FIG. 2 is a front plan view of a golf ball net;

FIG. 5 is a side elevation view thereof.
The mesh shading is representing a net material and is broken away sections is considered standard drafting practice.
The broken line showing of ground hooks is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.

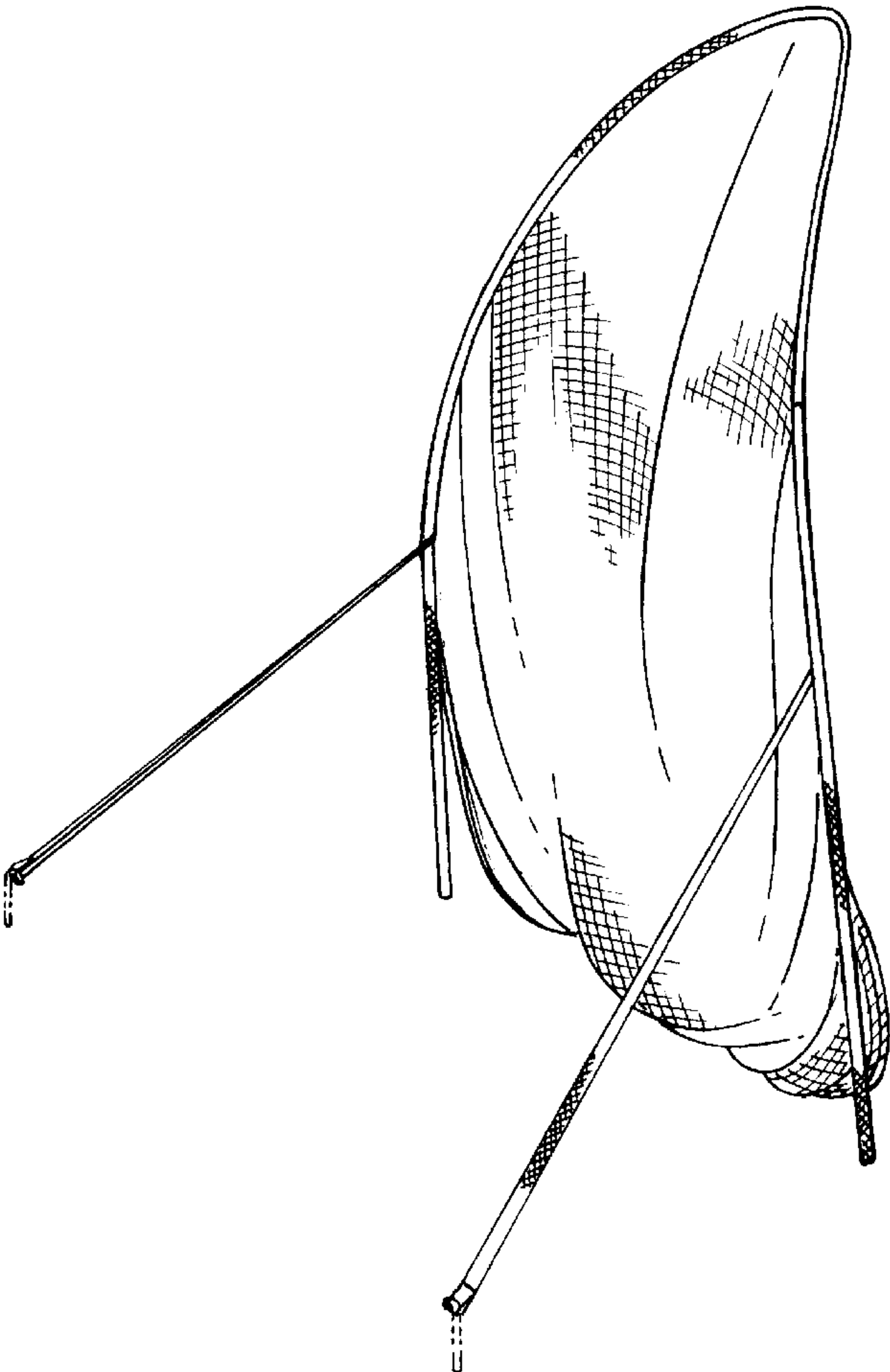

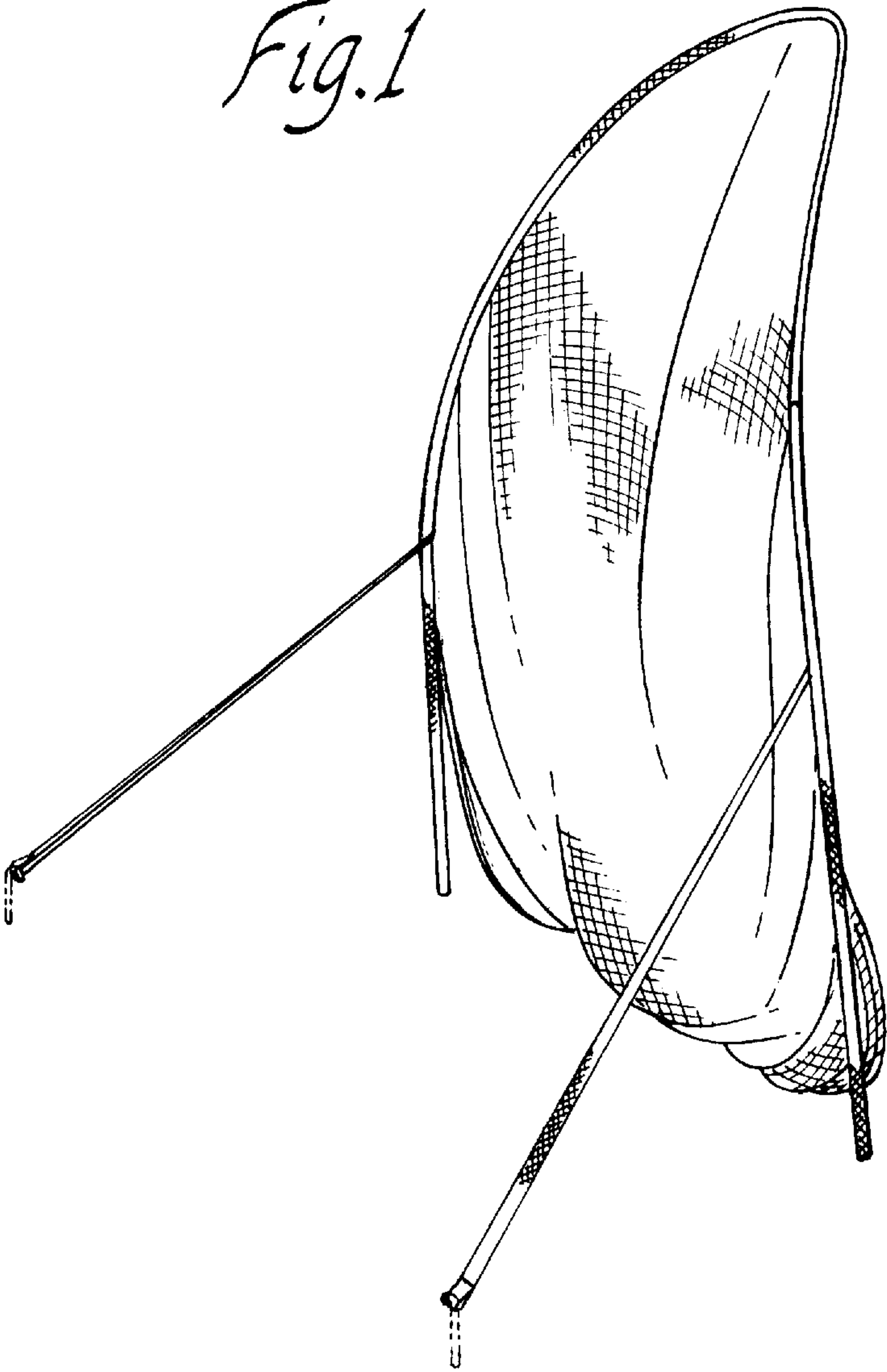

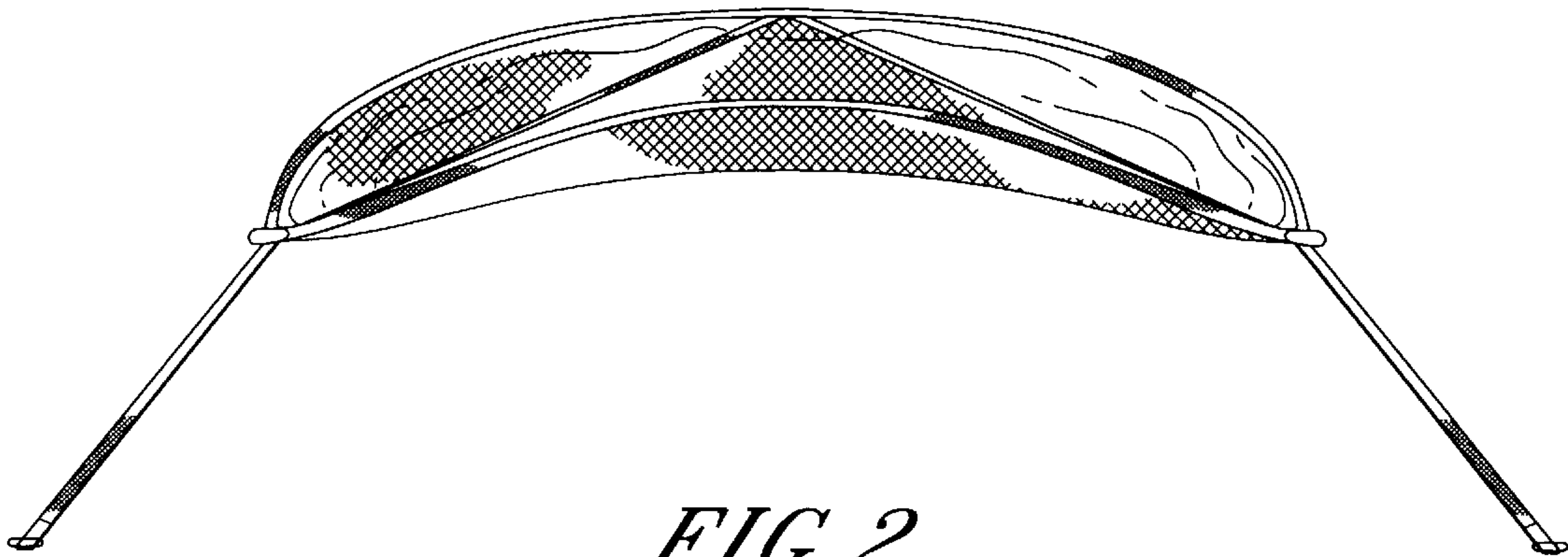

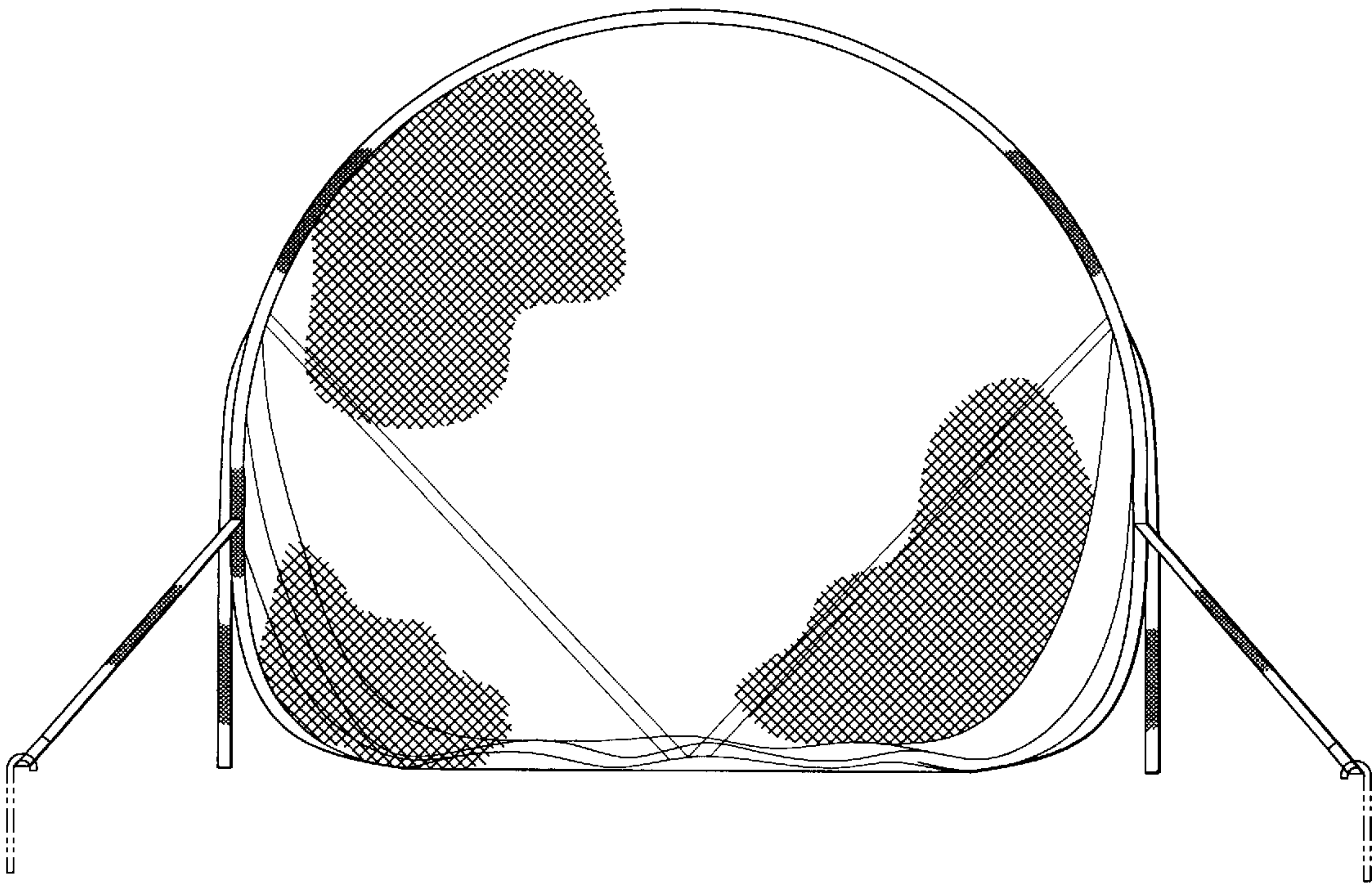

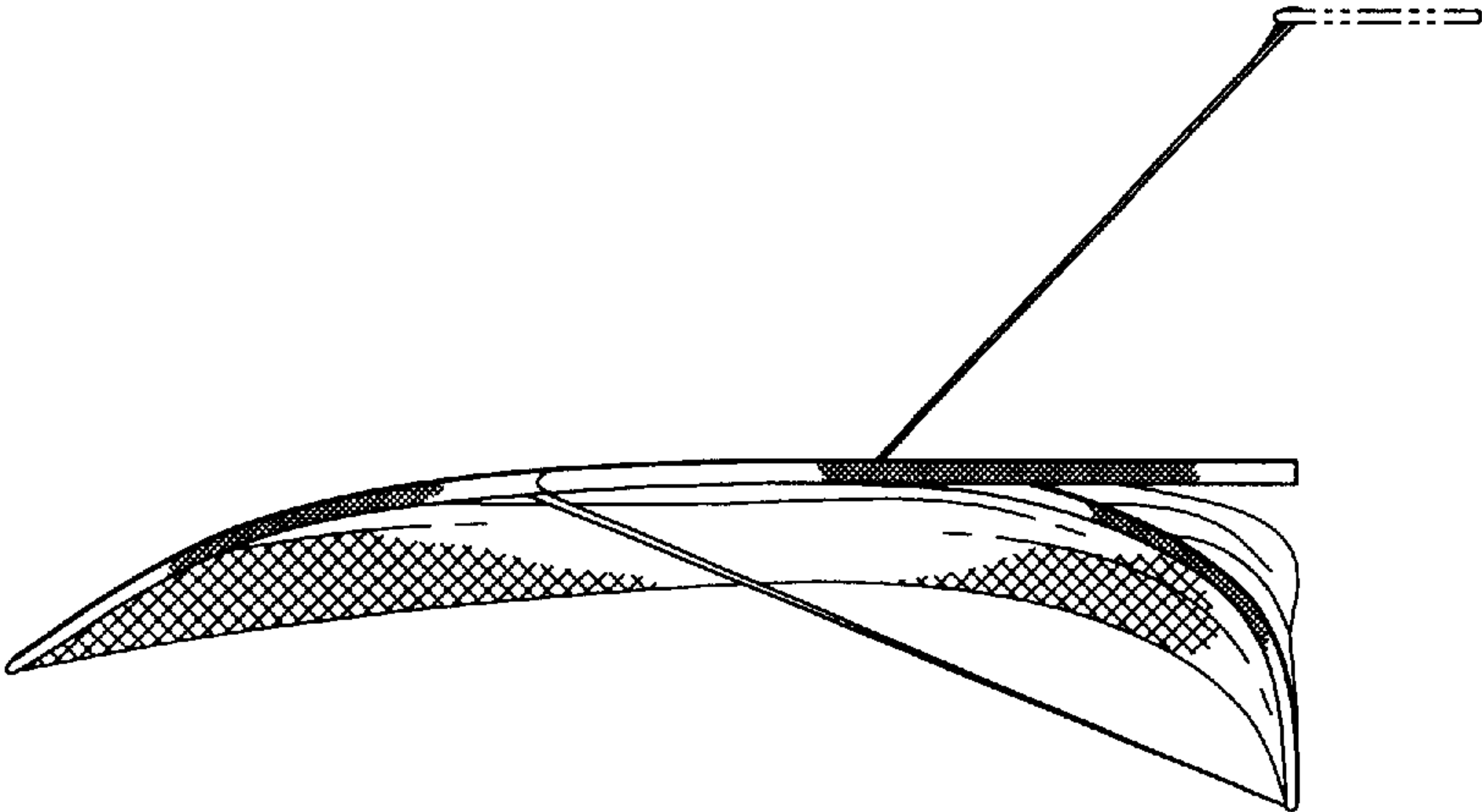
