FIG. 4 is a rear elevation view thereof; and,

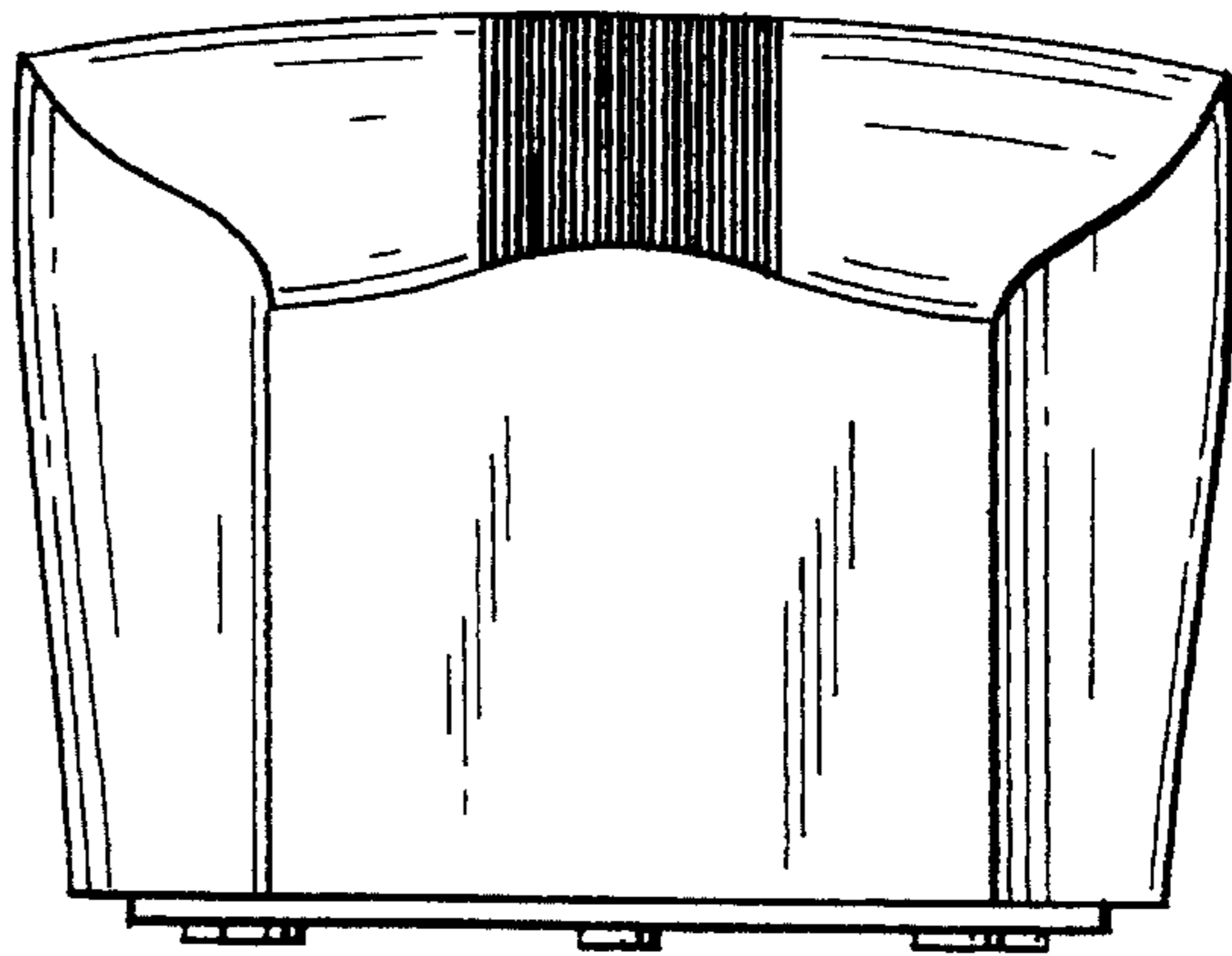
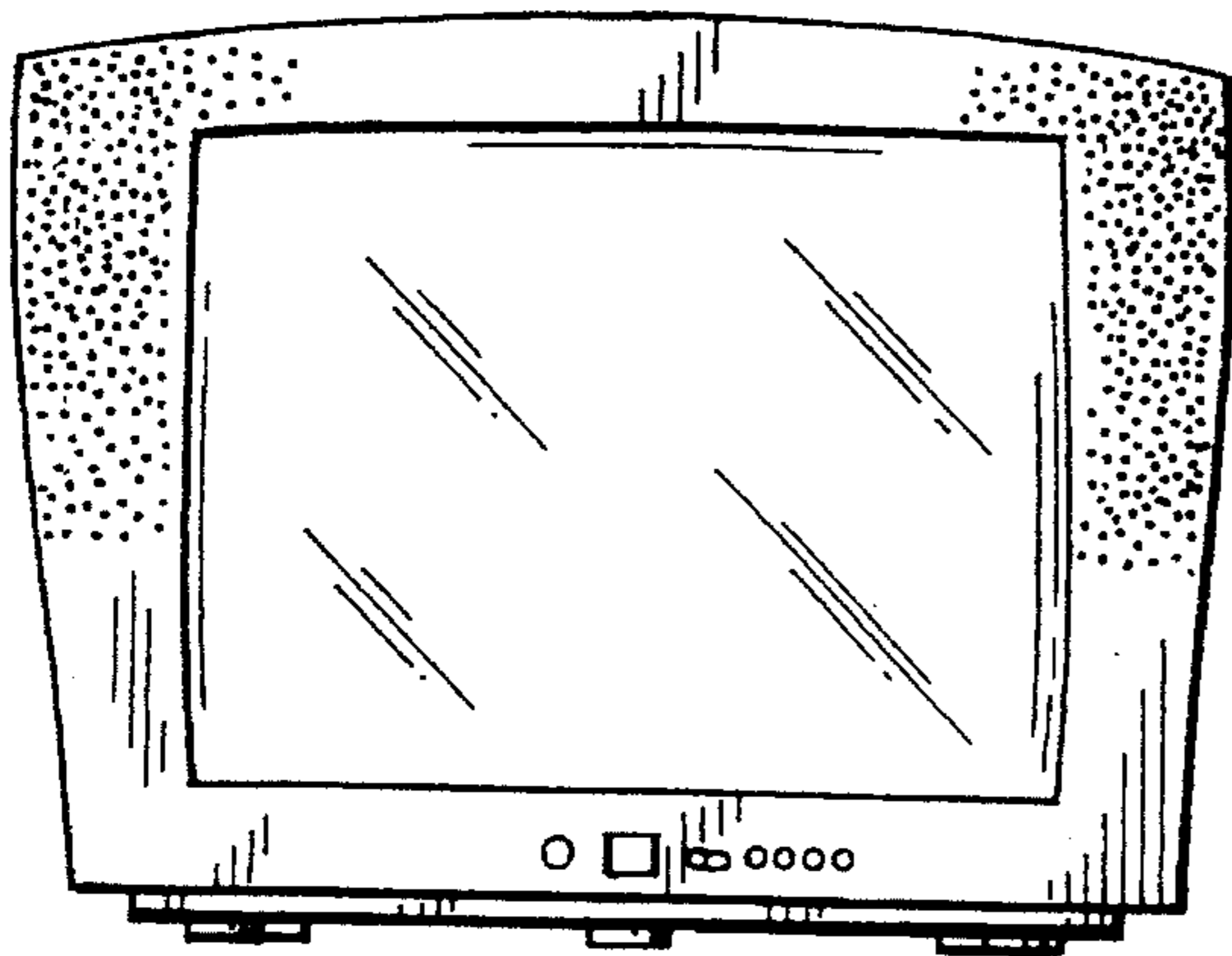
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof.

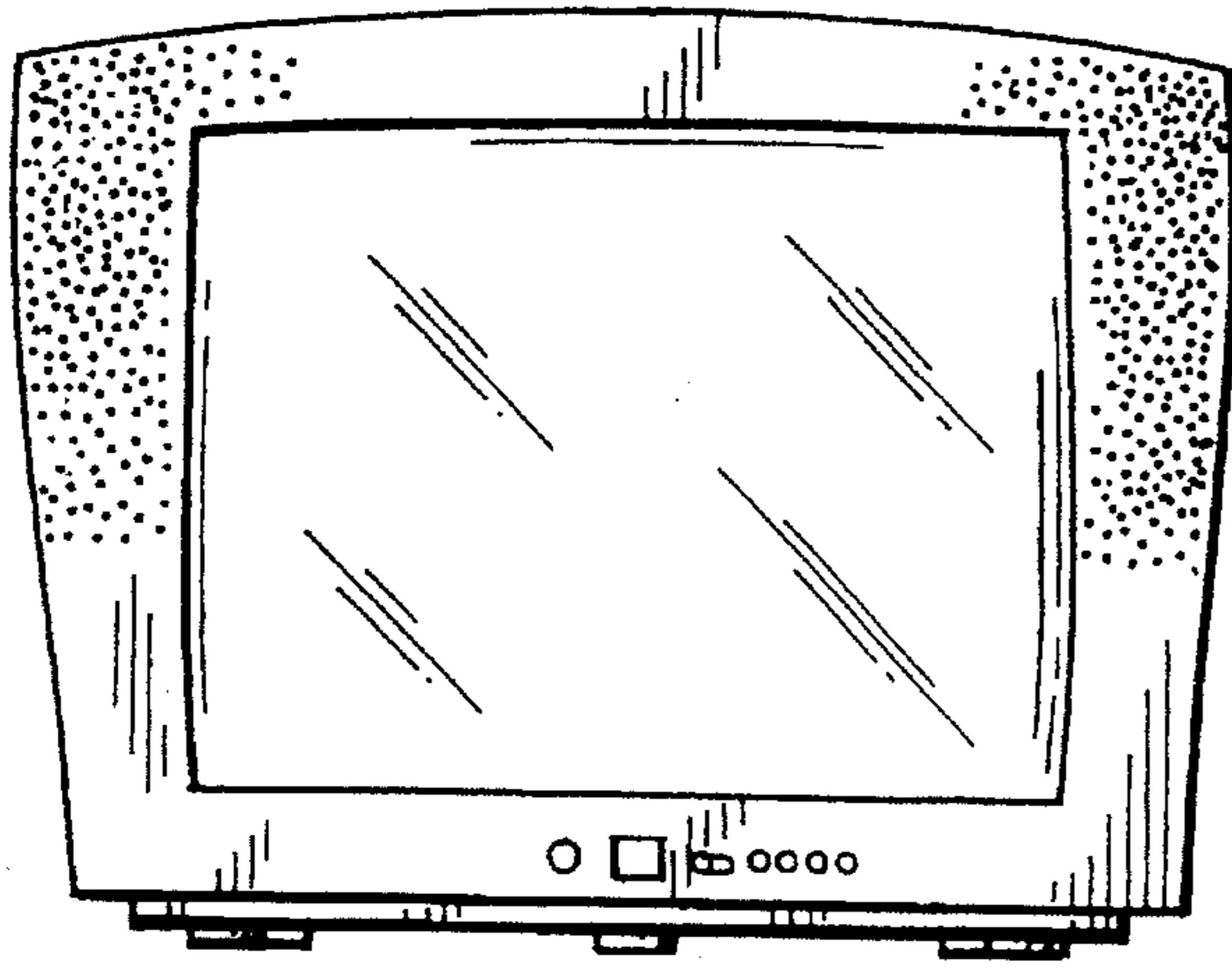

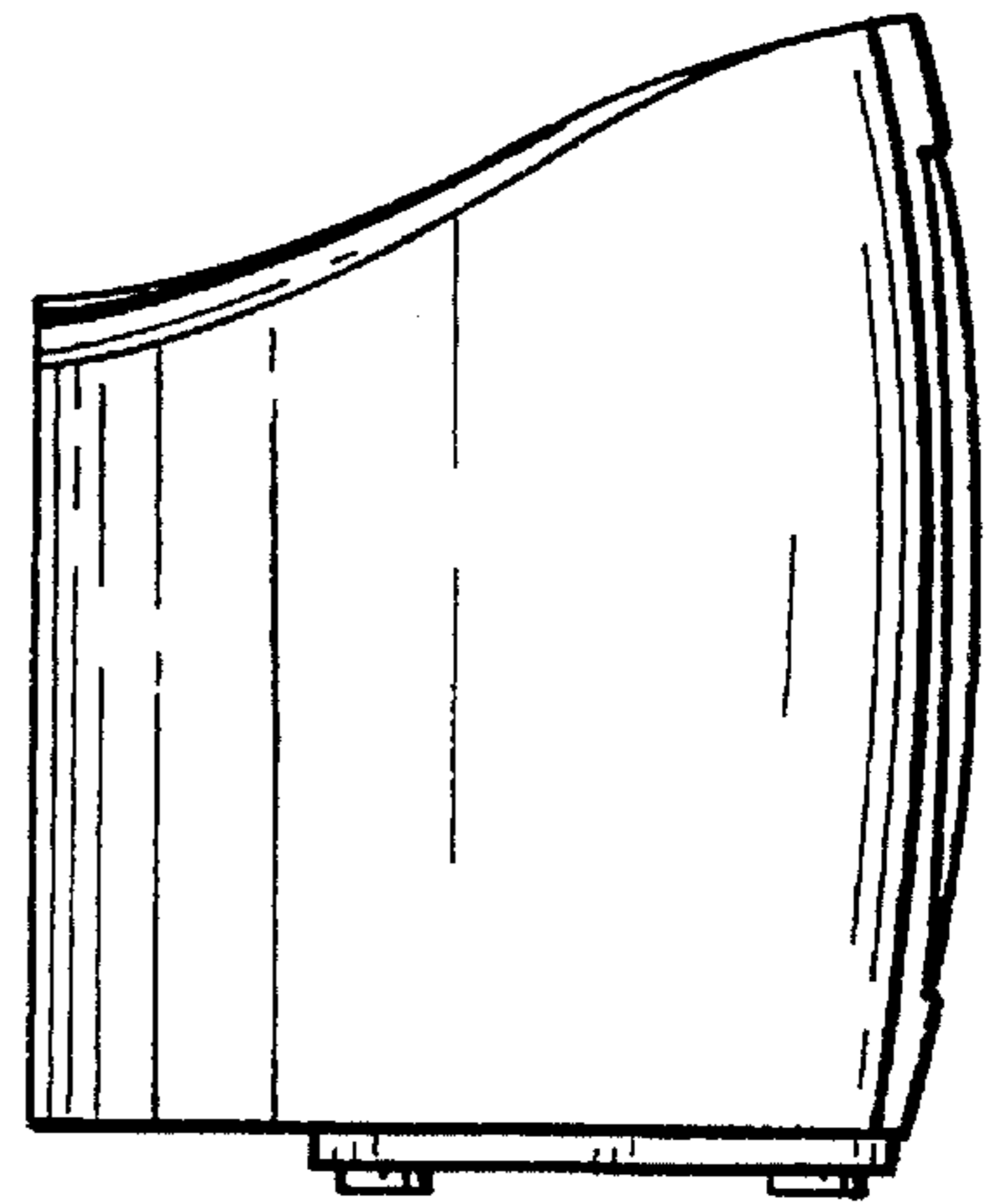

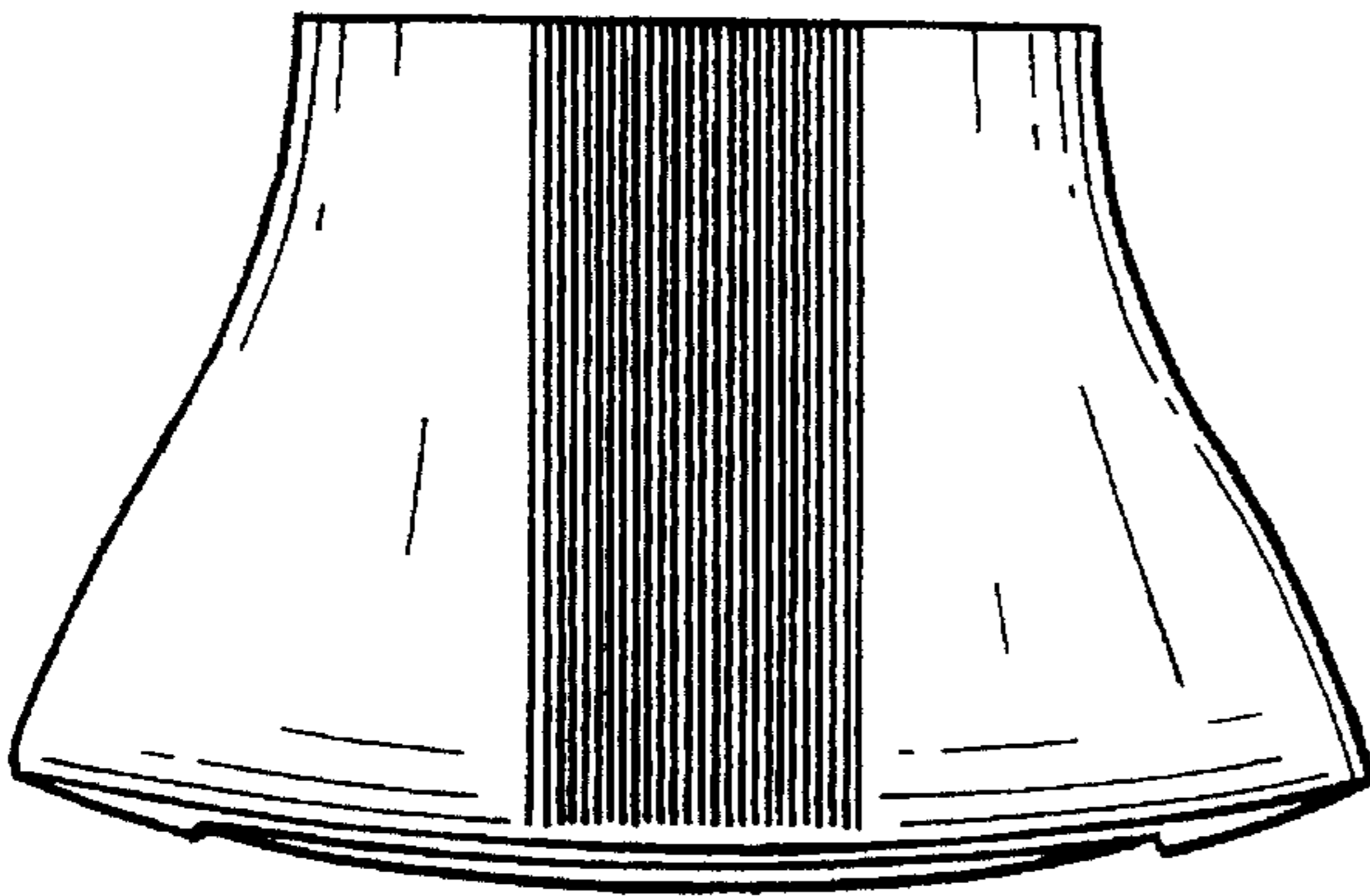

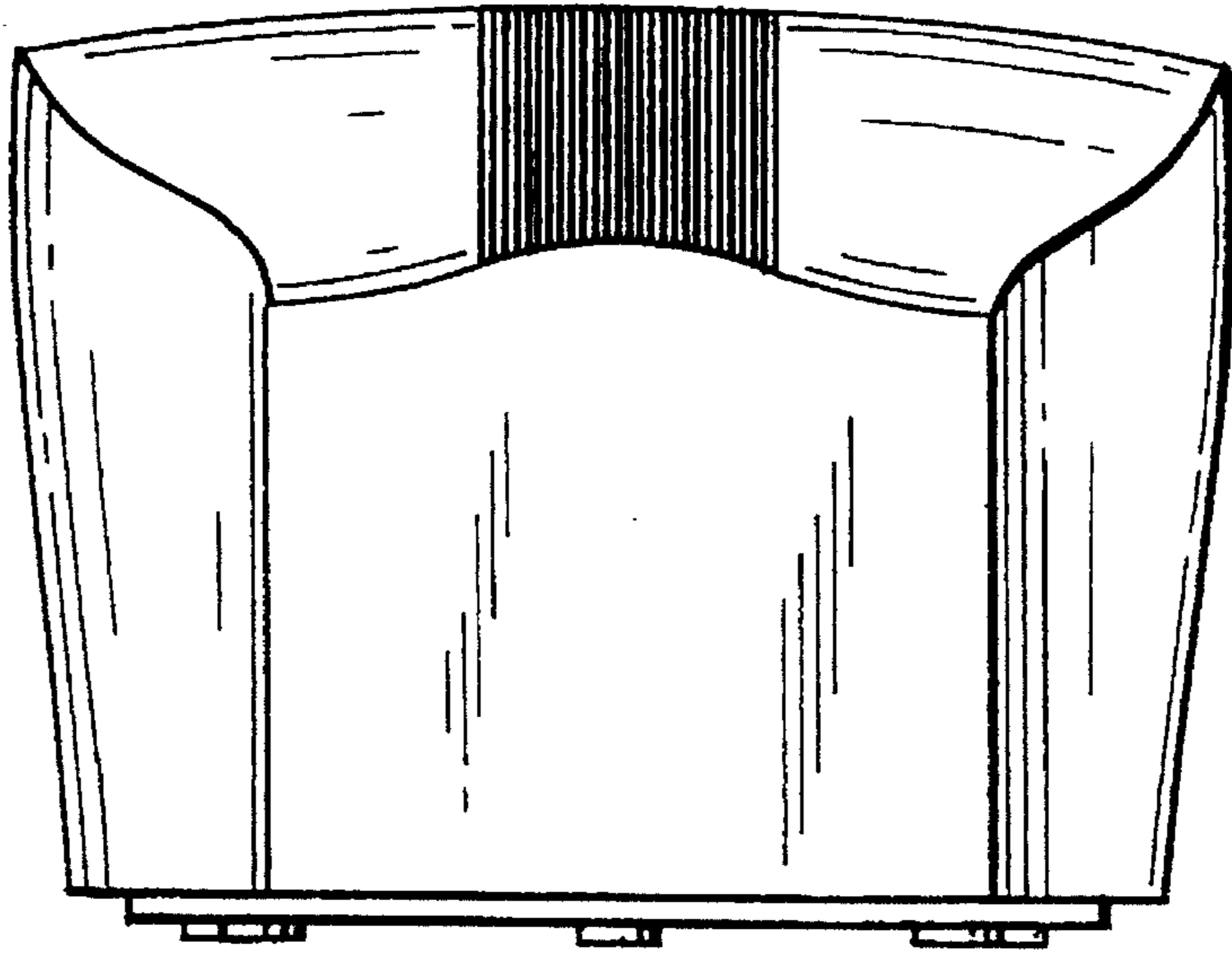

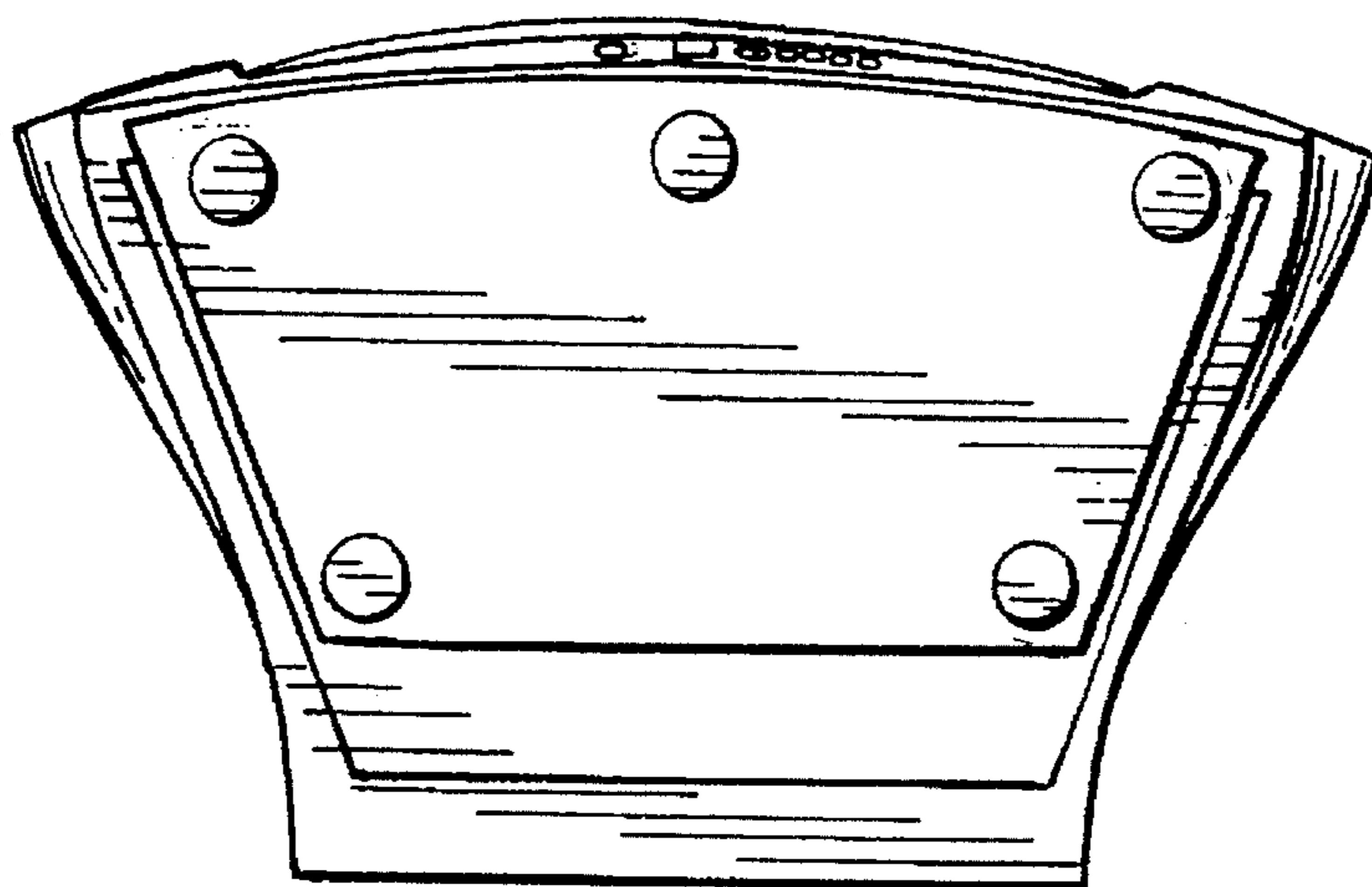
