The ornamental cough pillow, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION


FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of the cough pillow of the present invention.

FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view of the drawing of FIG. 1 the text of FIG. 1 being removed for clarity purposes, and the left side of the cough pillow being substantially a mirror image of the right side;

FIG. 3 is an bottom plan view of the cough pillow of FIG. 1 the text of FIG. 1 being removed for clarity purposes, and the top of the cough pillow being substantially a mirror image of the bottom; and,

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view of the drawing of FIG. 1.



Deep Breathing Exercise Hold your coughing pillow firmly against your incision, then do the following: Take a deep breath in through your nose, and exhale slowly through your mouth puckering your lips as if blowing out a candle. Take a second deep breath in through your nose as deeply as you can, exhale slowly through your mouth, again puckering your lips as you exhale completely. On your third deep breath, breathe in slowly as deeply as you can. Deep...deep...deep Hold that breath and cough!


