FIG. 7 is a perspective view thereof.

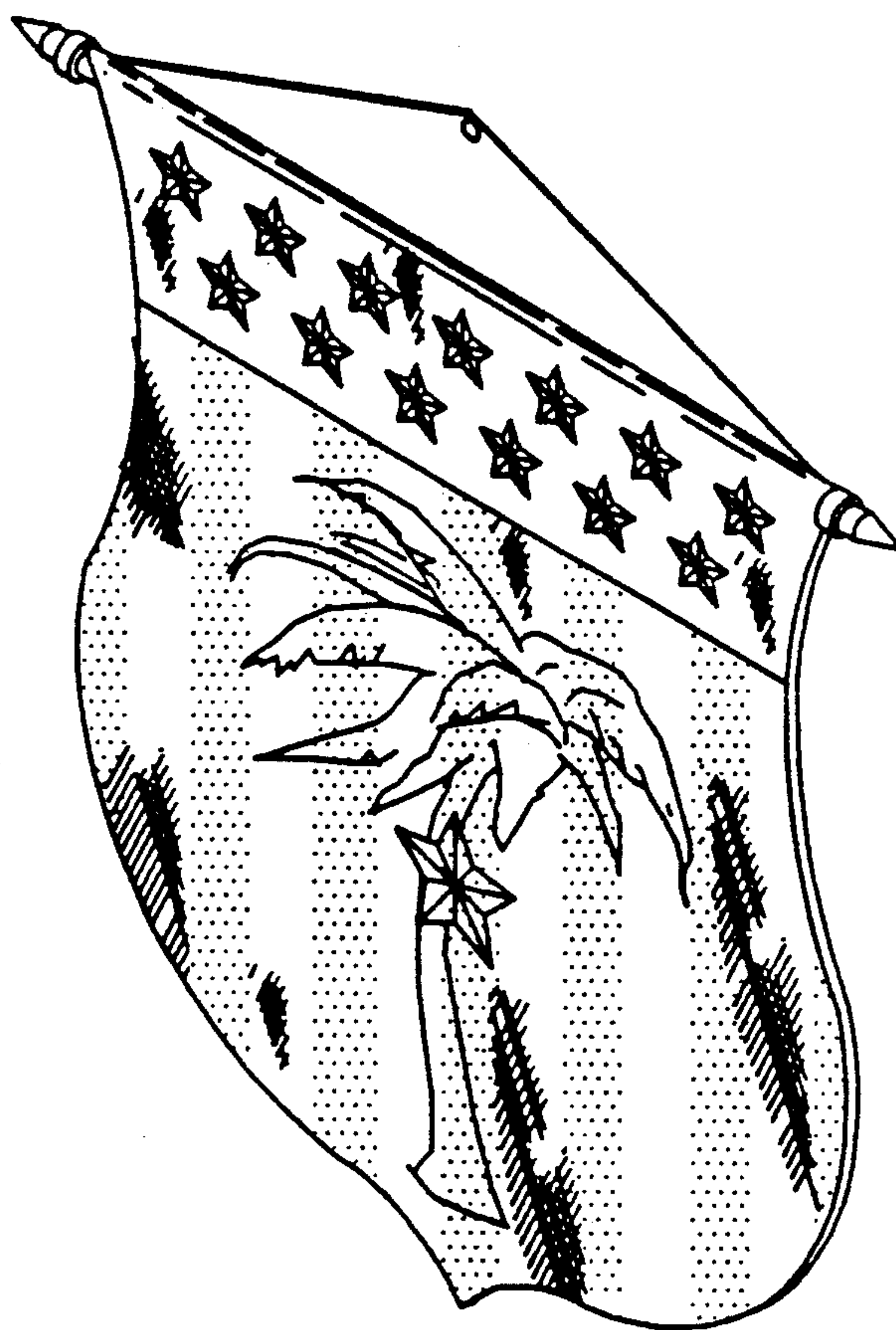

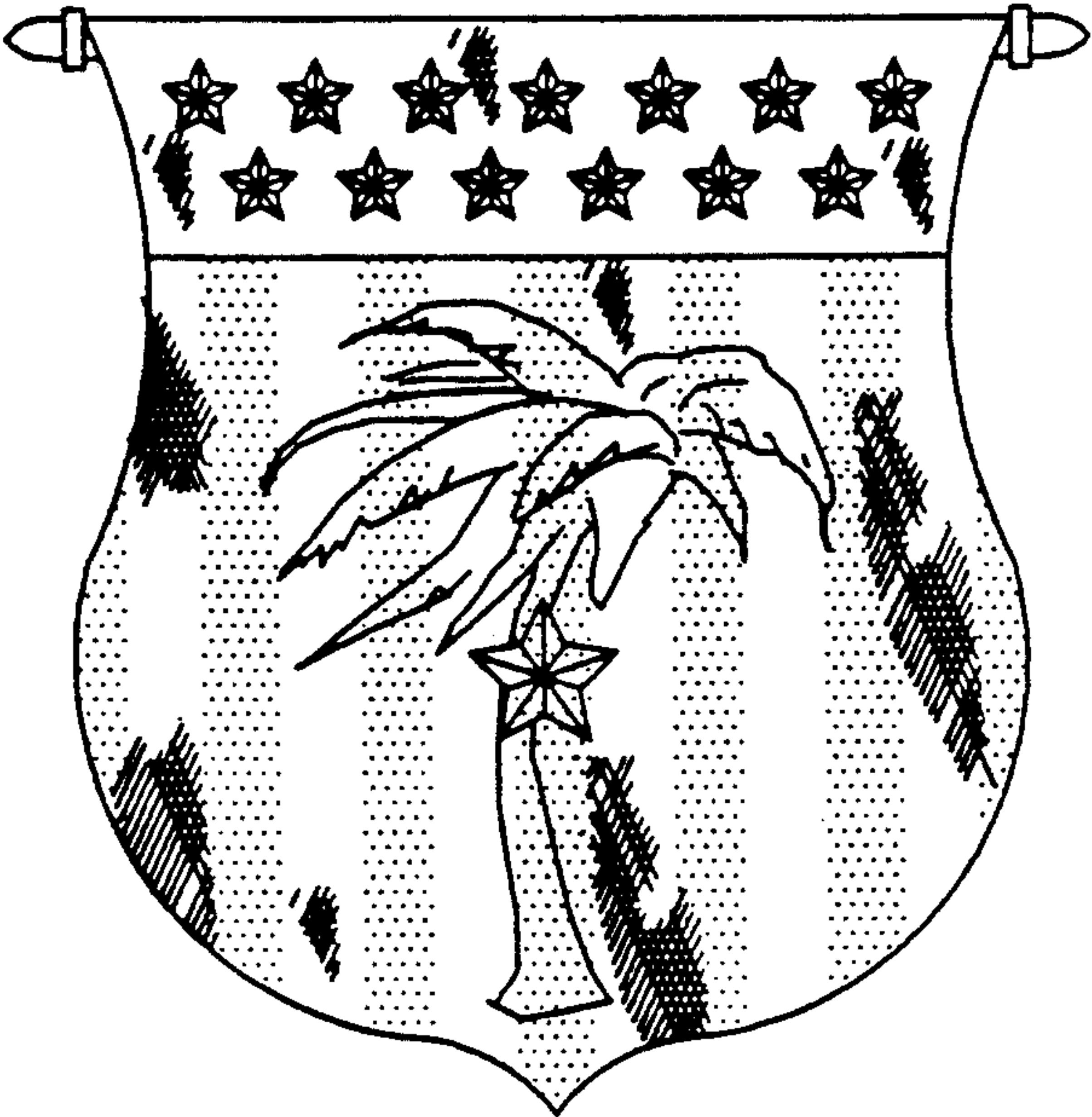

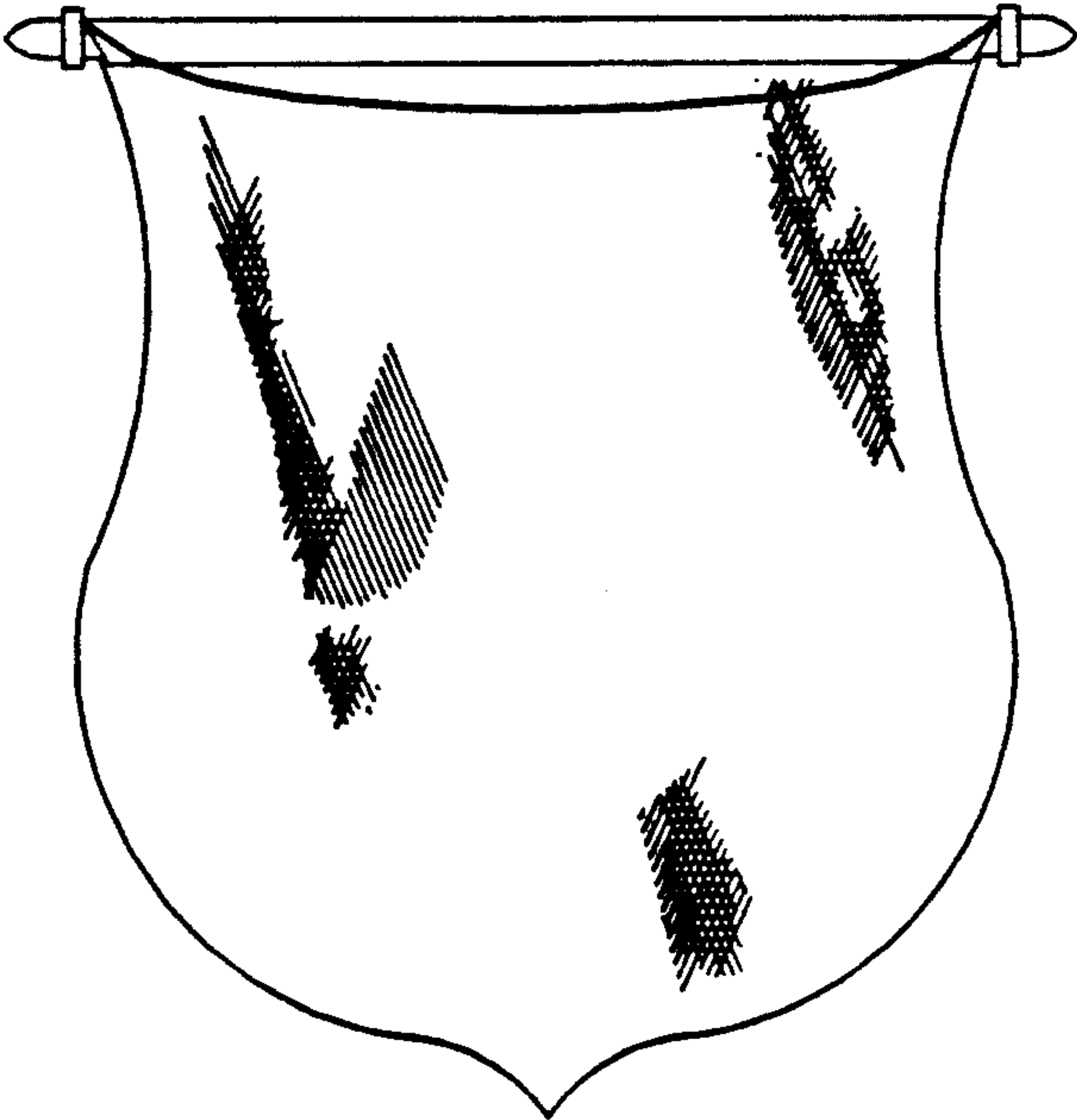

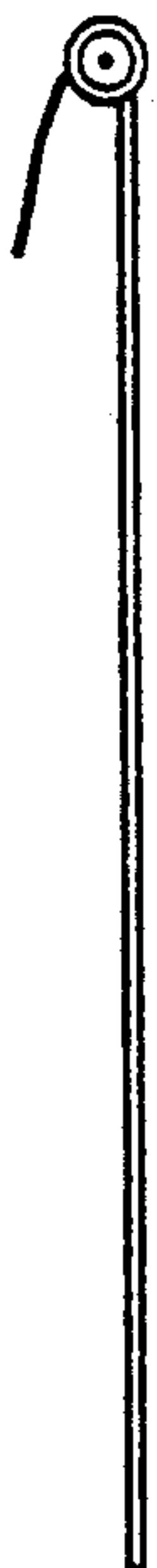

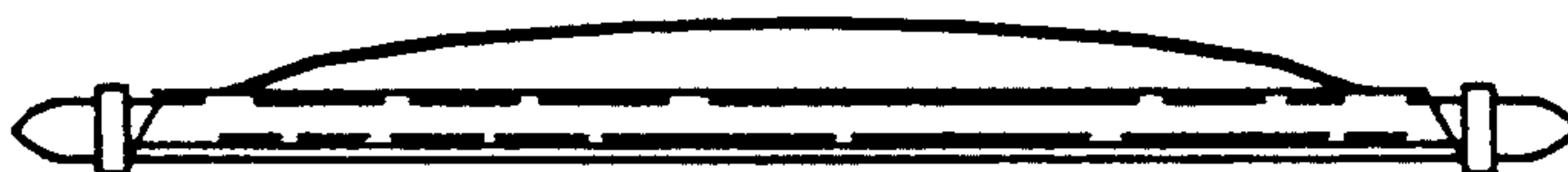
