The ornamental design for twig chair, as shown and described.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a first embodiment of twig furniture comprising a rocking chair in accordance with the present invention;

FIG. 2 is a left elevational view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a right elevational view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1:

FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1.

FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view of the rocking chair of FIG. 1;

FIG. 8 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of twig furniture comprising a loveseat rocker suitable for seating two people in accordance with the present invention;

FIG. 9 is a left elevational view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8;


FIG. 10 is a front elevational view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8;

FIG. 11 is a right elevational view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8;


FIG. 12 is a rear elevational view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8;


FIG. 13 is a top plan view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8; and,


FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view of the loveseat rocker of FIG. 8.










