FIG. 3 is a bottom view;

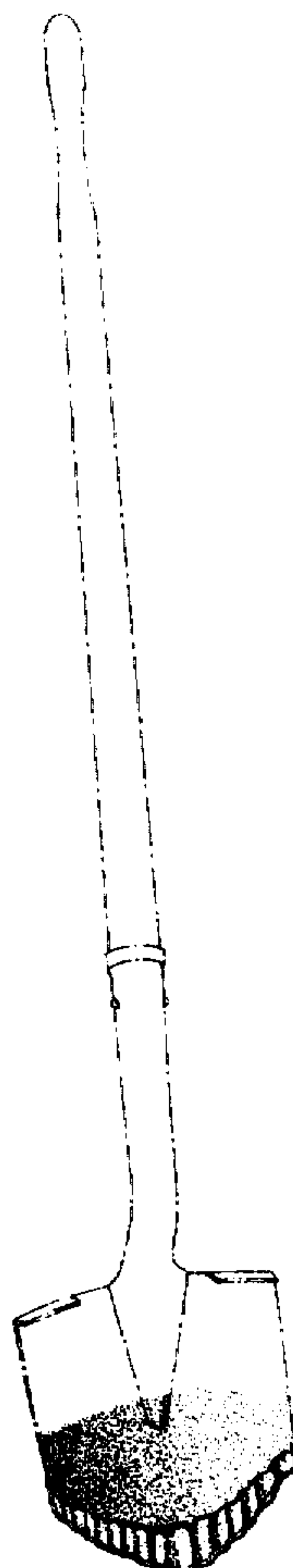
FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view;

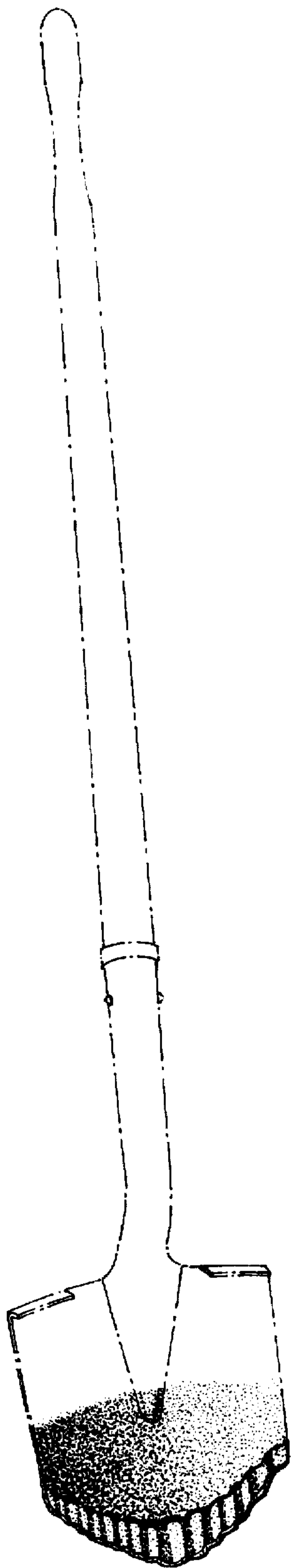

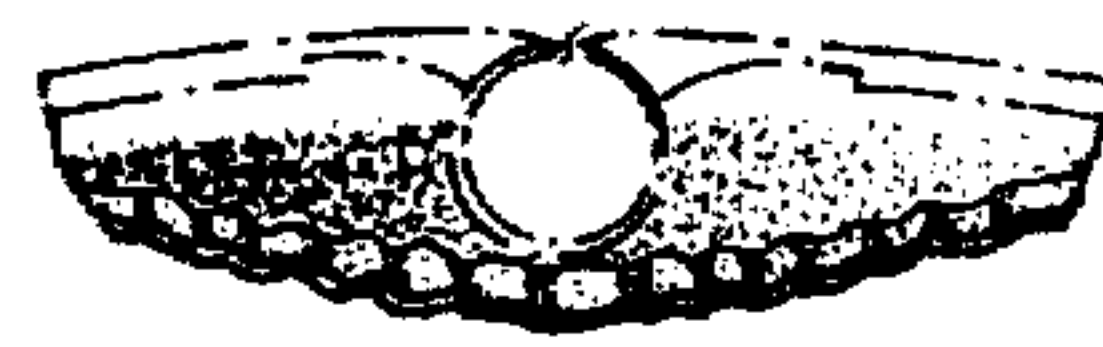

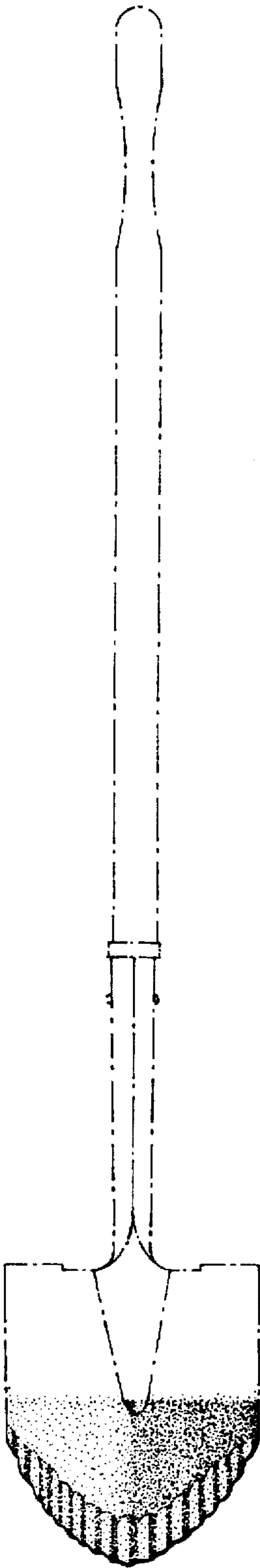

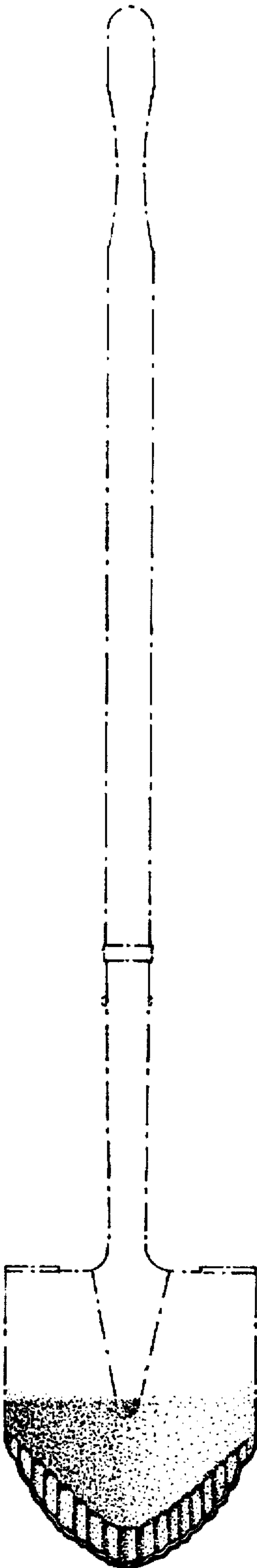
