DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a beach chair showing my new design;

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof;

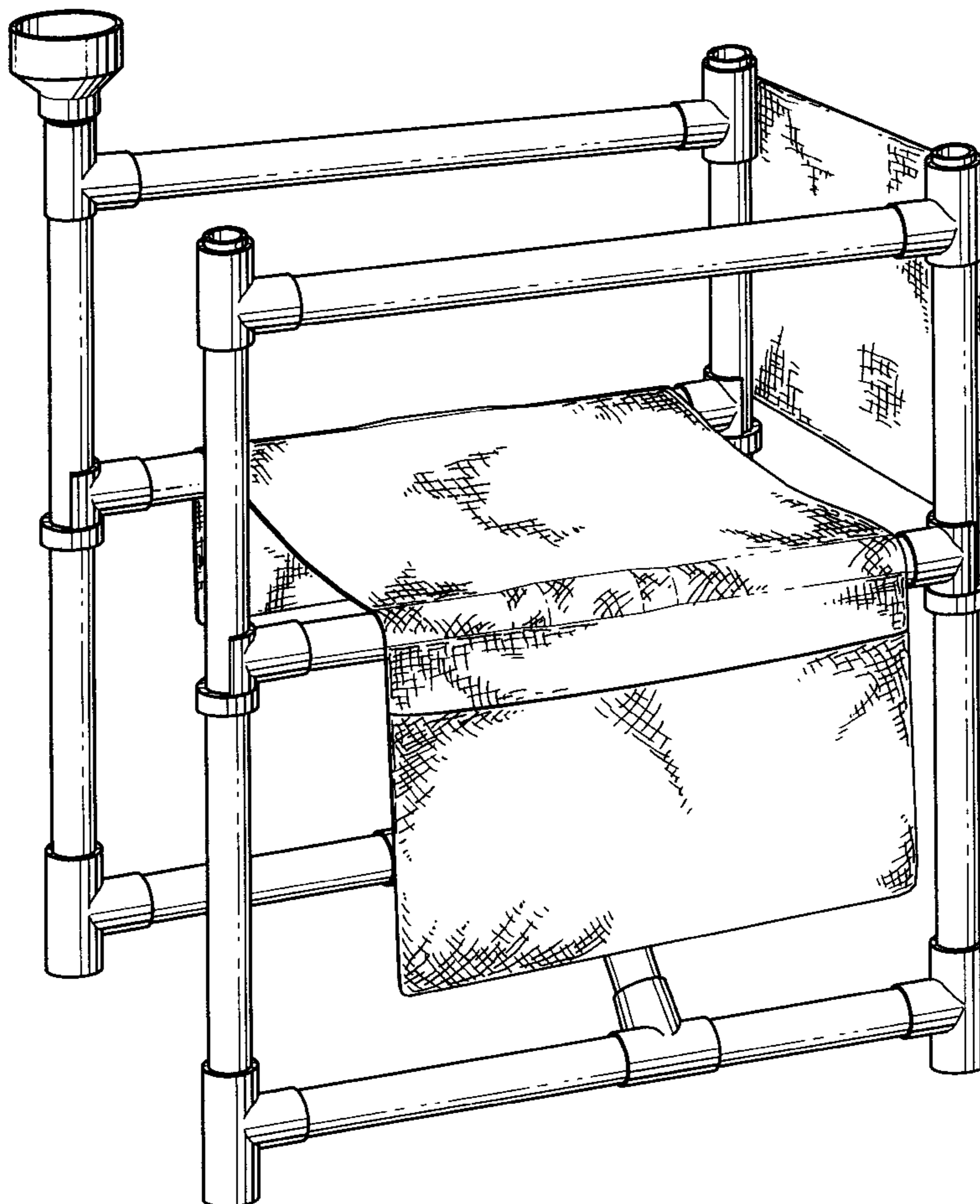
FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof;

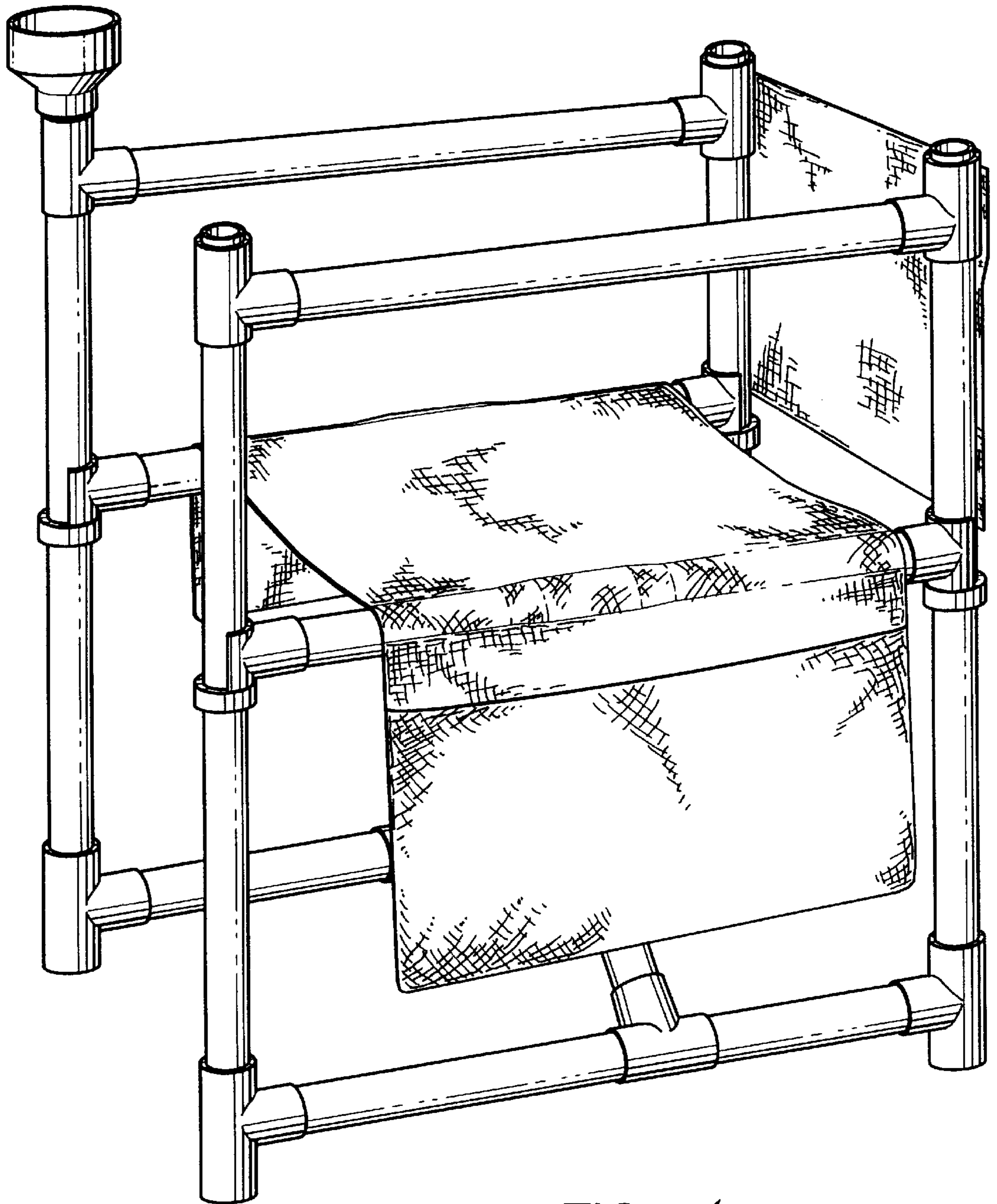

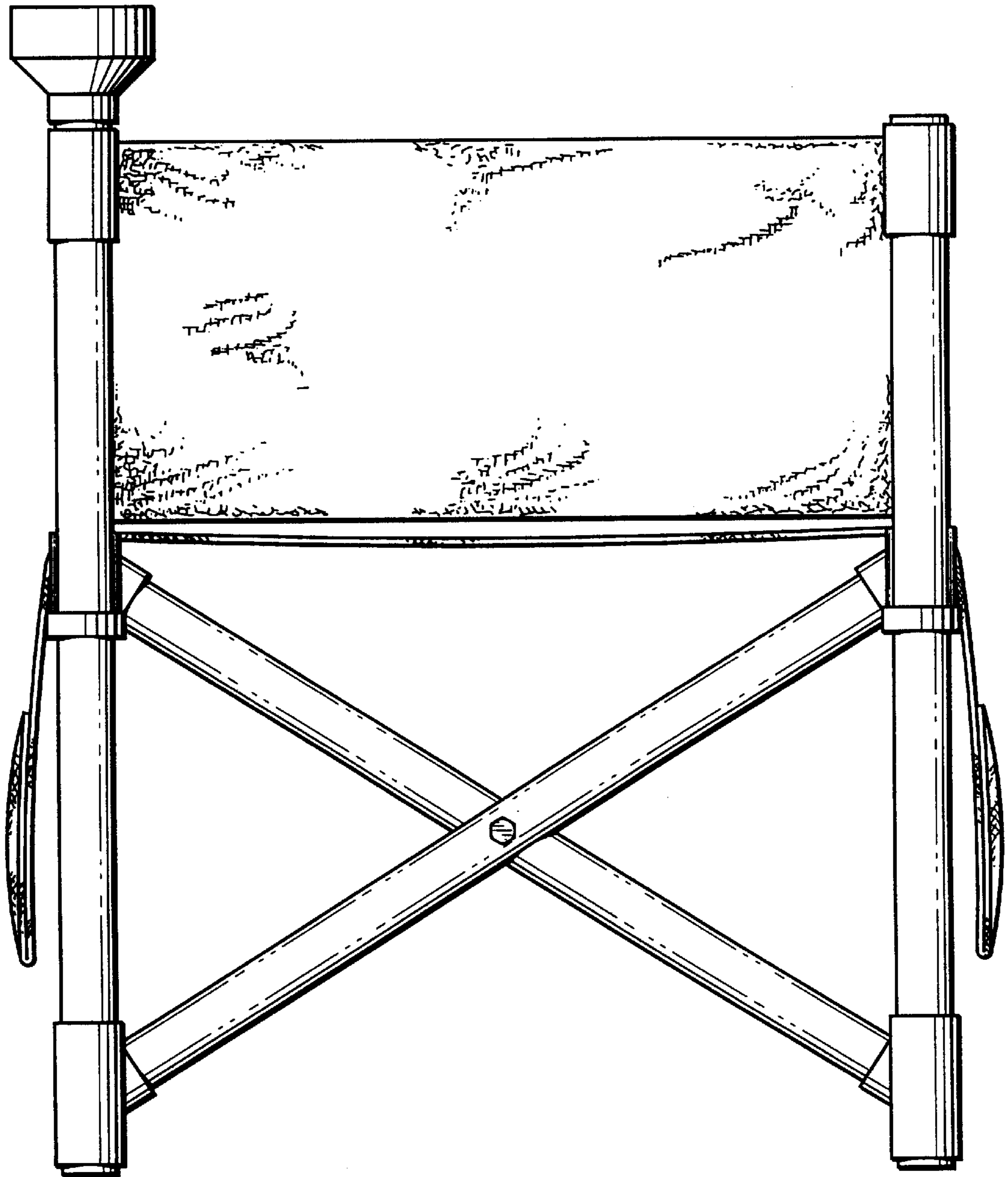

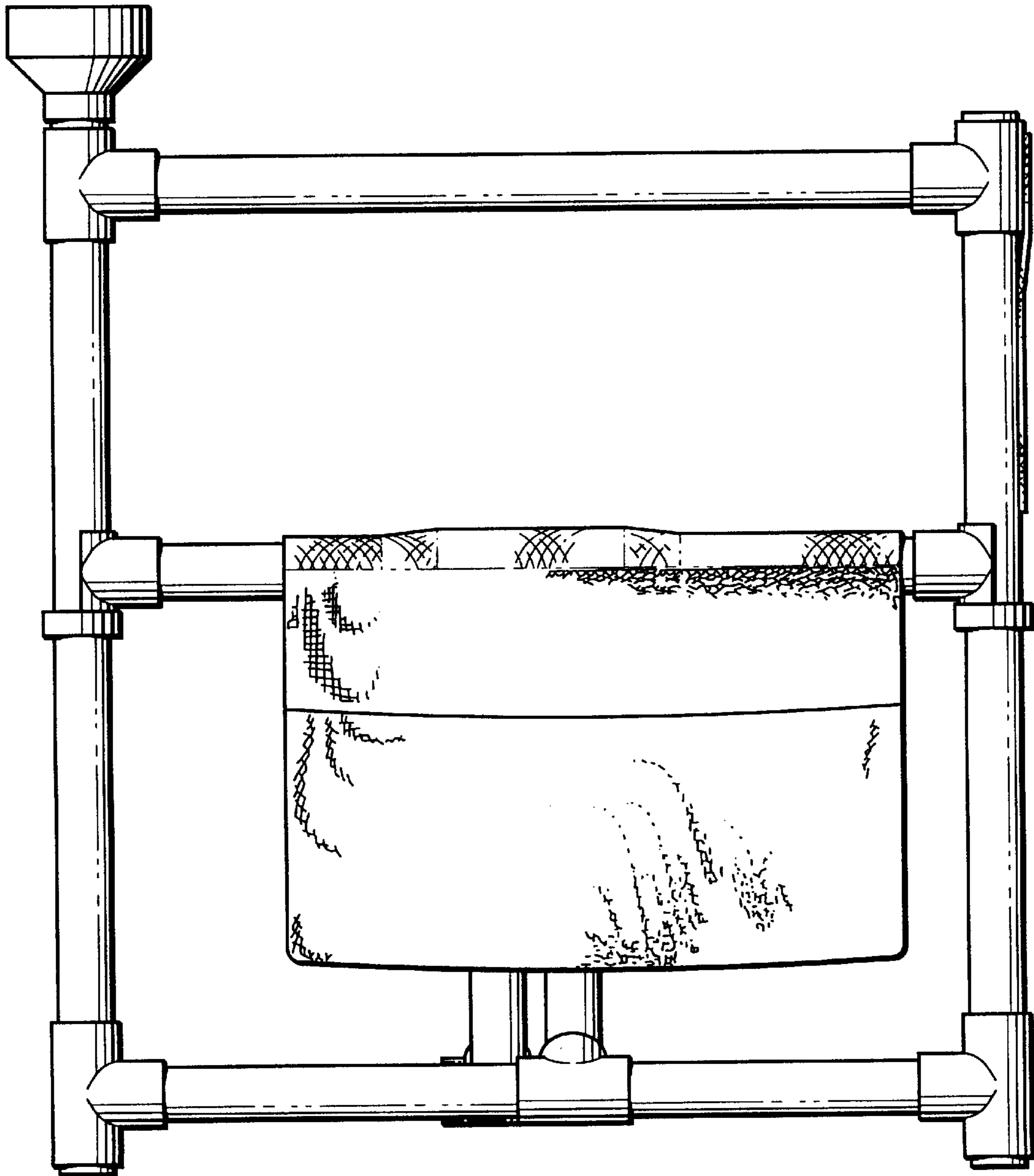

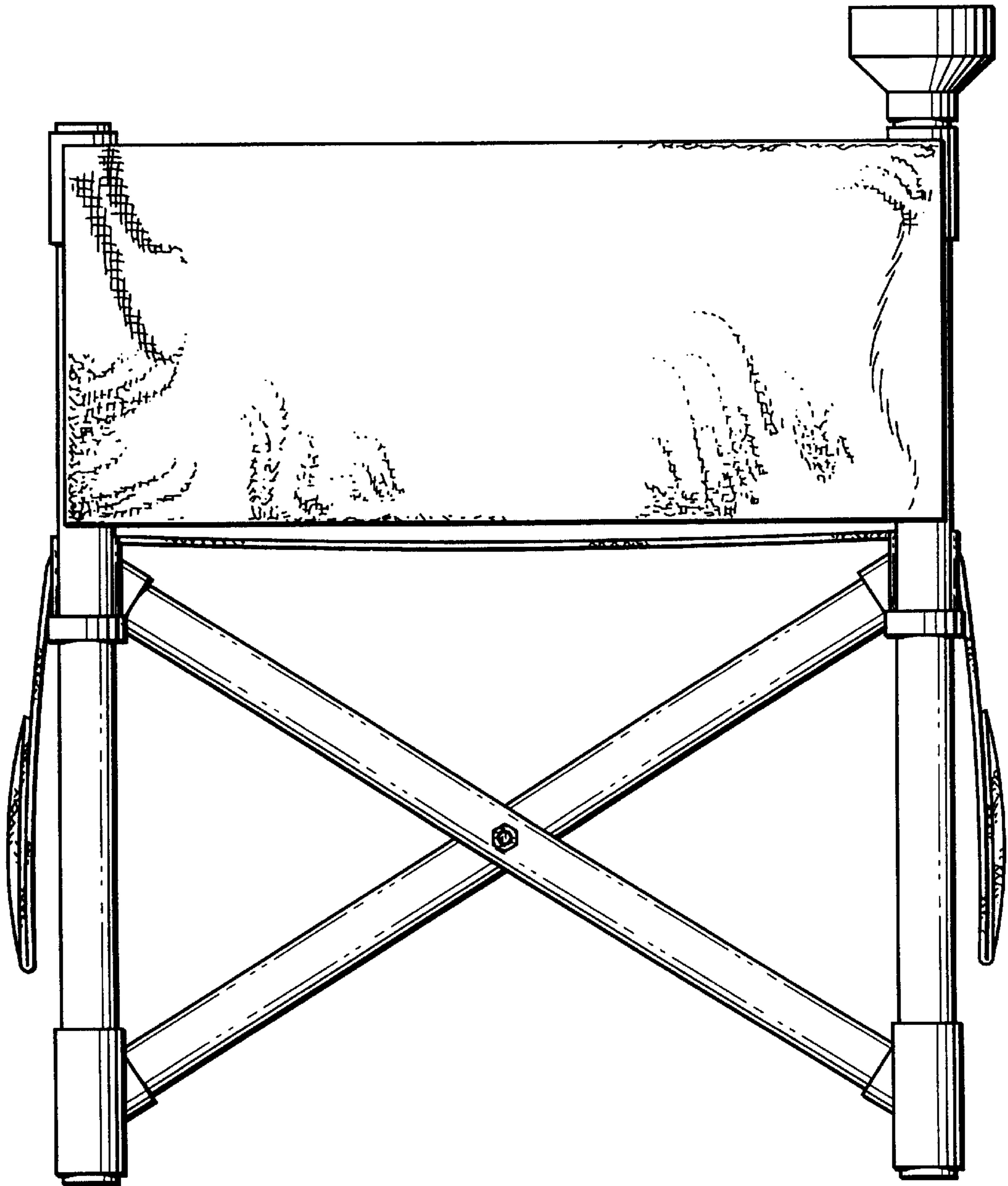

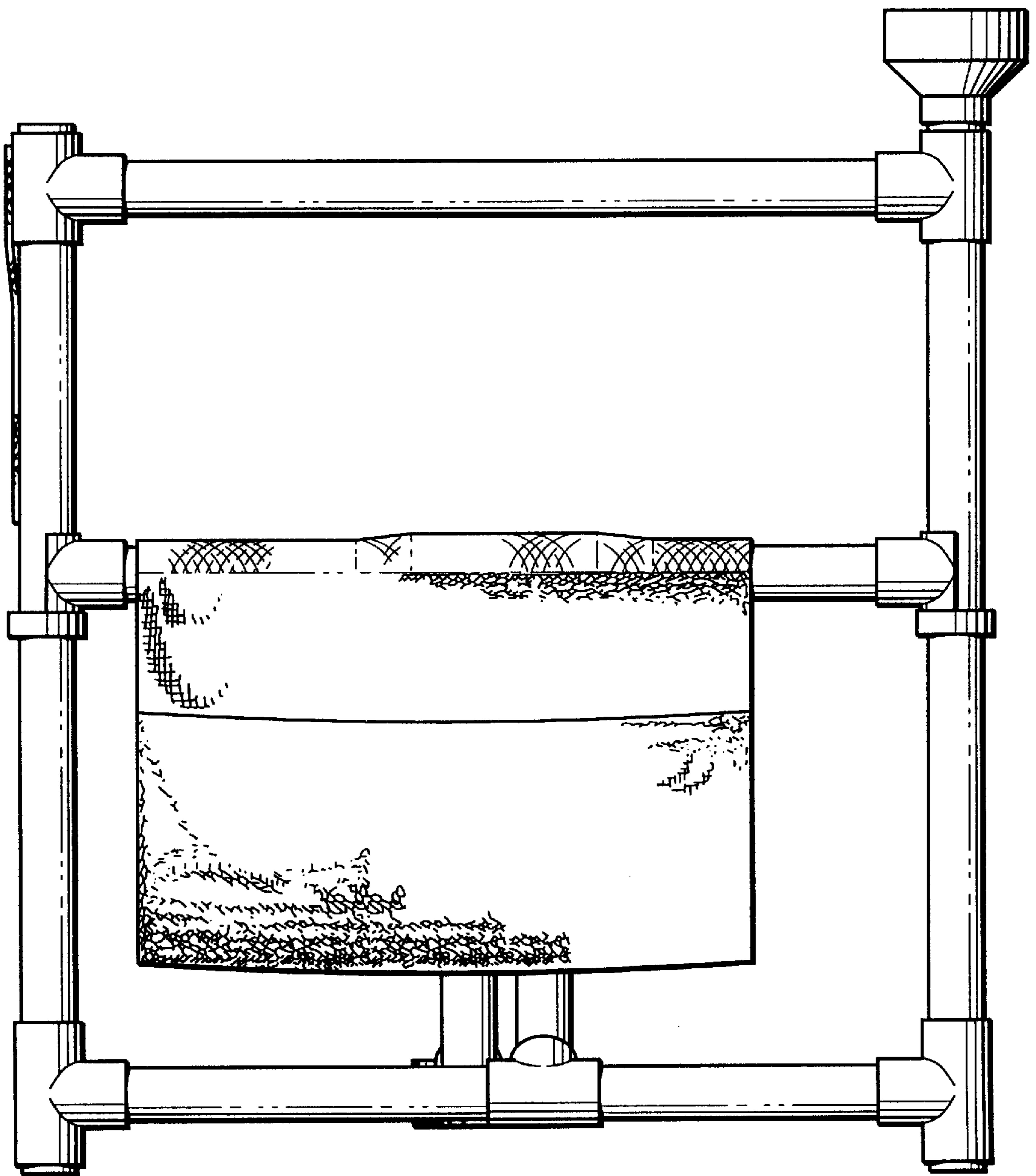

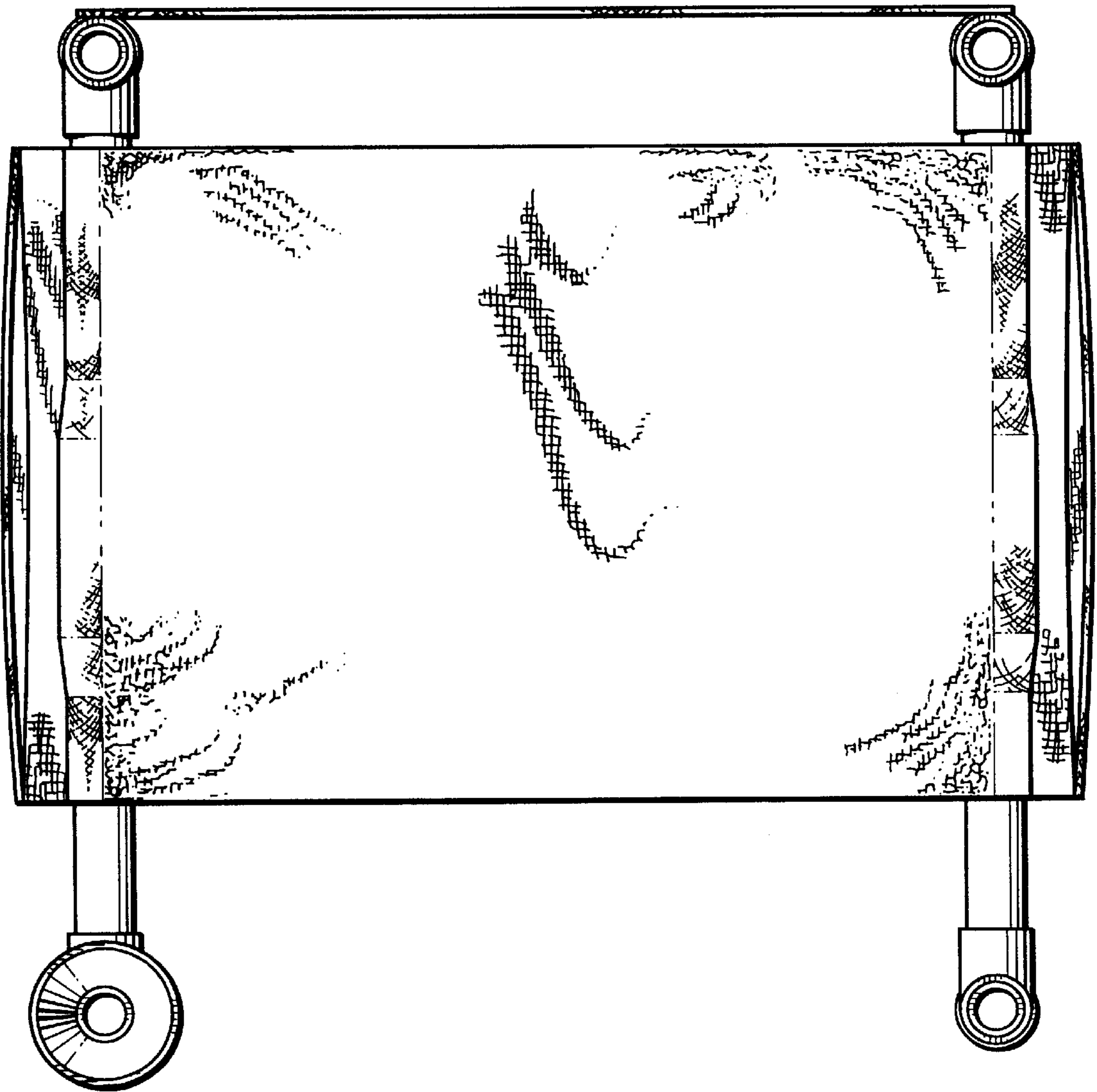
