DESCRIPTION

FIG. 2 is a front view of the chair according to the present invention.

FIG. 3 is a rear view of the chair according to the present invention.

FIG. 4 is a top view of the chair according to the present invention.

FIG. 5 is a bottom view of the chair according to the present invention; and,

FIG. 6 is a right side view of the chair according to the present invention, the left side view being the mirror image.

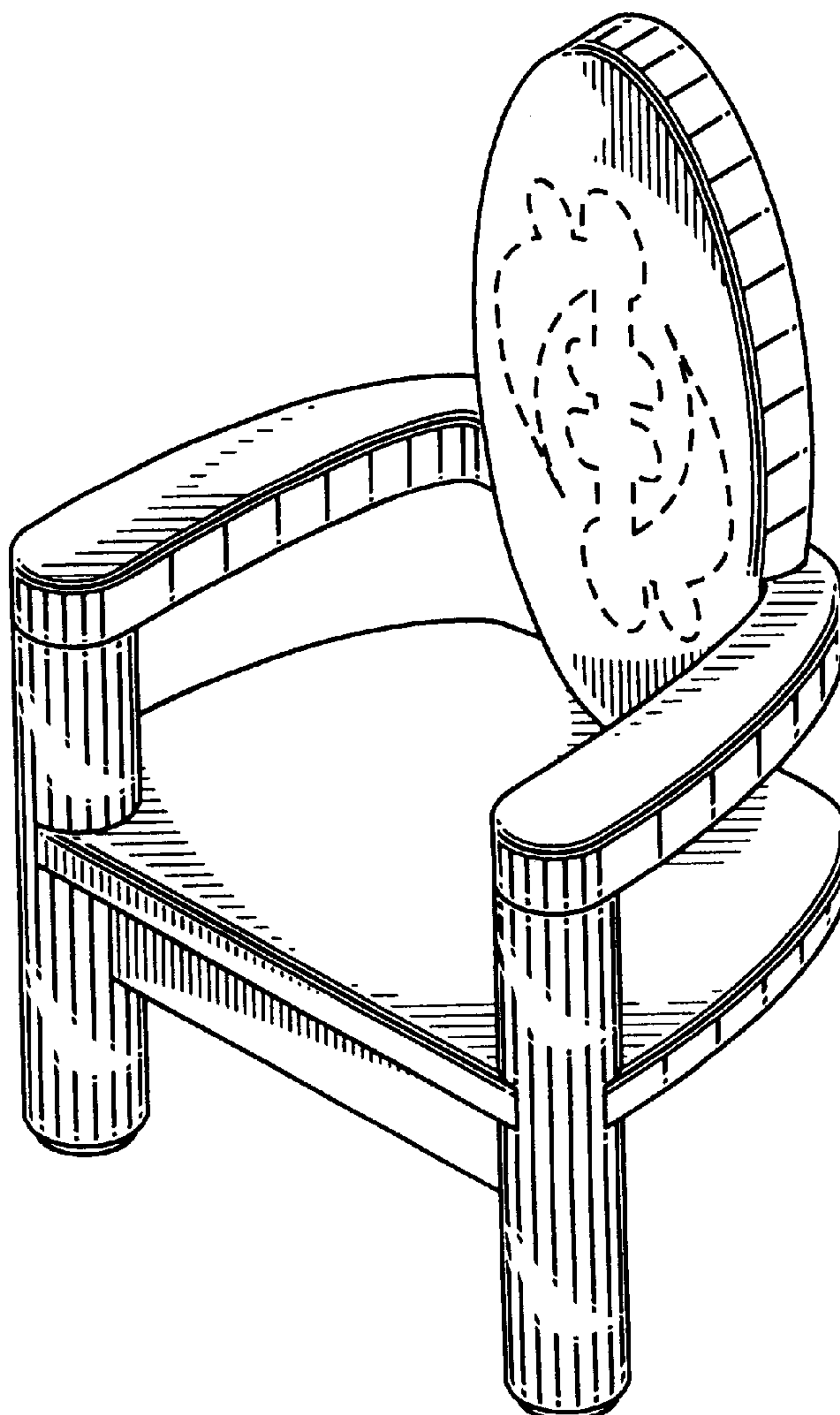

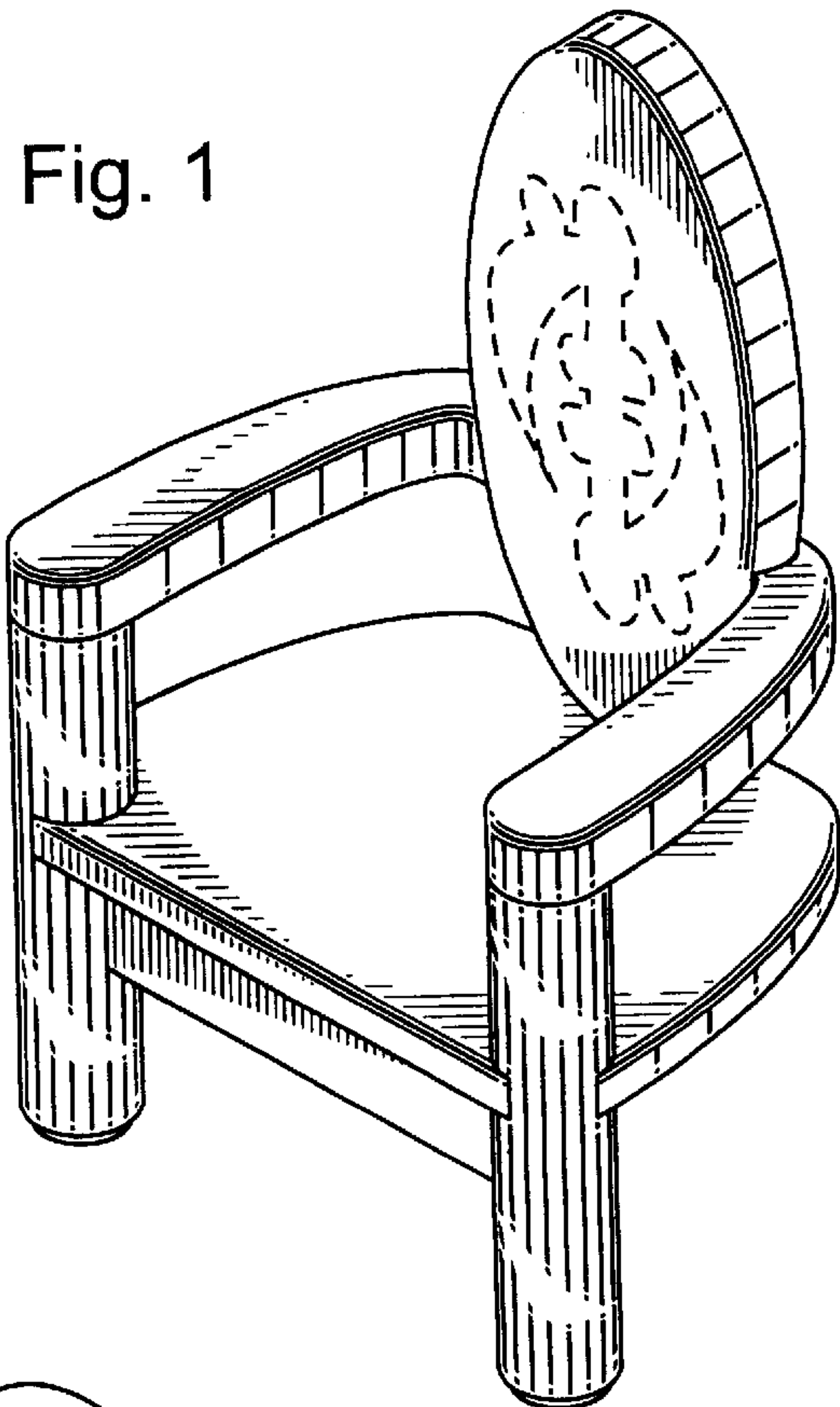

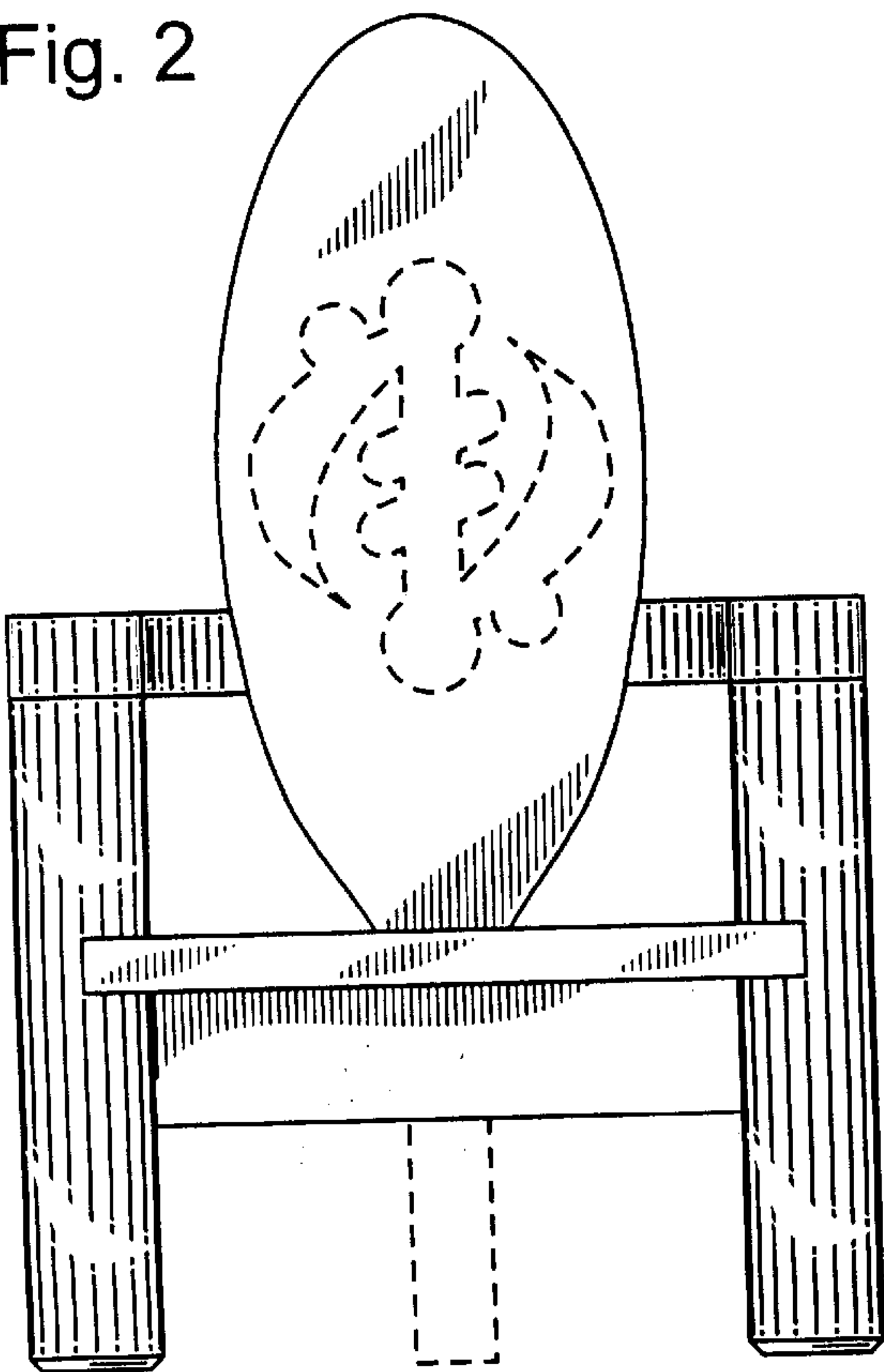

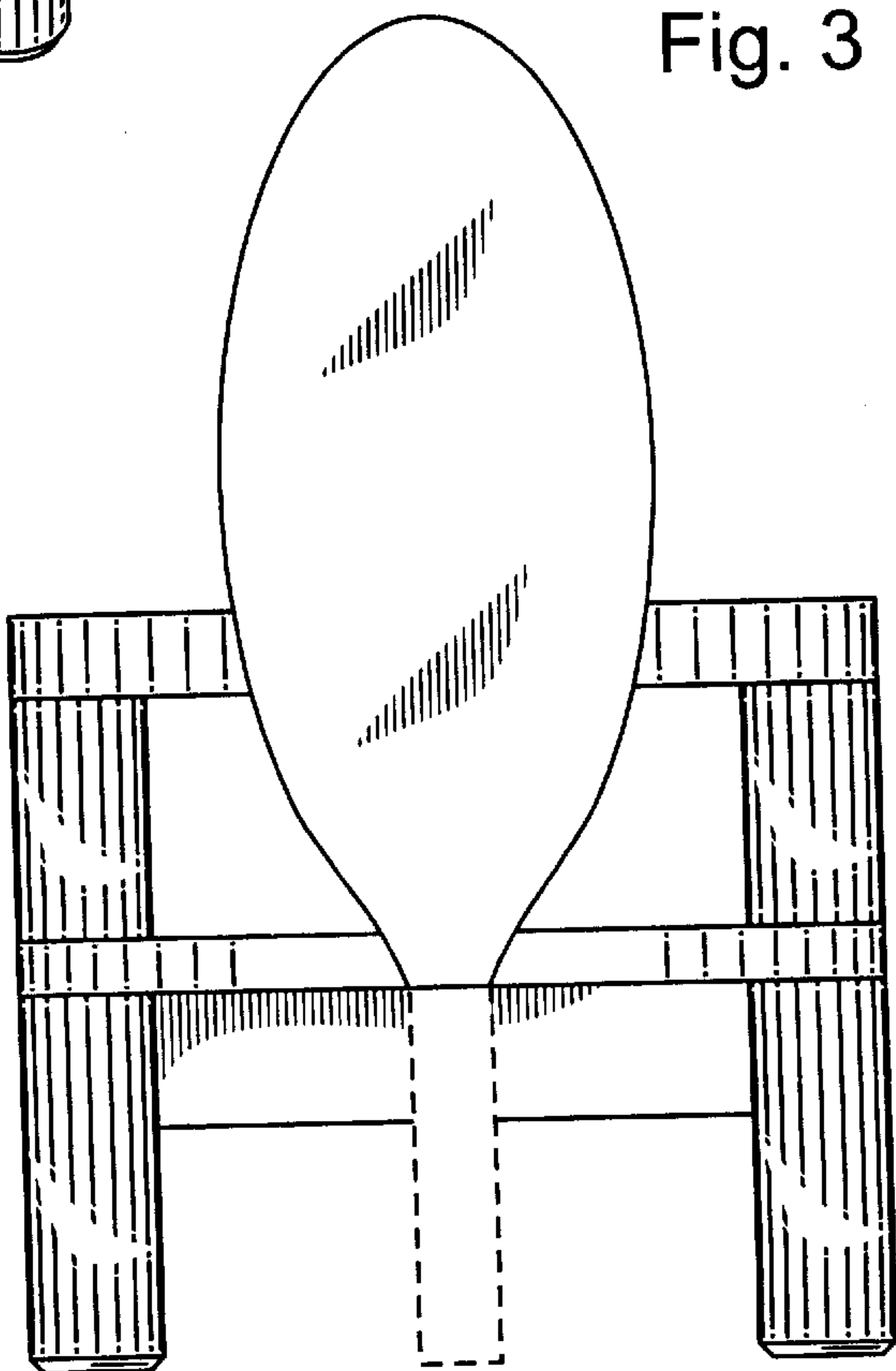

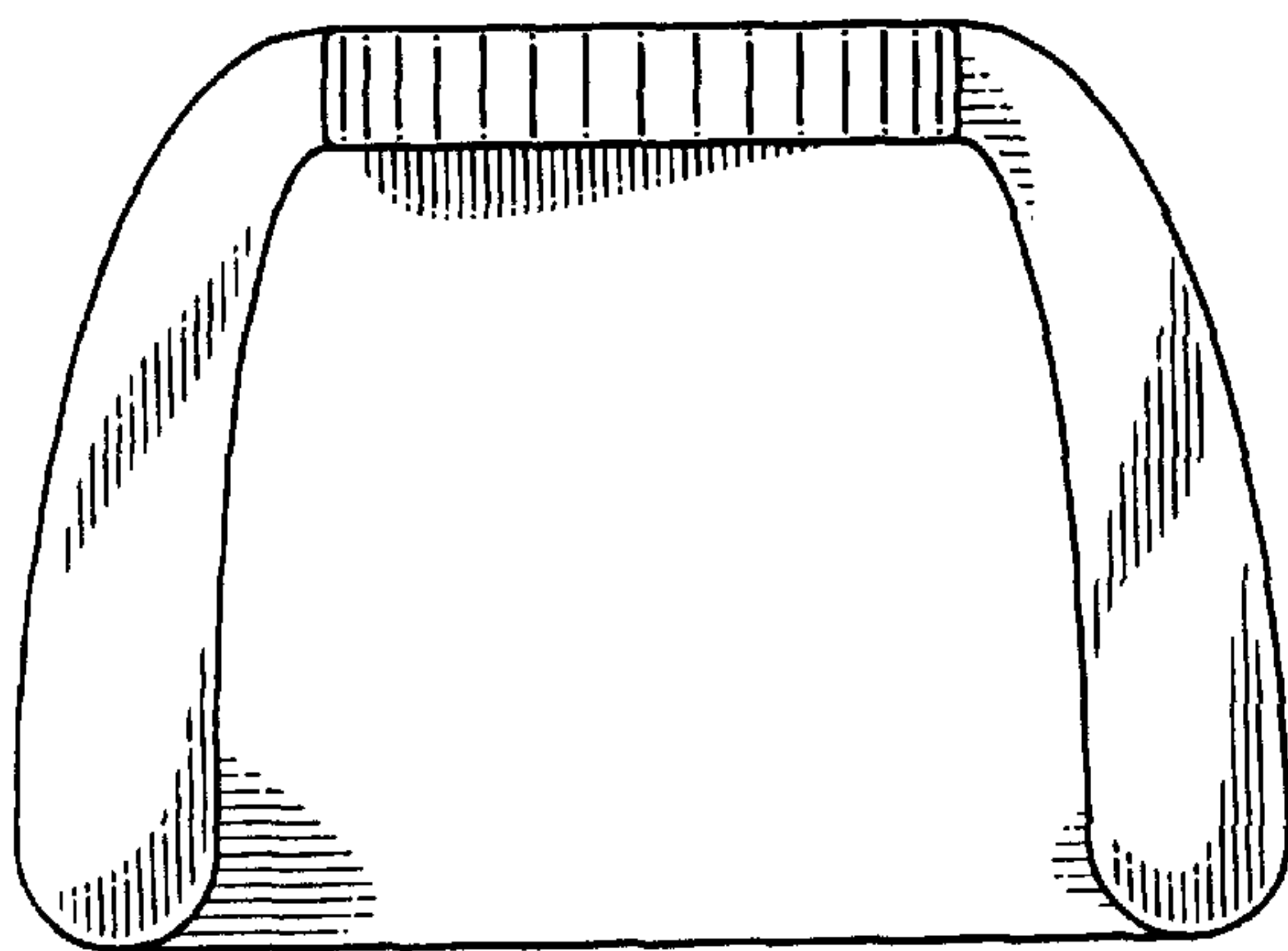

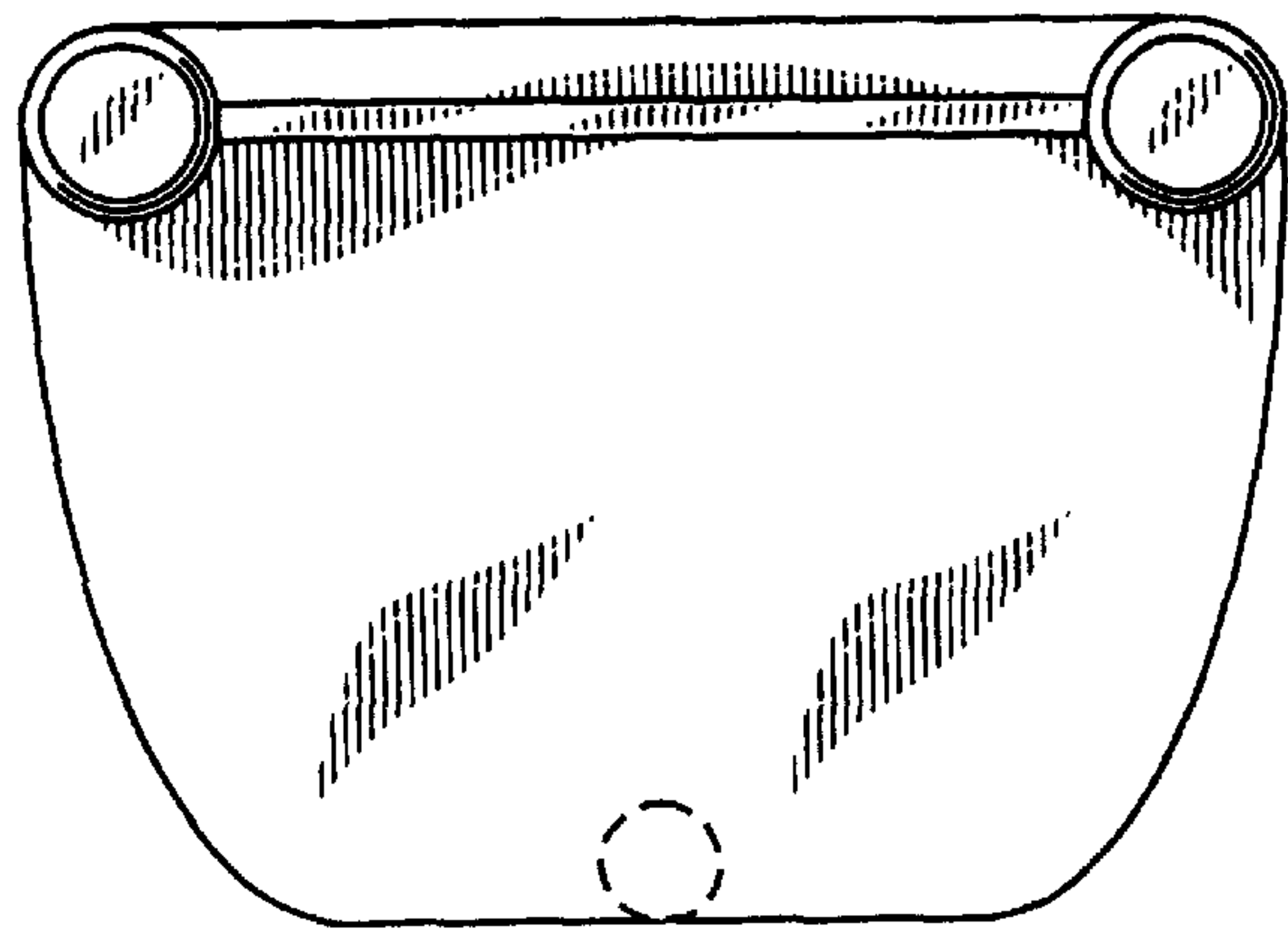
