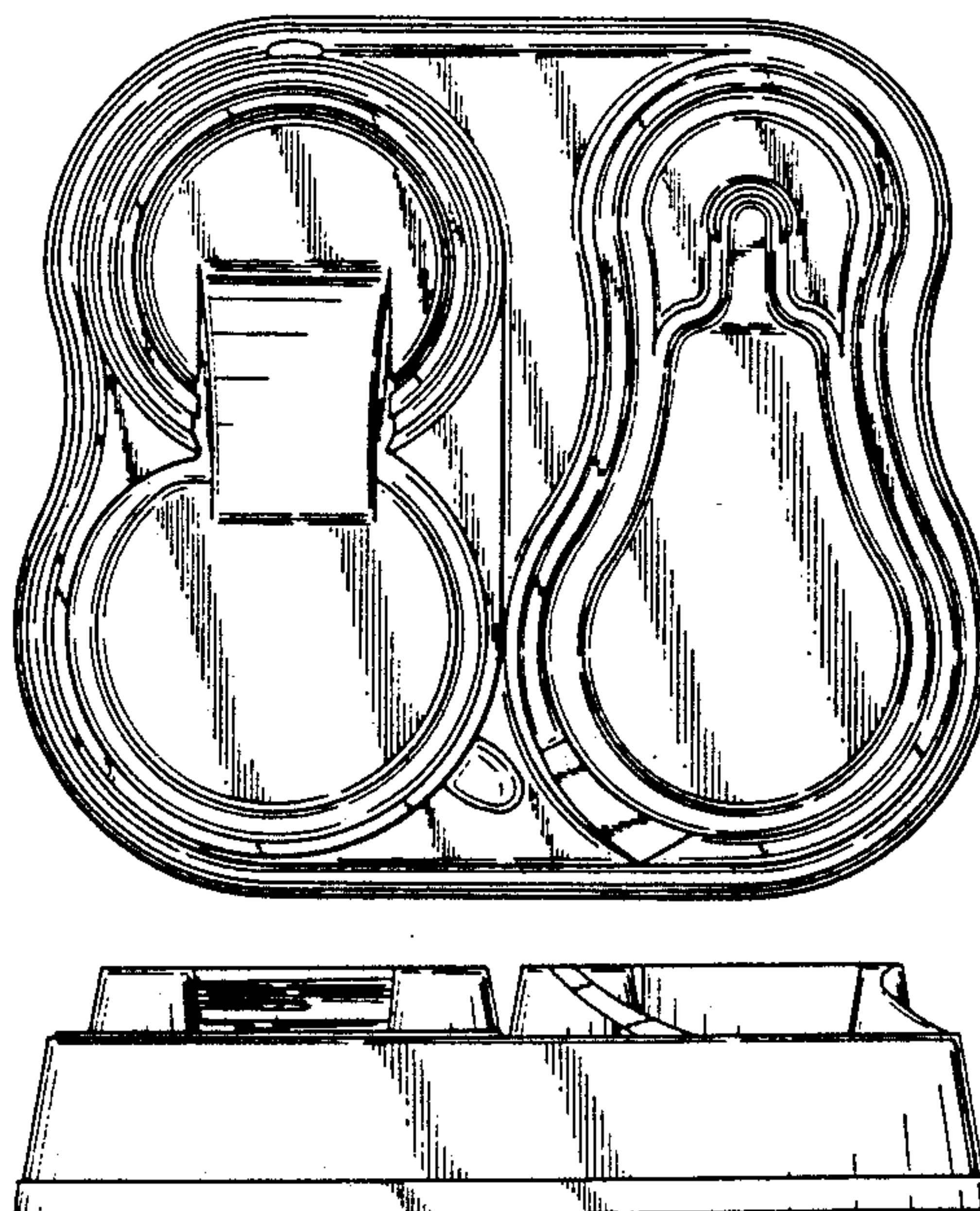

[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a combined automatic pet waterer and feeder with removable food dish, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a combined automatic pet waterer and feeder showing our new design; FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof; FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof; FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof; FIG. 6 is a right side elevational view thereof; FIG. 7 is a top plan view showing the pet dish removed for ease of illustration; FIG. 8 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 9 is a front elevational view thereof; FIG. 10 is a rear elevational view thereof; FIG. 11 is a left side elevational view thereof; FIG. 12 is a right side elevational view thereof; FIG. 13 is a top plan view of the food dish; FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 15 is a right side elevational view thereof; FIG. 16 is a left side elevational view thereof; FIG. 17 is a front elevational view thereof; FIG. 18 is a rear elevational view thereof; and, FIG. 19 is a cross sectional view taken on line 19—19 of FIG. 13.



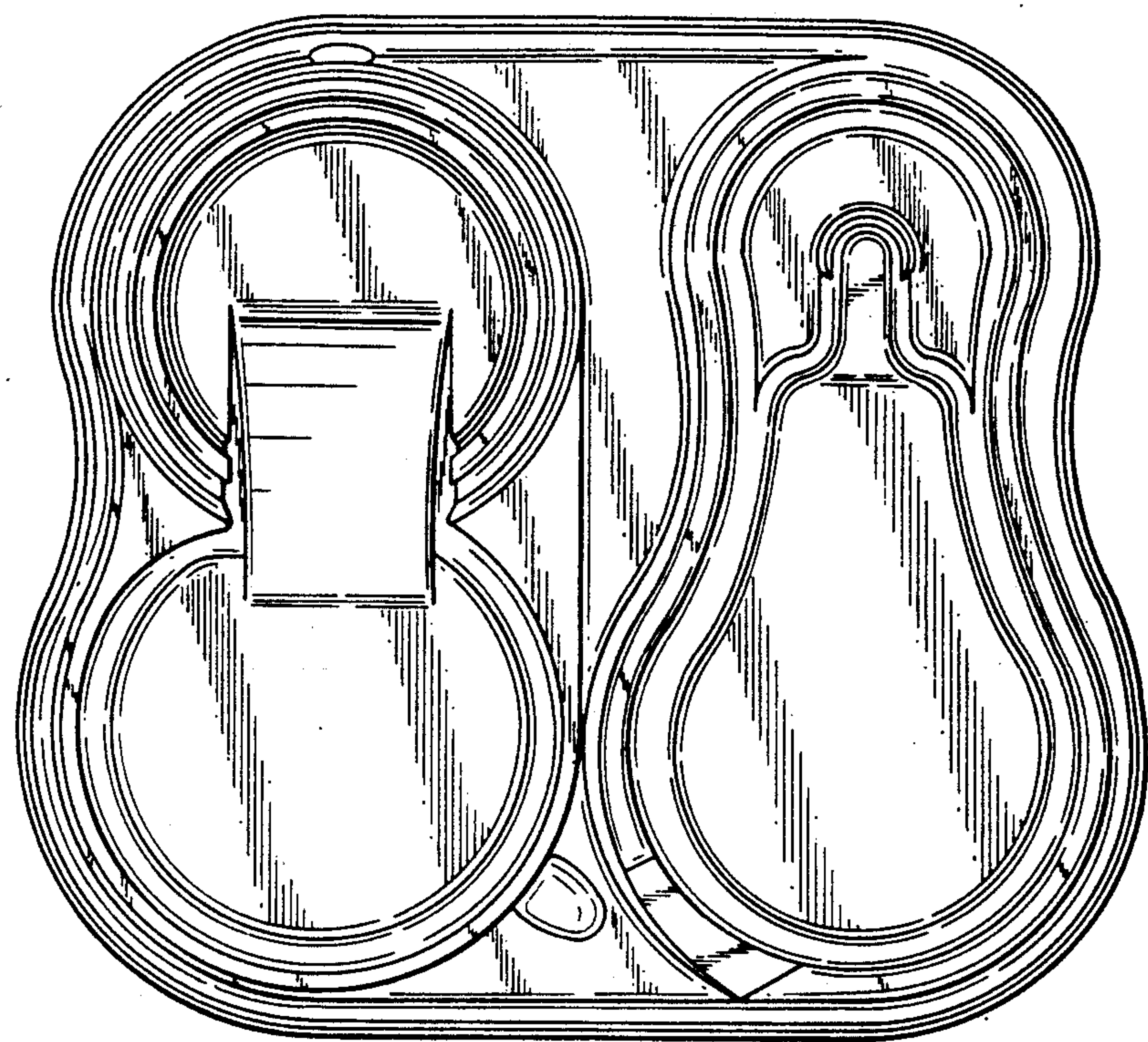

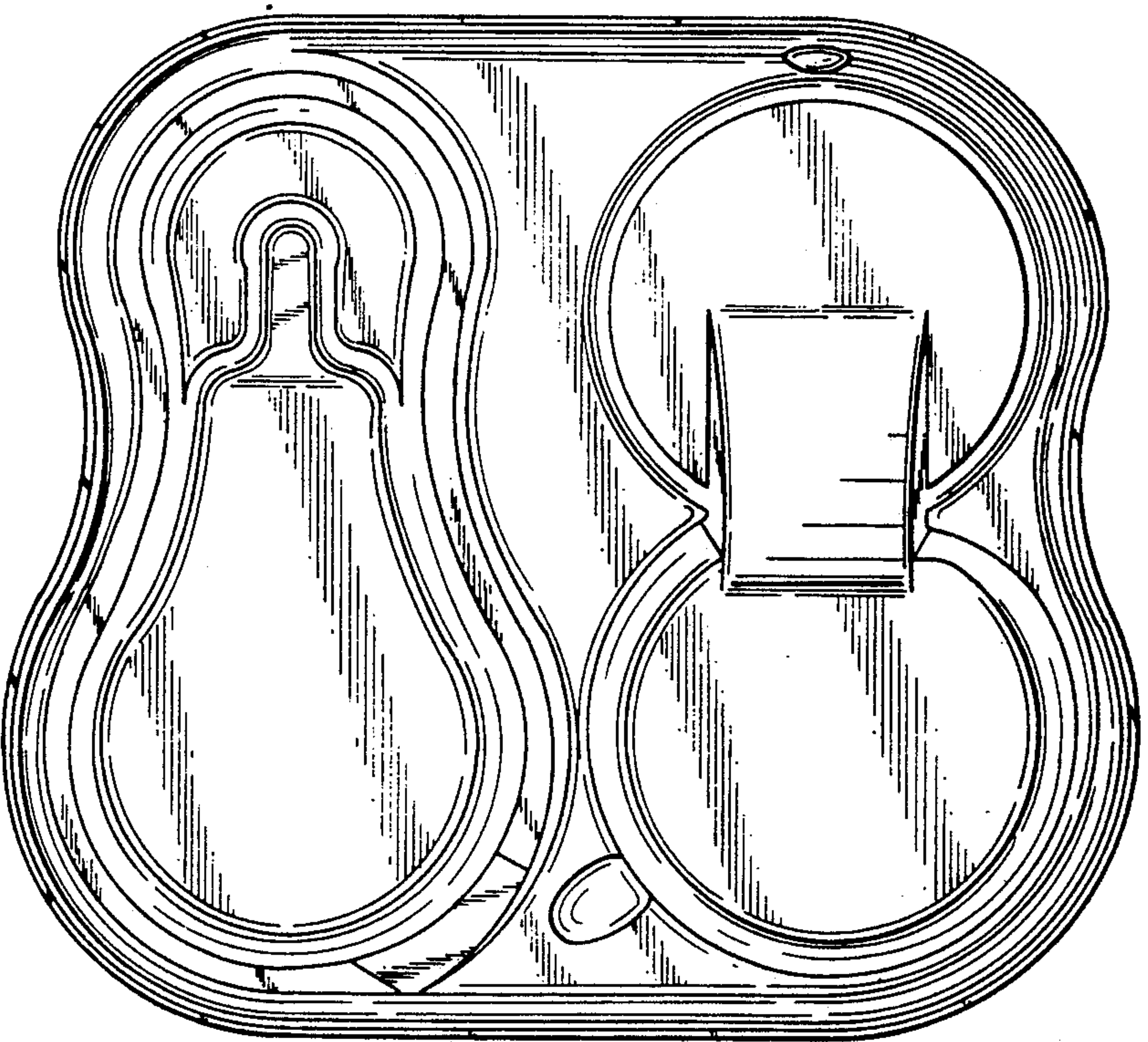

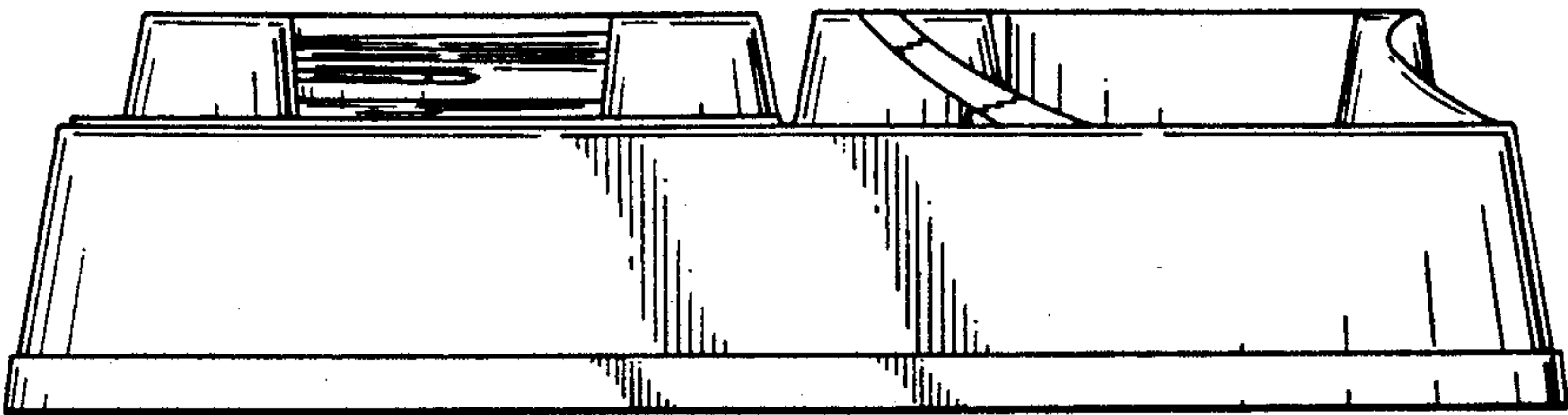

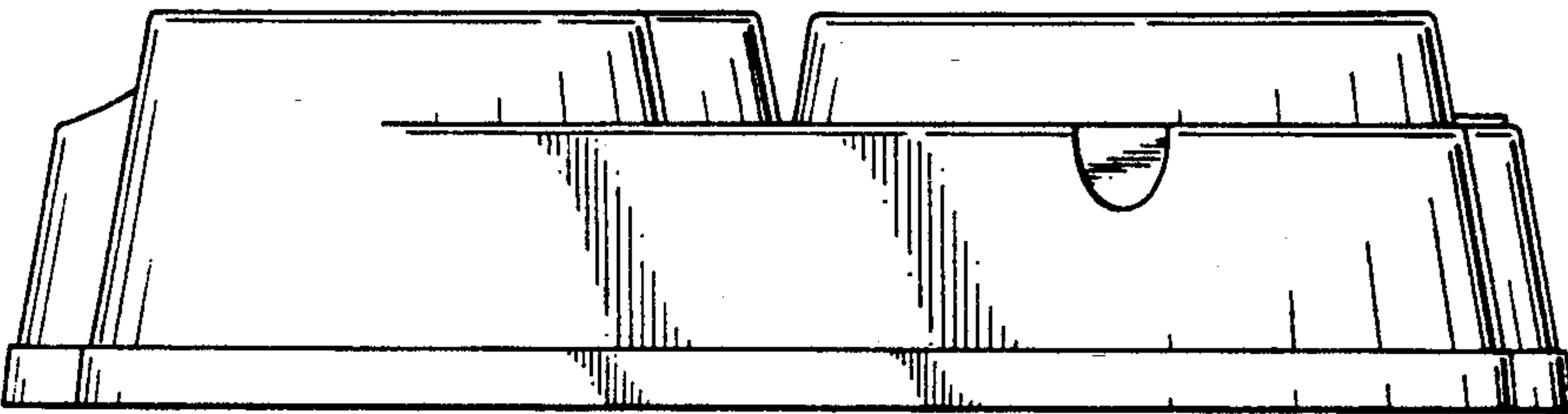

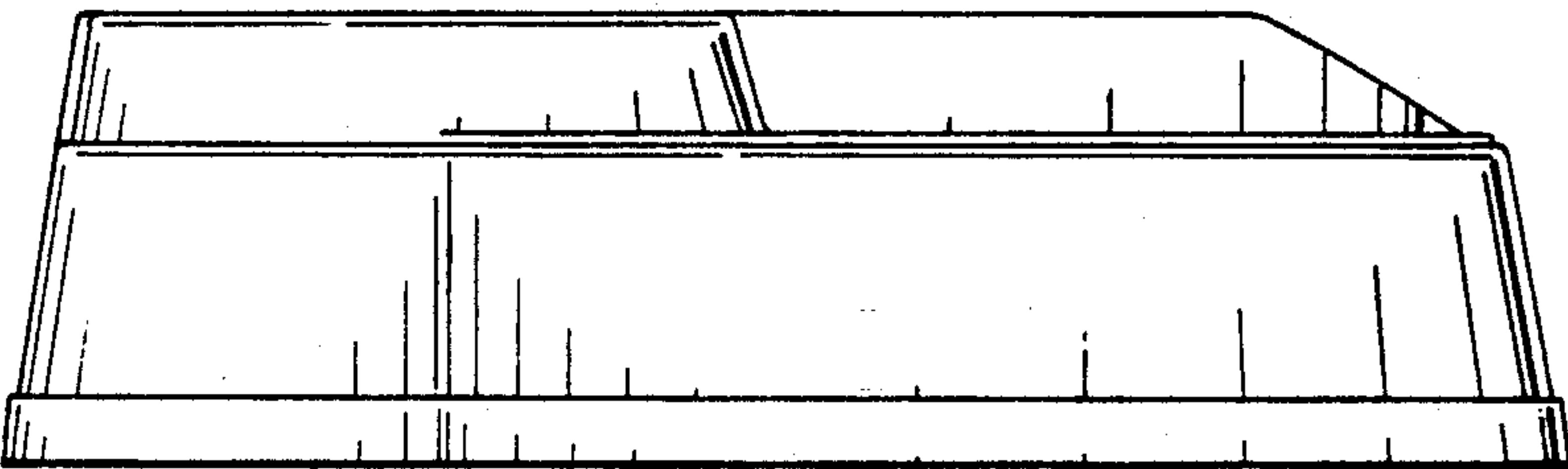

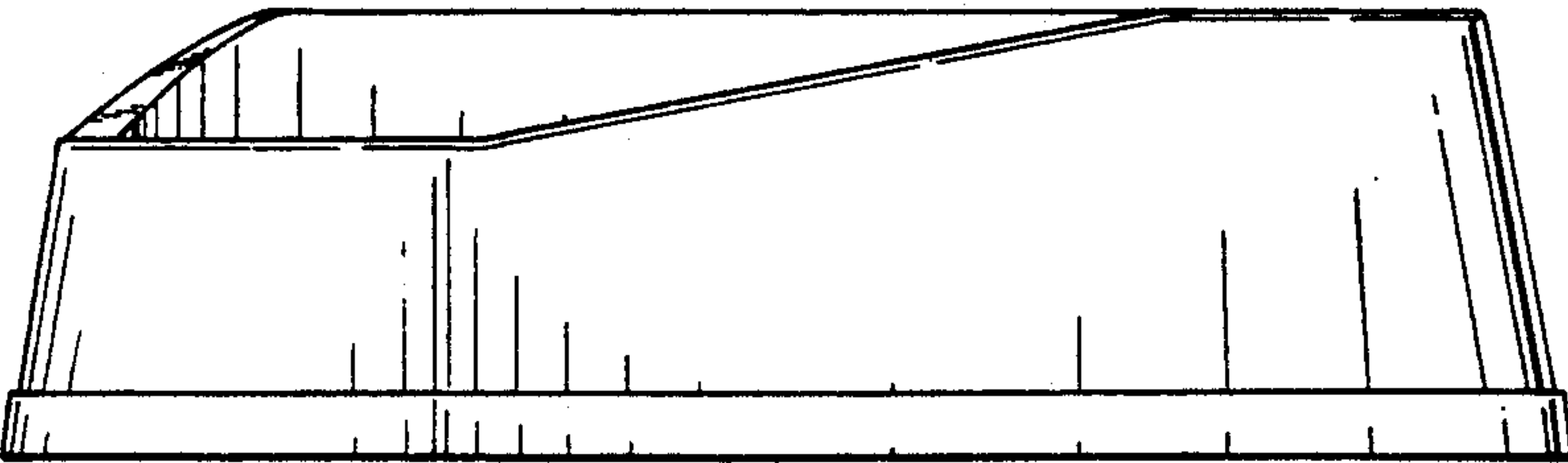

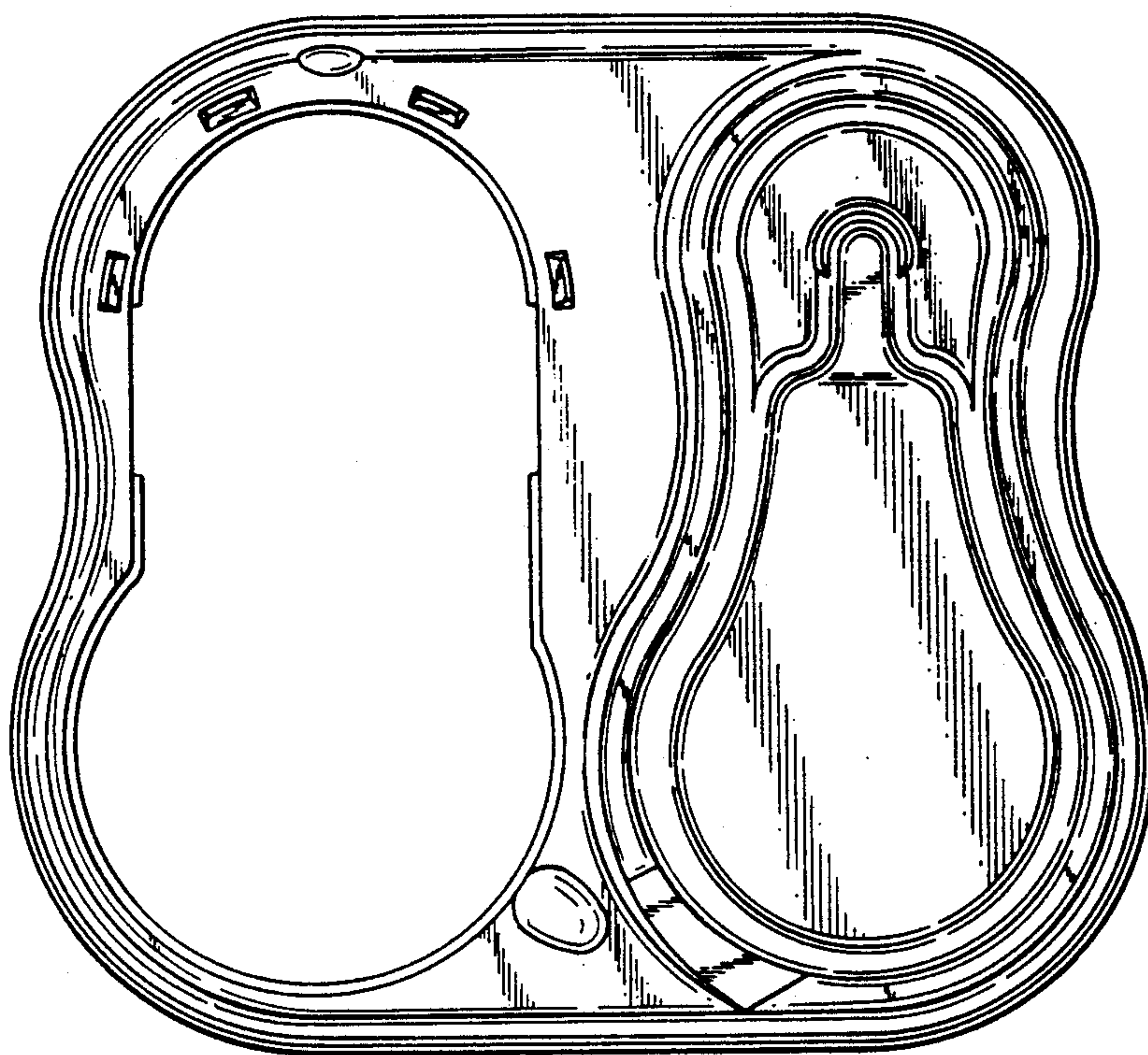

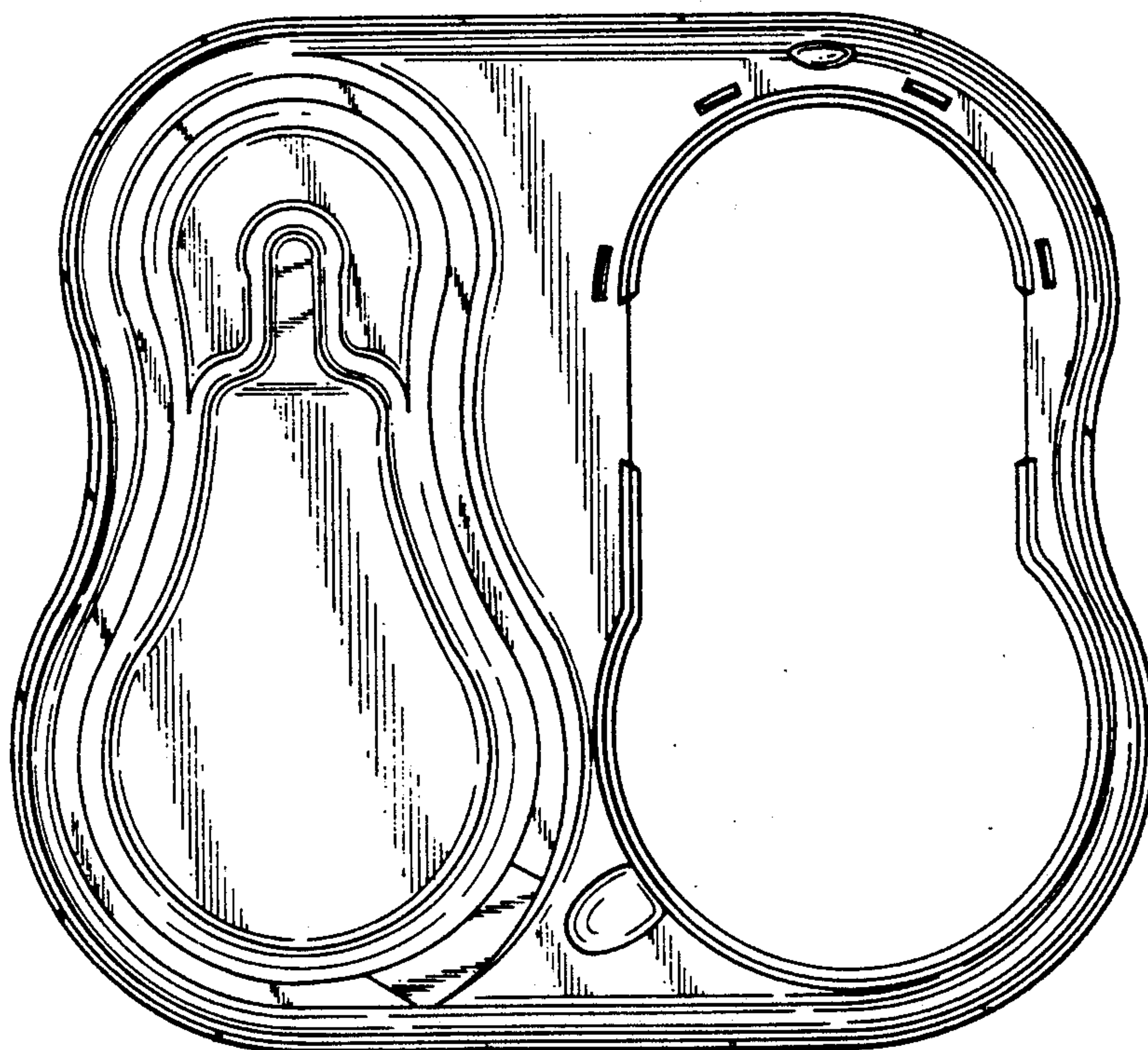

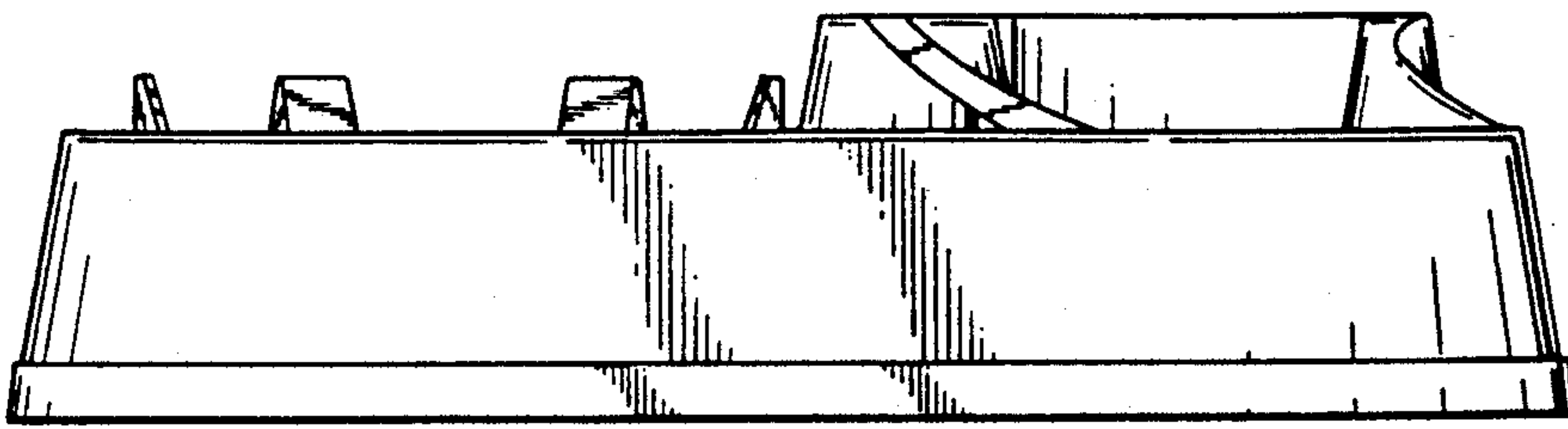

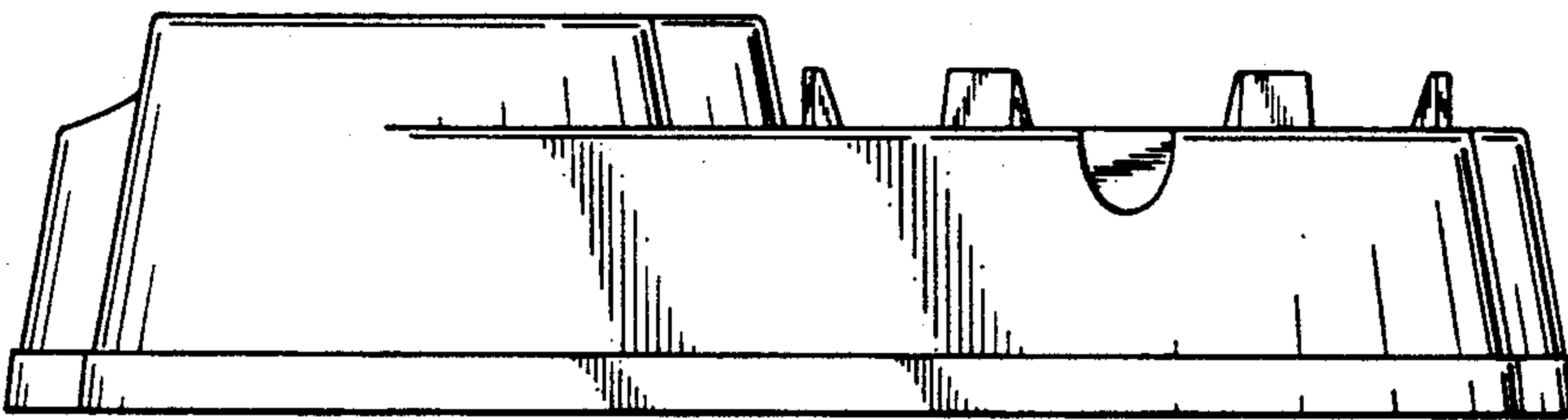

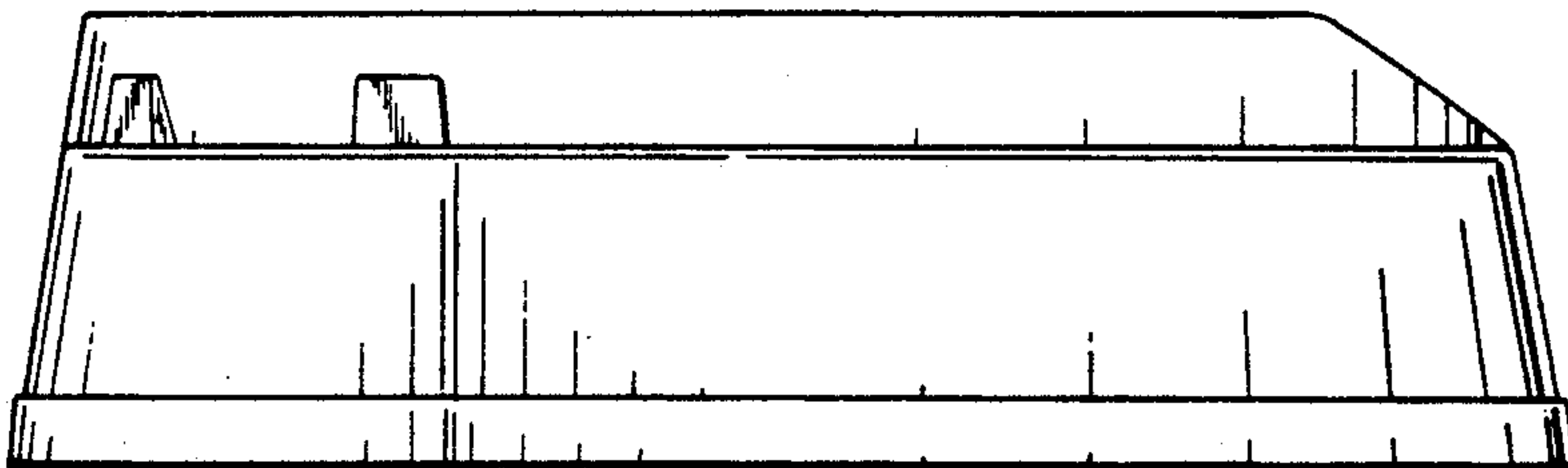

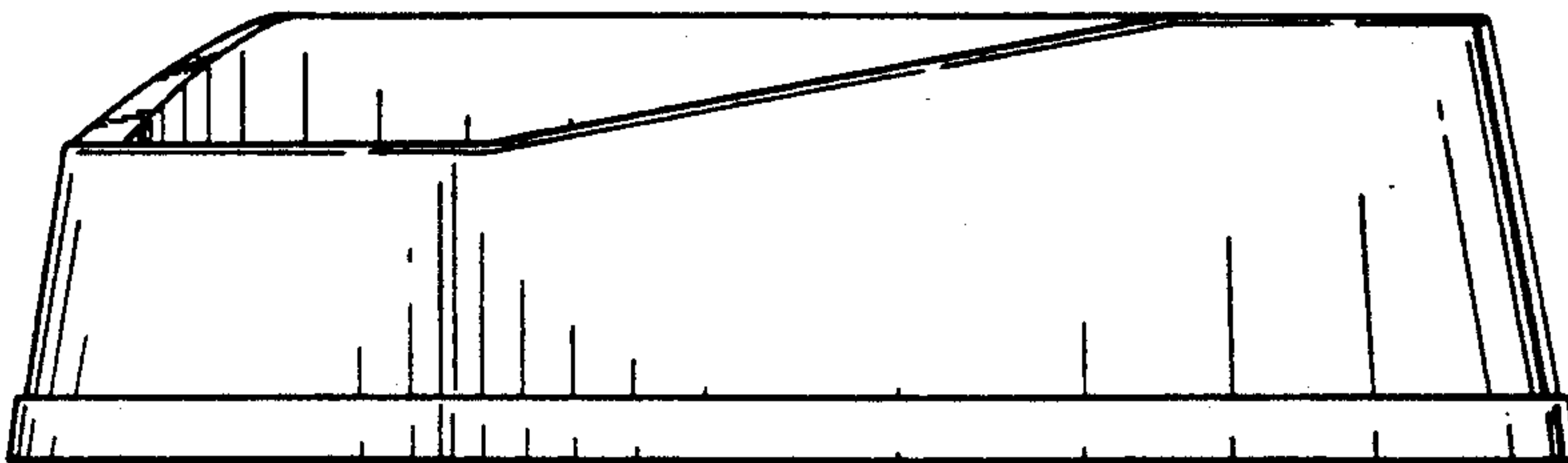
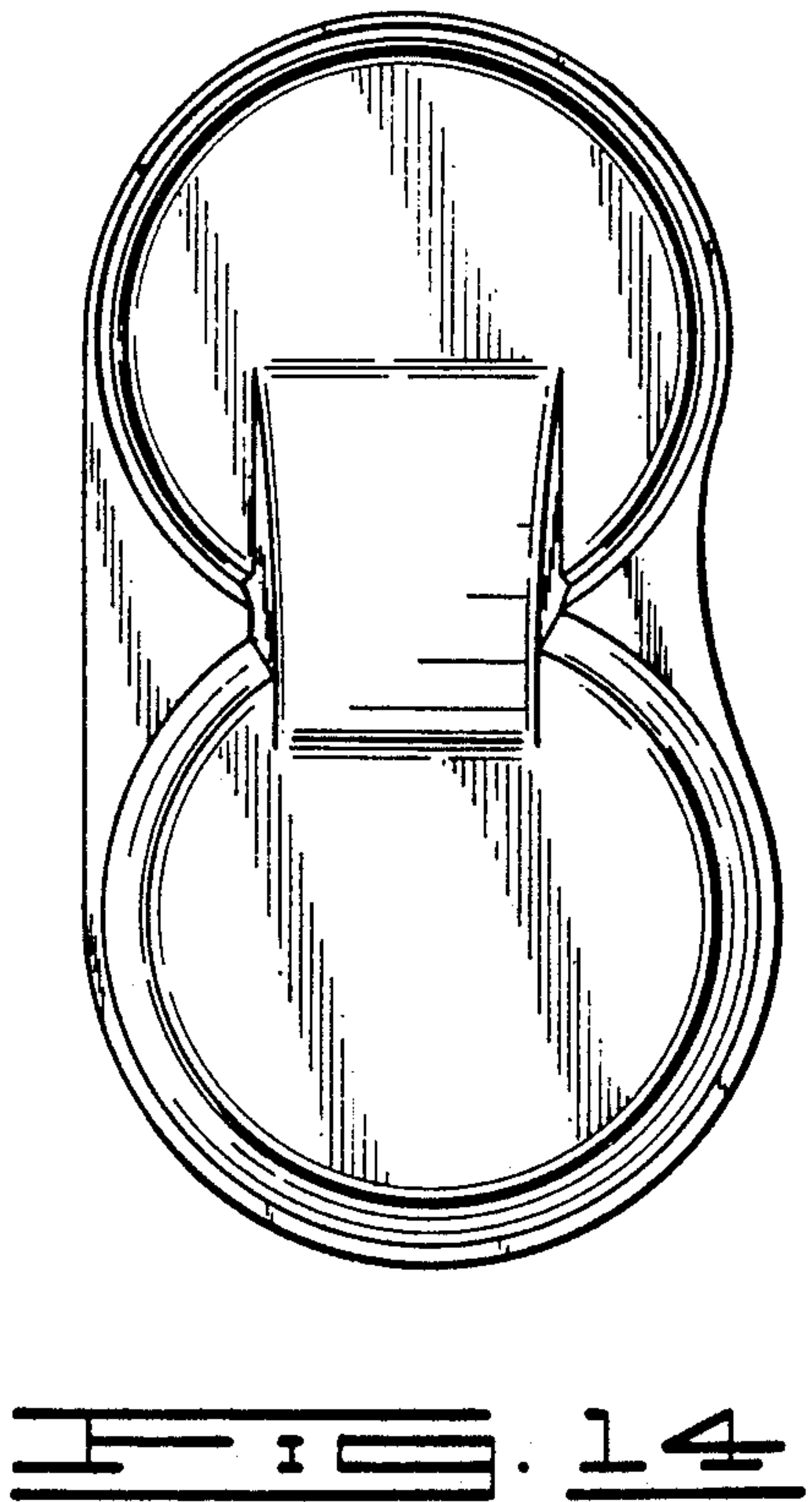
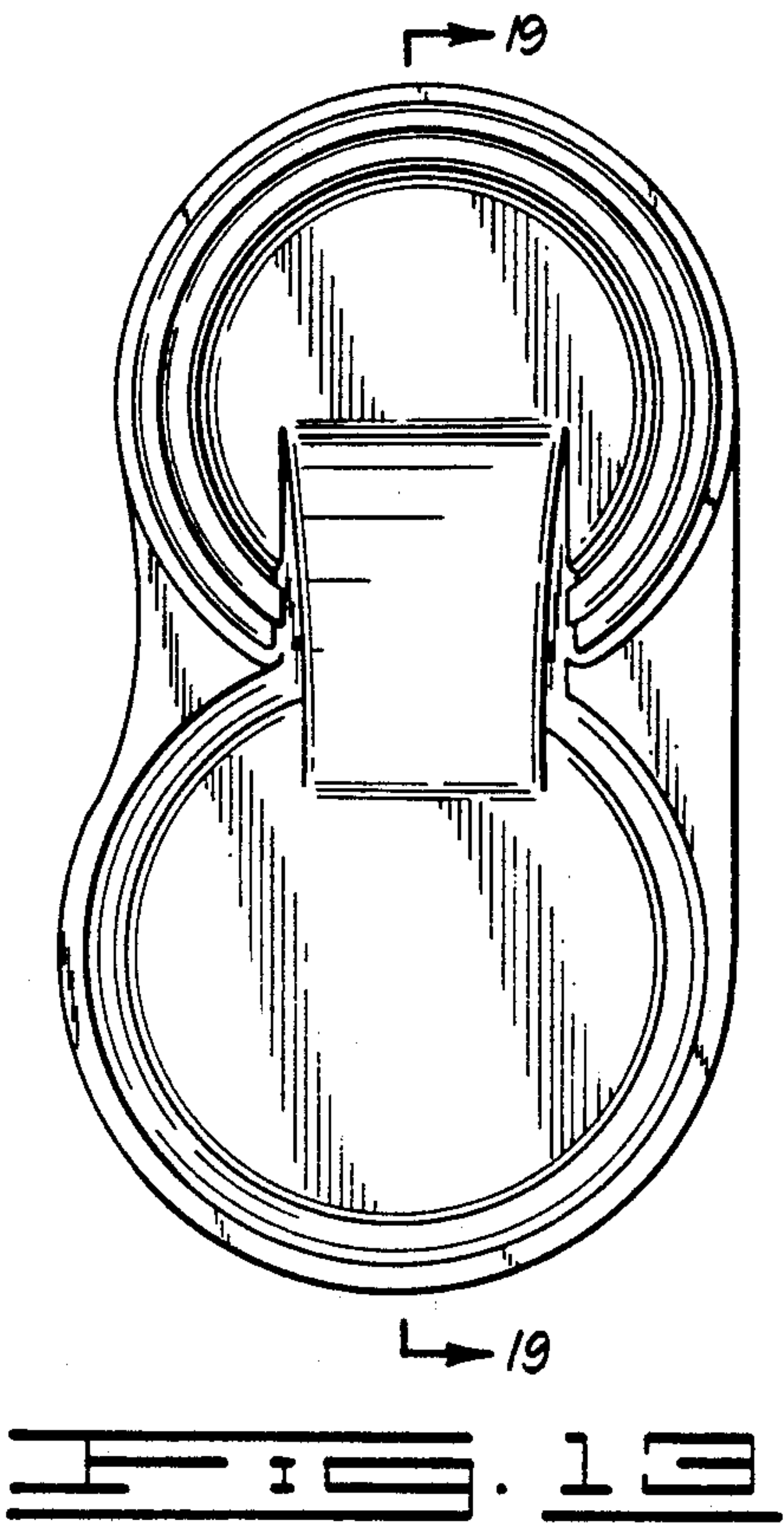

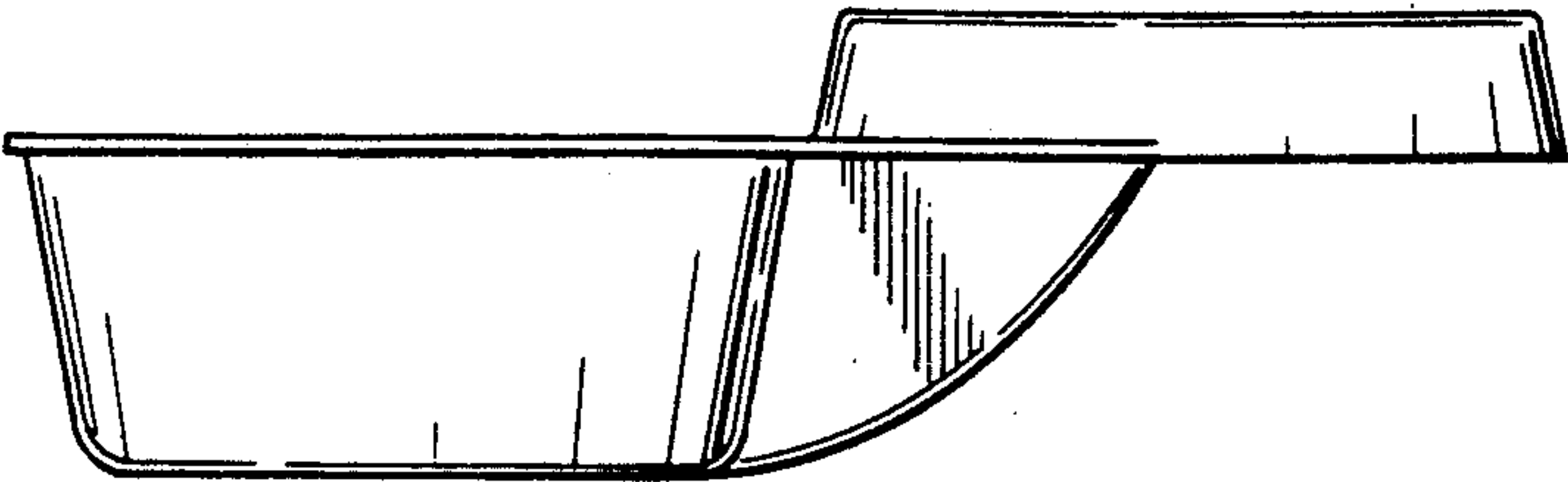

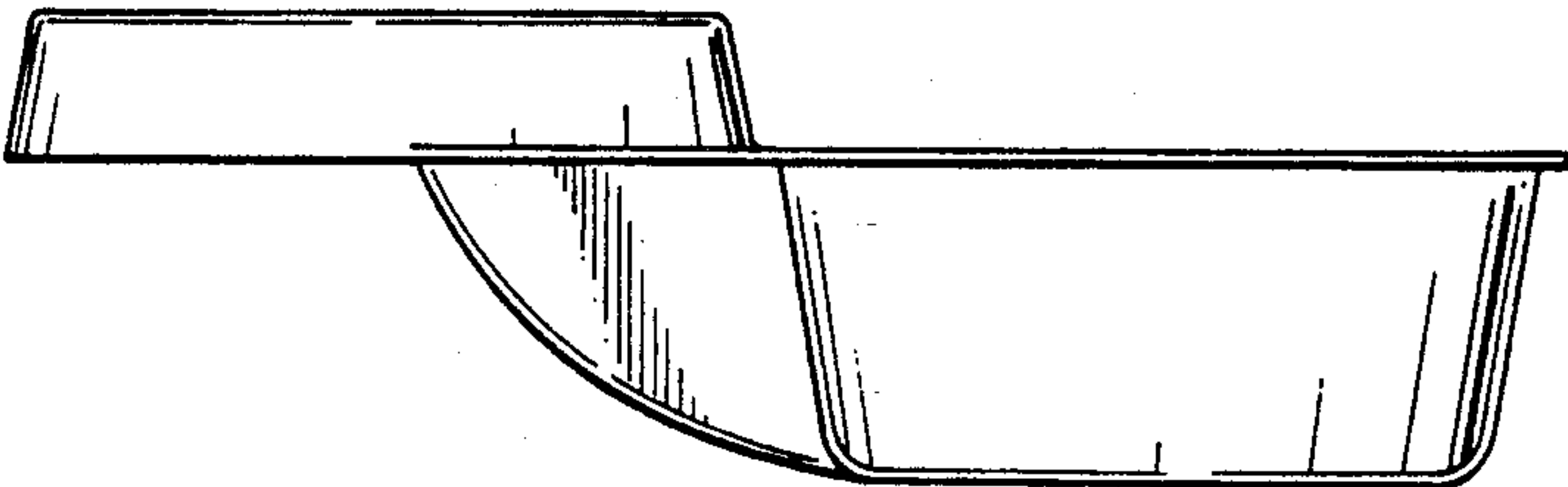

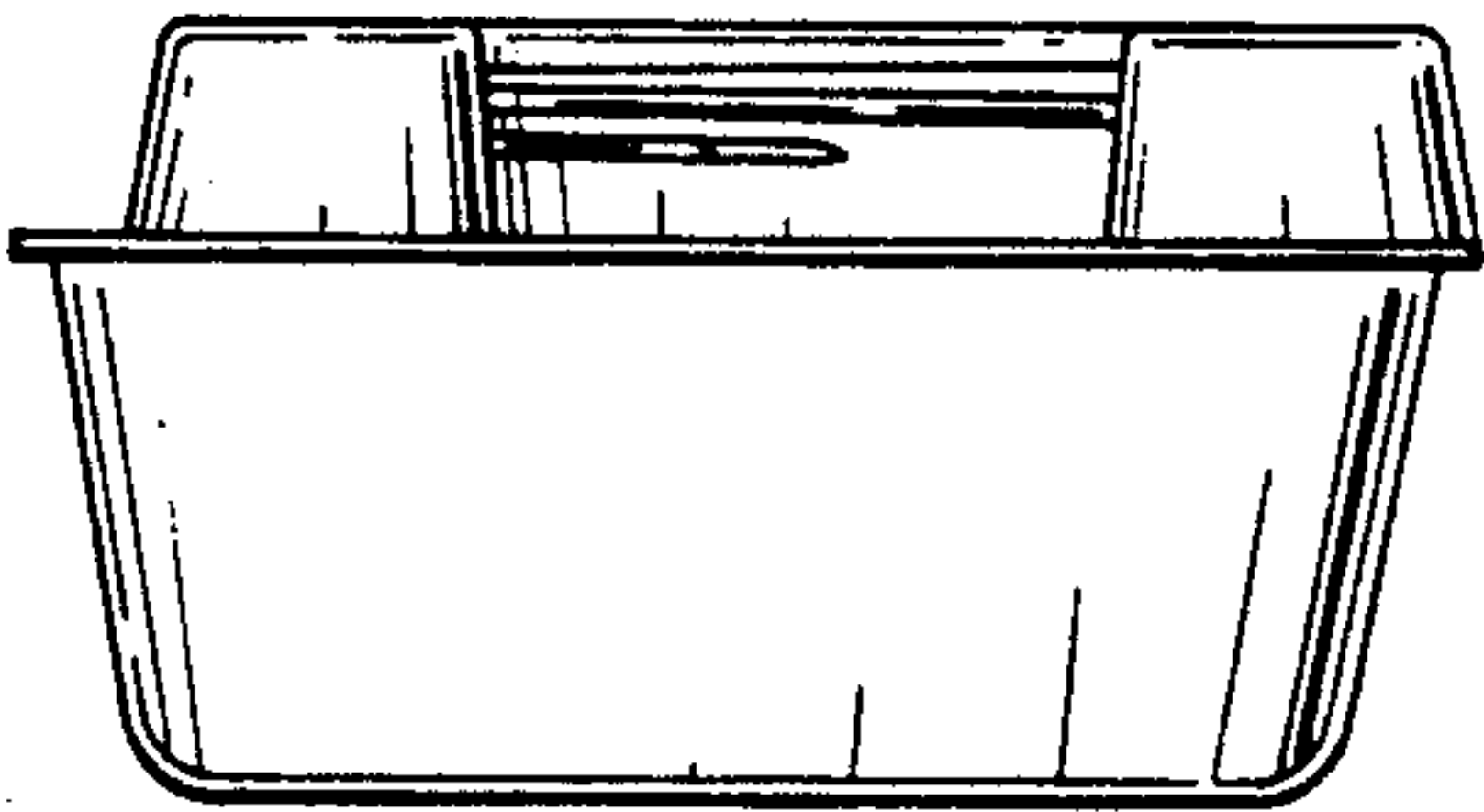

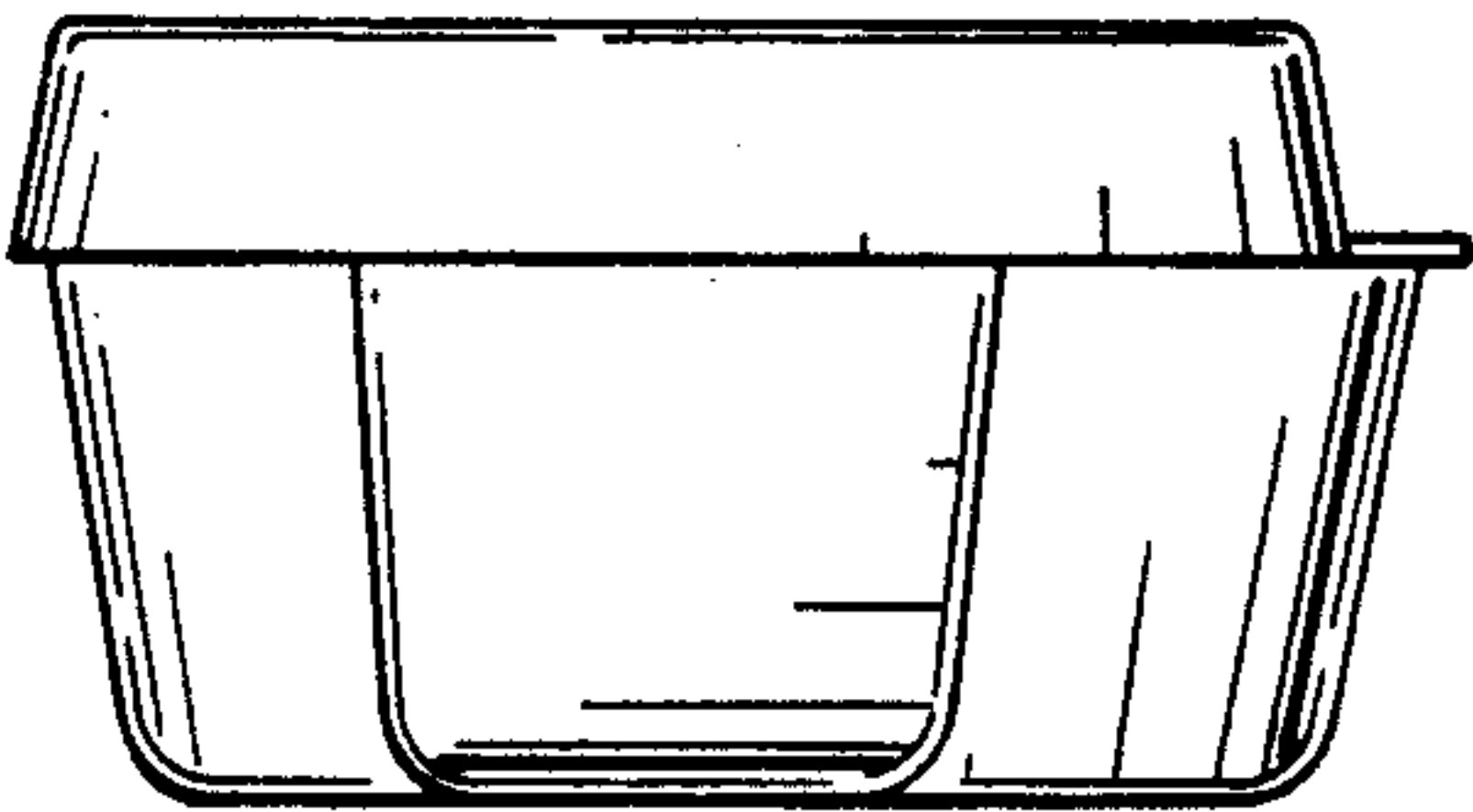

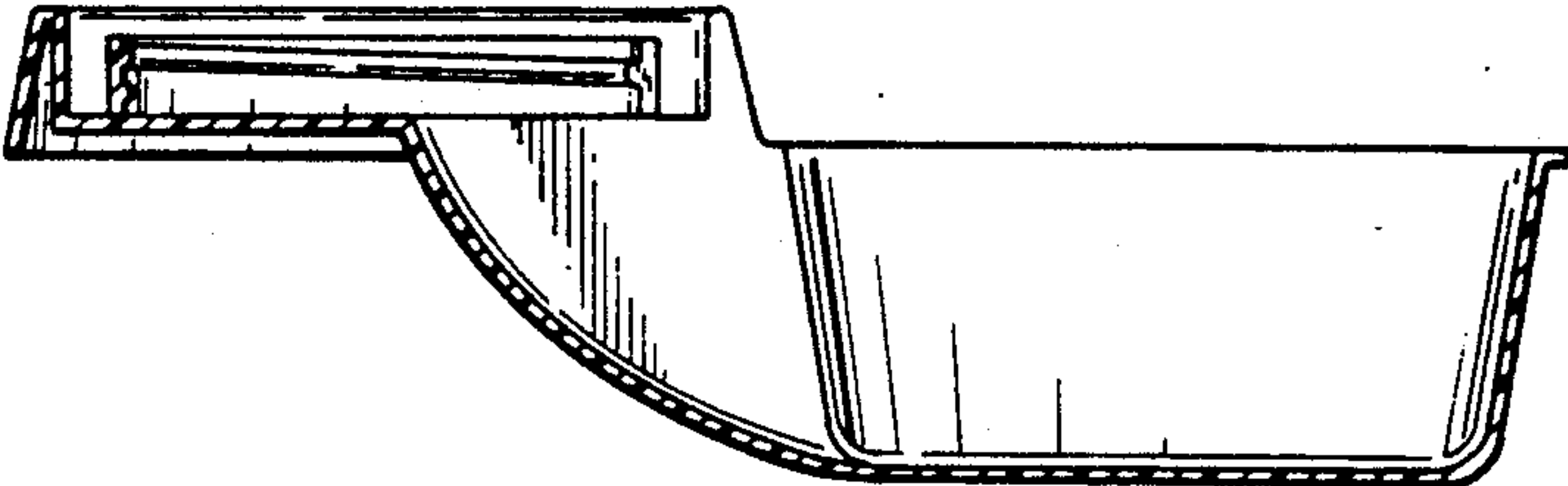
