DESCRIPTION

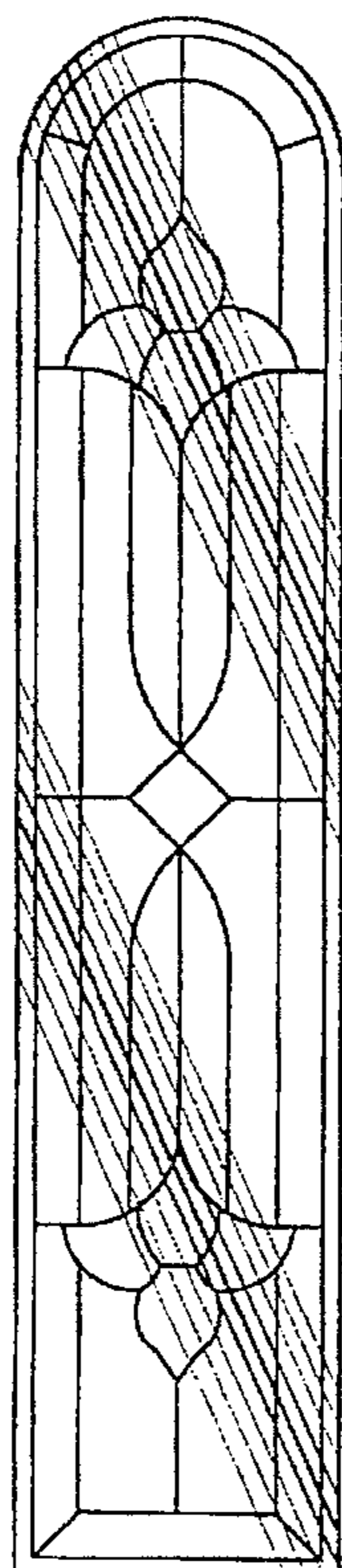
FIG. 1 is a front elevational view thereof, the rear being a mirror image;

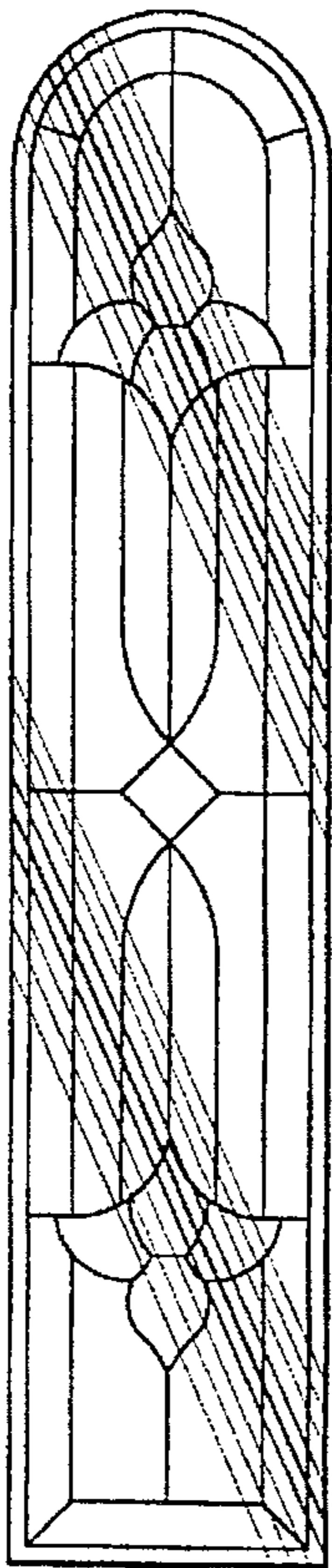

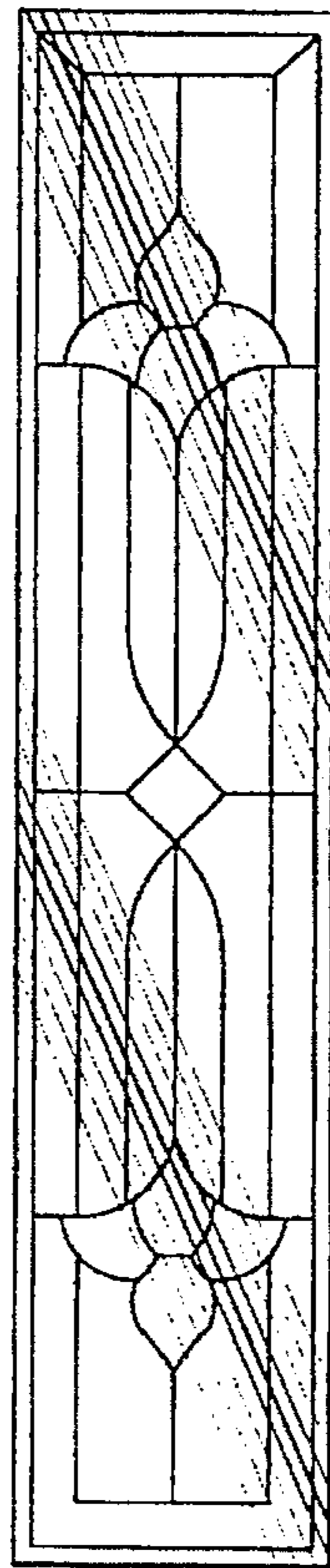

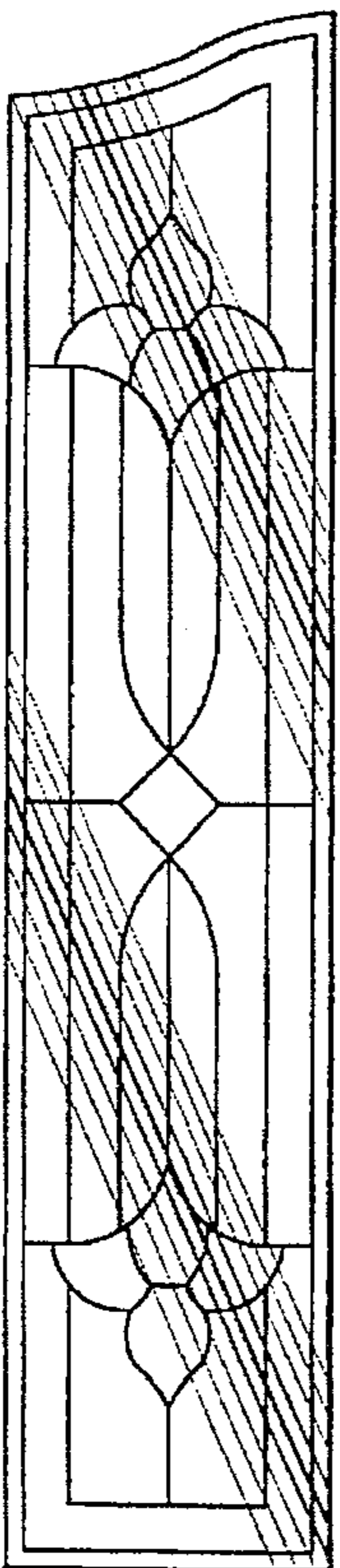

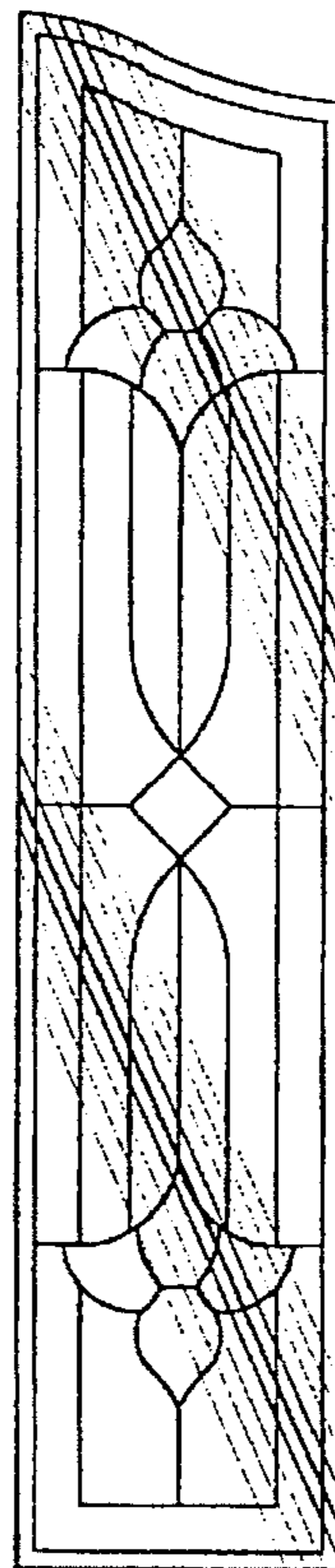
