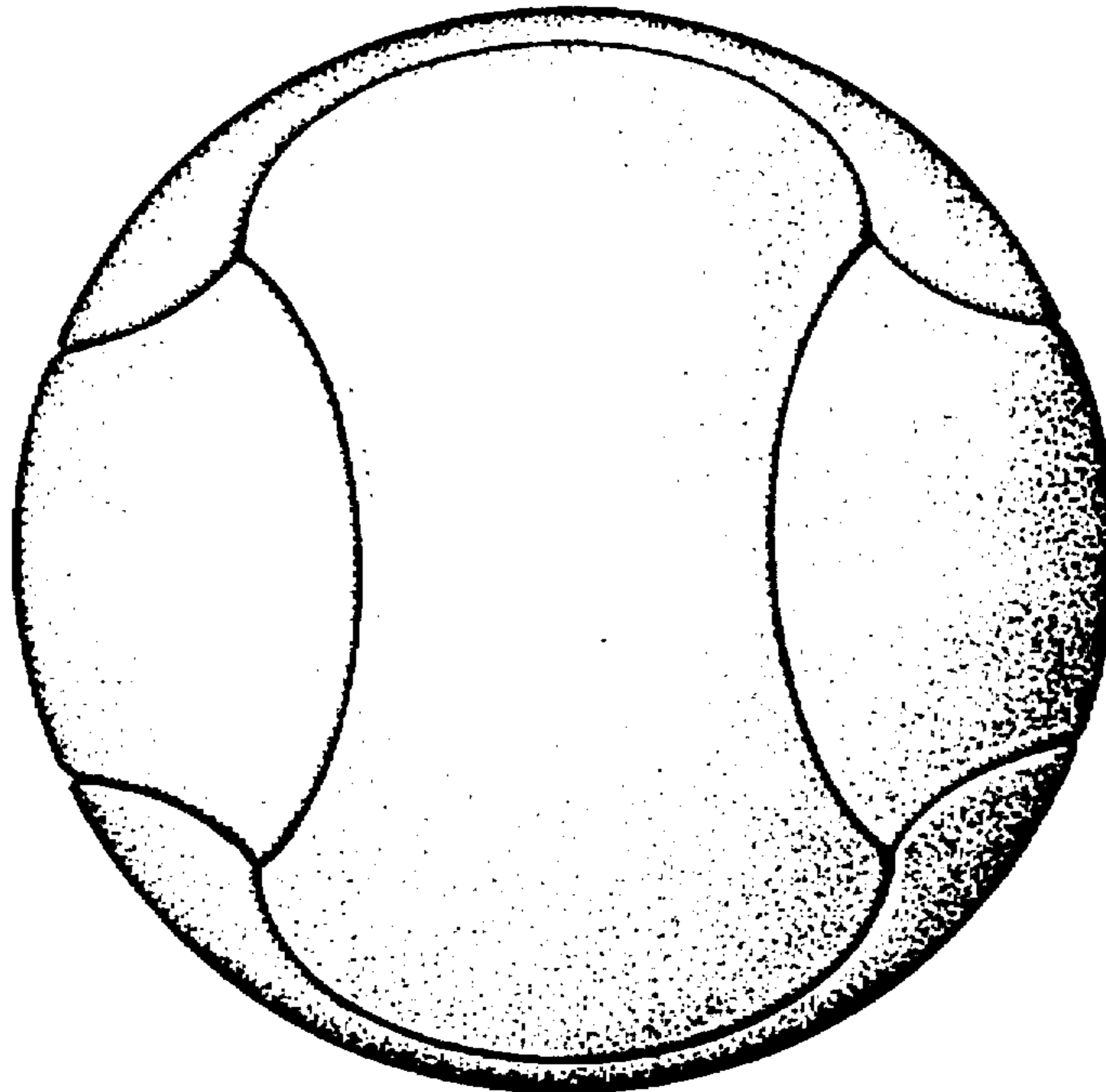
[57] **CLAIM**

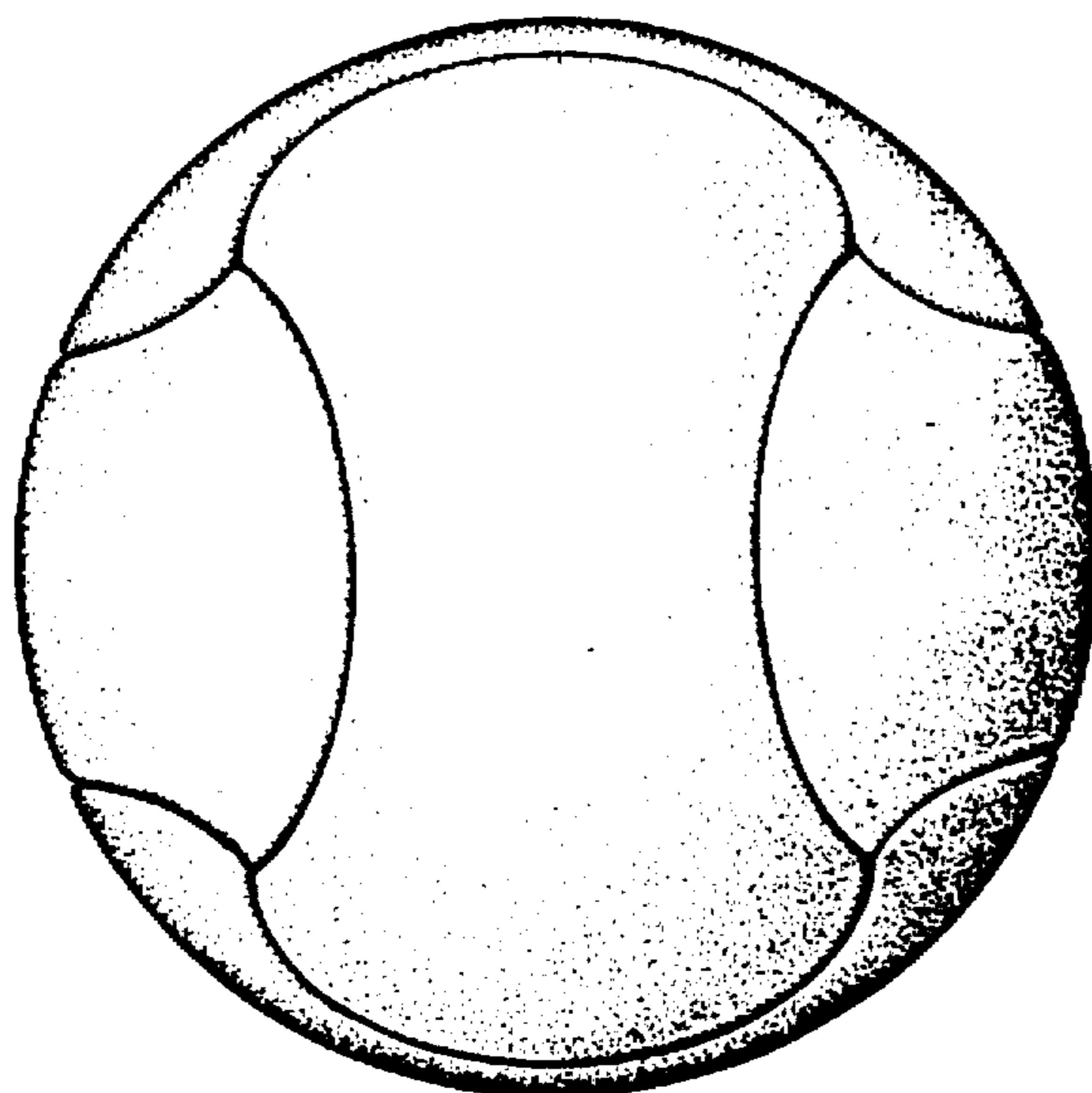

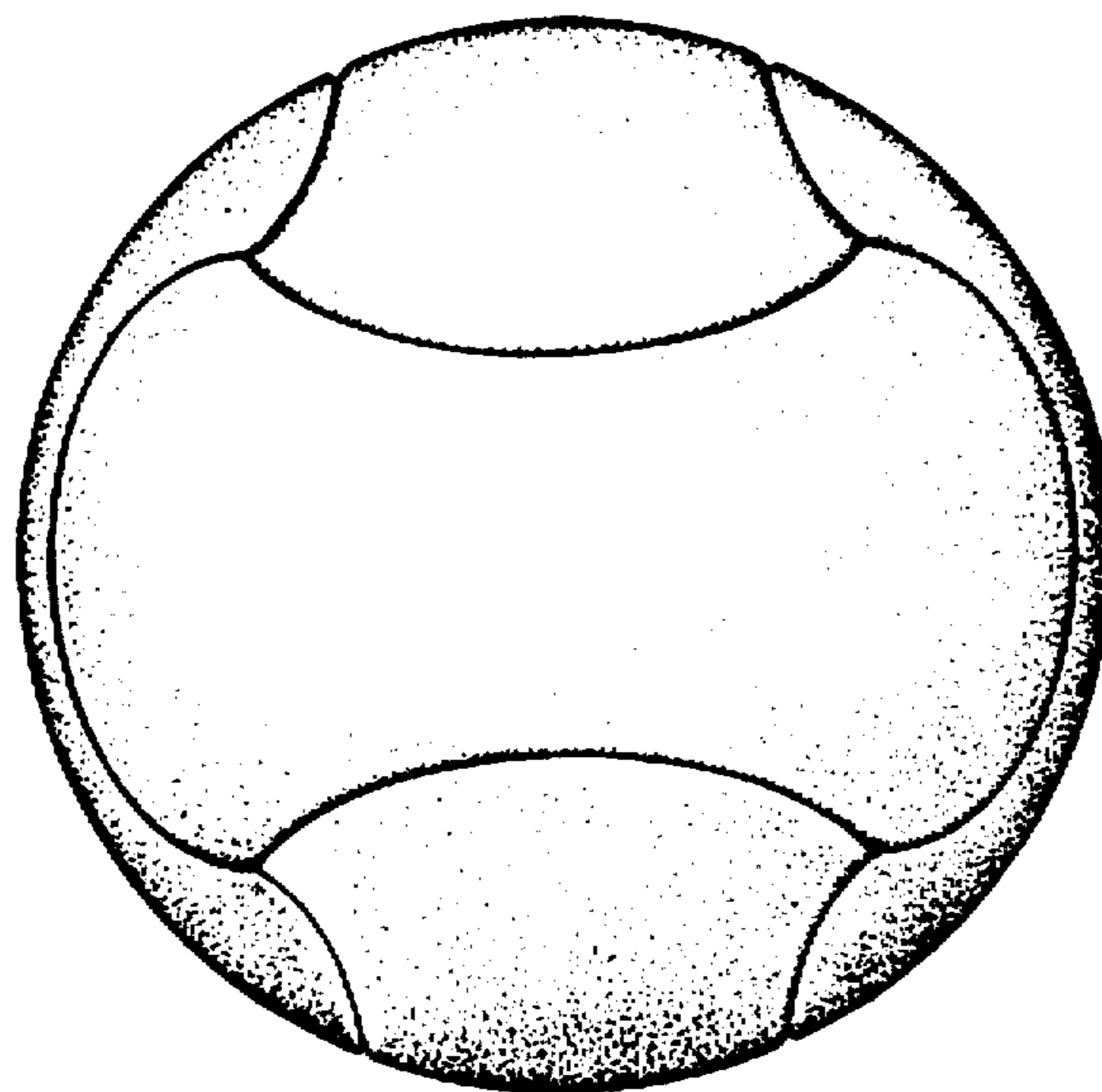
