[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a flower pot cover, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of our new flower pot cover design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof, all sides being identical;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a side elevational view of a second embodiment of our new design, the only difference being the height;

FIG. 6 is a side elevational view of a third embodiment of our new design, the only difference being the height;

FIG. 7 is a side elevational view of a fourth embodiment of our new design, the only difference being the location of the cut-out pattern;

FIG. 8 is a side elevational view of a fifth embodiment of our new design, the only difference being the location of the cut-out pattern;

FIG. 9 is a side elevational view of a sixth embodiment of our new design; the only difference being the location of the cut-out pattern;

FIG. 10 is a perspective view of a seventh embodiment of our new flower pot cover design;




FIG. 11 is a side elevational view thereof, all sides being identical;

FIG. 12 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 13 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 14 is a side elevational view of an eighth embodiment of our new design, the only difference over FIG. 10 being the height;

FIG. 15 is a side elevational view of a ninth embodiment of our new design, the only difference over FIG. 10 being the height;


FIG. 16 is a side elevational view of a tenth embodiment of our new design, the only difference over FIG. 10 being the location of the cut-out pattern;

FIG. 17 is a side elevational view of an eleventh embodiment of our new design, the only difference over FIG. 10 being the location of the cut-out pattern; and,


FIG. 18 is a side elevational view of a twelfth embodiment of our new design, the only difference over FIG. 10 being the location of the cut-out pattern.


The flower pot cover has no substantial thickness.











































