FIG. 13 is a right-side elevational view of the second embodiment;

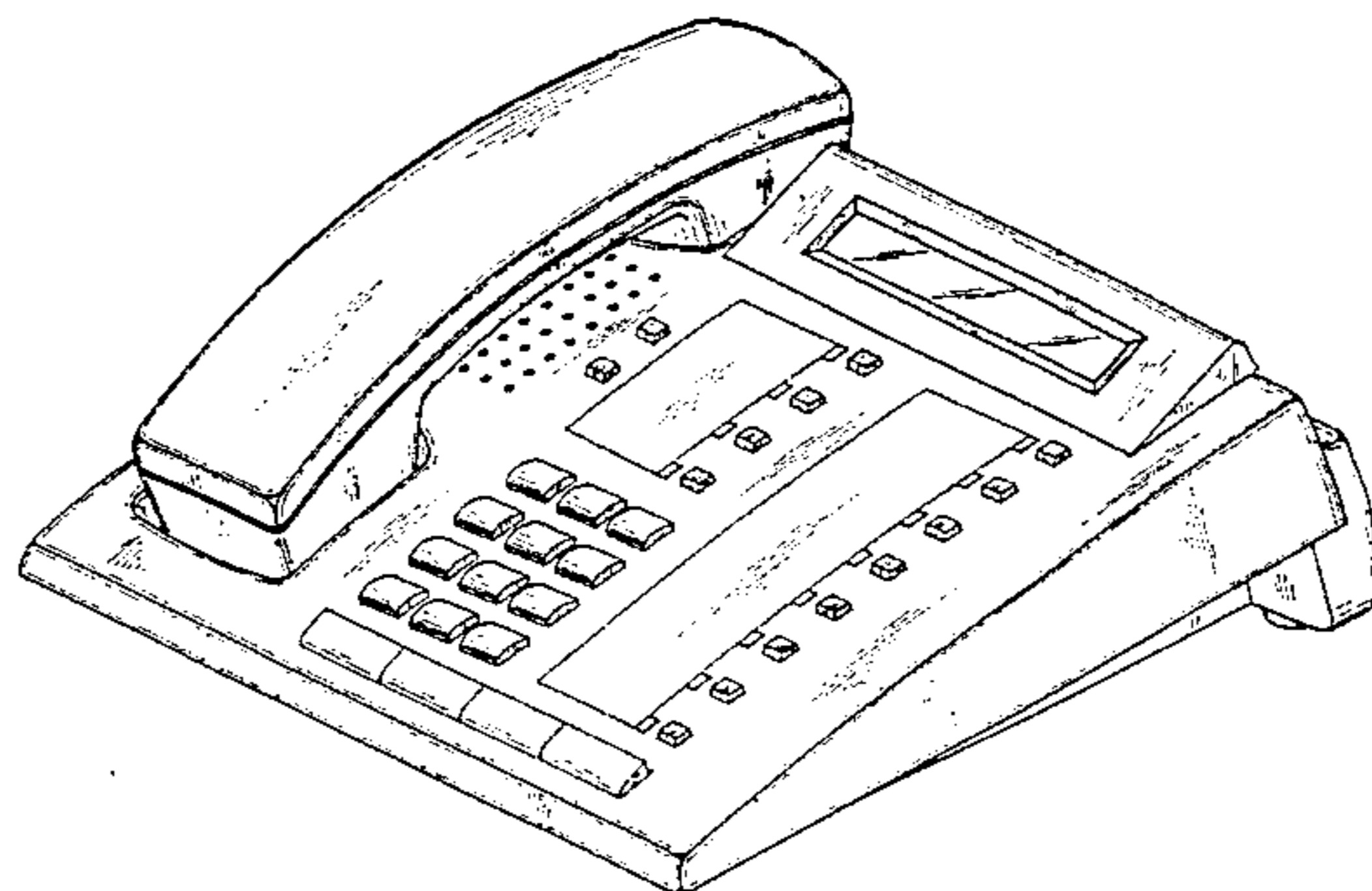
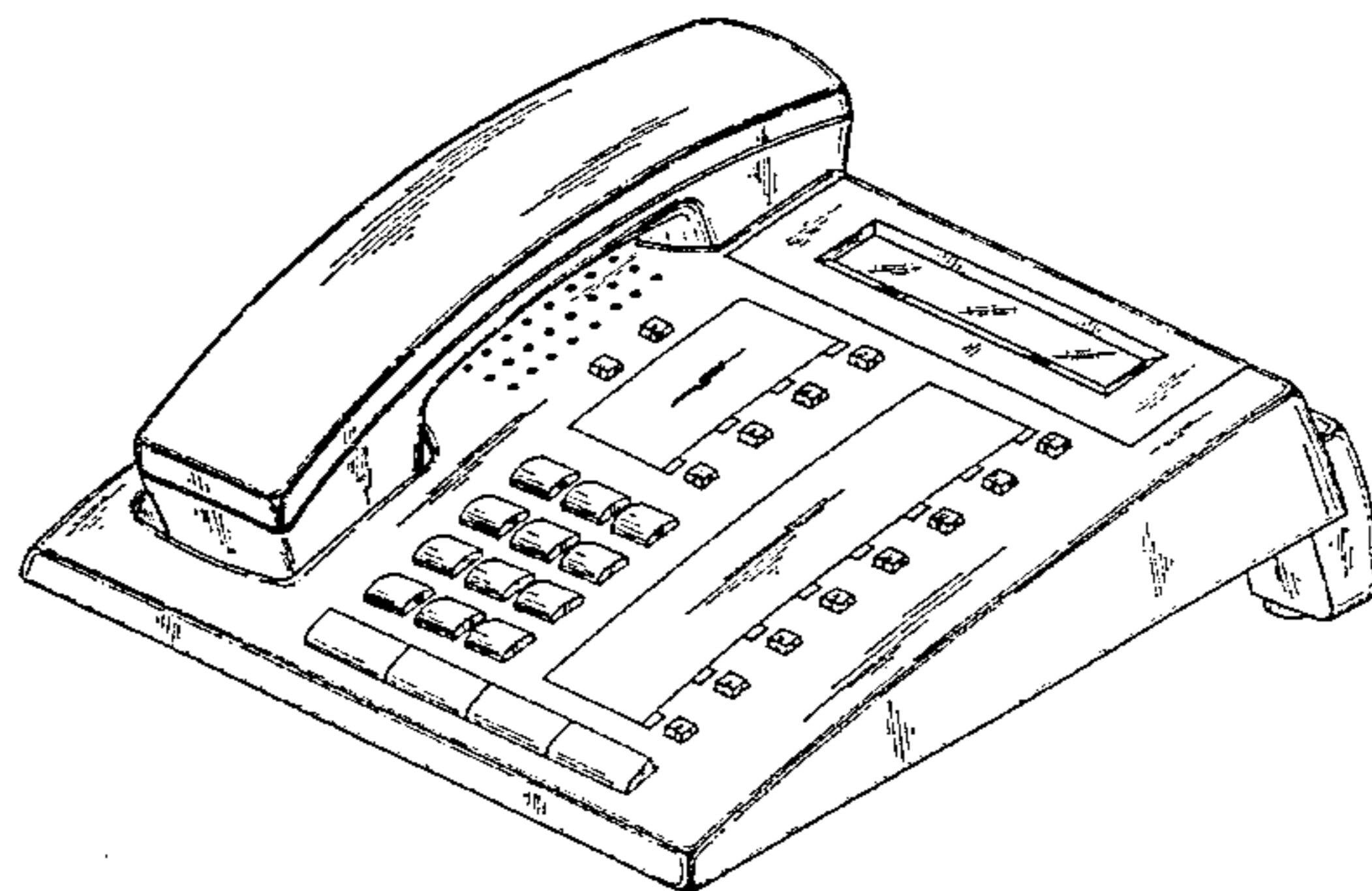
FIG. 14 is a left-side elevational view of the second embodiment;

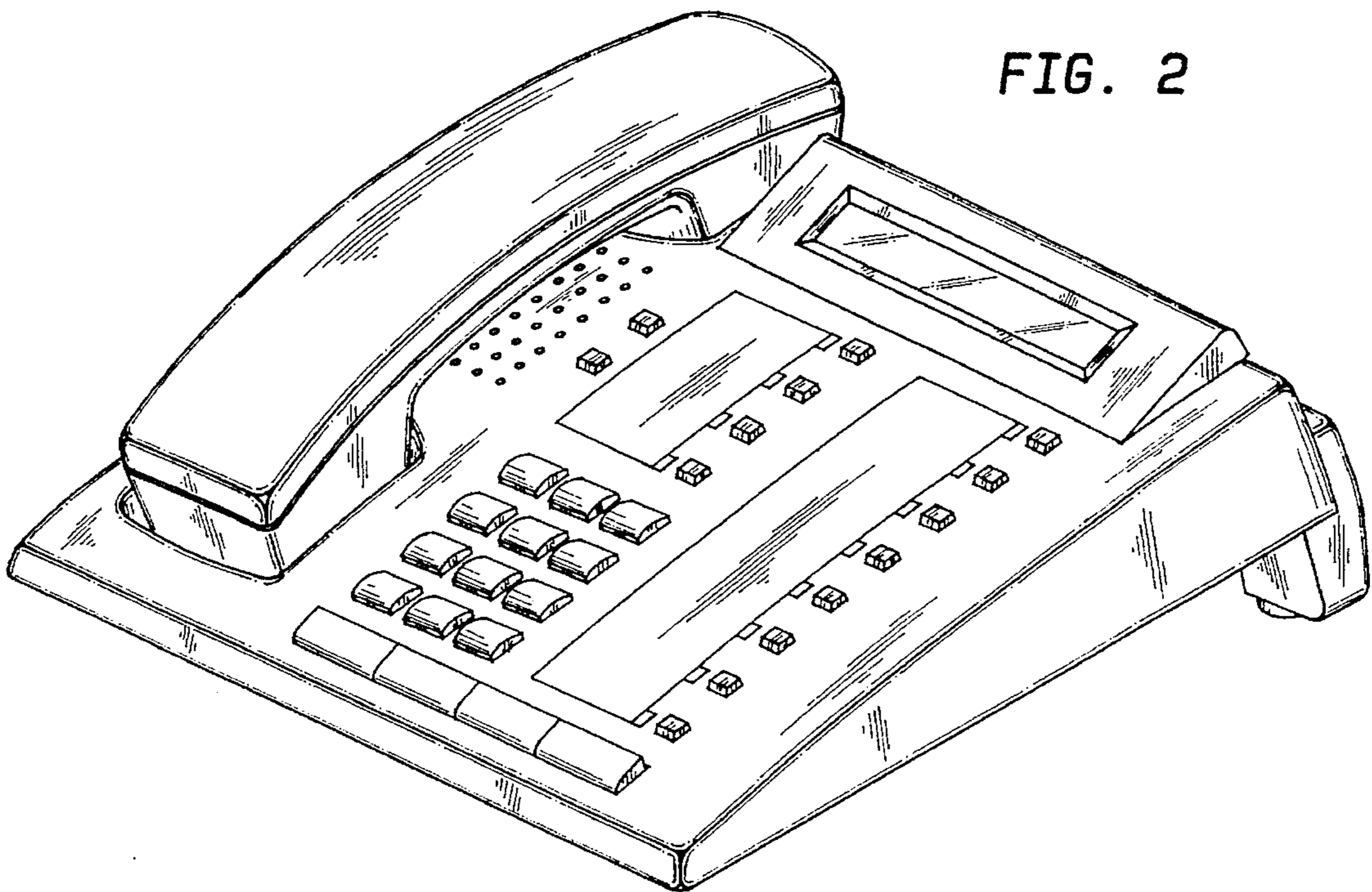
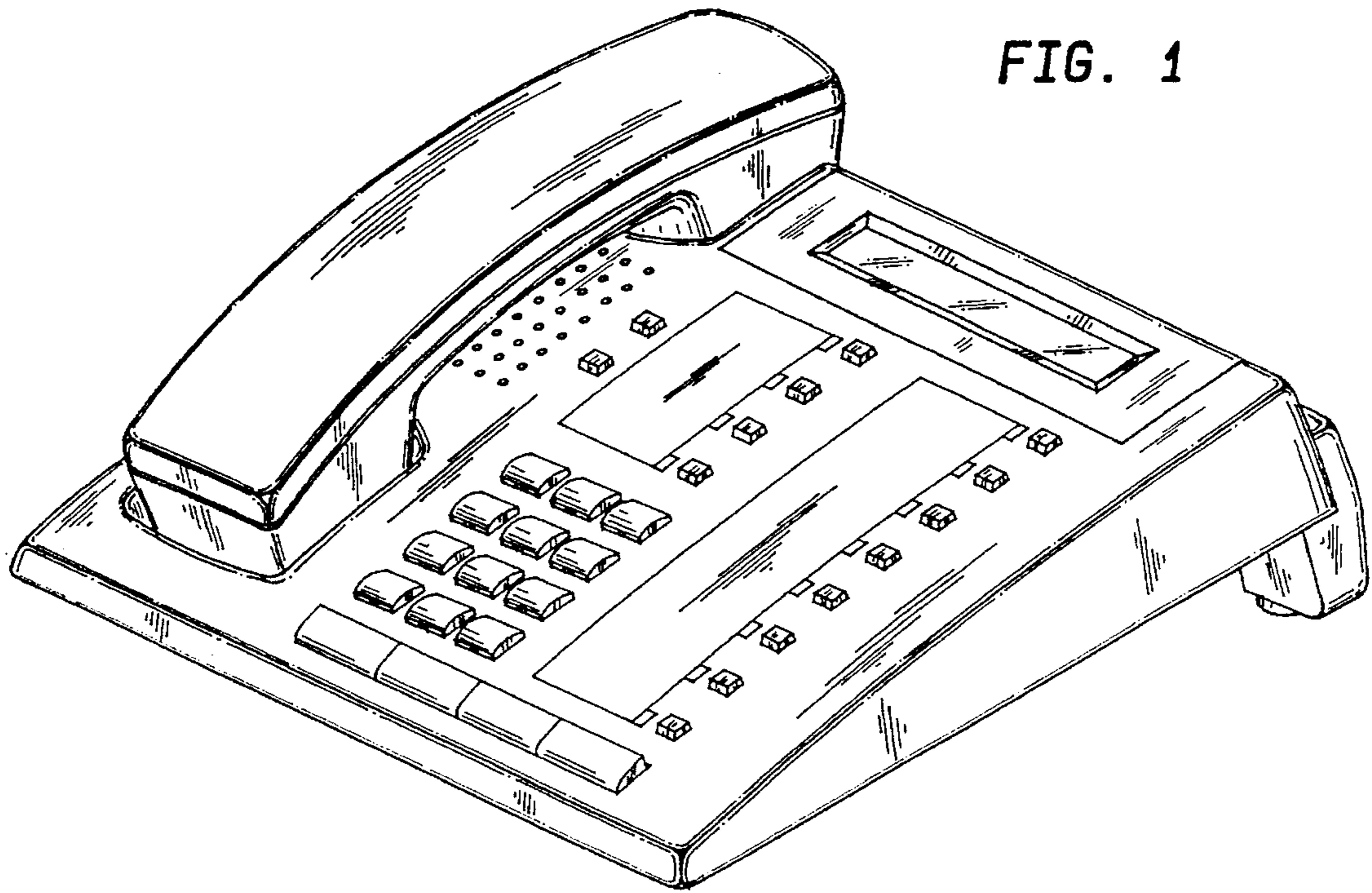

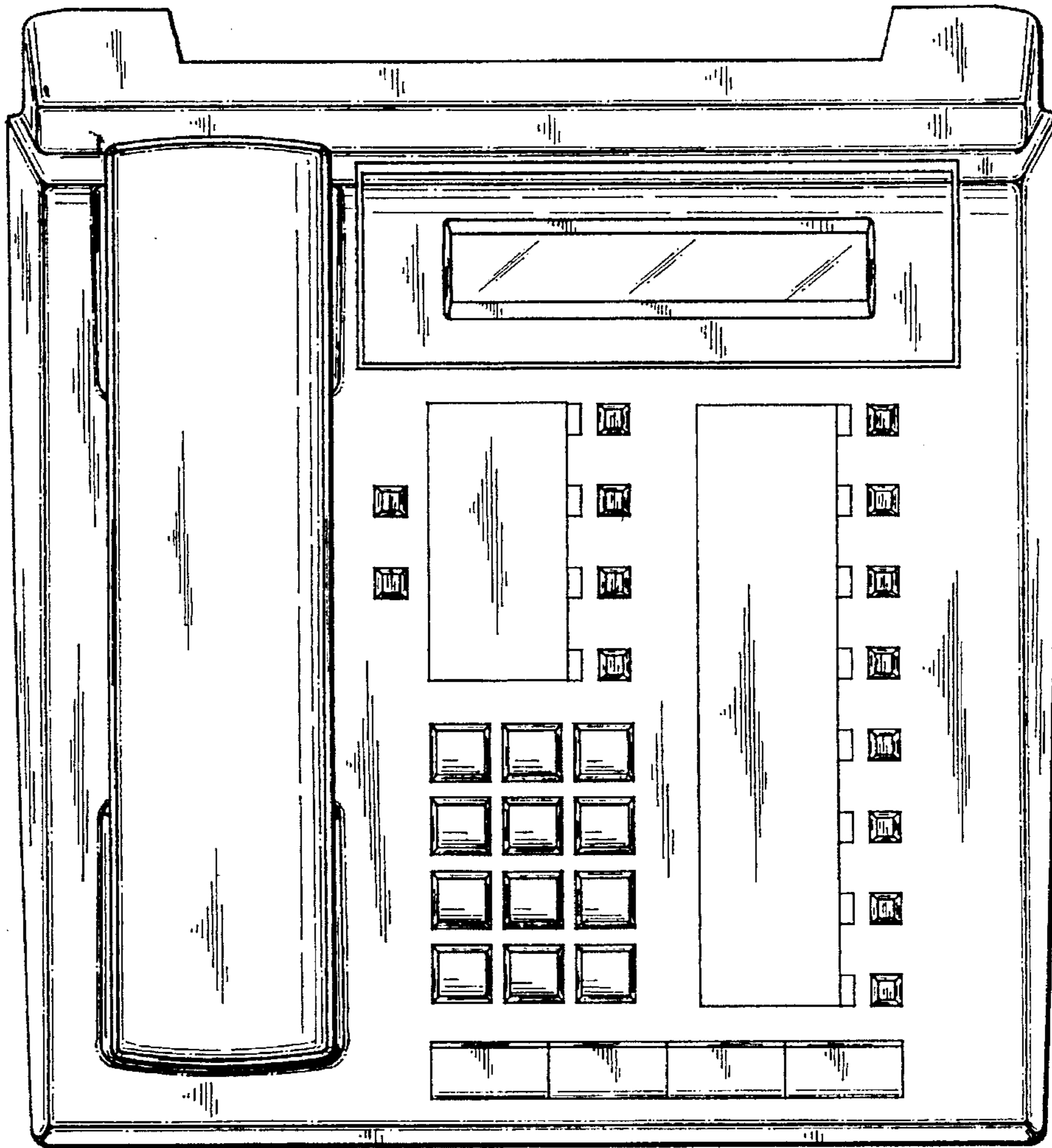

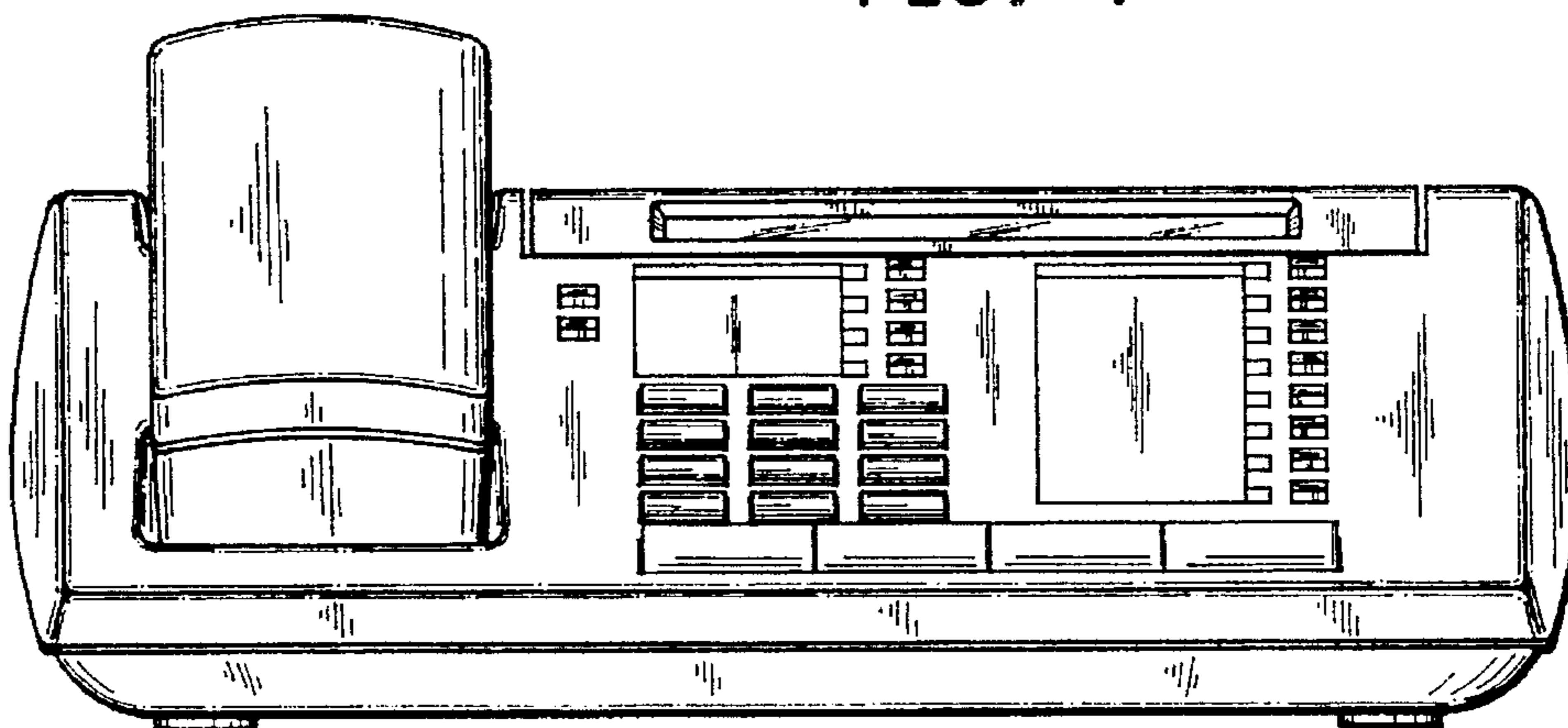

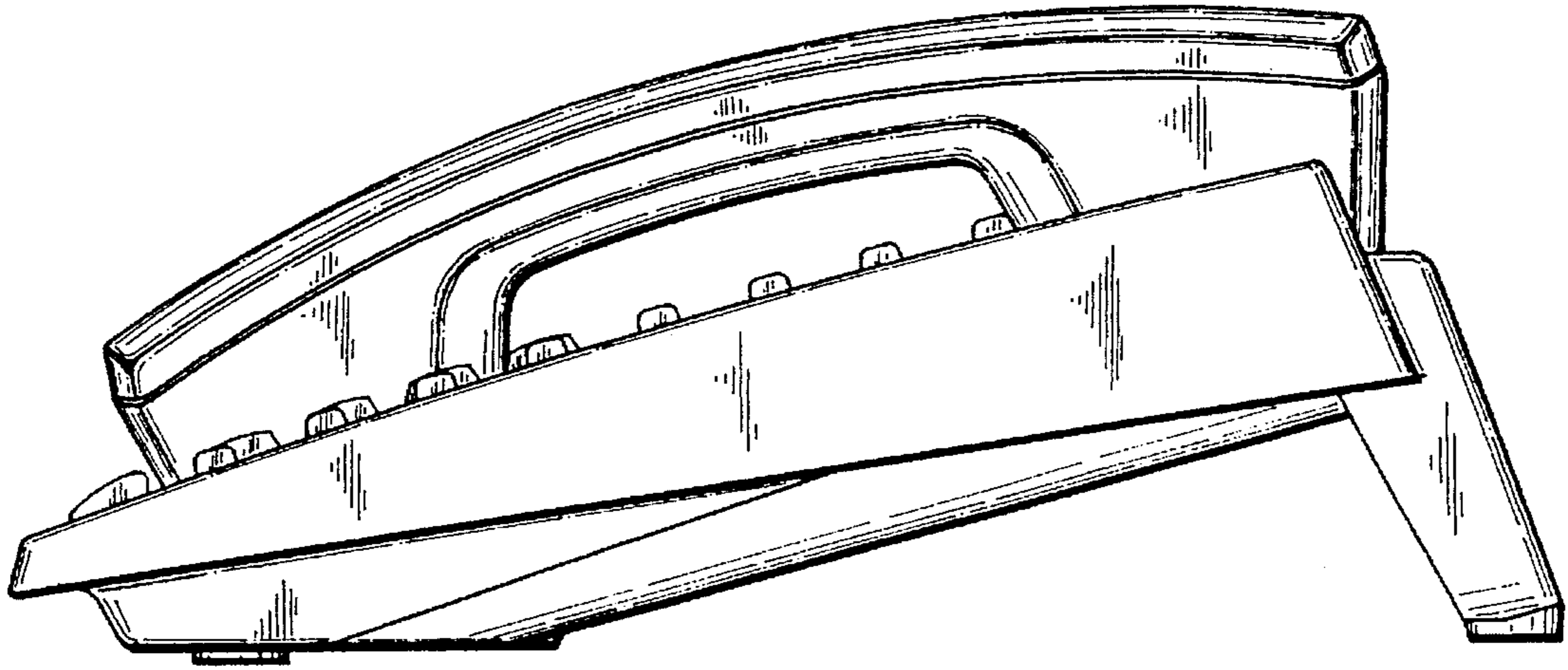

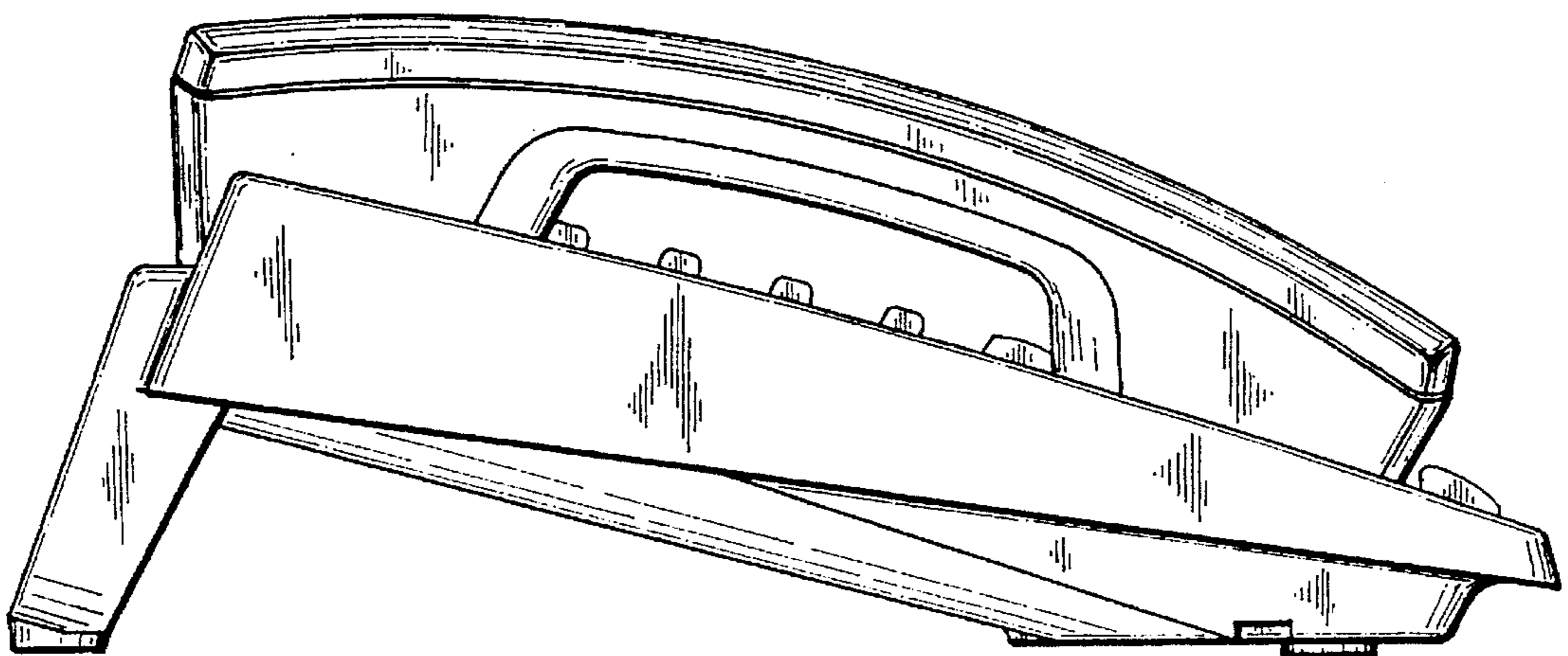

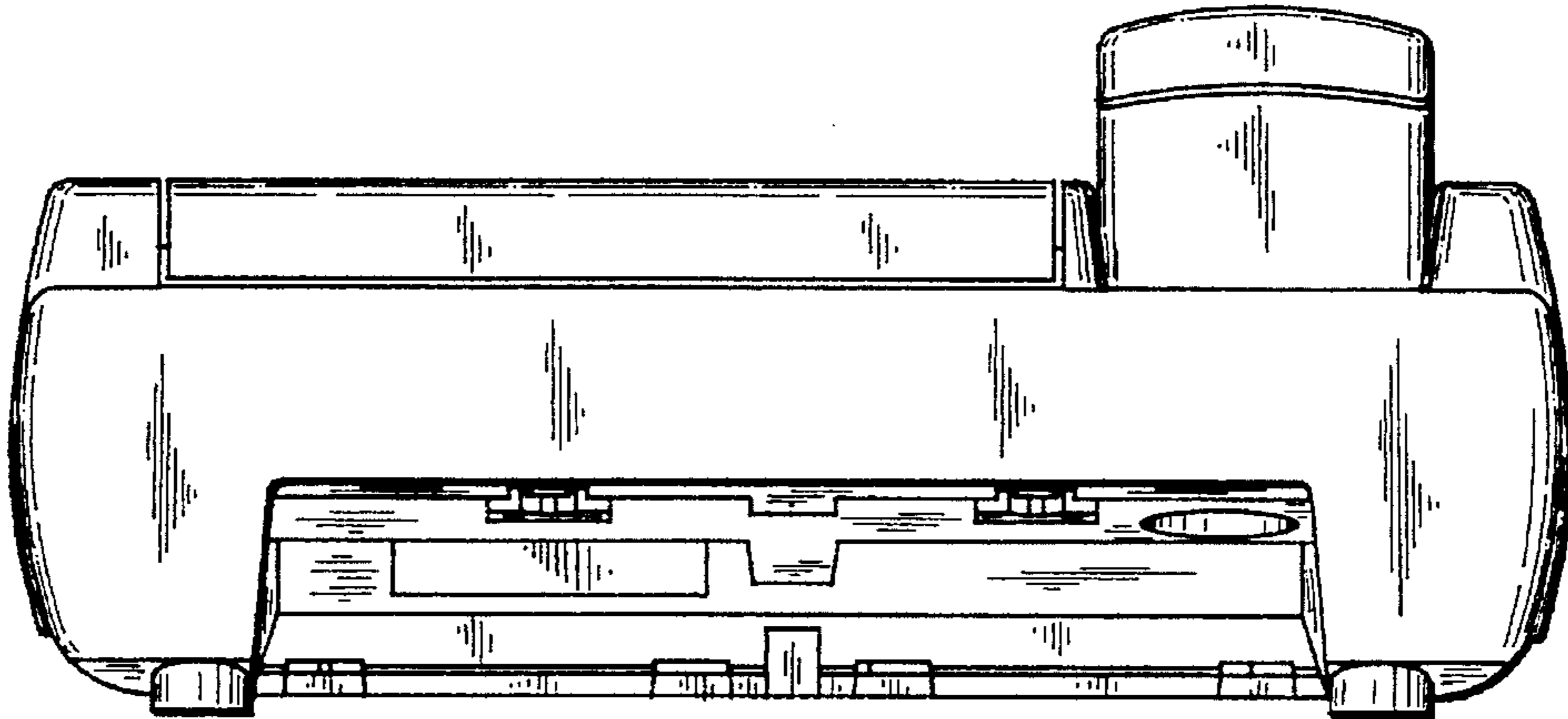
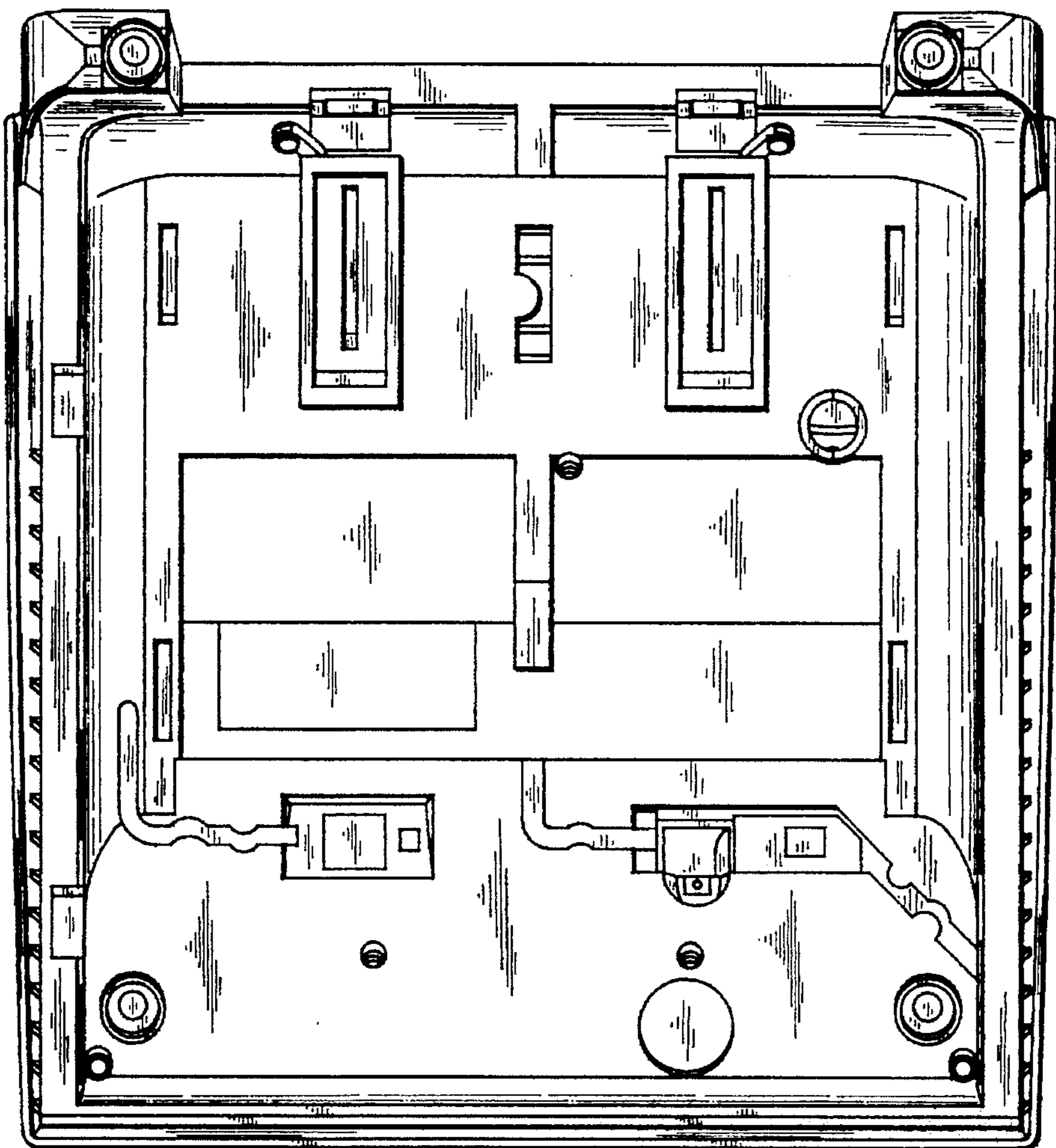

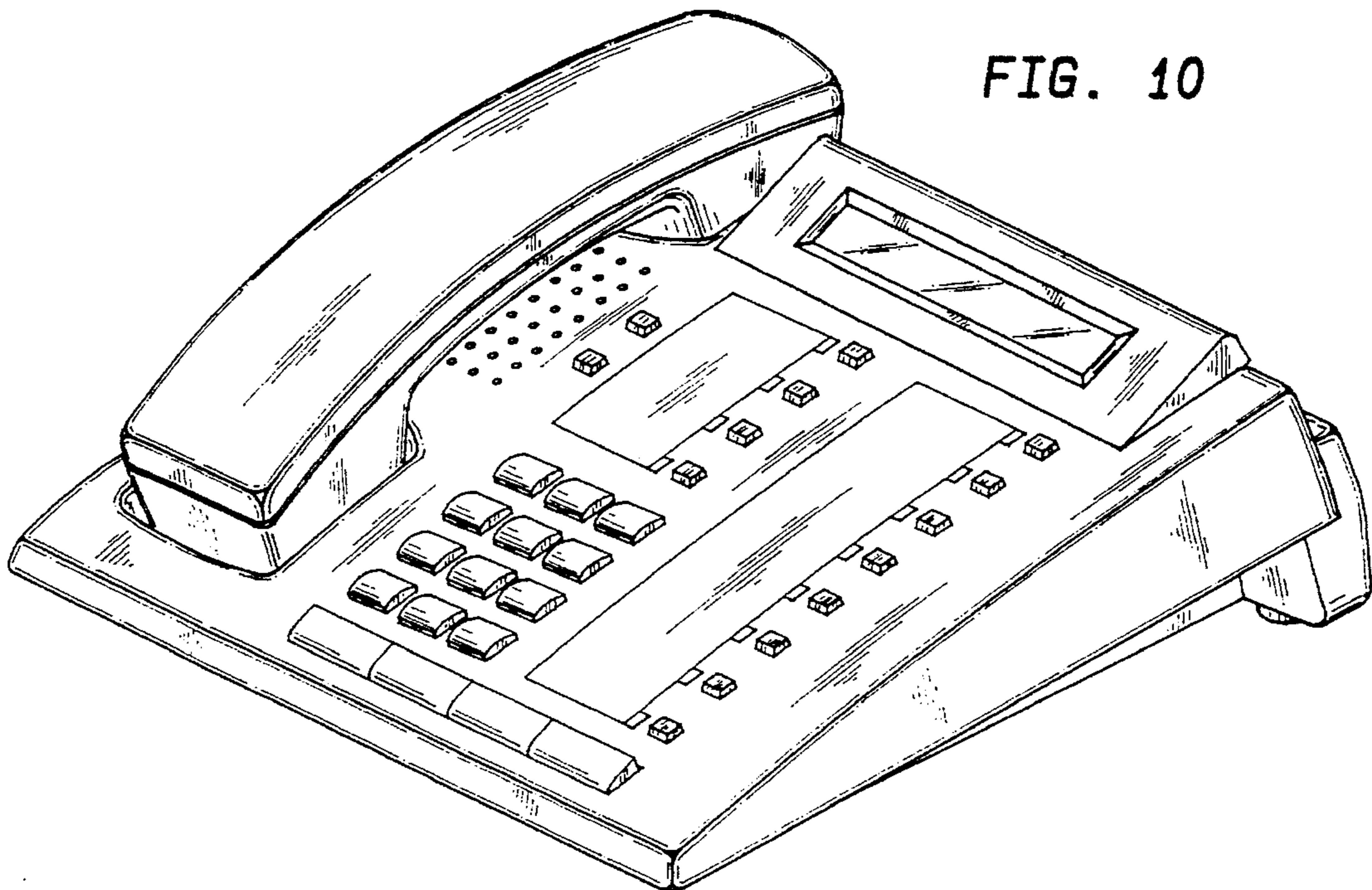
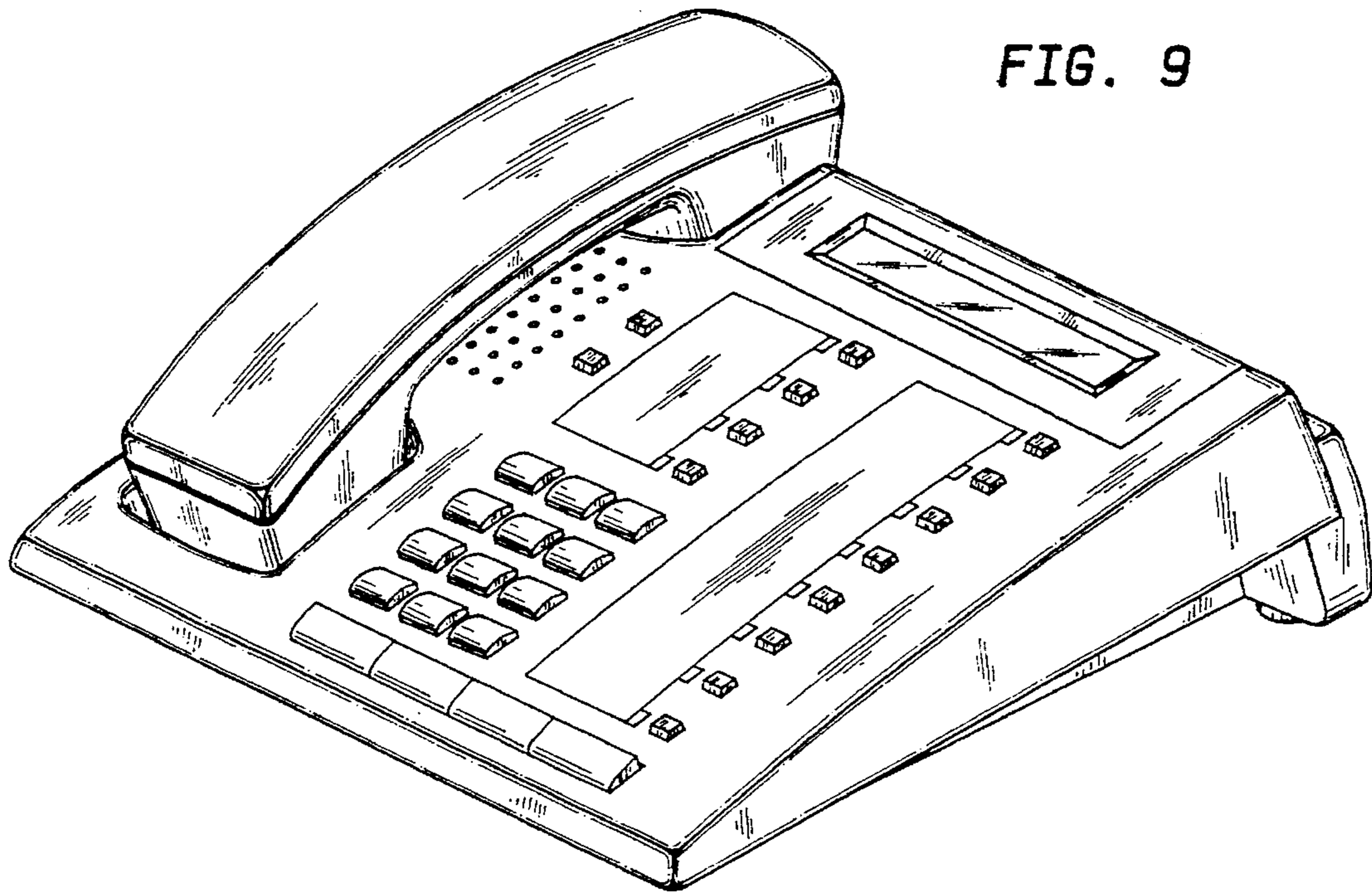

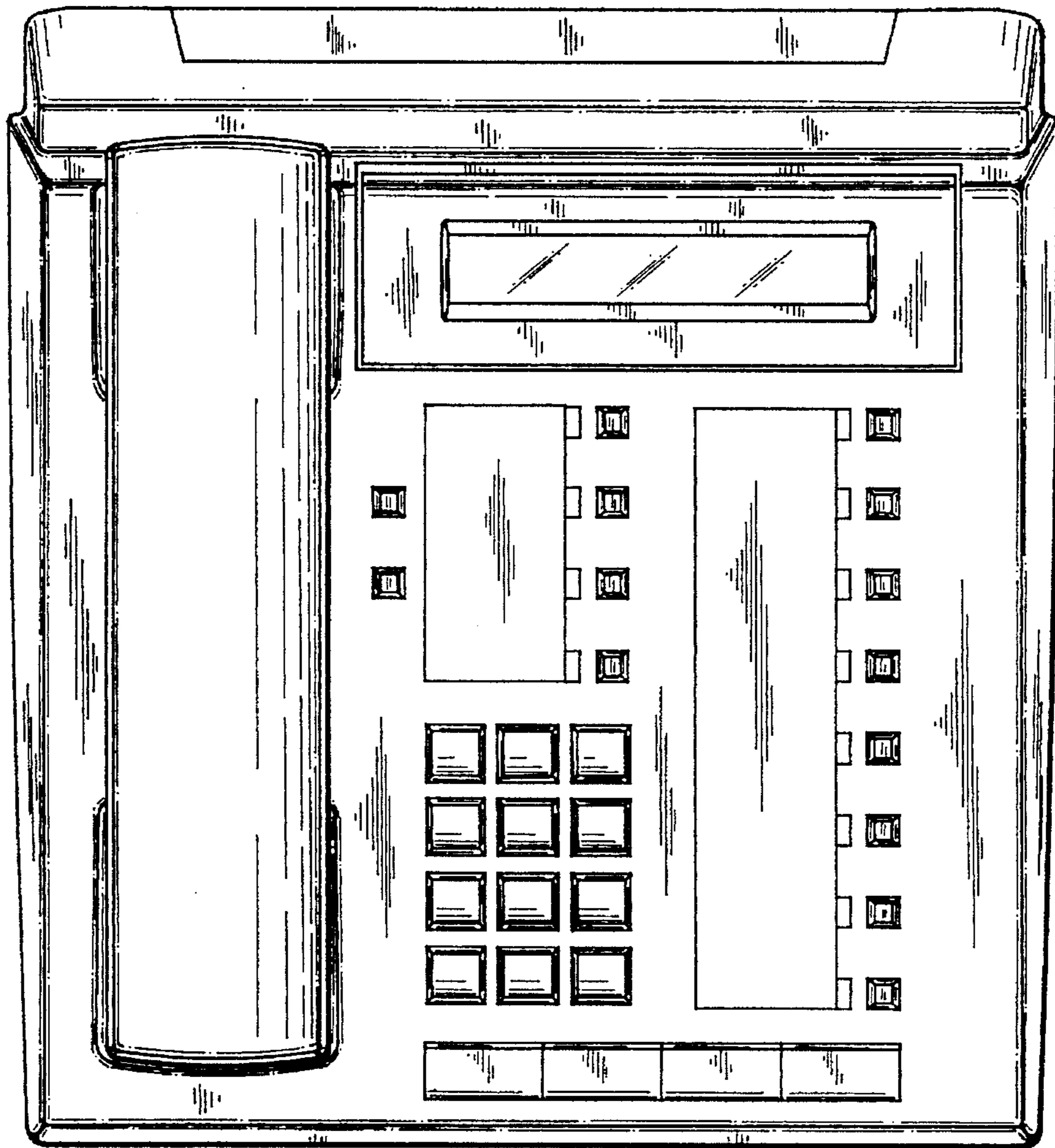

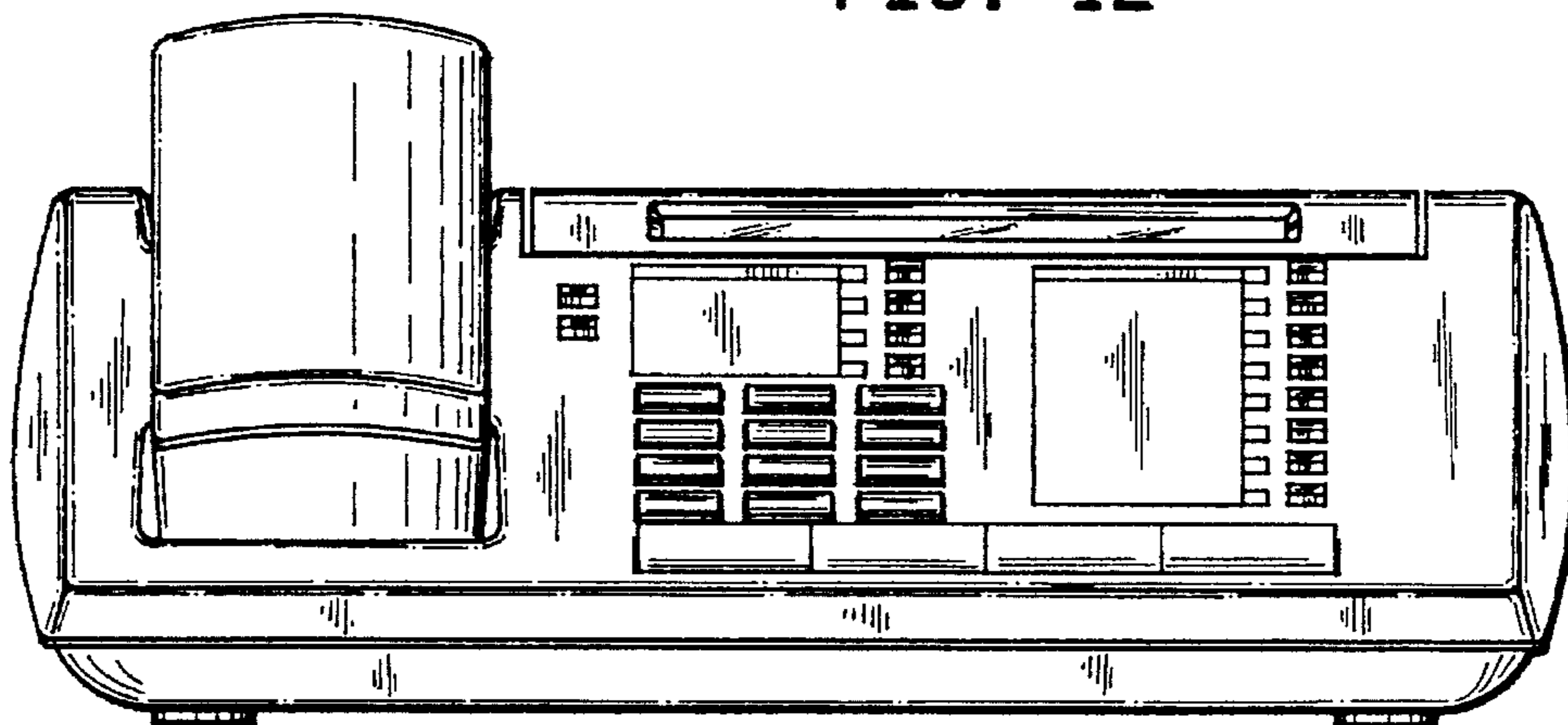

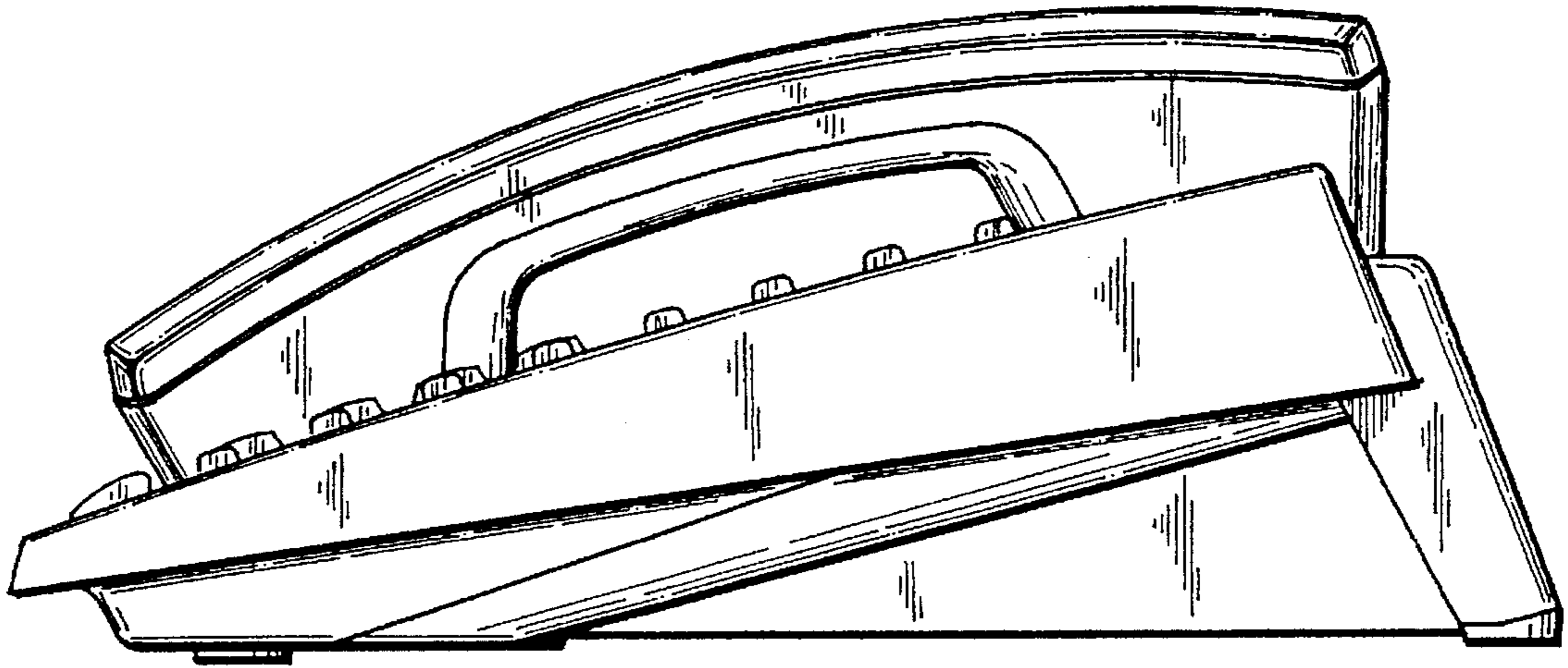

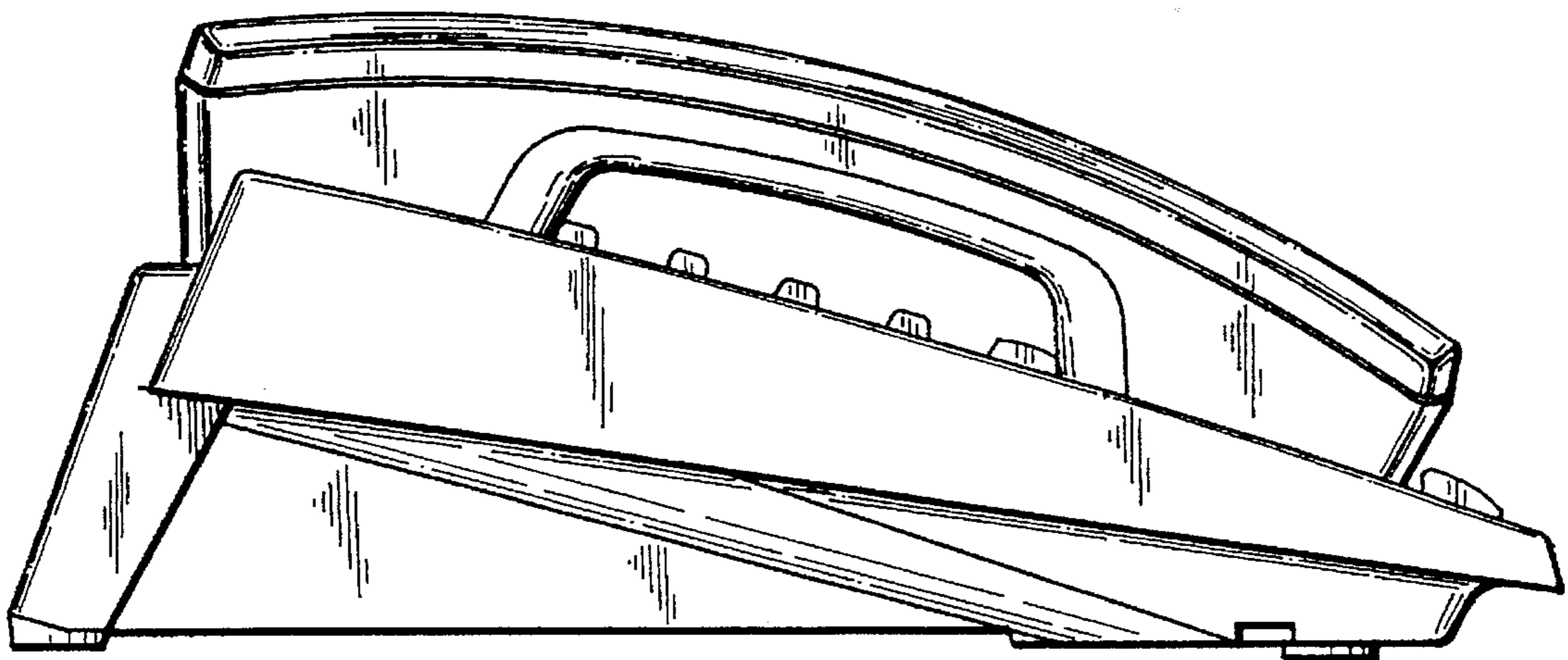

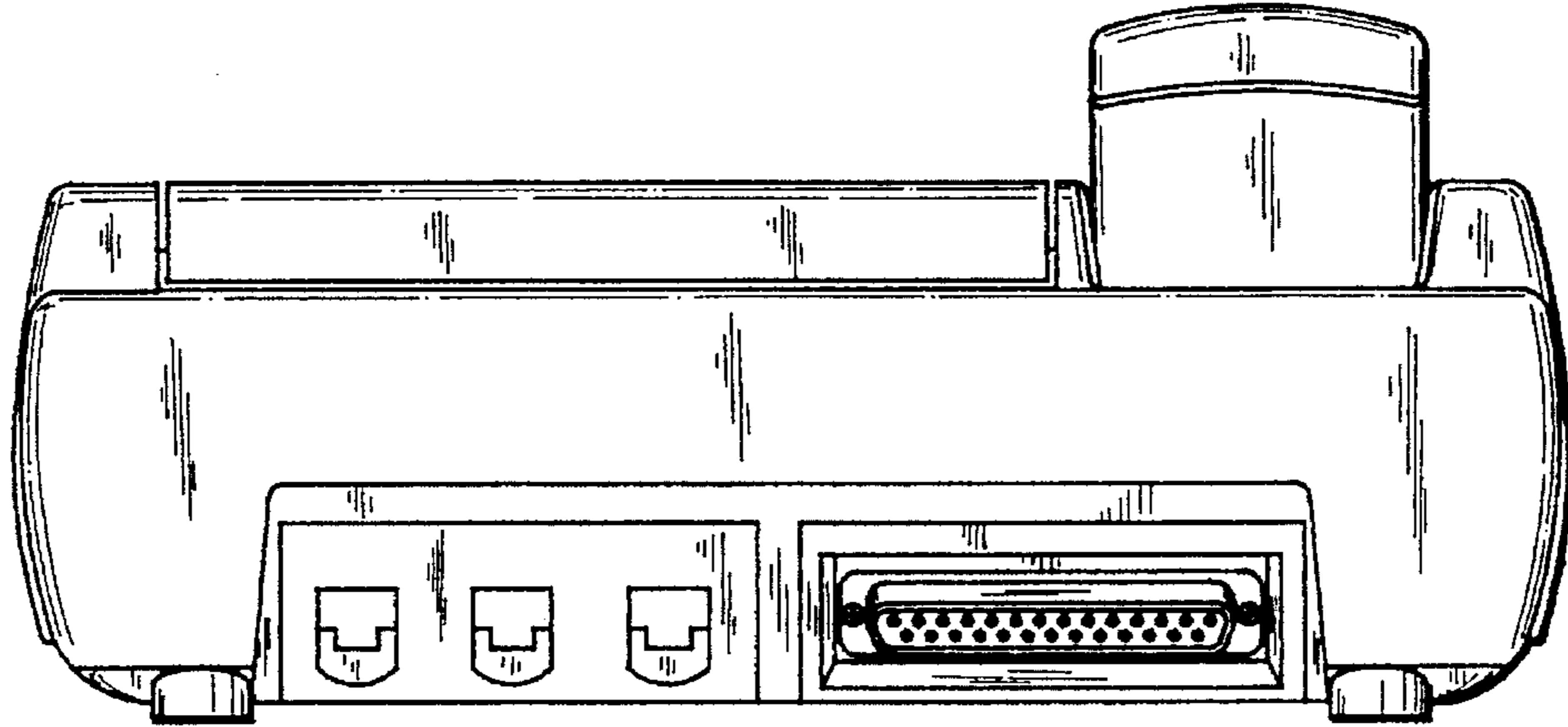
