[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a point-of-purchase coupon dispenser, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view as seen from the top, front and left side of a point-of-purchase coupopn dispenser showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a top plan view thereof; and,

FIG. 8 is a perspective view as seen from the top, front, and left side of the point-of-purchase coupon dispenser of FIGS. 1 through 7 with the cover strip removed.

The broken lines in FIGS. 1 through 5, and 8 representing pull tabs, and the broken lines in FIG. 8 representing a coupon being removed from the dispenser, are used for illustrative purposes only and form no part of the claimed design. The broken lines on the front face of the point-of-purchase coupon dispenser shown in FIGS. 1 and 4 shows perforations.
