The ornamental design for a multi-sided traction stud, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 front elevational view of a preferred embodiment of a multi-sided traction stud illustrating our new design of the present invention, it being understood that the back side and the left side and right side as viewed in FIG. 1 are mirror images thereof;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a side elevational view thereof, taken along the line 3—3 of FIG. 2;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof;

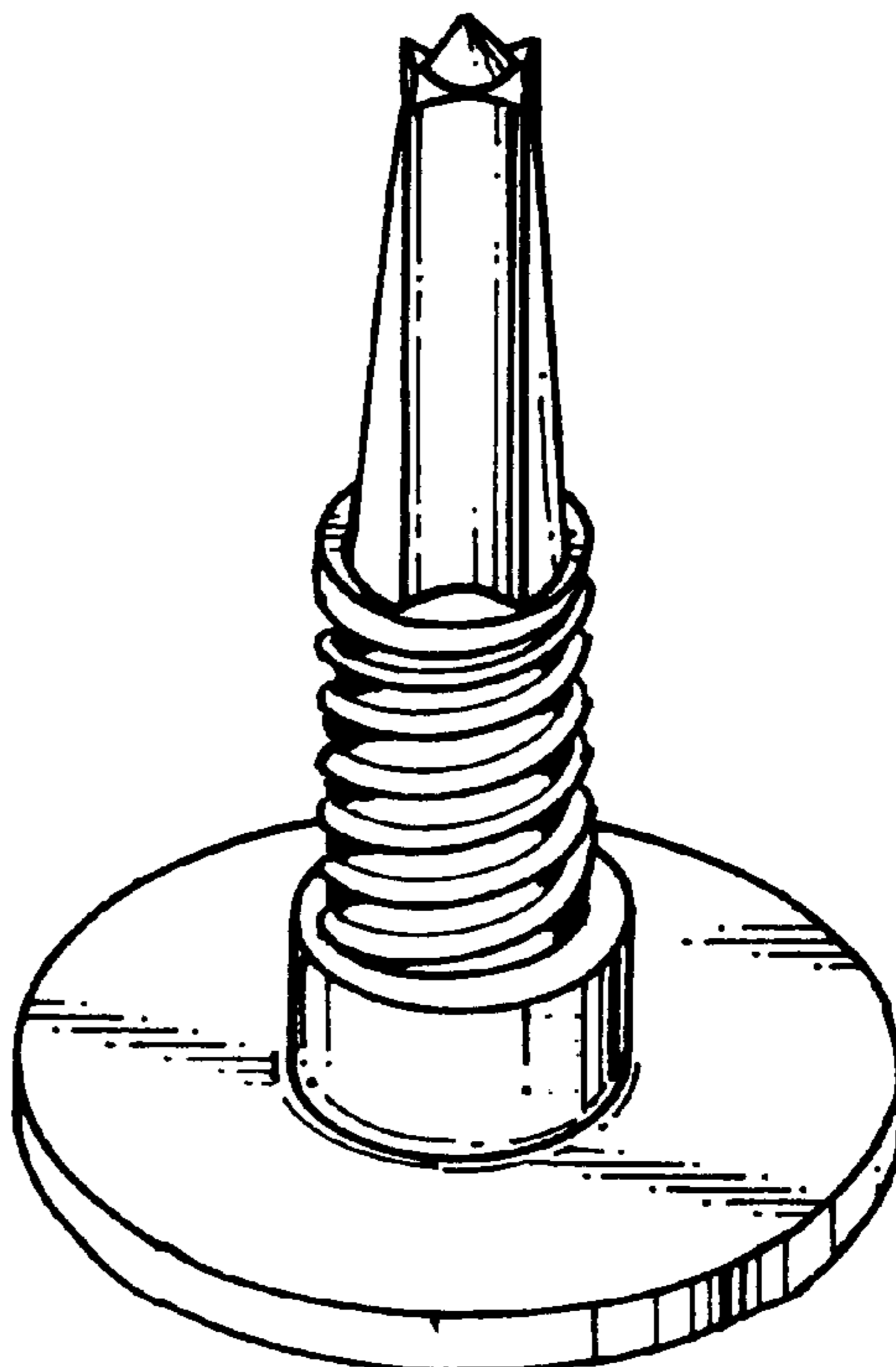
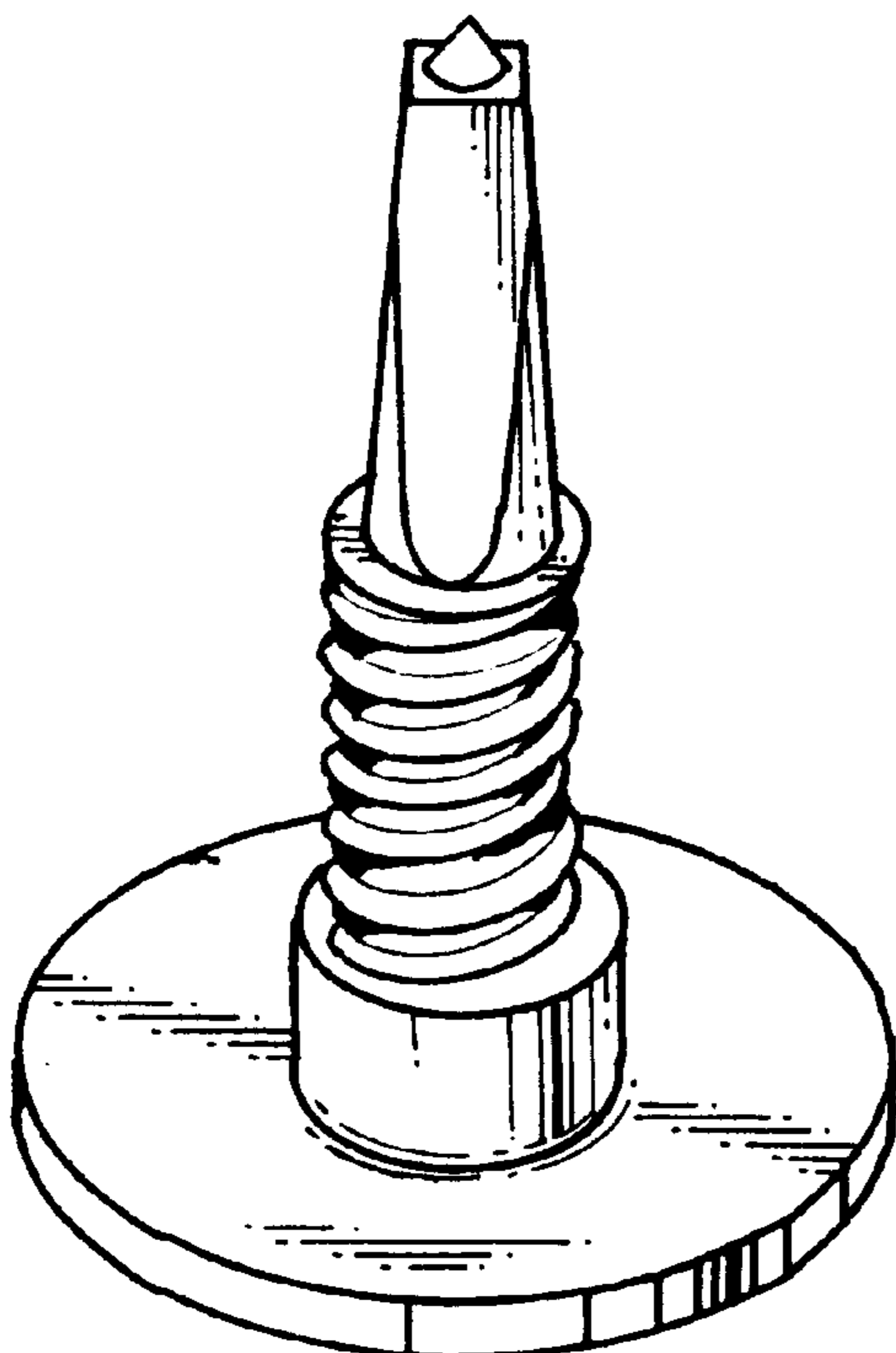
FIG. 5 is a perspective view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view similar to FIG. 1 of a slightly modified multi-sided traction stud illustrating a slightly modified design, it being understood that the back side and right and left sides, as viewed in FIG. 6 are mirror images of the design illustrated in FIG. 6;

FIG. 7 is a top plan view of the multi-sided traction stud illustrated in FIG. 6; and,

FIG. 8 is a front perspective view of the embodiment illustrated in FIGS. 6 and 7.

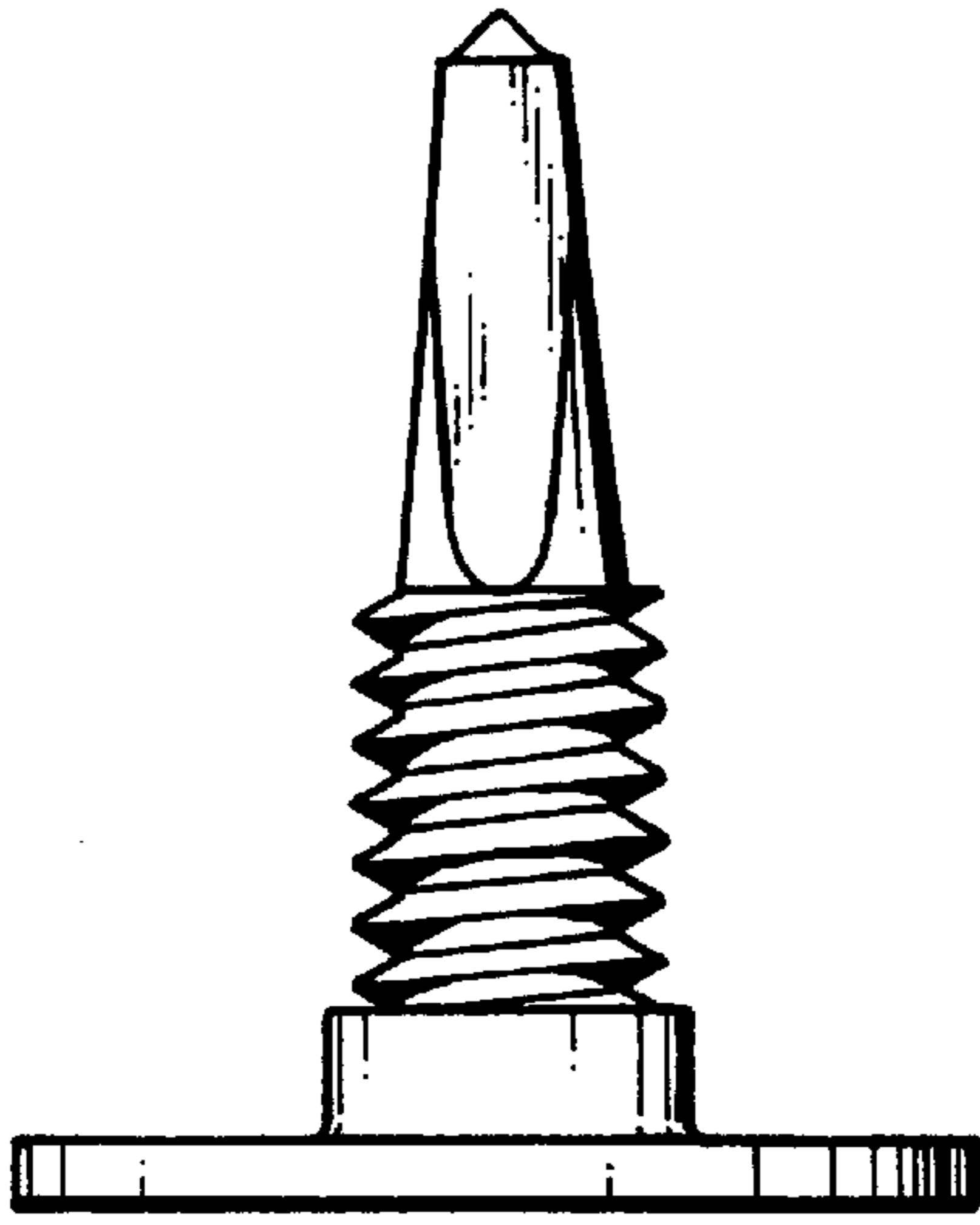

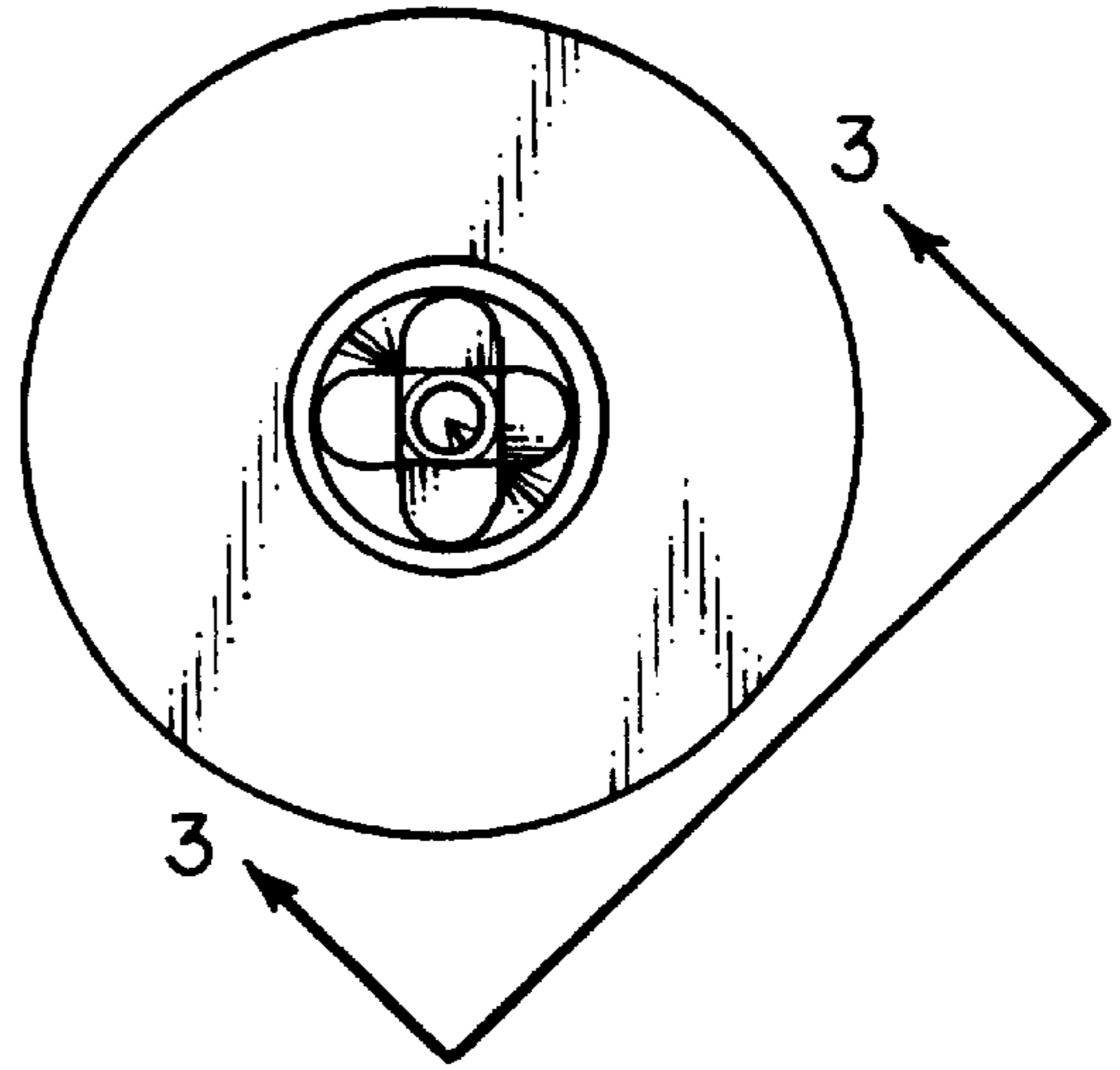

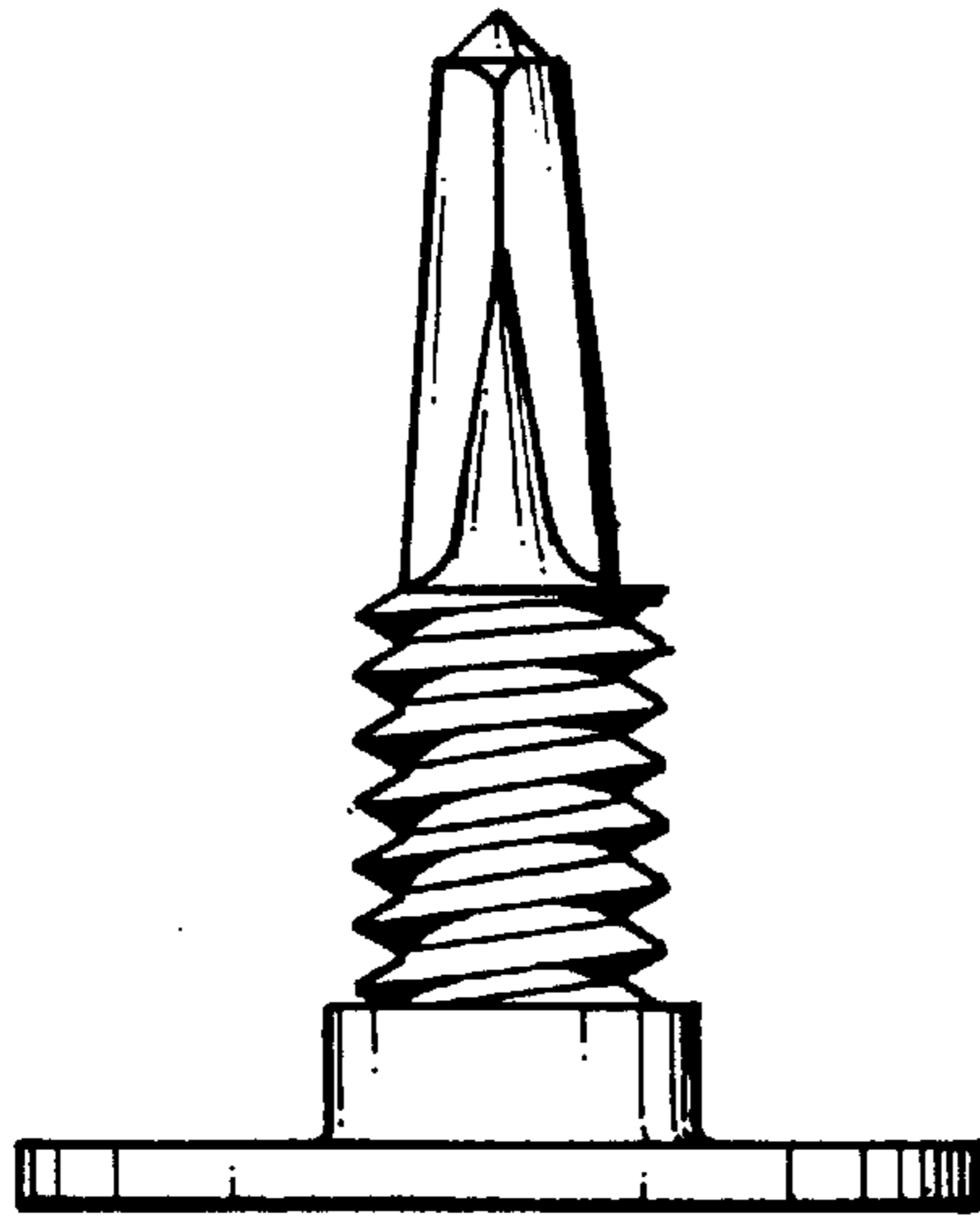

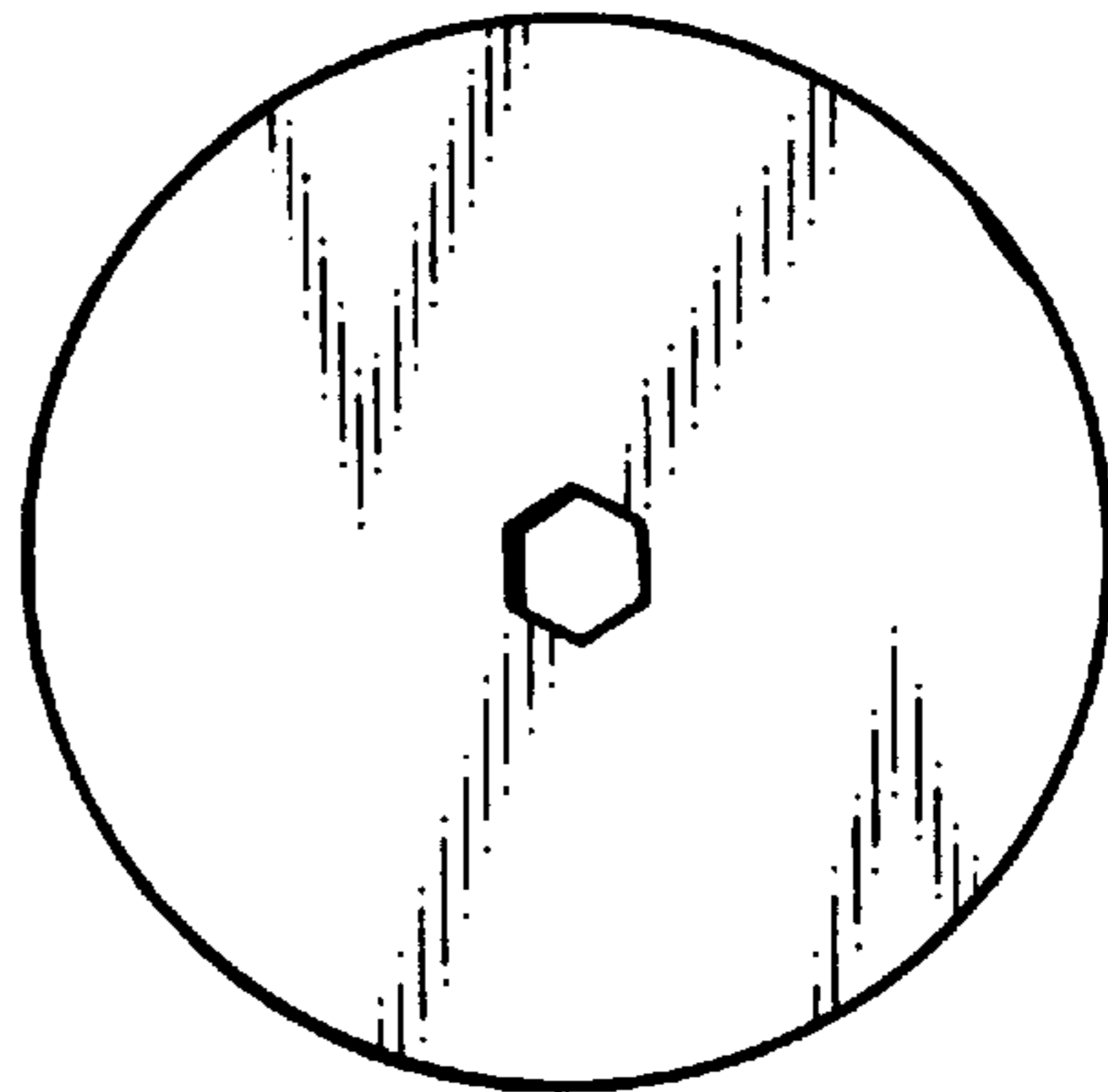

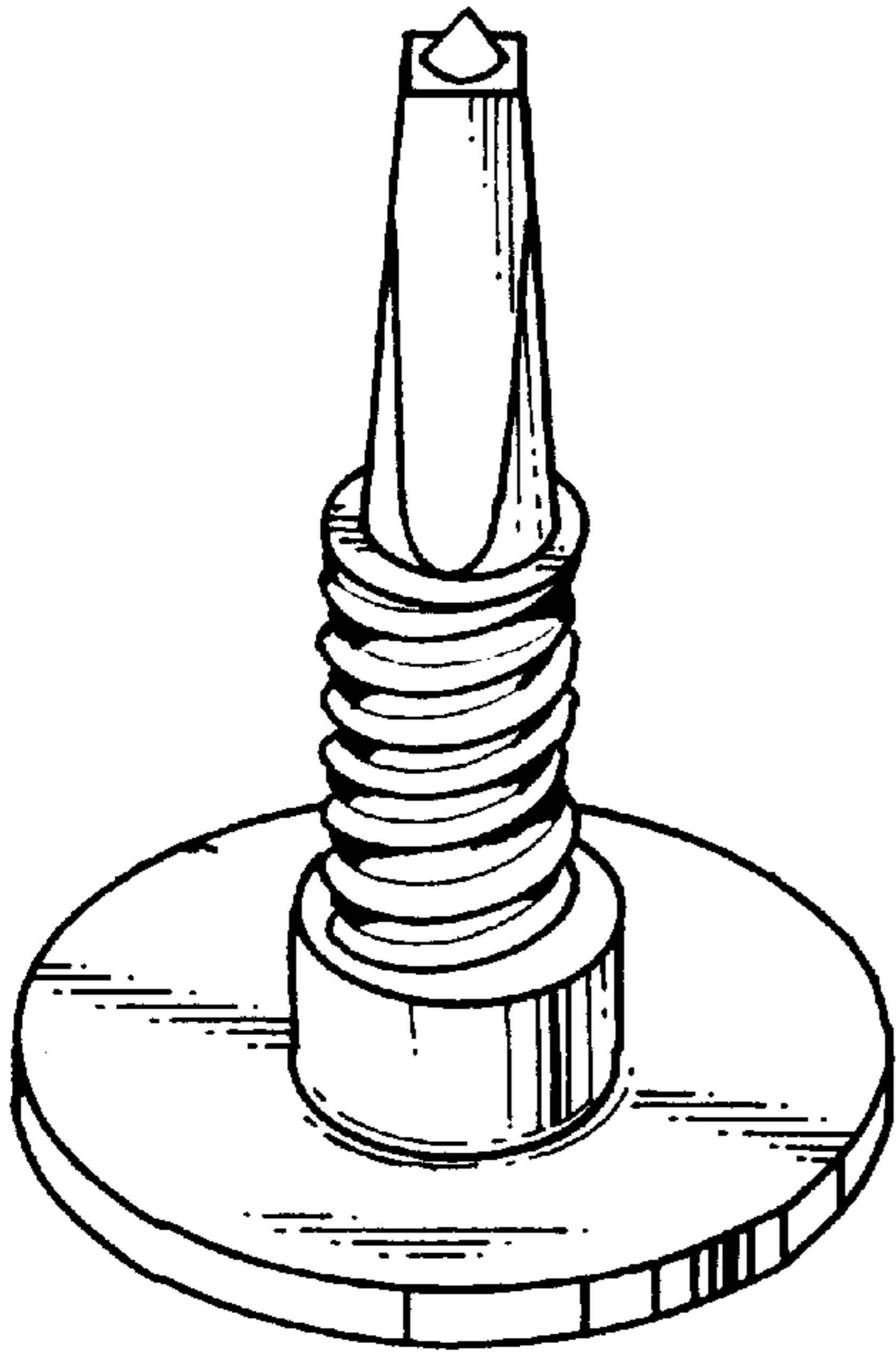

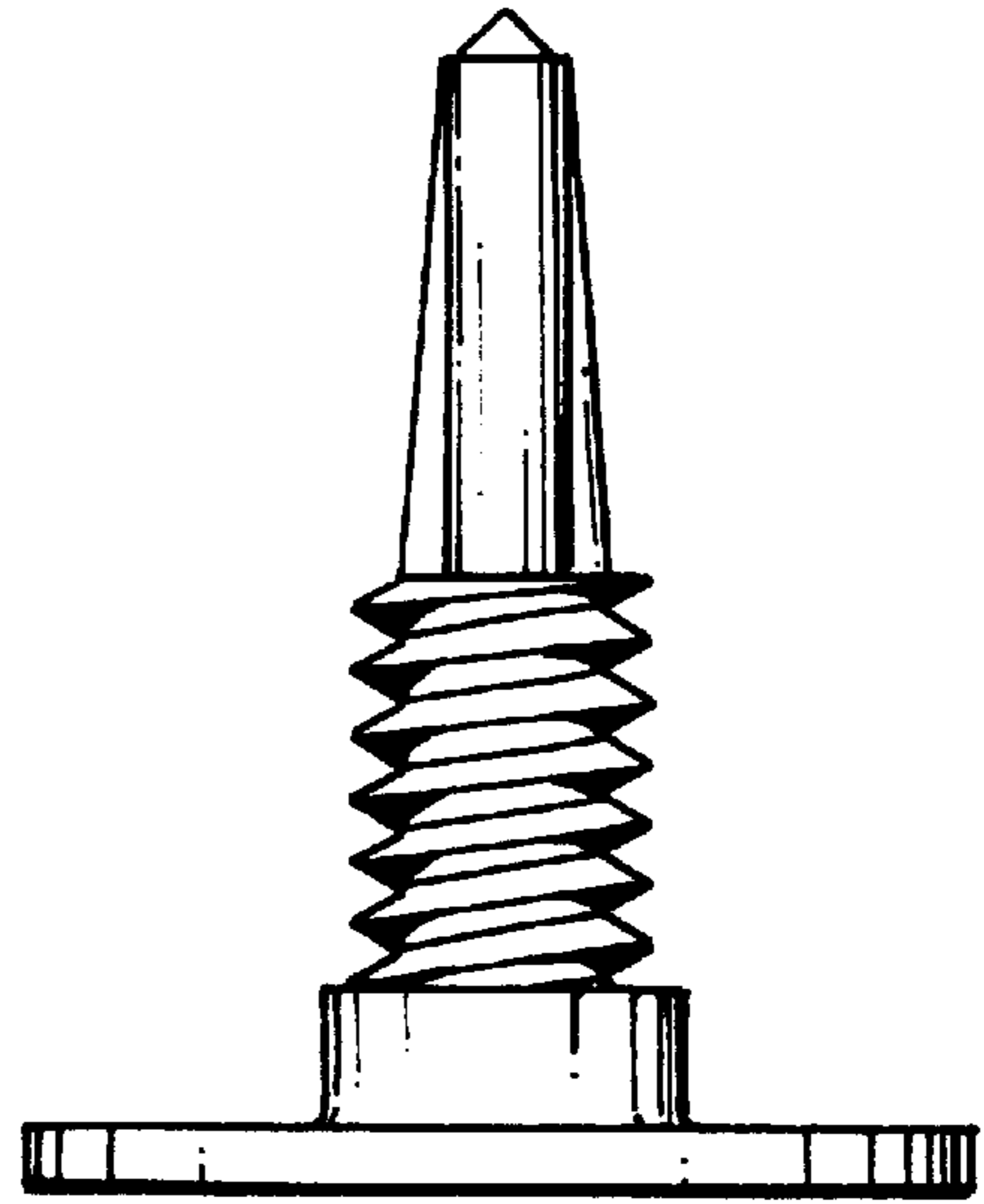

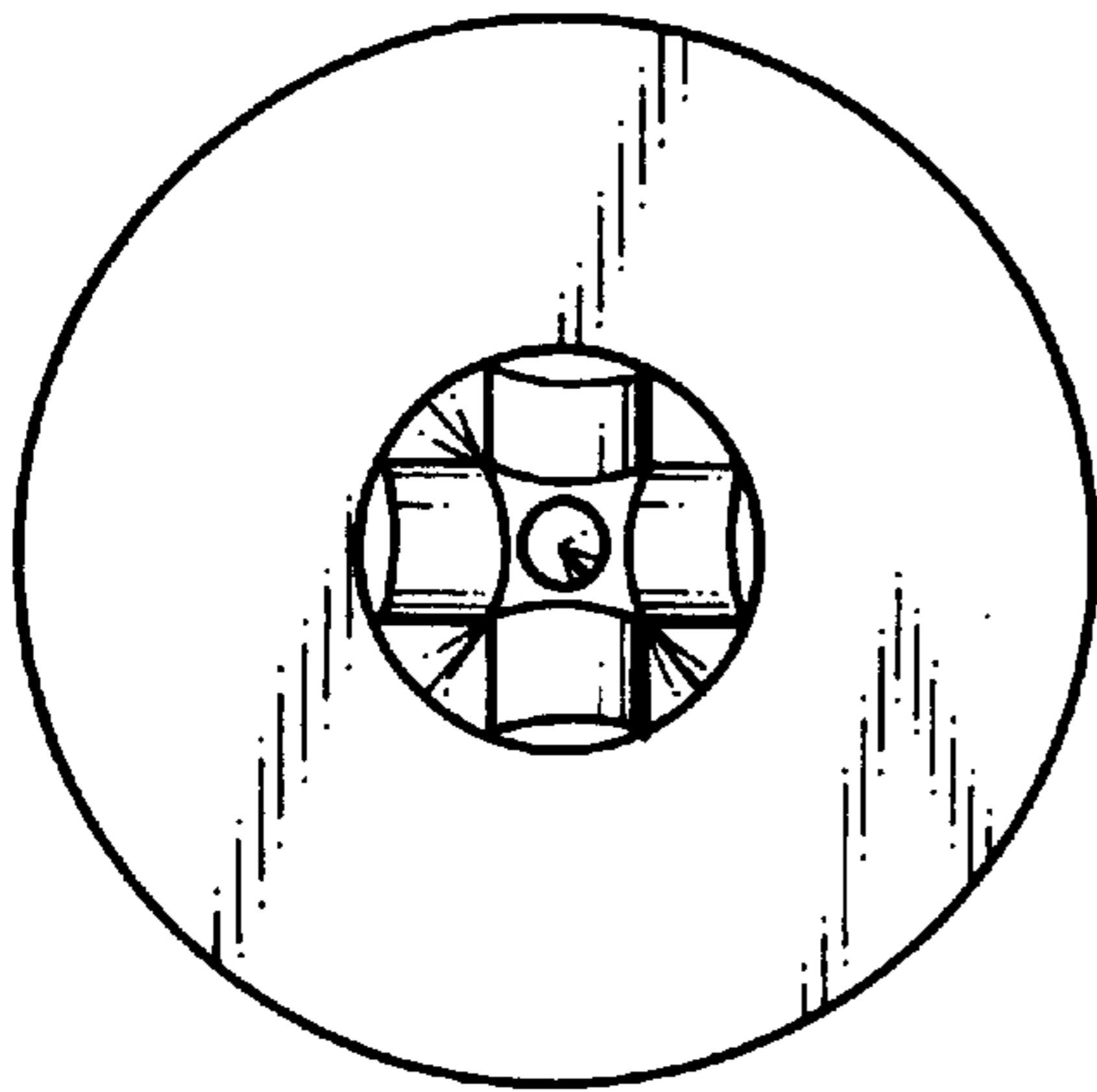

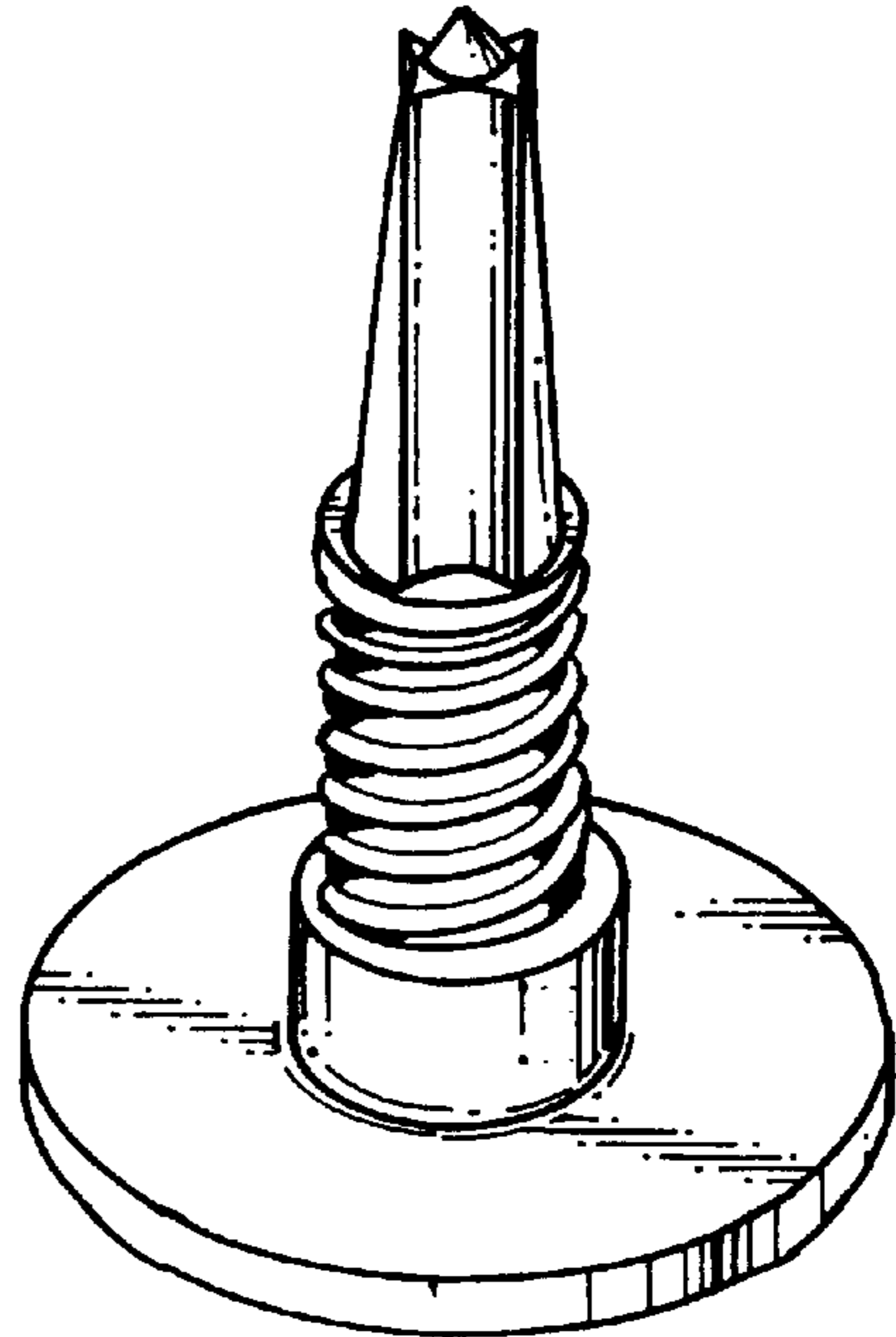
