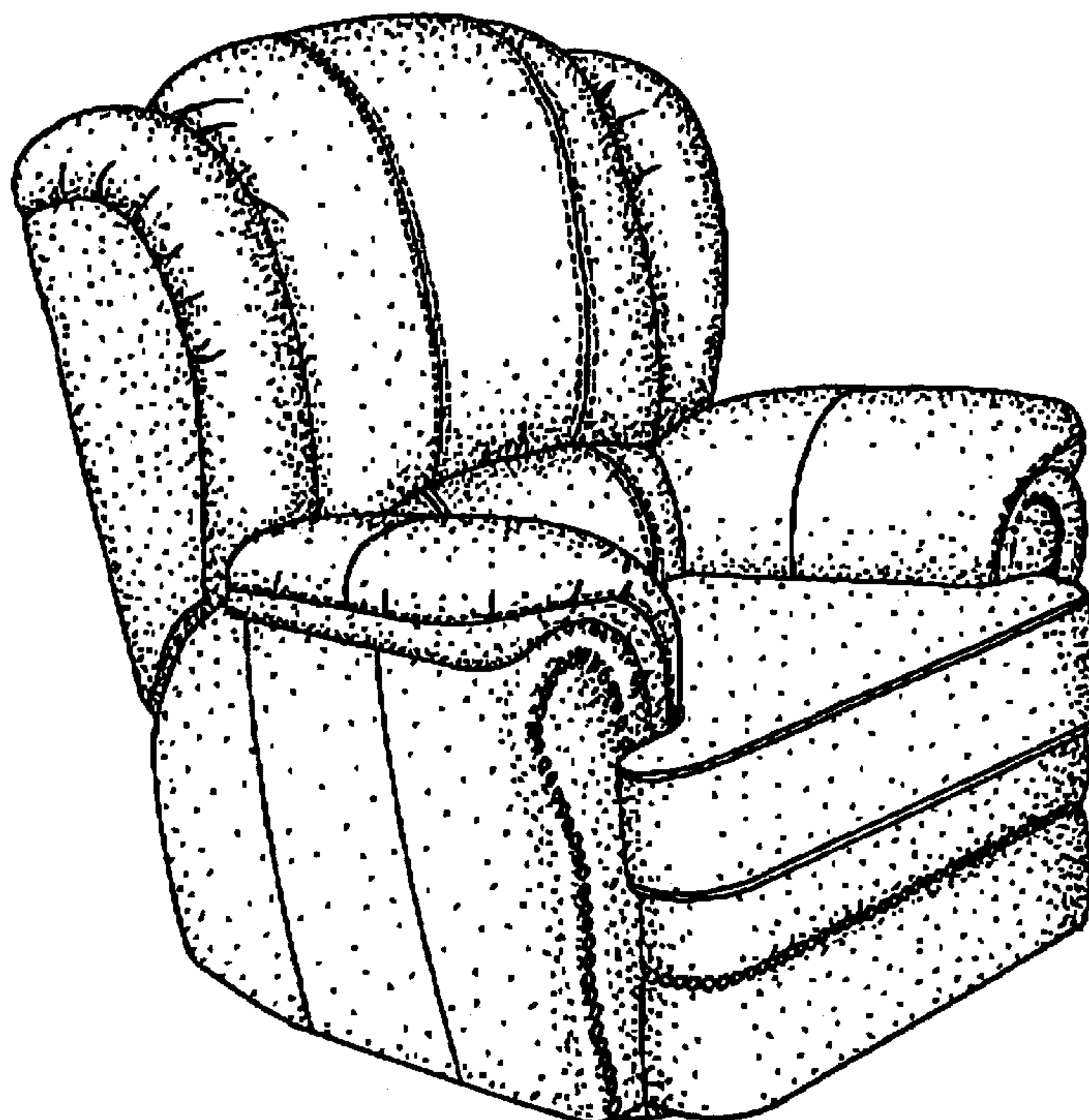
The ornamental design for seating furniture, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

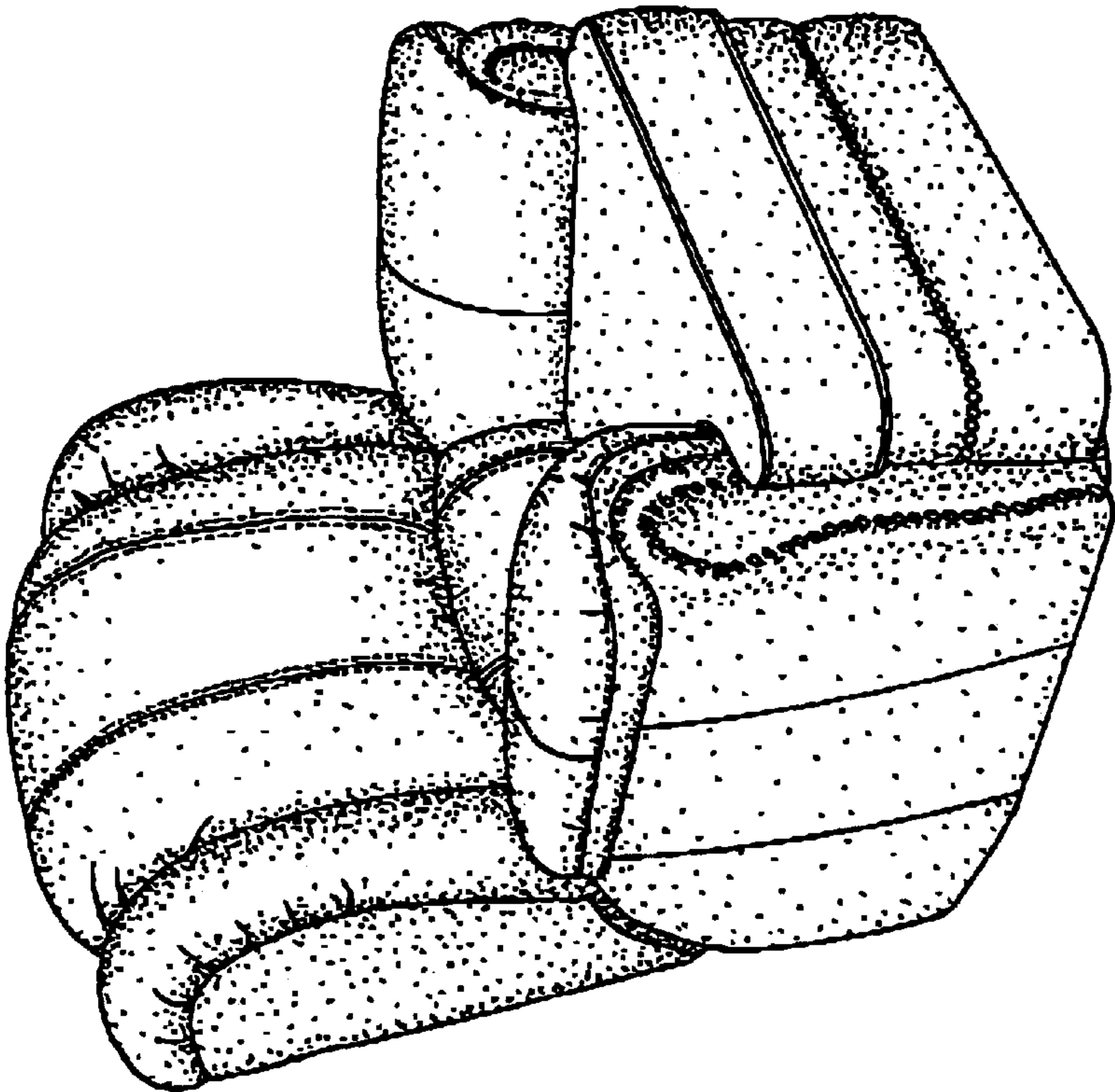

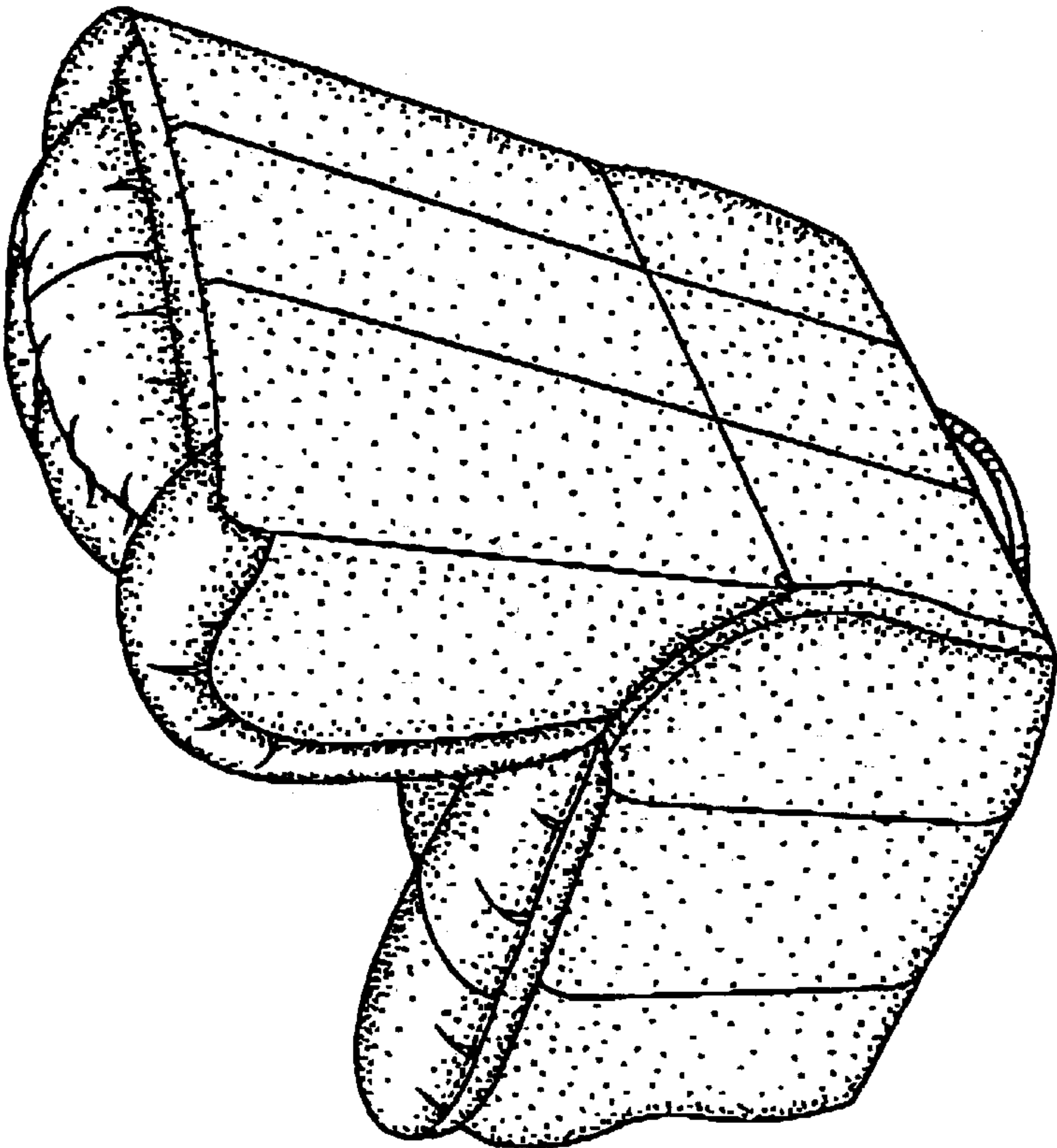

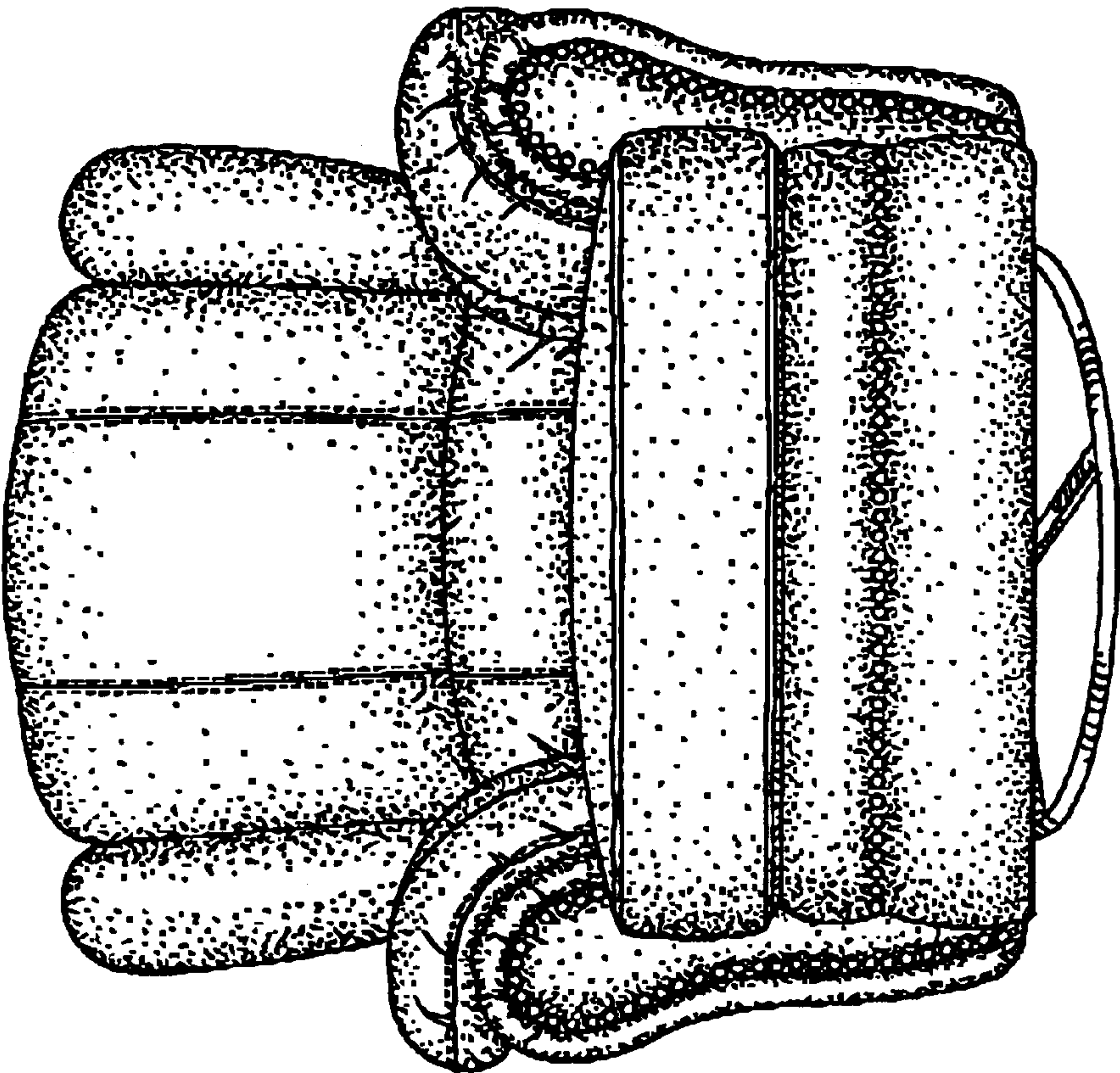

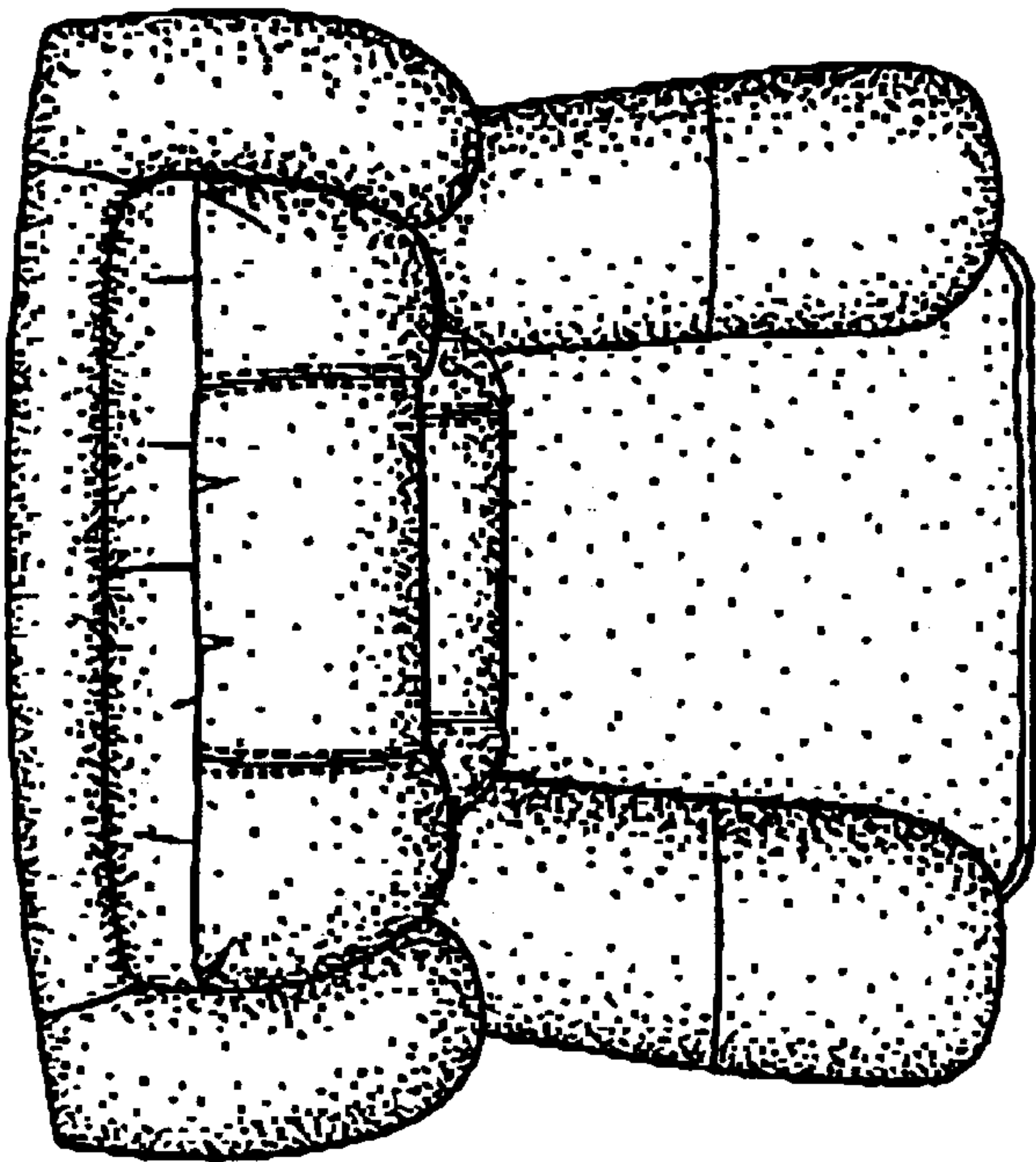

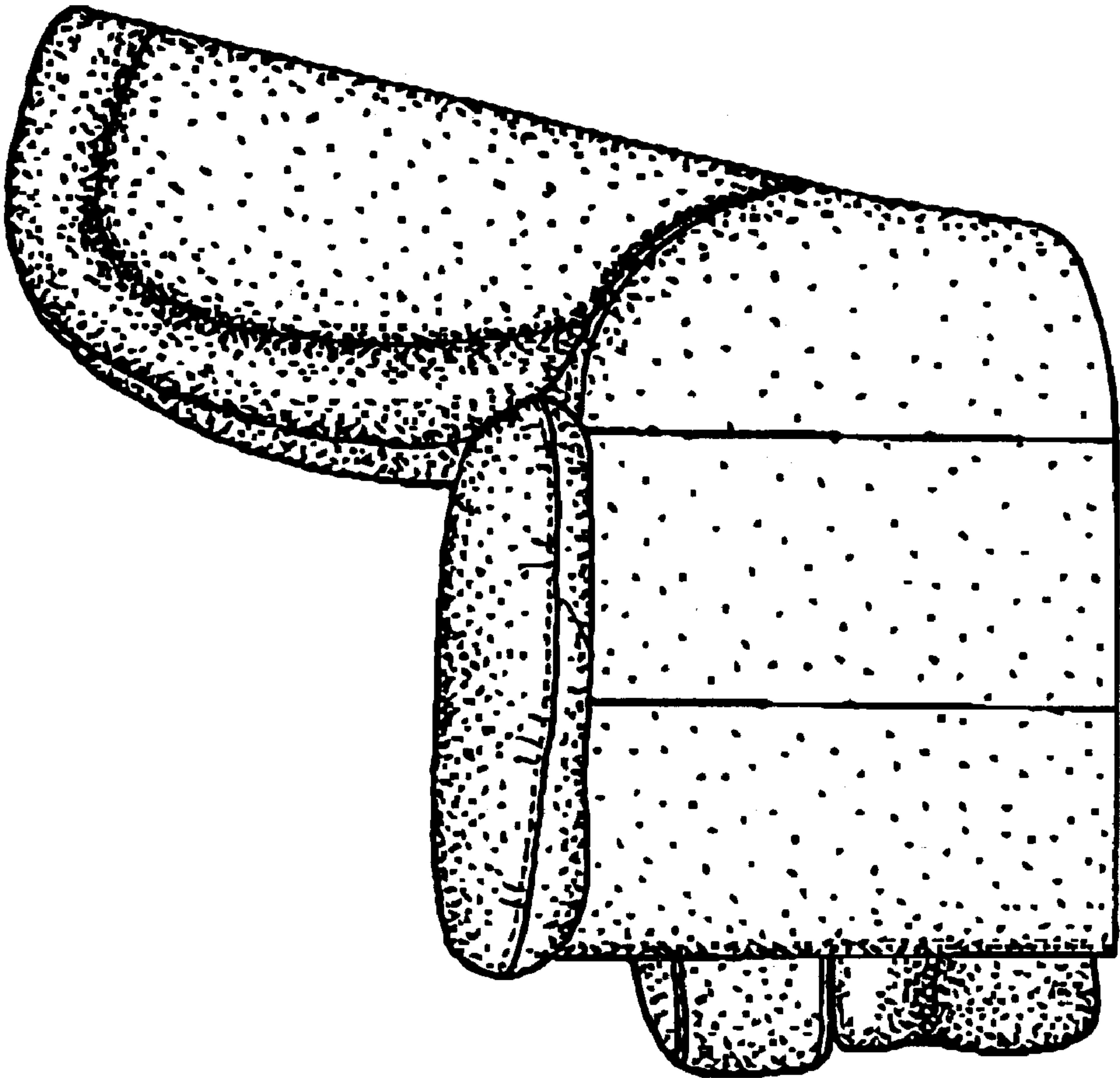

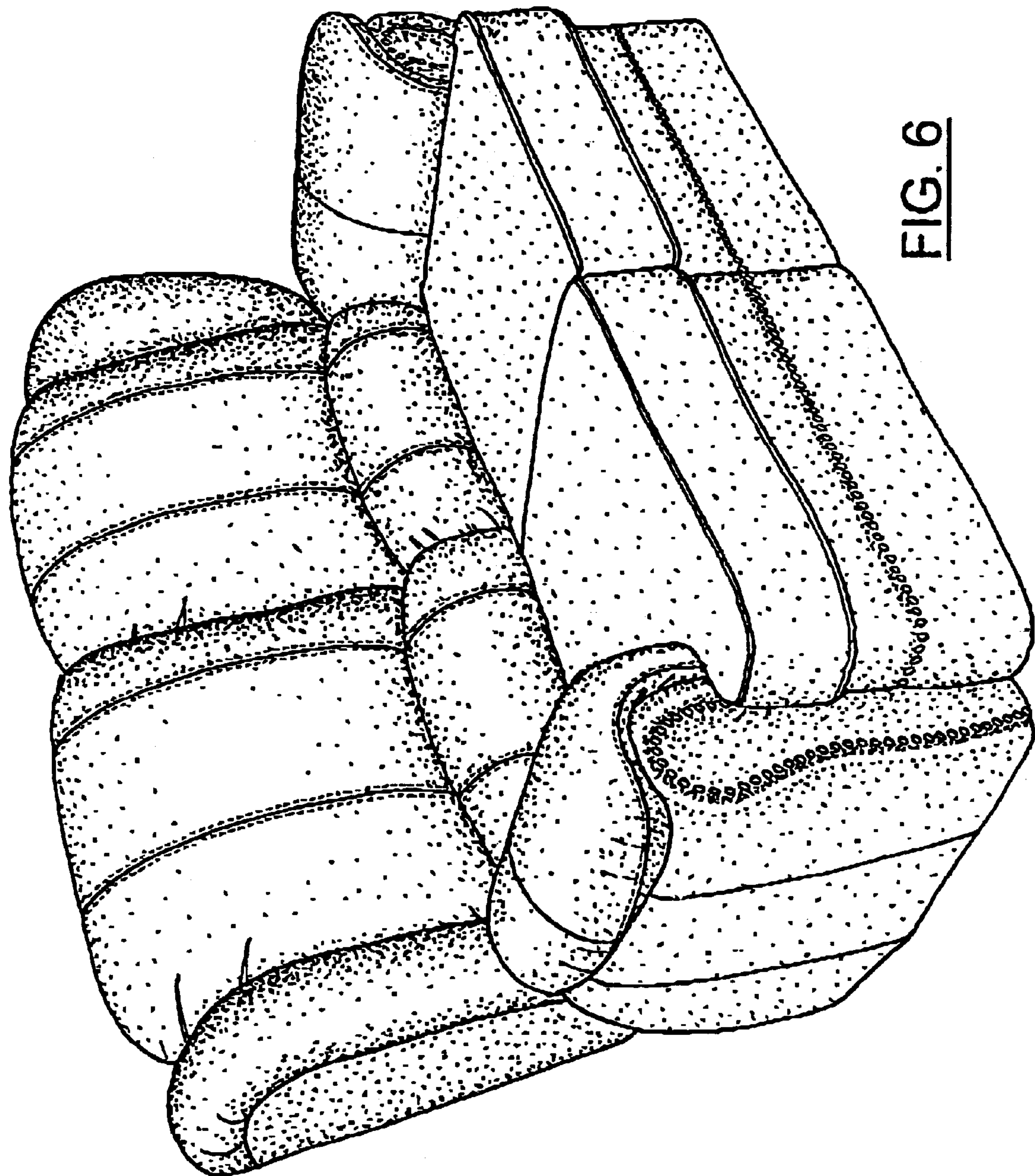

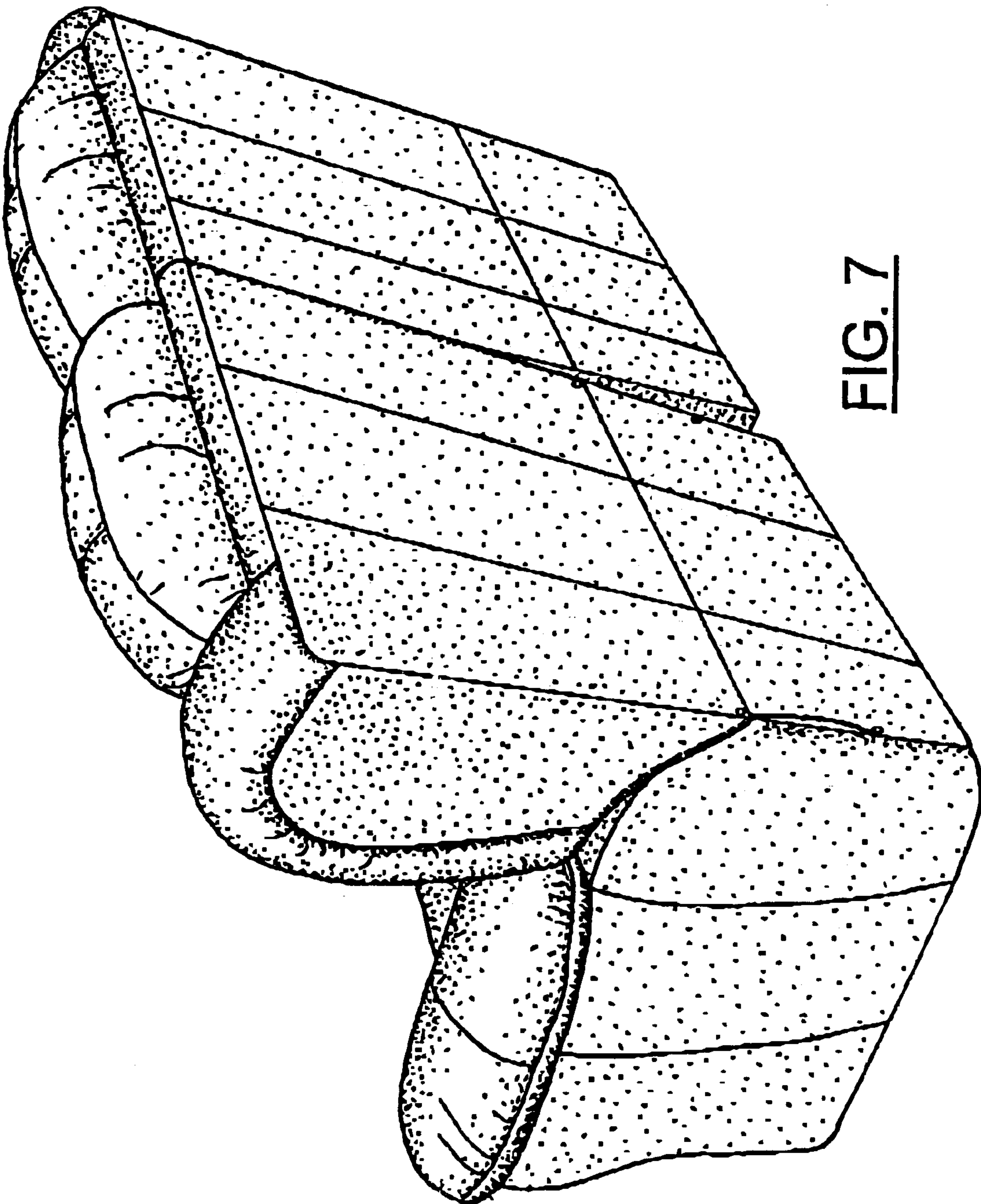

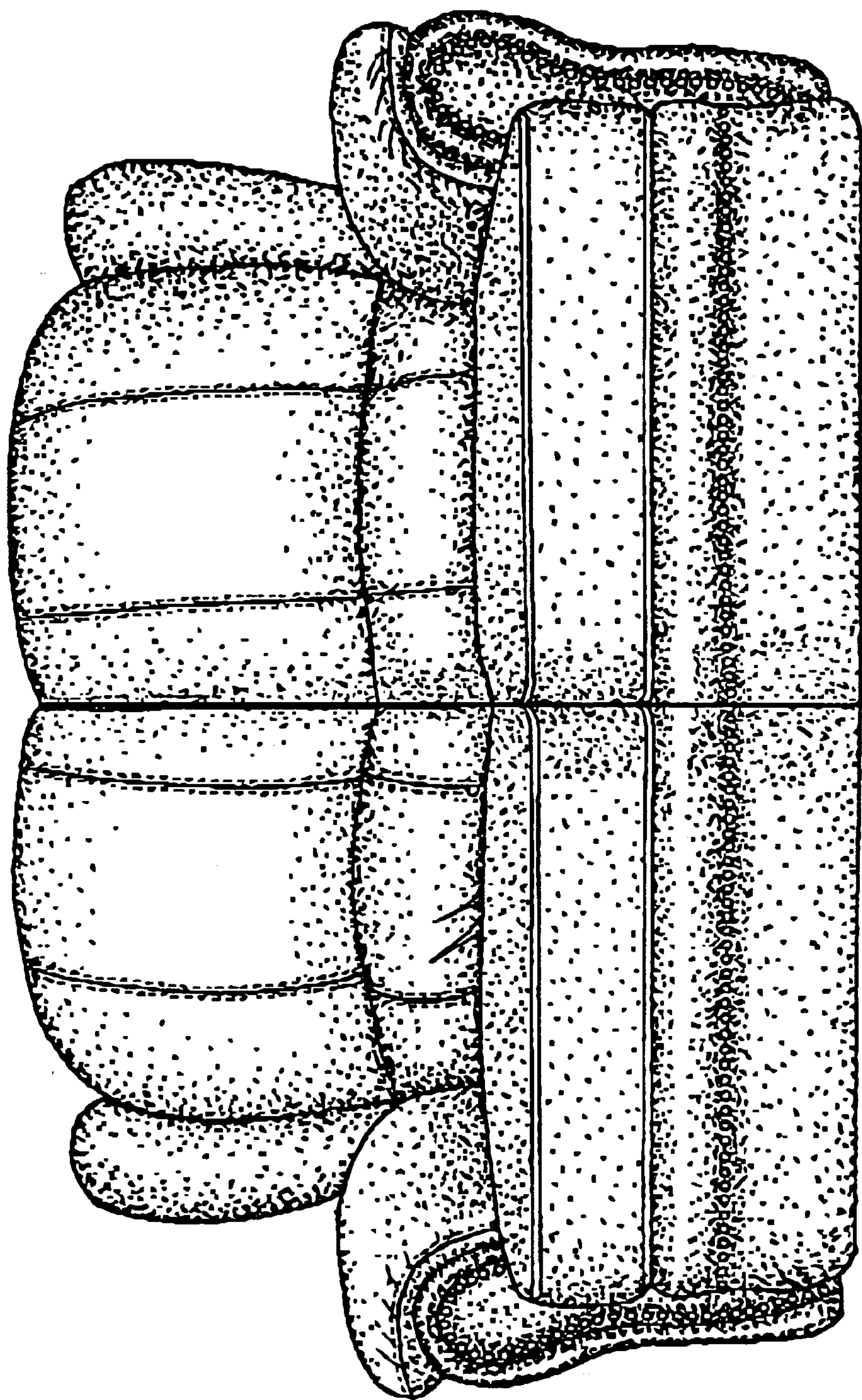

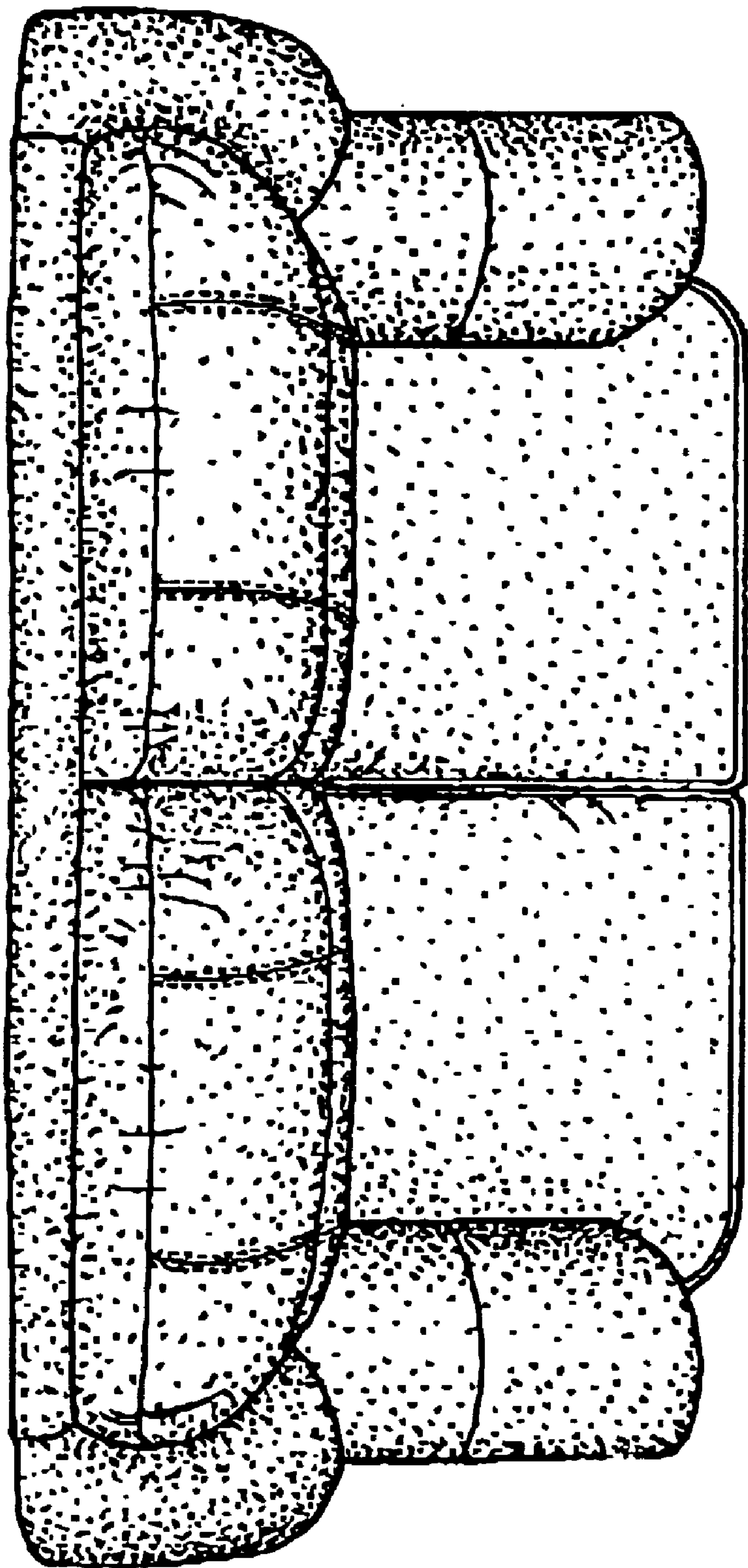

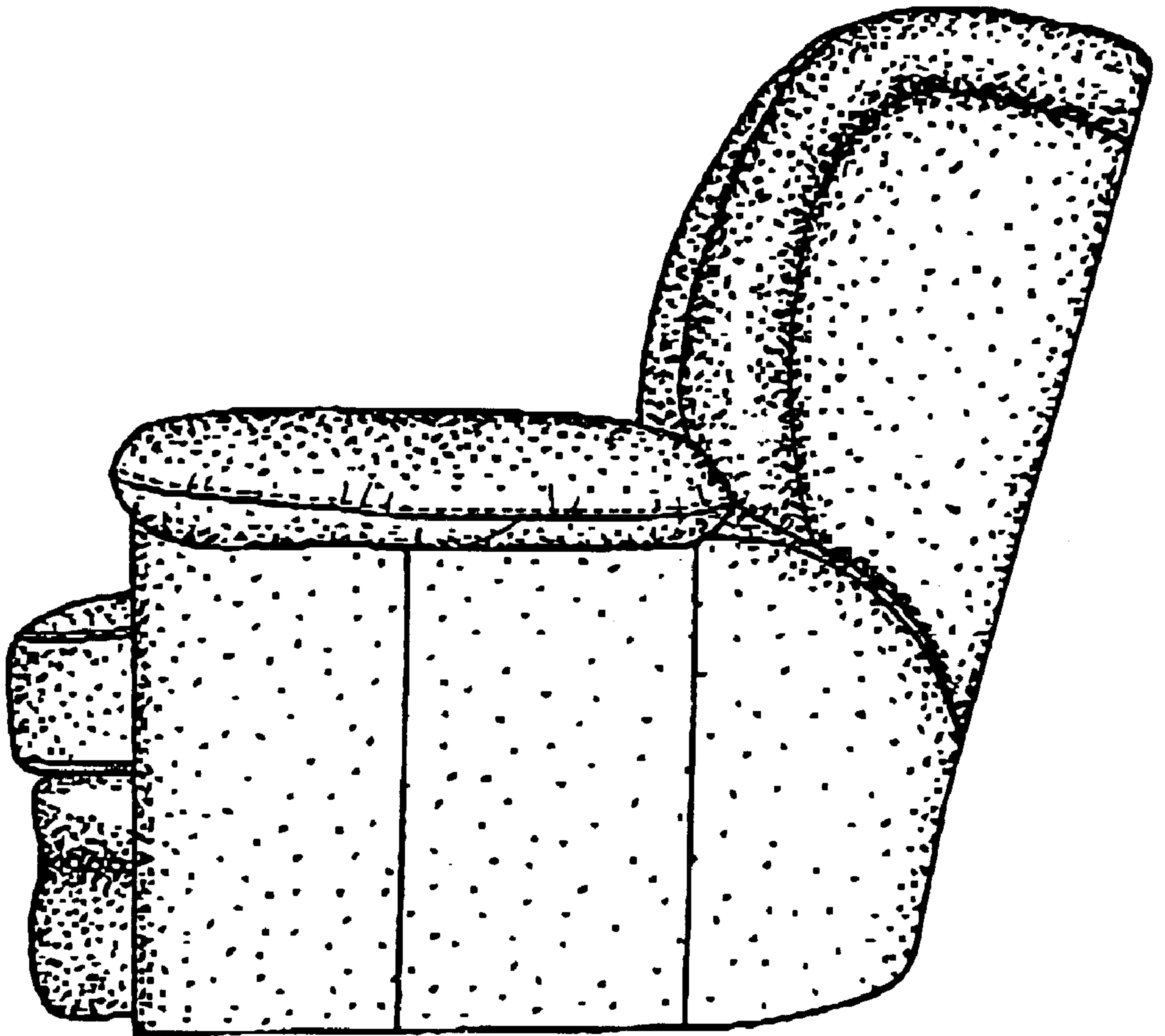

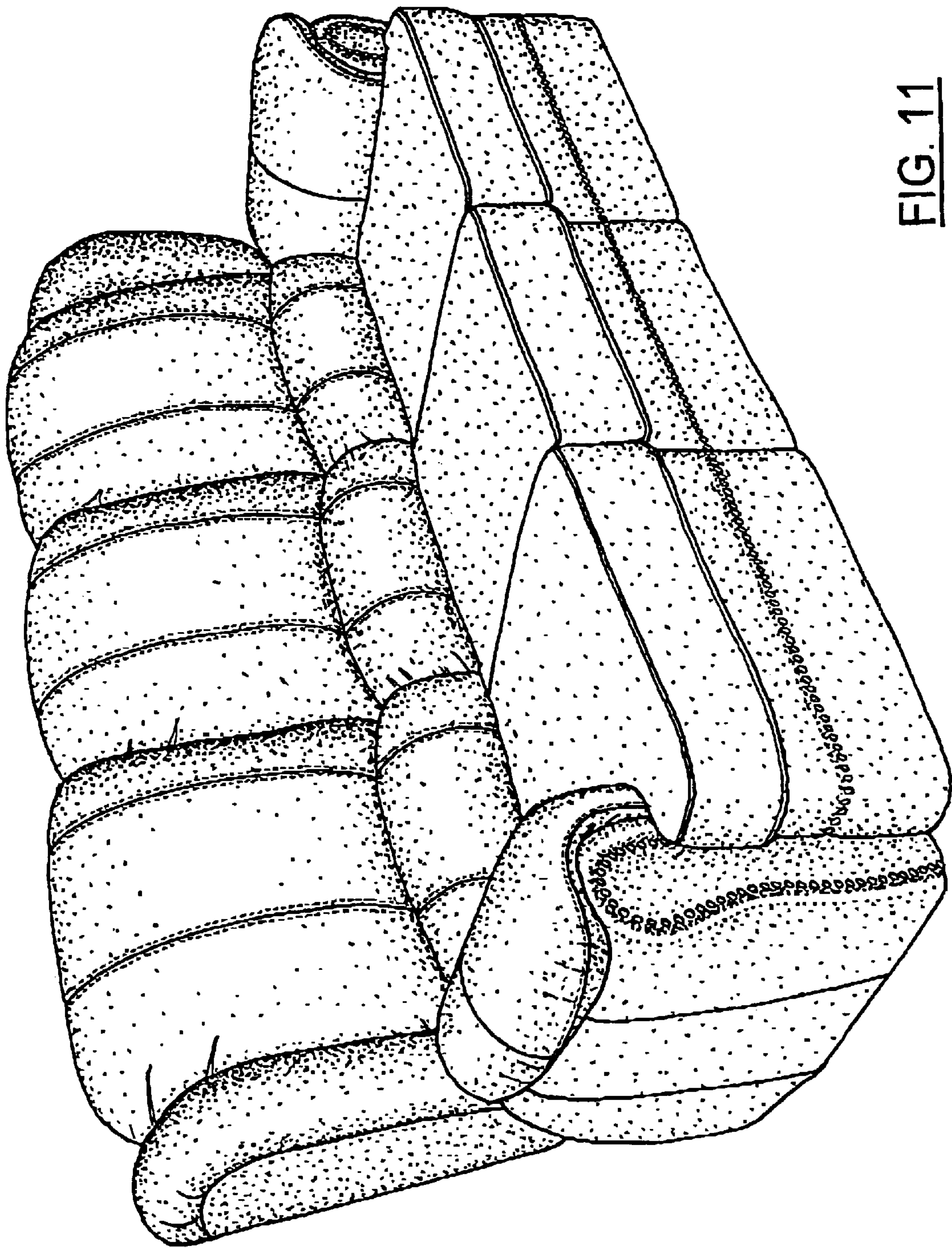

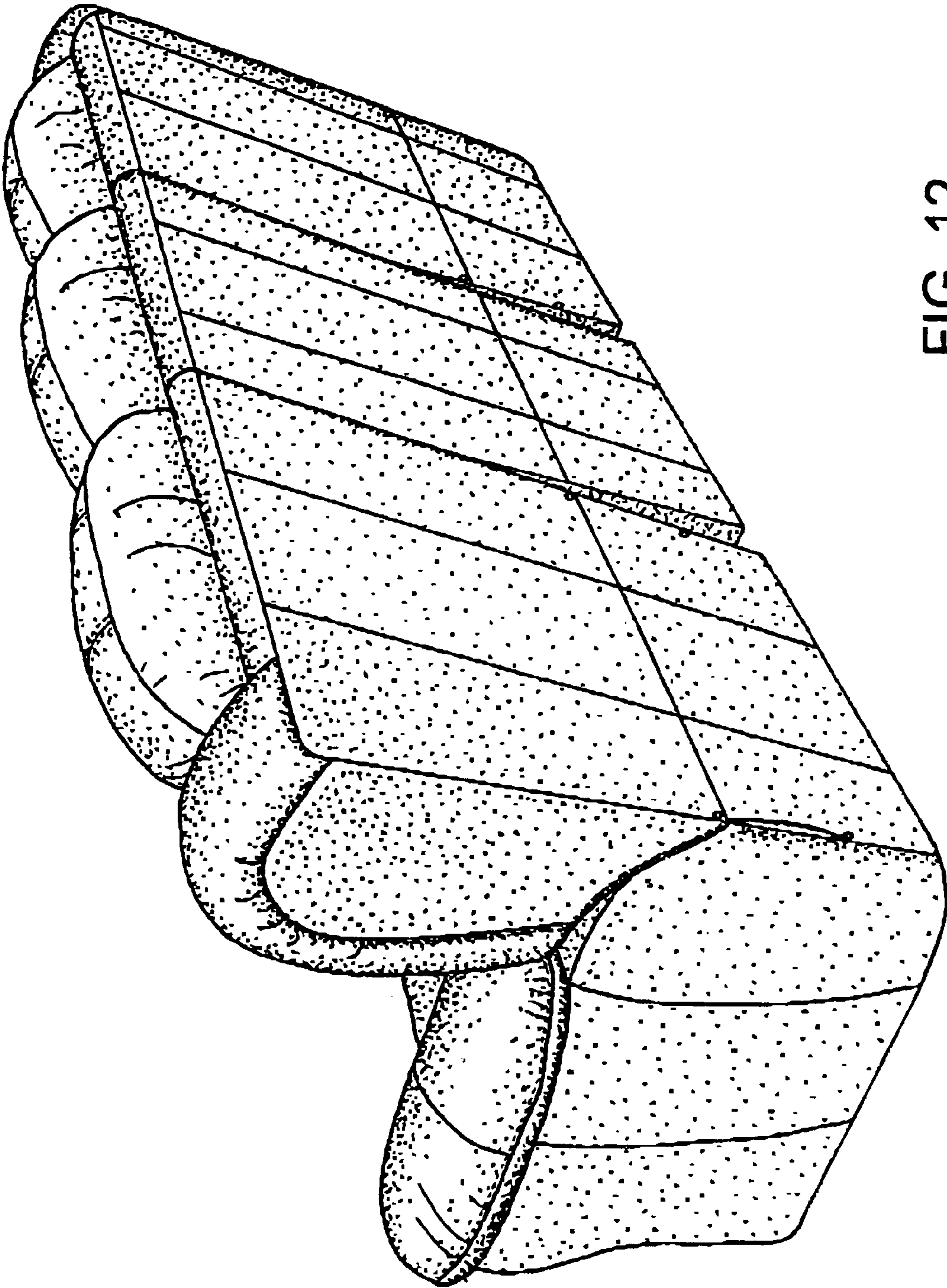

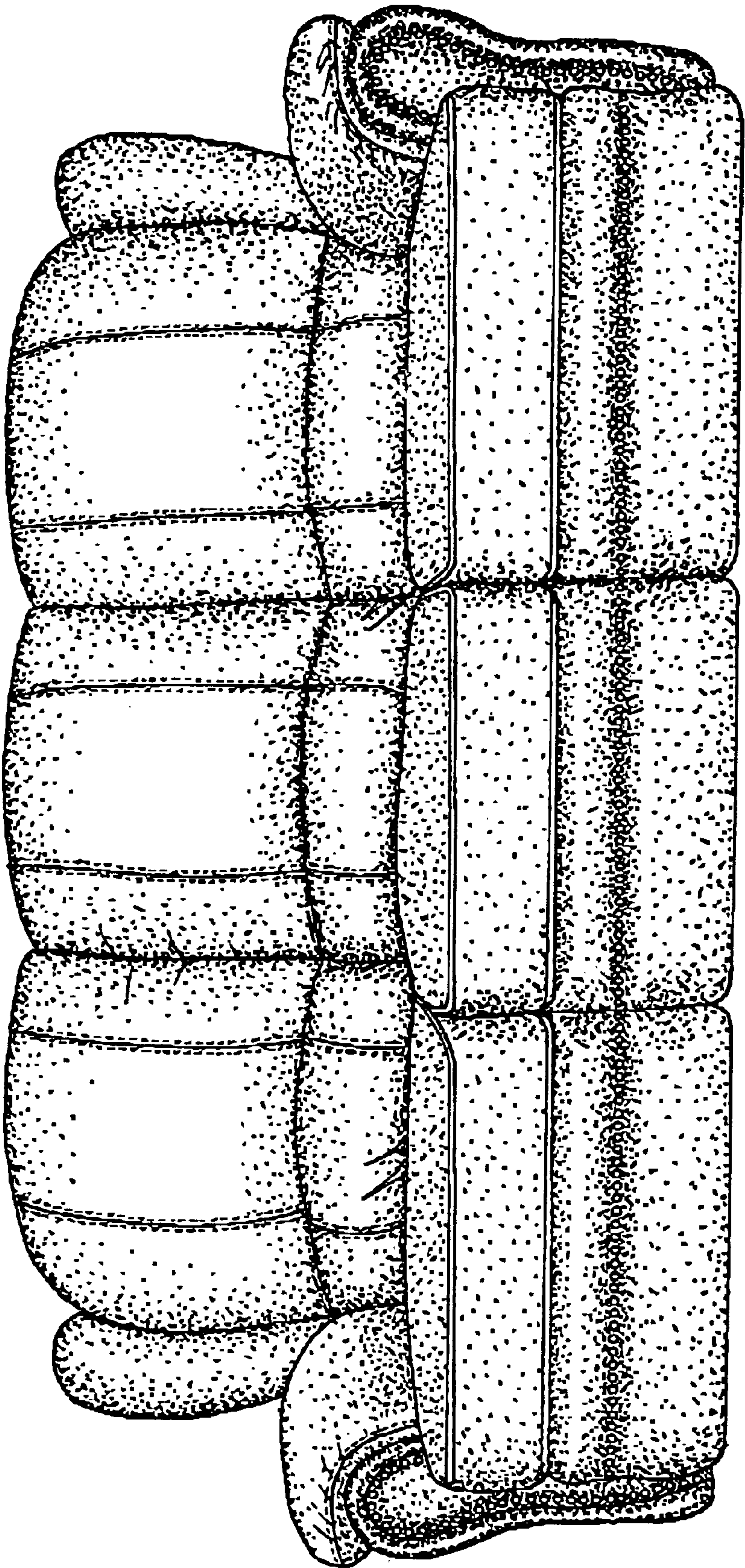

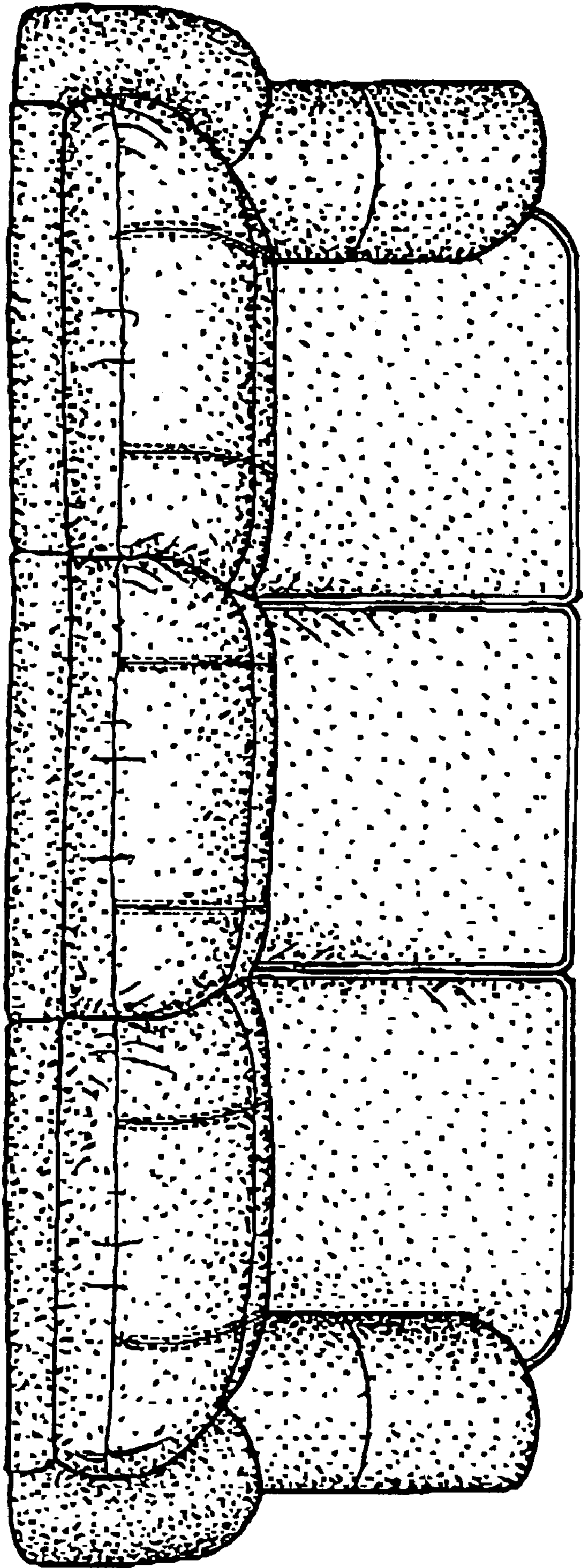

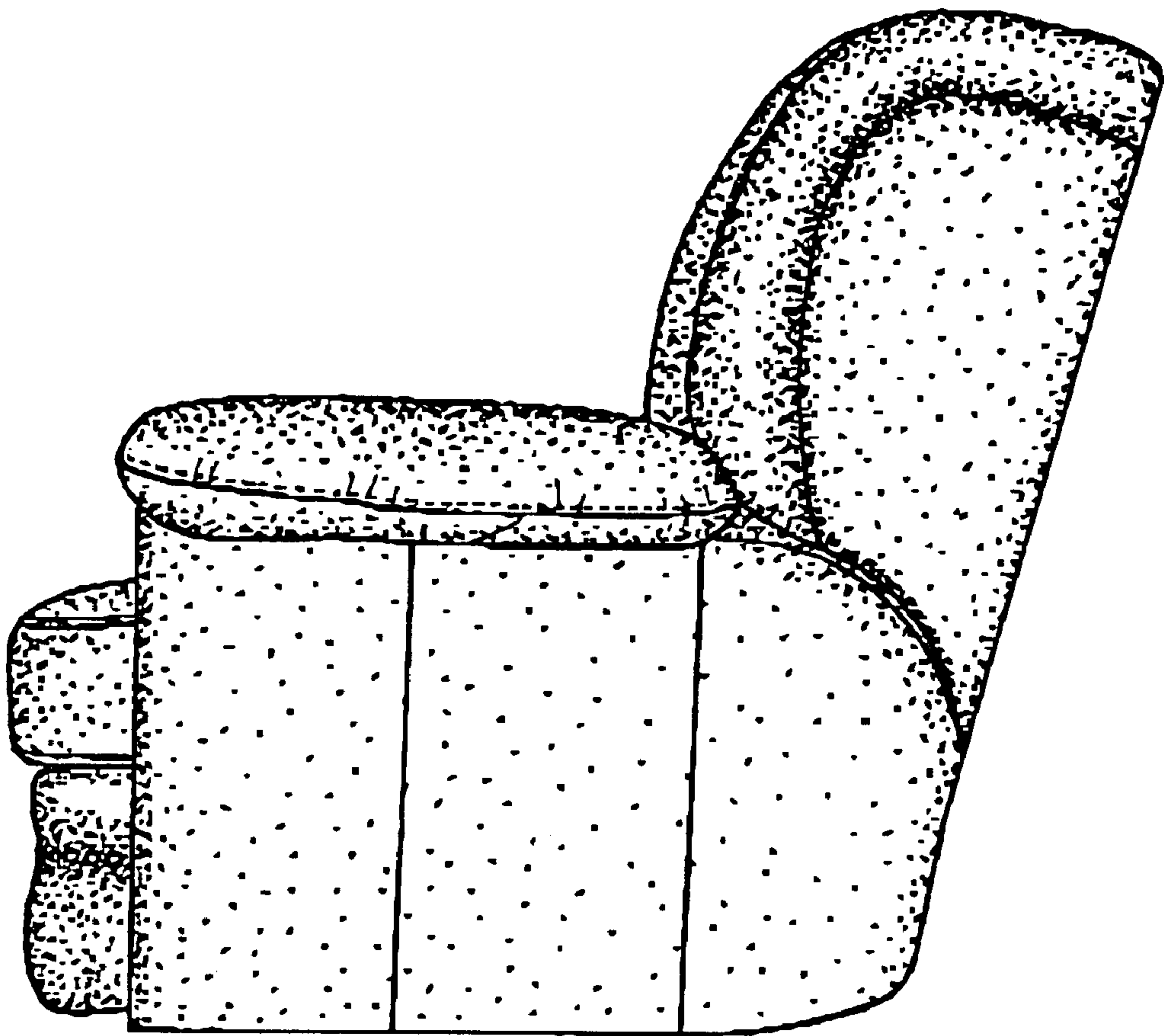
