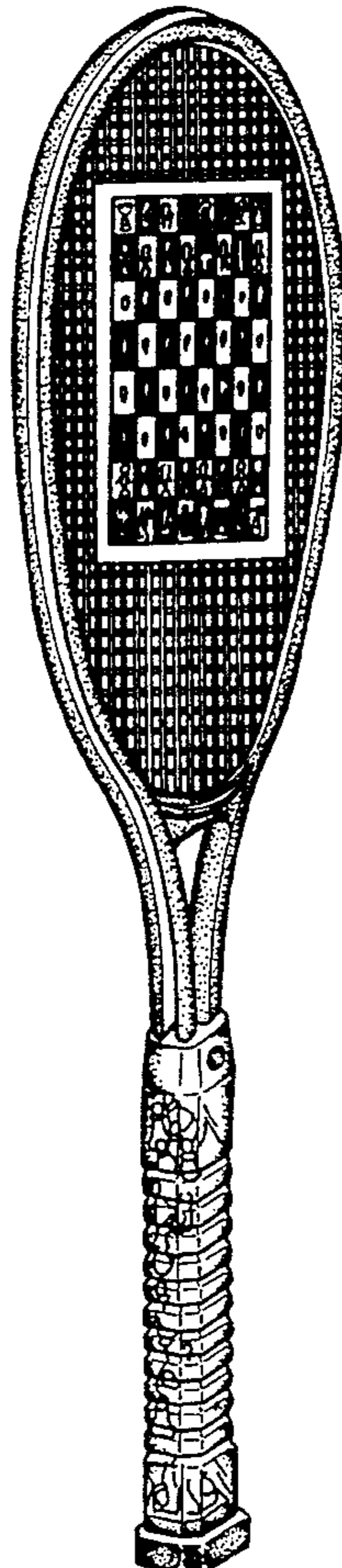
[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a combination tennis racket and chess board, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a combination tennis racket and chess board showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof; FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof; FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof; FIG. 6 is an inverted left side elevational view thereof; FIG. 7 is a right side elevational view thereof; FIG. 8 is a rear perspective view of FIG. 1; and, FIG. 9 is a front perspective view of FIG. 1, the chess pieces shown in an alternate position for clarity of illustration.

The broken line showing of a tennis ball in FIG. 8 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.



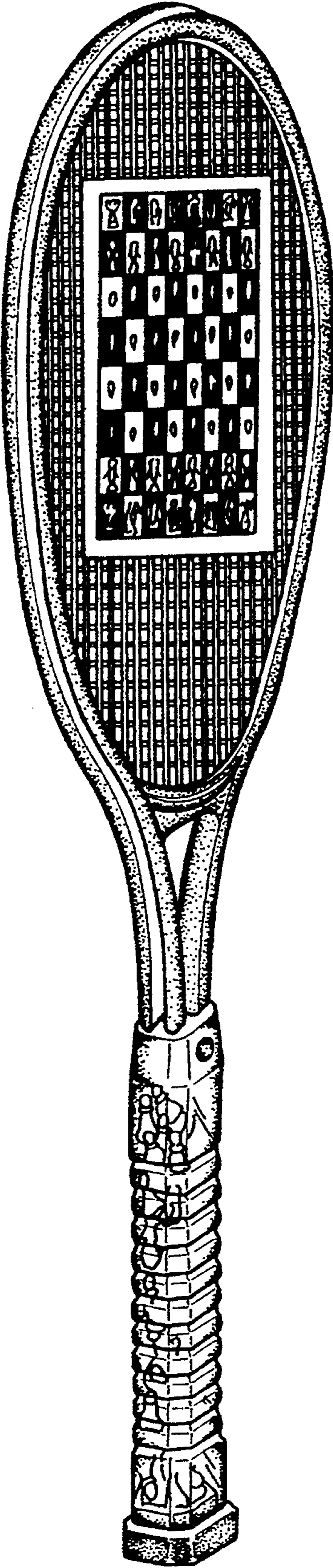

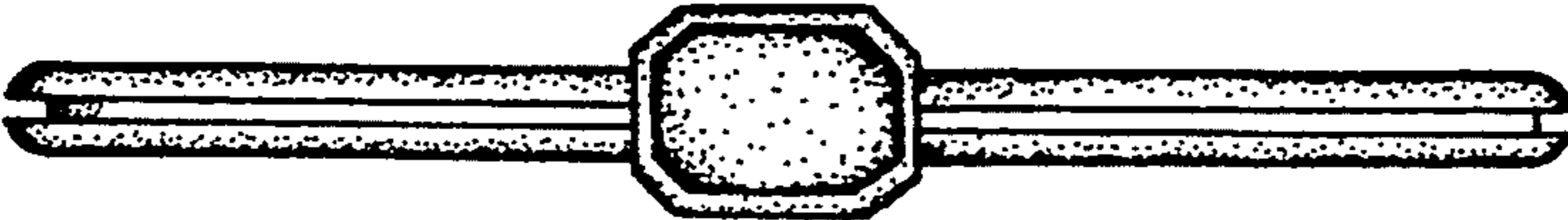

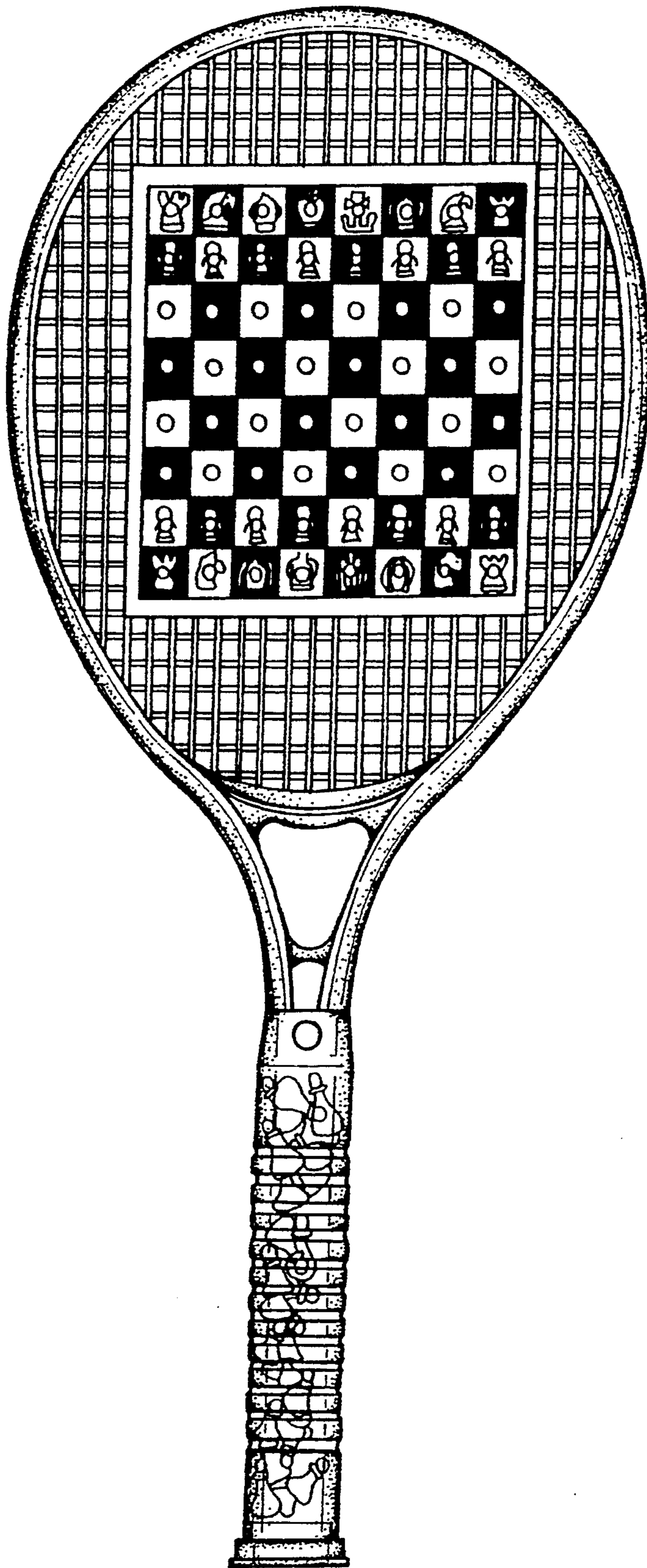

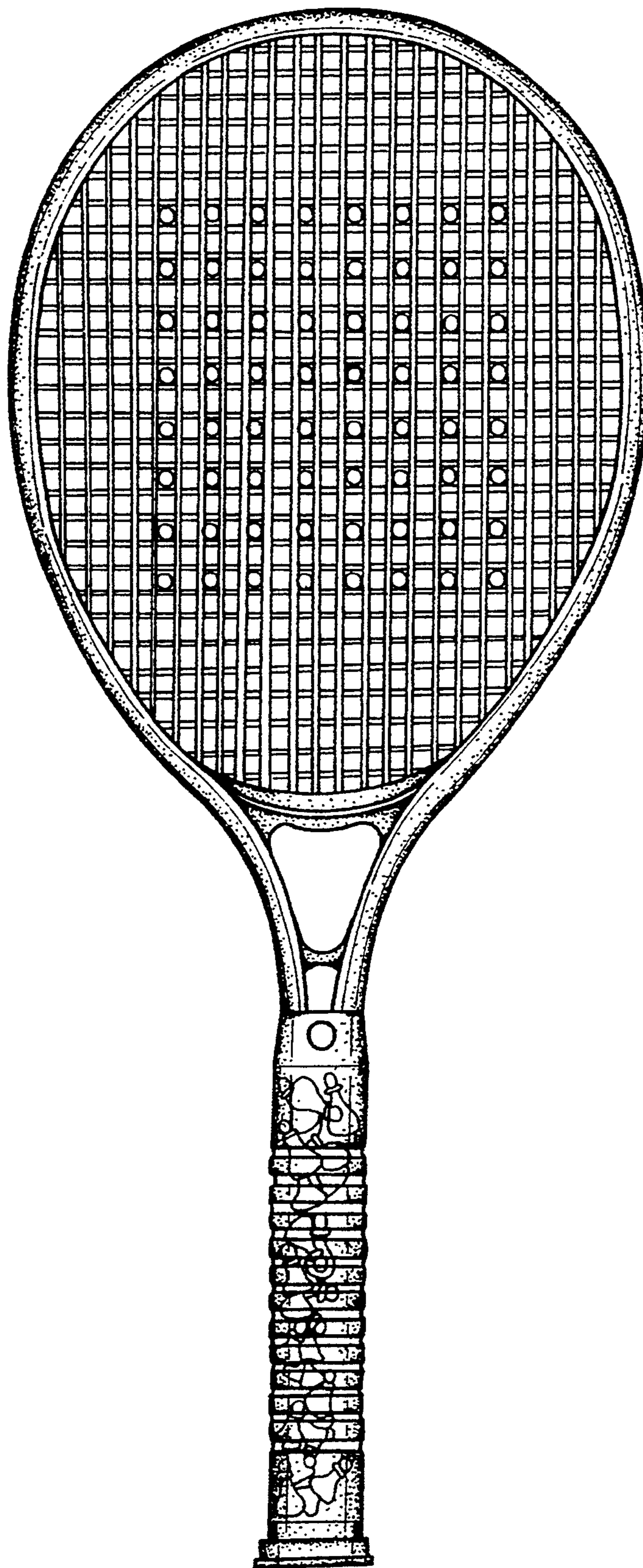

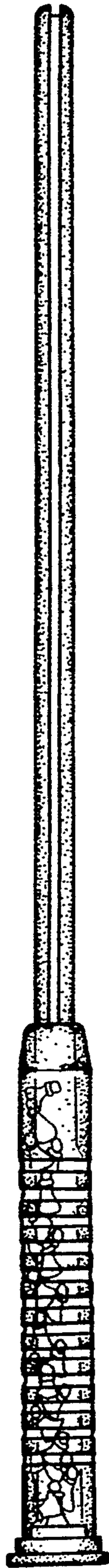

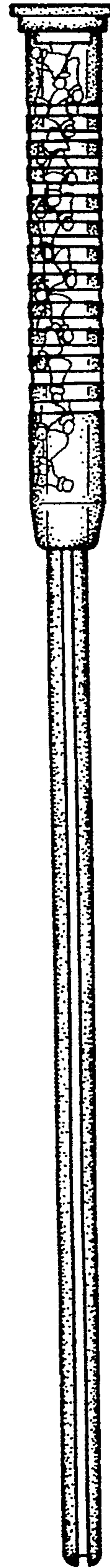

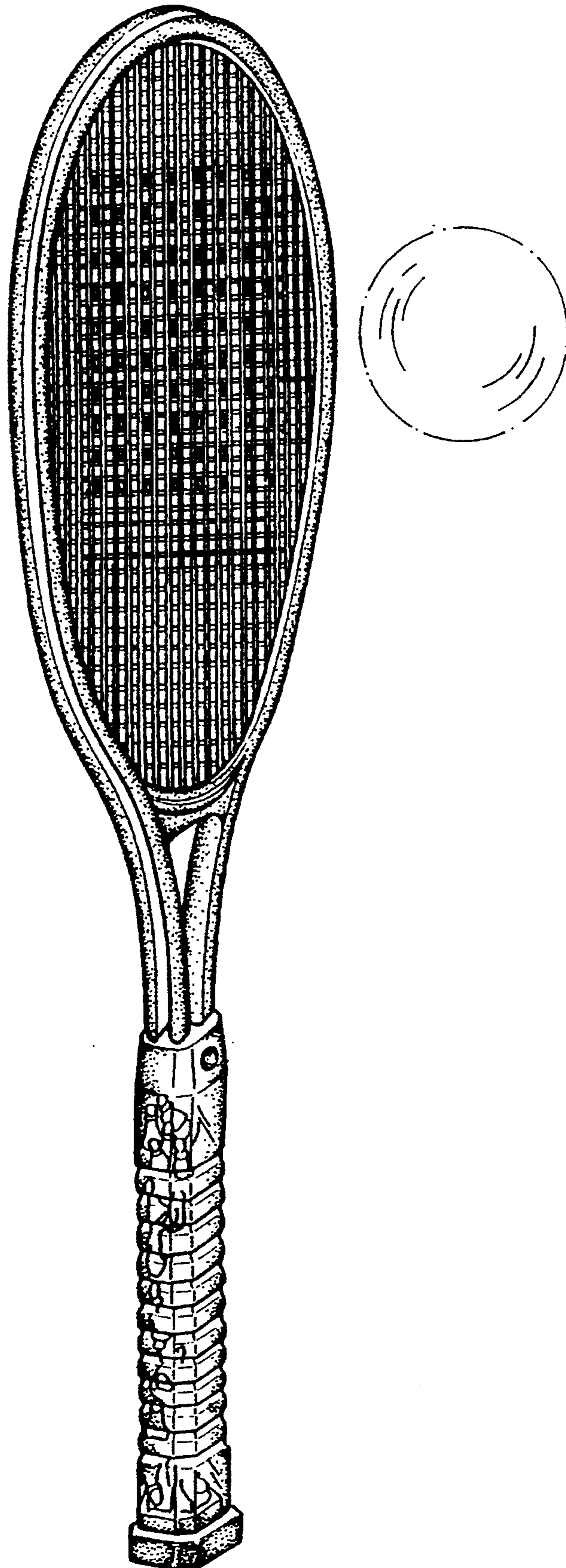

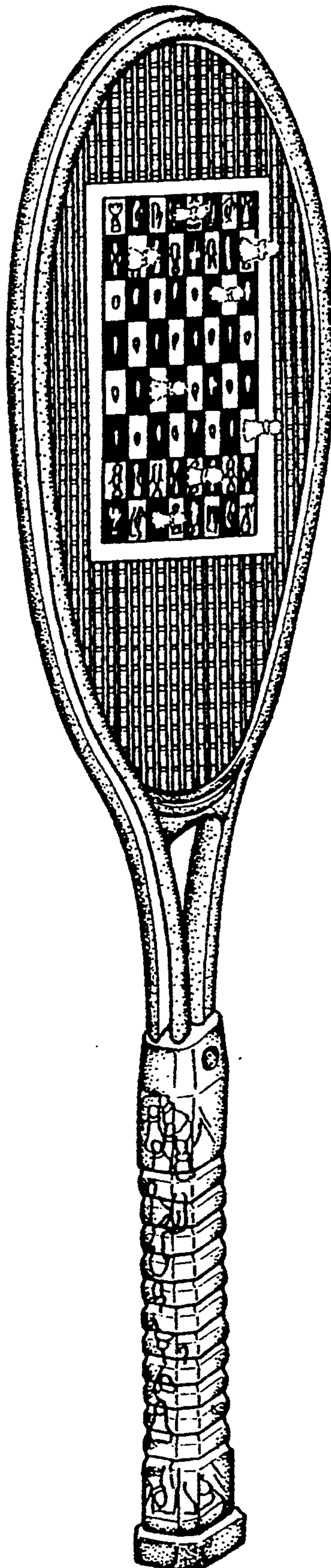
