[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a workstation, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a workstation showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 8 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of the workstation shown in FIG. 1; the top and bottom views being identical to FIGS. 2 and 7, respectively; the sides and rear being similar to FIGS. 4, 6, and 5, respectively except for the lower open-end panels;

FIG. 9 is a perspective view of a third embodiment of the workstation shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 10 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 11 is a front elevational view thereof;


FIG. 12 is a right side elevational view, the left side being a mirror image thereof;


FIG. 13 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 15 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of the workstation shown in FIG. 9; the top and bottom views being identical to FIGS. 10 and 14, respectively; the side and rear views being similar to FIGS. 12 and 13, respectively, except for the lower open-end panels; FIG. 16 is a perspective view of a fourth embodiment of the workstation shown in FIG. 1; the sides and rear views being similar to FIGS. 4-6, respectively, except for the extended shelf; and,

FIG. 17 is a perspective view of a third embodiment of the workstation shown in FIG. 9; the sides and rear being similar to FIGS. 12 and 13, respectively, except for the extended shelf.


































