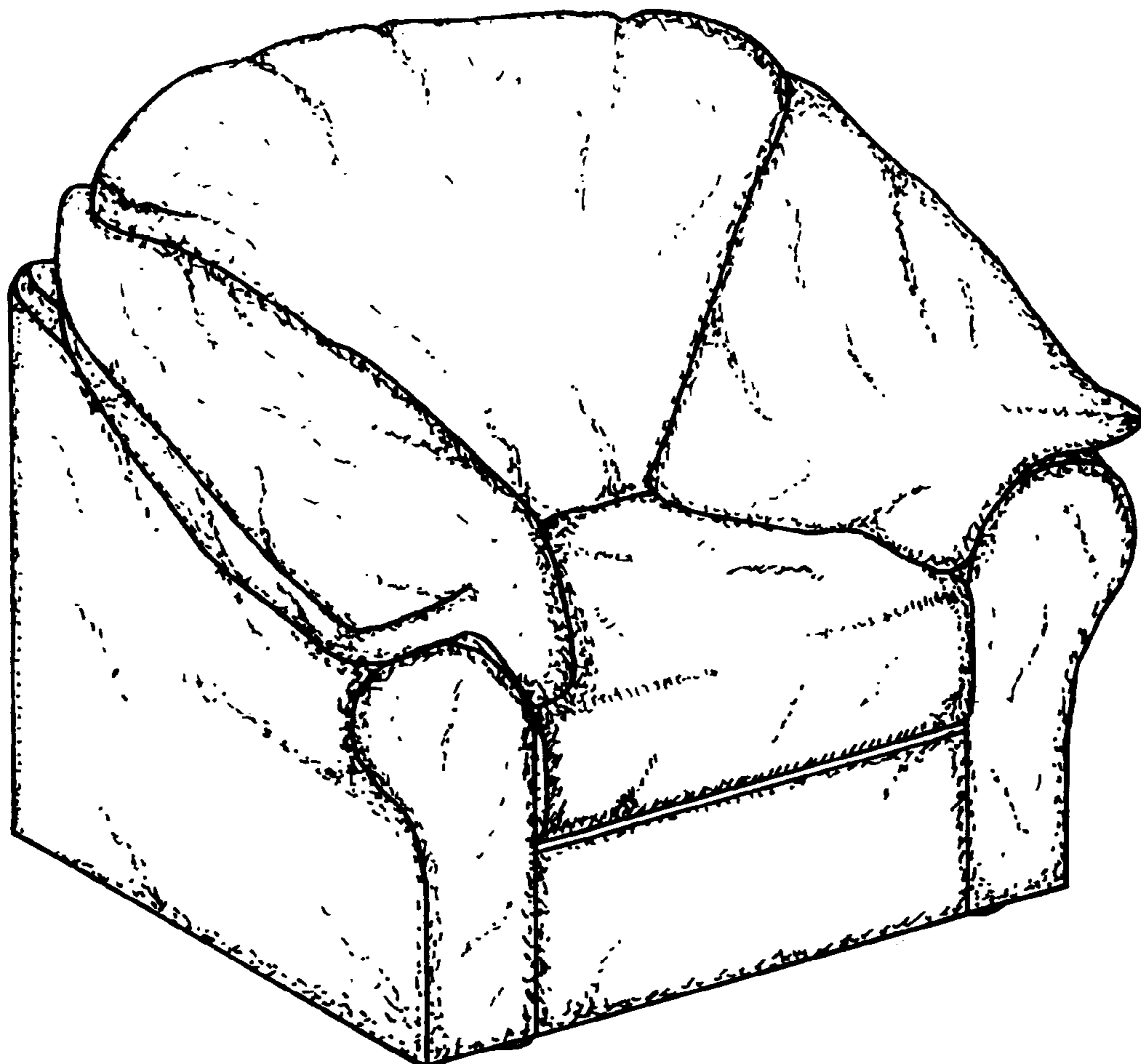
[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a chair, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is front perspective view of a chair showing new design;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view of the side opposite to the FIG. 3 side;
FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof; and,
FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof, the fragmental cross-hatching is understood to represent fabric and would be continuous throughout the implied area.

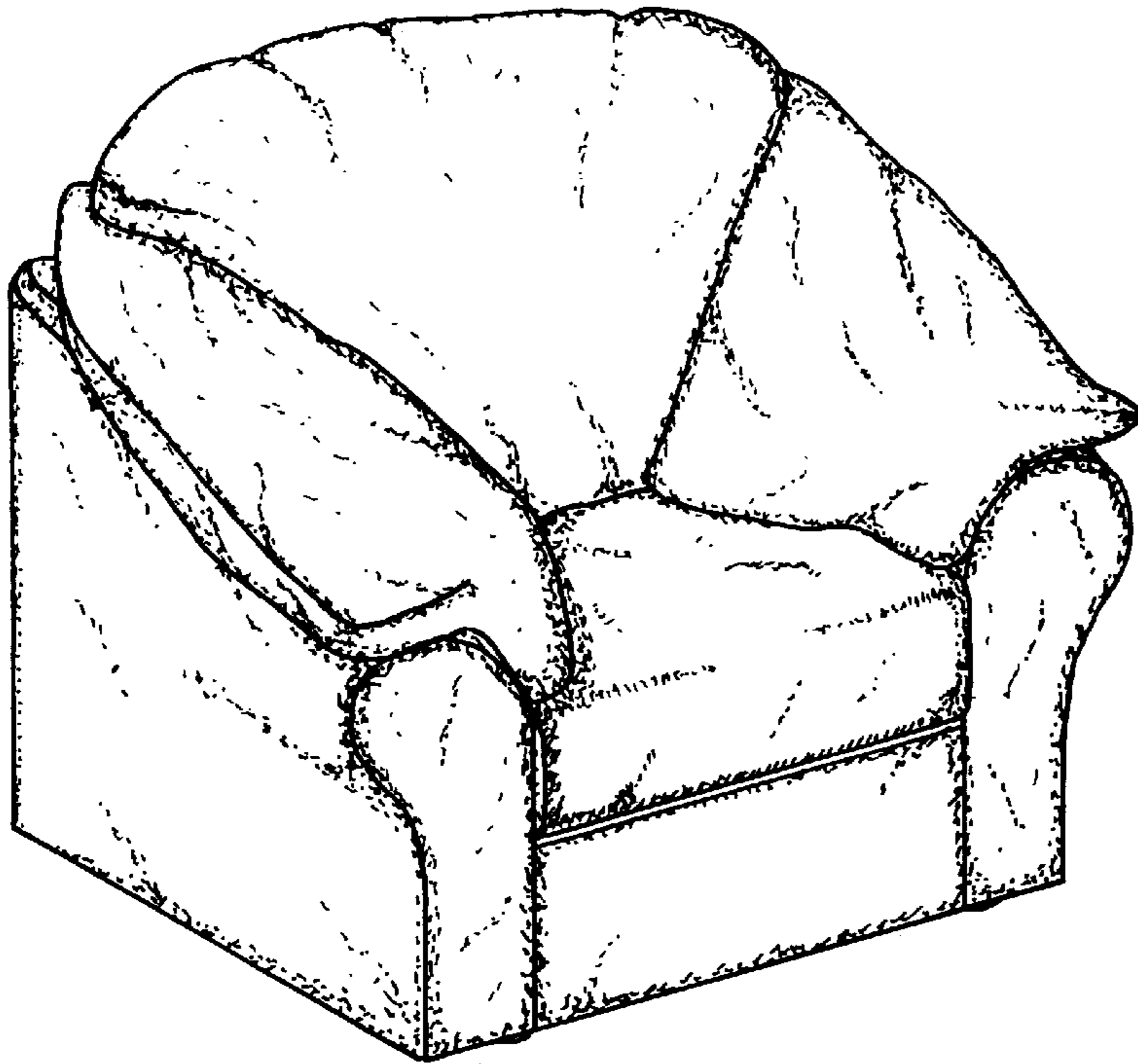

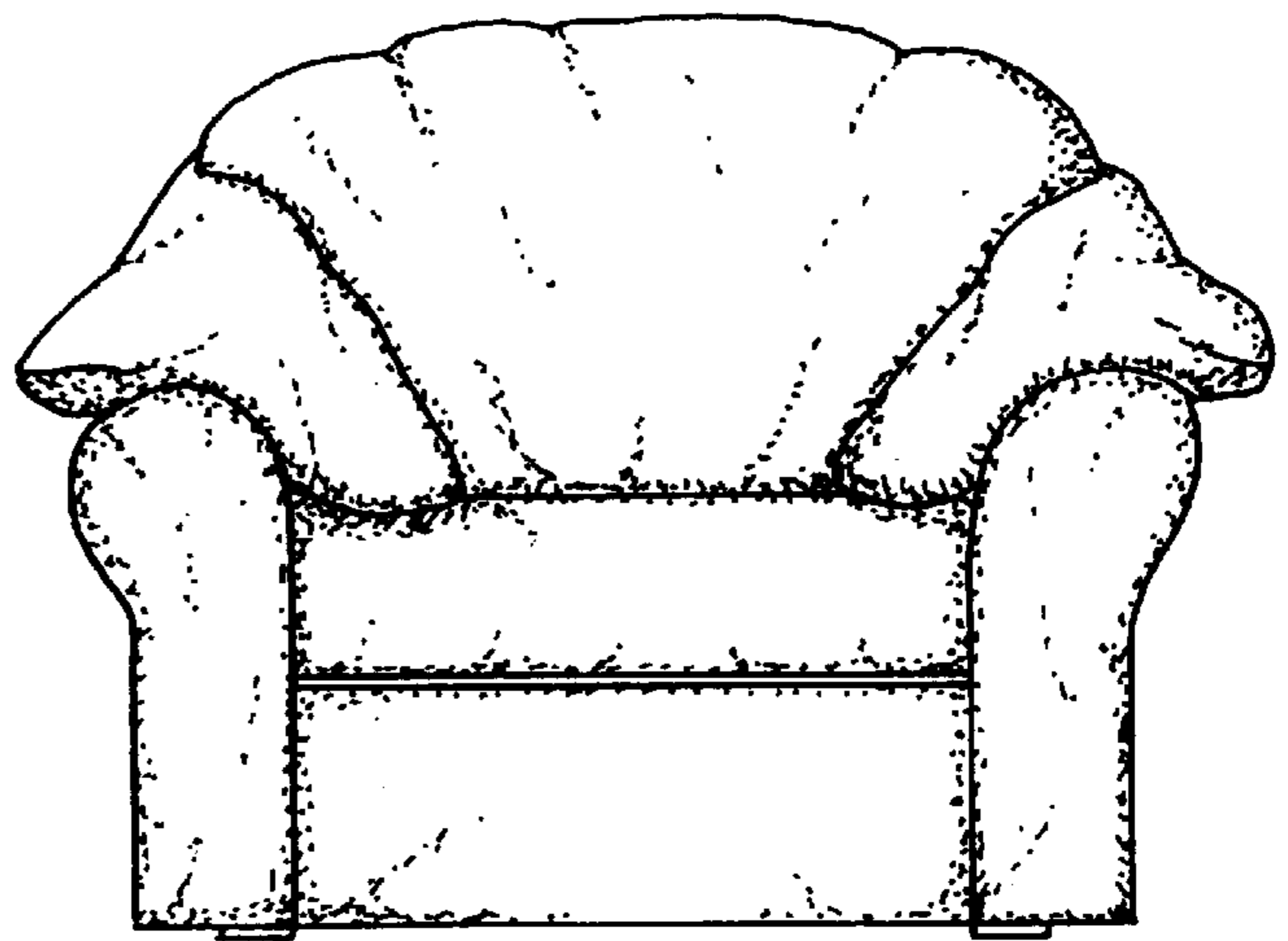

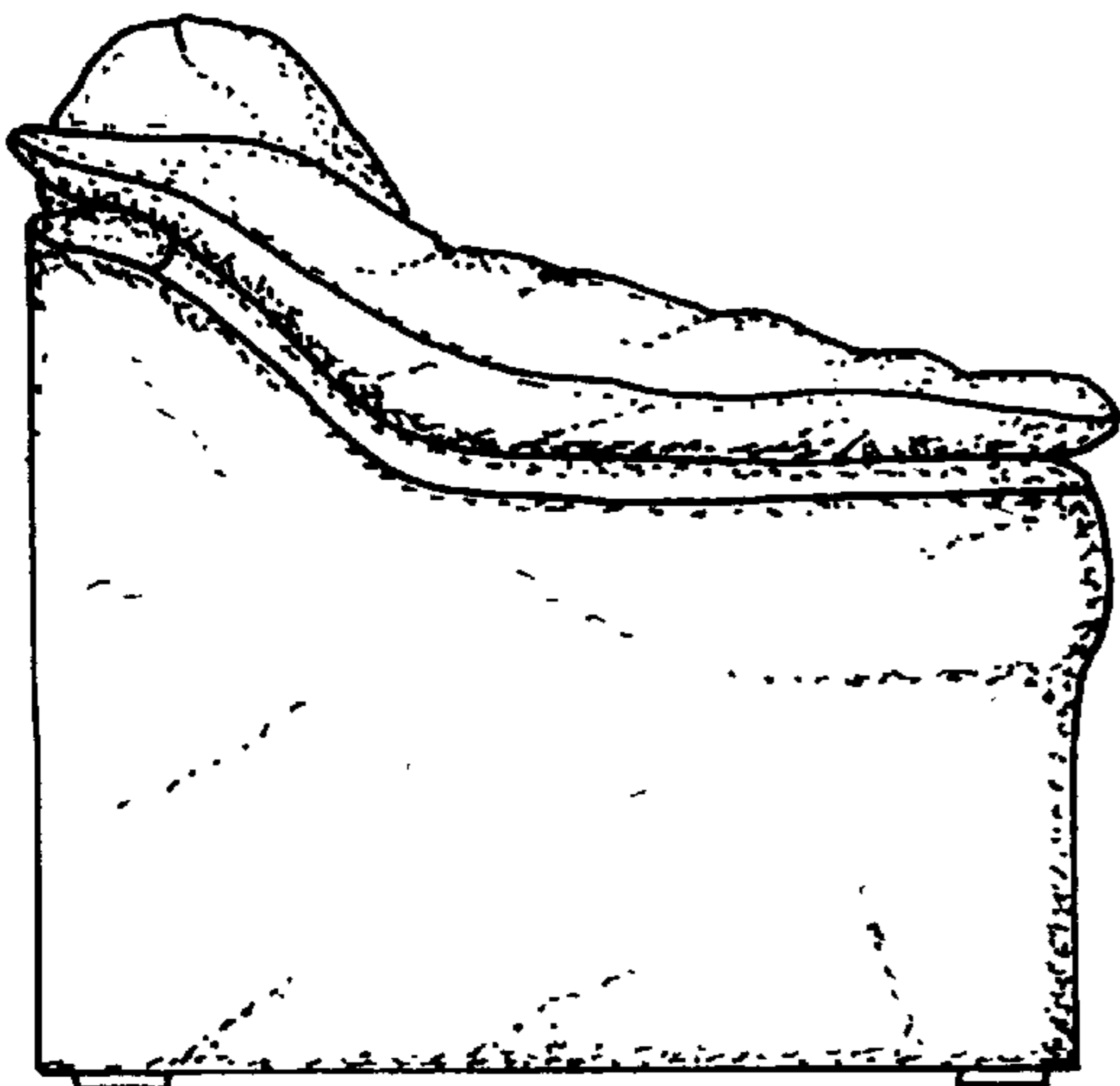

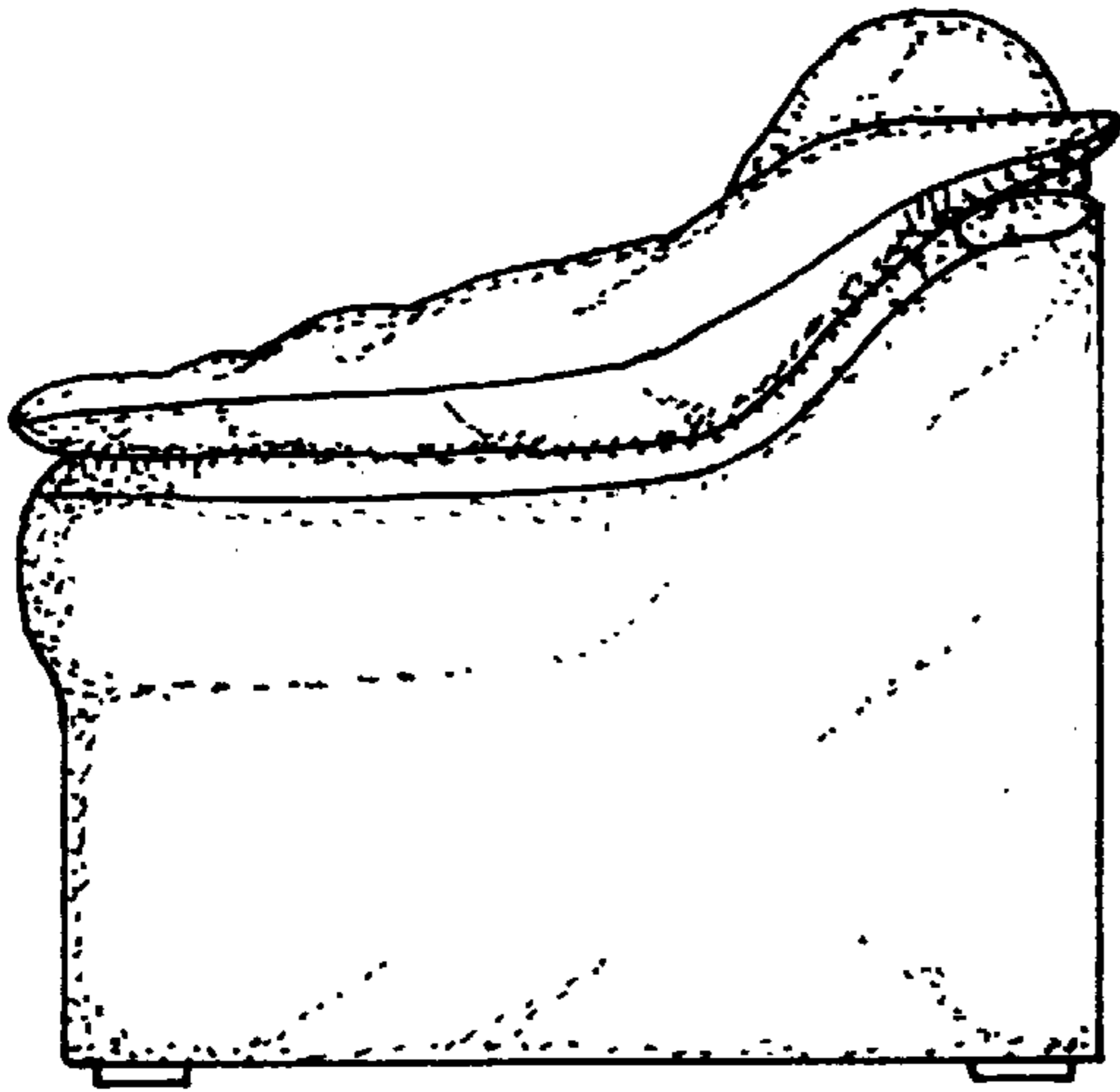

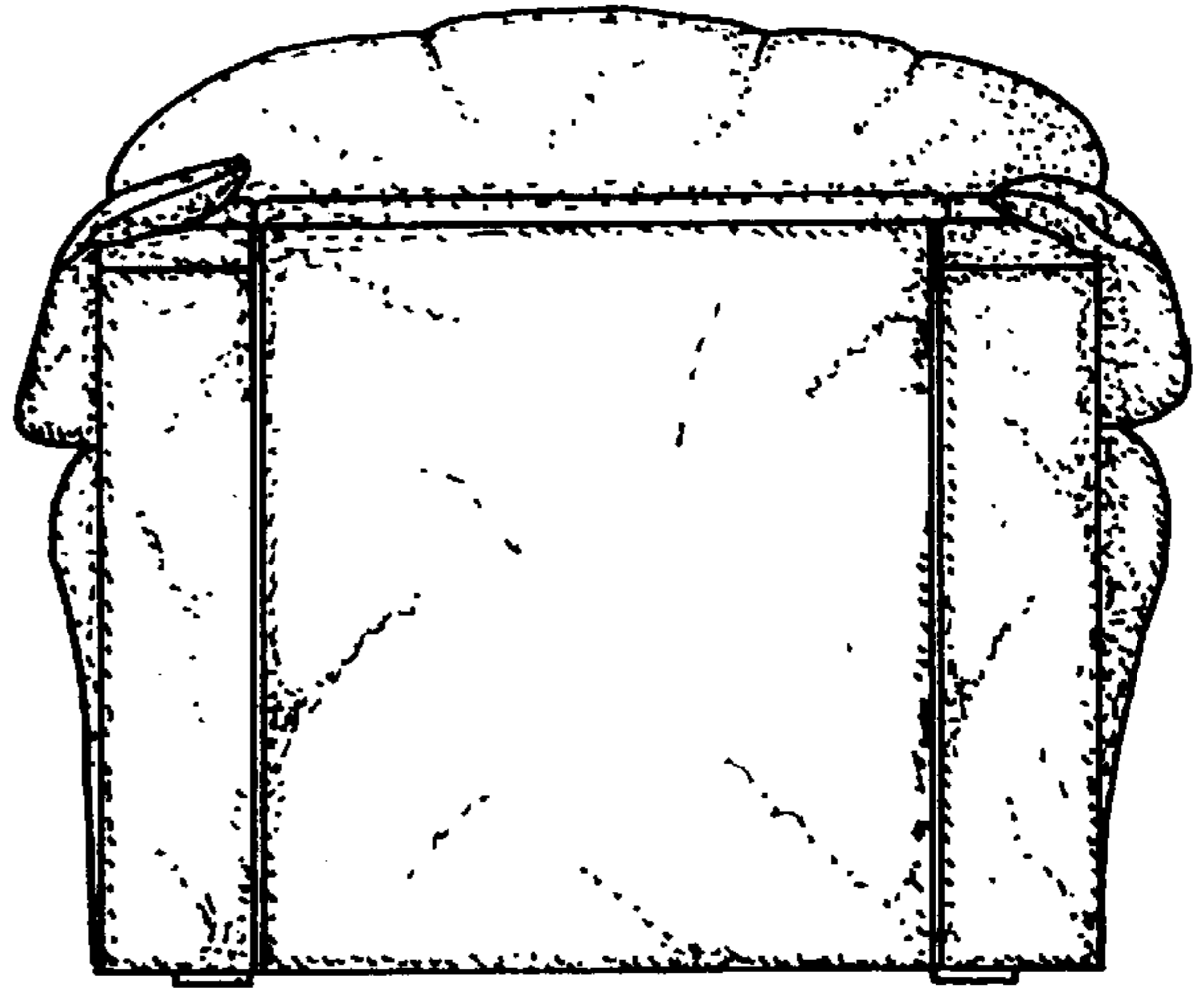

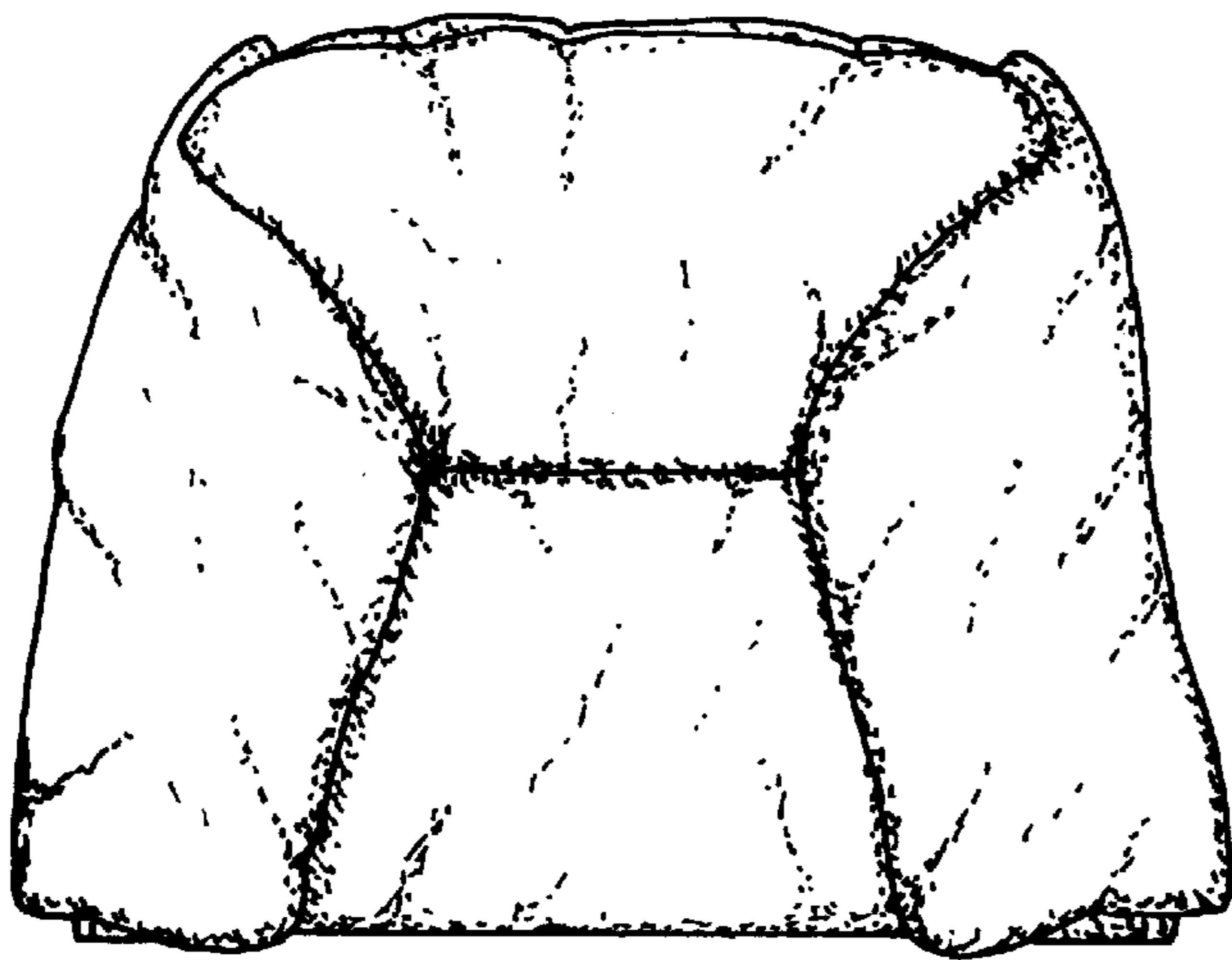

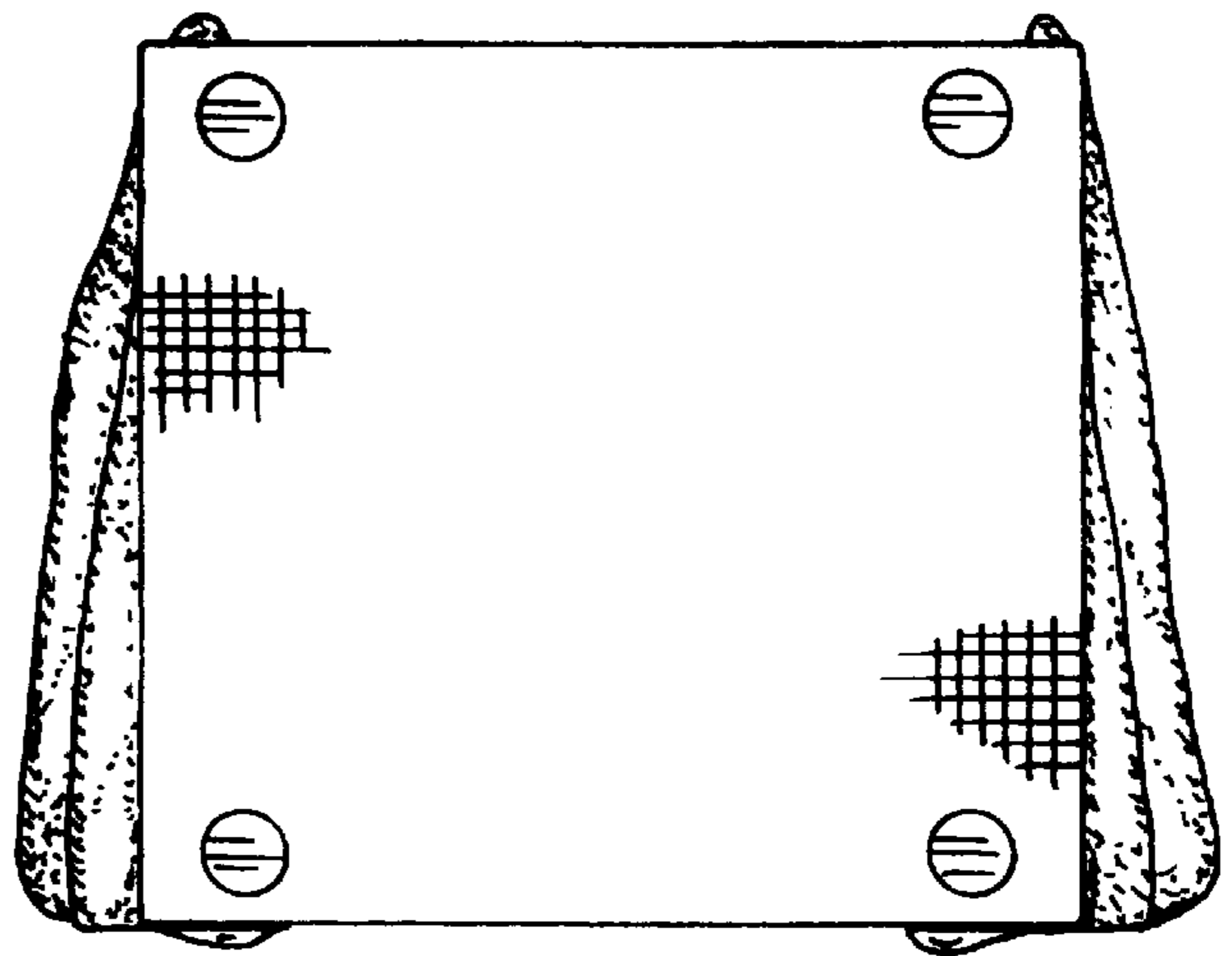
