FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof;

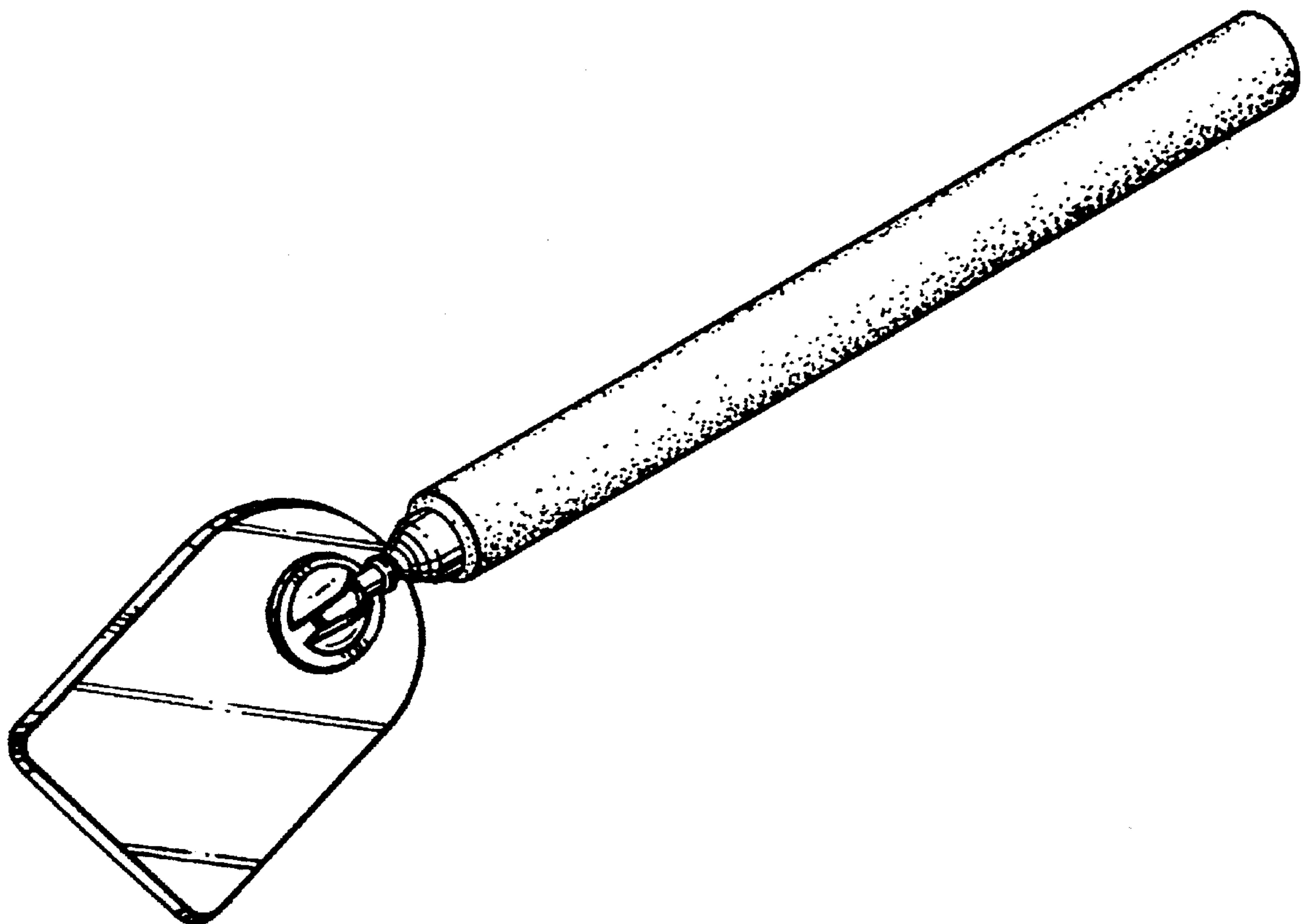
FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof;

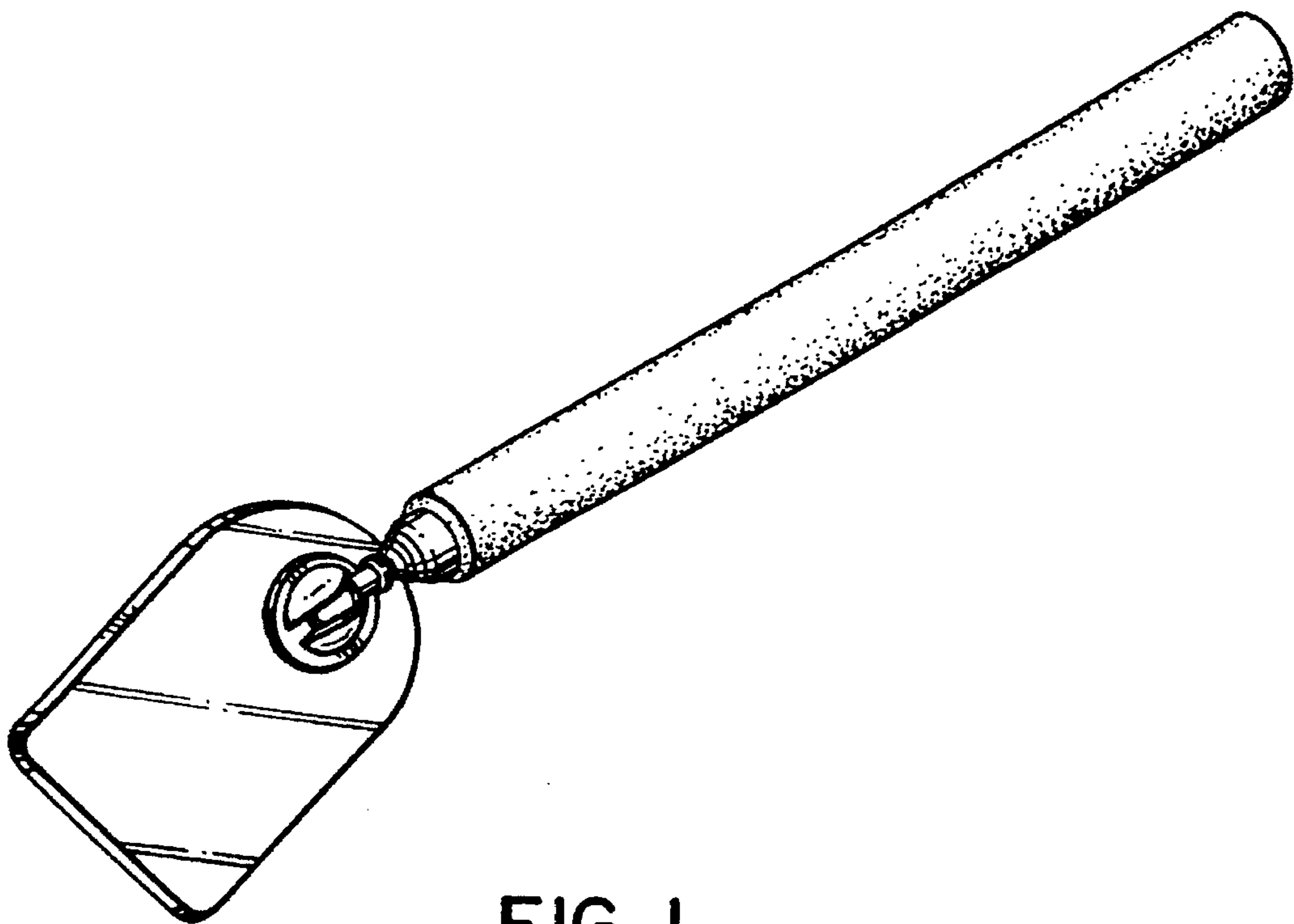

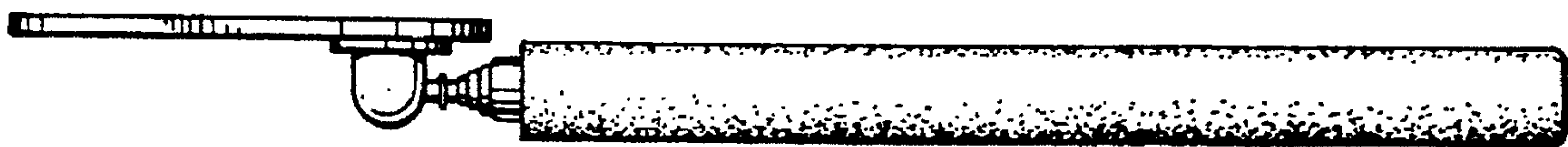

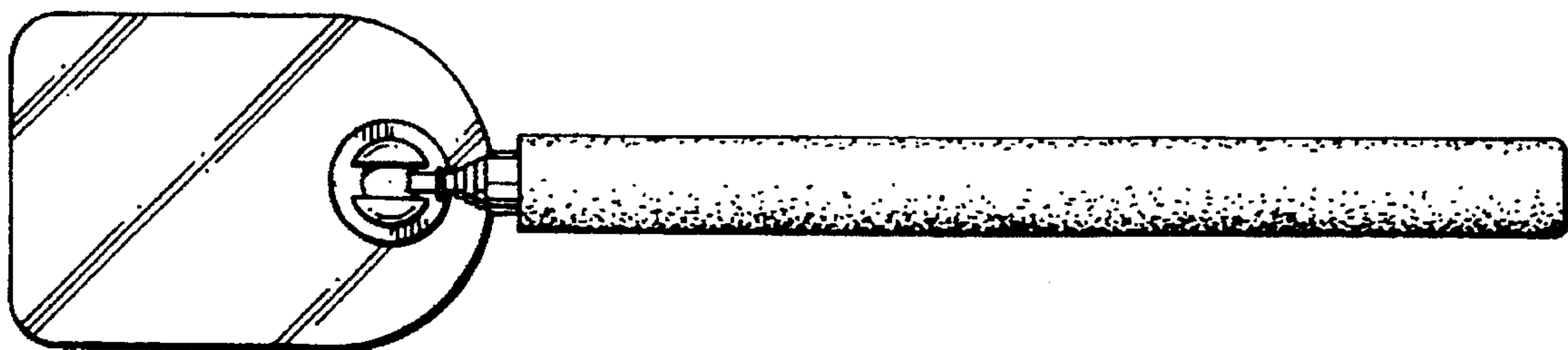

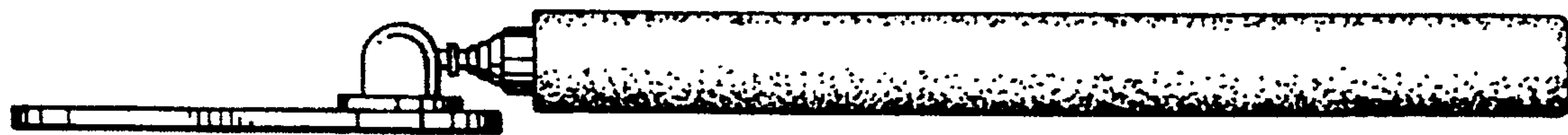

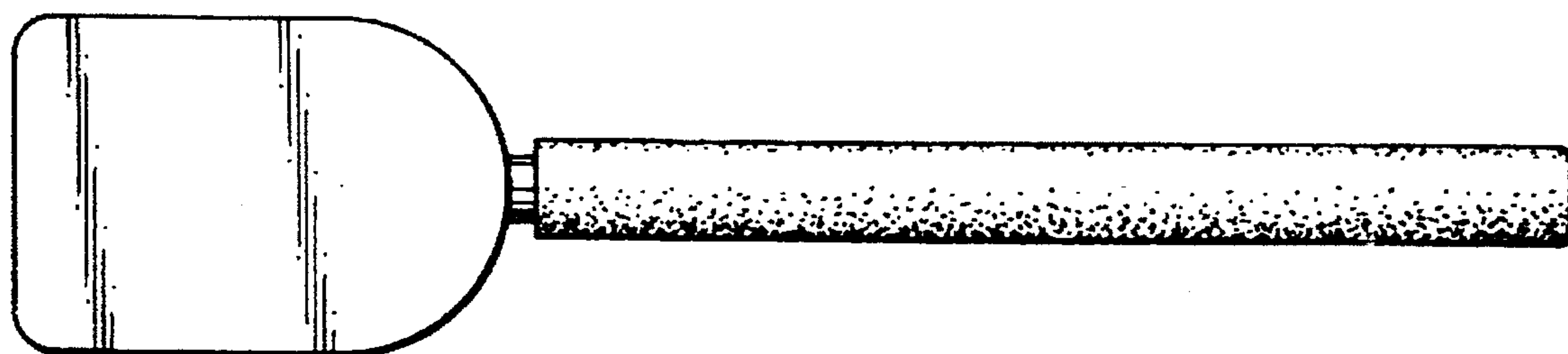

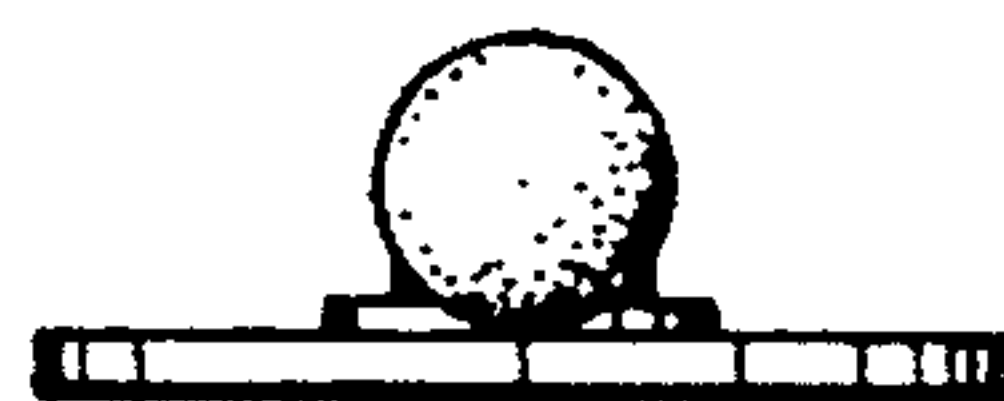

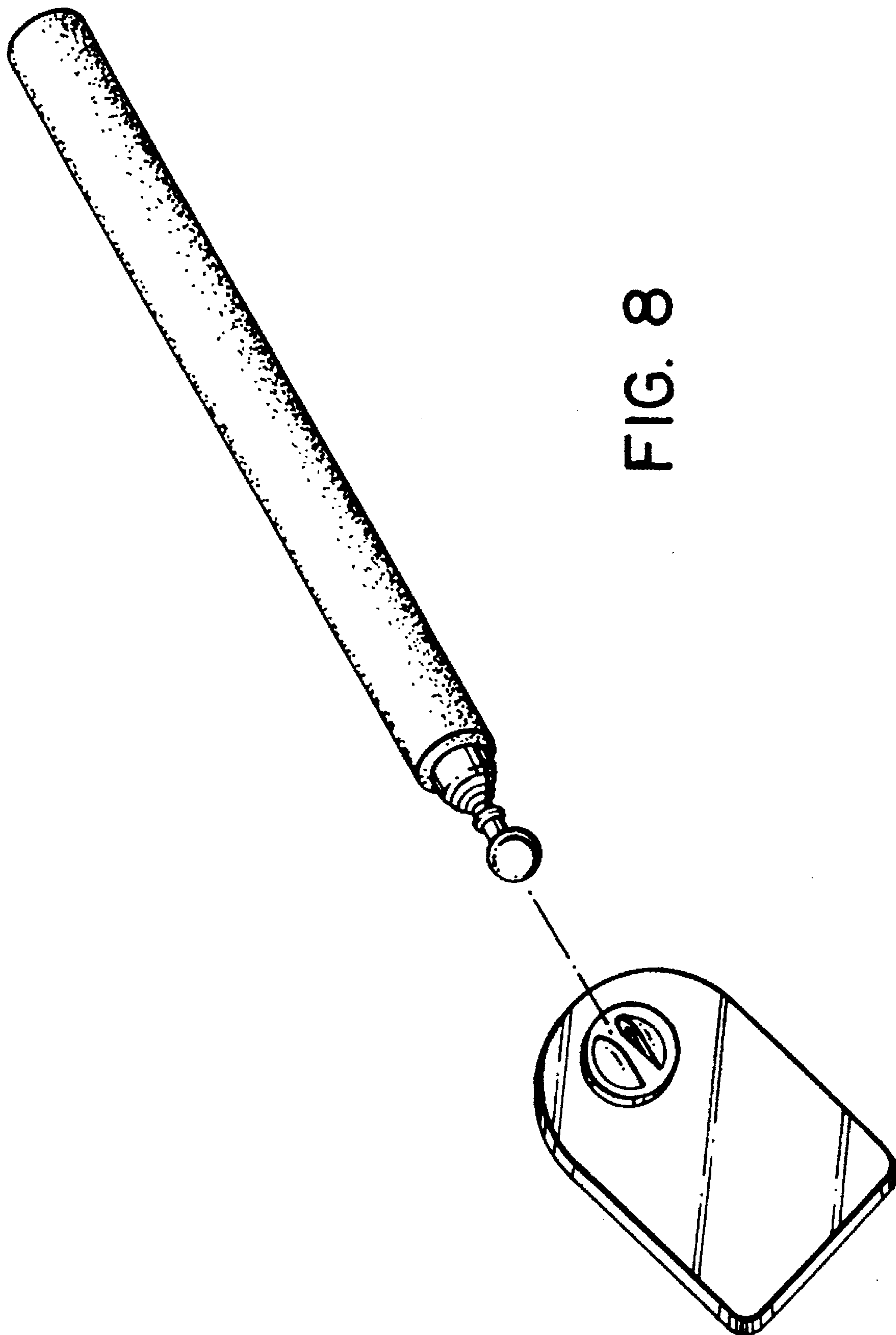

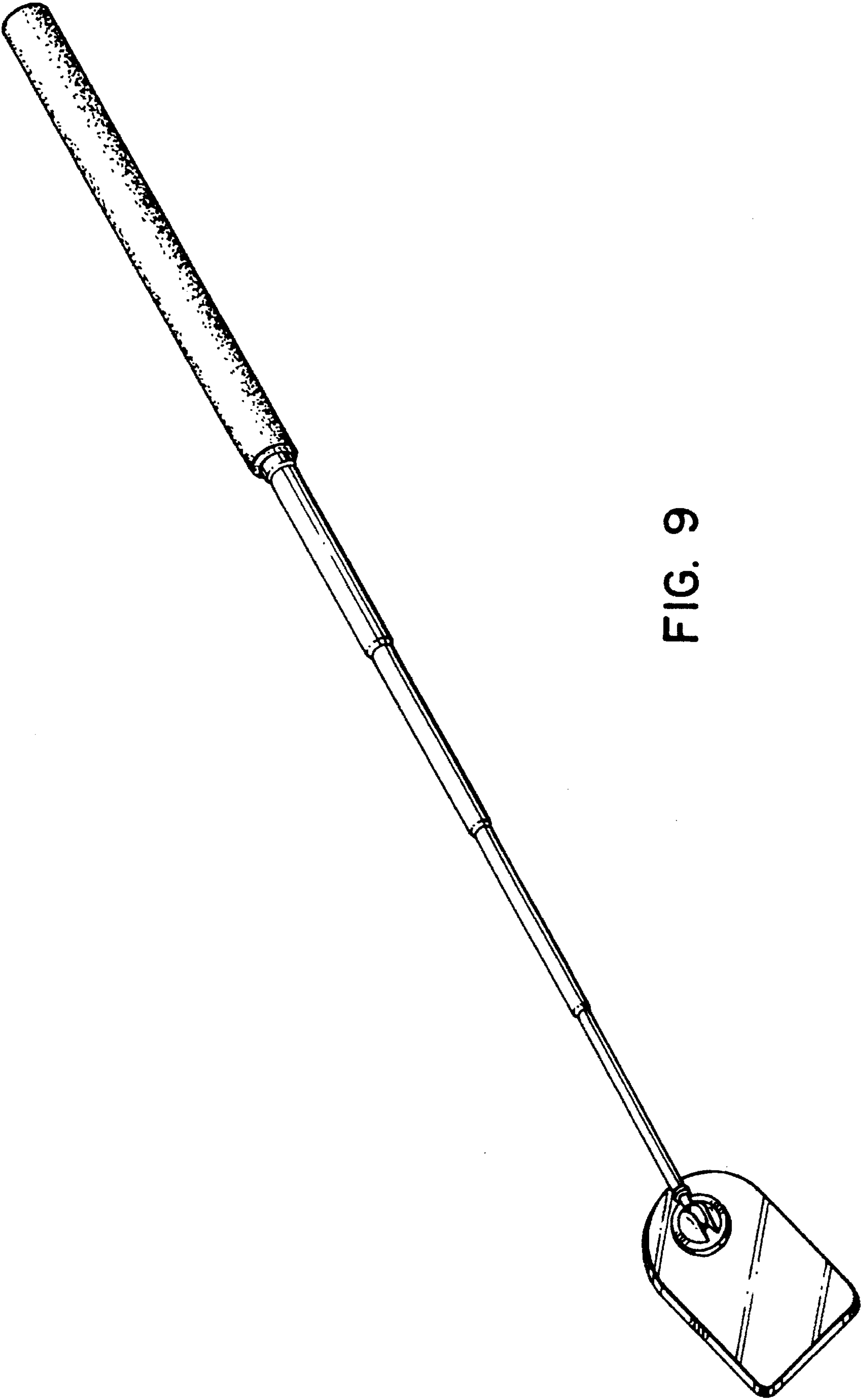

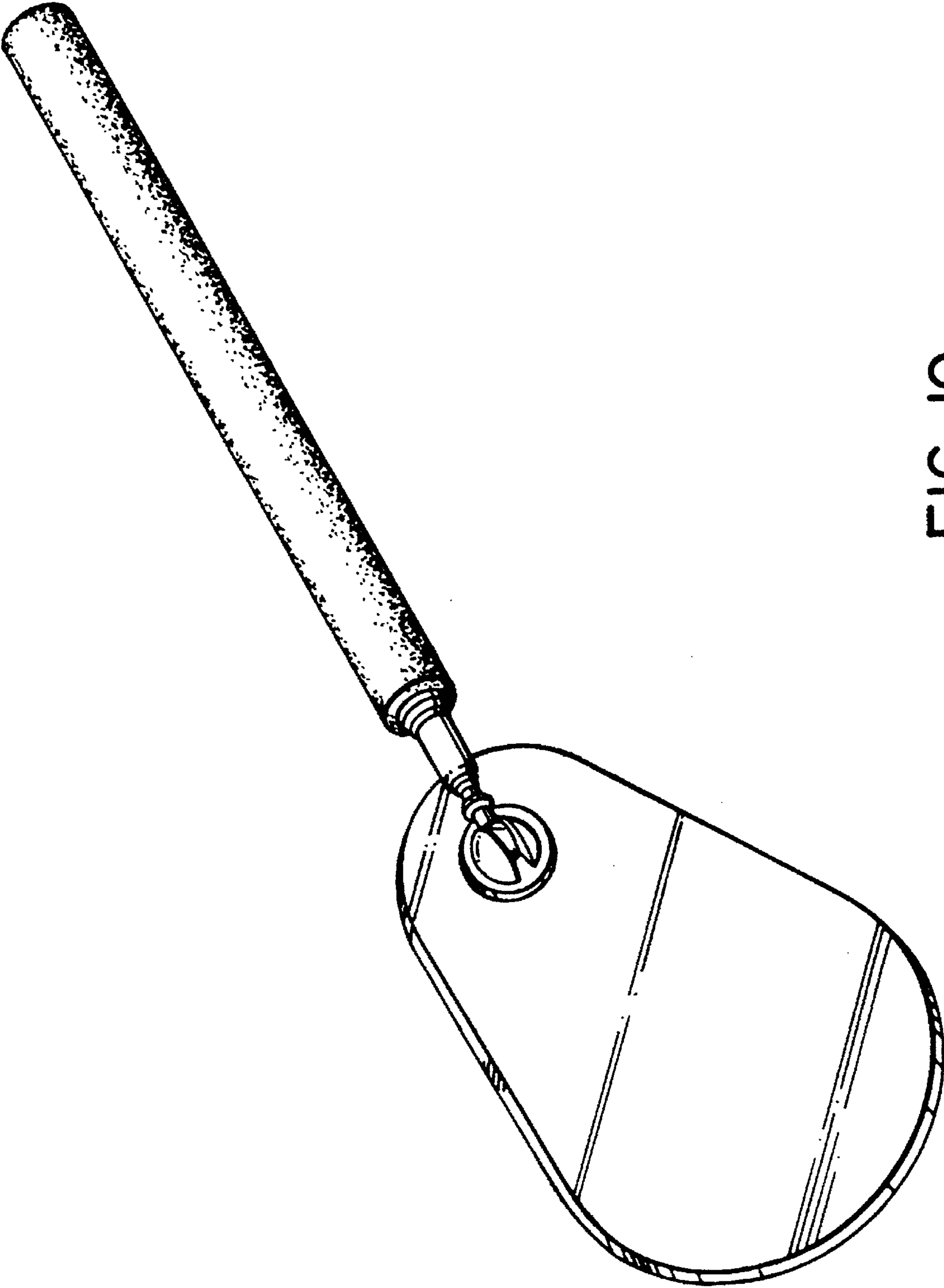
