[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a shower fixture, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view taken from the front and right side of a shower fixture showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof, the right side being a mirror image of the left side;

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a perspective view taken from the front of a second embodiment thereof;

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view of FIG. 5;

FIG. 7 is a left side elevational view of FIG. 5, the right side being a mirror image of the left side; and,

FIG. 8 is a top plan view of FIG. 5.

The fragmentary broken line representation of a shower wall in FIGS. 1 and 5, and the broken line representation of fitting holes in FIGS. 1, 2 and 5, are for purposes of illustration only and form no part of the claimed design.

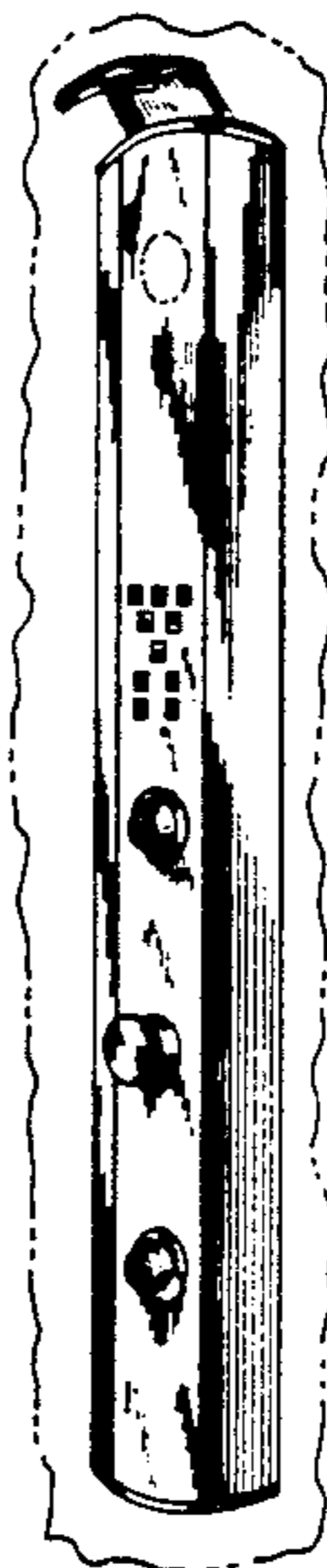

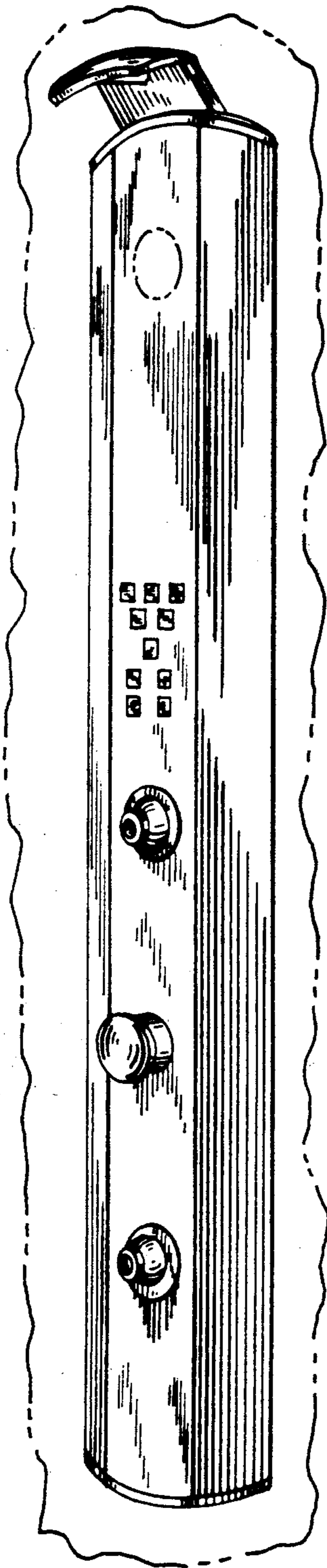

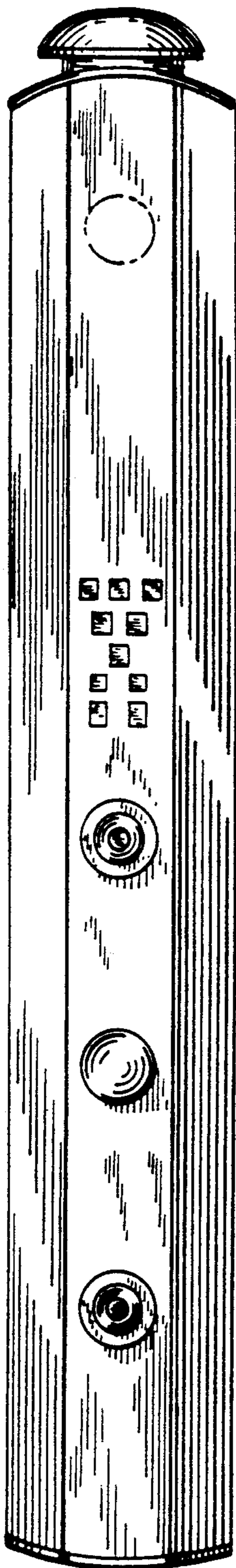

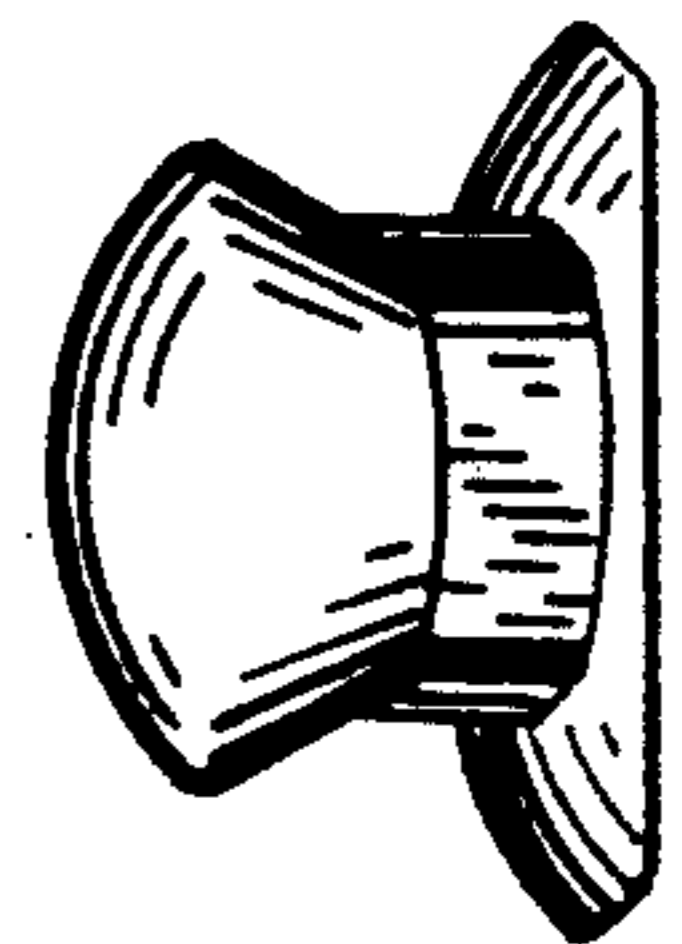

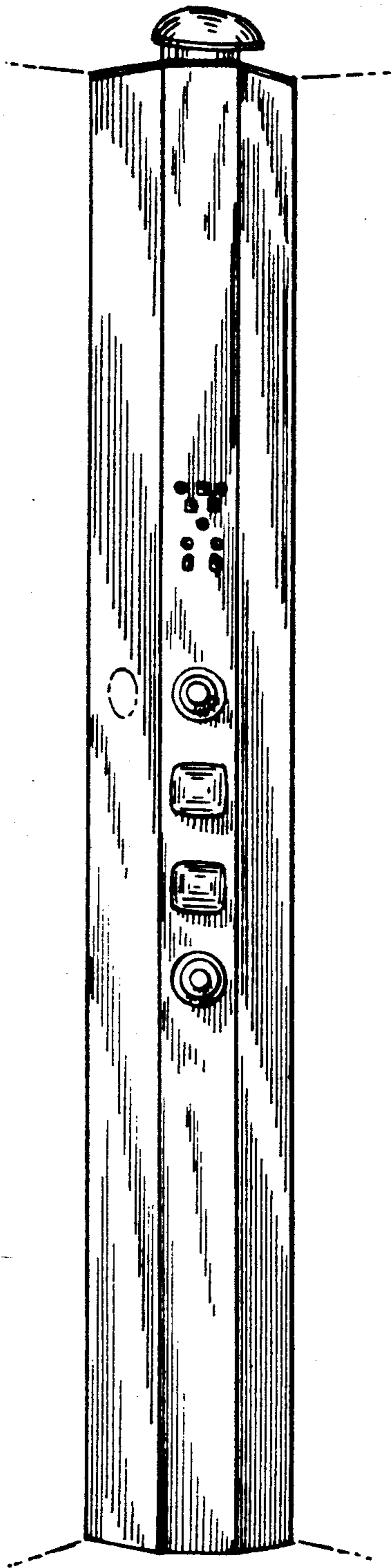

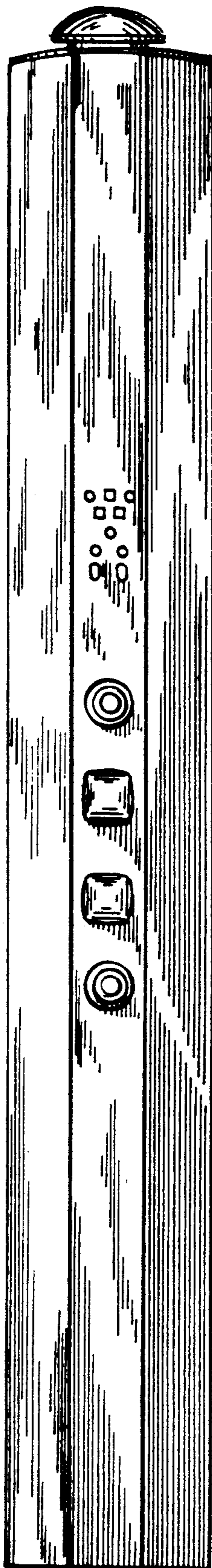

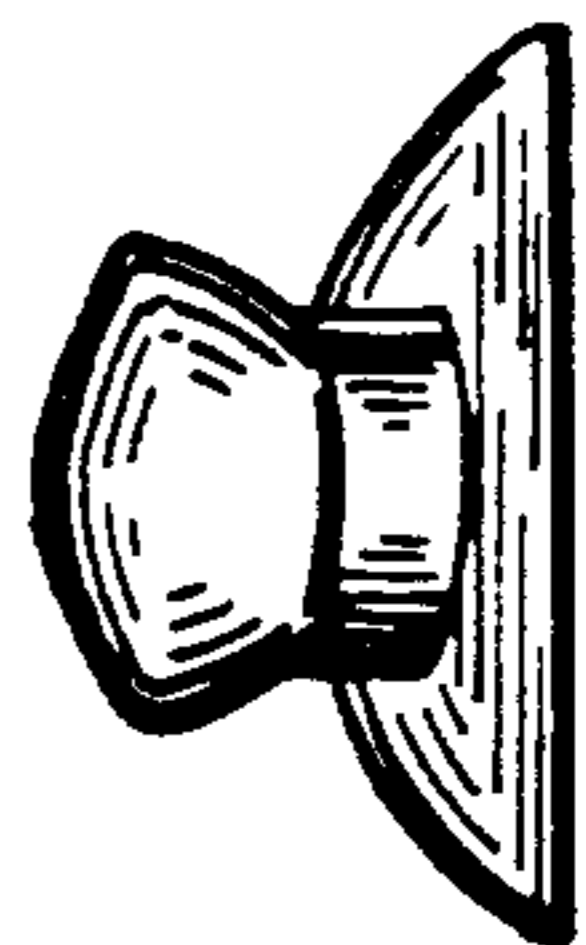
