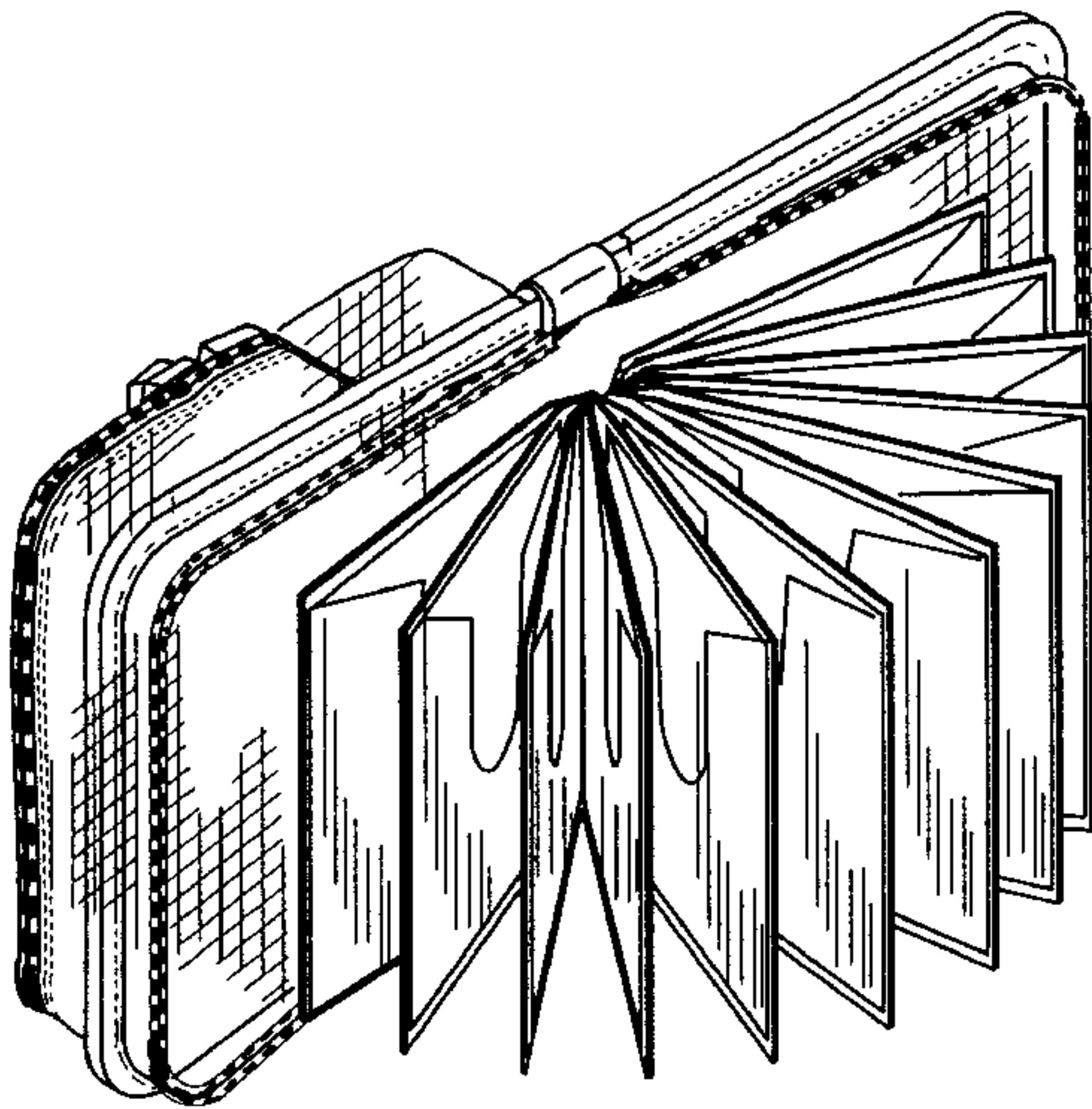
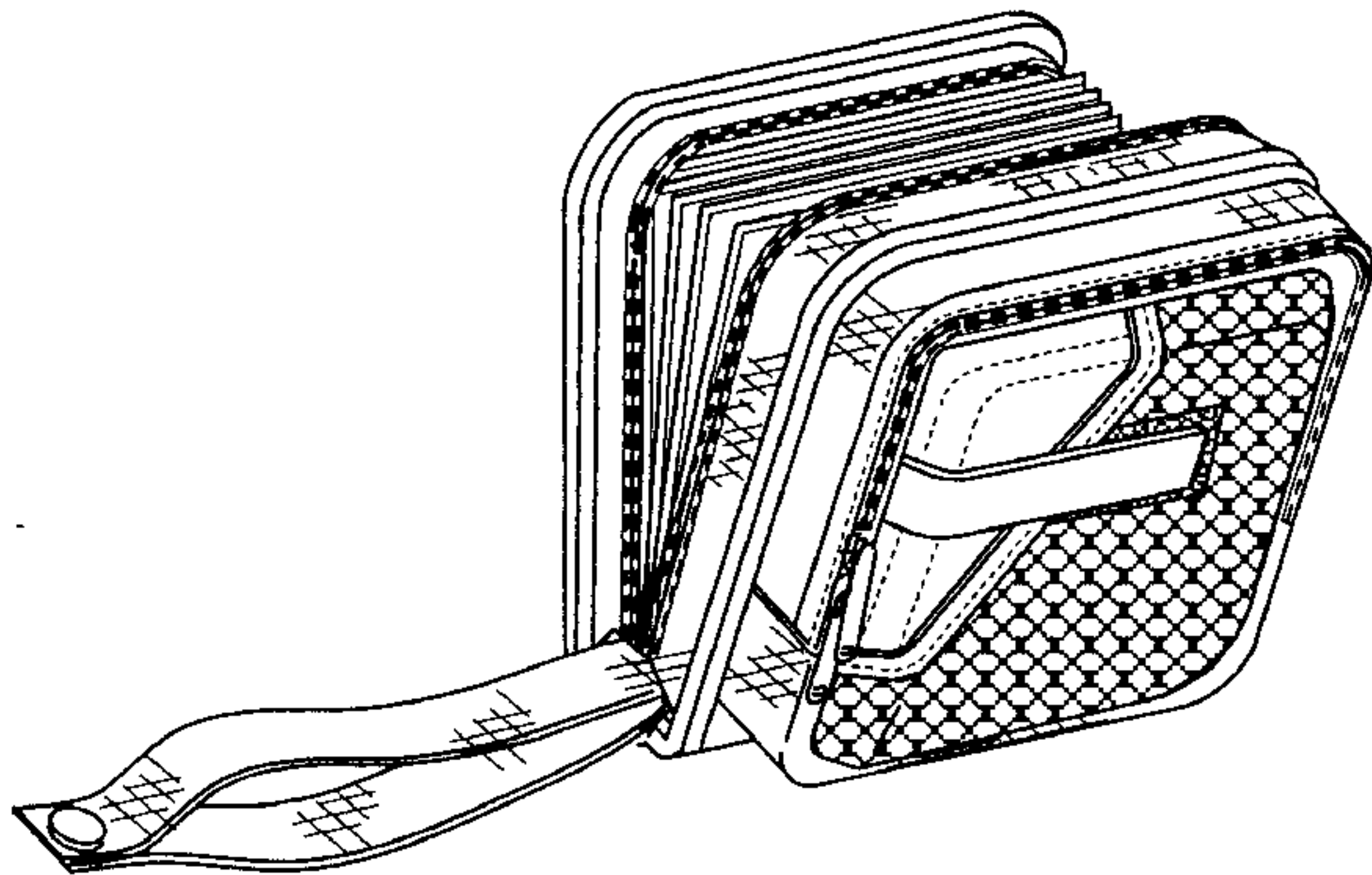
[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a case for holding a compact disc player and compact discs with associated handle, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a case for holding a compact disc player and compact discs with associated handle showing my new design in a partially open condition, the broken lines showing an object in the outer pocket being for illustrative purposes only and forming no part of the claimed design;
FIG. 2 is a front perspective view thereof shown in a fully open position;
FIG. 3 is a rear perspective view of FIG. 2;
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view of FIG. 2;
FIG. 5 is a right side elevational view of FIG. 2;
FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 2;
FIG. 7 is a top plan view of FIG. 2;
FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of FIG. 2; and,
FIG. 9 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 2.
The broken lines shown on the claimed article throughout the views are understood to represent stitching.

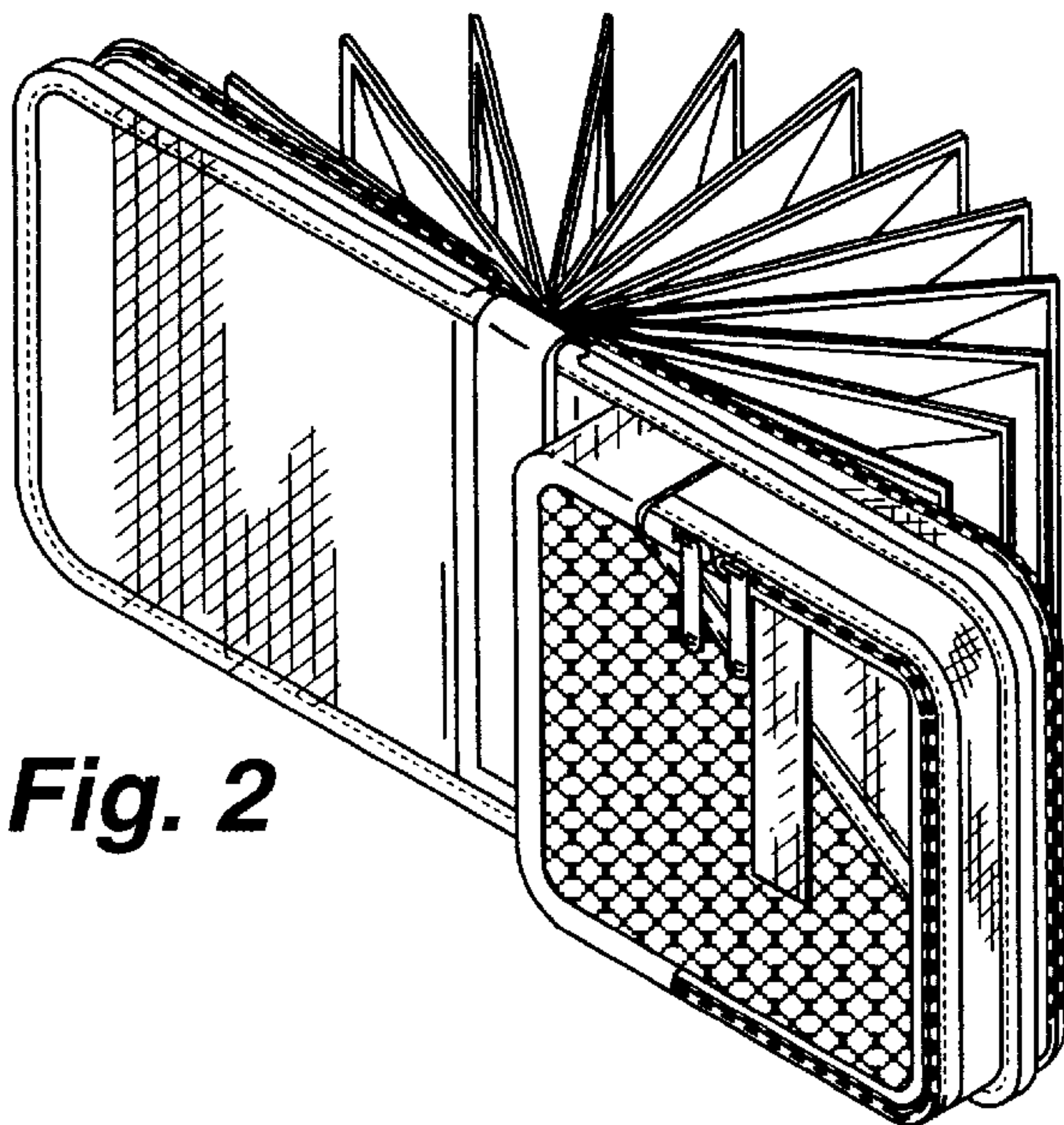

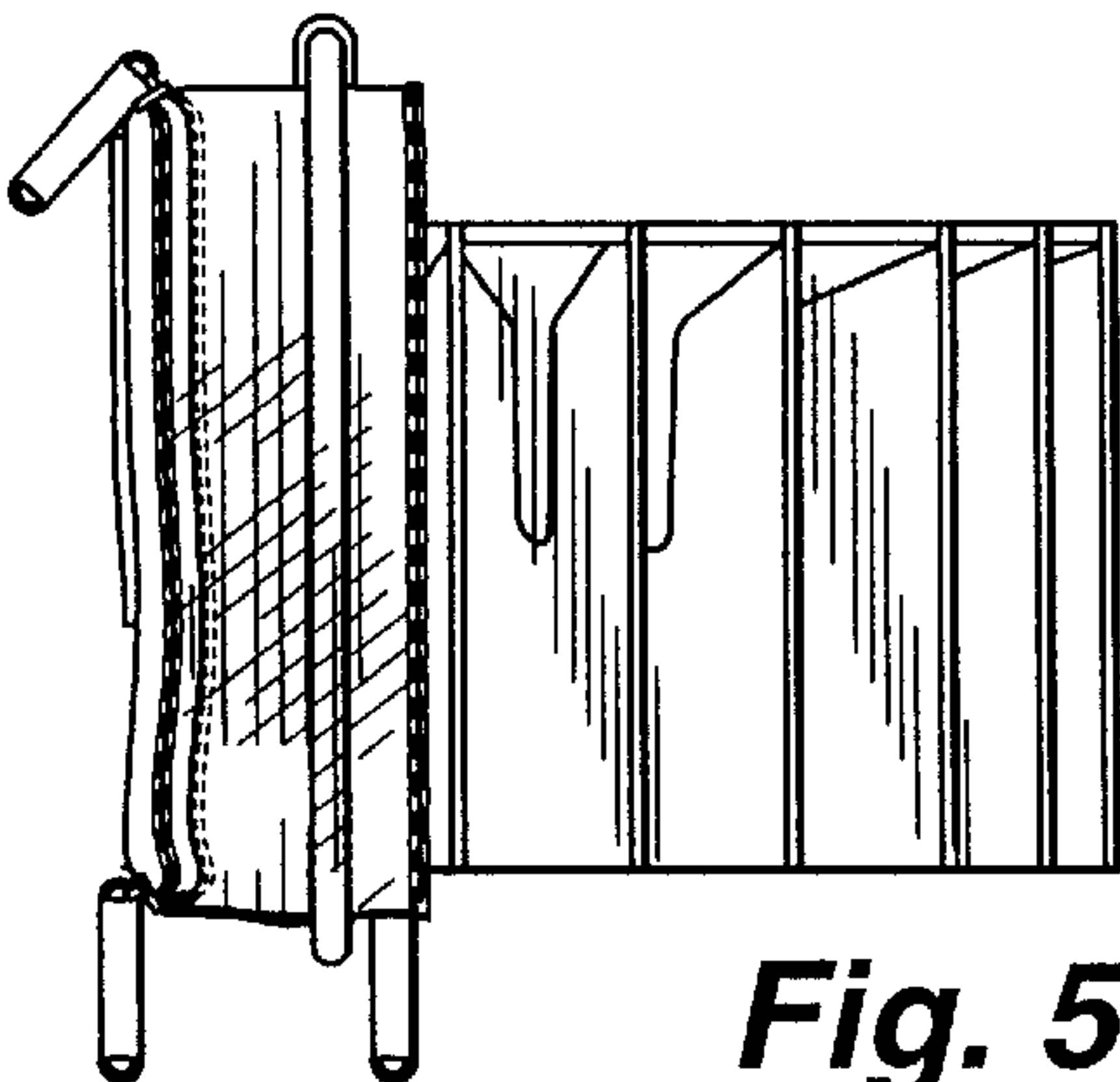

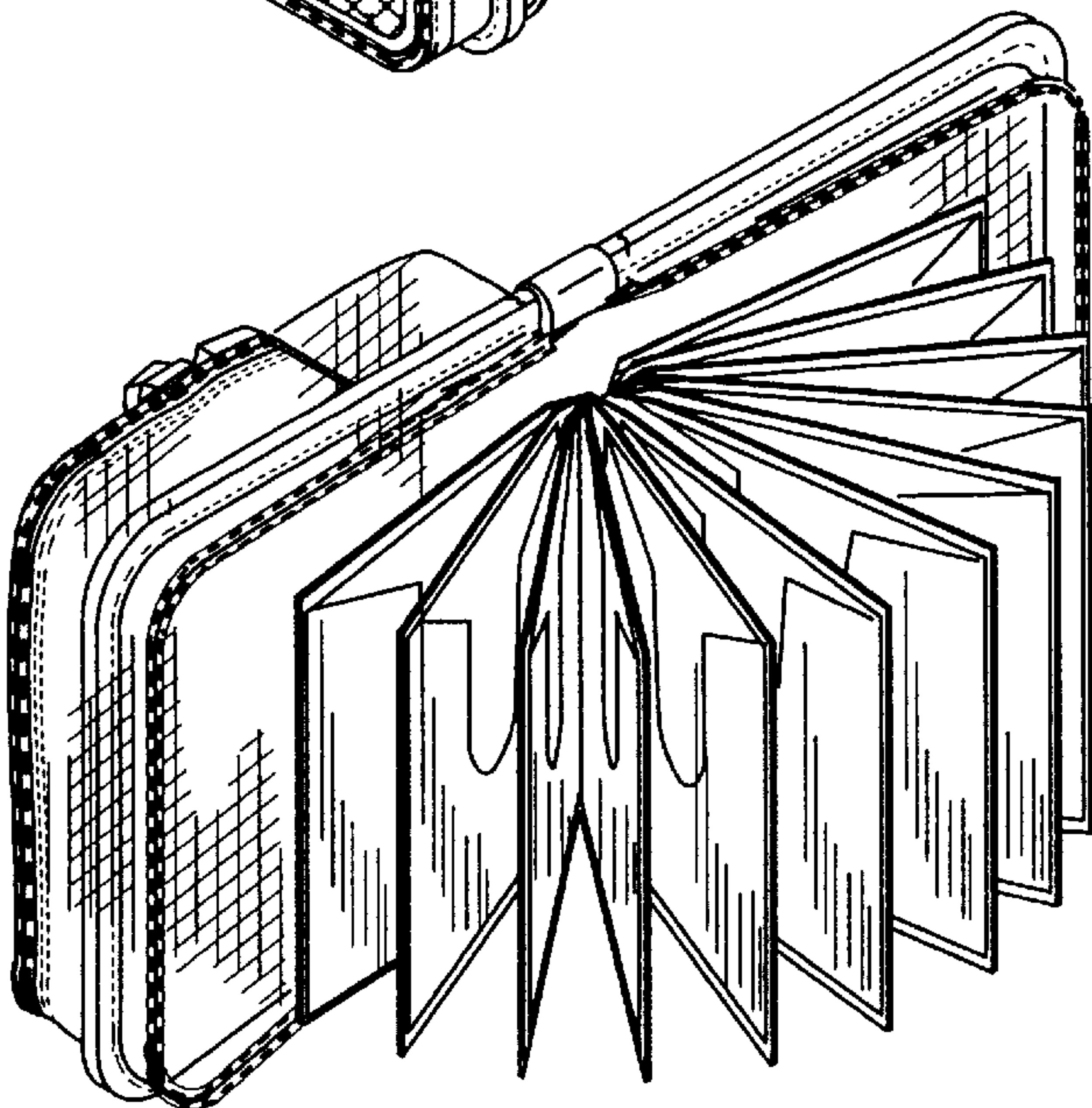

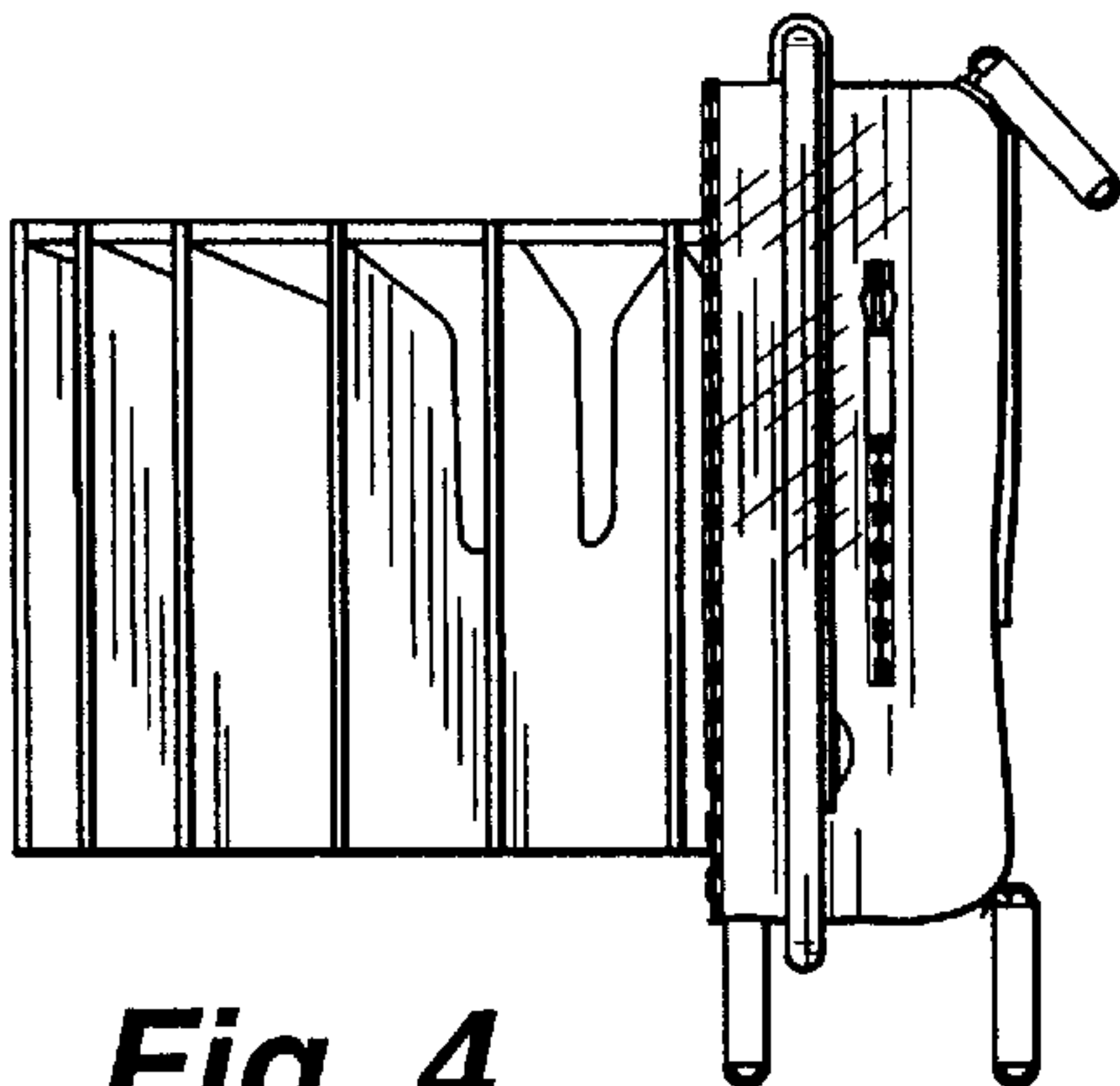

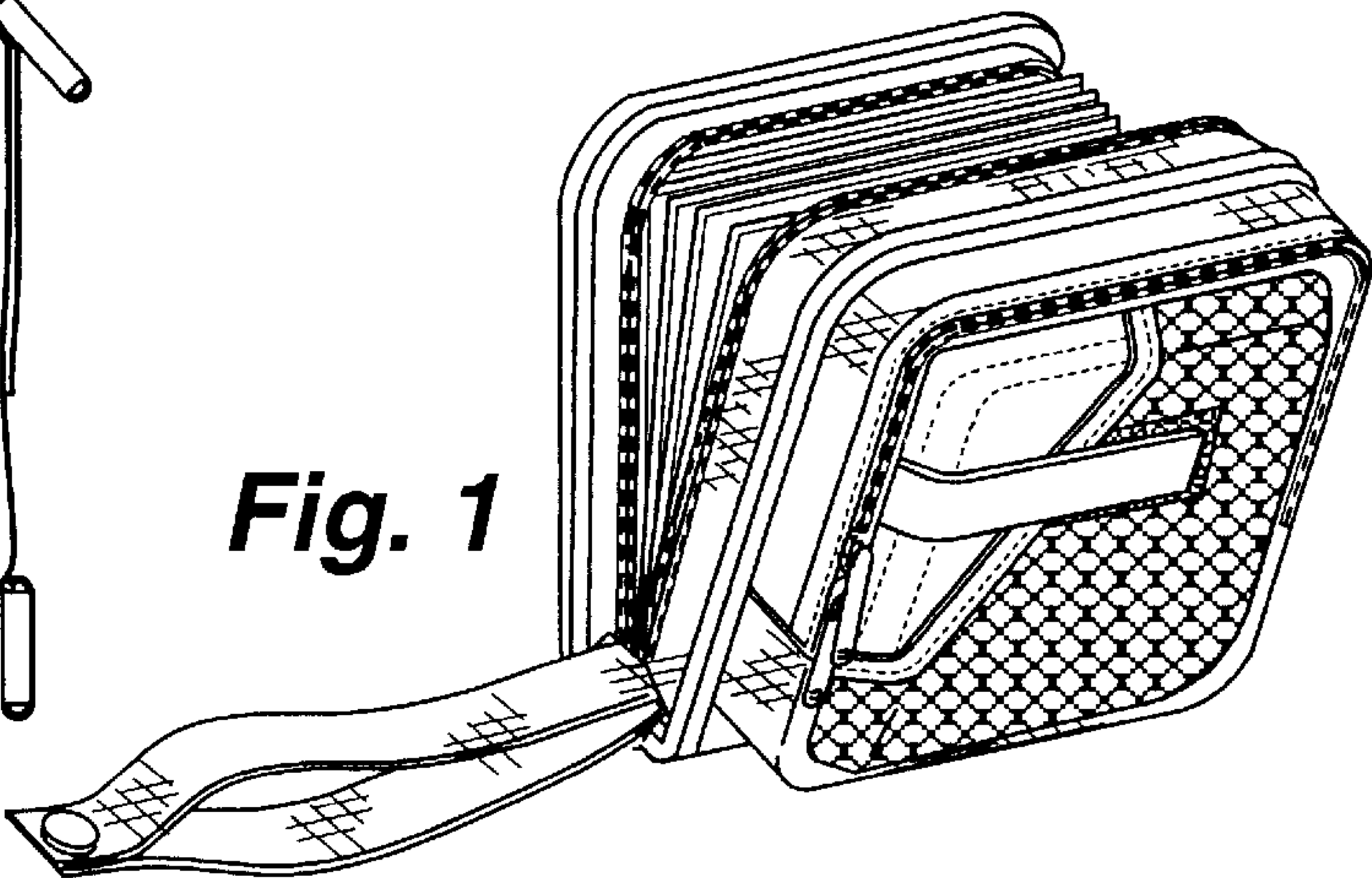

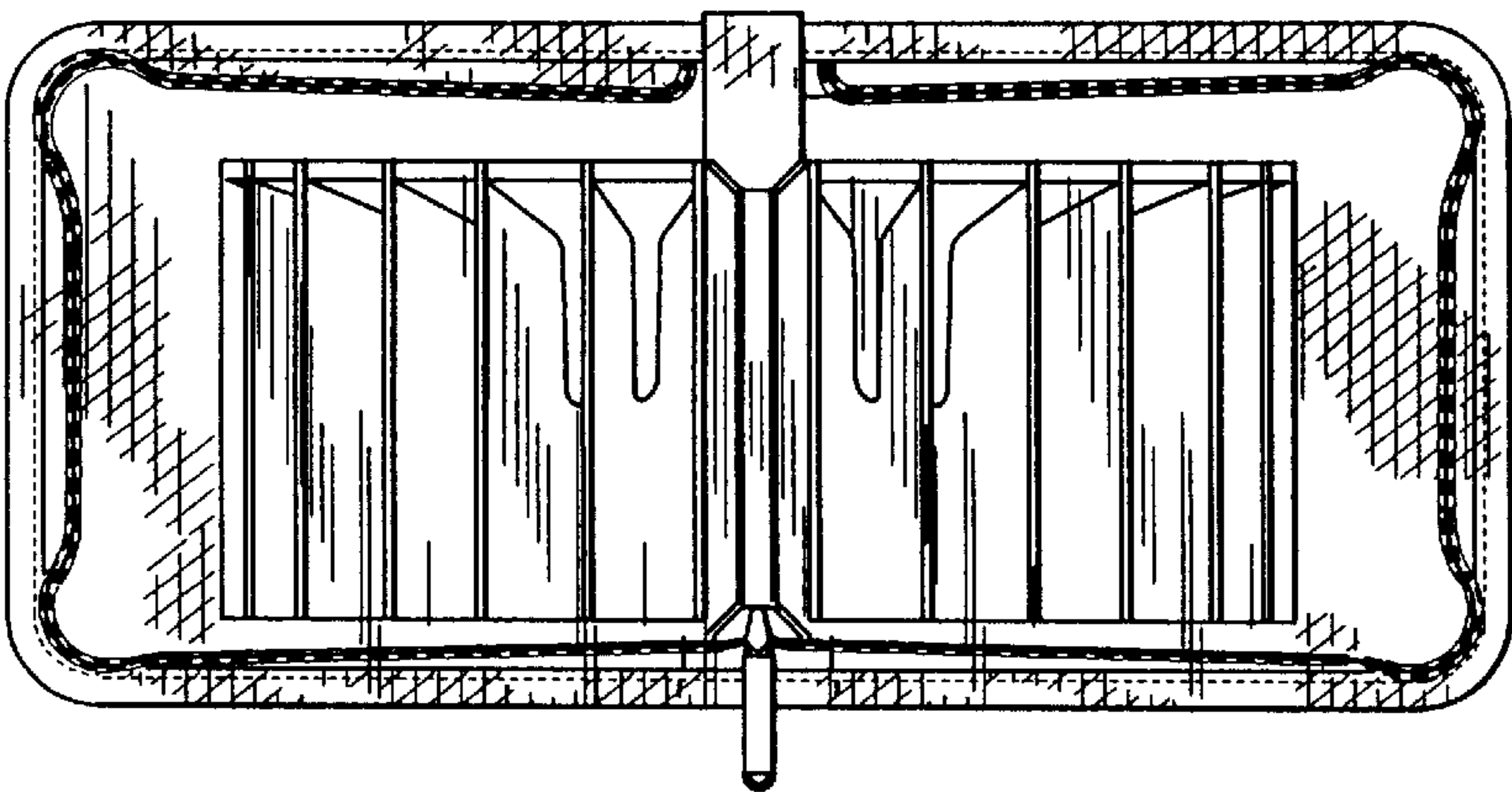

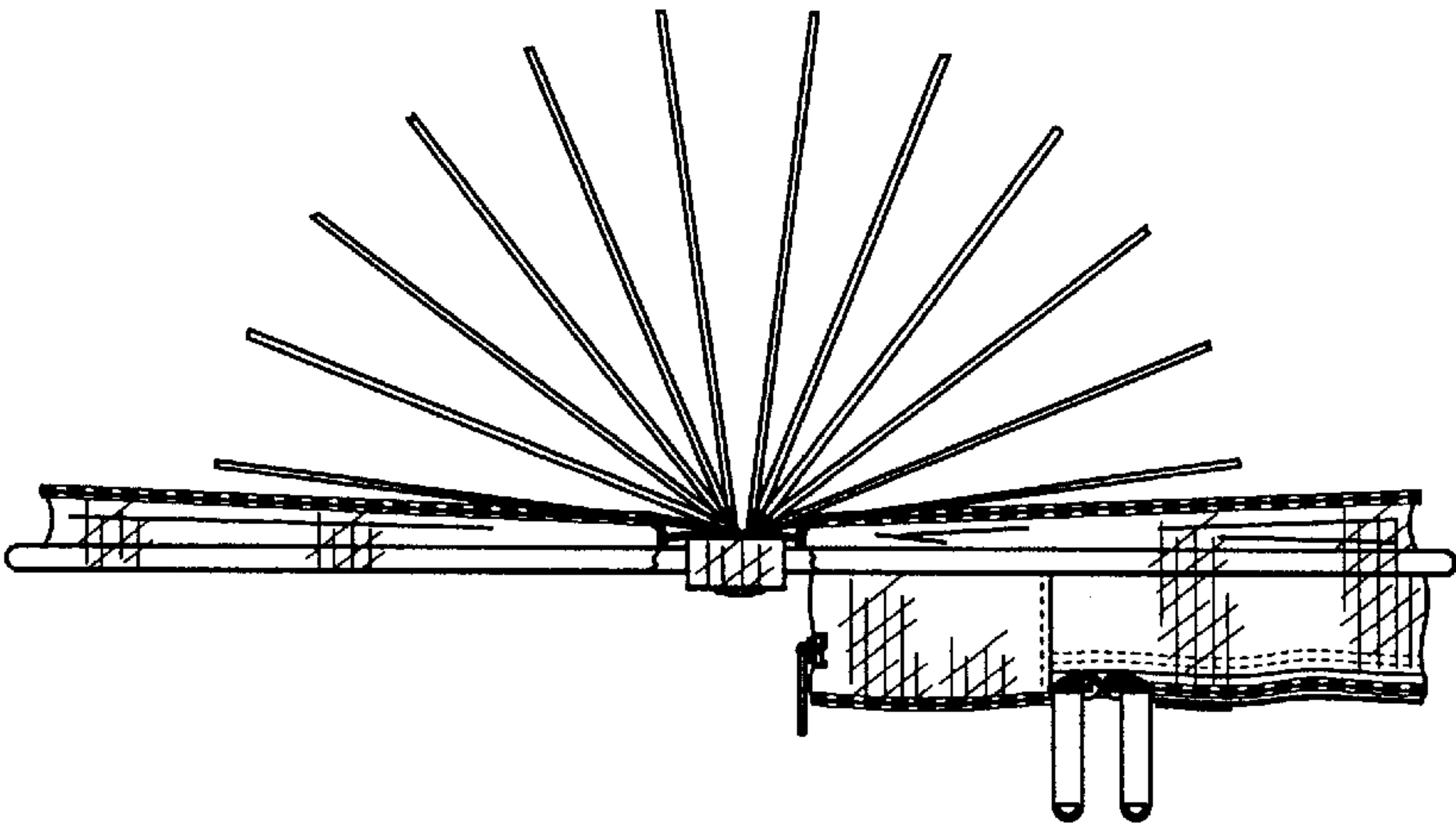

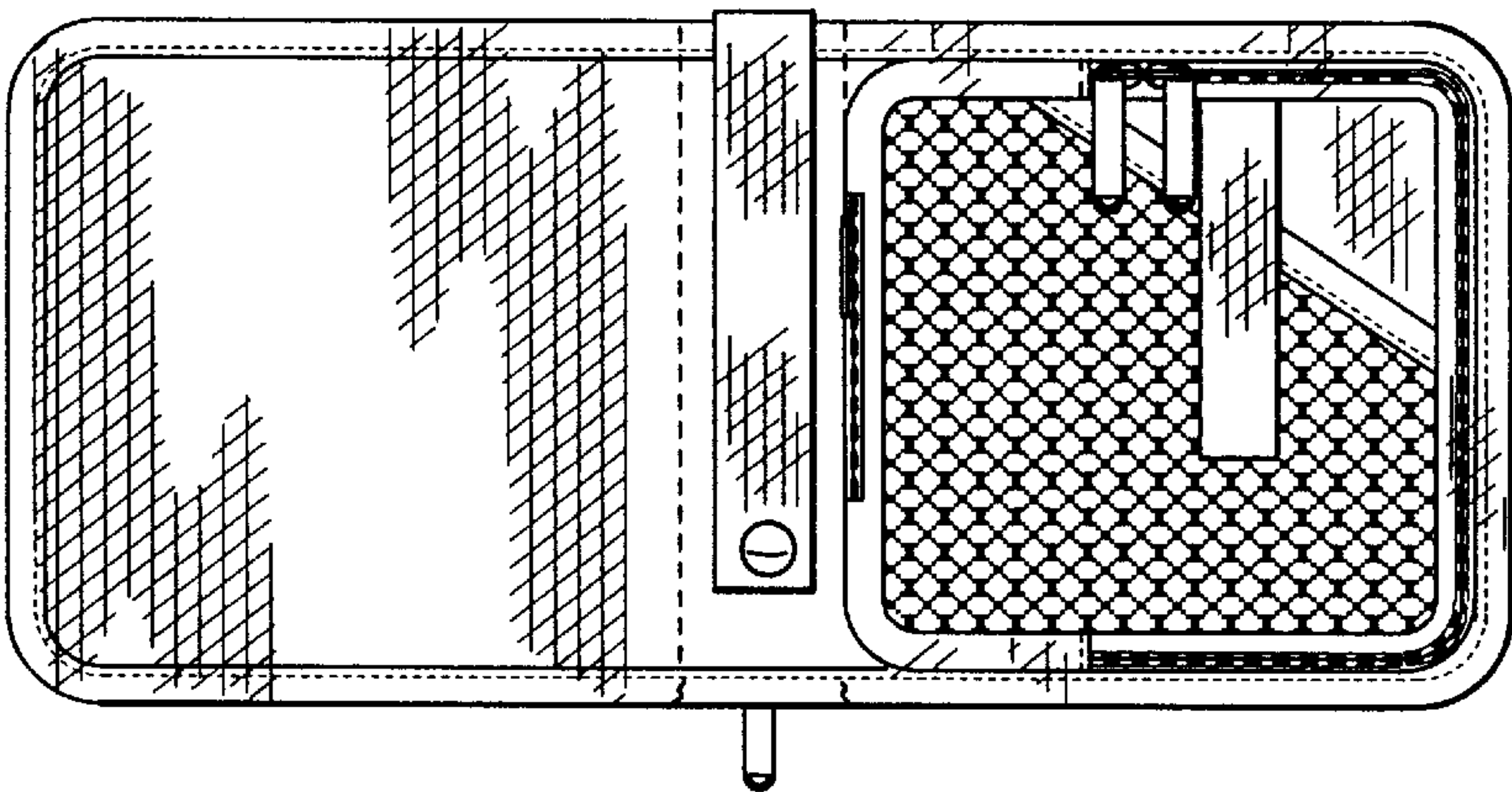
