FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view of the vest;


FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view showing the vest in an enlarged scale;

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view showing the vest in an enlarged scale; and,


FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view of the vest.

The broken line showing in FIGS. 1–5 is for illustrative purposes only forms no part of the claimed design.









