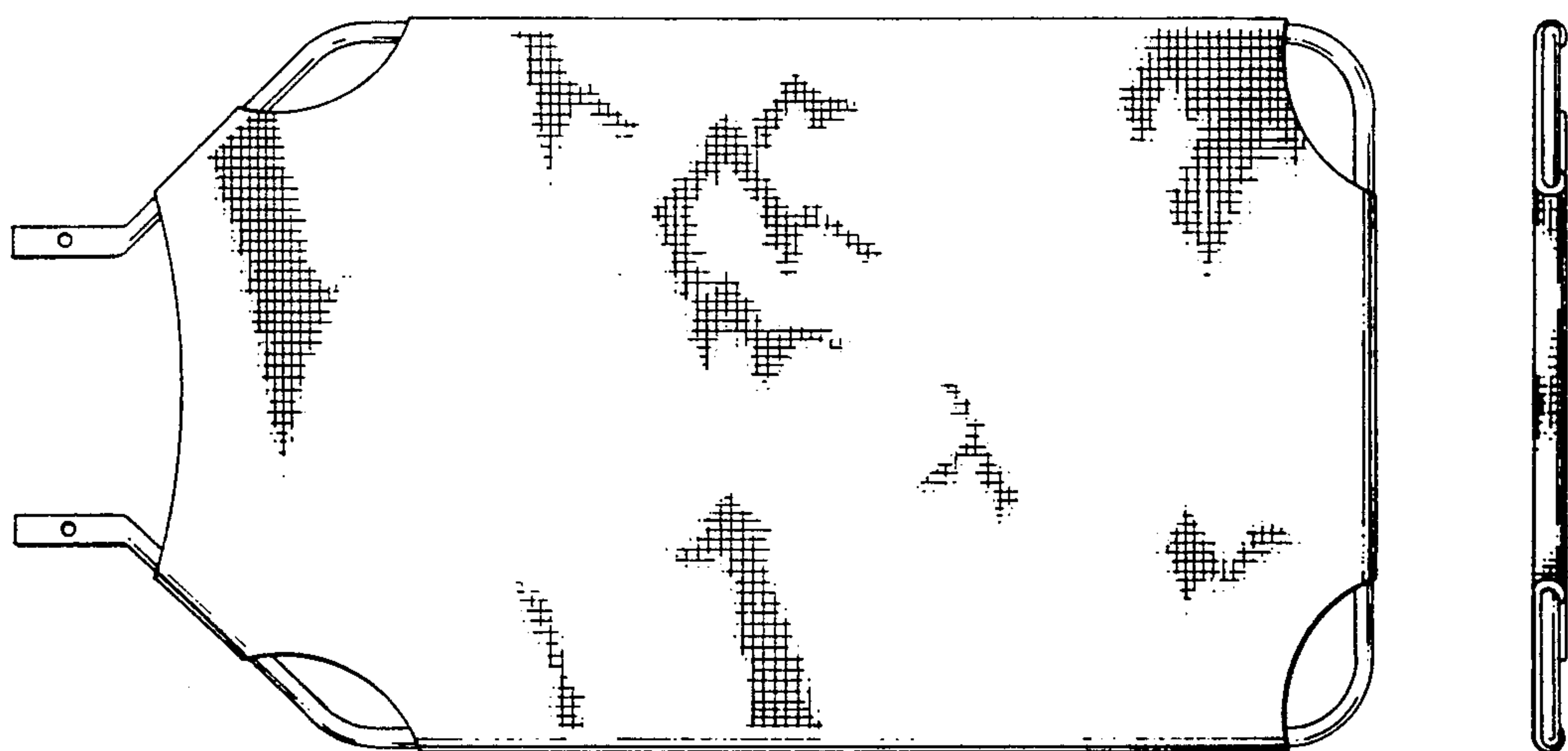

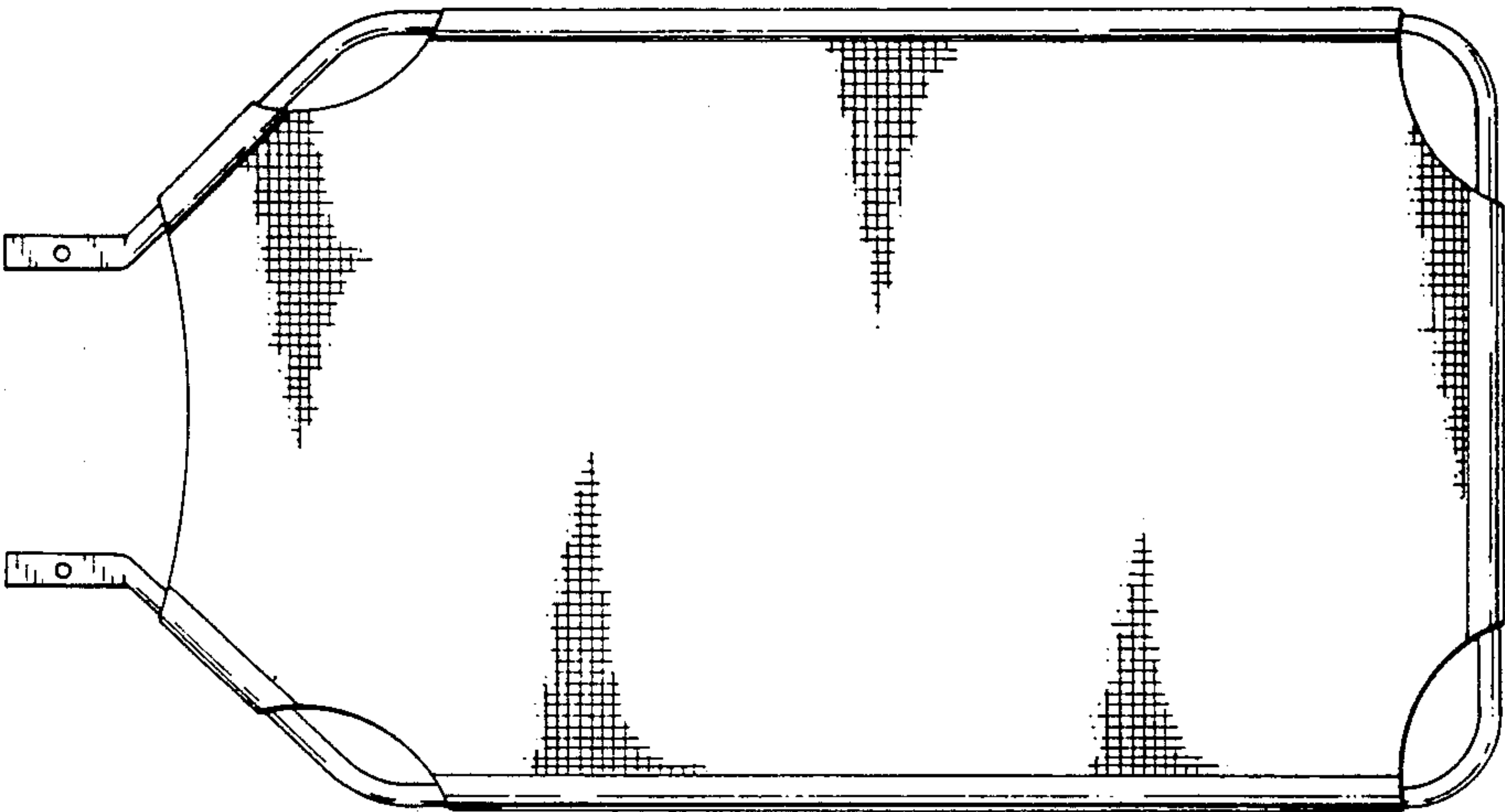
