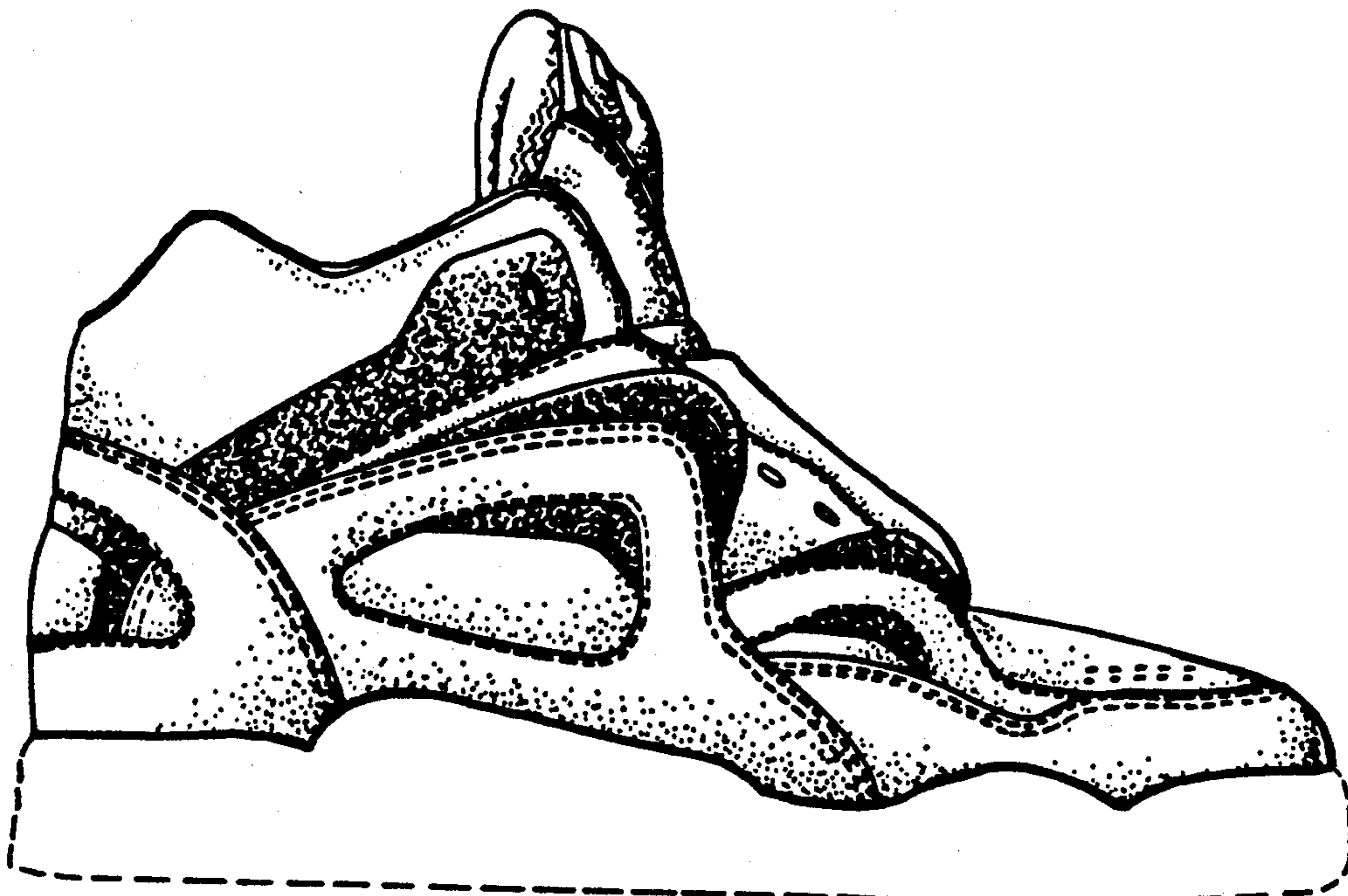

The ornamental design for a shoe upper, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is left side elevational view of a shoe upper showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof; and,
FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof.
The broken line showing of a shoe sole in the figures is environmental only and forms no part of the claimed design.



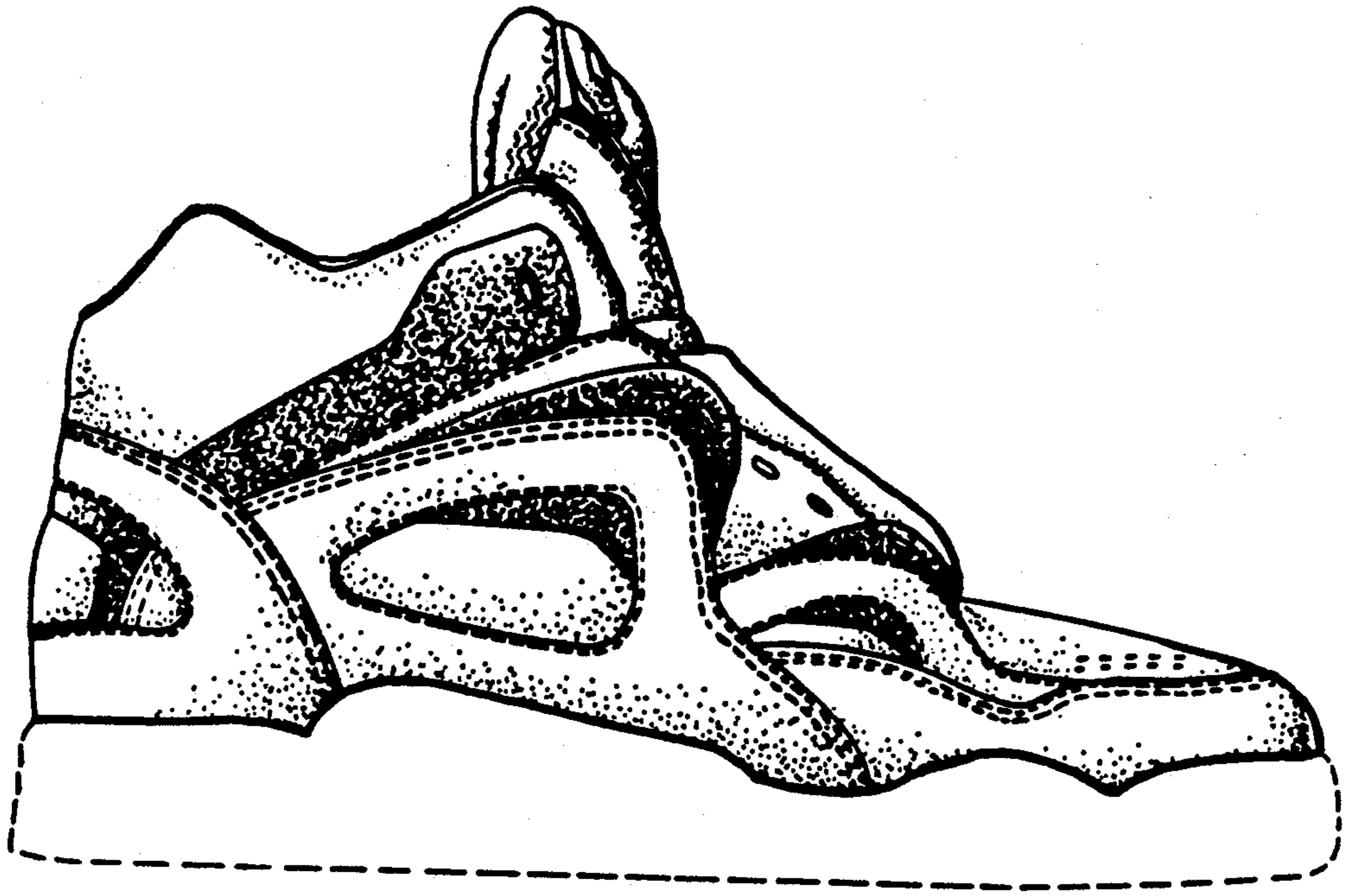

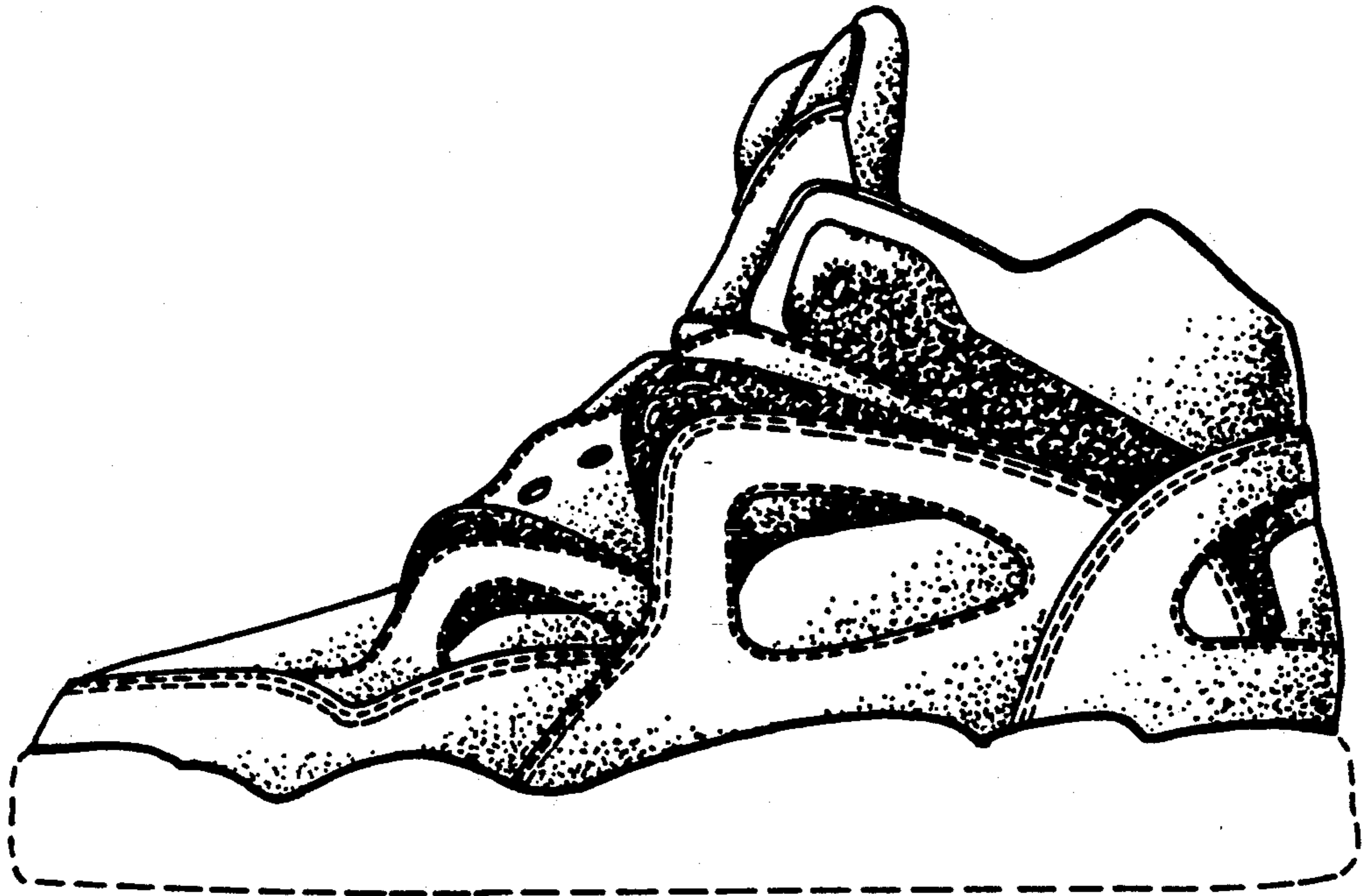

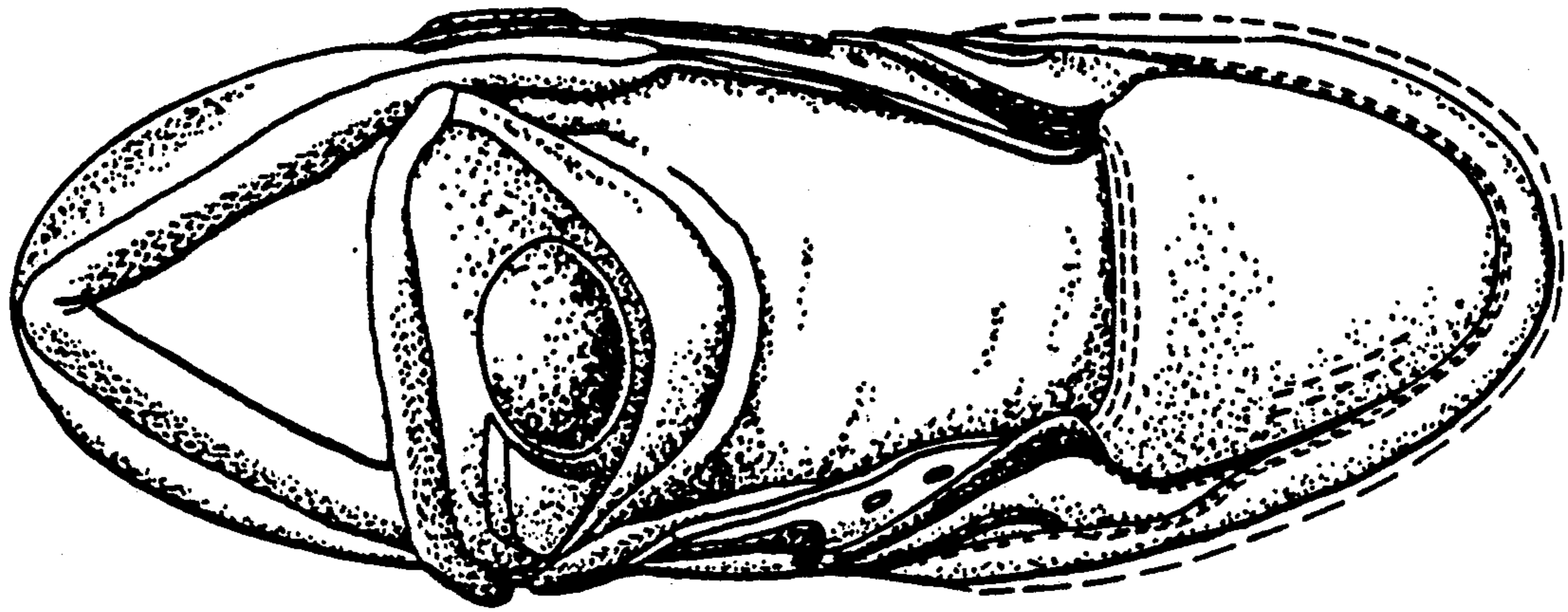

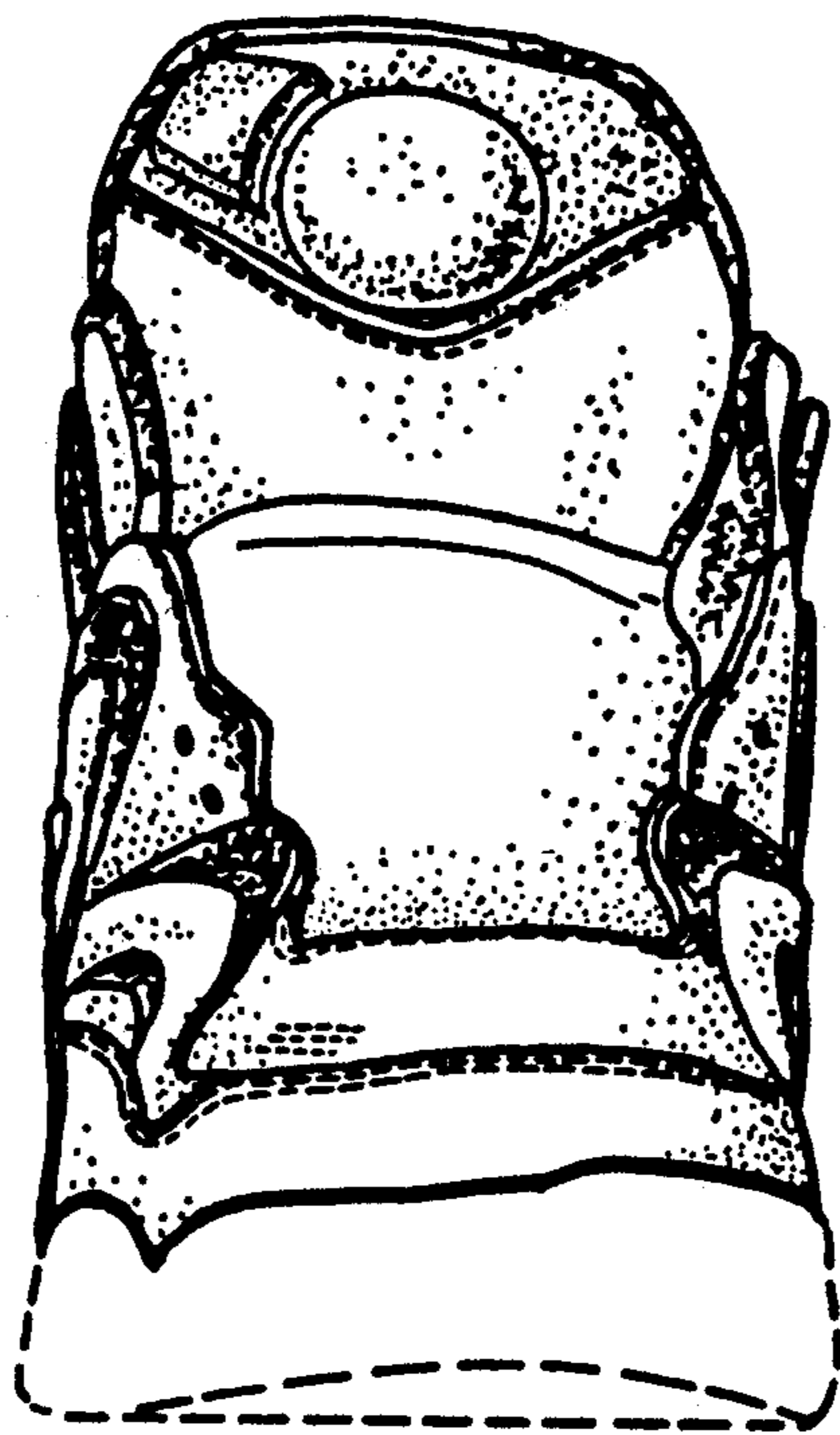

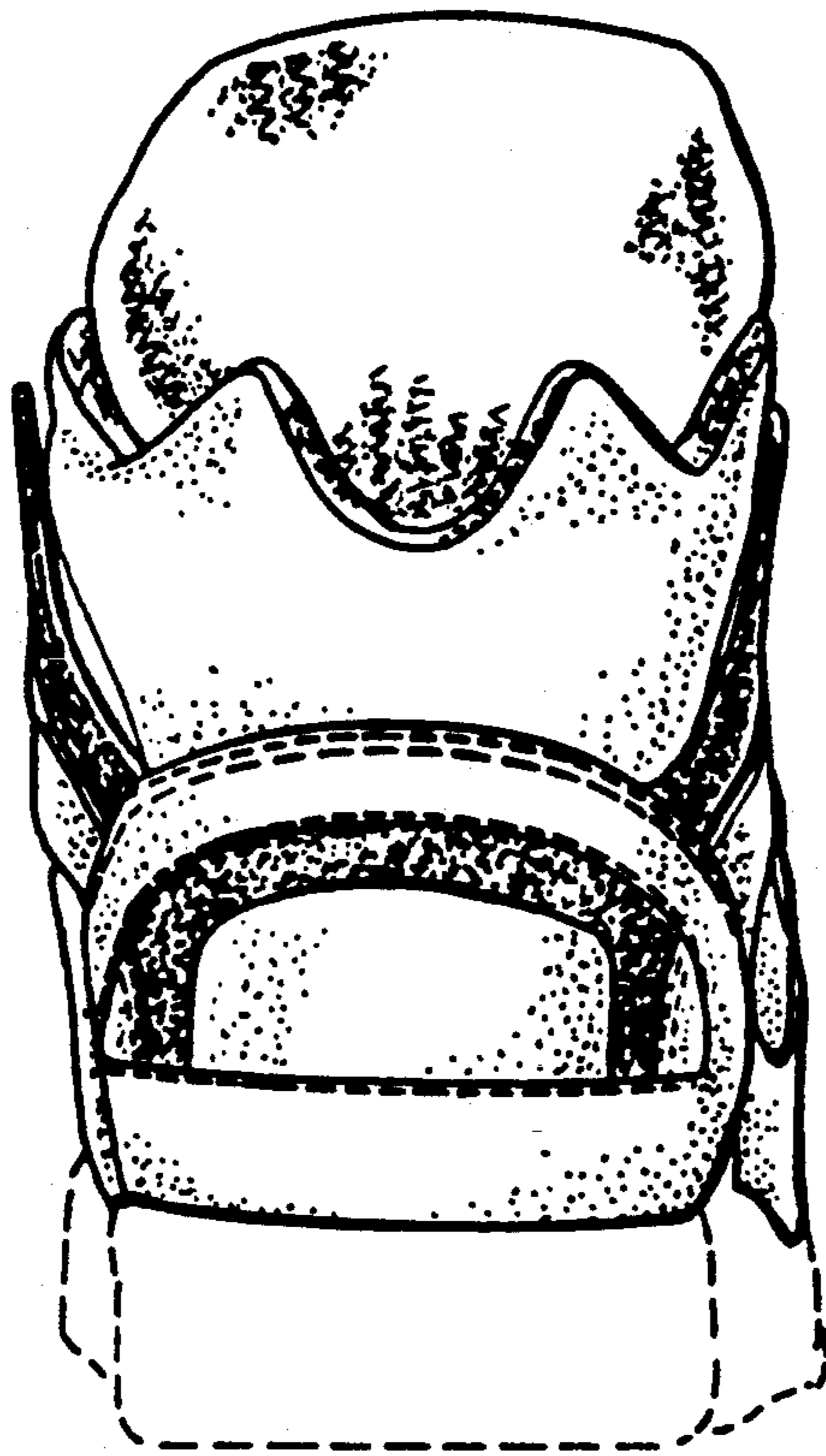
