The ornamental design for a vehicle mirror with housing, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front view of a vehicle mirror with housing according to my novel design;

FIG. 5 is a top view of a vehicle mirror with housing according to my novel design;


FIG. 6 is a bottom view of a vehicle mirror with housing according to my novel design;





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









