**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a cap showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevation view of the cap;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevation view of the cap;

FIG. 4 is a left side elevation view of the cap;

FIG. 5 is a right side elevation view of the cap;

FIG. 6 is a top elevation view of the cap;

FIG. 9 is a rear elevation view of the cap of the second embodiment;

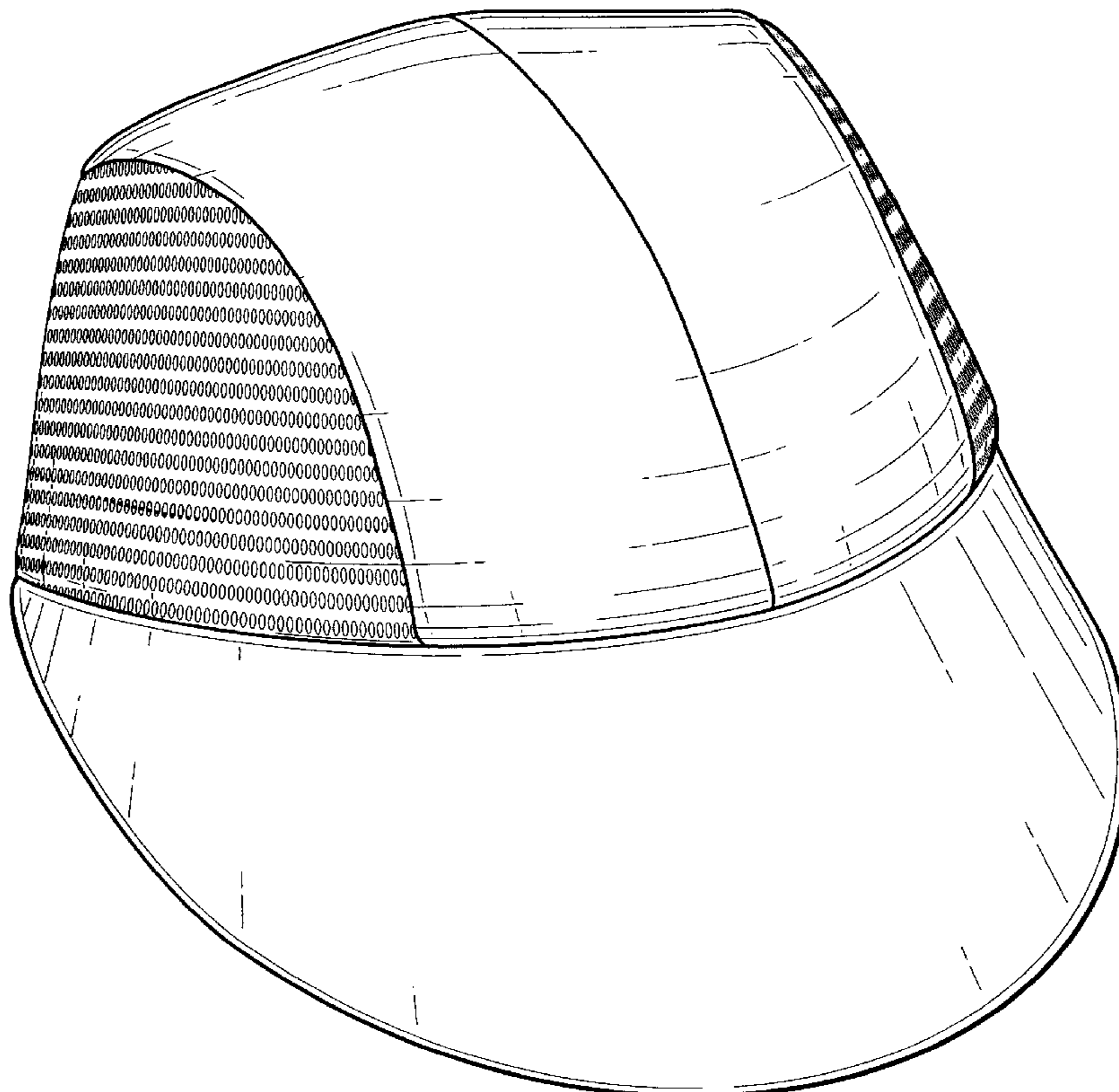
FIG. 10 is a left side elevation view of the cap of the second embodiment;

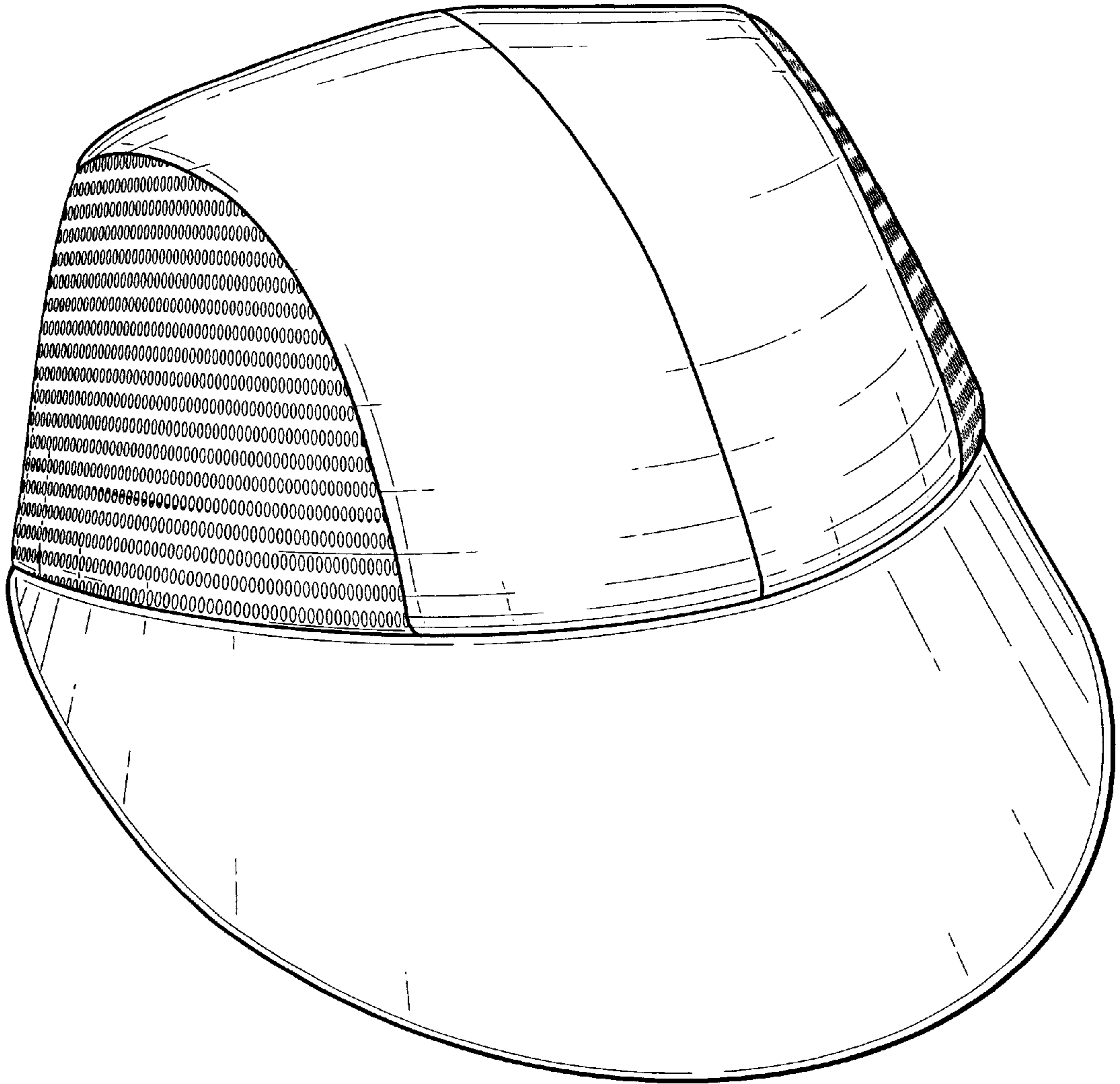

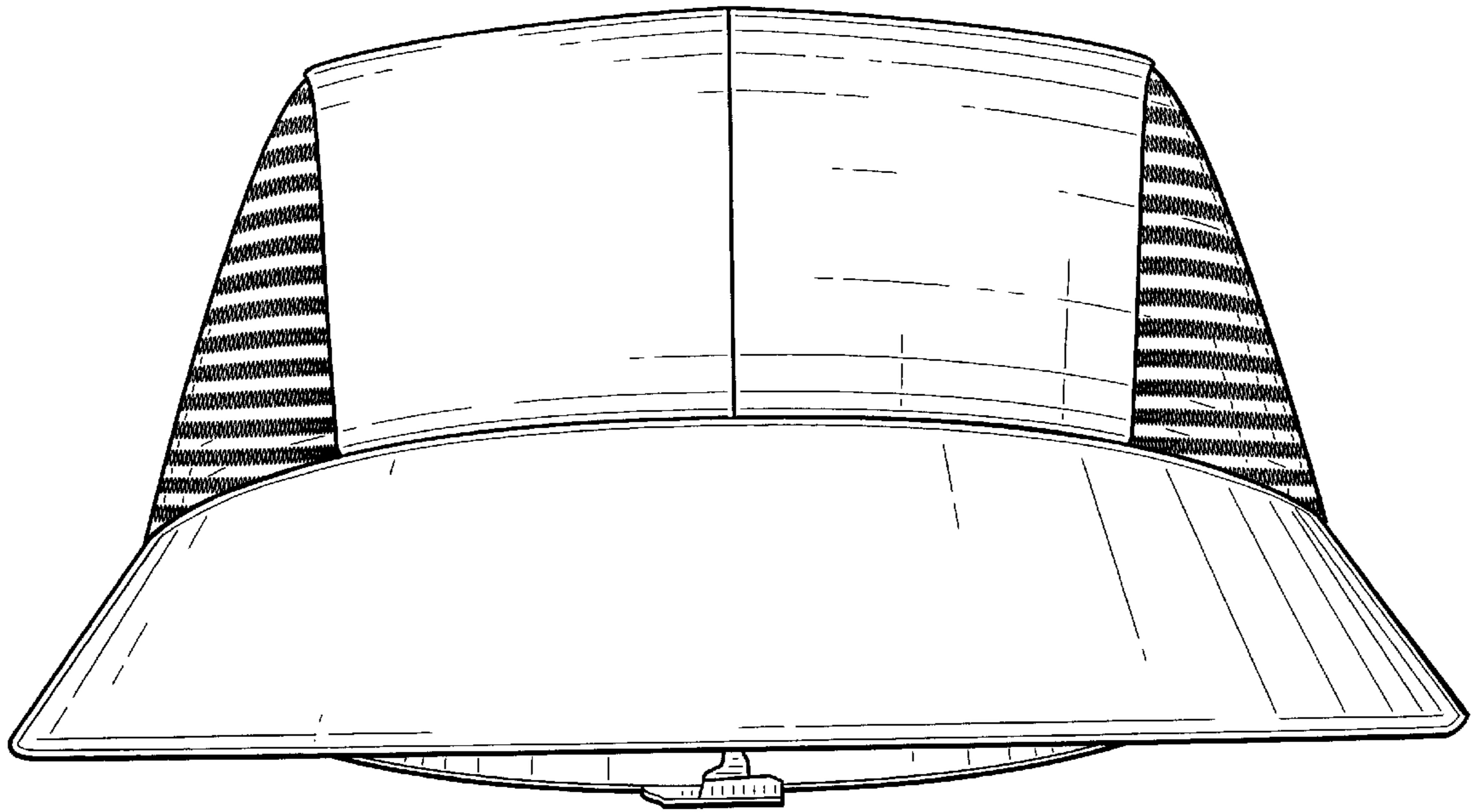

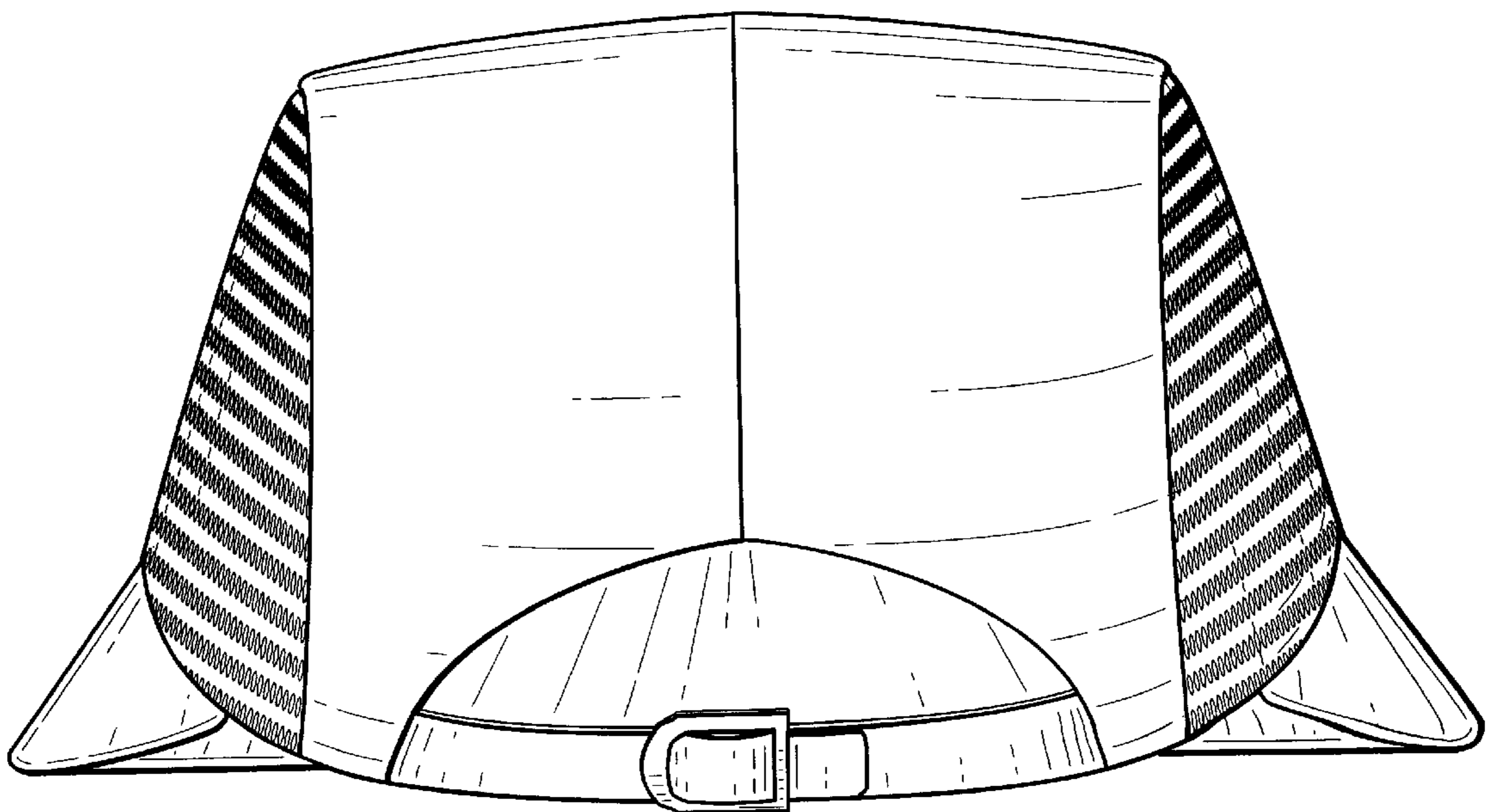

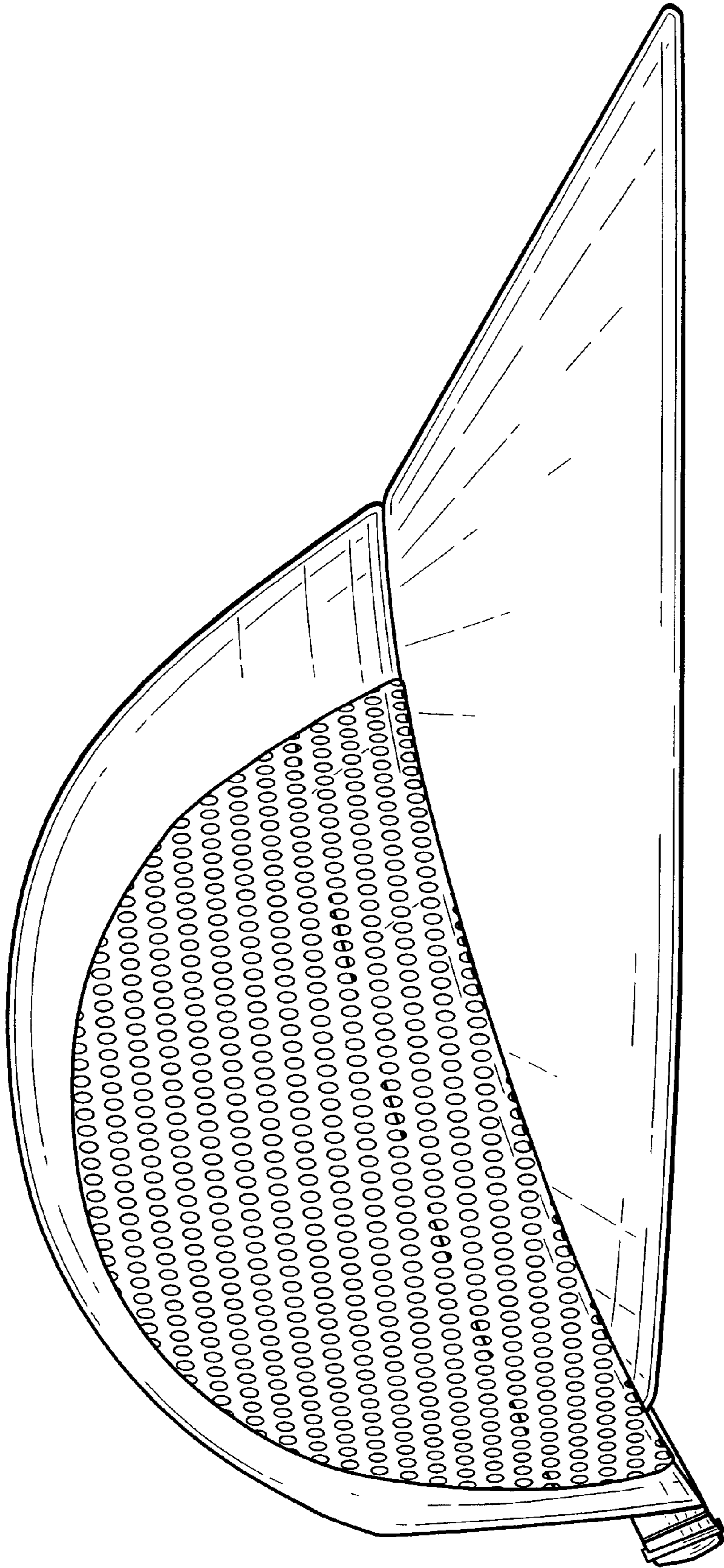

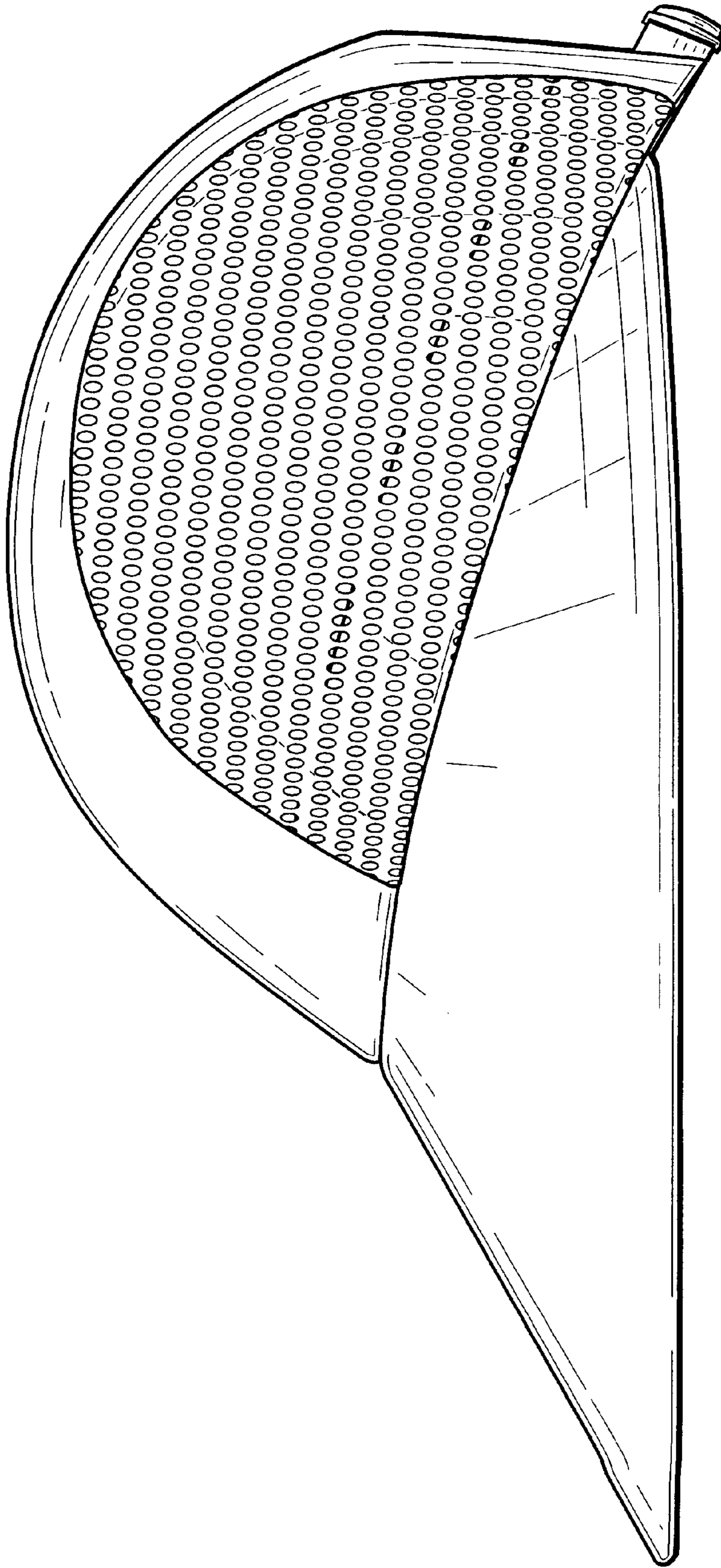

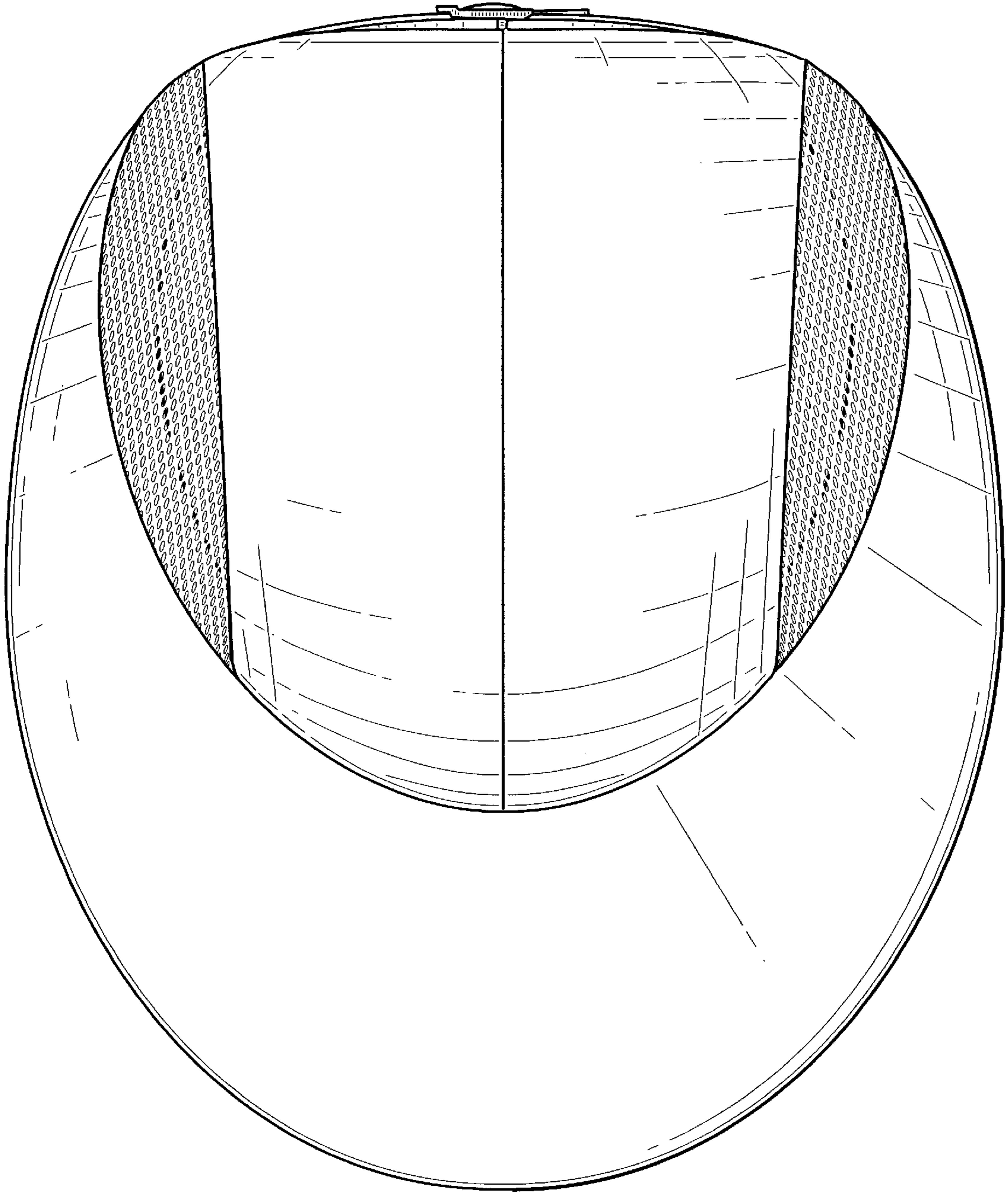

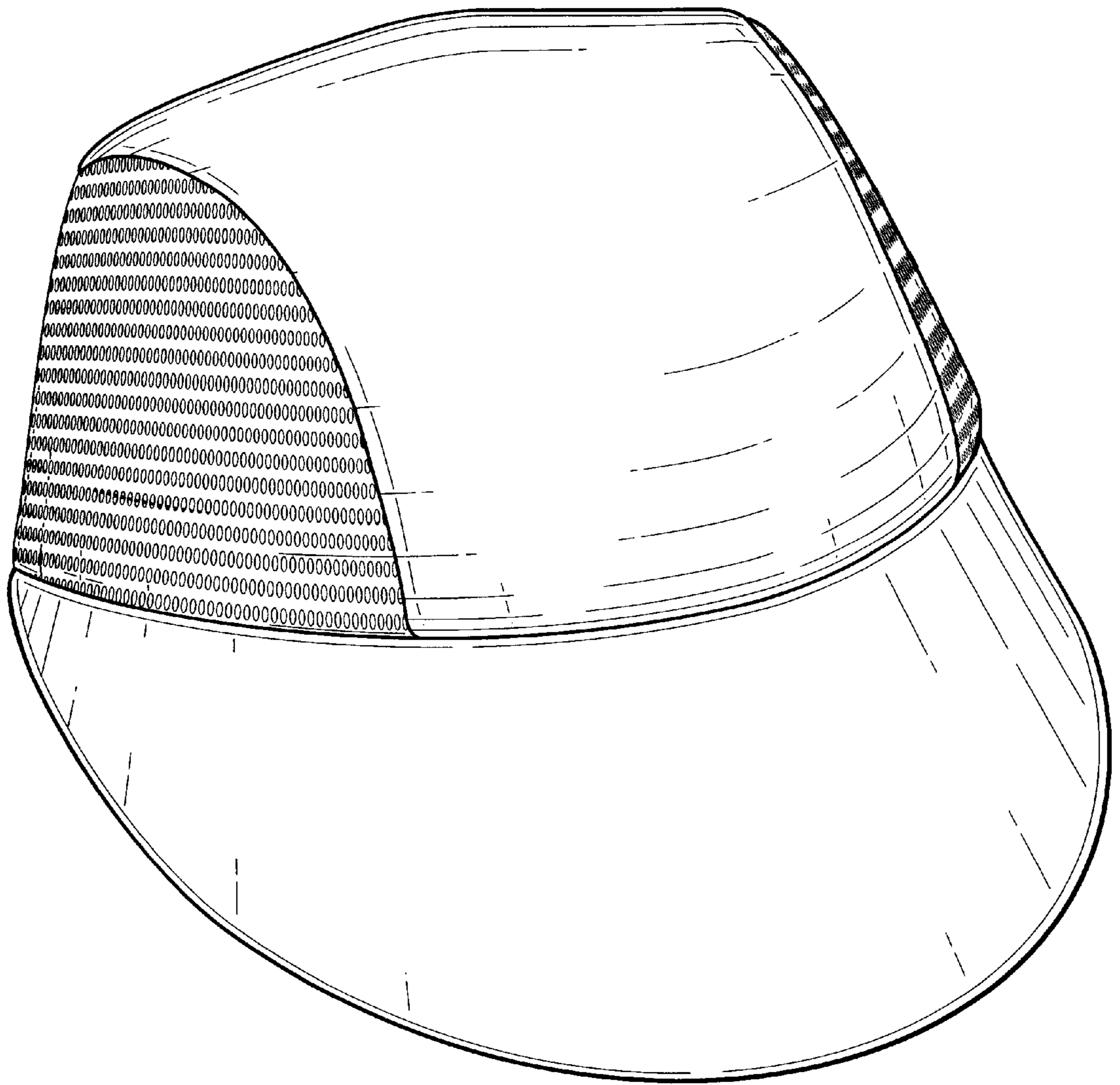

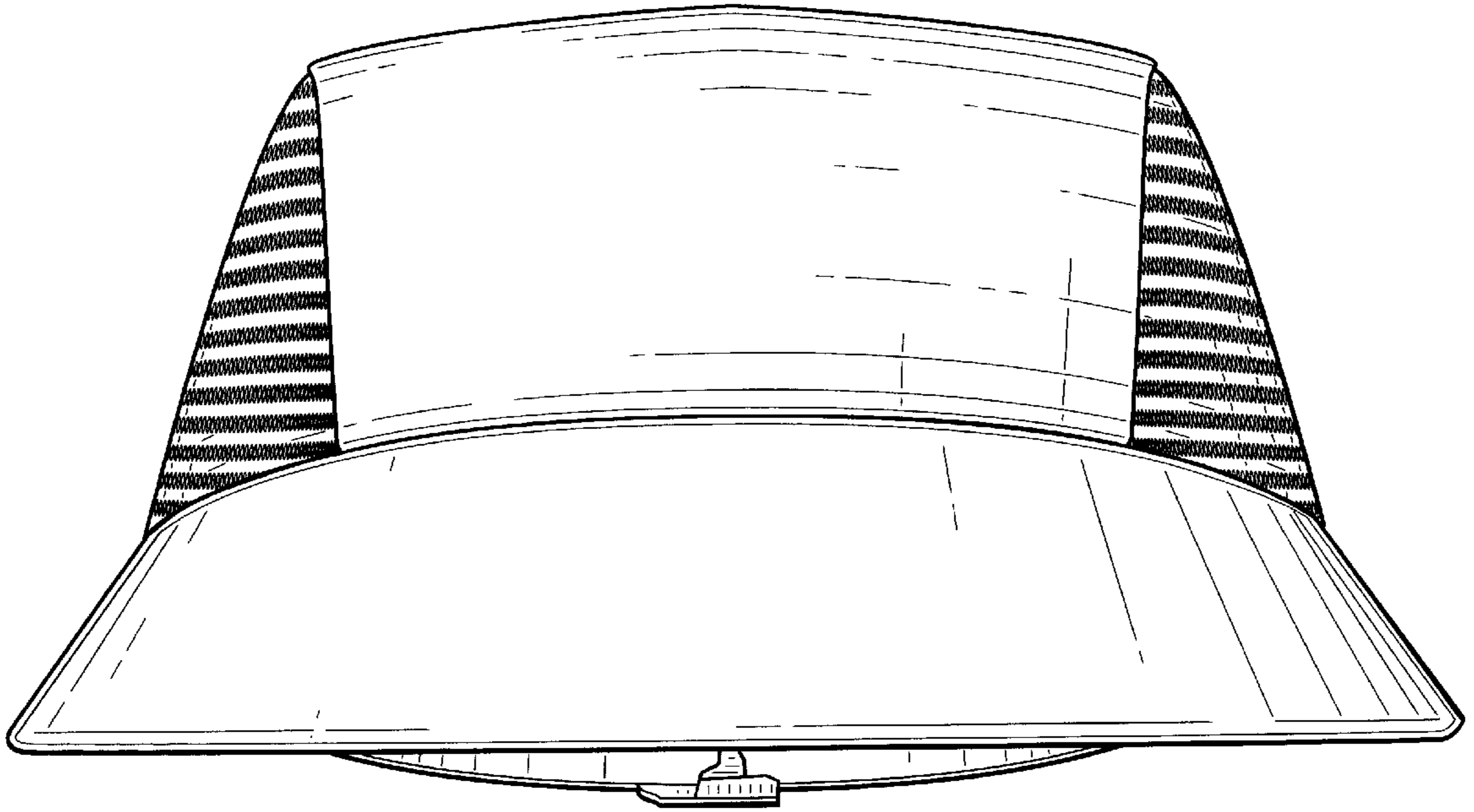

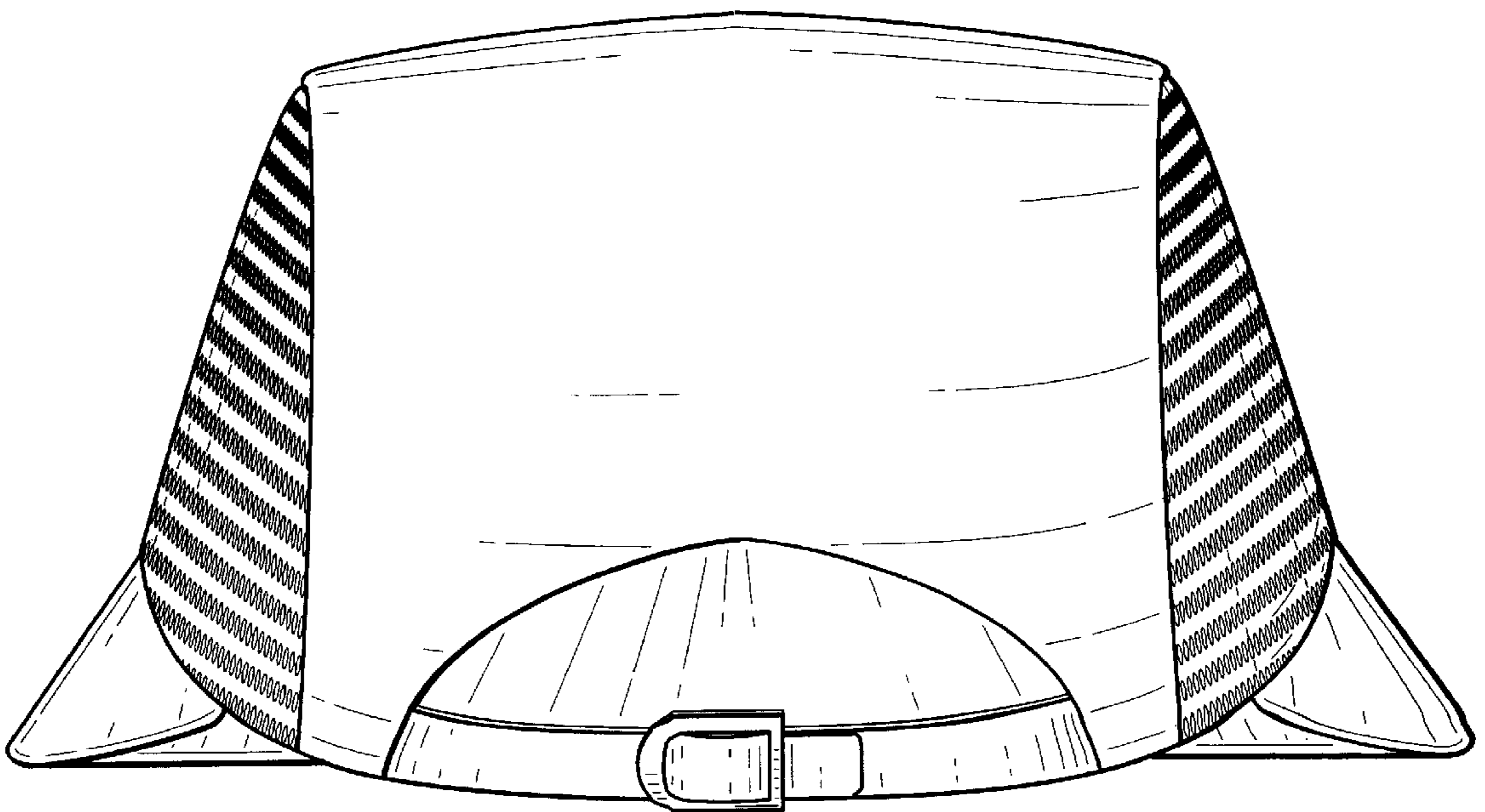

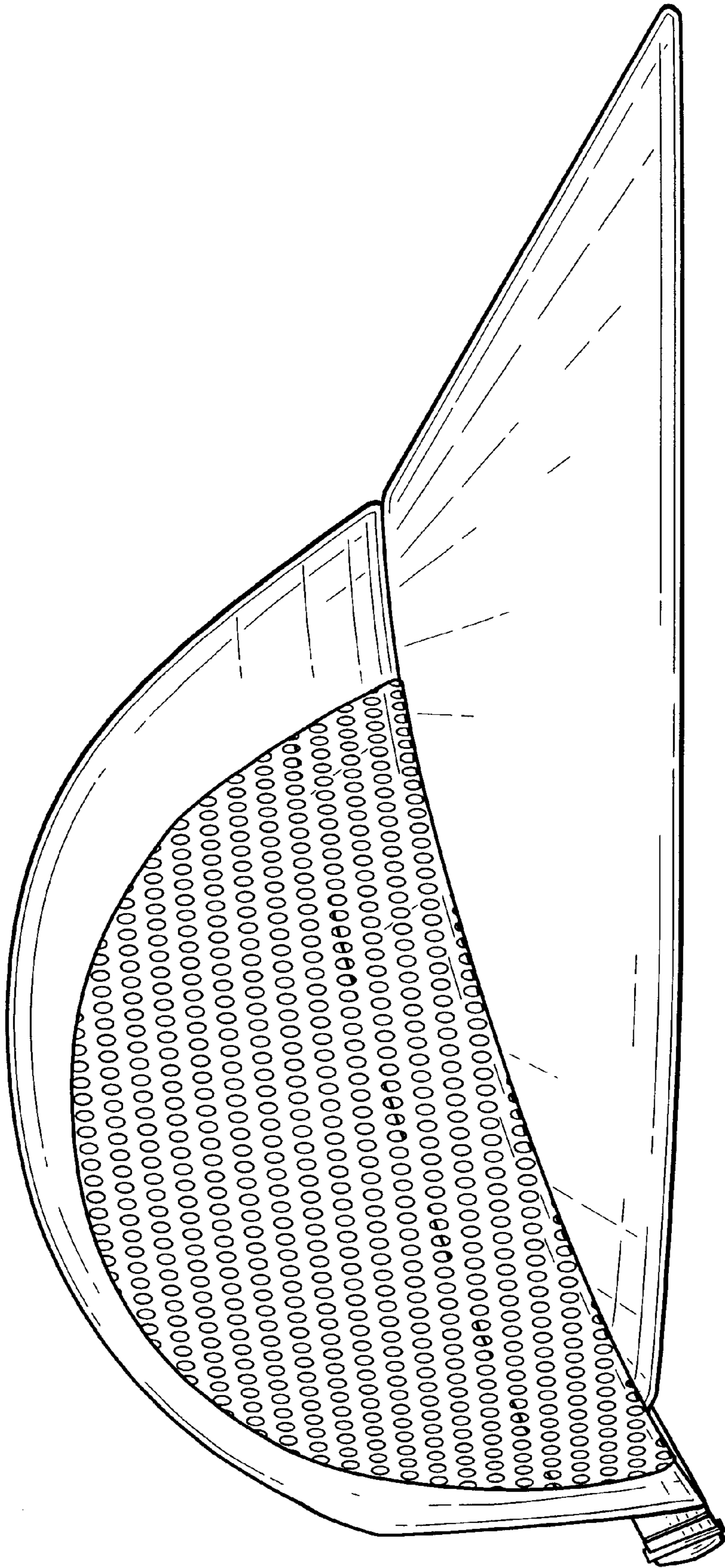

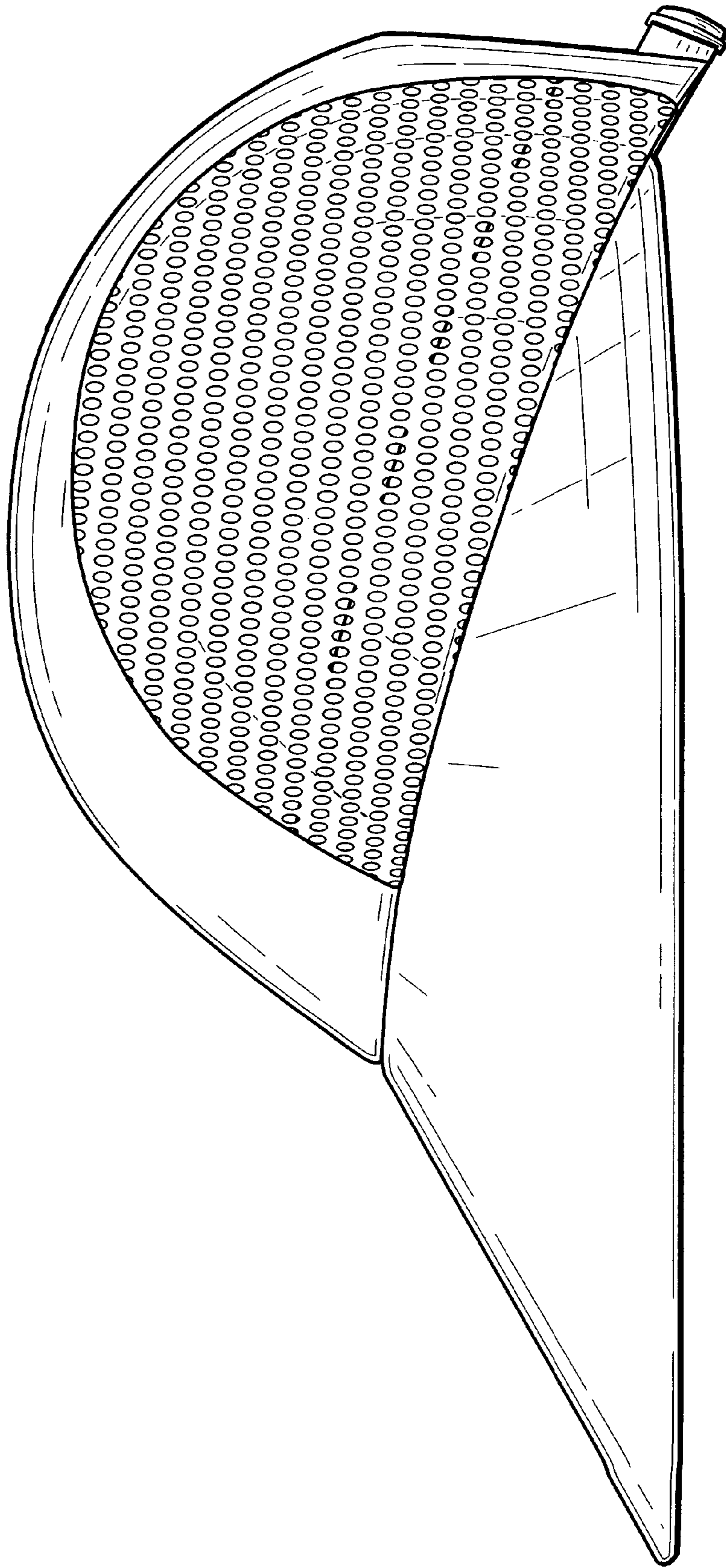

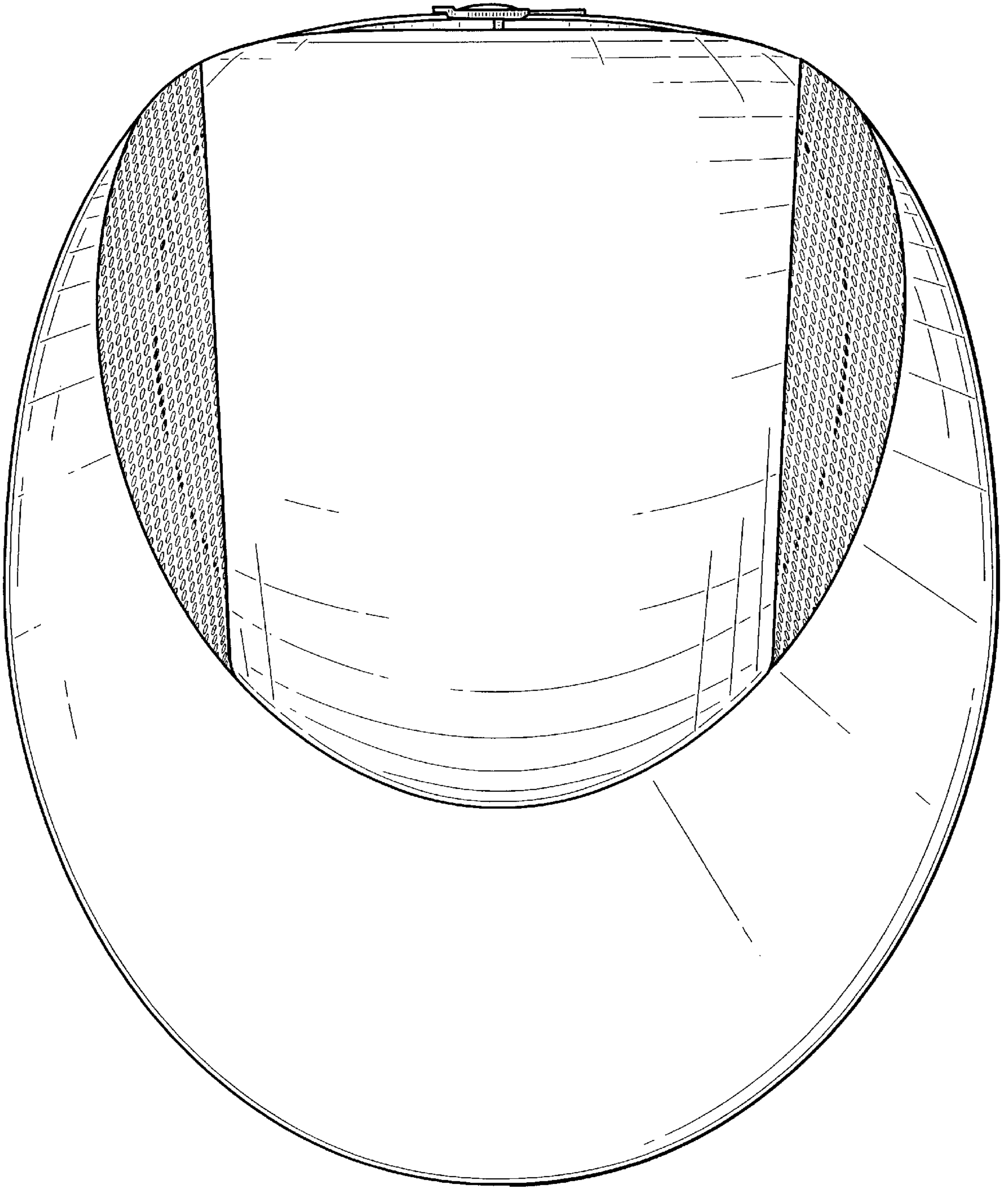
