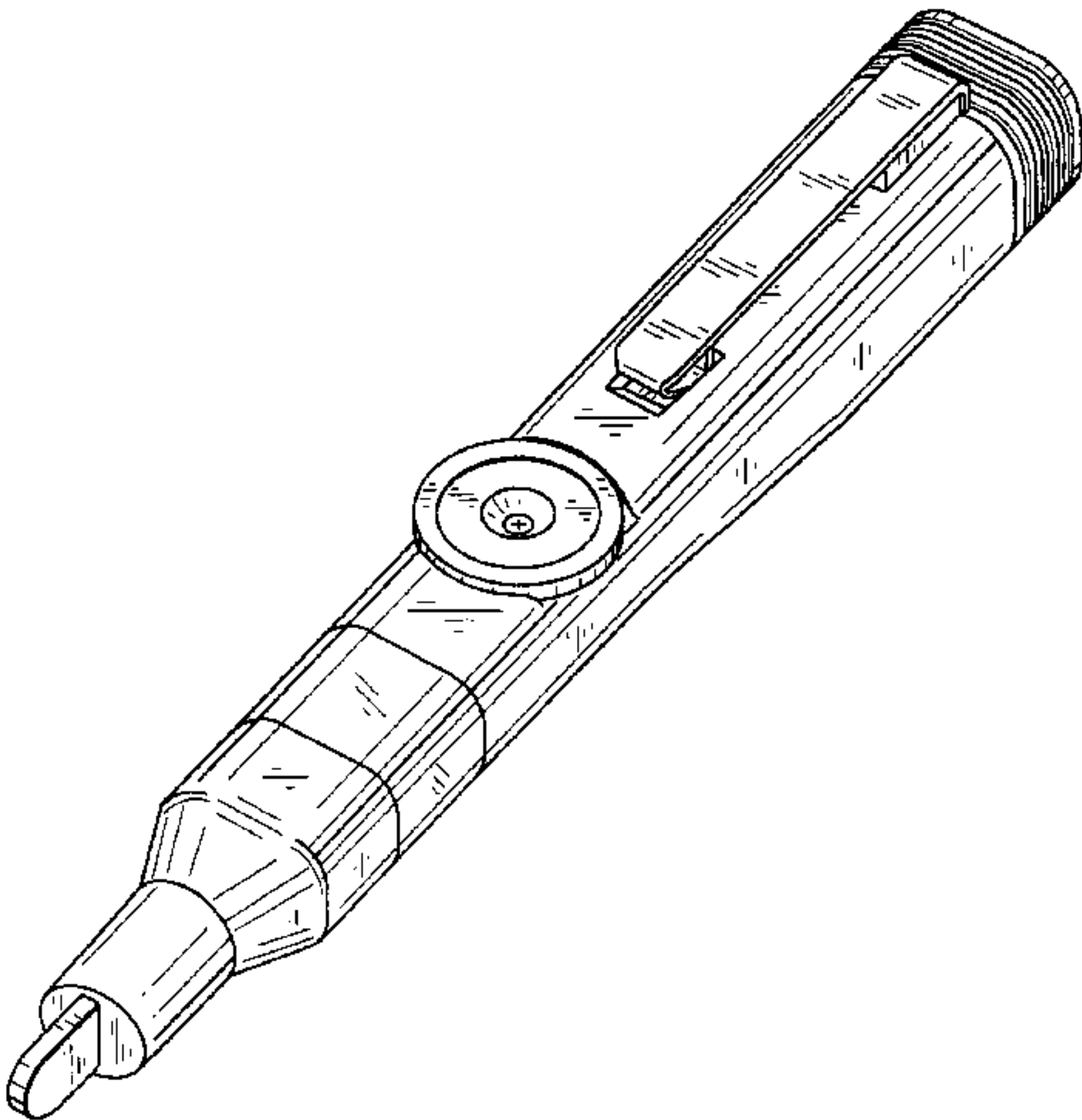
[57] CLAIM

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an electrical instrument
showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof, the left side
elevational view being a mirror image of FIG. 2;
FIG. 3 is a top elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a bottom elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 7 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of an
electrical instrument showing our new design;
FIG. 8 is a right side elevational view thereof, the left side
elevational view being a mirror image of FIG. 8;
FIG. 9 is a top elevational view thereof;
FIG. 10 is a bottom elevational view thereof;
FIG. 11 is a front elevational view thereof; and,
FIG. 12 is a rear elevational view thereof.

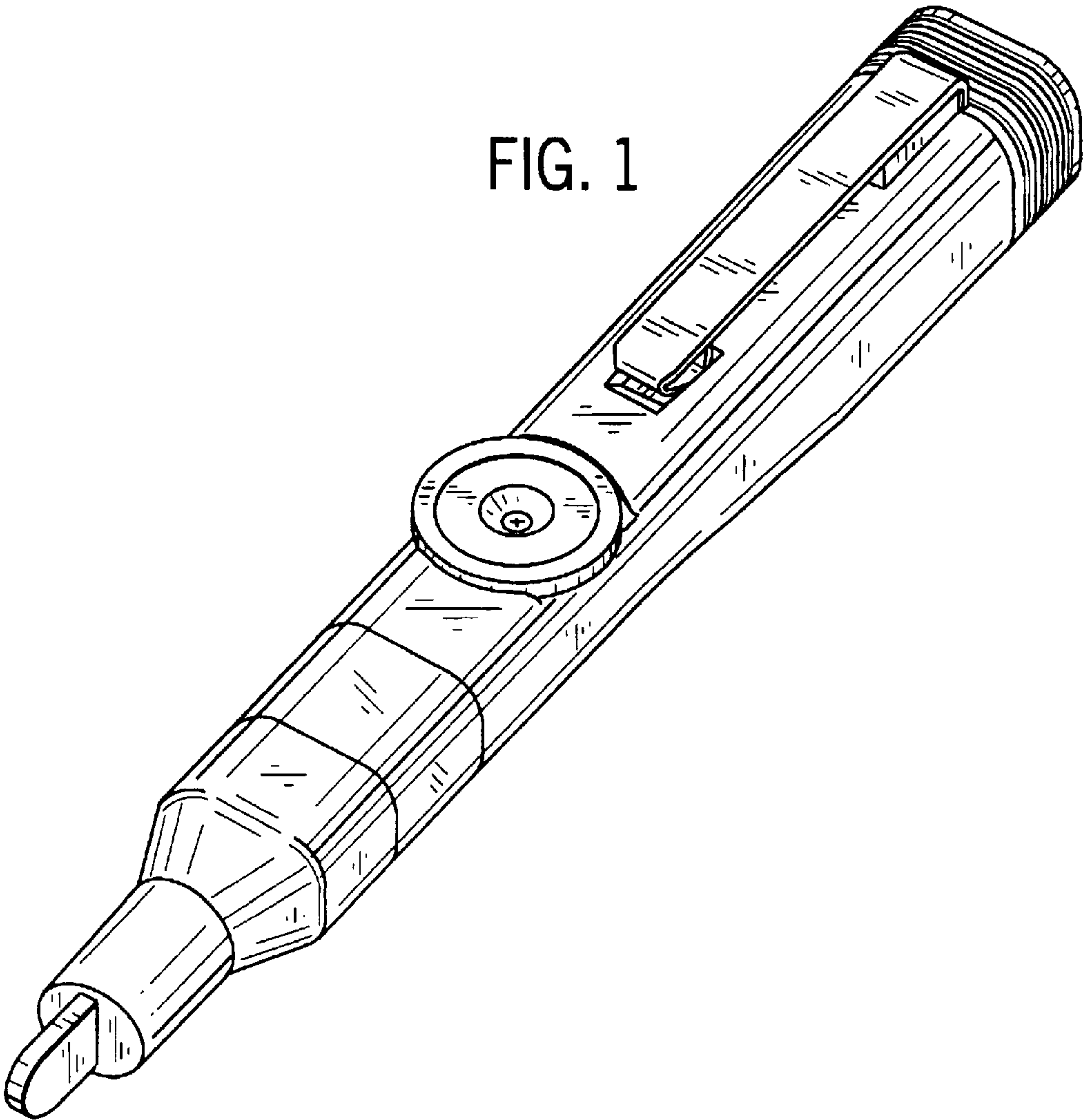

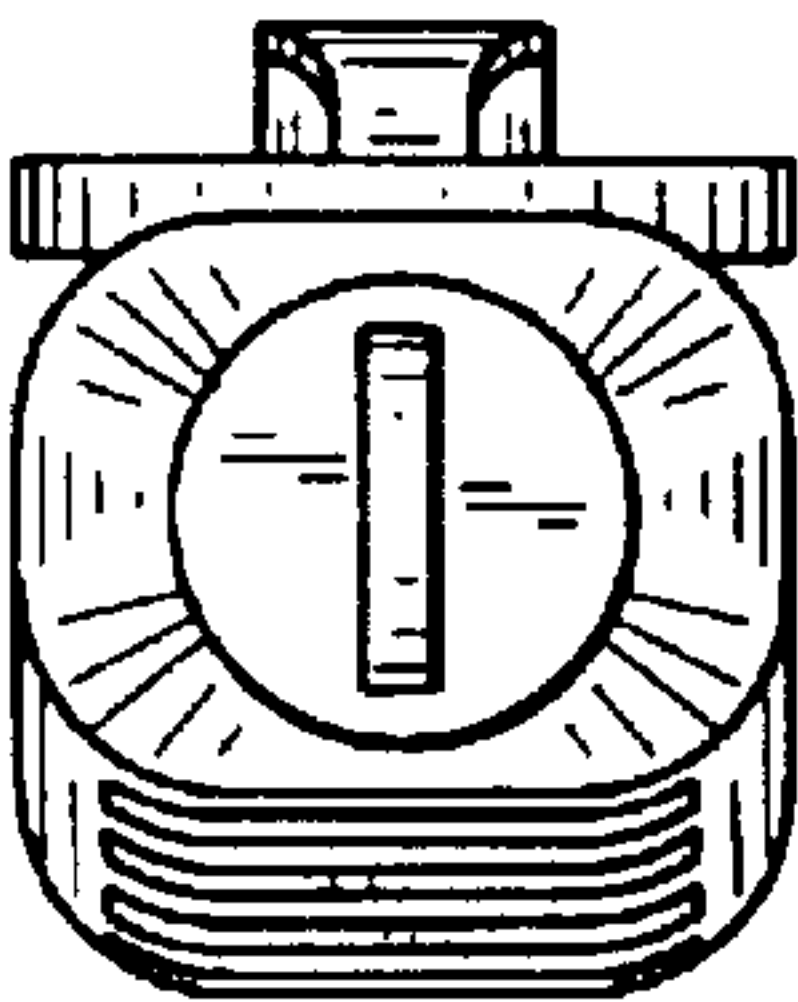

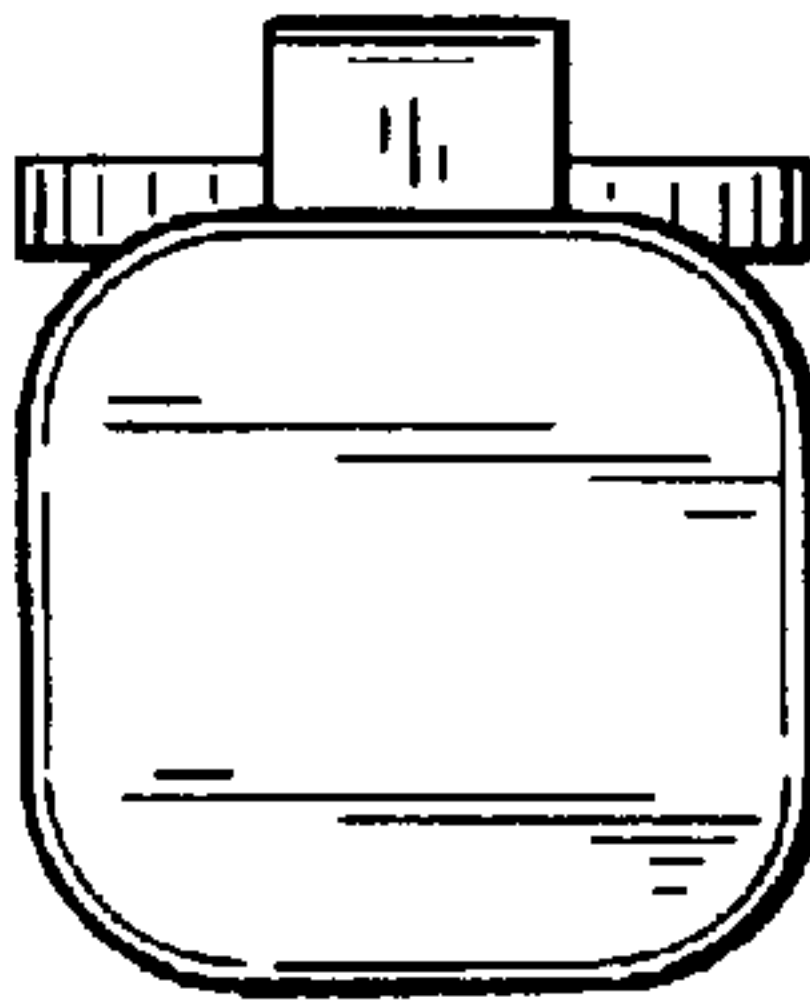

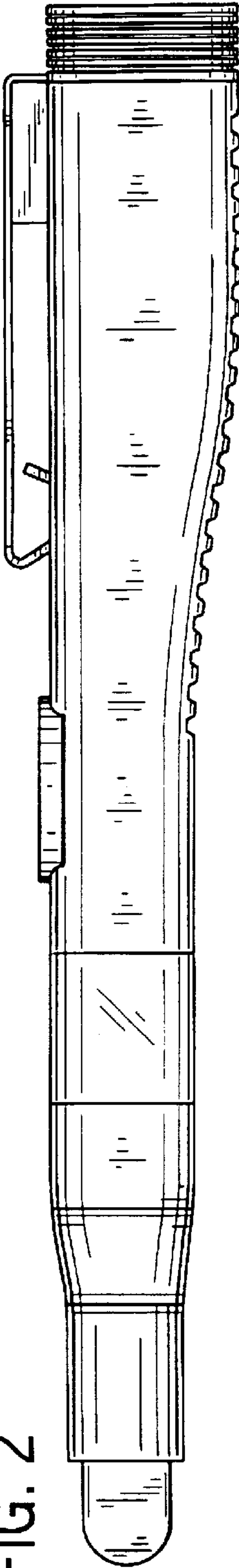

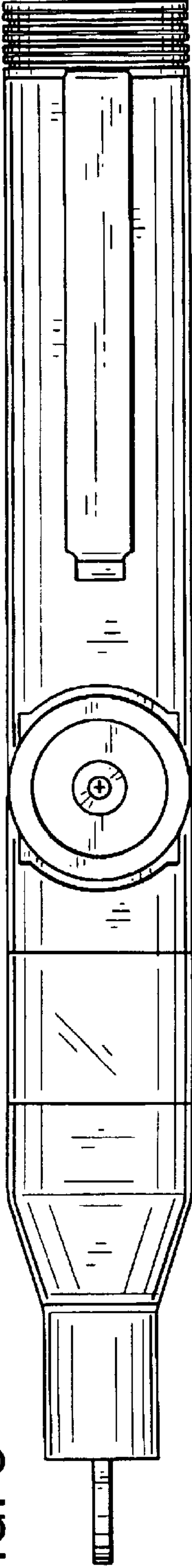
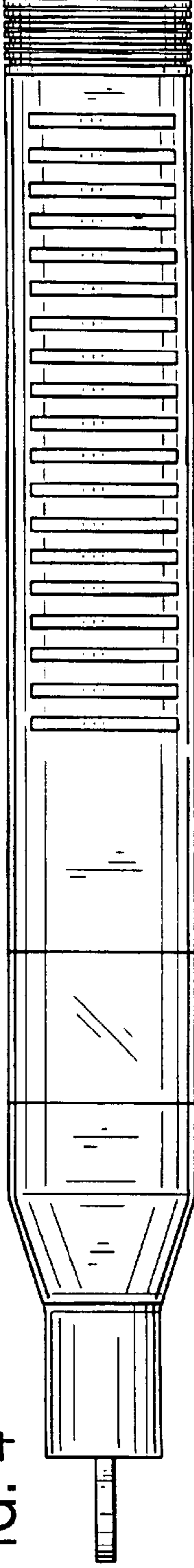

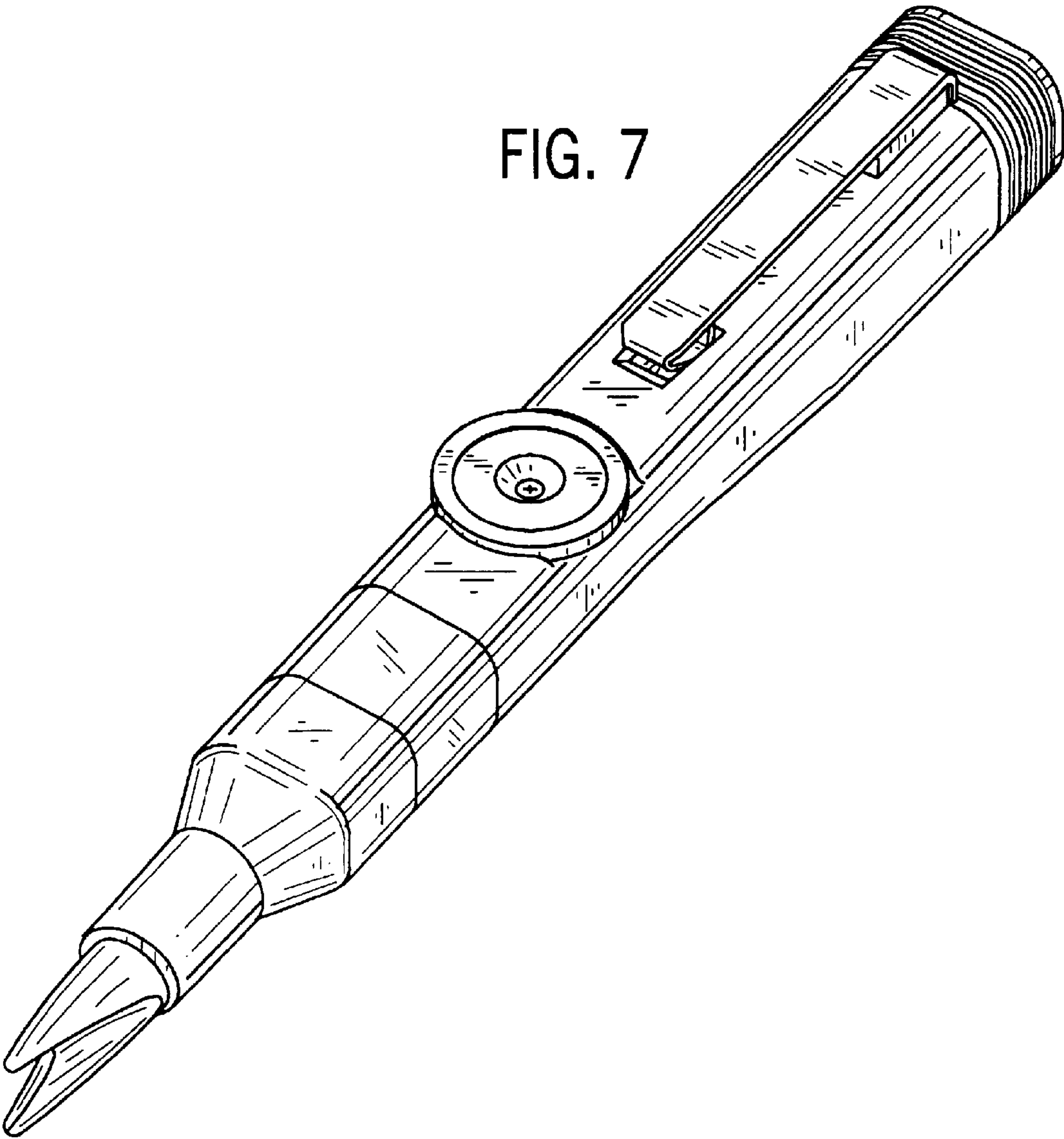

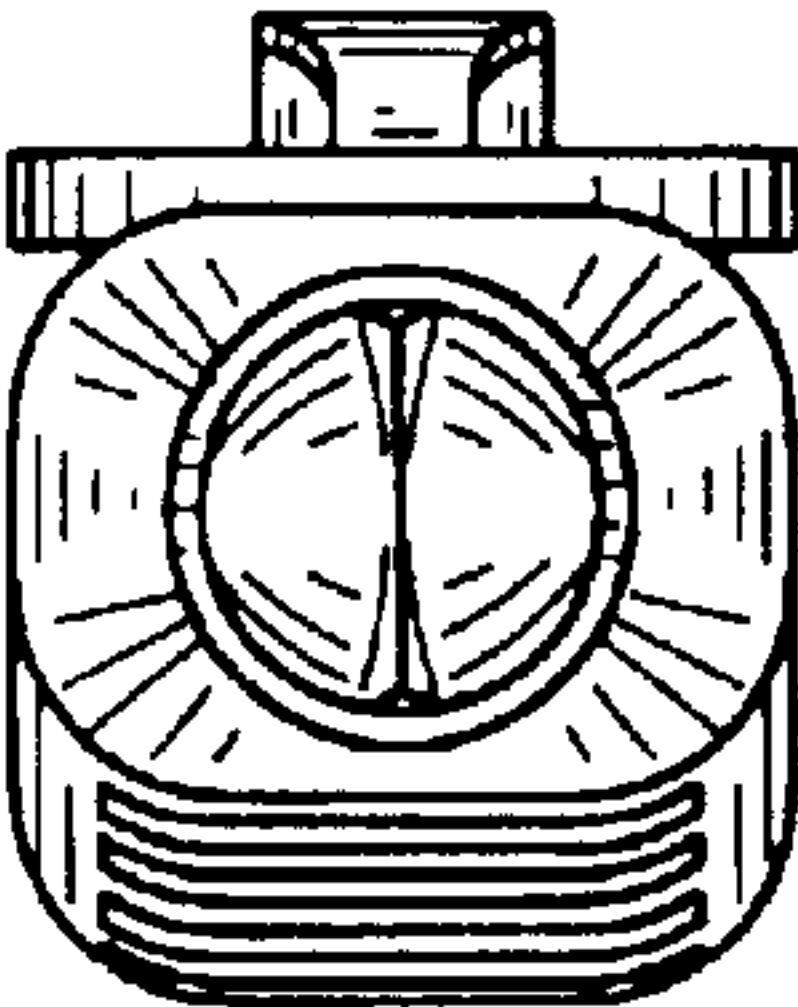

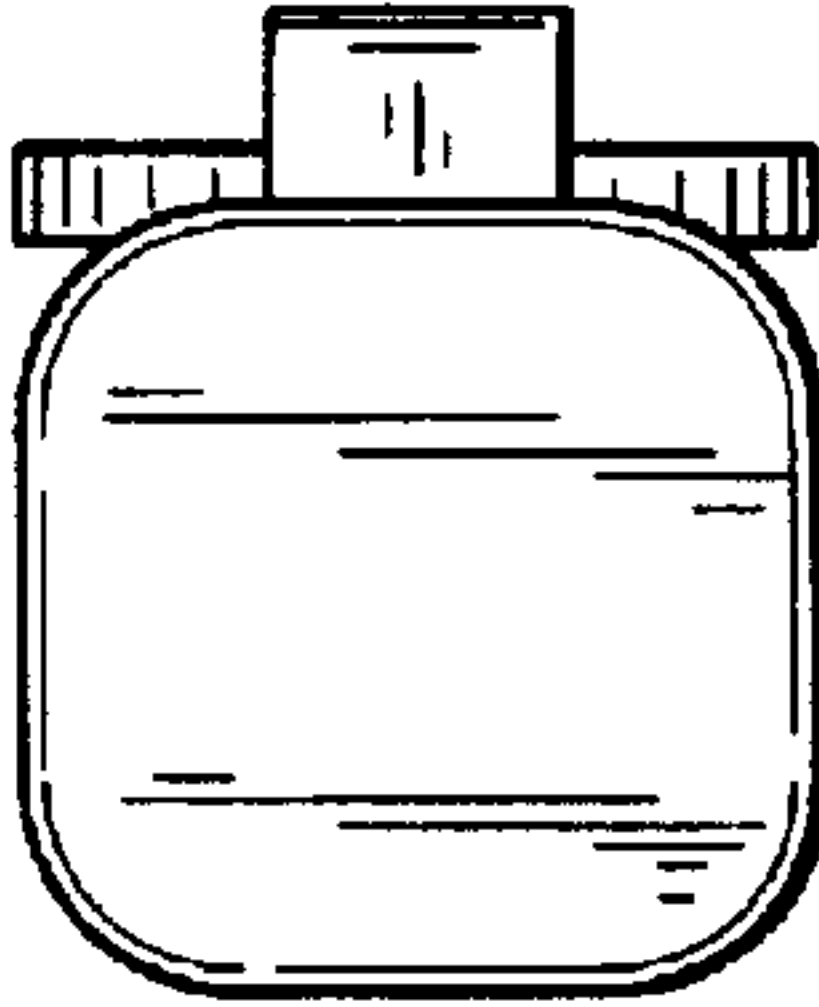

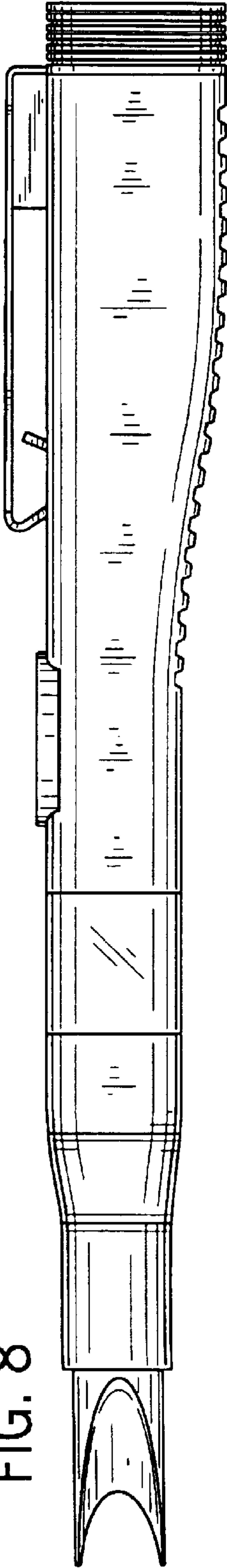

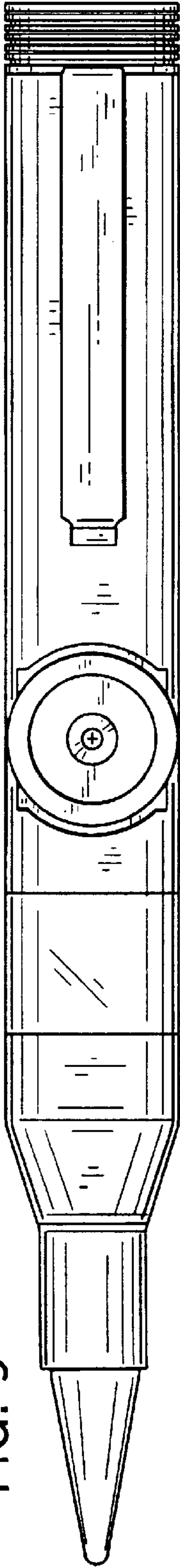
