DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a circuit breaker showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof;

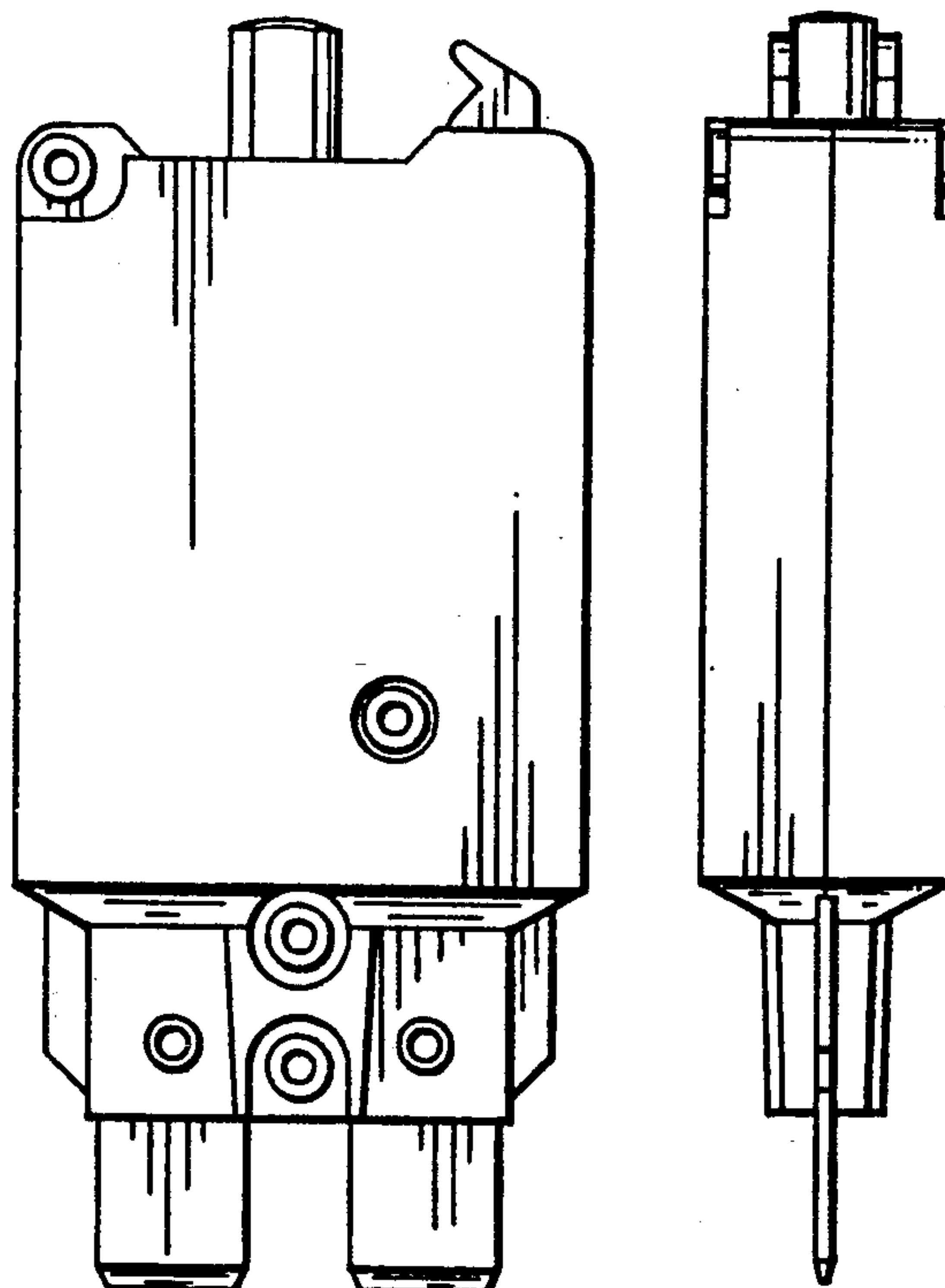
FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof; and,

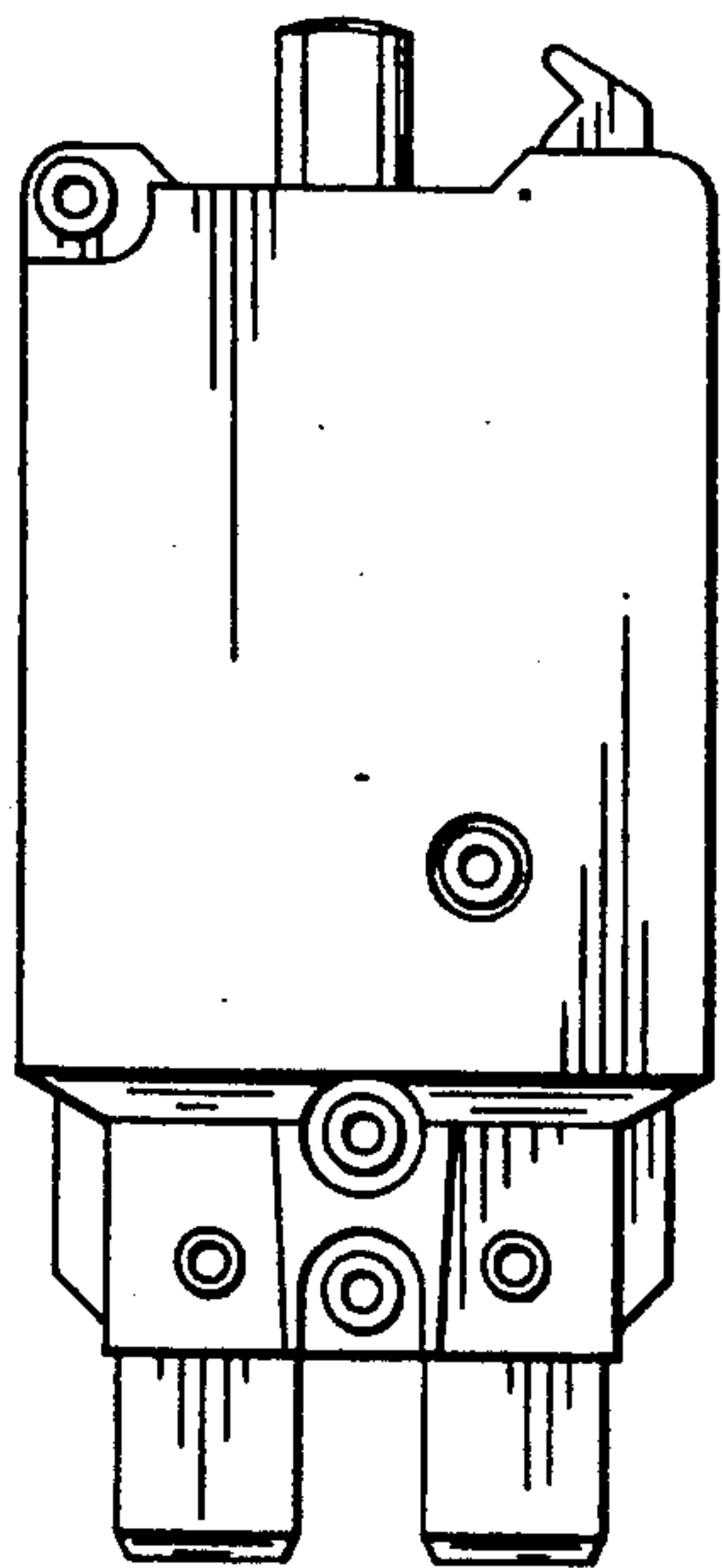

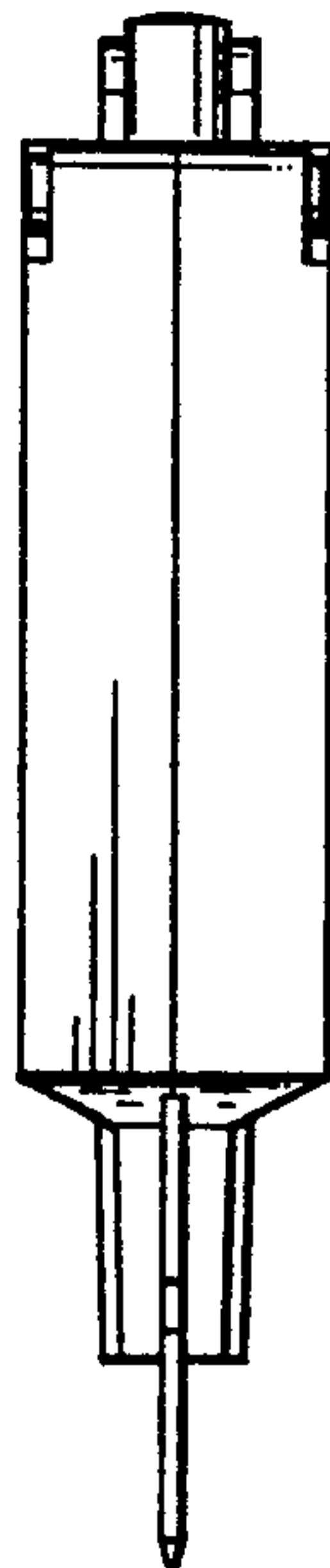

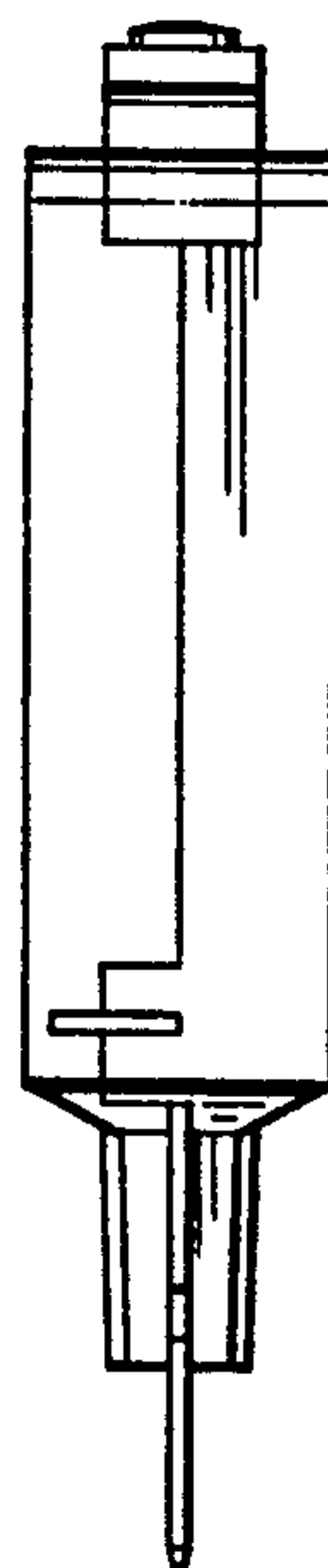

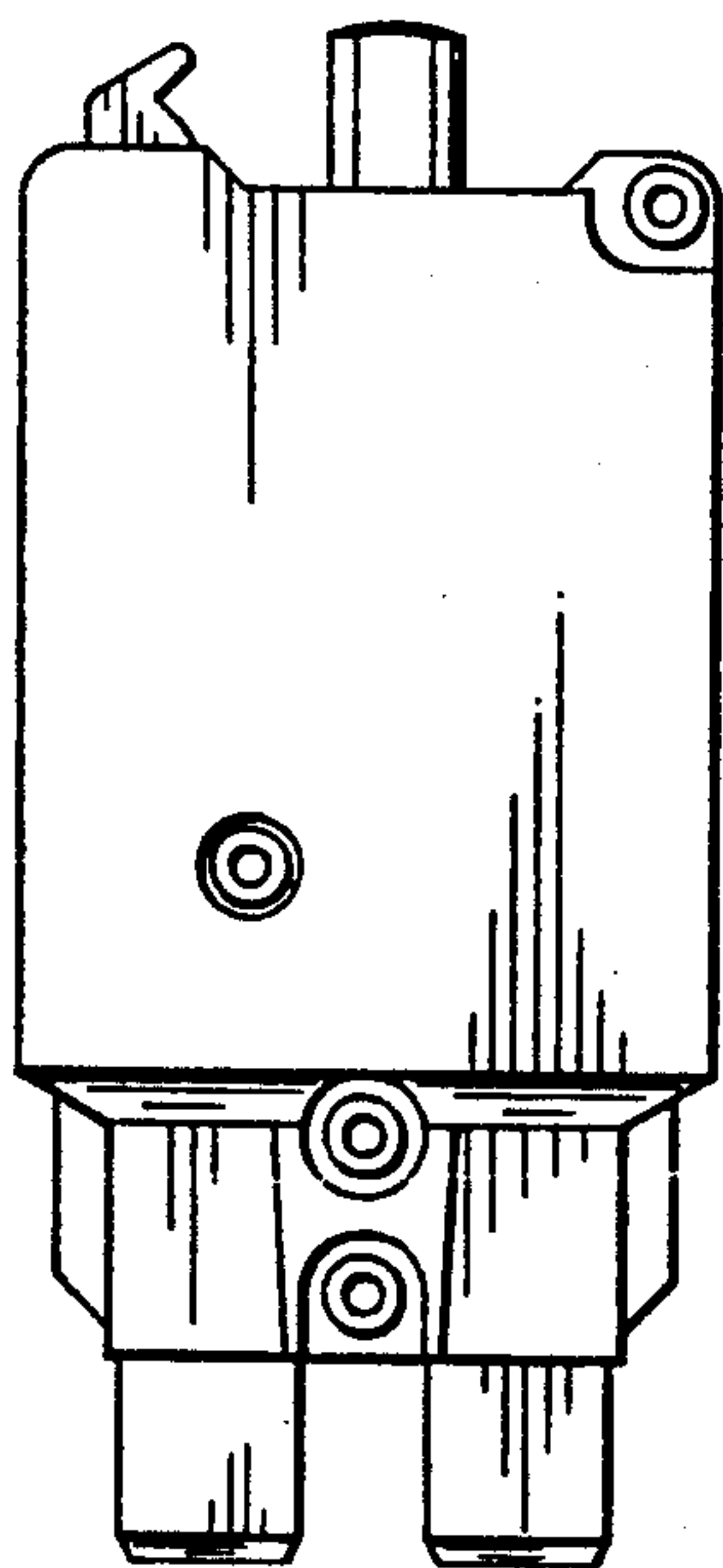

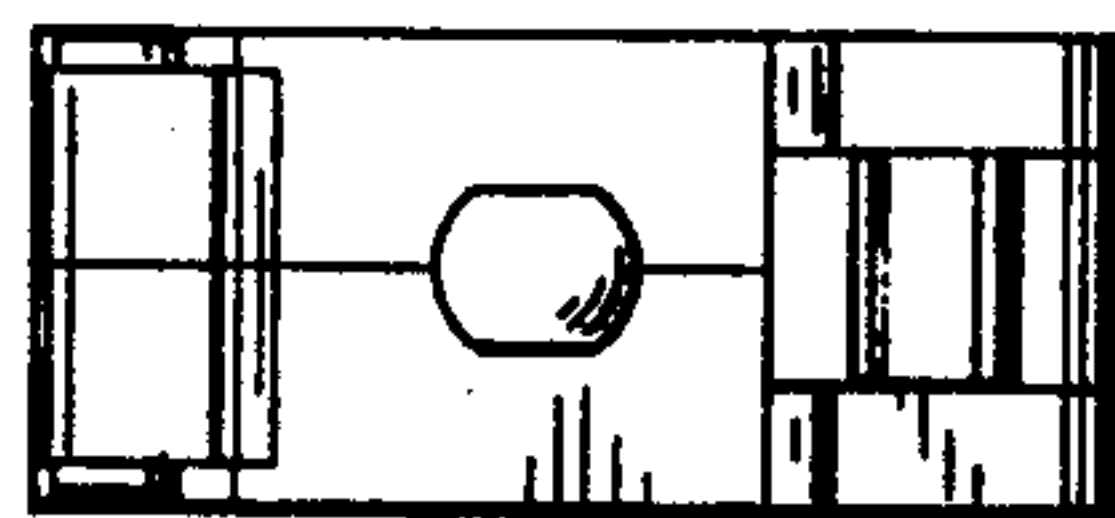

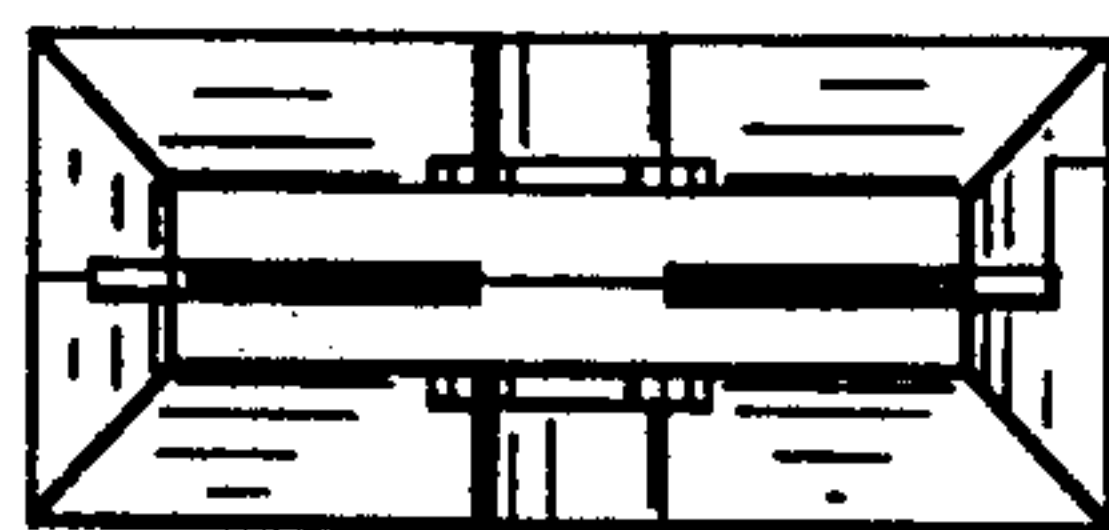

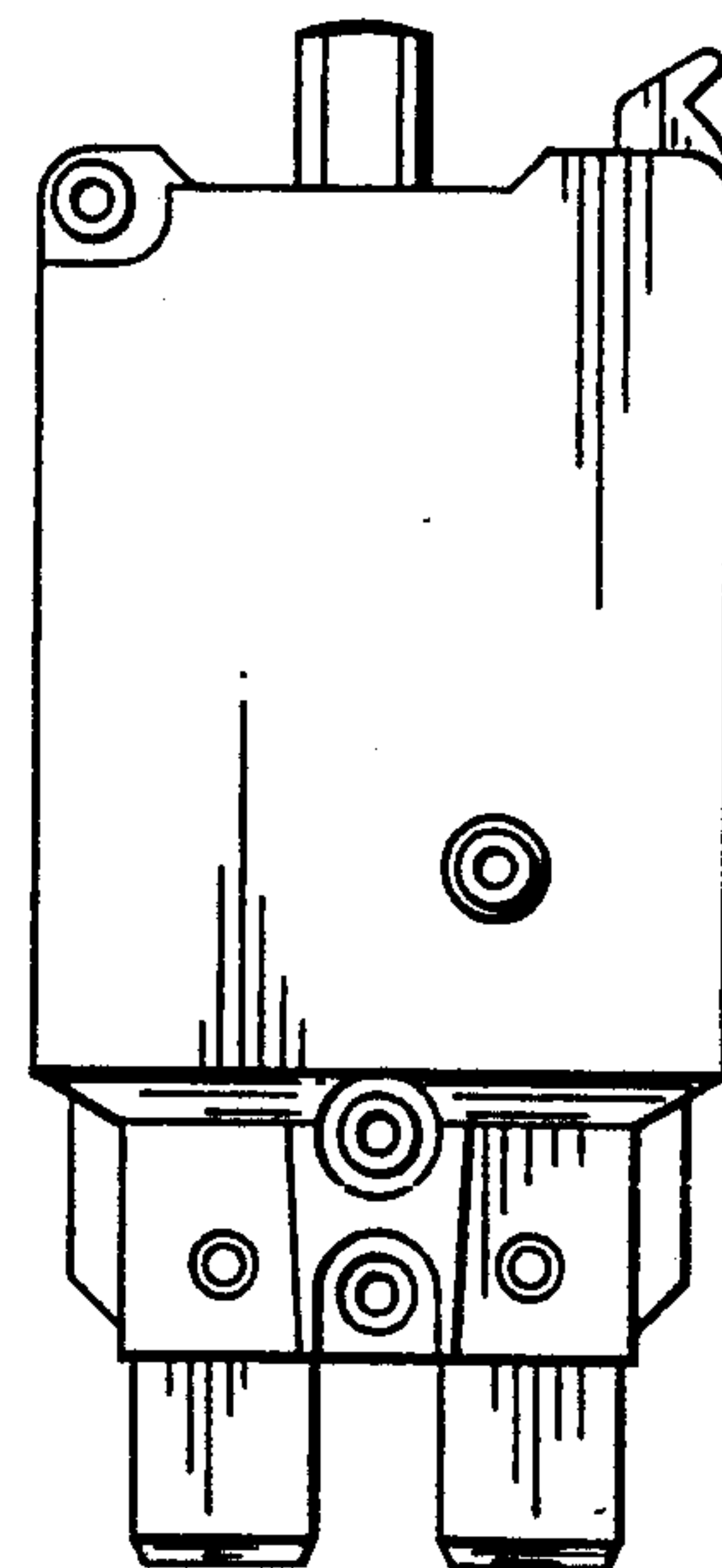
