CLAIM

The ornamental design for an article of jewelry, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of the article of jewelry showing the new design;

FIG. 2 is a back elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a left front perspective view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right perspective view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view of the alternate embodiment of the invention without a gem attached thereto;

FIG. 6 is a rear perspective view of the alternate embodiment;

FIG. 7 is a right rear perspective view of the alternate embodiment shown in FIG. 6;

FIG. 8 is a bottom plan view of the article of jewelry;

FIG. 9 is a top plan view of the article of jewelry;

FIG. 10 is a left side elevational view of the article of jewelry; and,

FIG. 11 is a right side elevational view of the article of jewelry.

FIGS. 8, 9, 10 and 11 represent views for either the gemmounted embodiment shown in FIGS. 1 through 4 and the embodiment without the gems as shown in FIGS. 5, 6 and 7. Articles of jewelry wich could be used could be pendants, stick pins, and tie-tacks.




















