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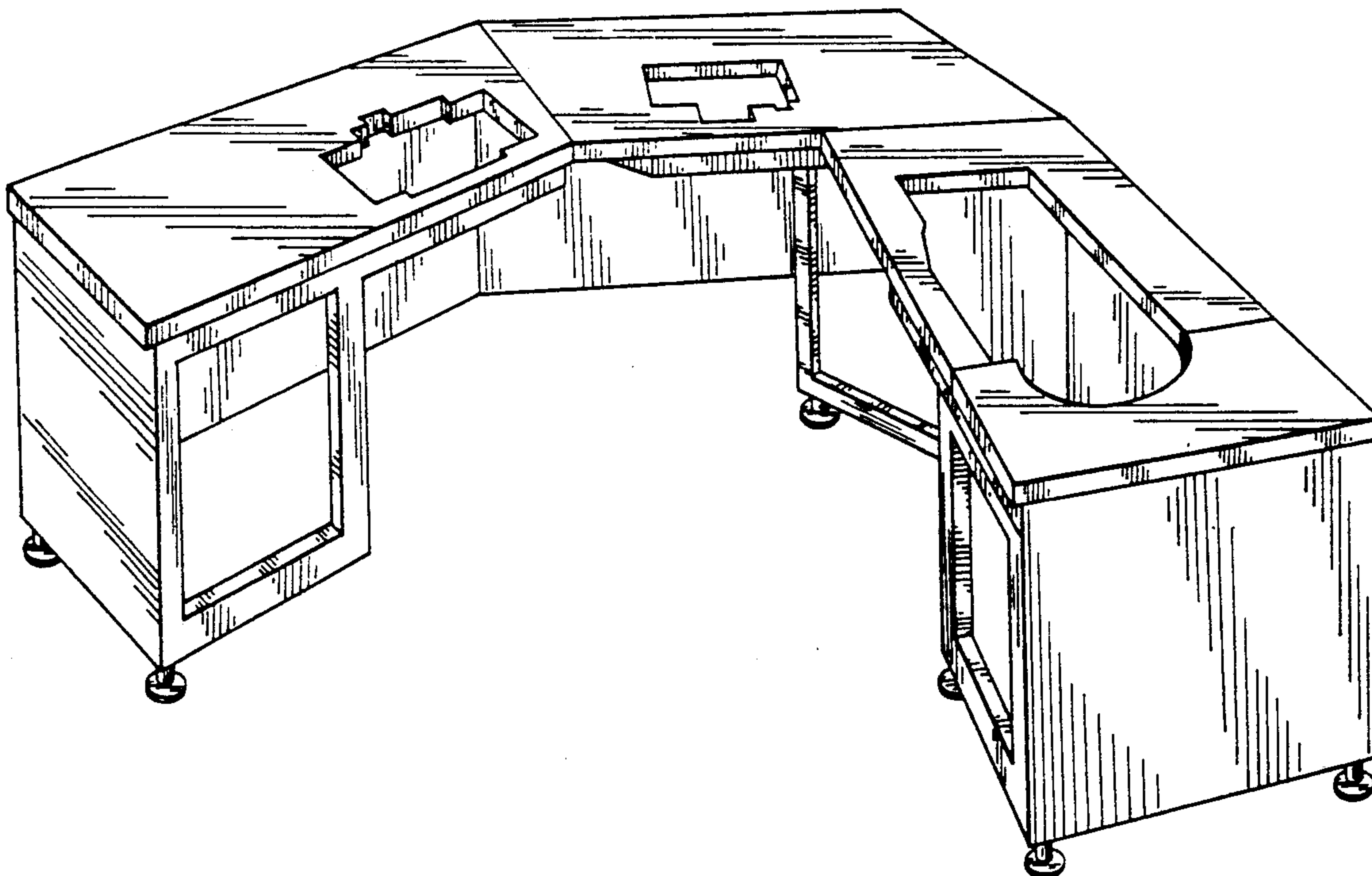
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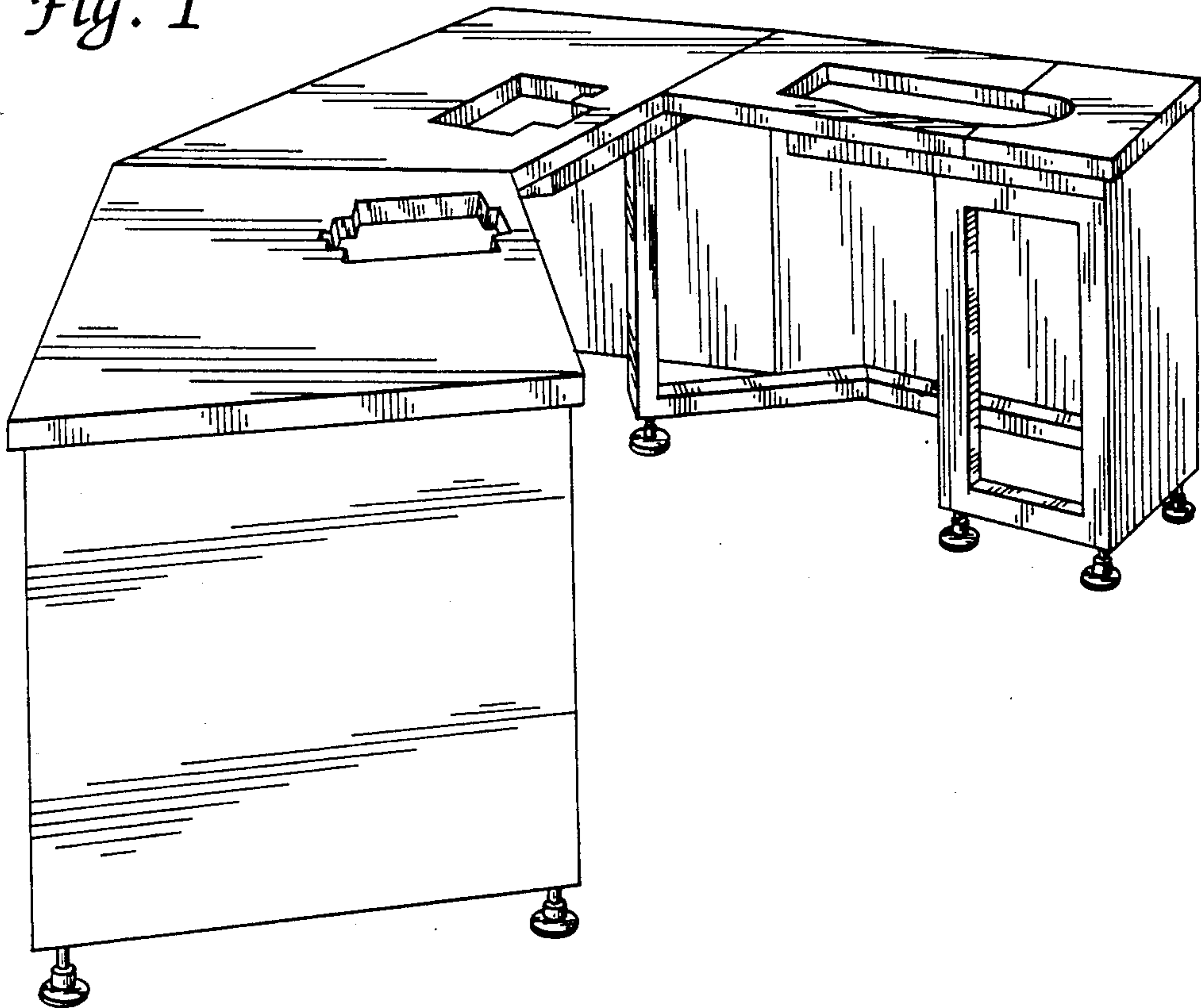
The ornamental design for work station to stitch manufactured items, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a right rear perspective view of a work station to stitch manufactured items, showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a left rear perspective view thereof; FIG. 3 is a reduced top plan view thereof; FIG. 4 is a reduced rear elevational view thereof; FIG. 5 is a reduced front elevational view thereof; FIG. 6 is a reduced right side elevational view thereof; and, FIG. 7 is a reduced left side elevational view thereof.
