DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a golf putter showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is an enlarged fragmented front elevational view of the shaft, shown for clarity of illustration;
FIG. 3 is an enlarged fragmented bottom perspective view of the golf putter head, shown for clarity of illustration;
FIG. 4 is a toe end view of FIG. 3;
FIG. 5 is a front elevational view of FIG. 3;
FIG. 6 is a heel end view of FIG. 3;
FIG. 7 is a top plan view of FIG. 3;
FIG. 8 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 3; and,
FIG. 9 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 3.

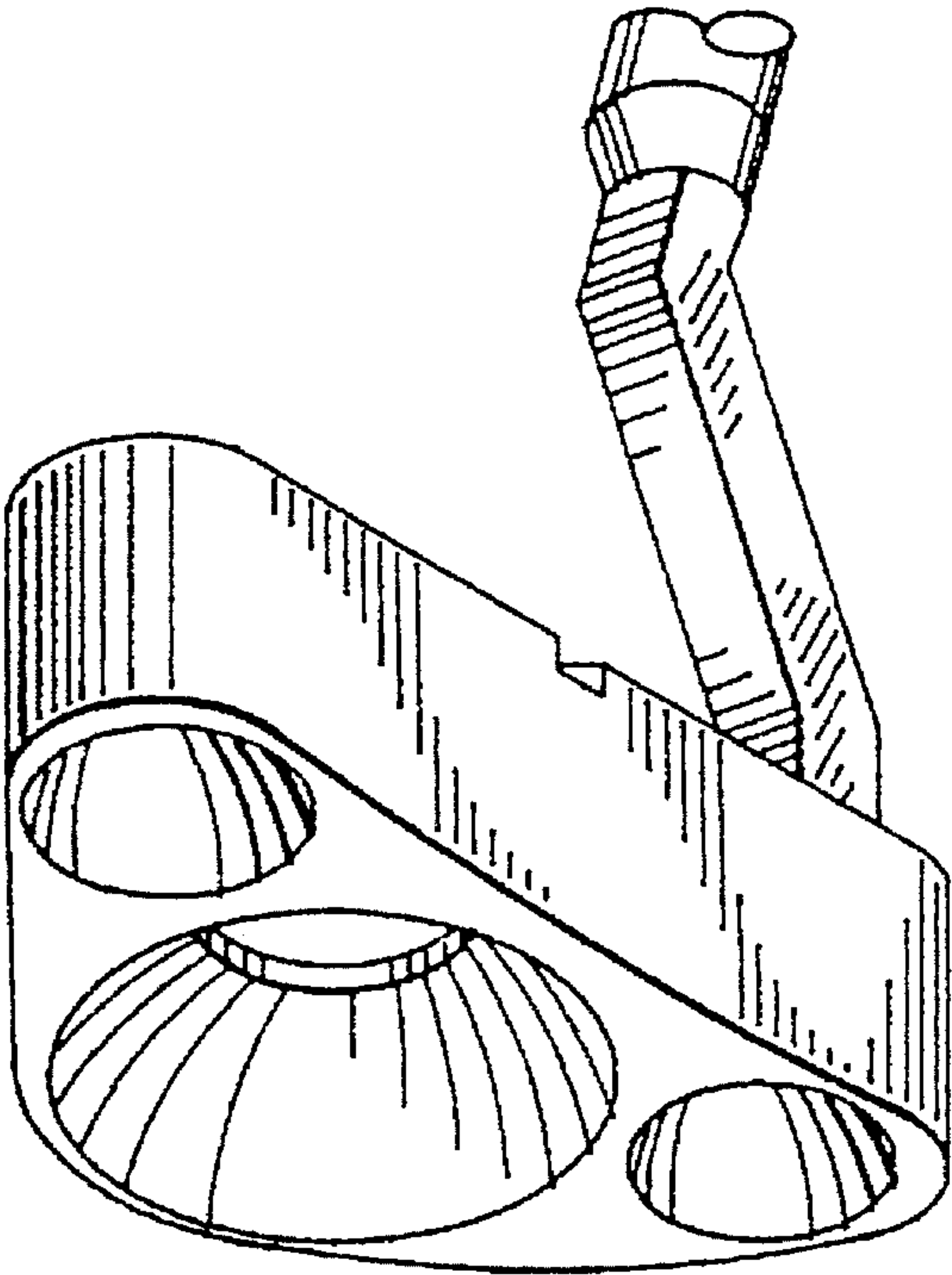

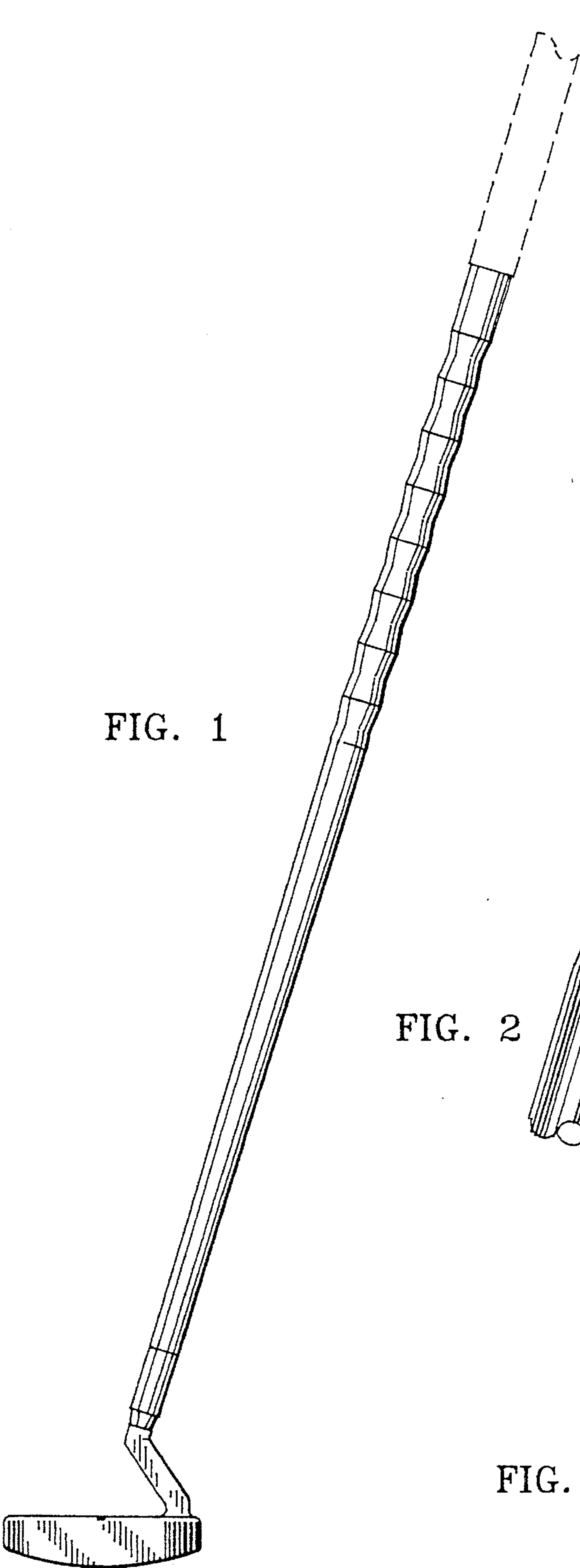

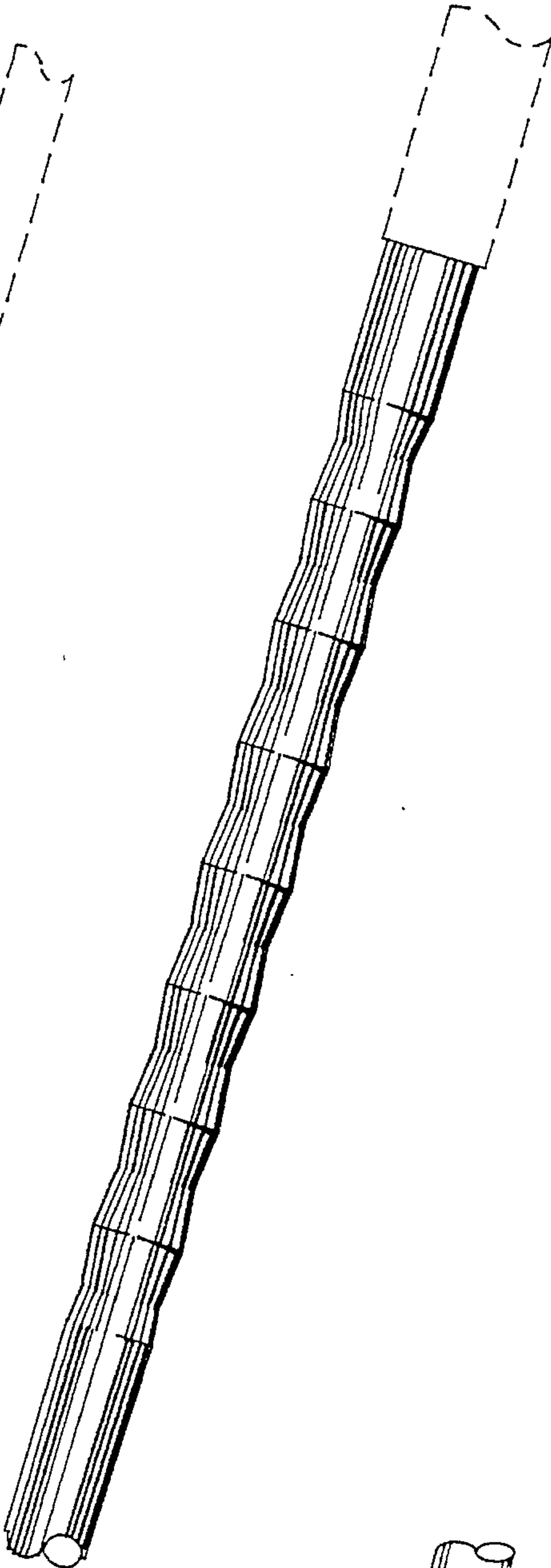
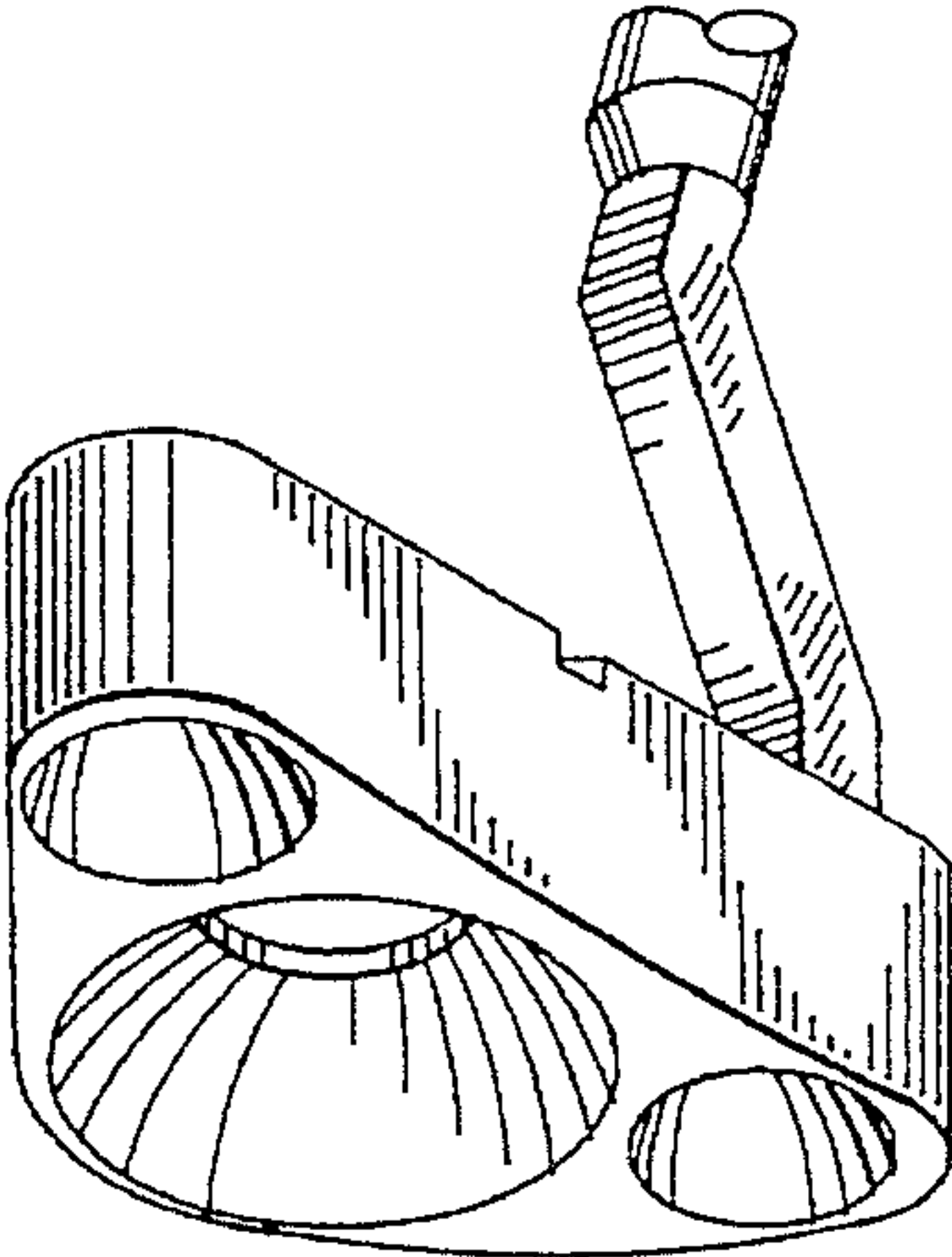

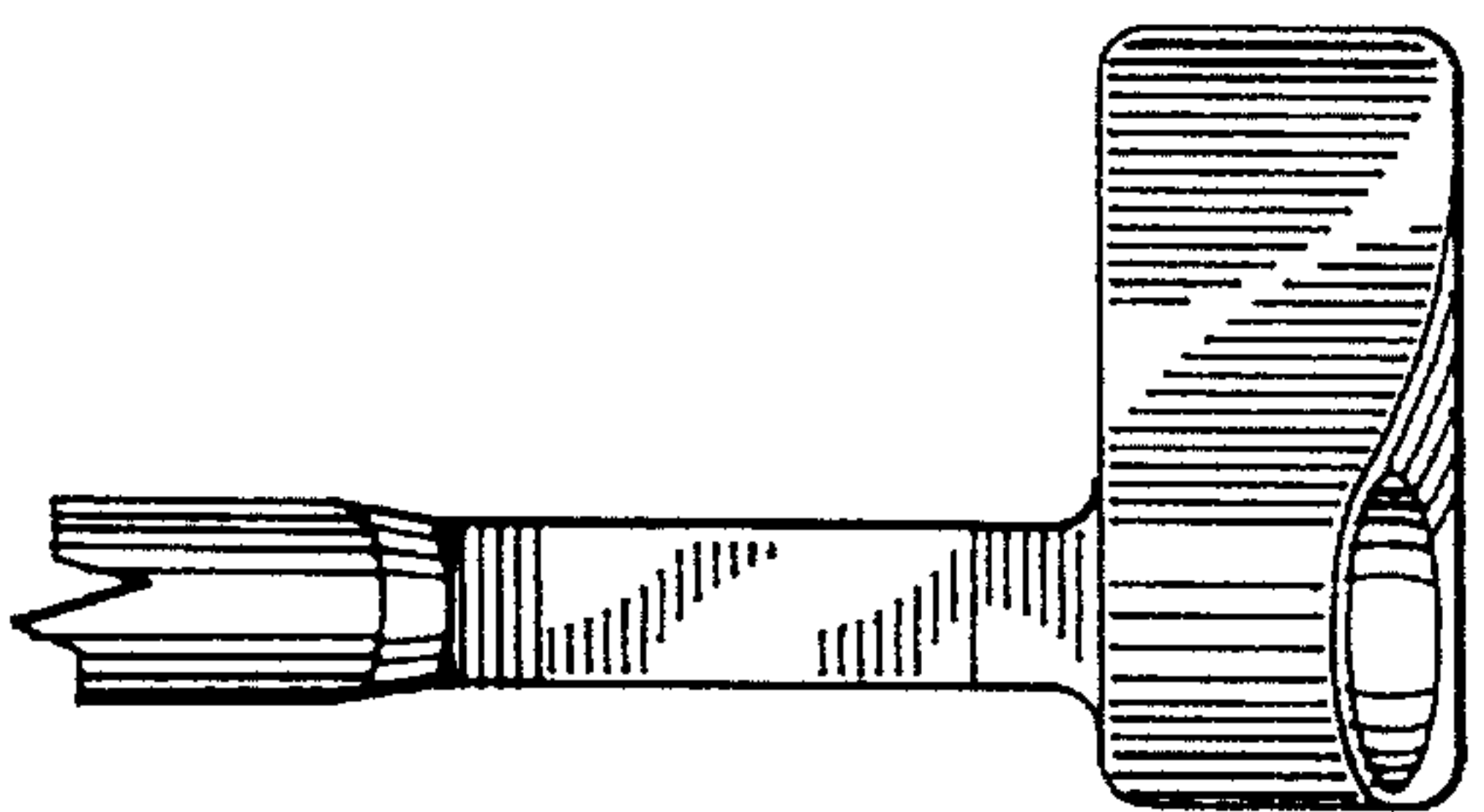

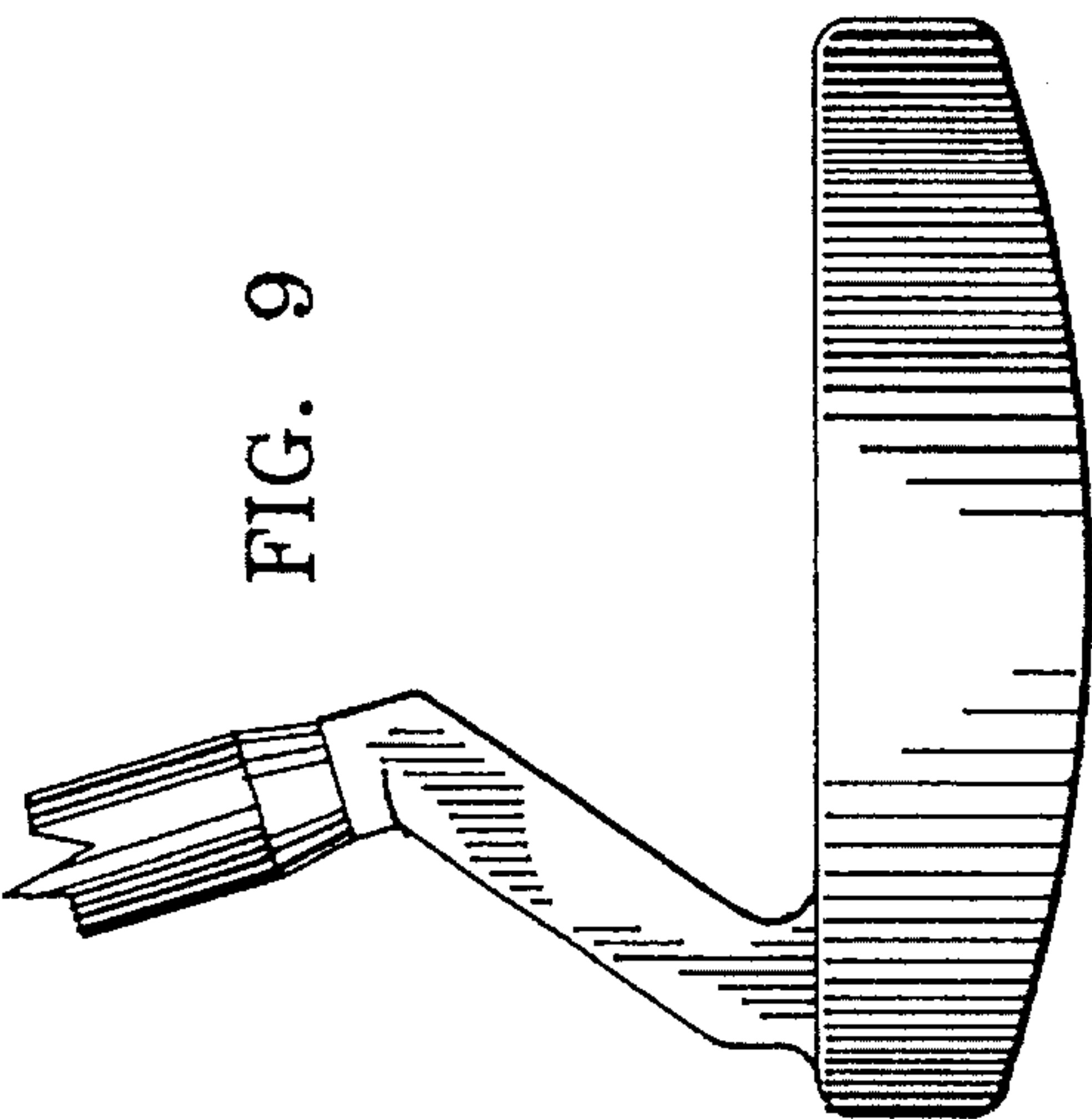

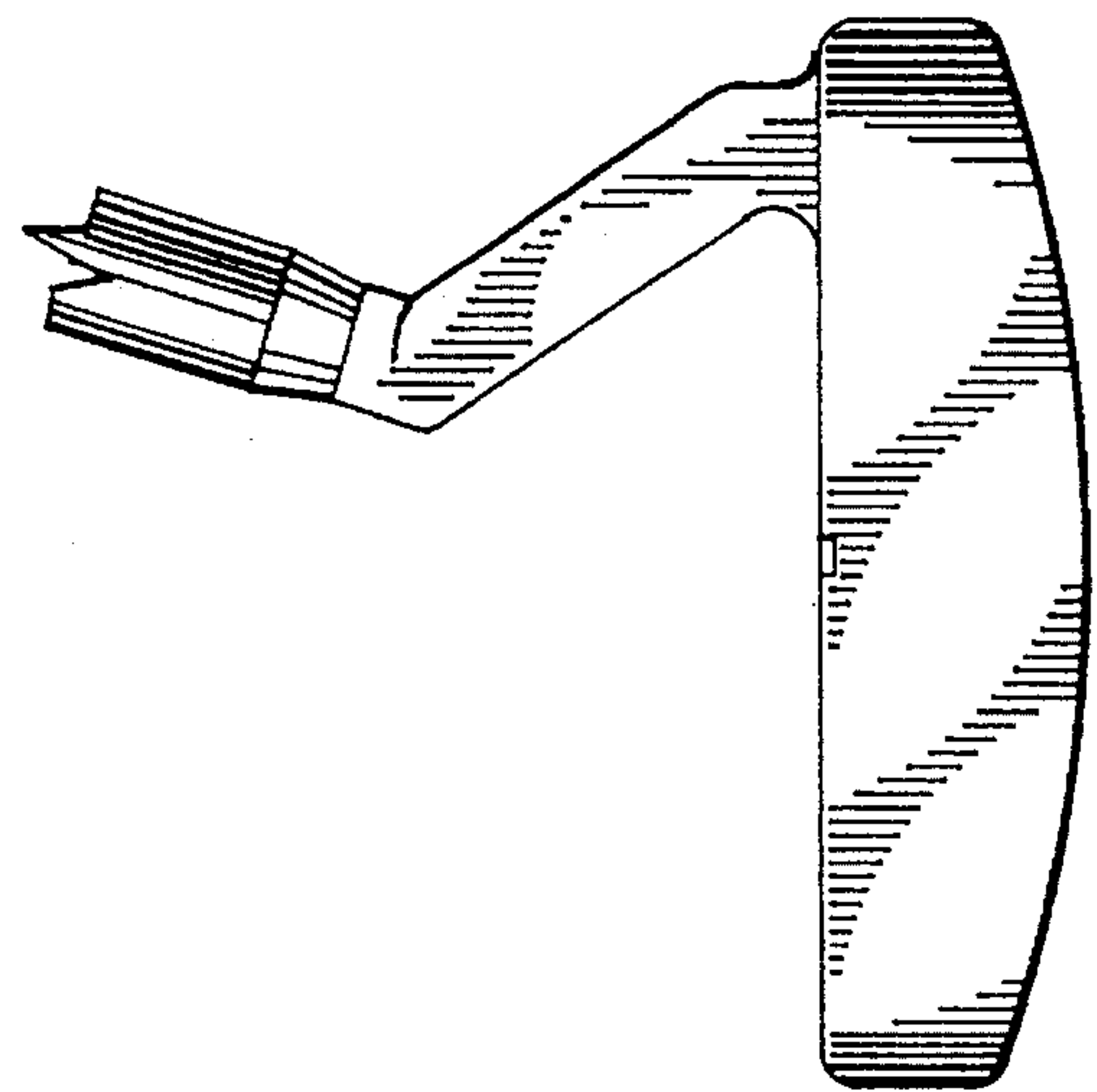

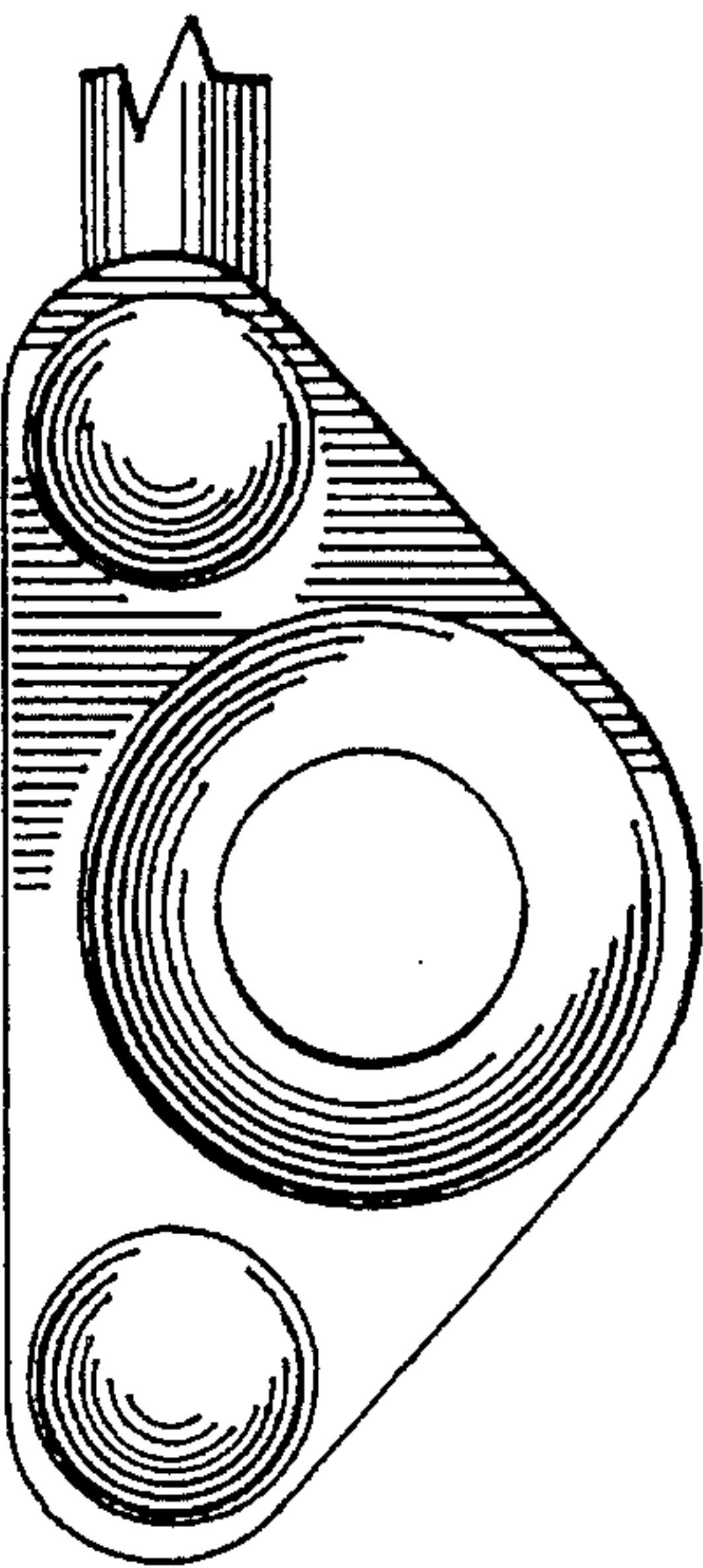

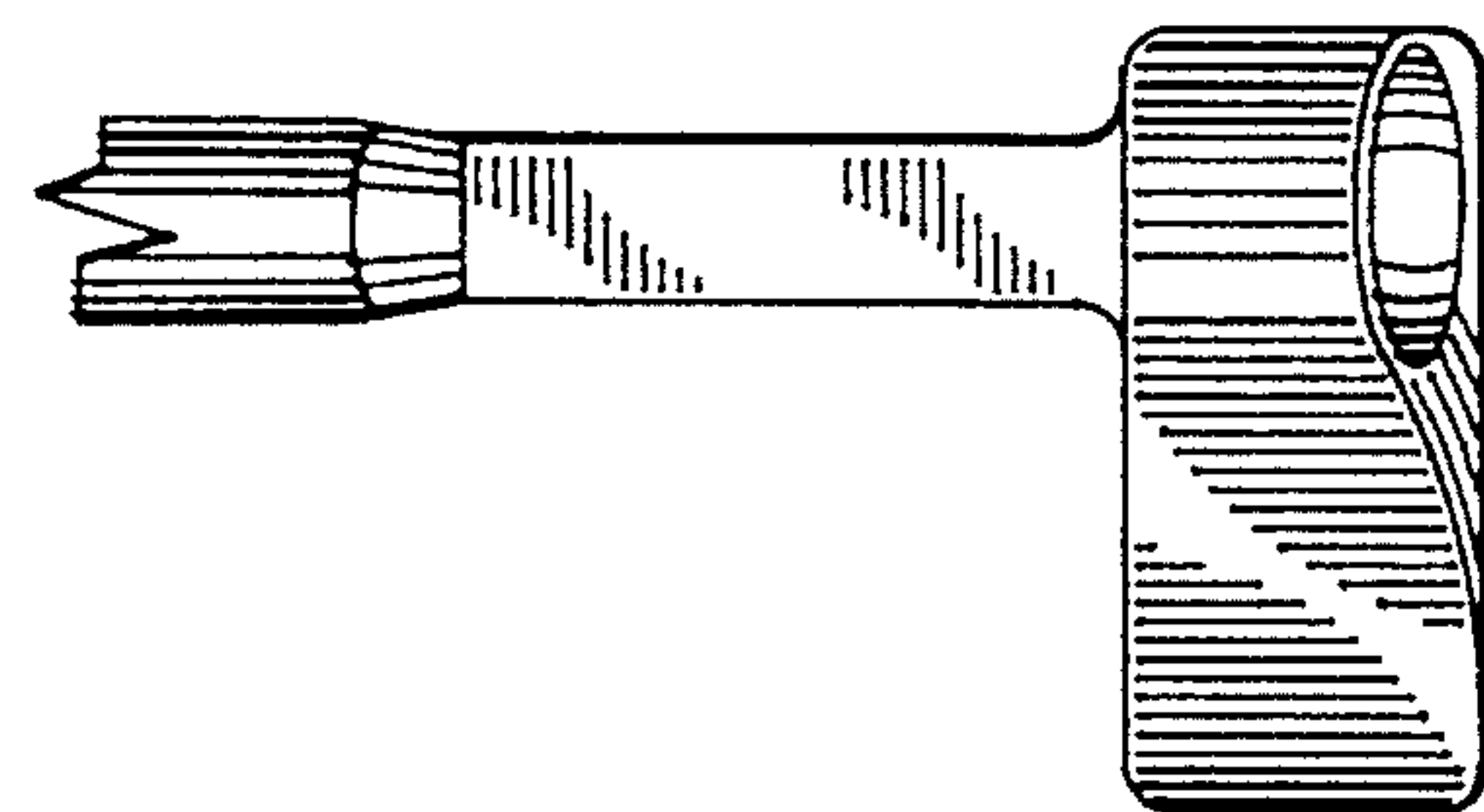

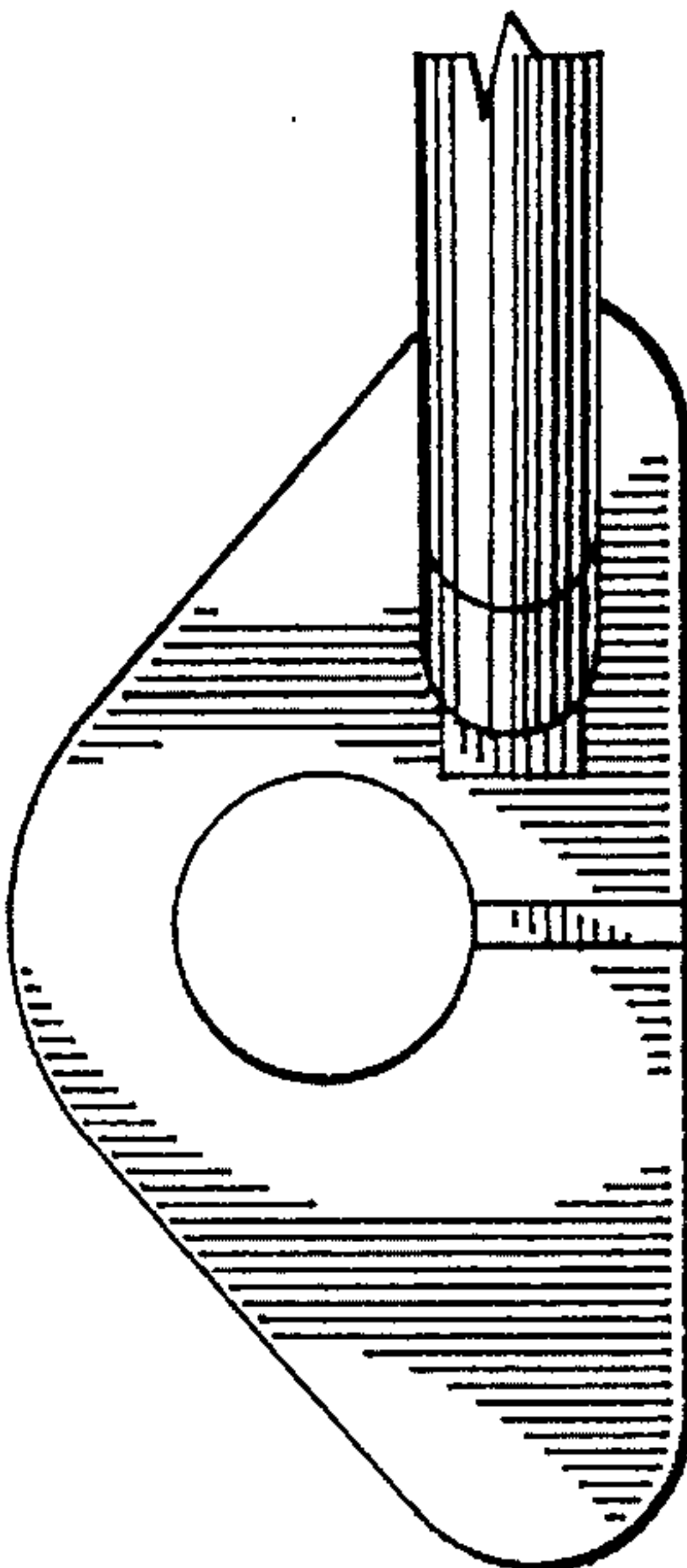
