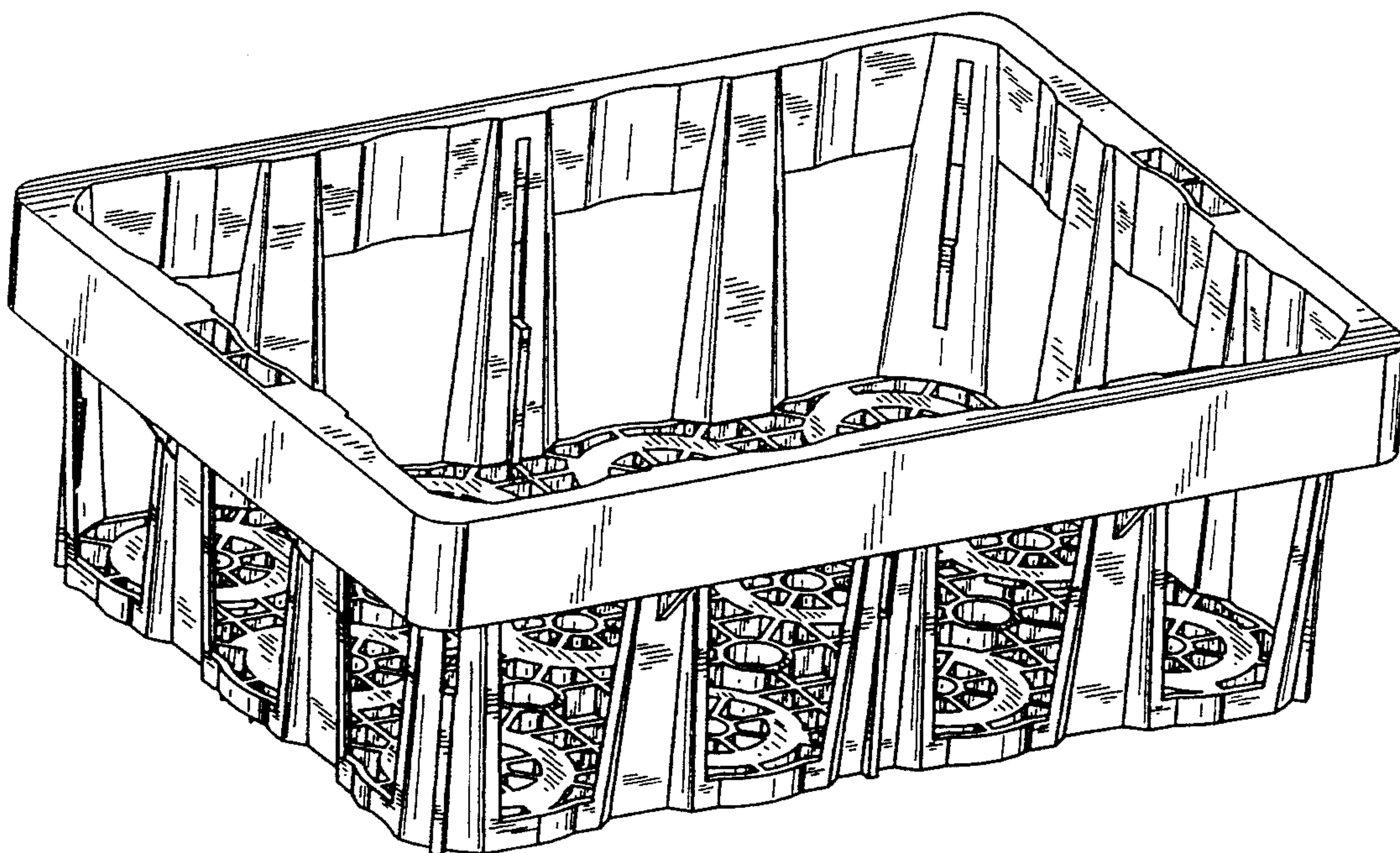
The ornamental design for a nestable tray for bottles, as shown and described.

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DESCRIPTION

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FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of a nestable tray for bottles showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a bottom perspective view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view thereof; the rear elevational view being a mirror image;

FIG. 9 is an enlarged elevational view taken along line 9—9 of FIG. 3.



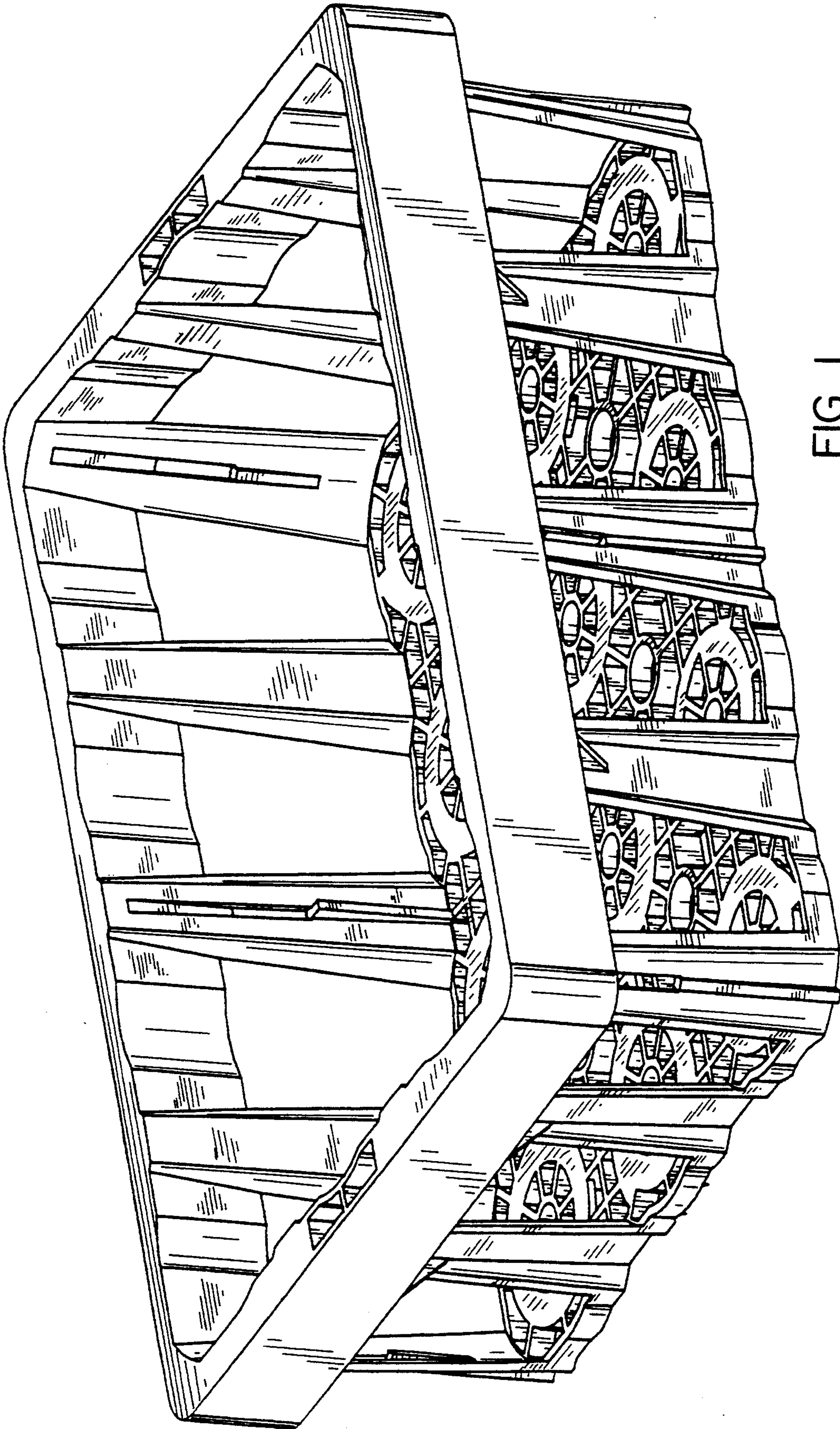

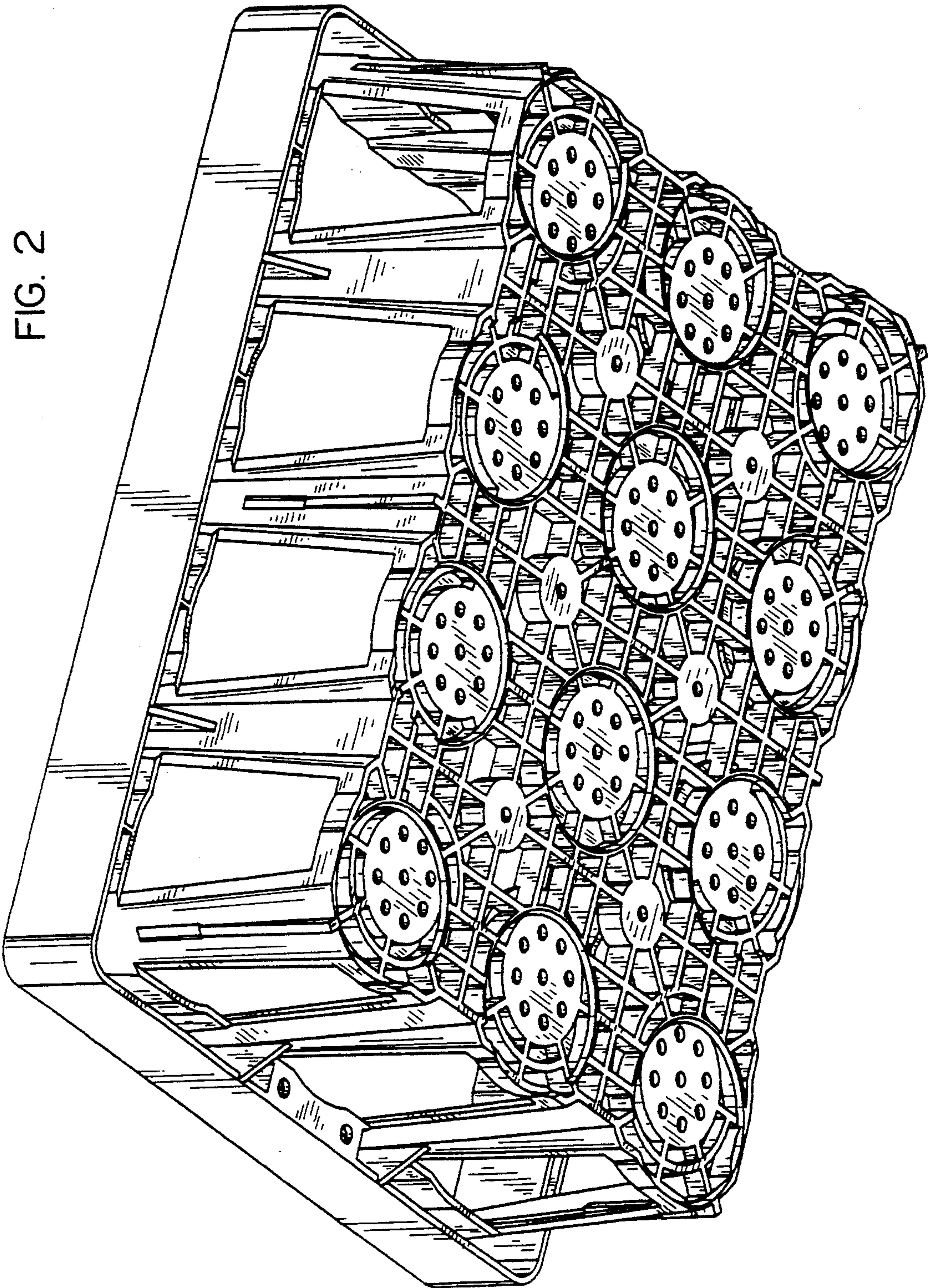

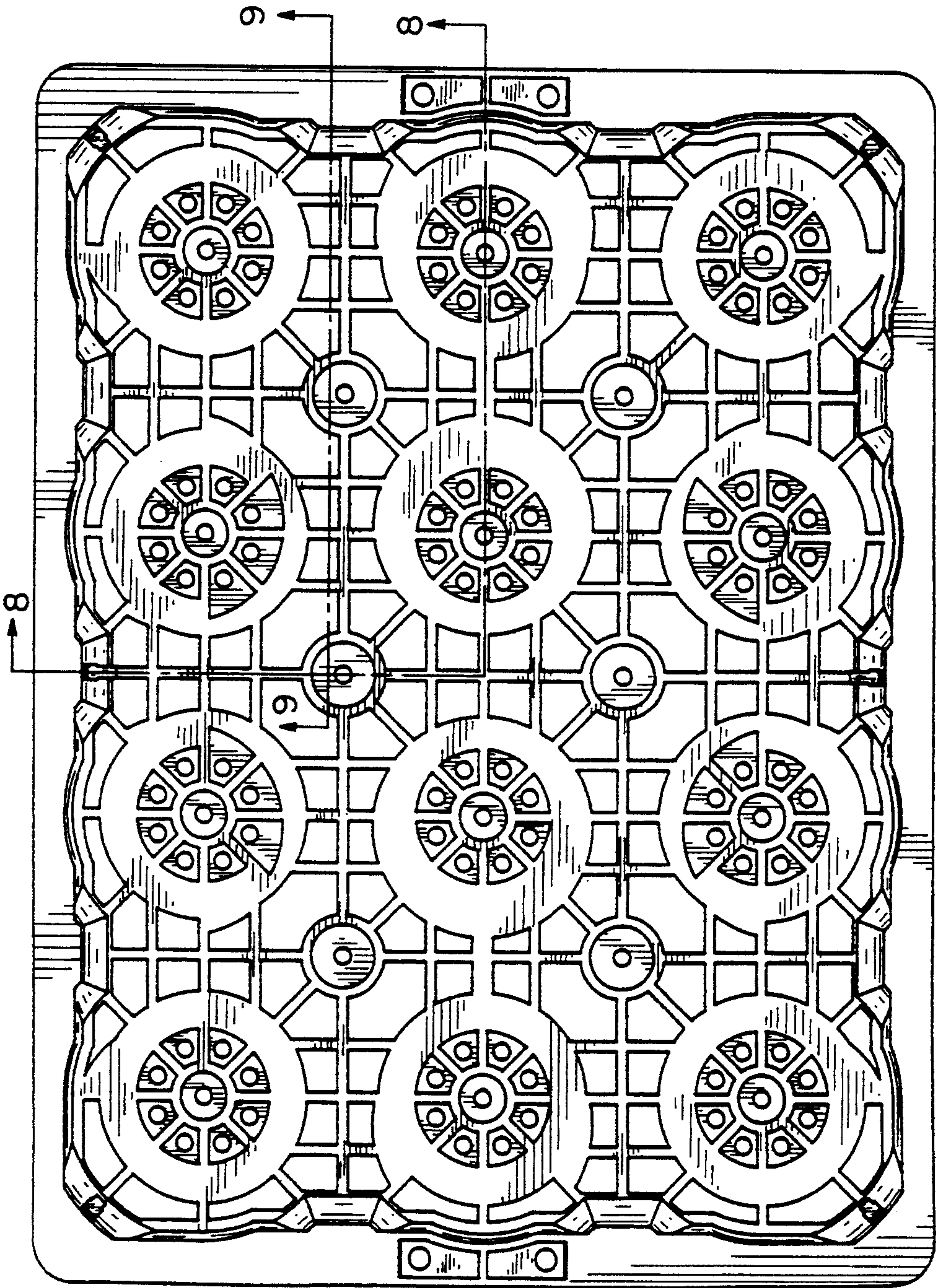

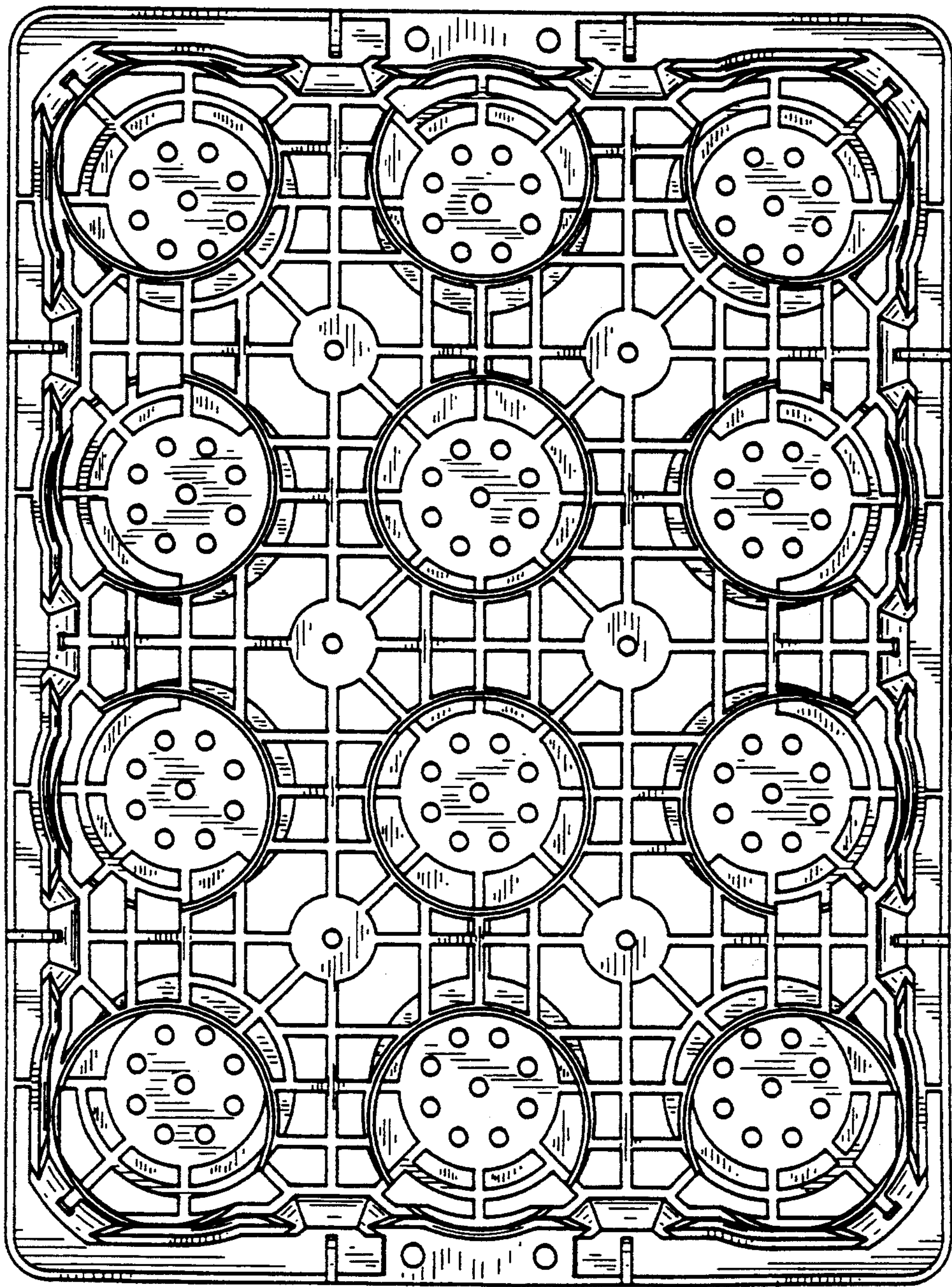

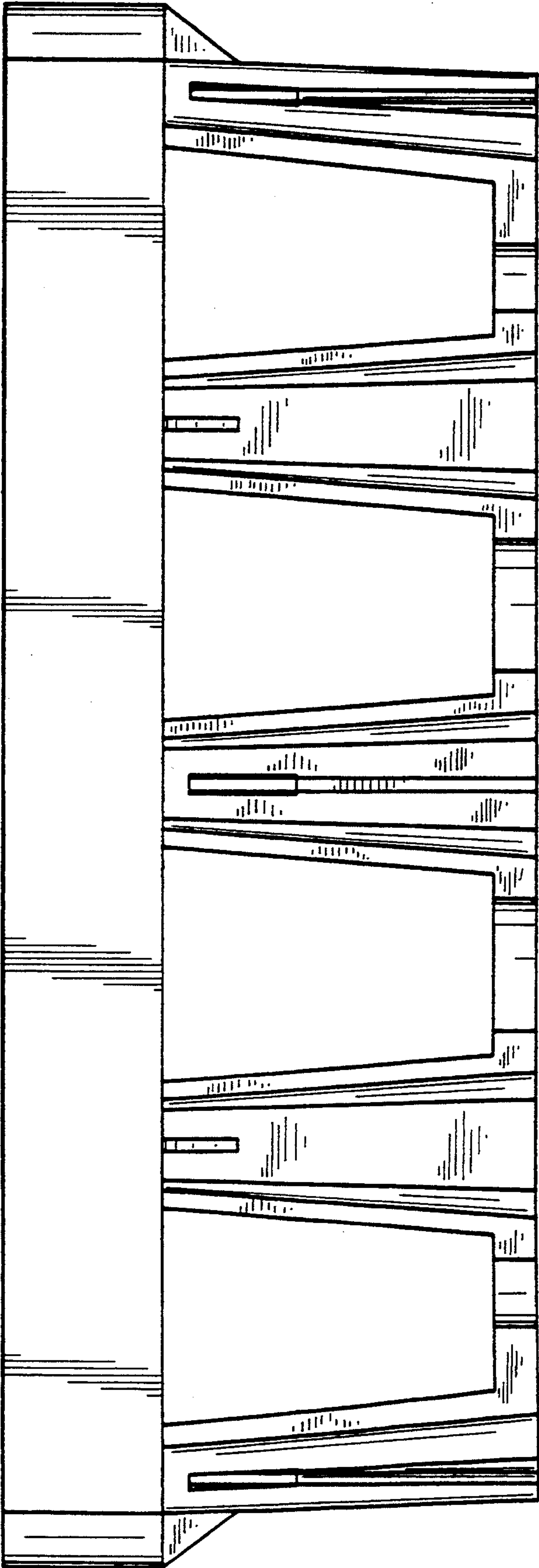
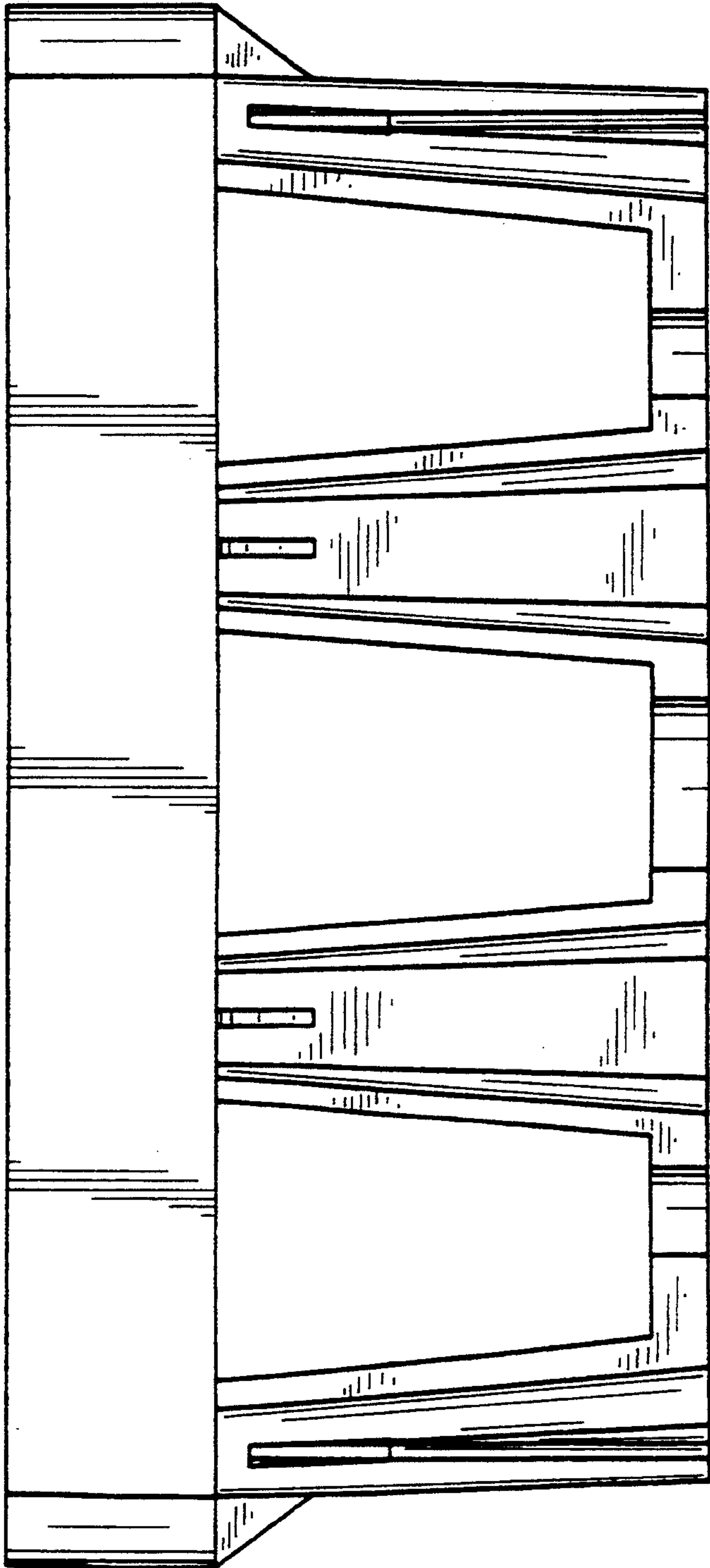

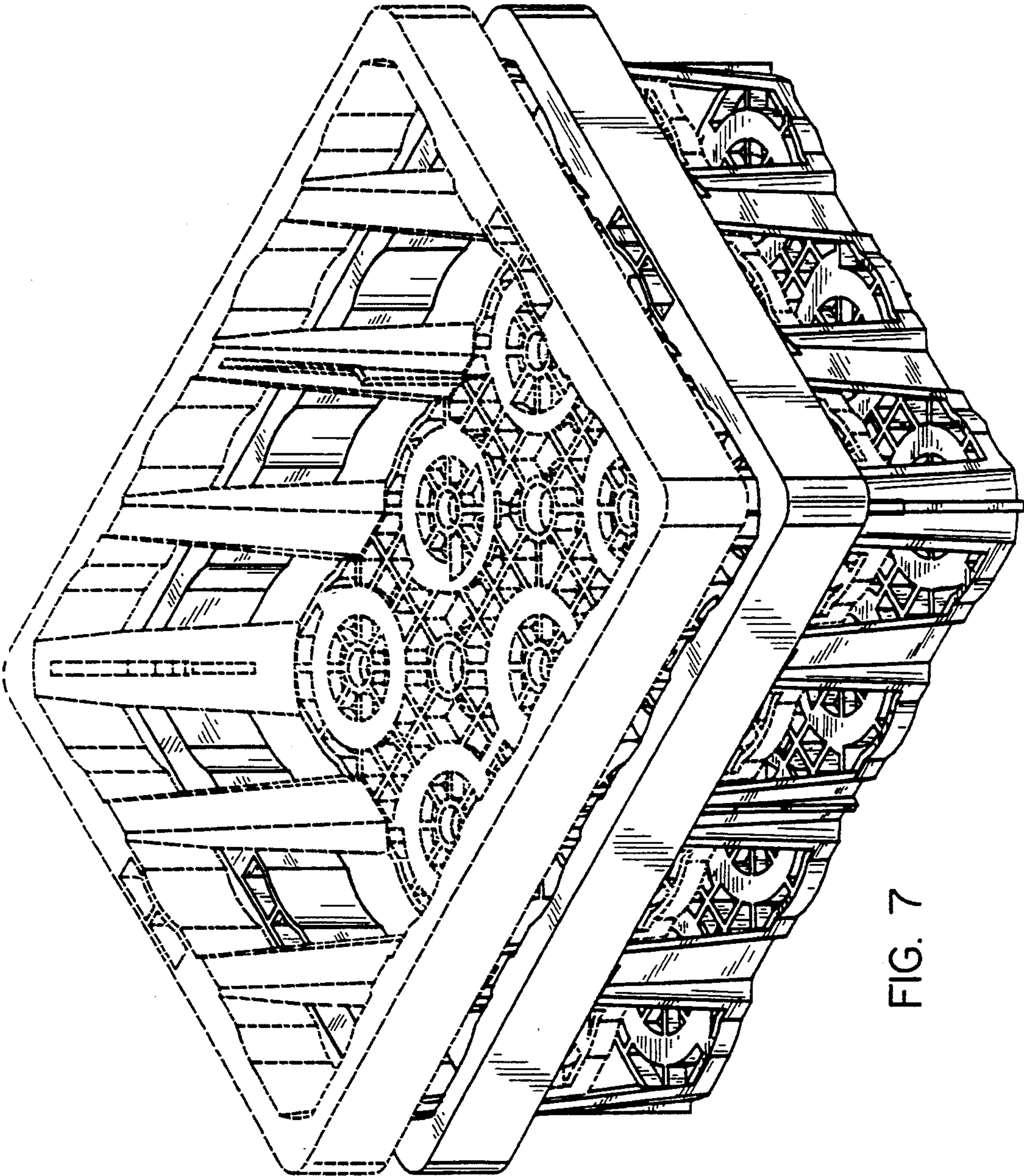

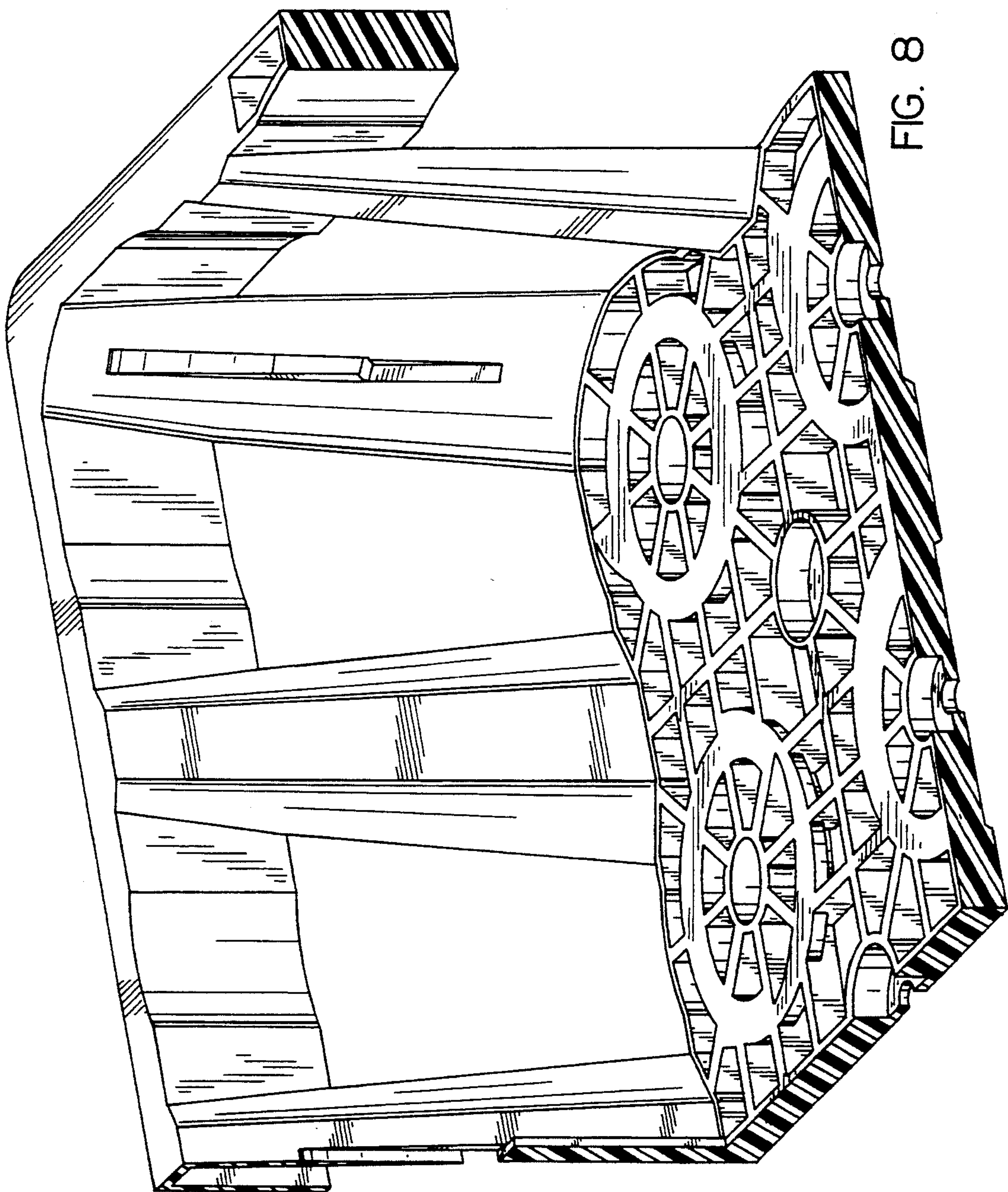

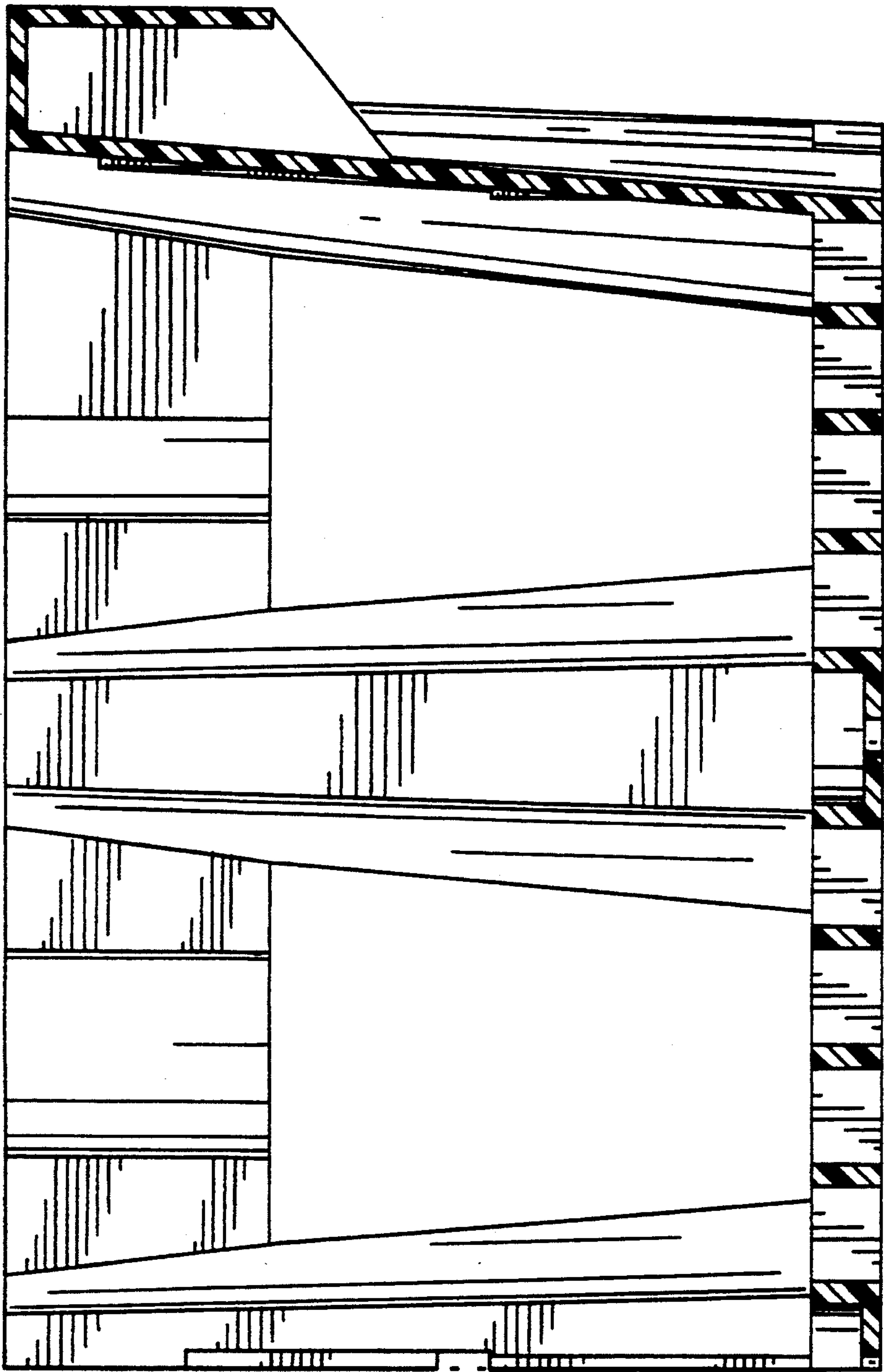
