[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for the combined bowling ball rack and table, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of the first embodiment of a combined bowling ball rack and table showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view of this first embodiment;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view of this first embodiment;

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view of this first embodiment;

FIG. 5 is a right end elevational view of this first embodiment;

The left end elevational view of this first embodiment is a mirror image of FIG. 5.

FIG. 6 is a front perspective view of a second embodiment of a combined bowling ball rack and table showing our new design;

FIG. 7 is a top plan view of the second embodiment;

FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of the second embodiment;

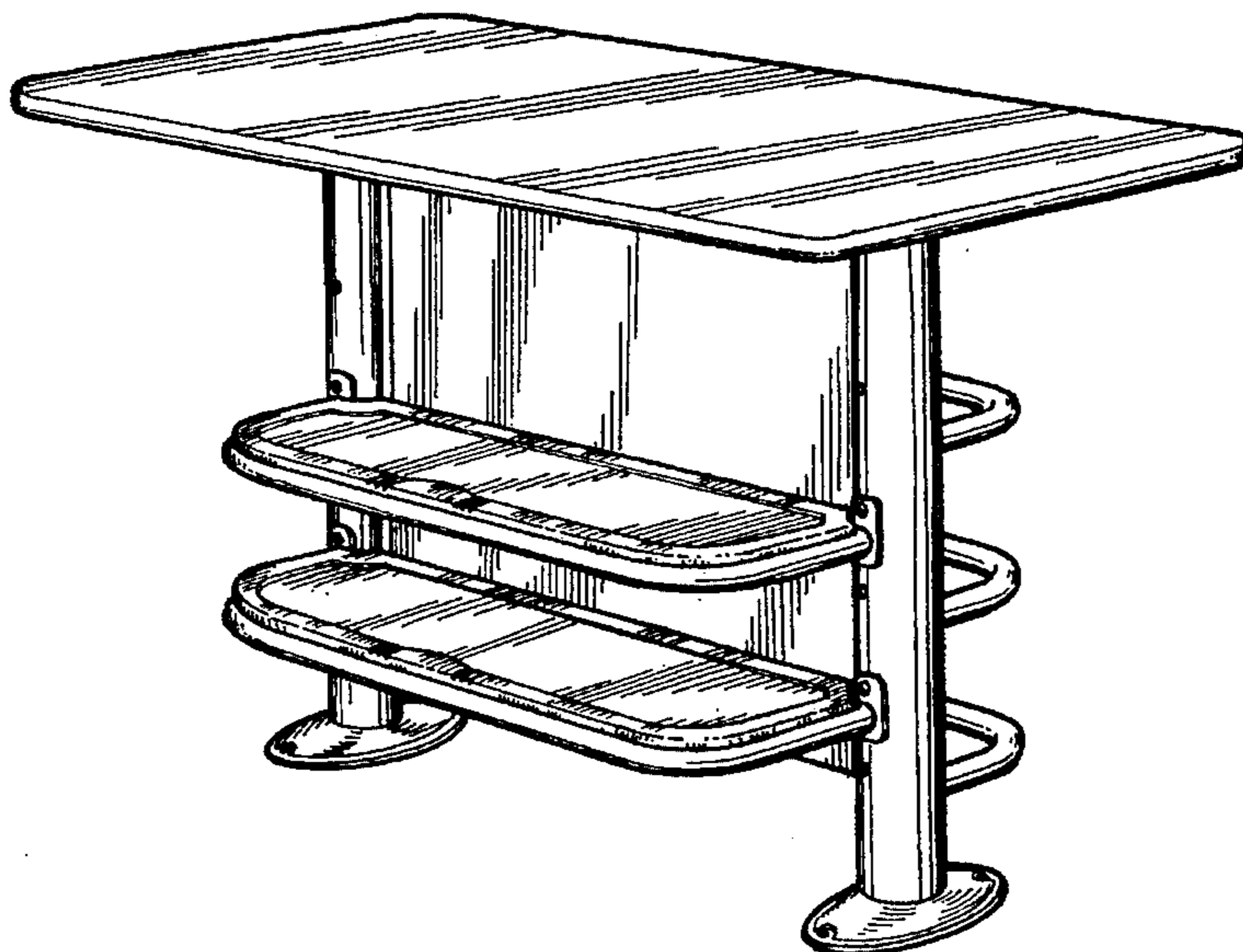
FIG. 9 is a rear elevational view of the second embodiment; and,

FIG. 10 is a right end elevational view of the second embodiment.

The left end elevational view of the second embodiment is a mirror image of FIG. 10.

The bottom of the combined bowling ball rack and table is plain and unornamented and forms no part of the claimed design.

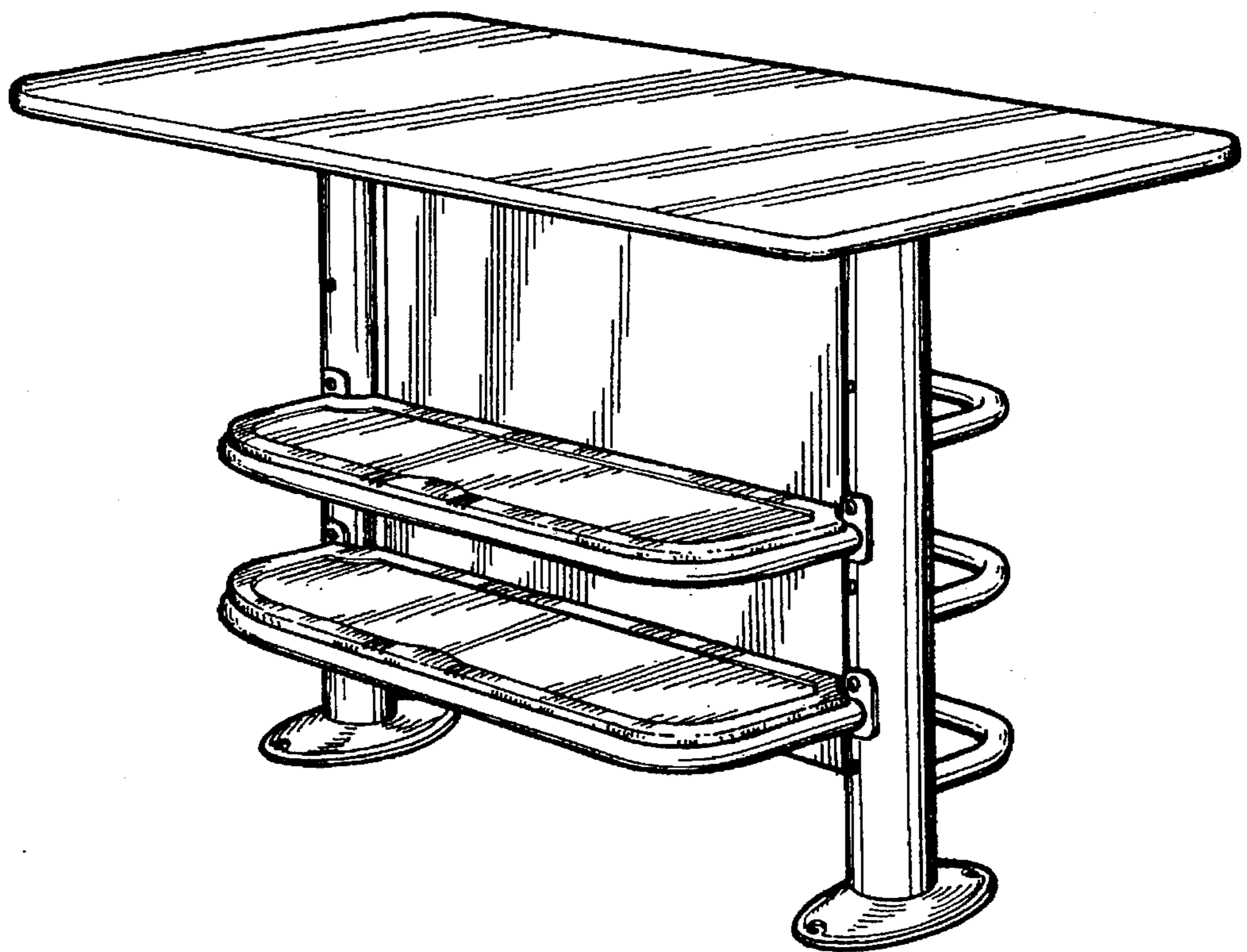

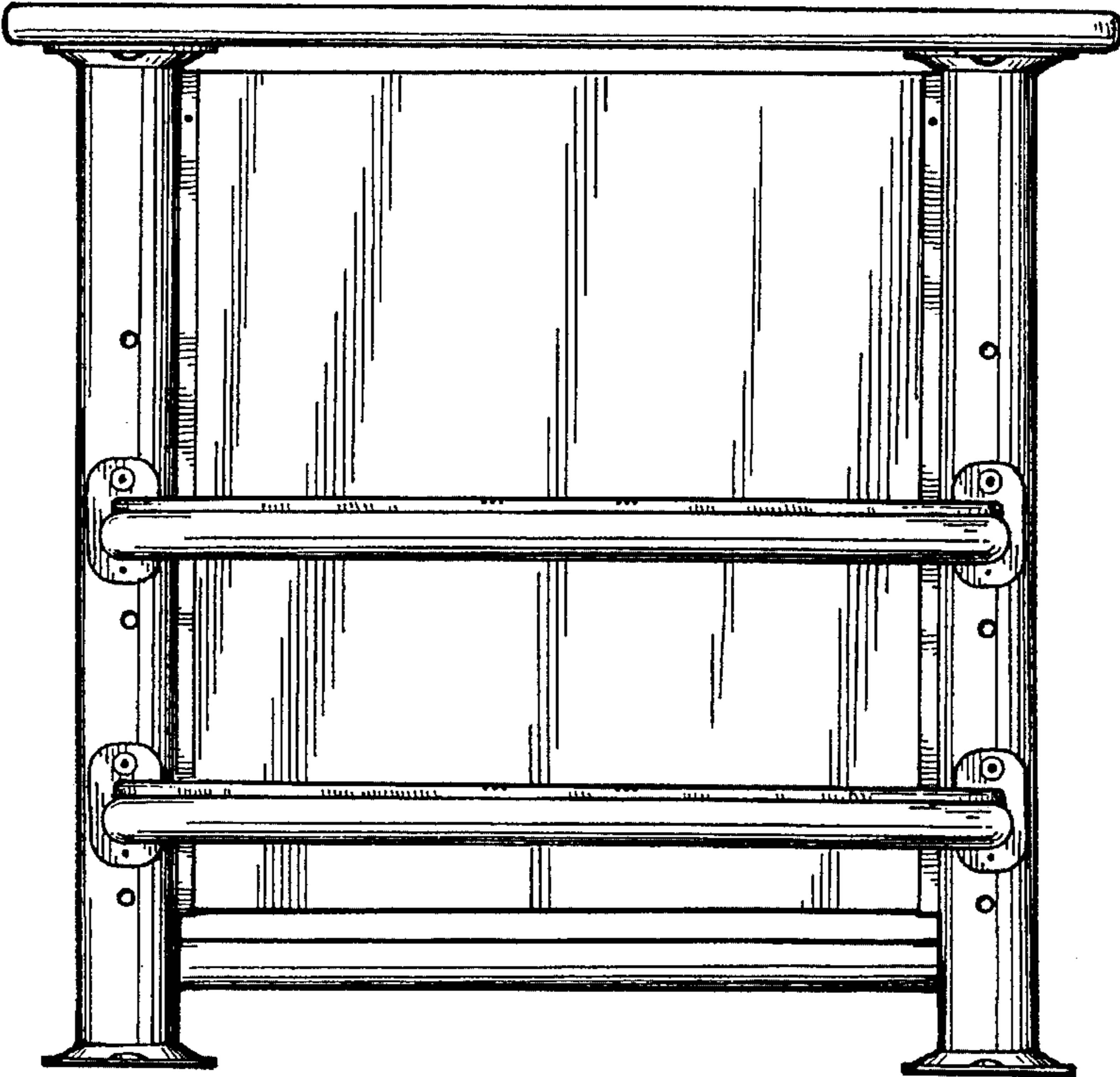

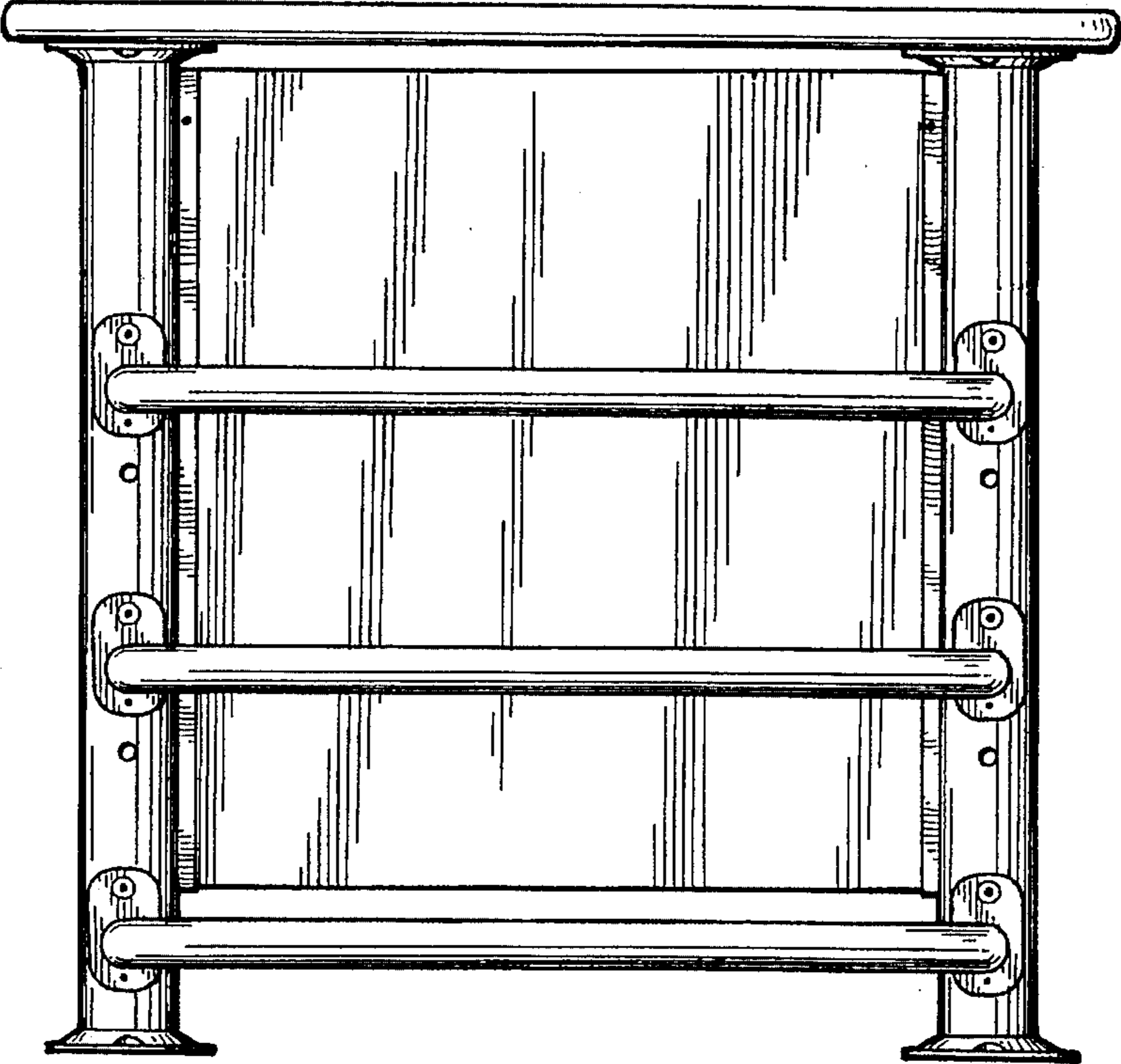

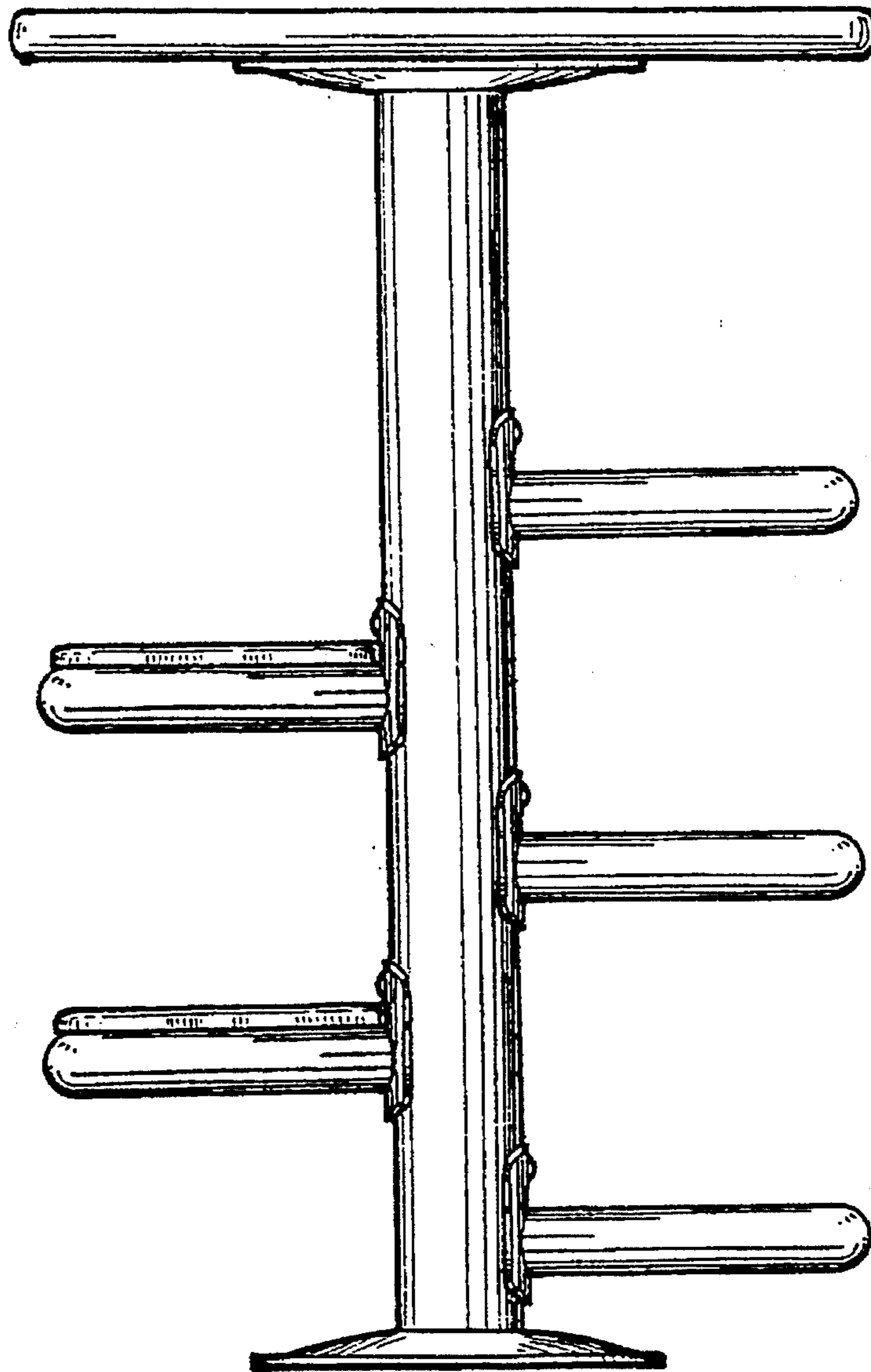

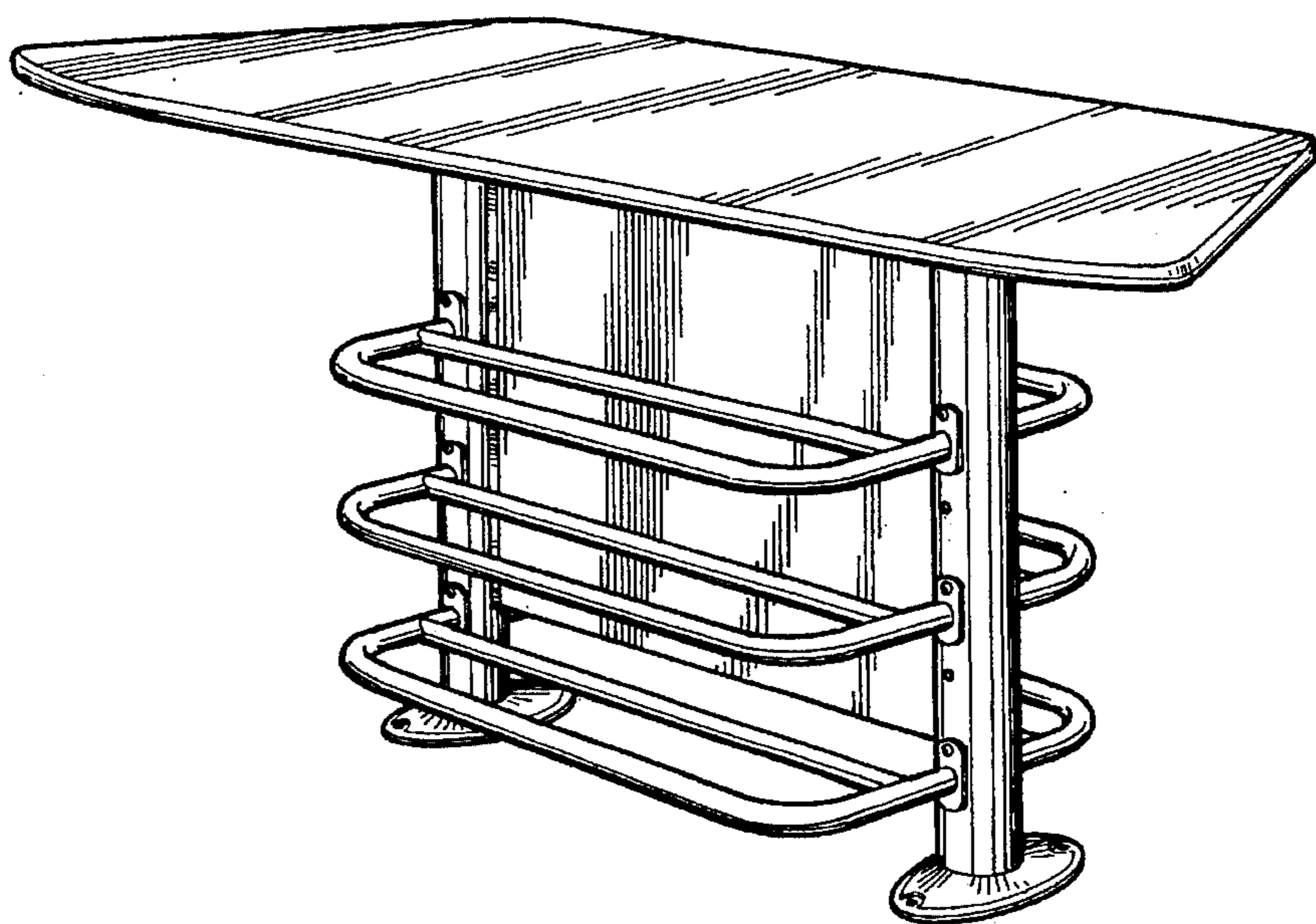

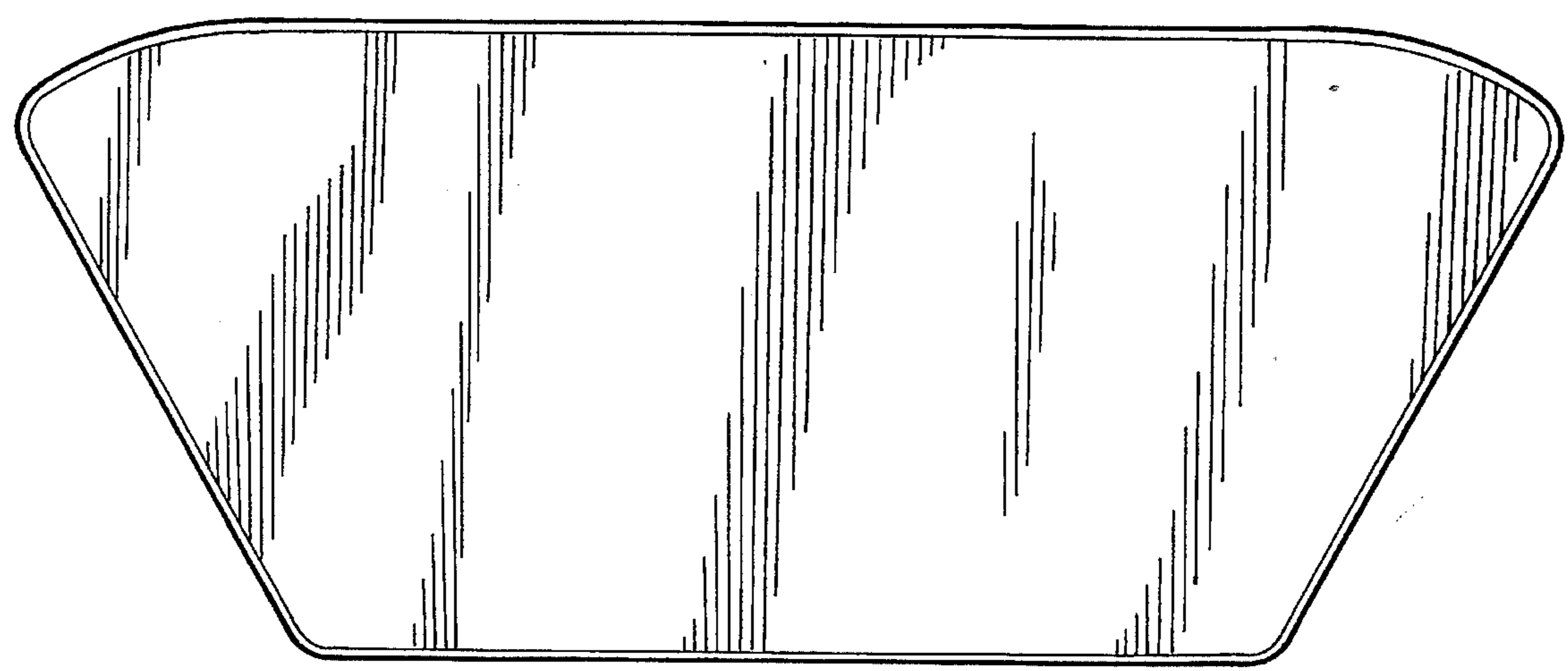

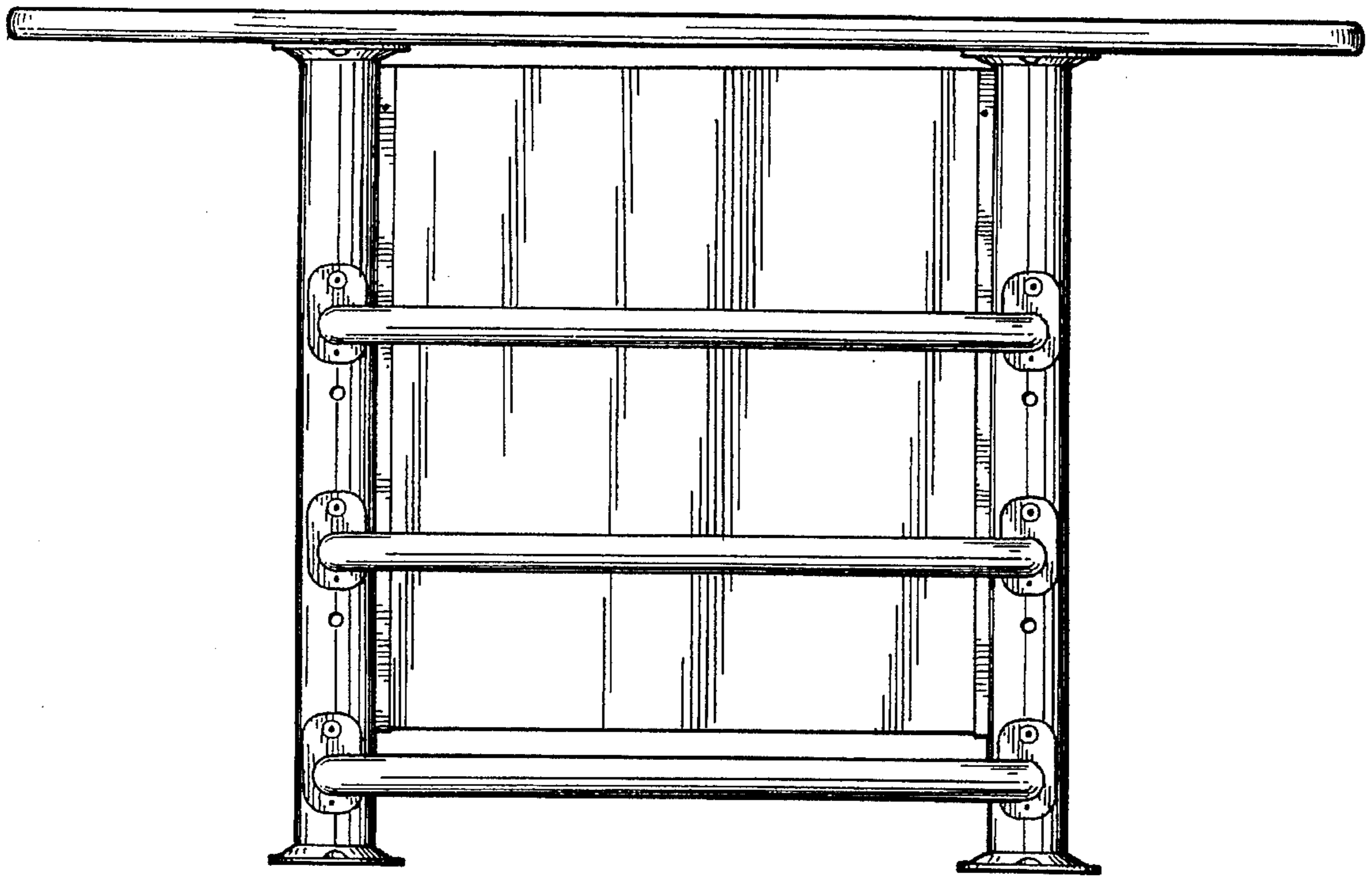

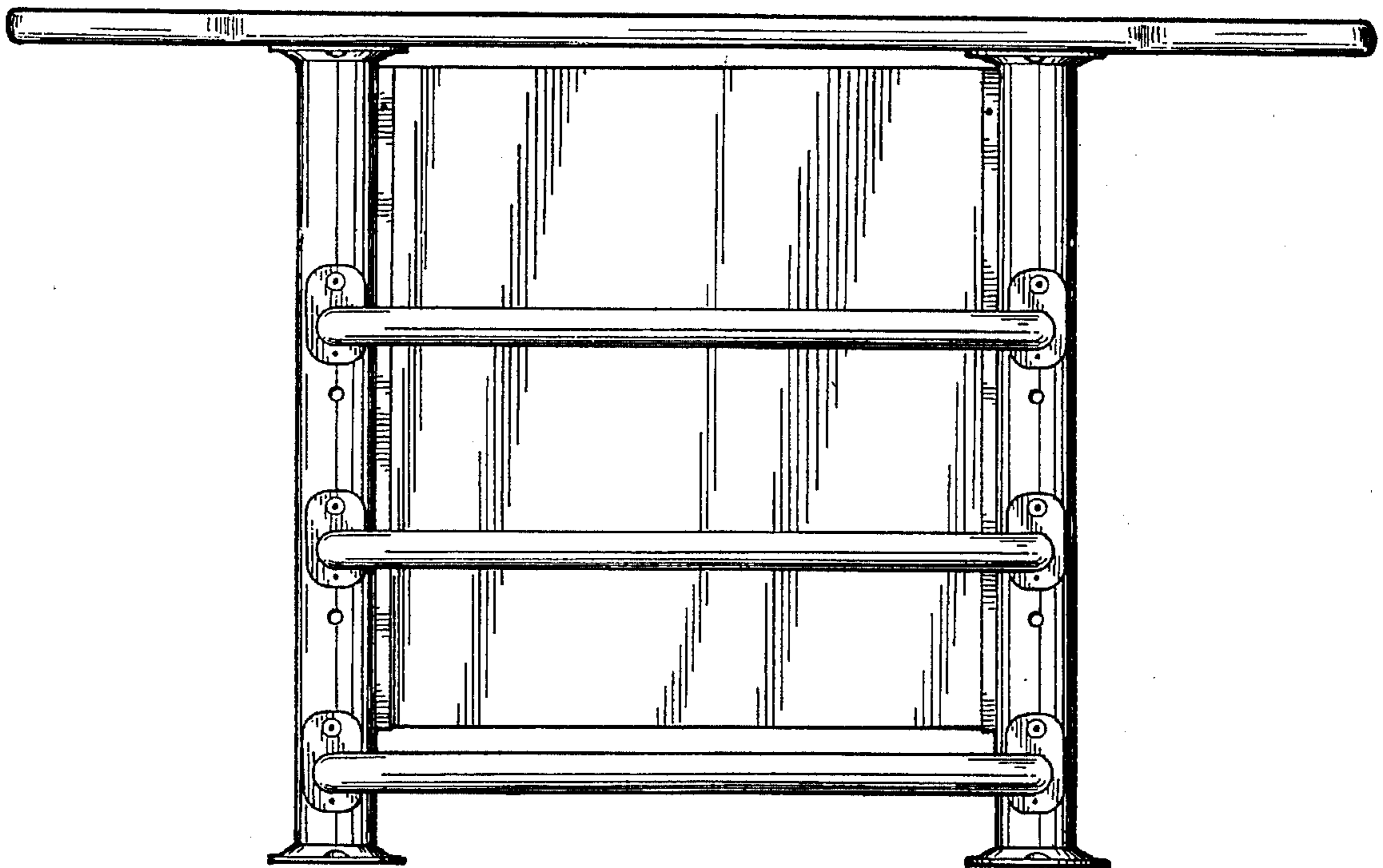

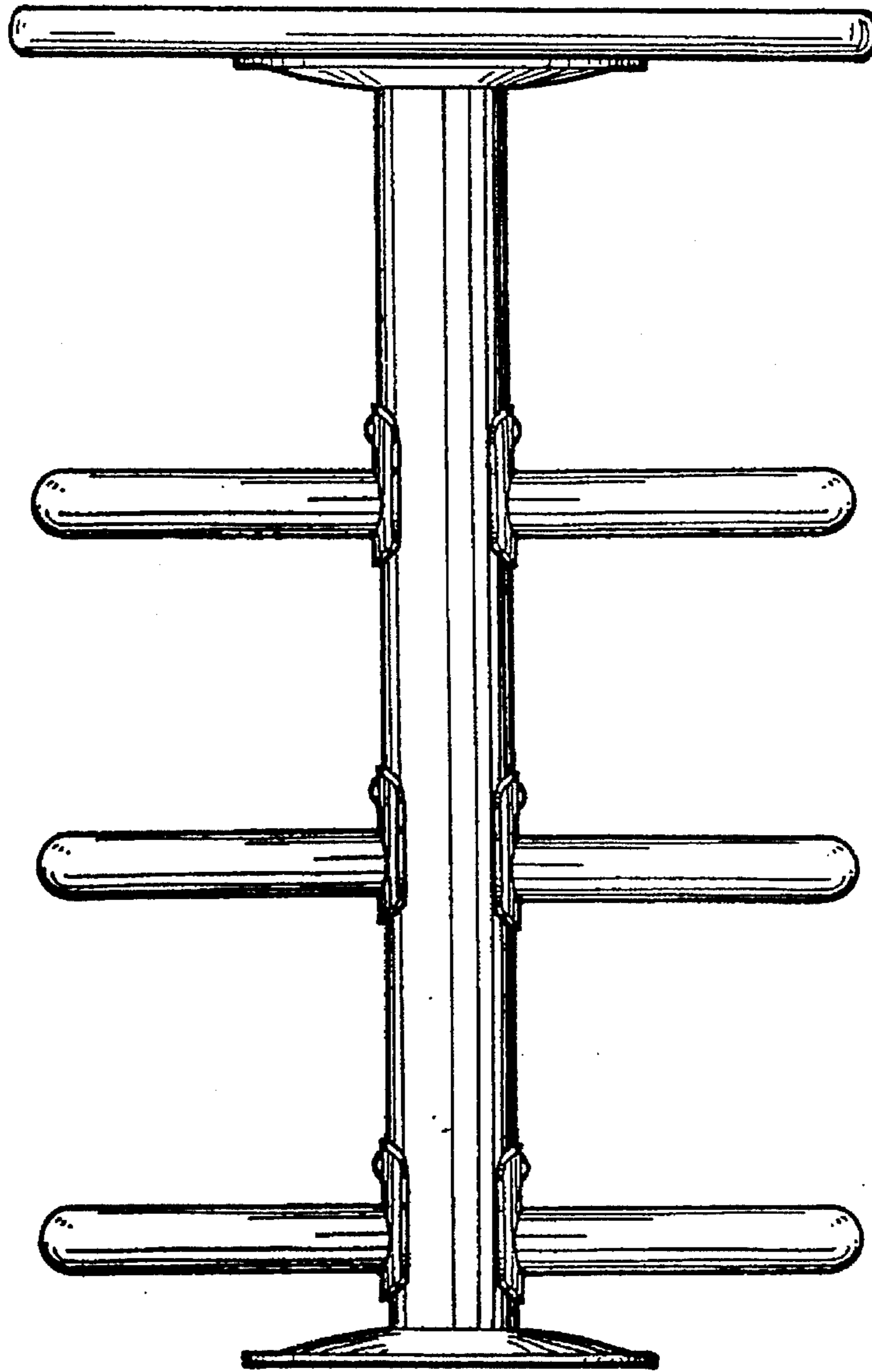
