the opposite end being identical thereto.

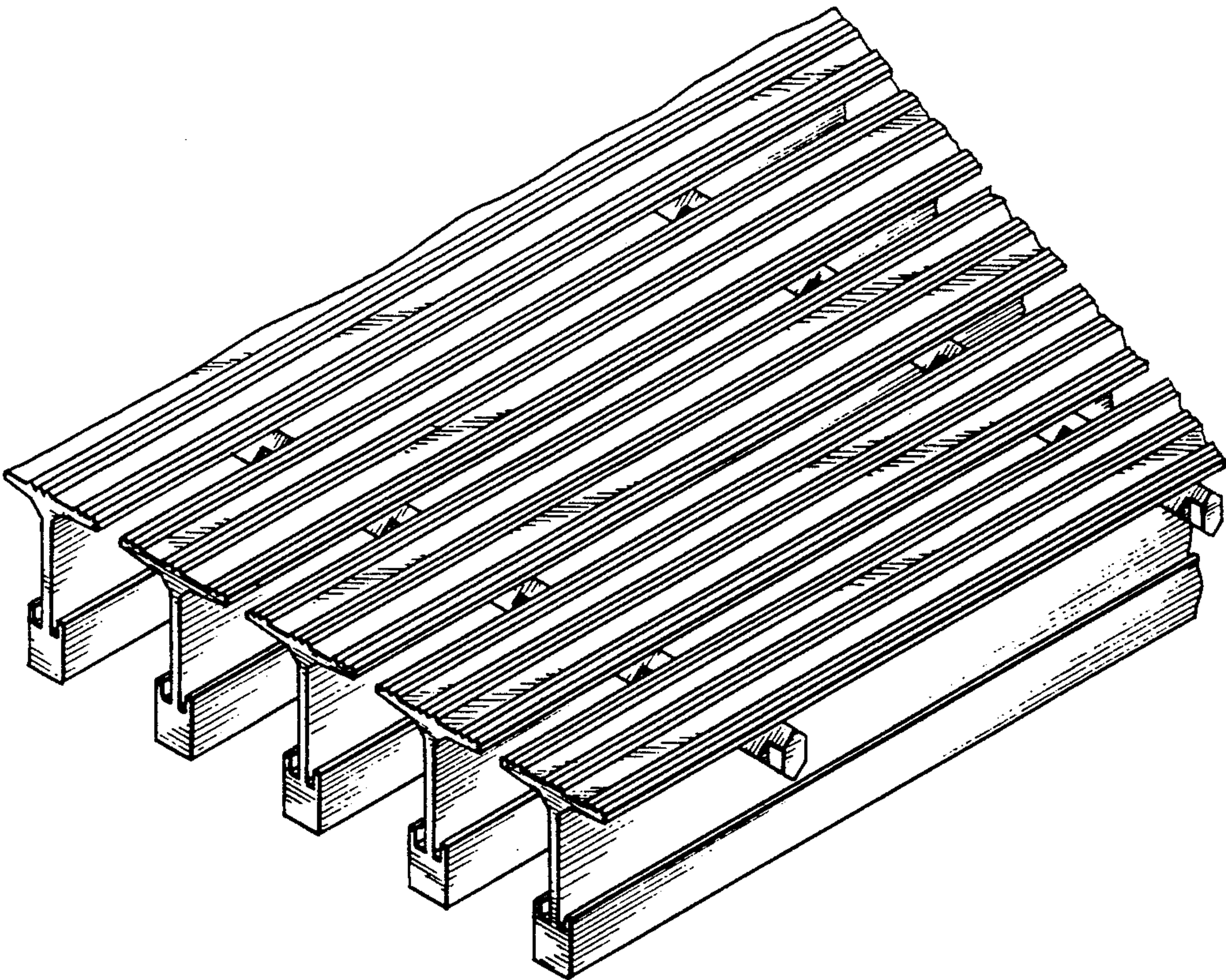

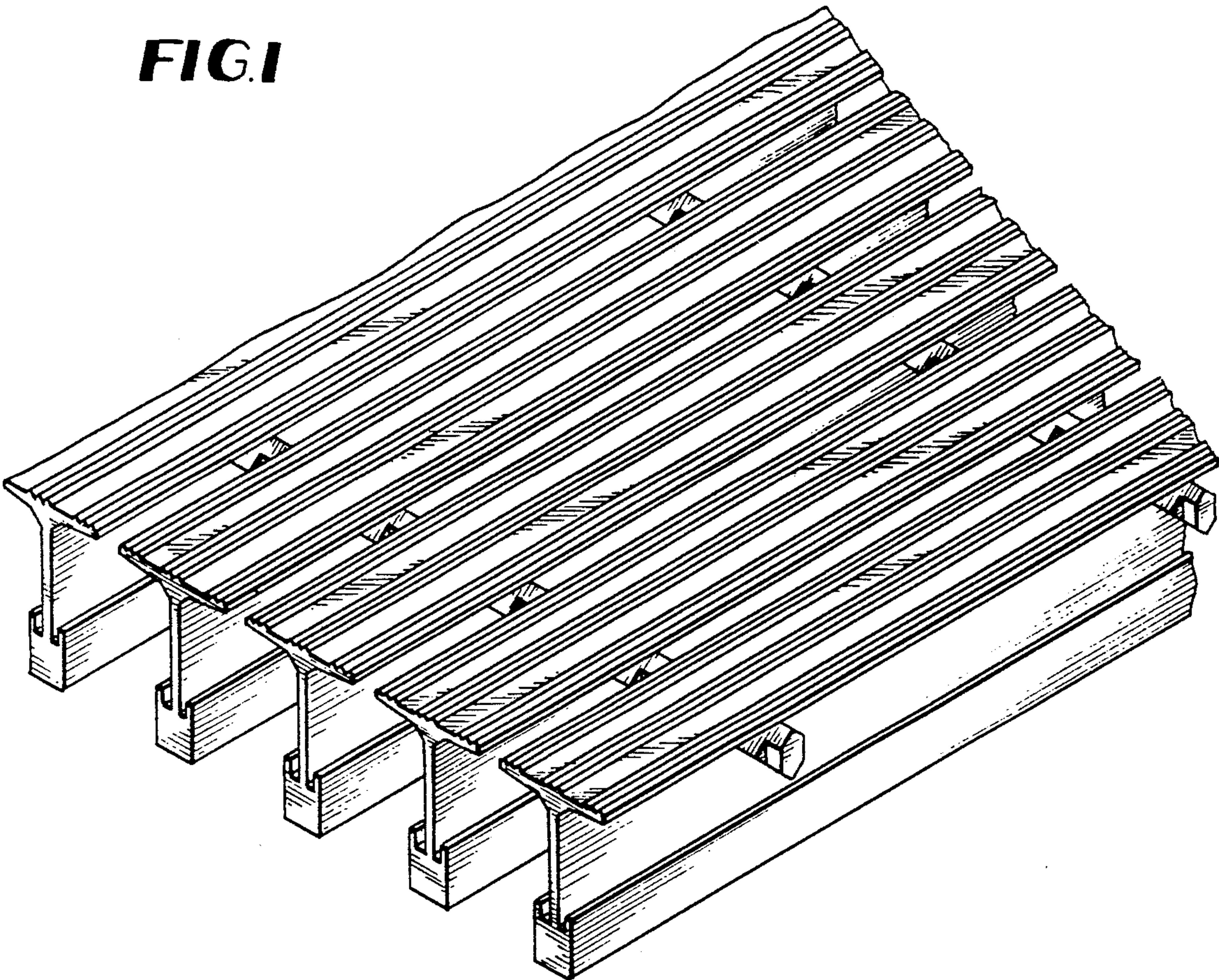

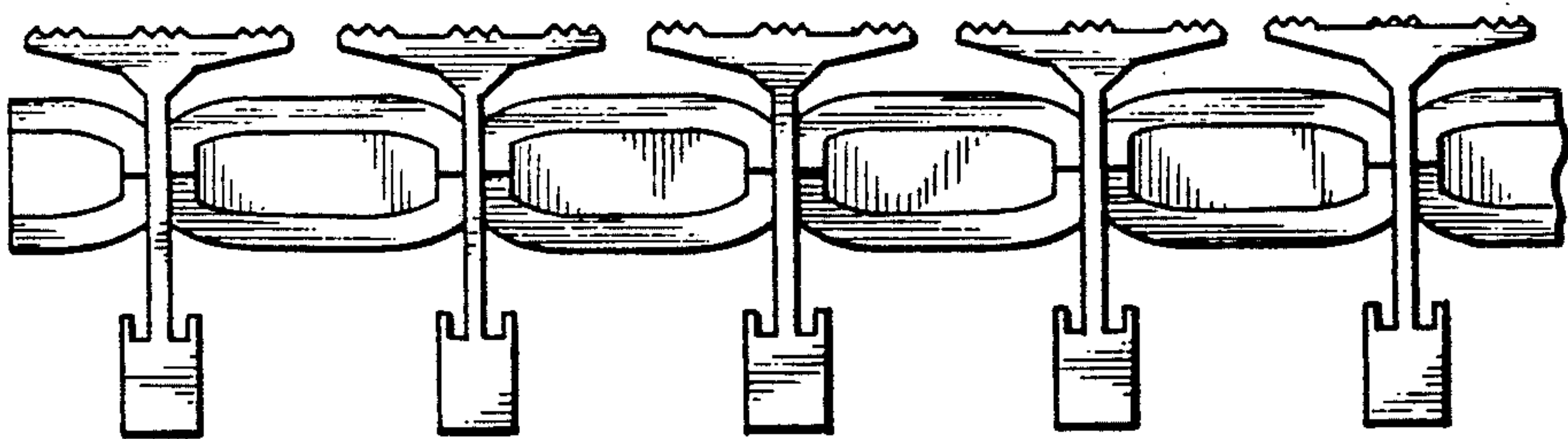

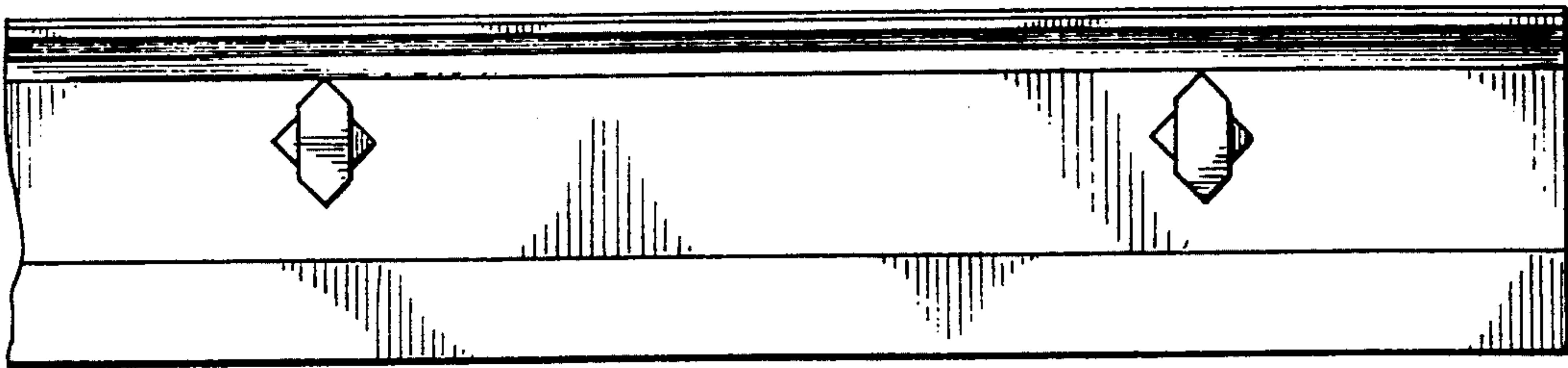

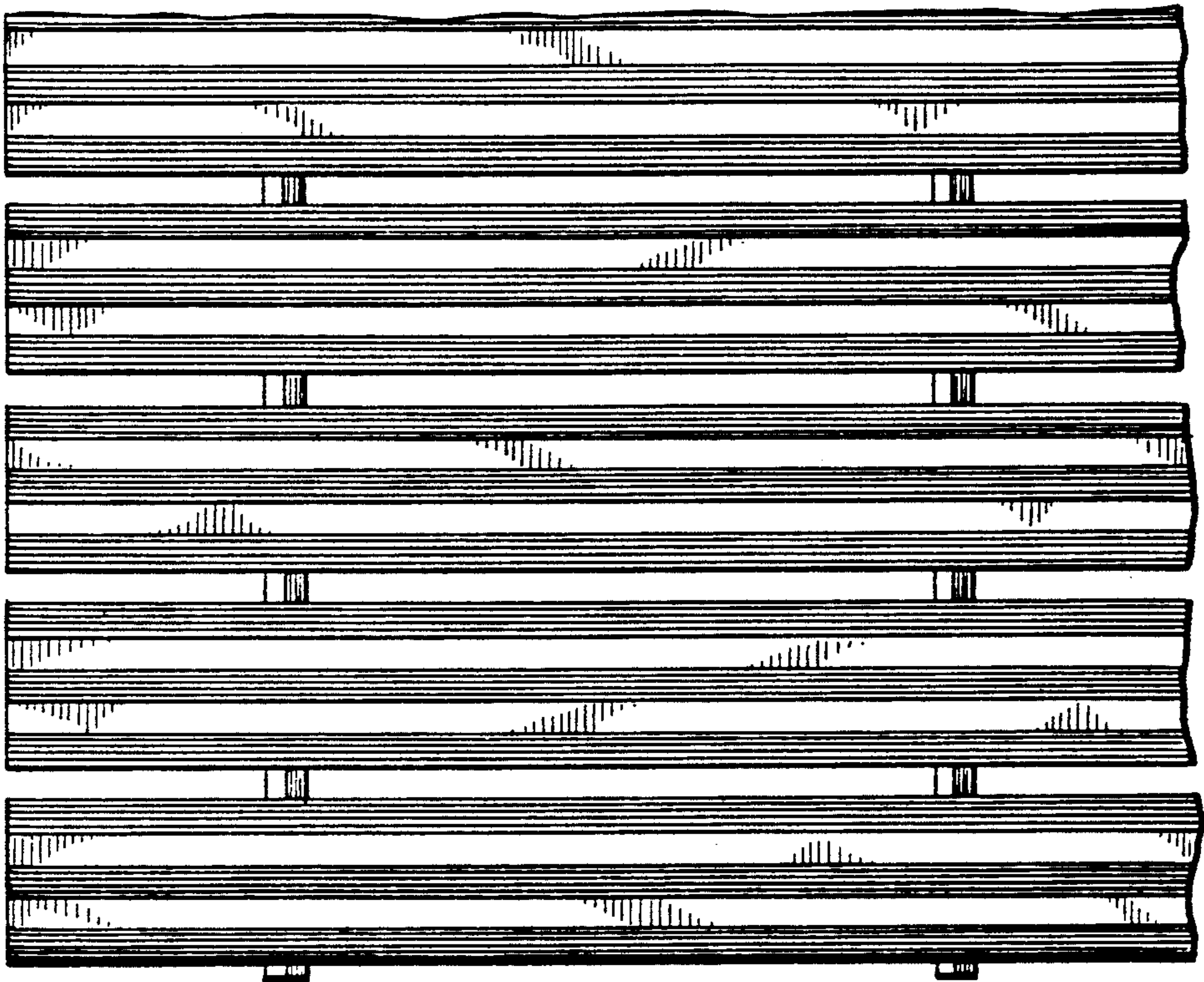

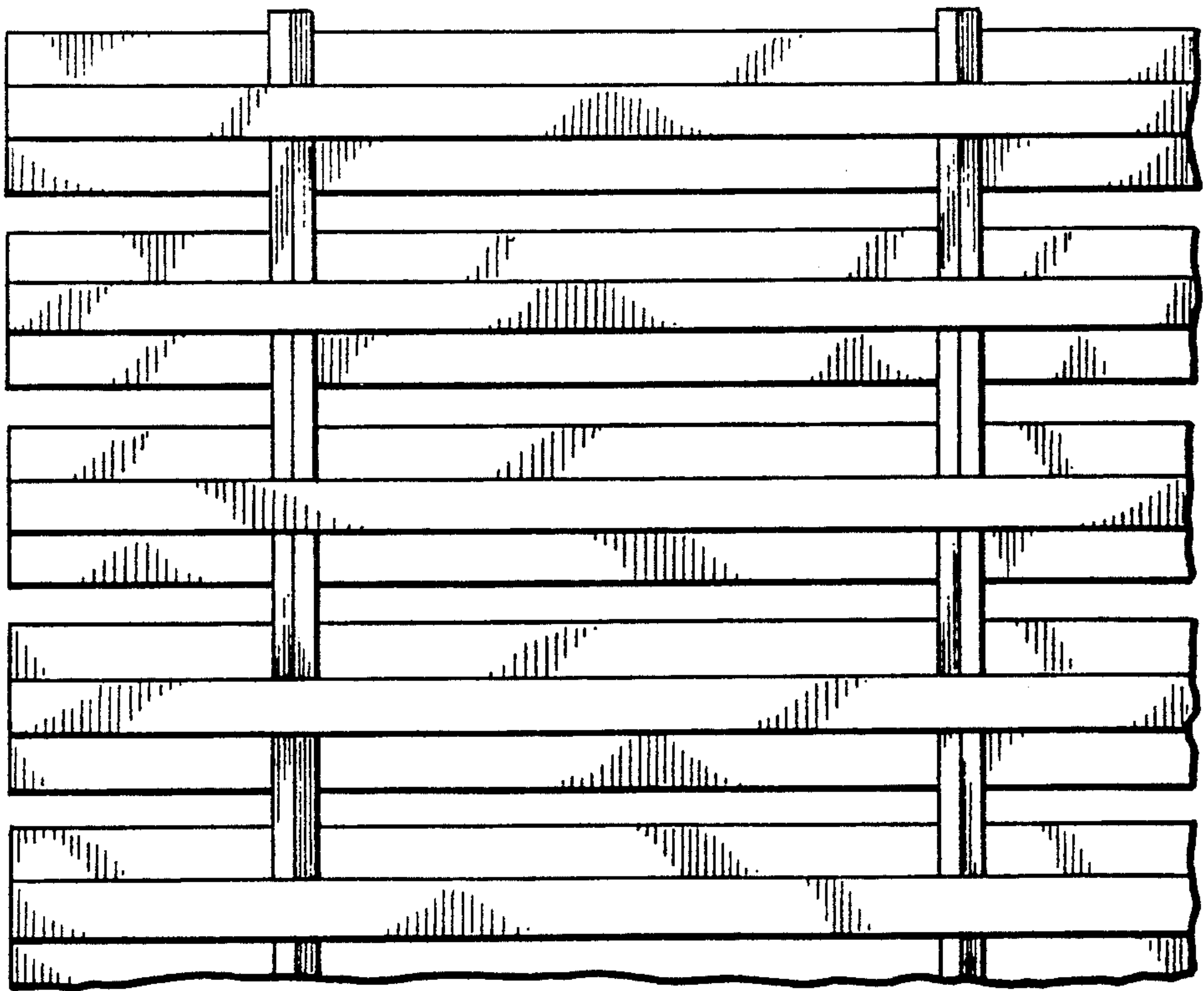

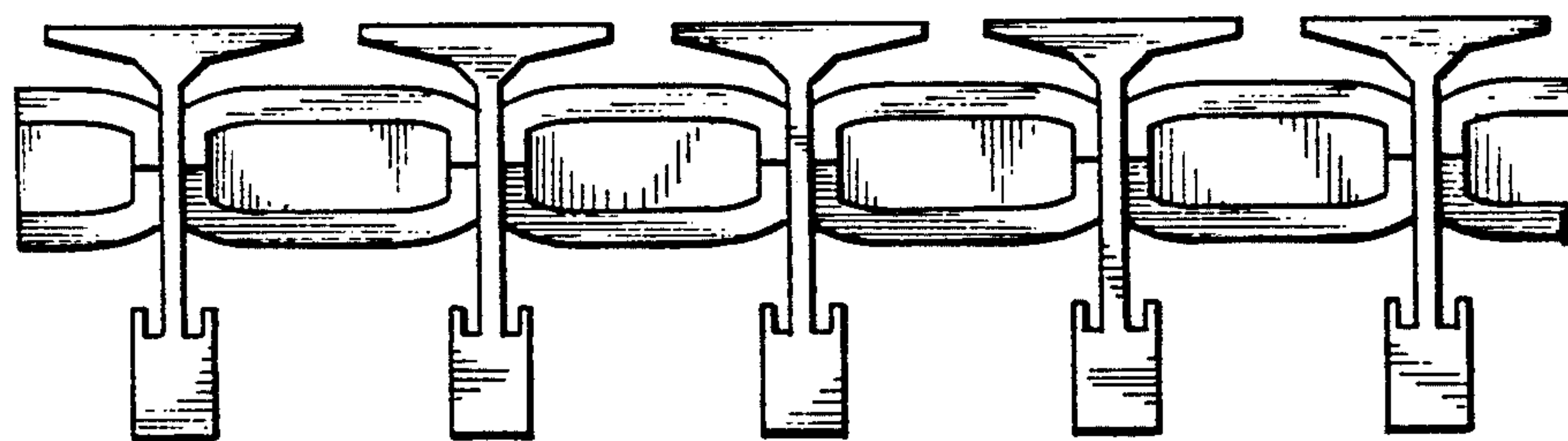
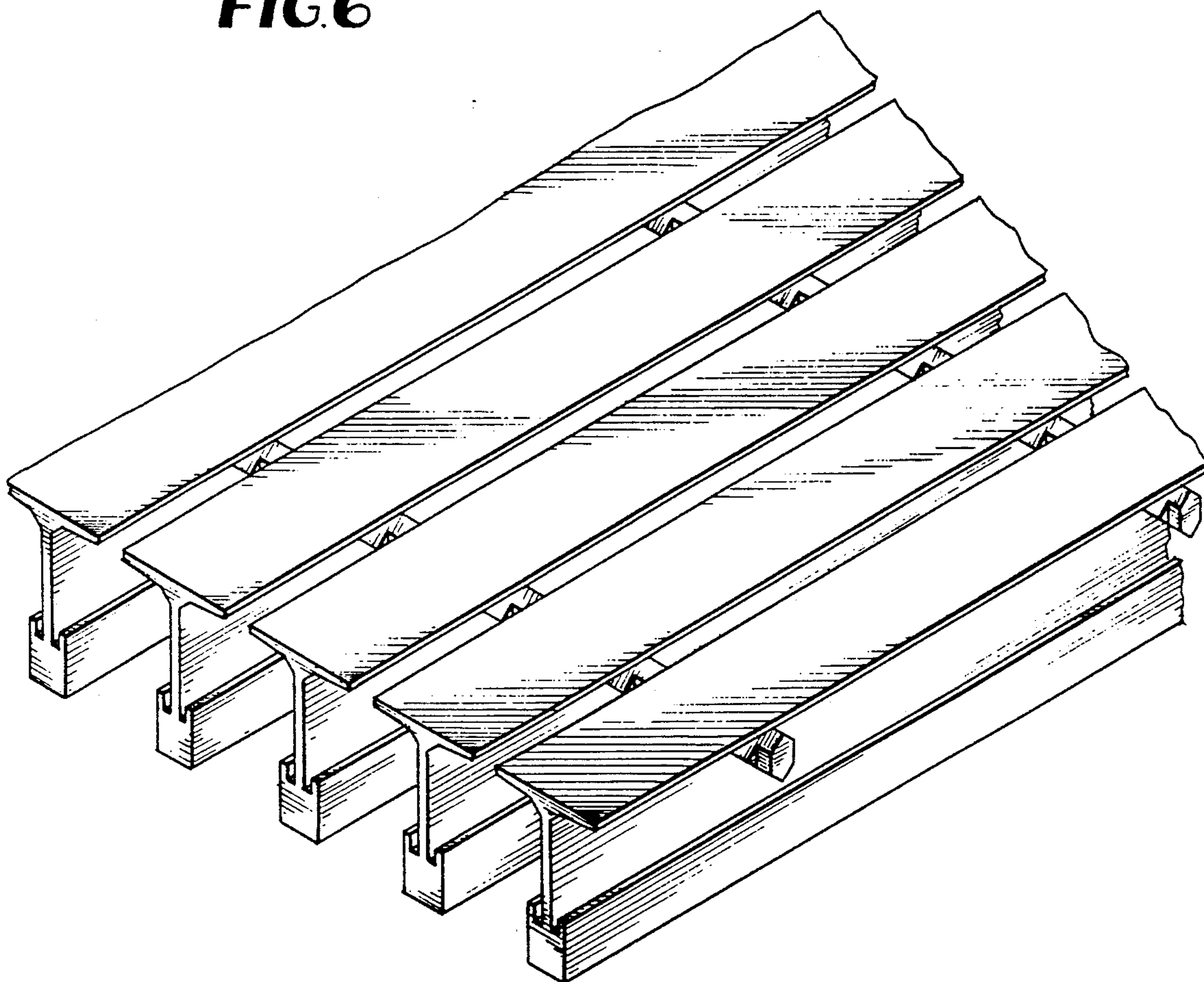

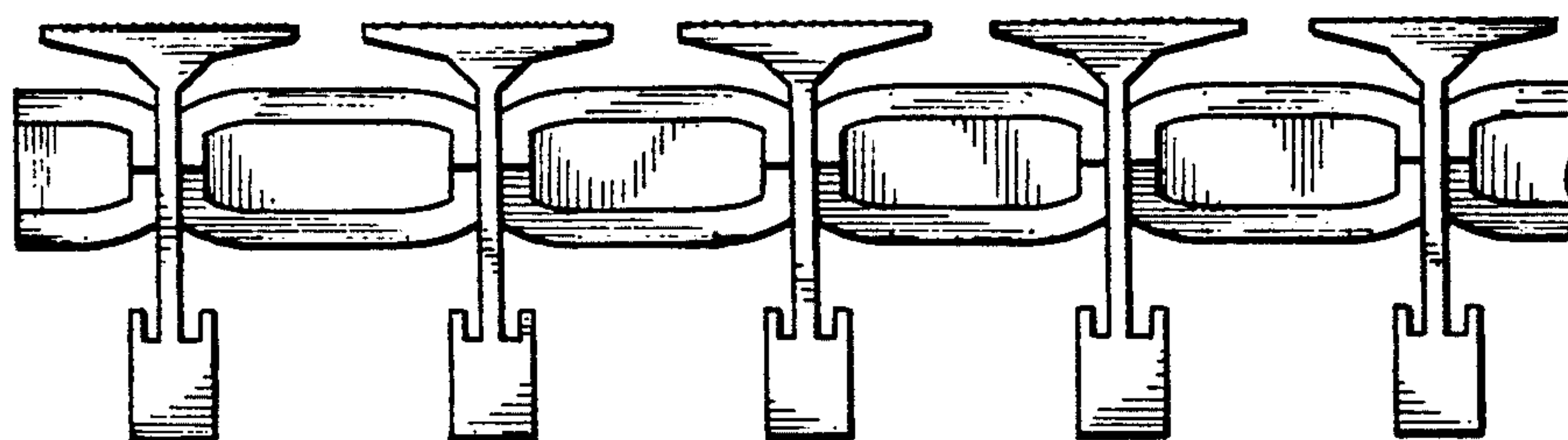
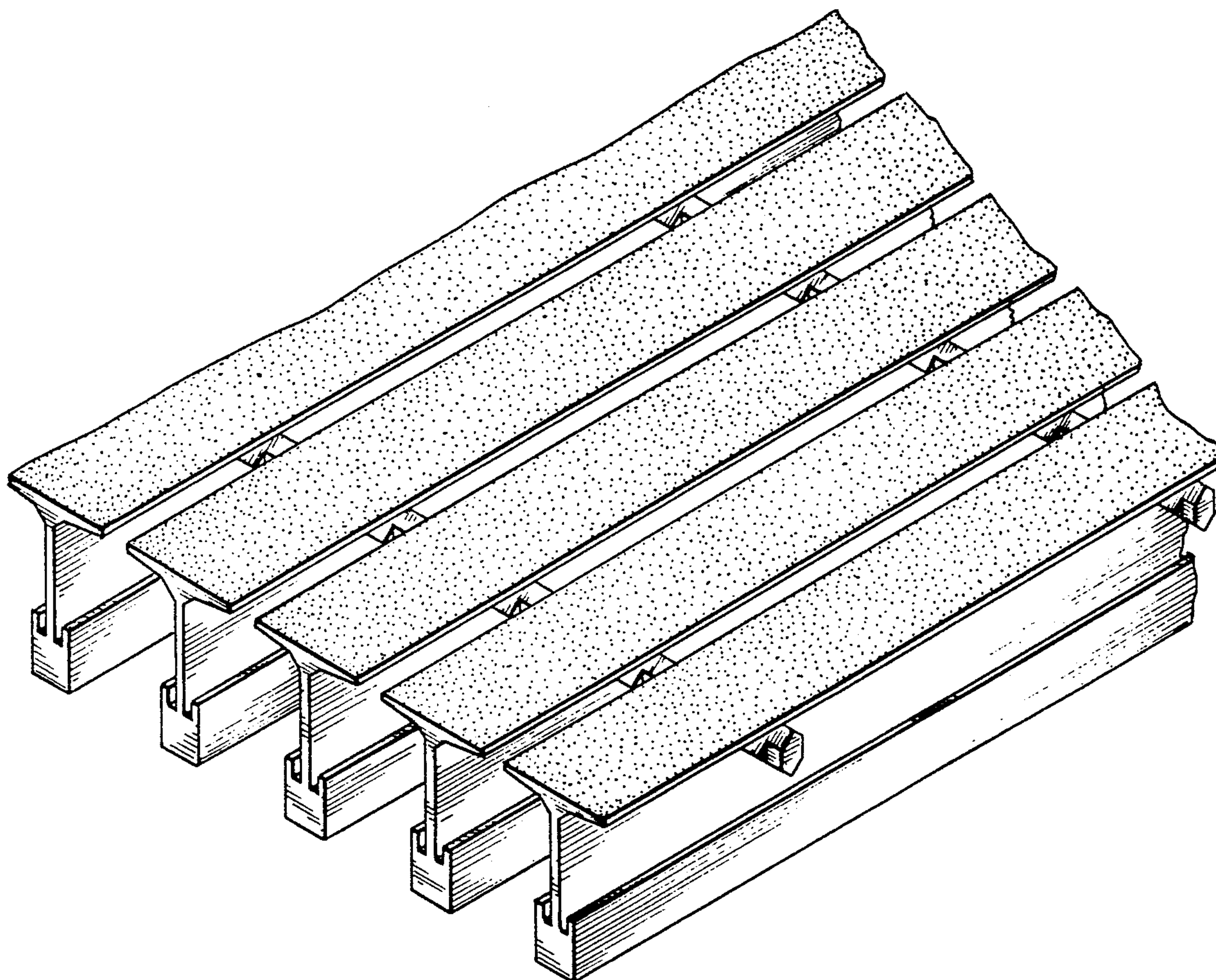

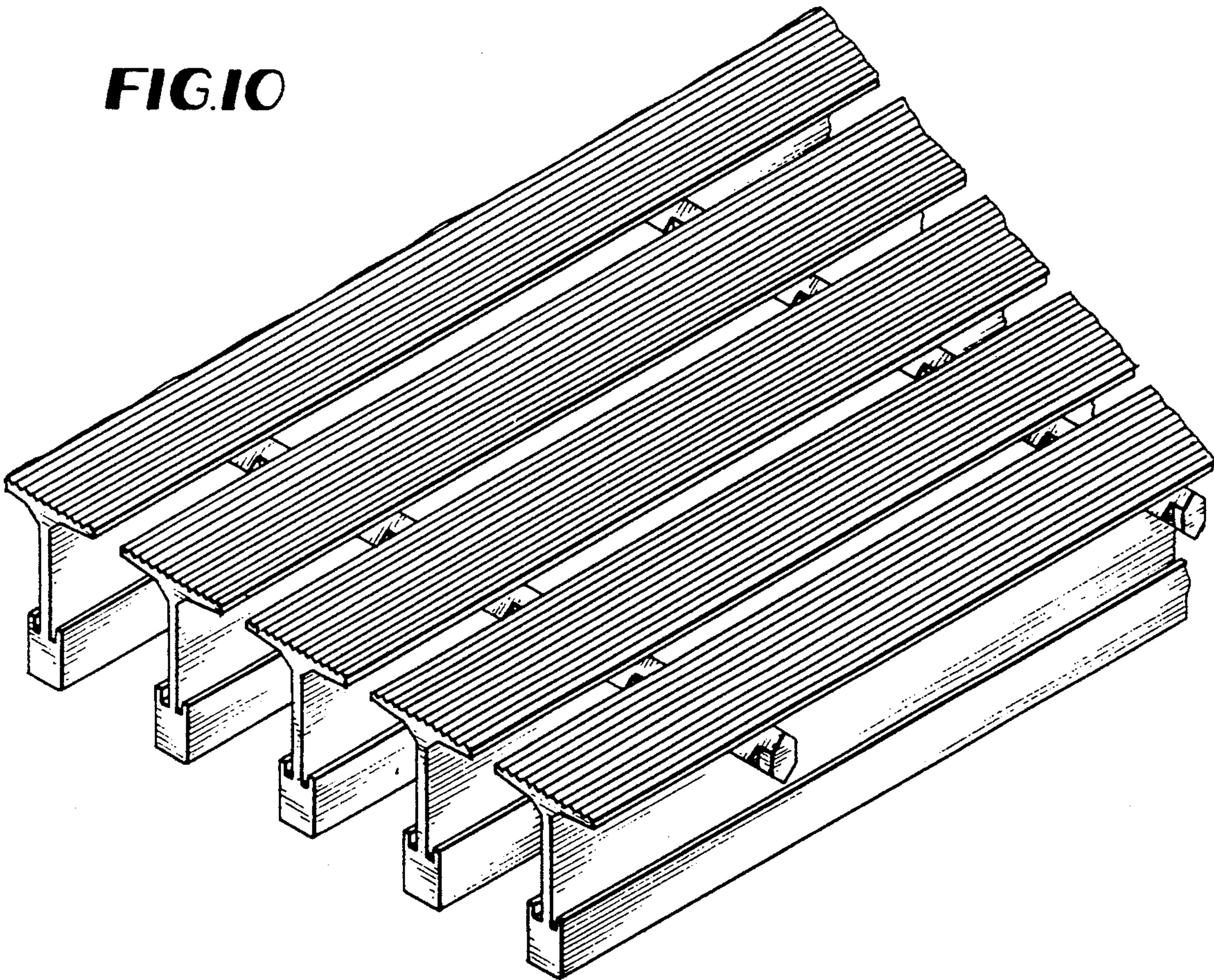
