[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a chassis for an in-line roller skate, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the chassis for in-line roller skate according to this design;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the chassis shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view of the chassis shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 5 is a right end elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a left end elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 7 is a side elevational view of the chassis for in-line roller skate according to this design shown attached to a skate that is depicted in phantom lines;

FIG. 8 is a perspective view of the chassis for in-line roller skate according to a variant of this design;

FIG. 9 is a top plan view of the chassis shown in FIG. 8;

FIG. 10 is a side elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 8;

FIG. 11 is a bottom plan view of the chassis shown in FIG. 8;

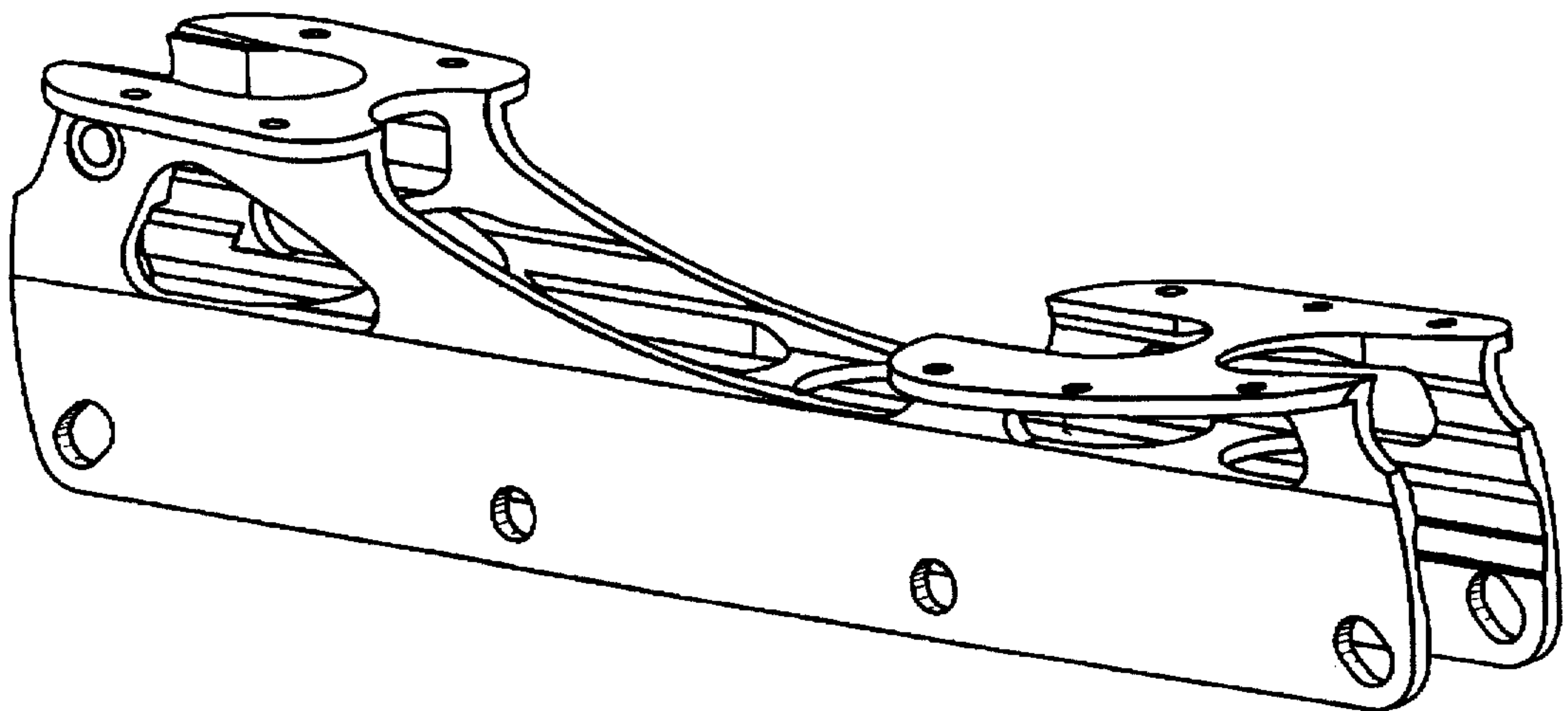
FIG. 12 is a right and elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 8;

FIG. 13 is a left end elevational view of the chassis shown in FIG. 8; and,

FIG. 14 is a side elevational view of the chassis for in-line roller skate to the variant of this design shown attached to a skate that is depicted in phantom lines.

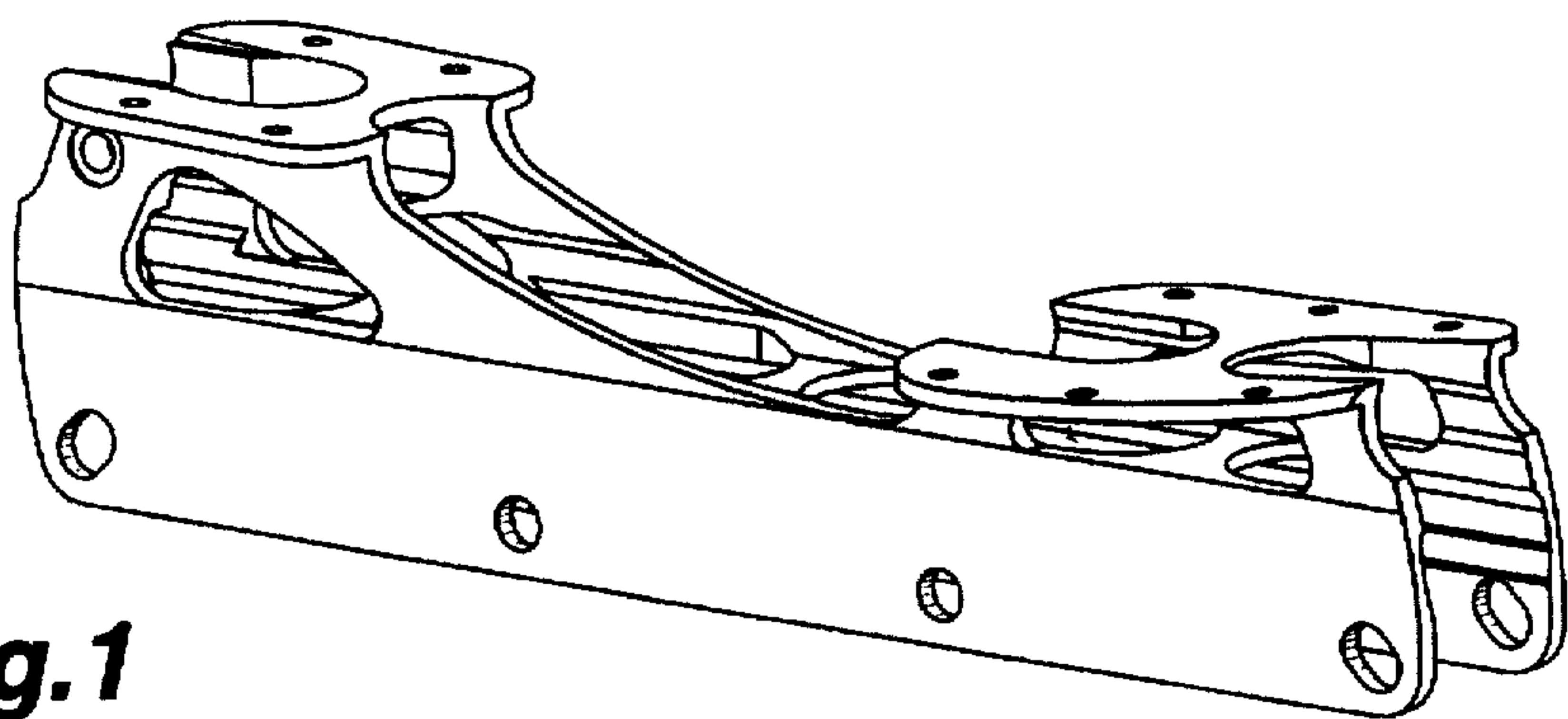

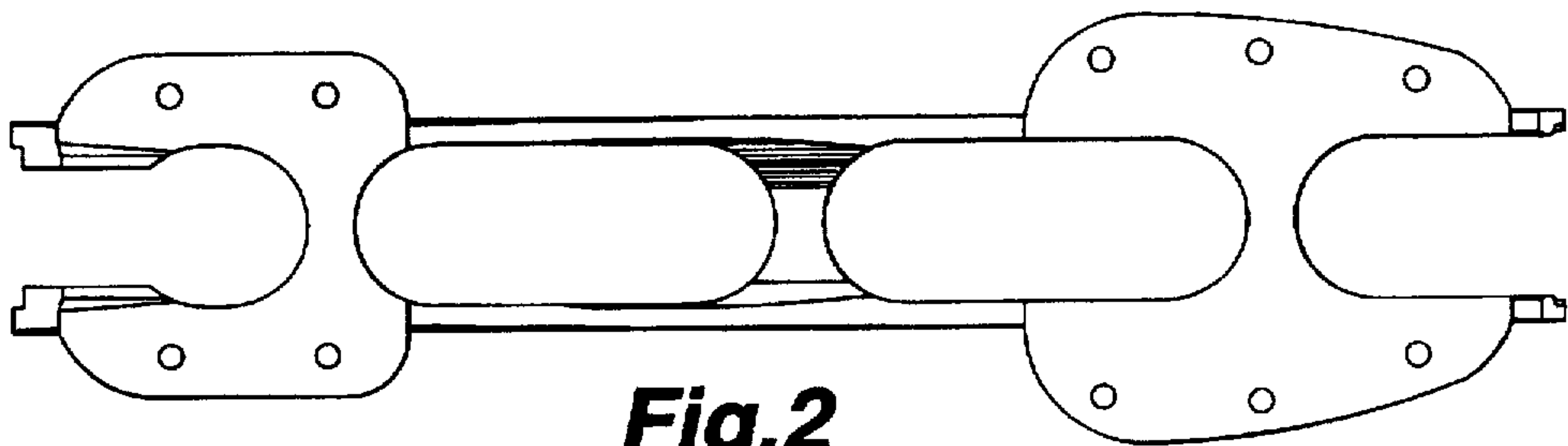

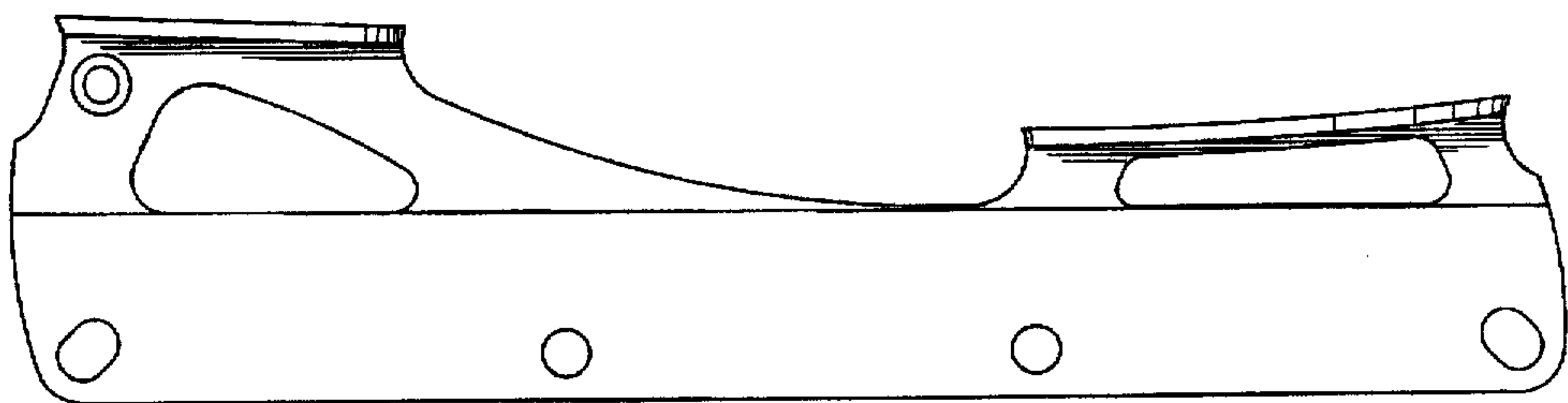

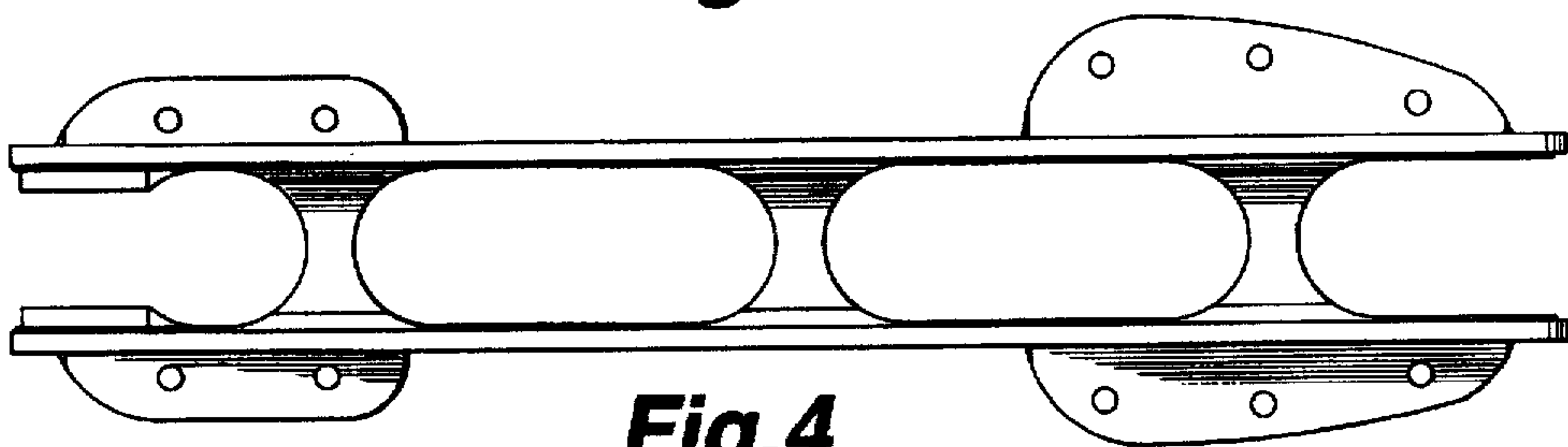

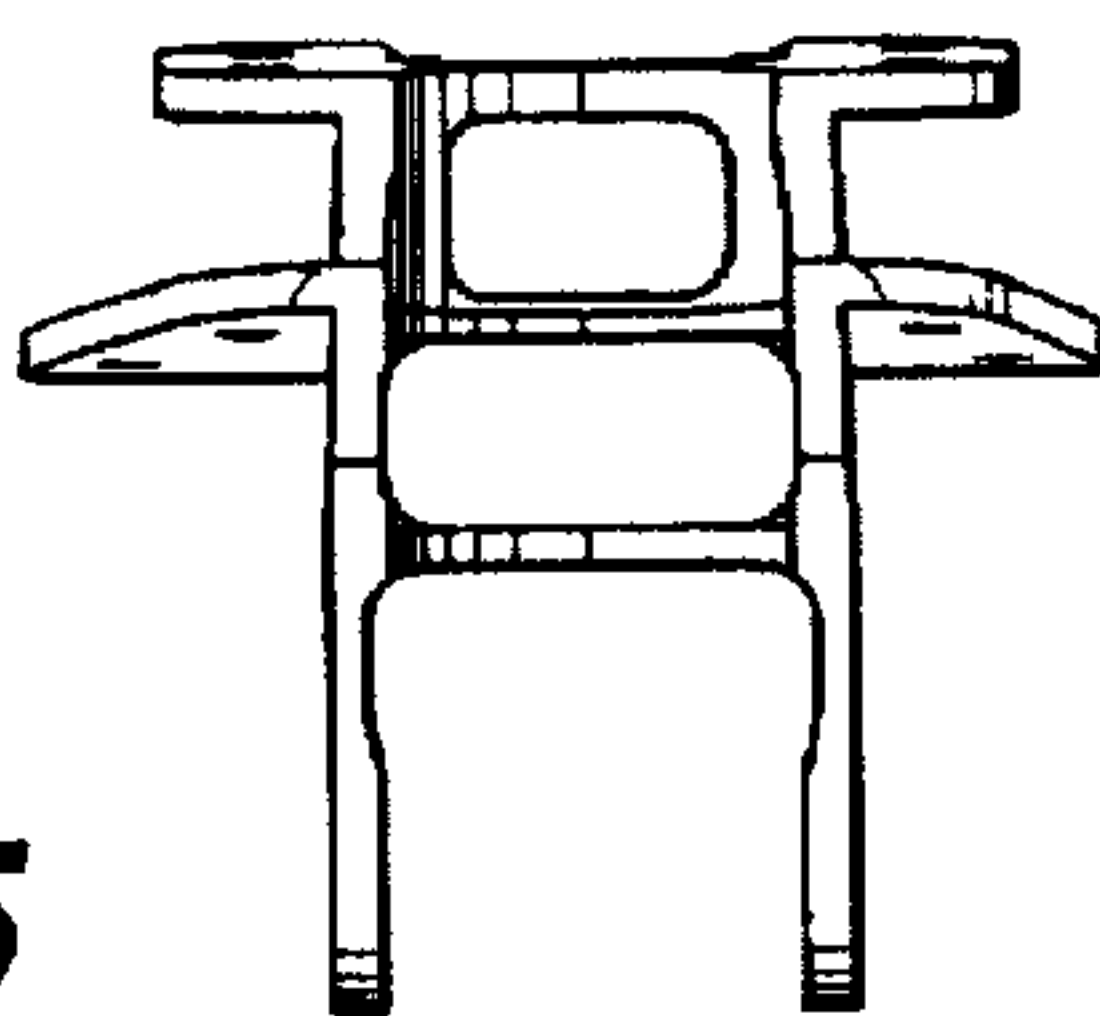

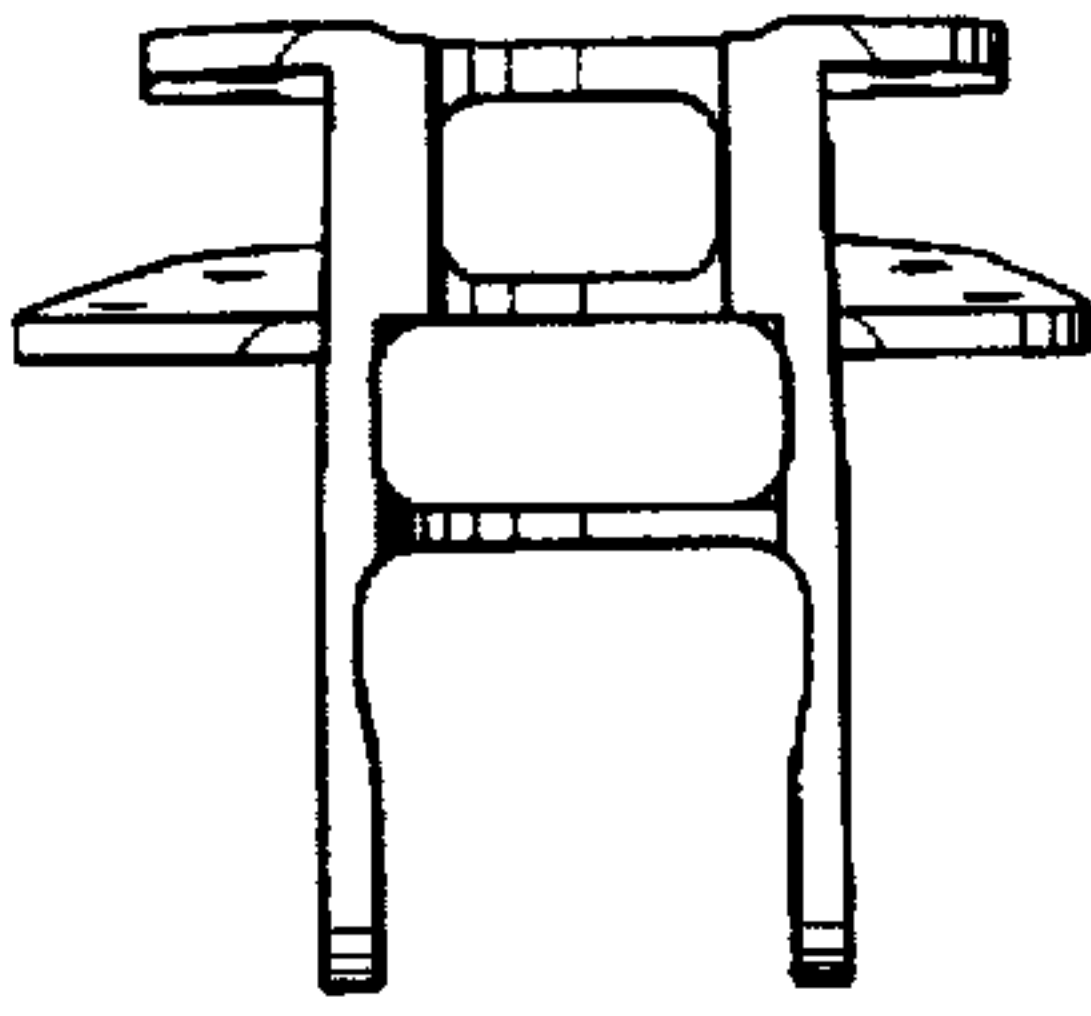

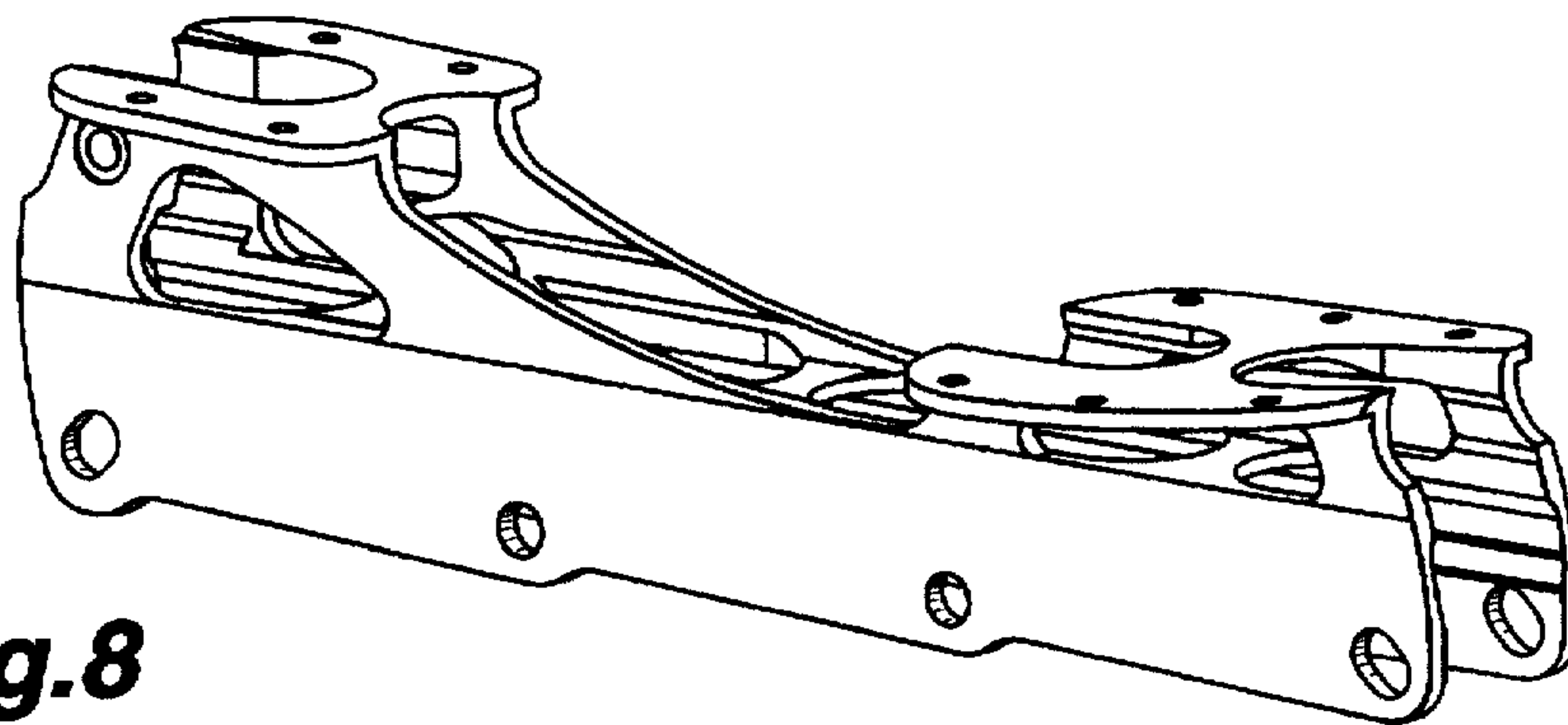

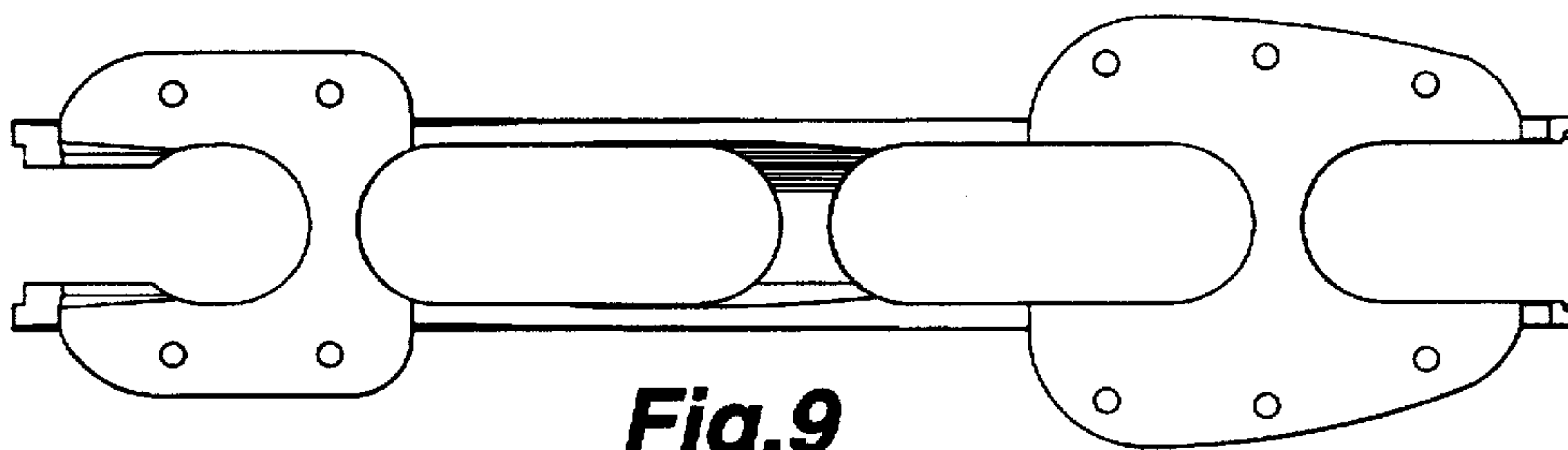

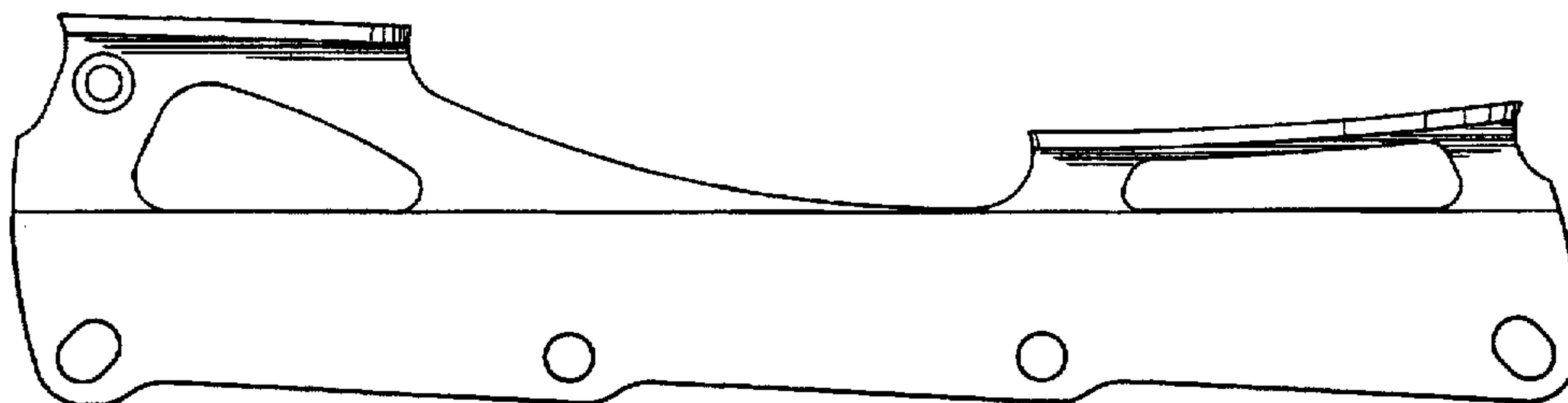

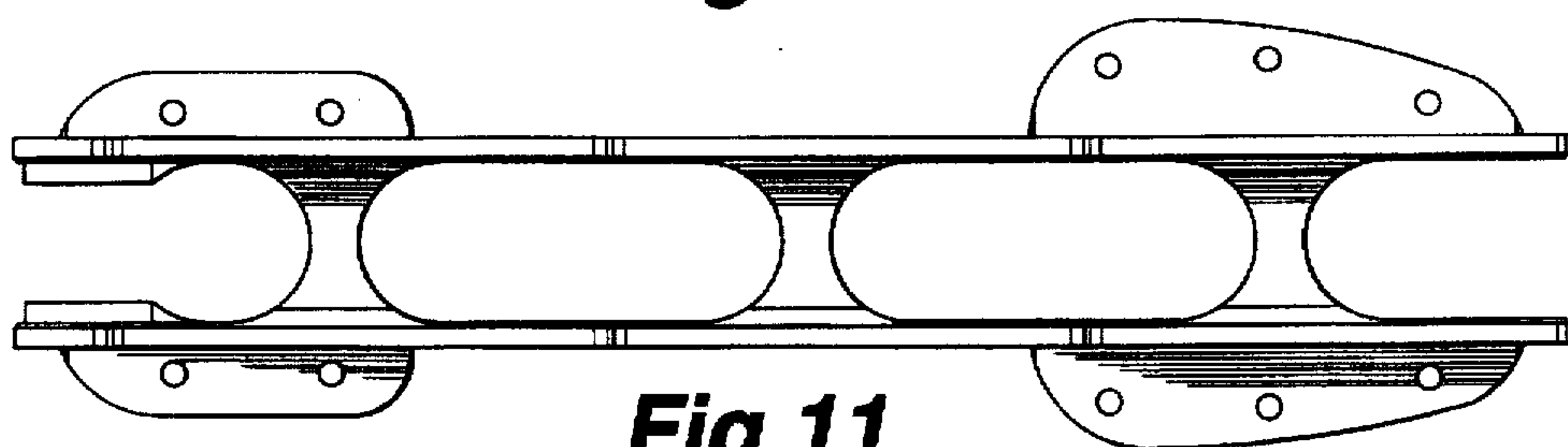

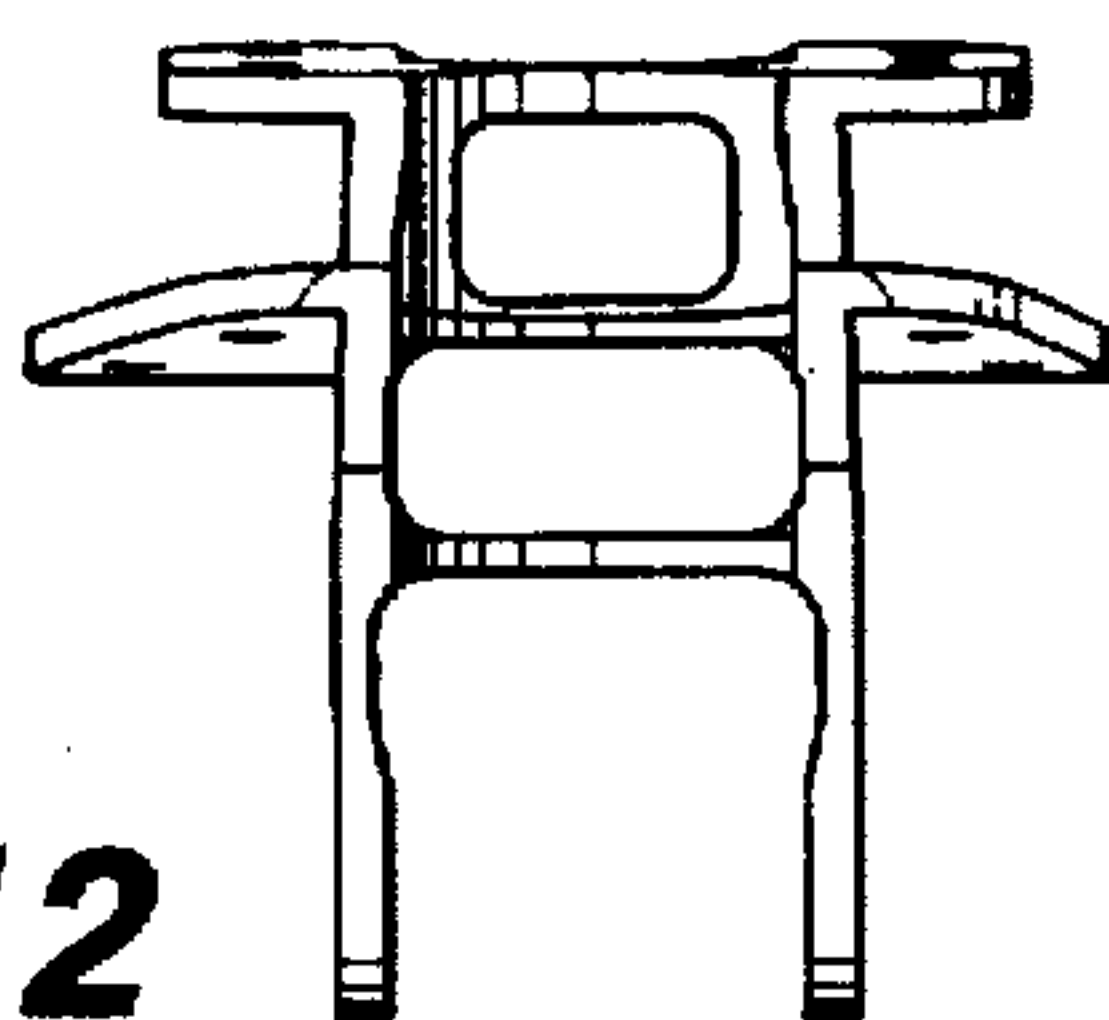

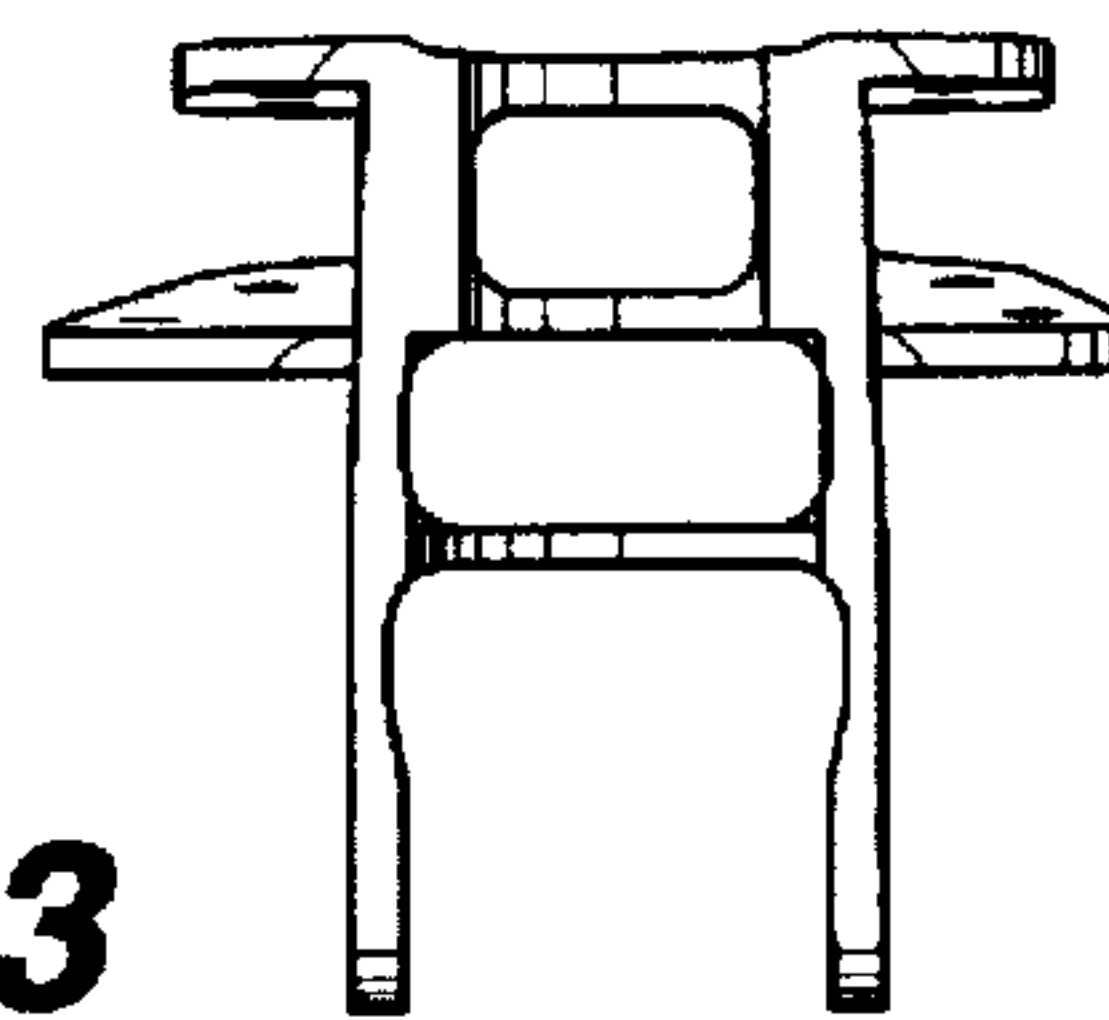
