[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design of a cue stick, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION







FIG. 1*FIG. 2**FIG. 3*

FIG. 1 is a side elevation of the entire cue stick showing my ornamental design;
FIG. 2 is an enlarged, fragmentary elevation of the butt end of the cue stick;
FIG. 3 is a further enlarged, fragmentary, developed view thereof taken in the direction of the line 3—3 of FIG. 2; and,
FIG. 4 is a further enlarged, fragmentary, developed view thereof taken in the direction of the line 4—4 of FIG. 2.
The tip and butt end of the cue stick are plain and unornamented.
The characteristic feature of the design resides in the ornamental indicia on the cue stick.
