FIG. 10 is a front view of a seond embodiment of a perfume bottle according to the invention;


FIG. 11 is an overhead view of a second embodiment of a perfume bottle according to the invention; and,

FIG. 12 is an underside view of a second embodiment of a perfume bottle according to the invention.


The broken line showing of a bottle neck and bottle base in FIGS. 1–12 represent environmental structure and form no part of the claimed design.

The broken lines defining the peripheral boundary of the second embodiment of the claimed design (FIGS. 7–14 12) form no part thereof.












