**DESCRIPTION**

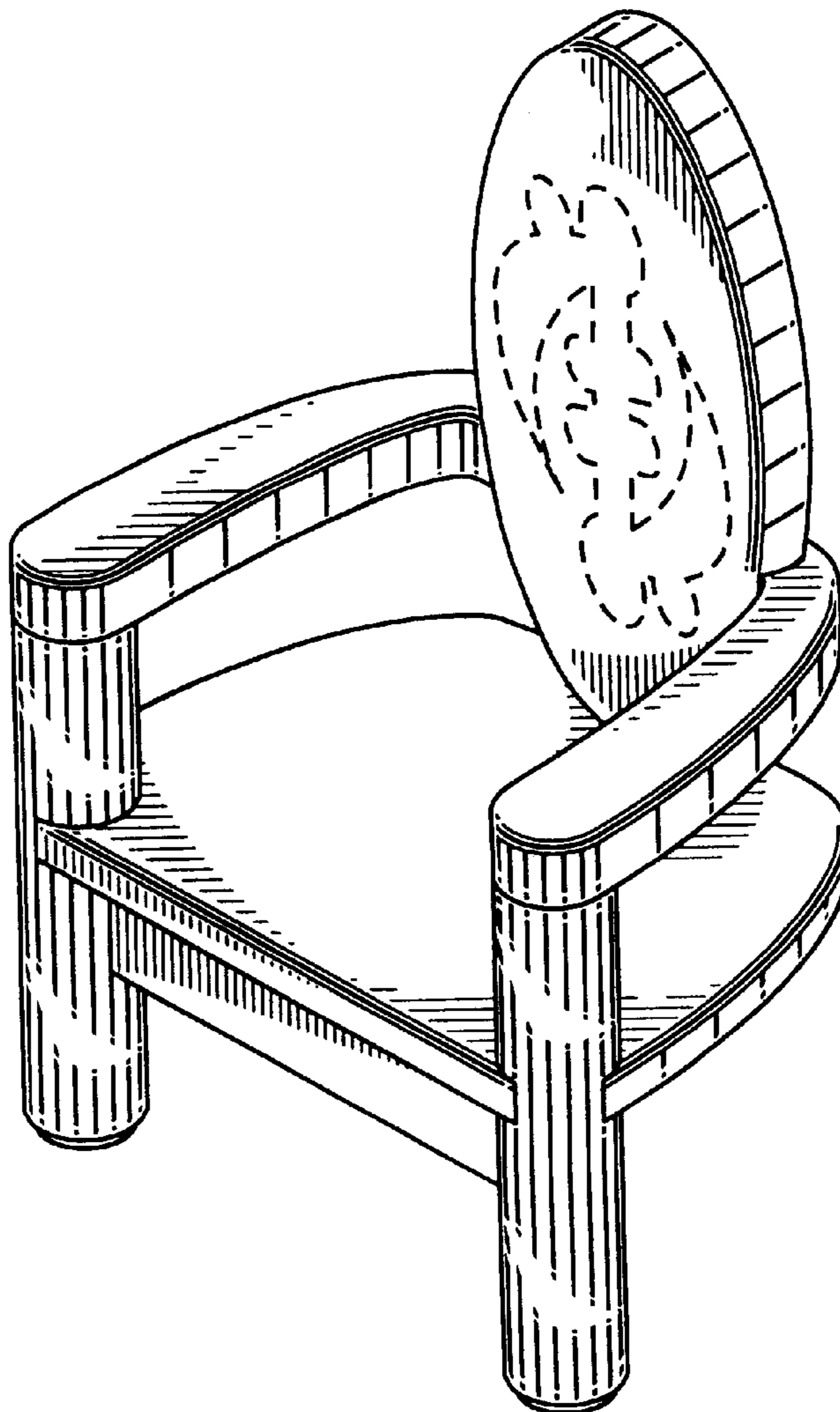

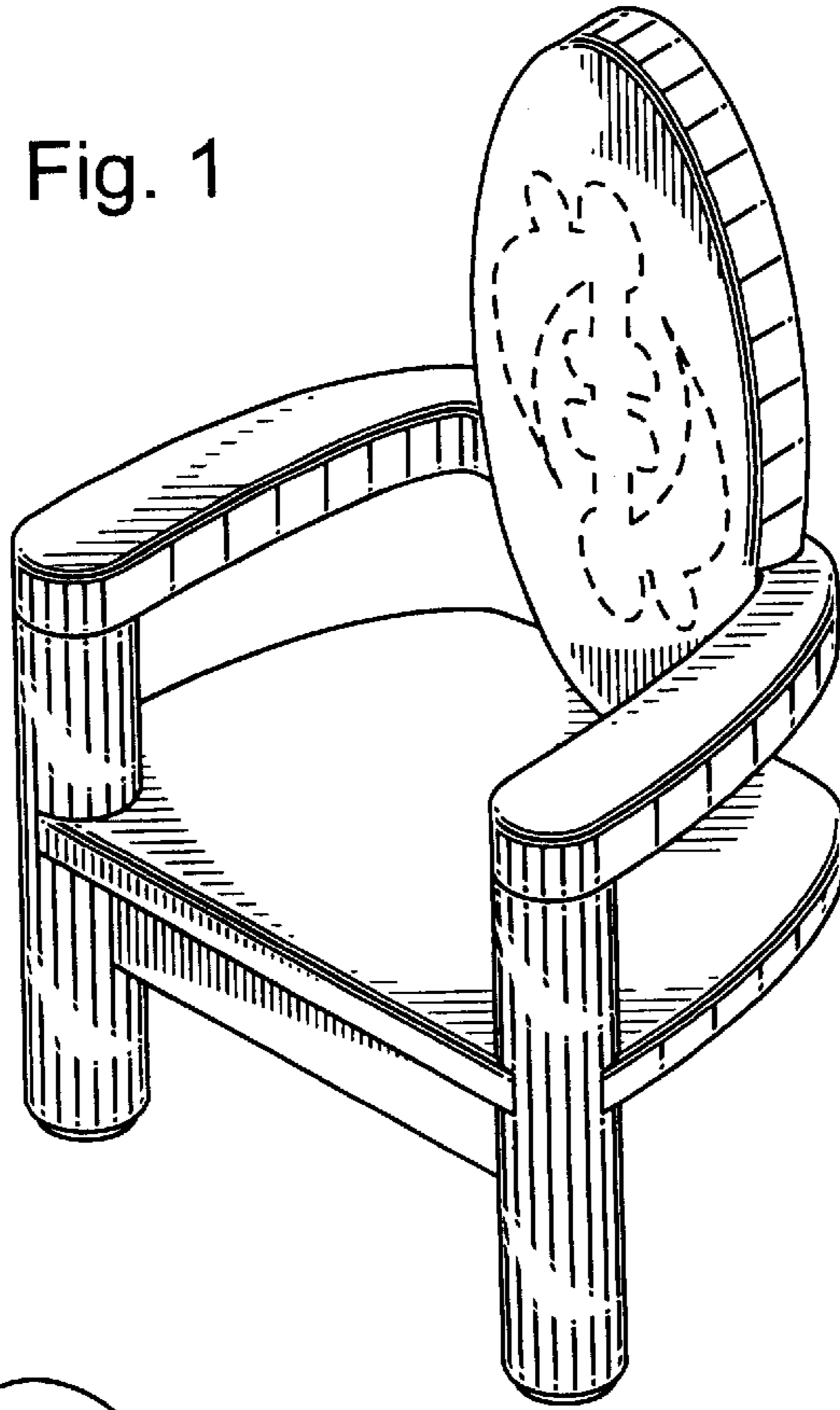

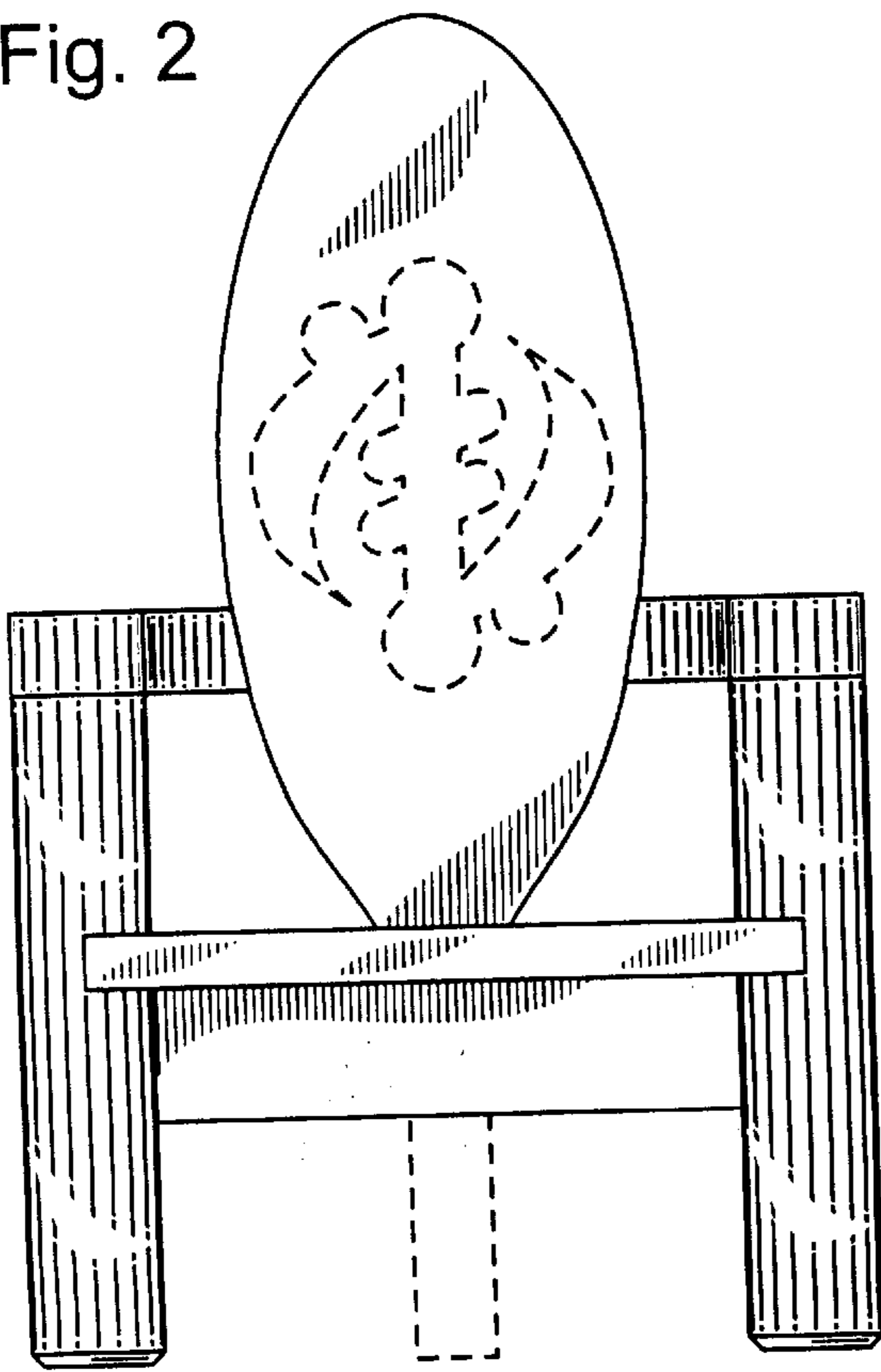

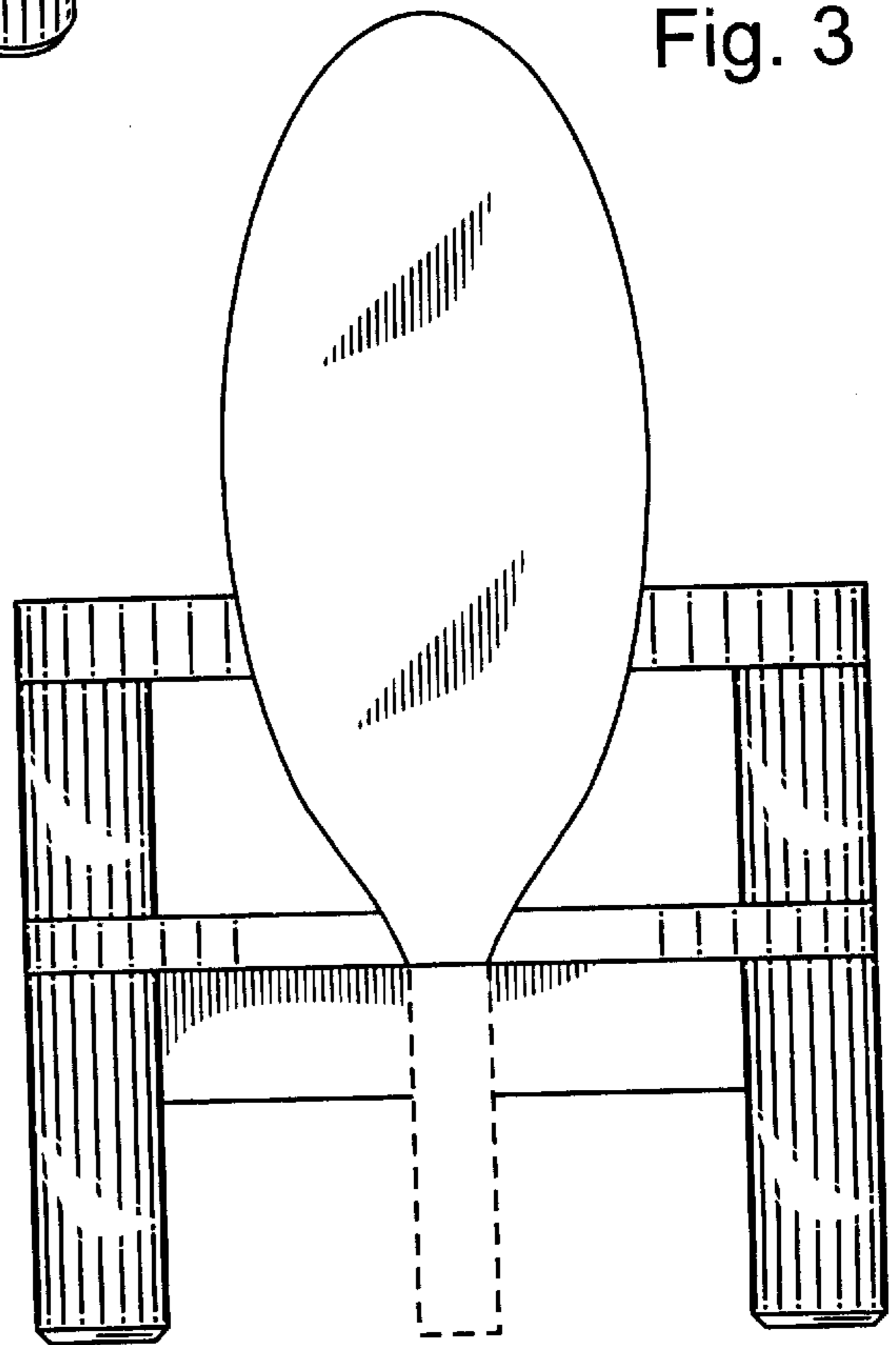

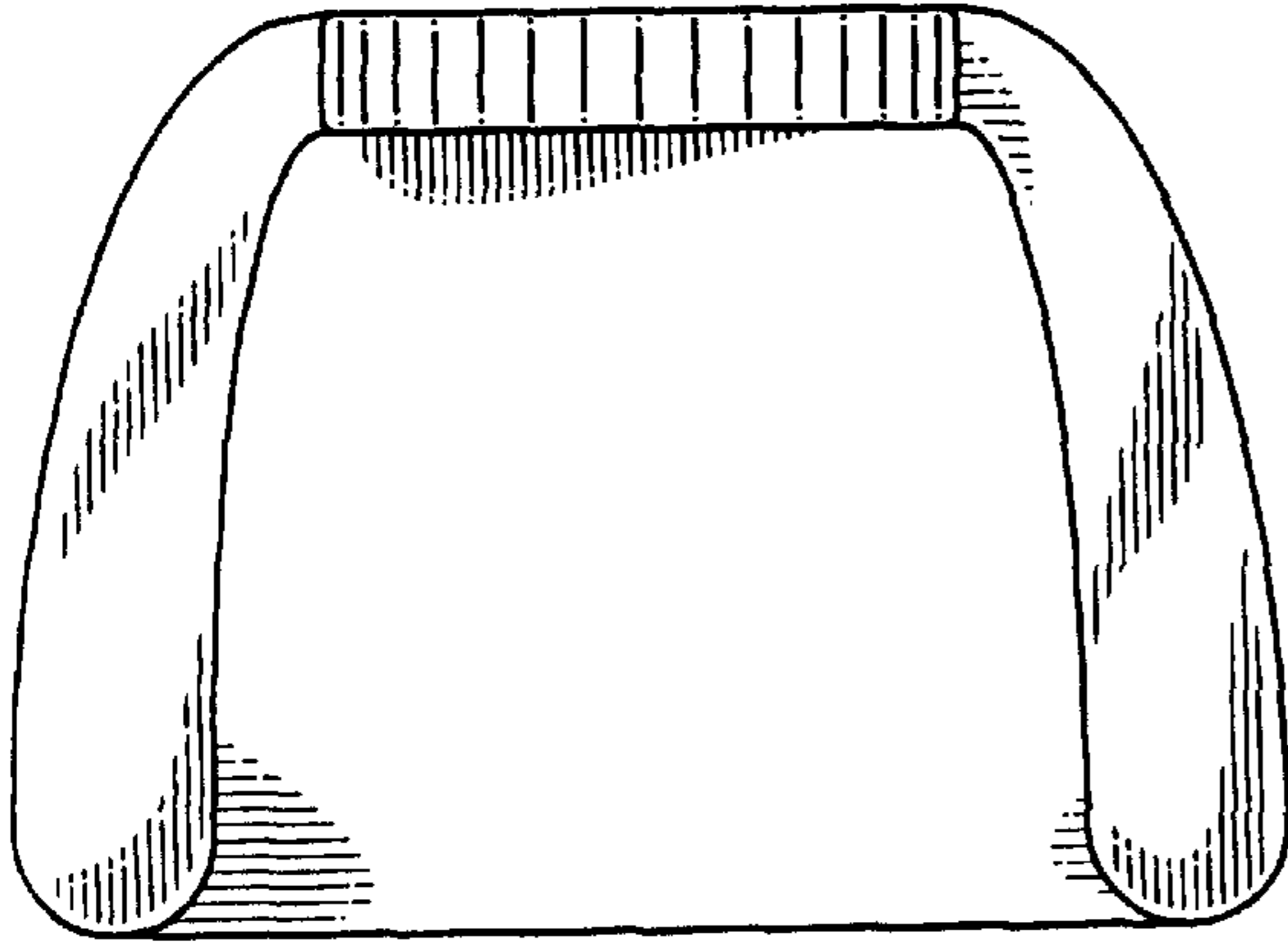

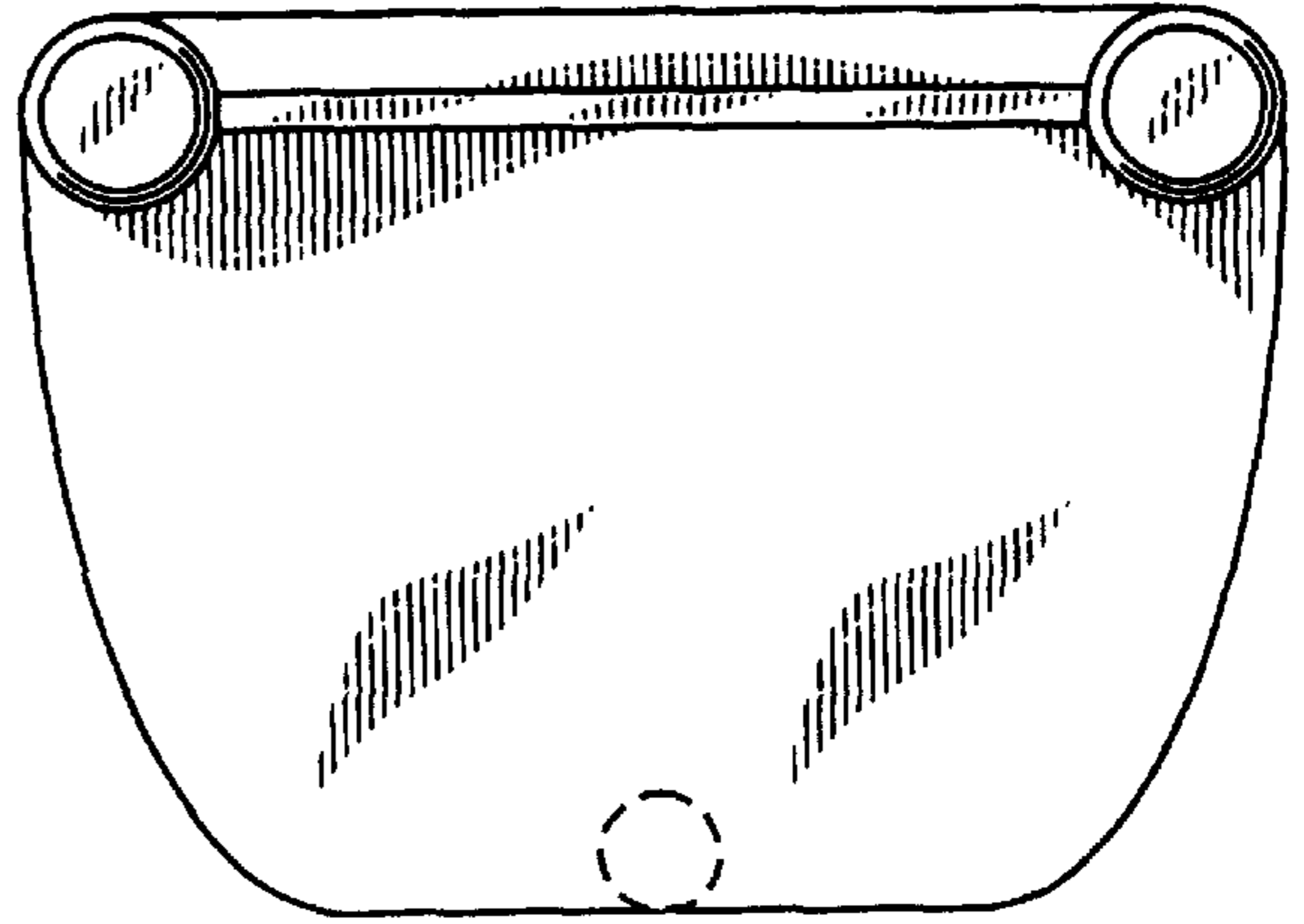
