medication dispenser;

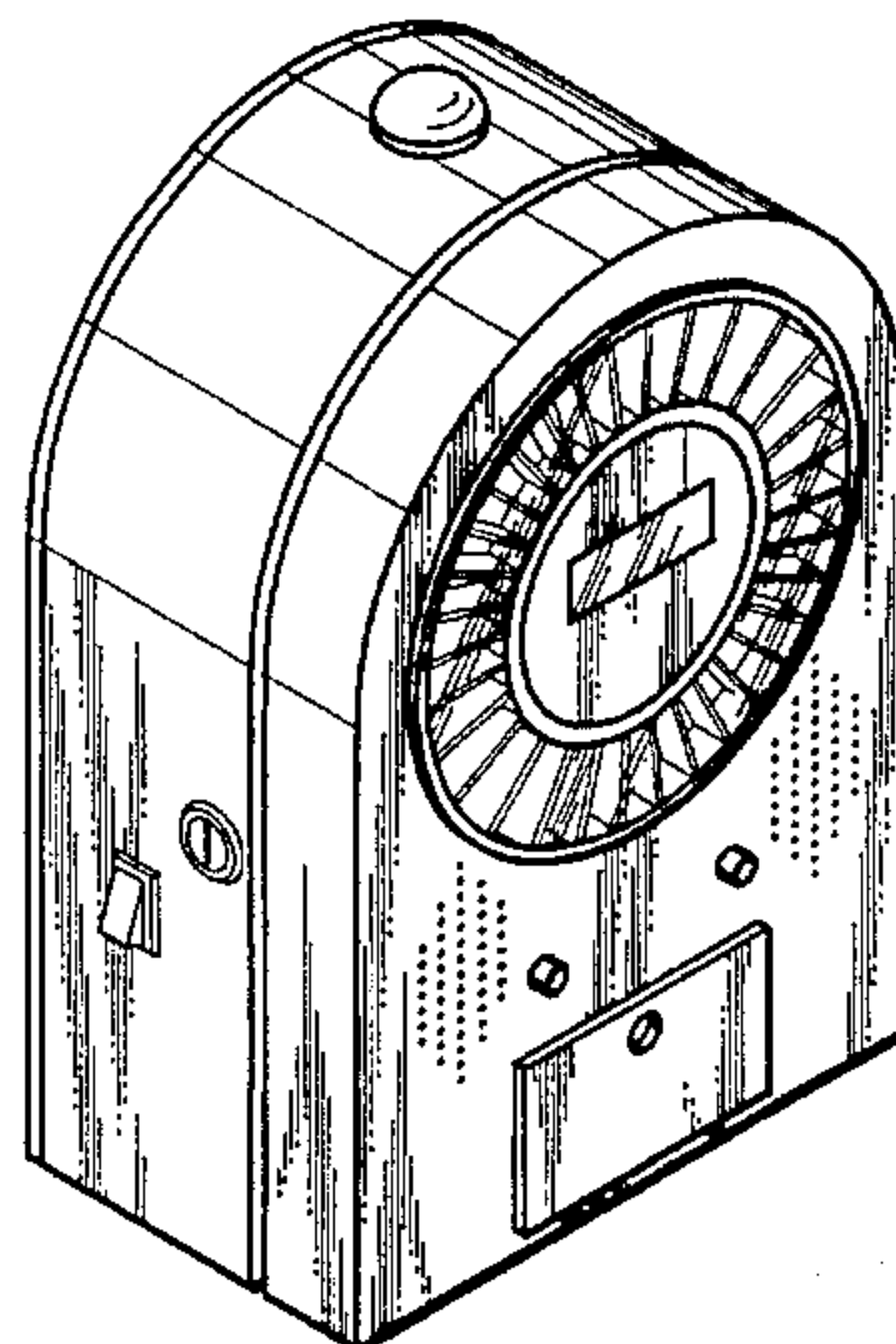
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view of a telephone monitored

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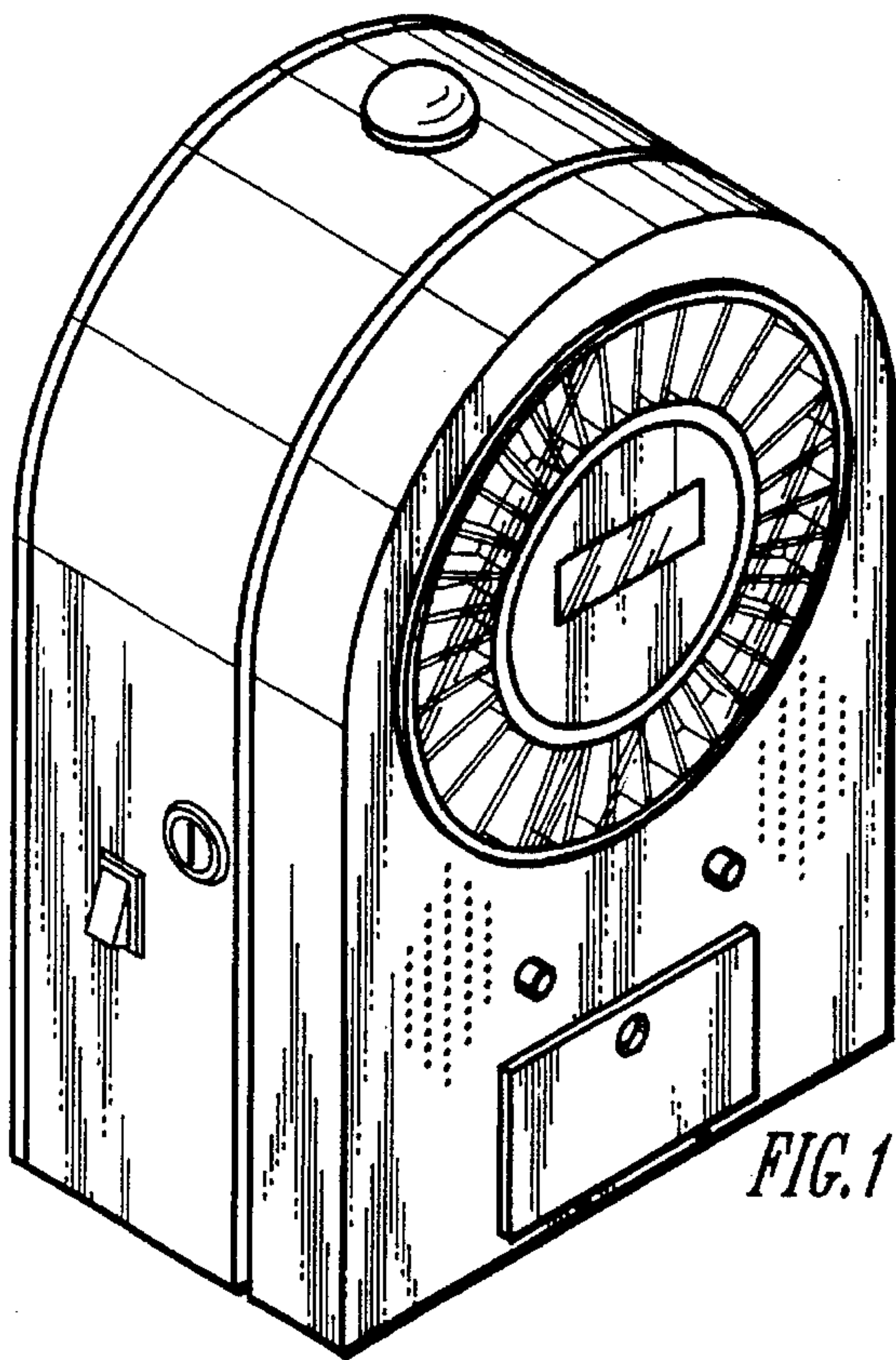

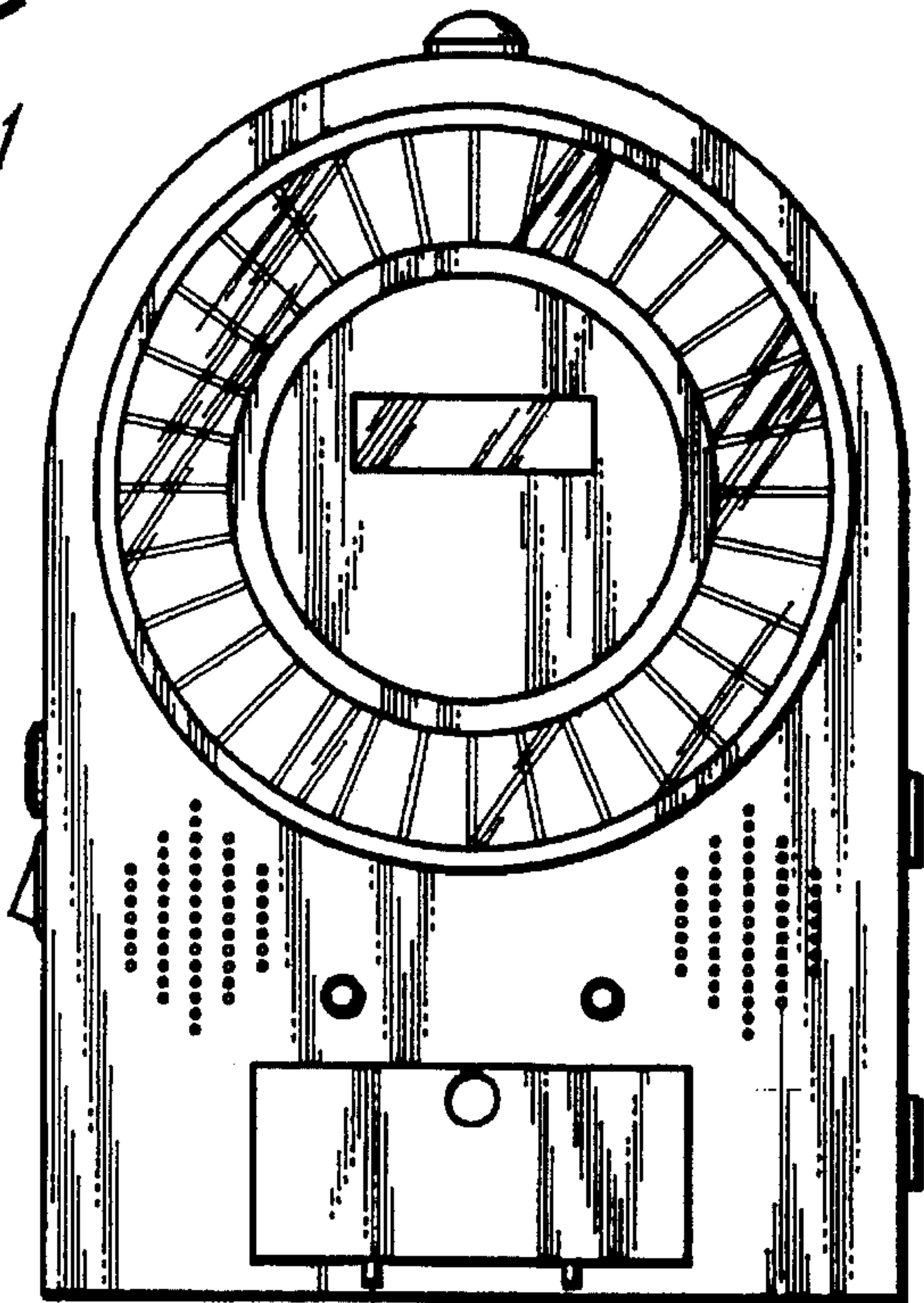

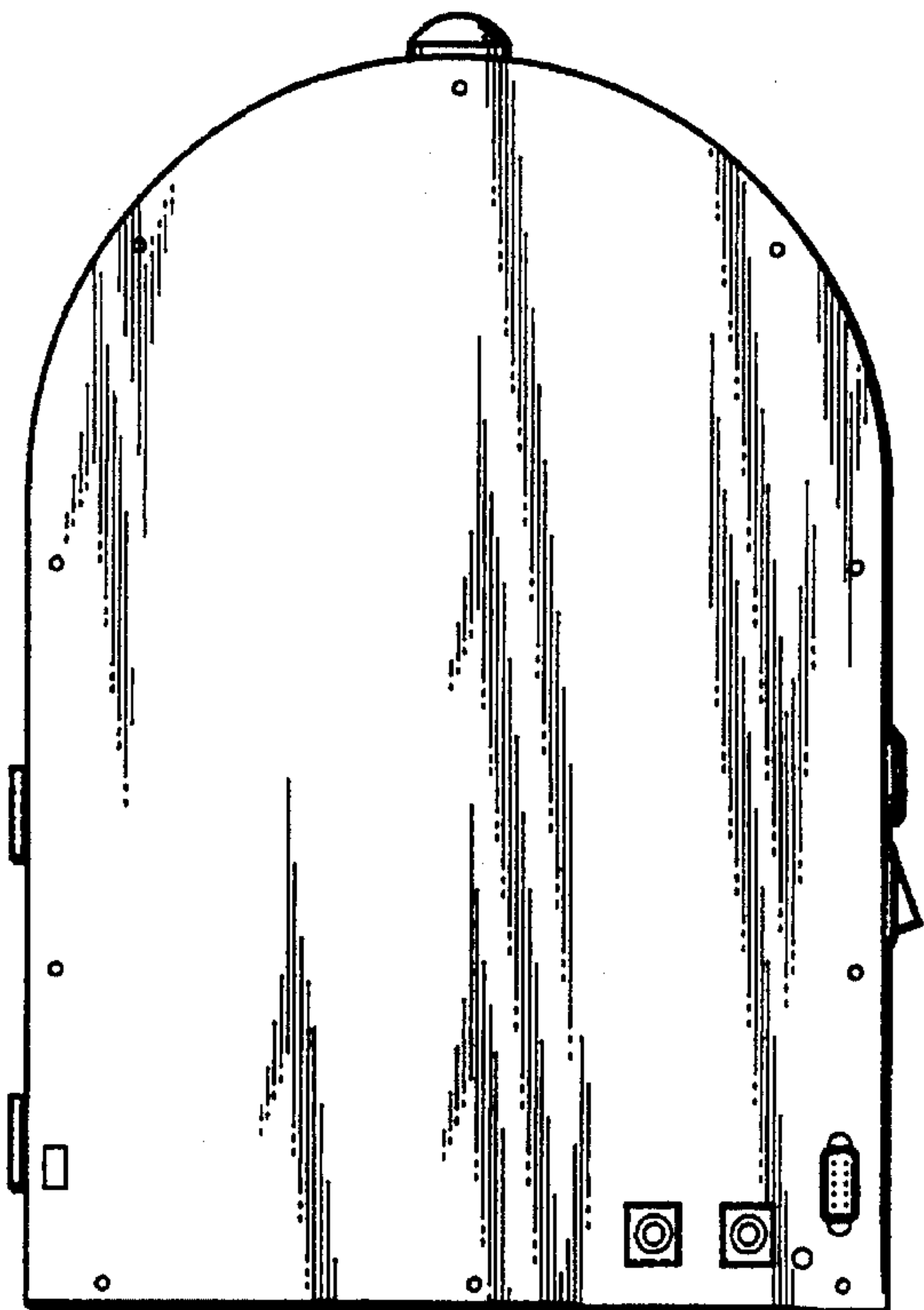

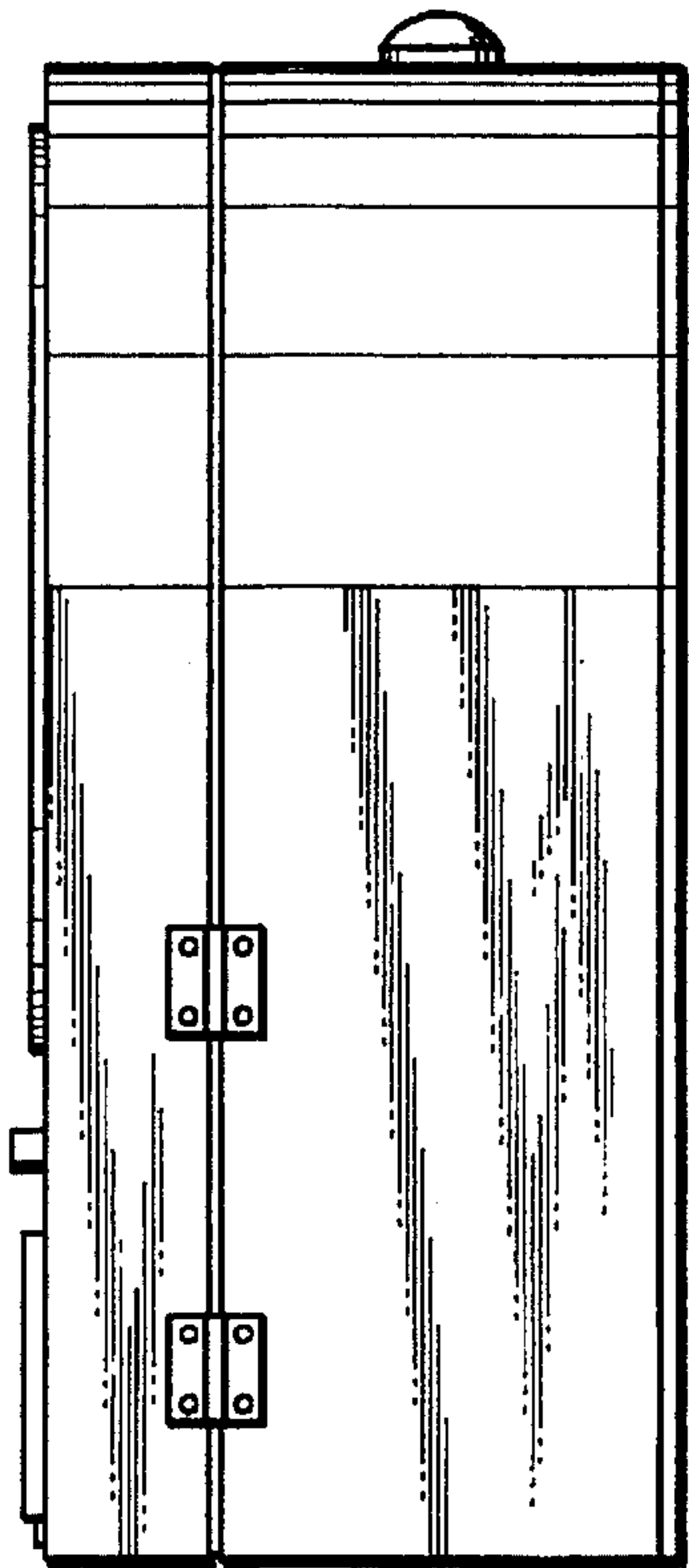

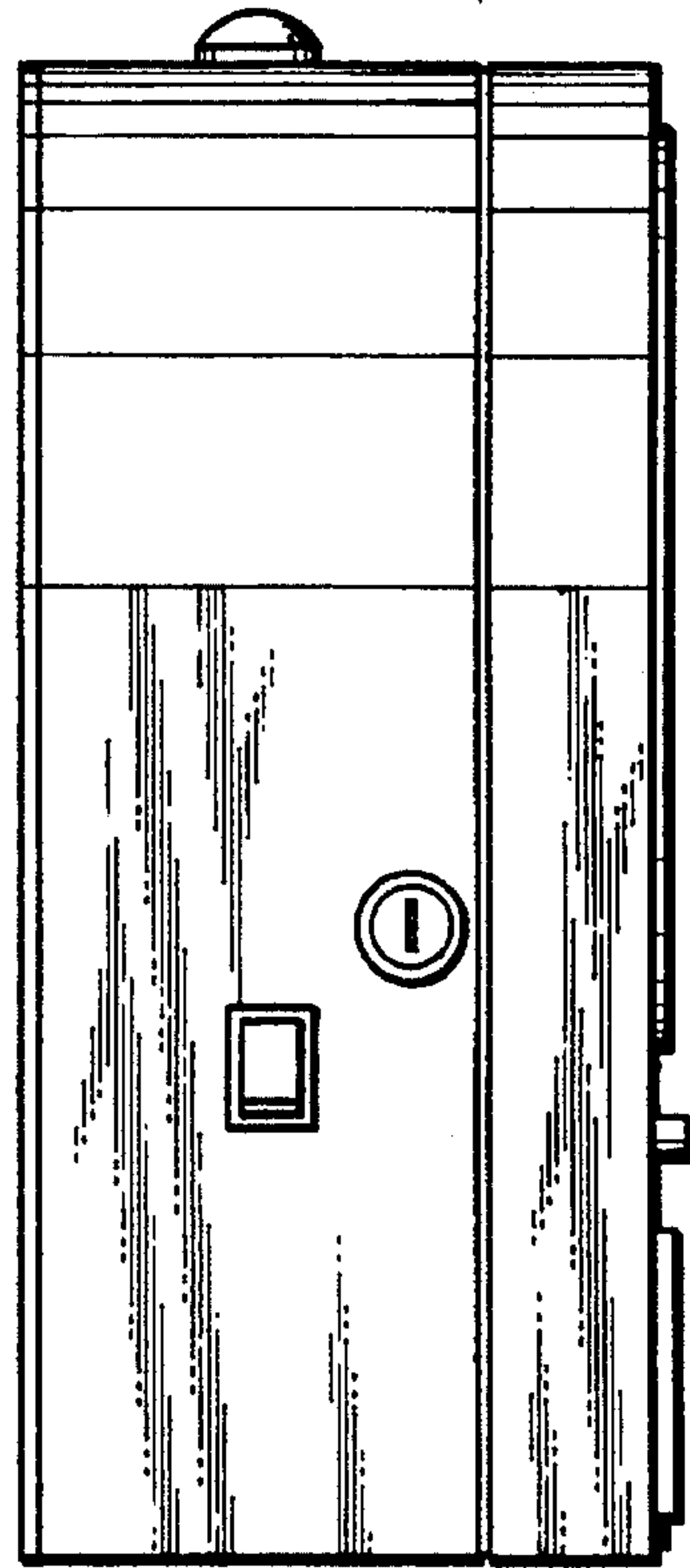

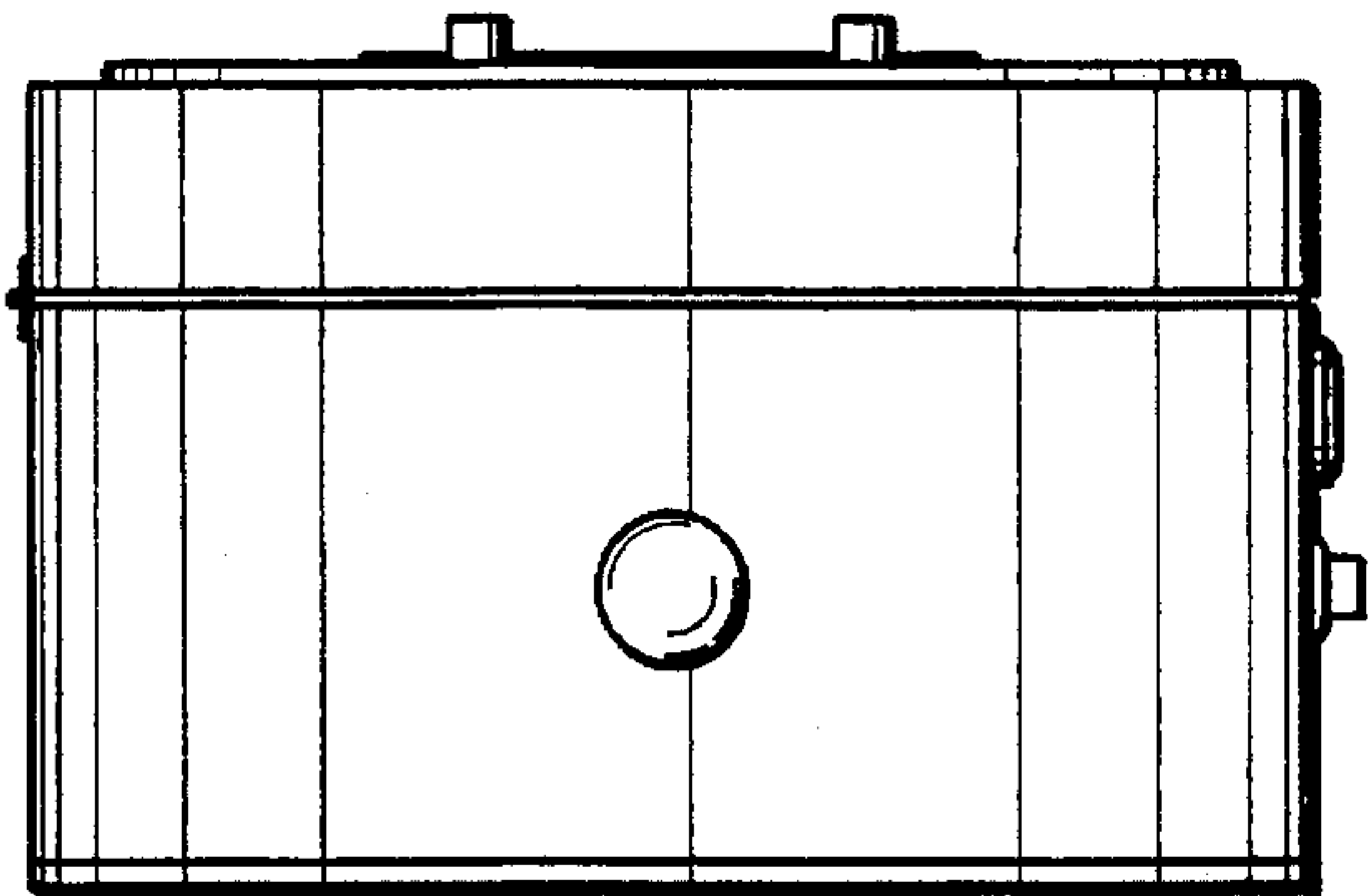

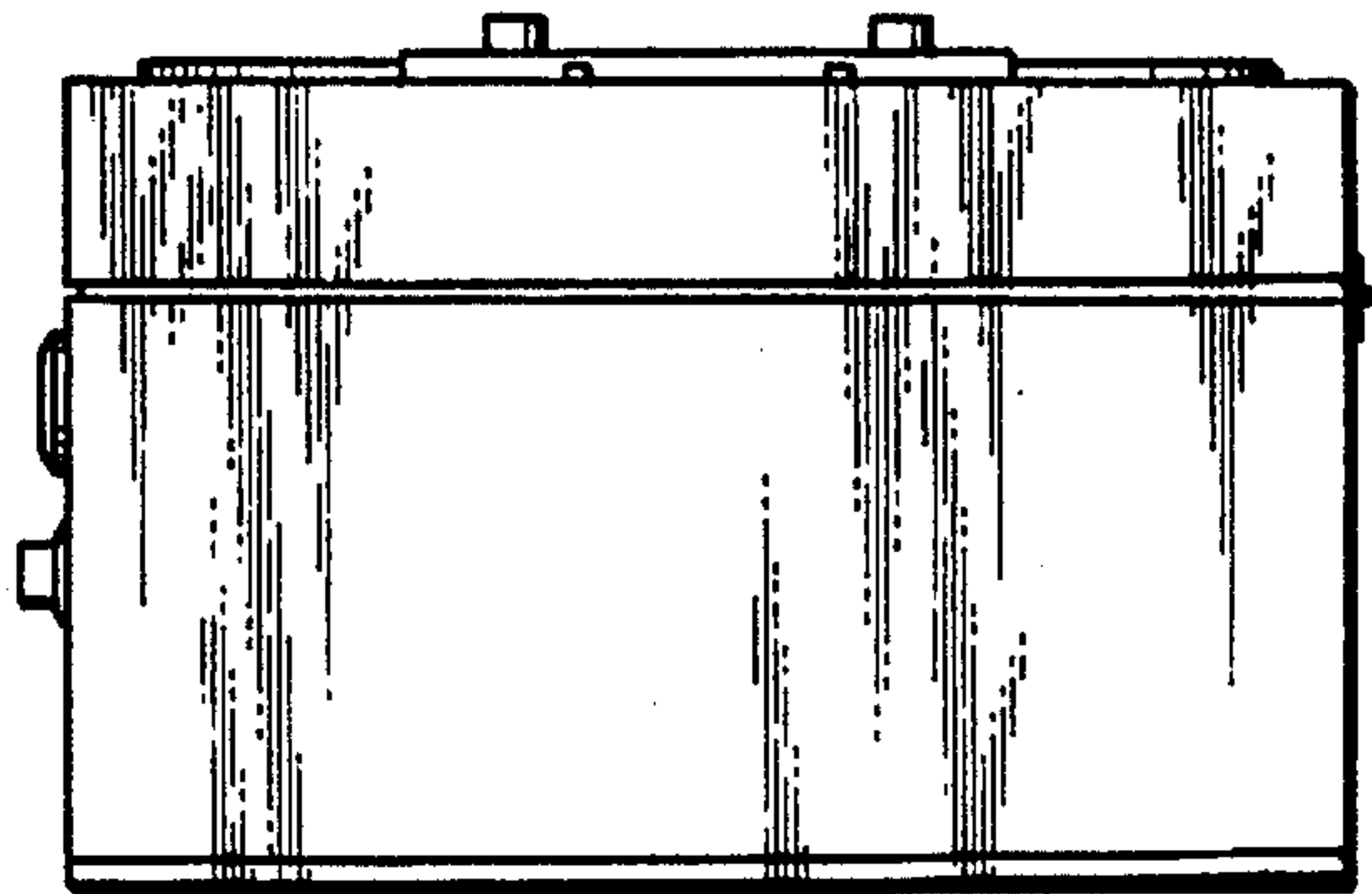
