FIG. 1 is a left side elevational view of a shoe upper according to my new design;

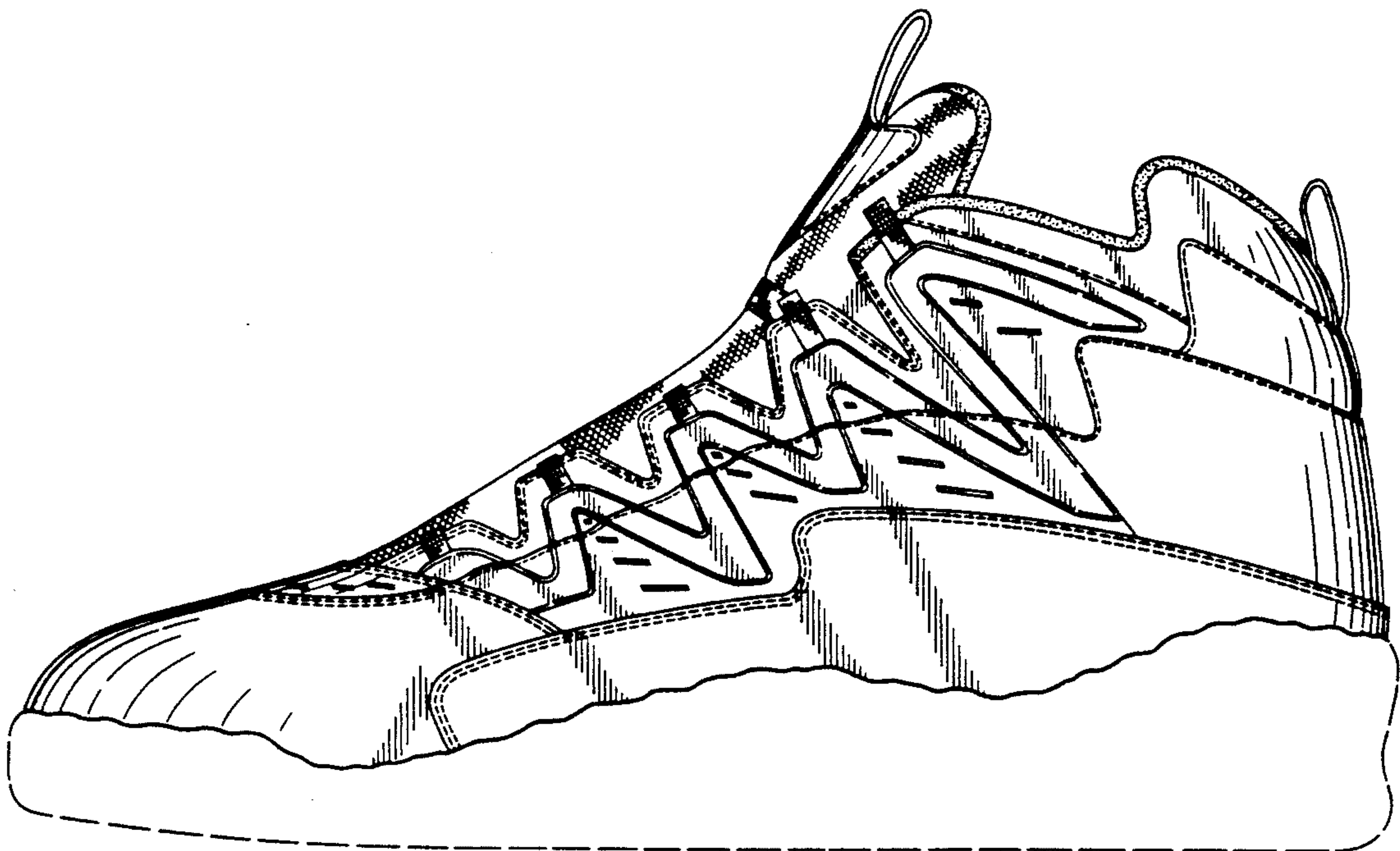
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view of the shoe upper shown in FIG. 1;

The broken line showing of a shoe sole in FIGS. 1-4 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.



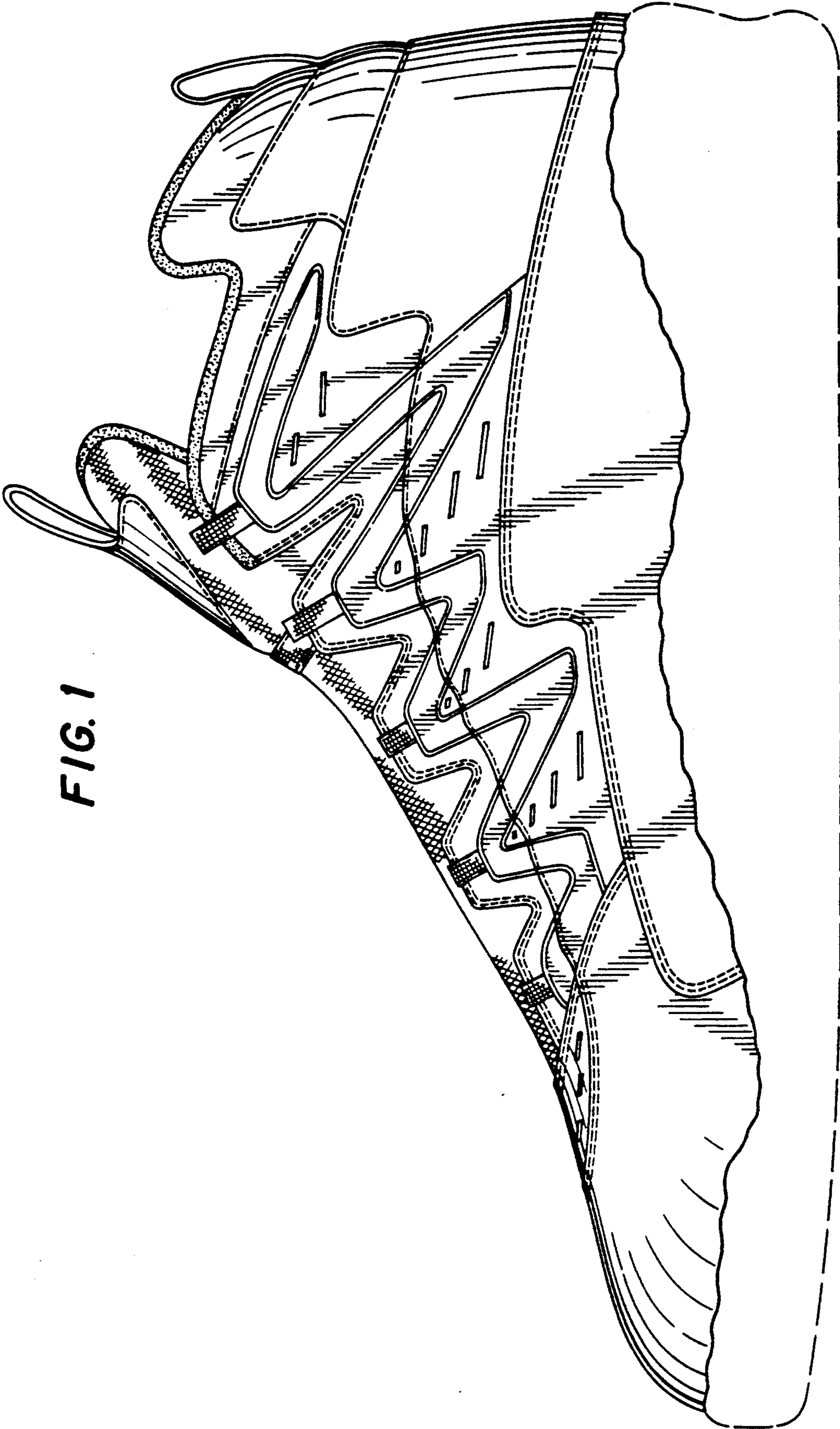

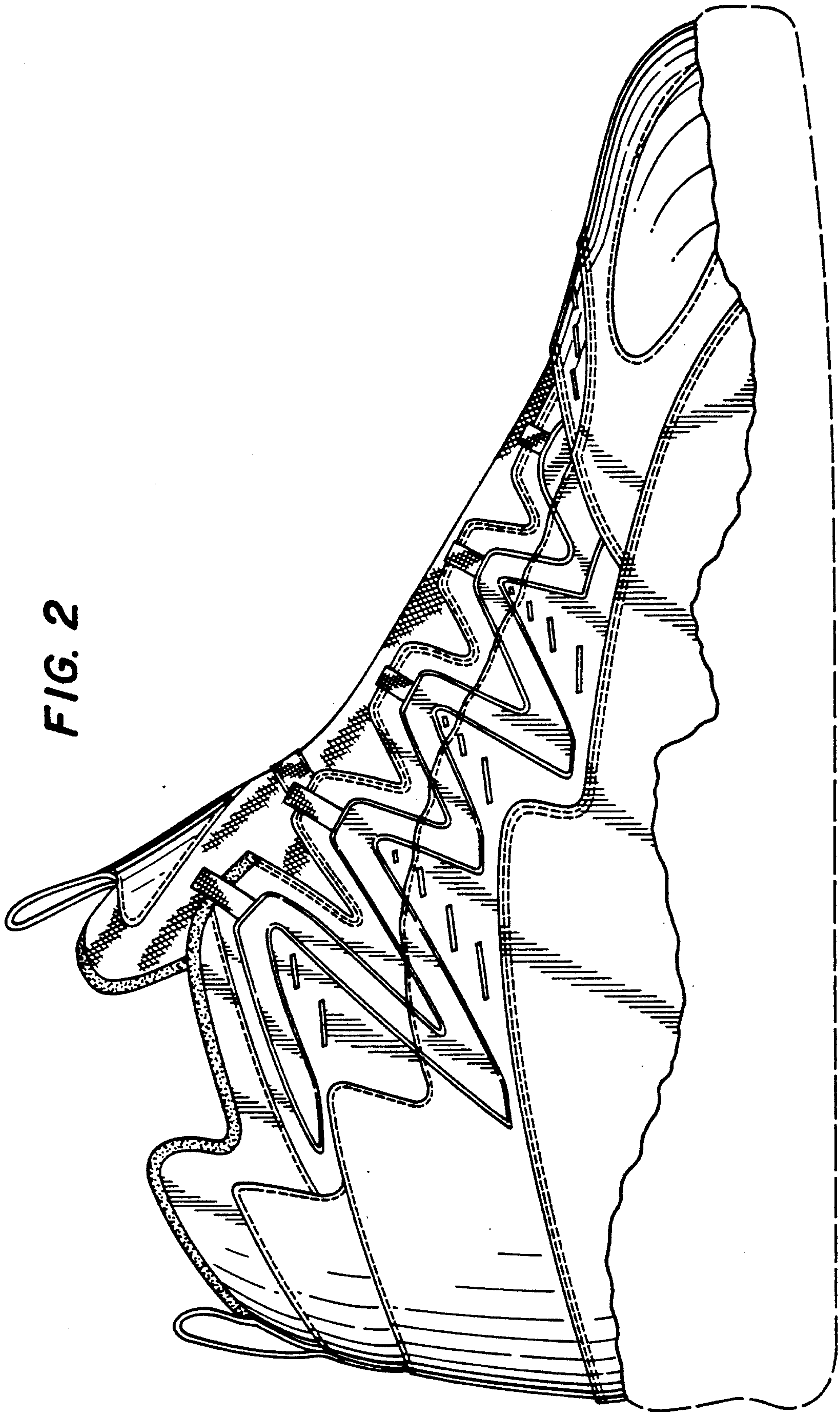

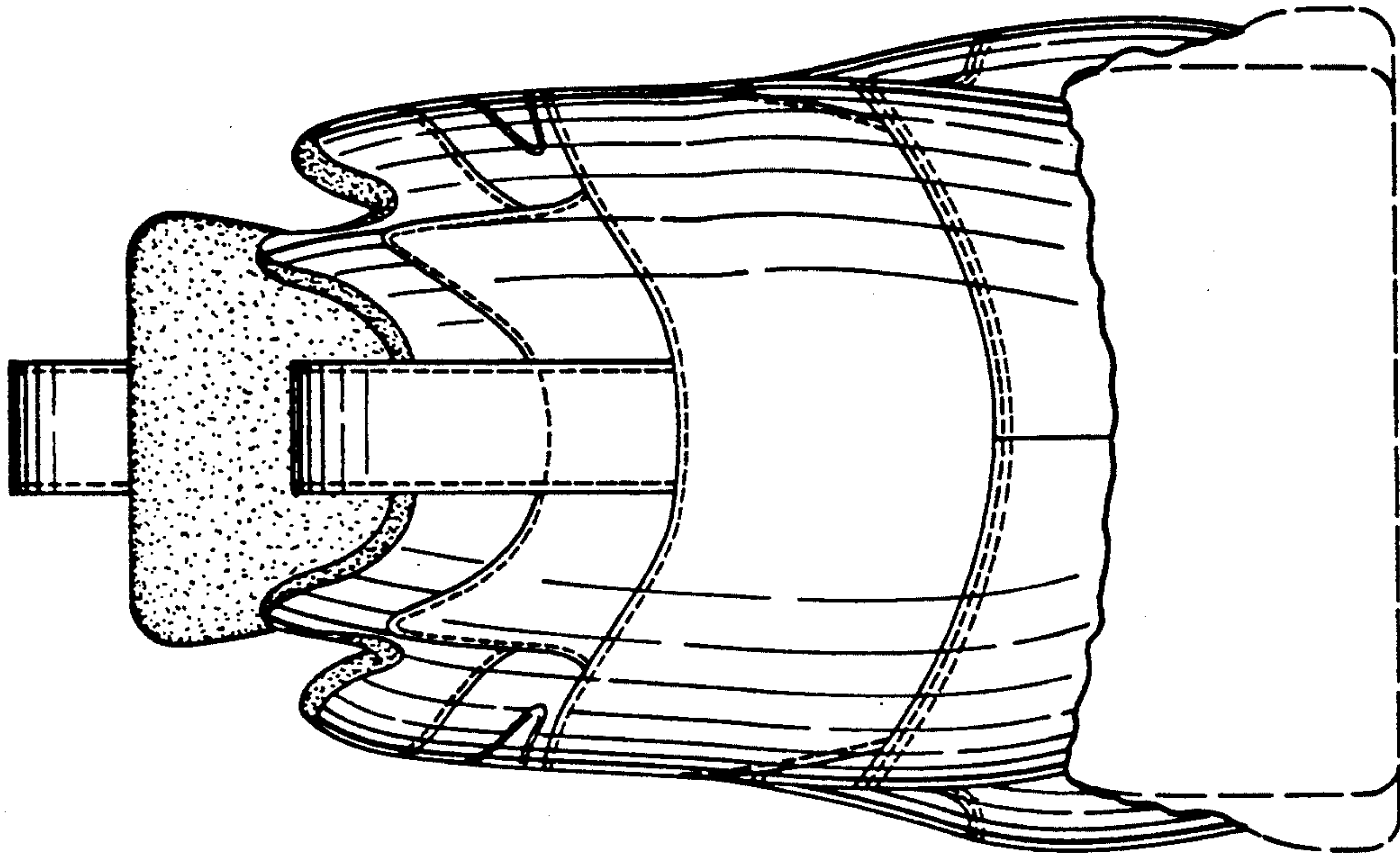

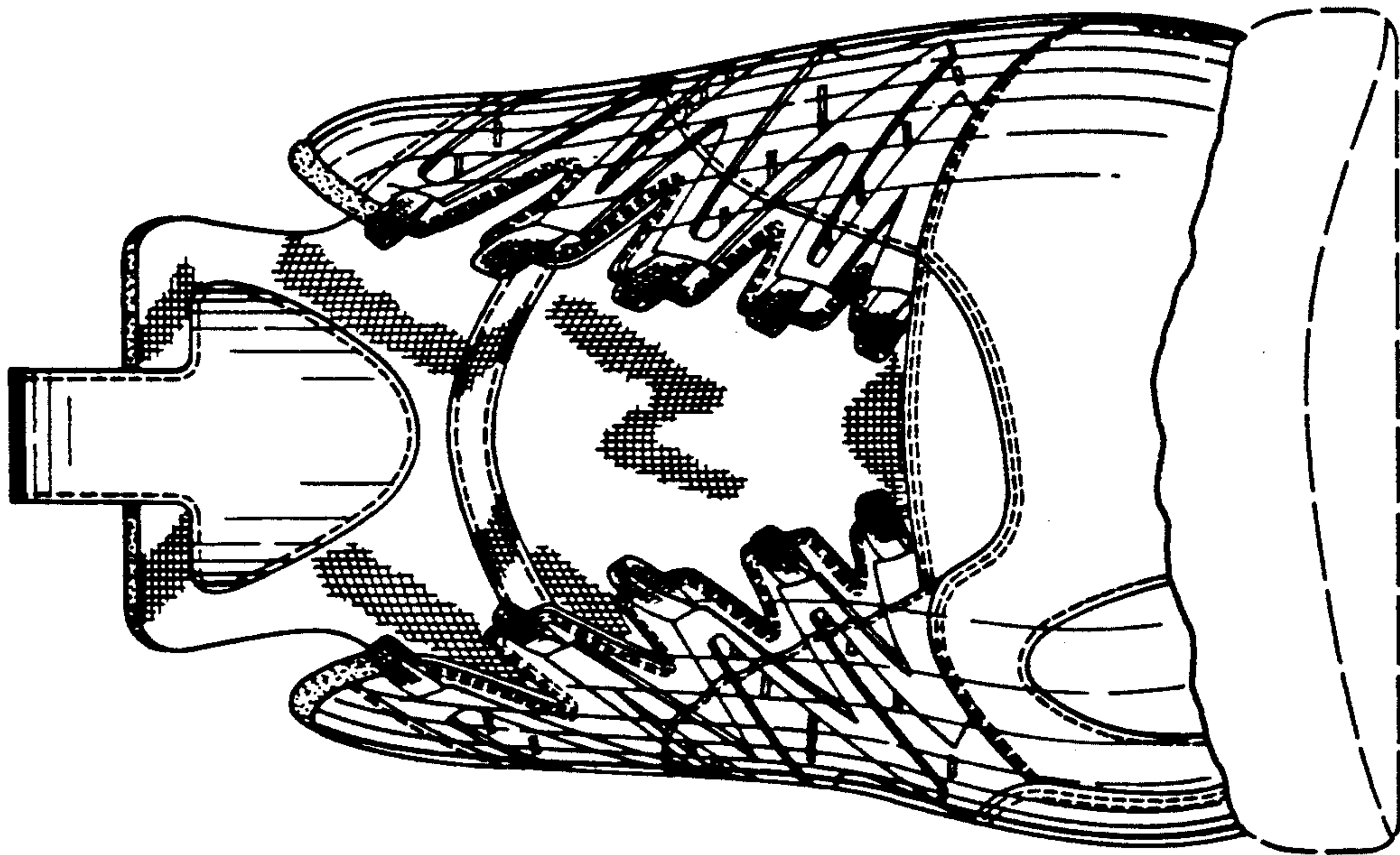
