FIG. 1 is a top right front perspective view of a dish drain tray showing our new design;

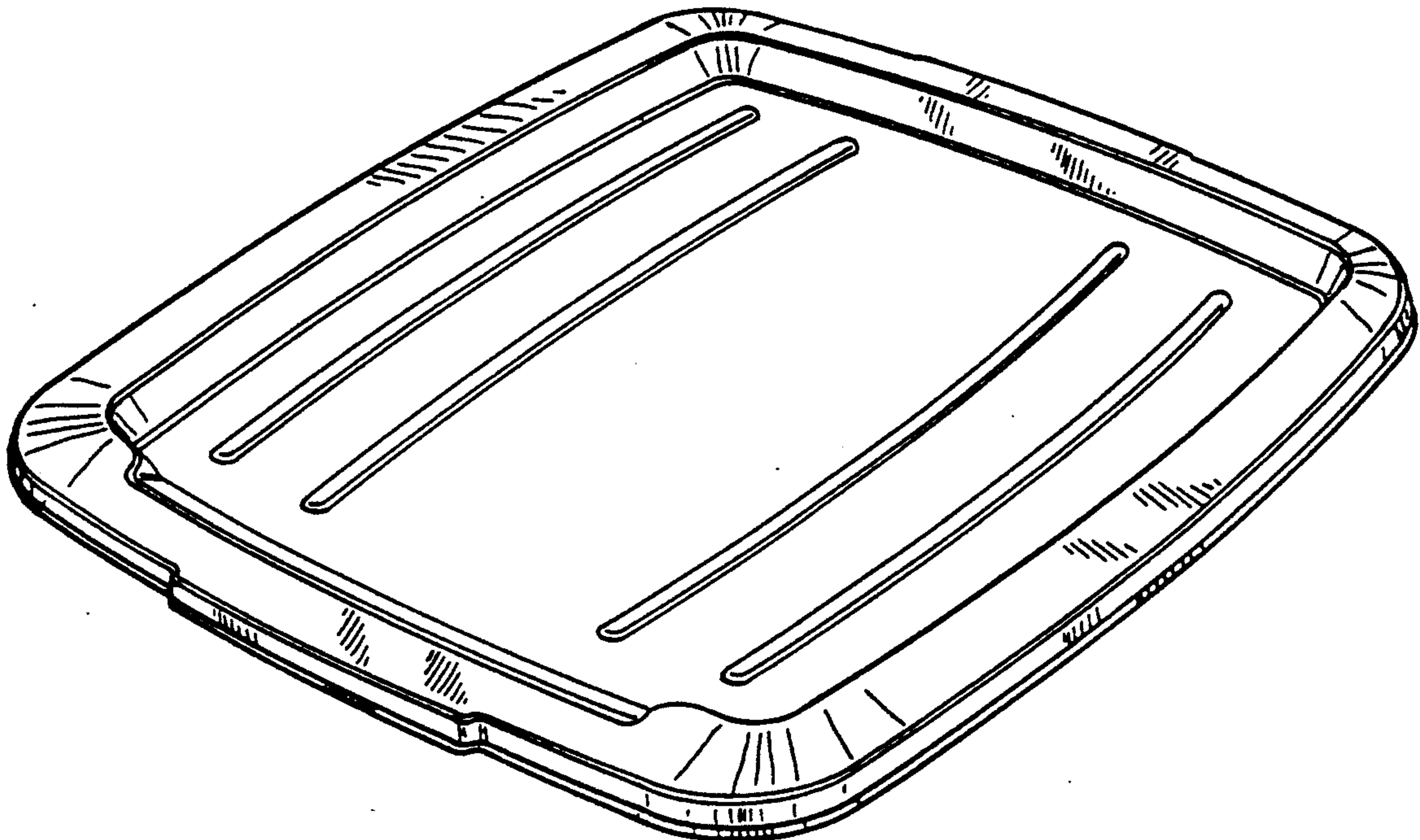
FIG. 2 is an enlarged top plan view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a side elevational view thereof; the opposite side being a mirror image.



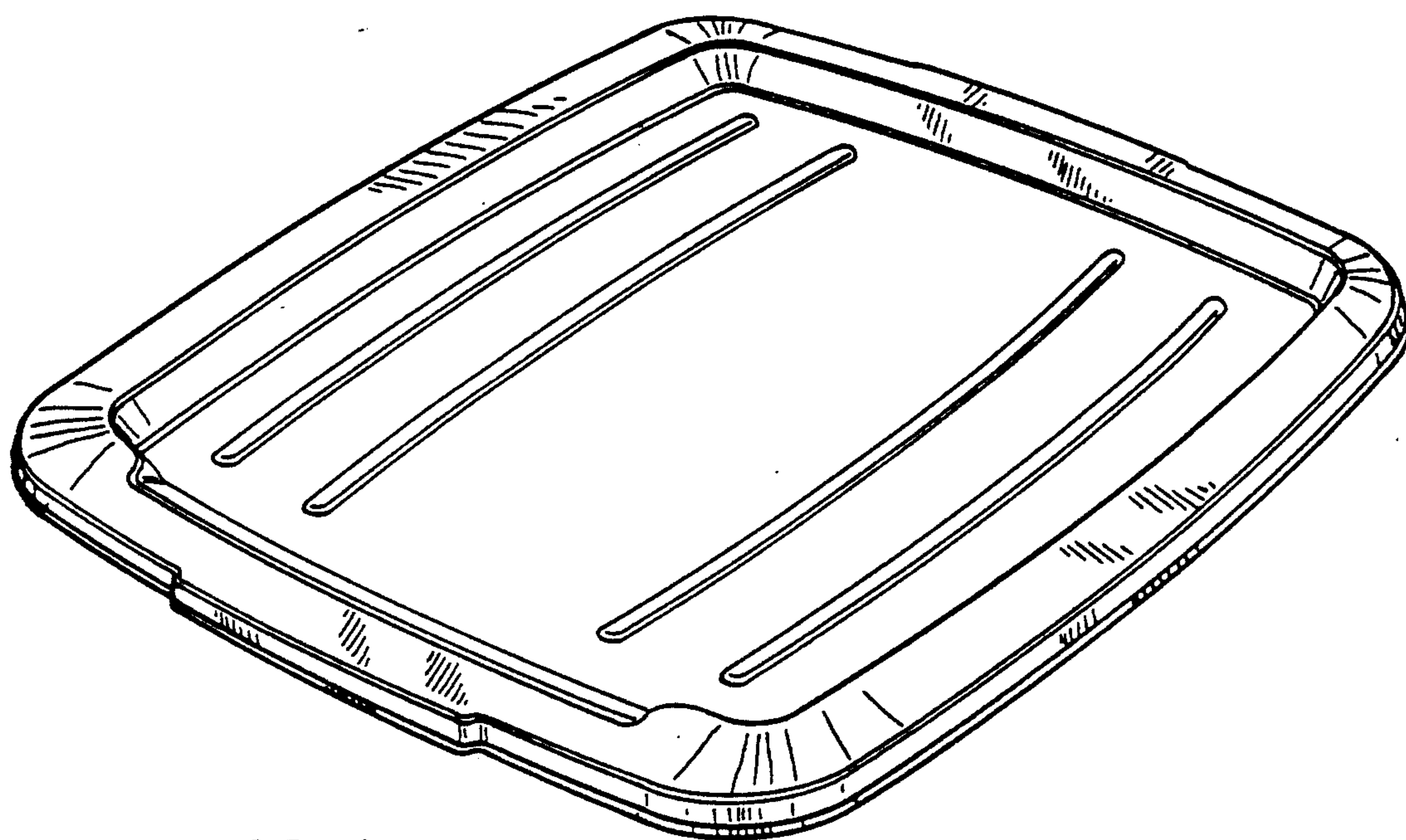

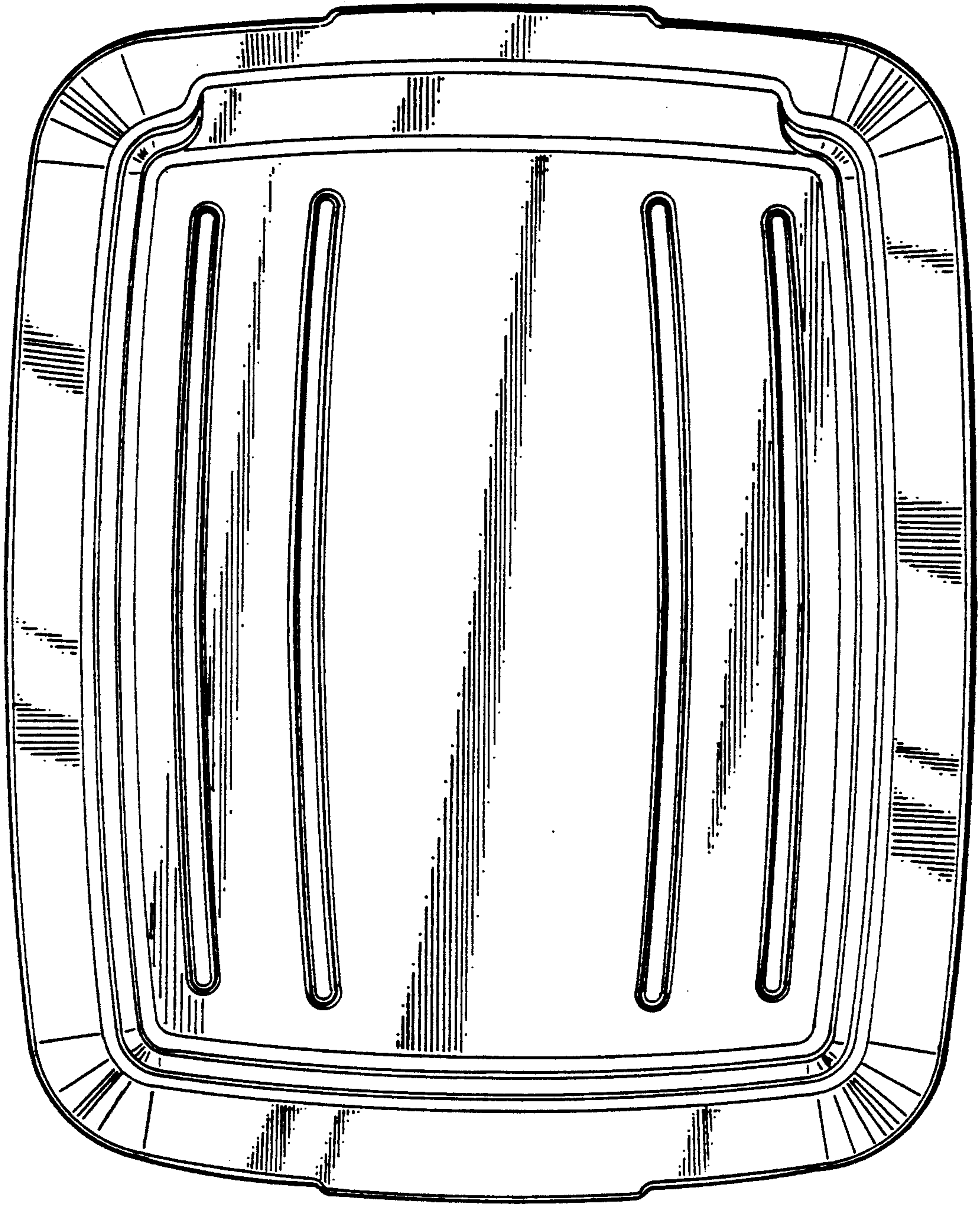

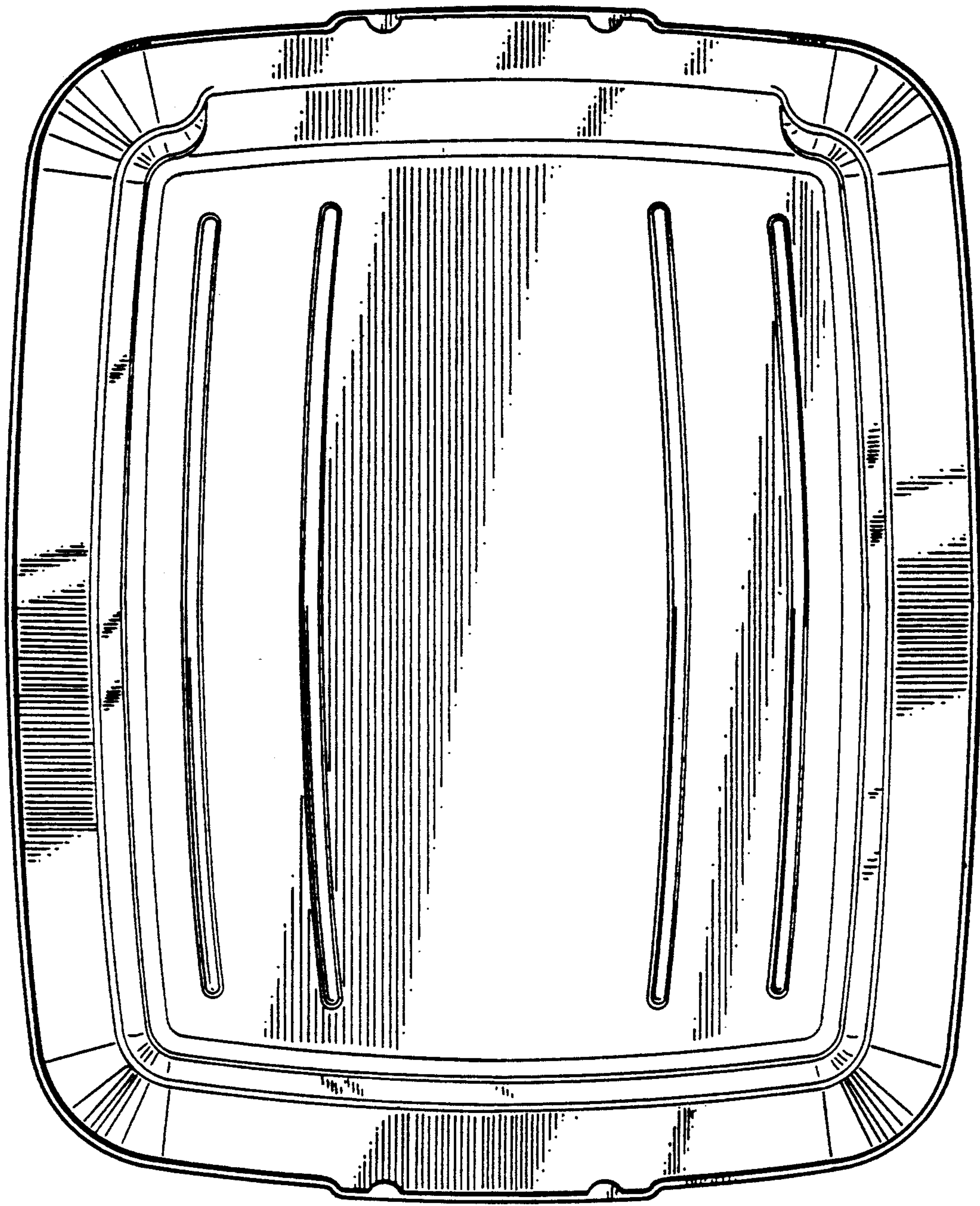
