[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a protective apron with a mesh back, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is an environmental front perspective view of a first embodiment of a protective apron with a mesh back showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view of a second embodiment of a protective apron with a mesh back showing my new design;

FIG. 7 is a right side elevational view thereof;

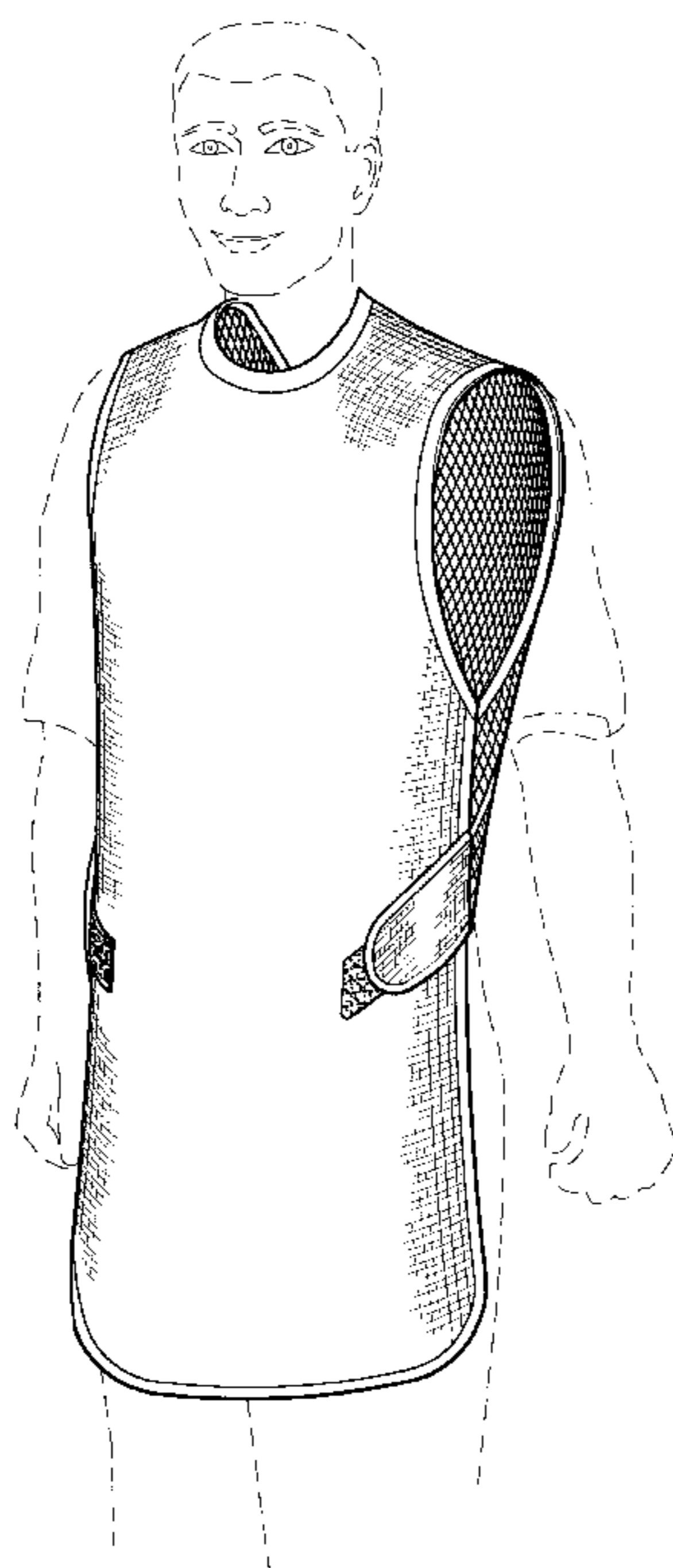
FIG. 8 is a left side elevational view thereof; and,

FIG. 9 is a rear elevational view thereof.

The broken line showing of the human figure in FIG. 1 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.

The fragmentary cris-cross pattern shown in the drawing is understood to represent fabric and is repeated uniformly throughout the front areas of the protective apron with a mesh back.

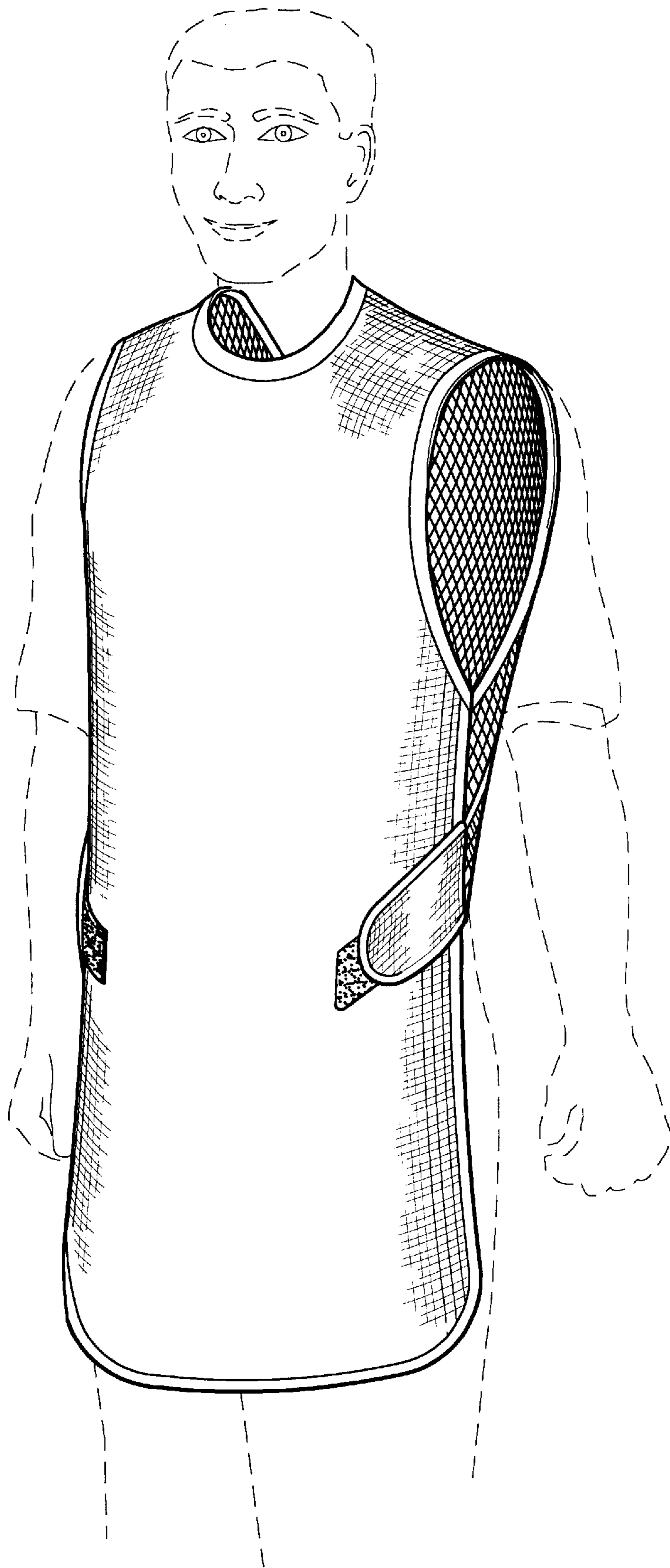

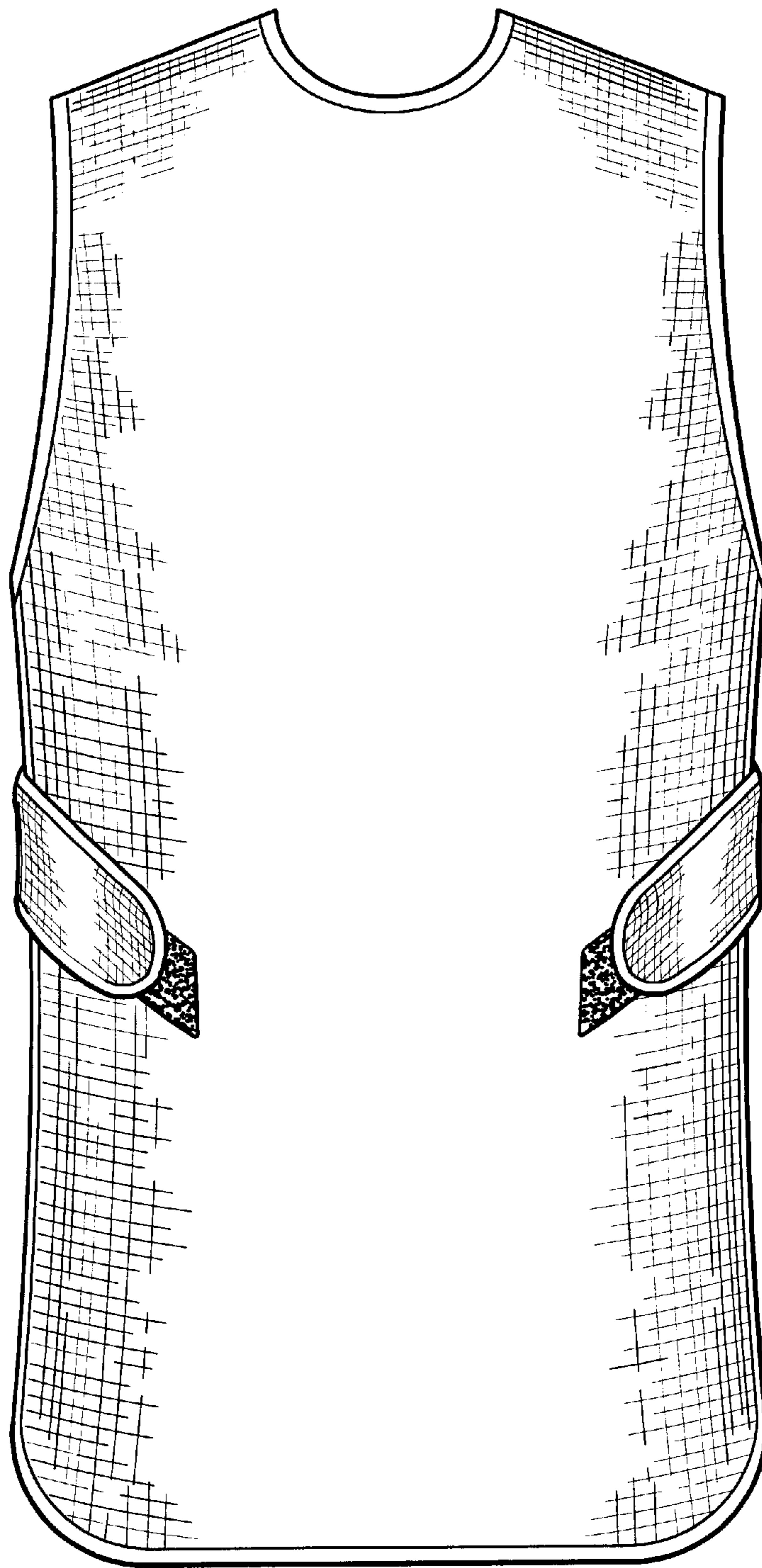

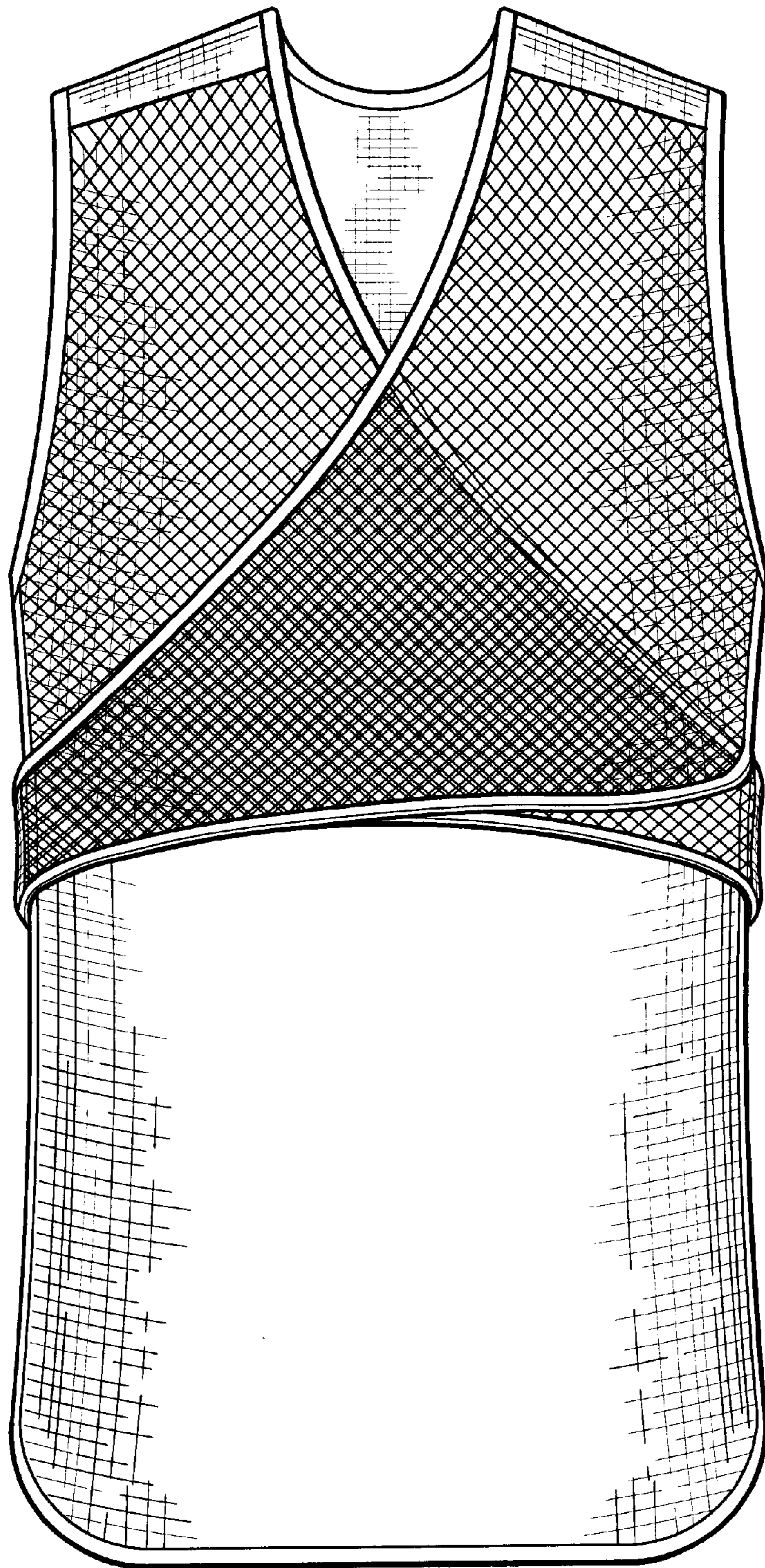

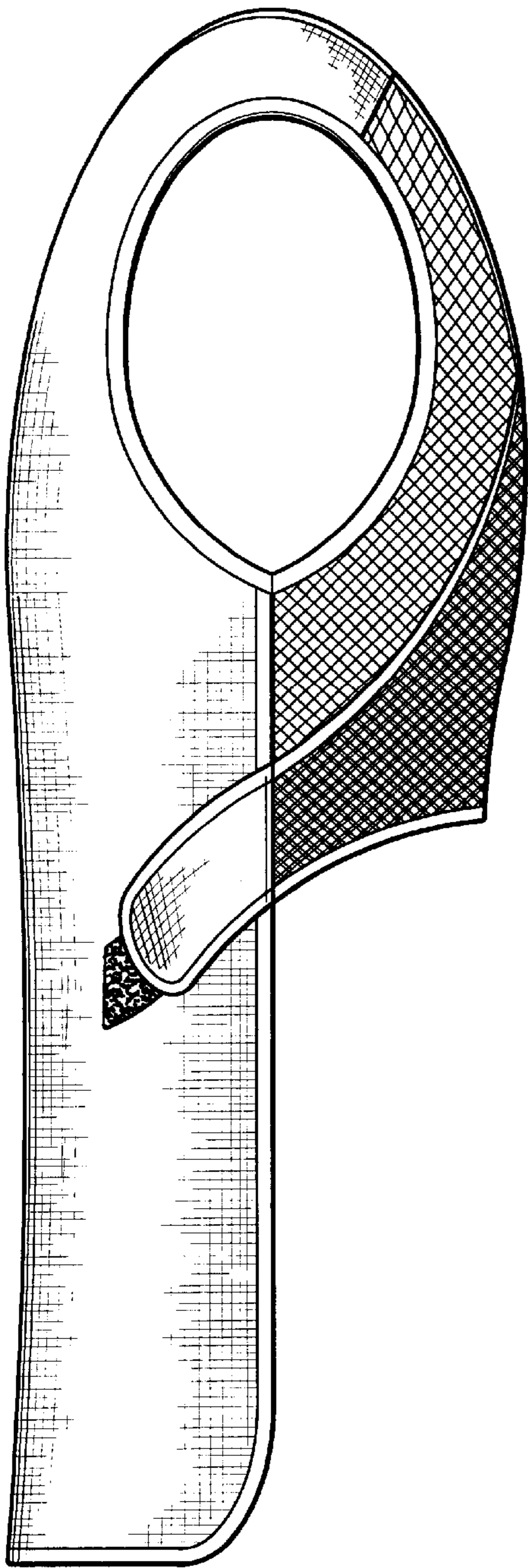

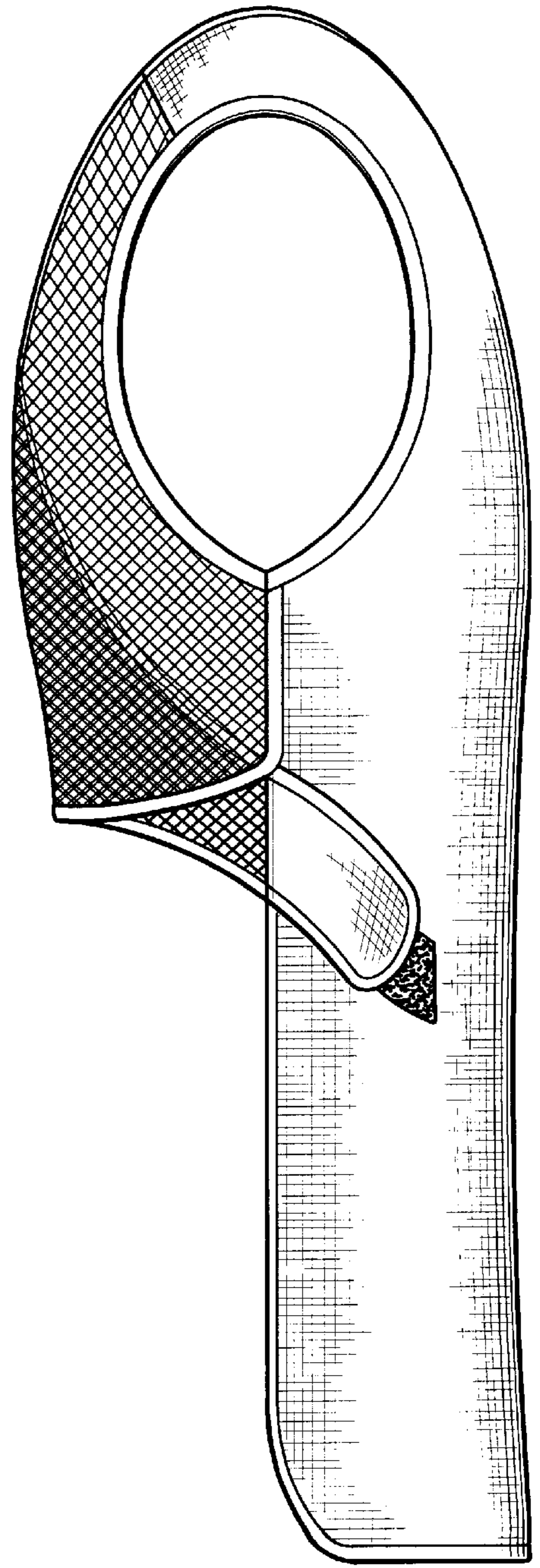

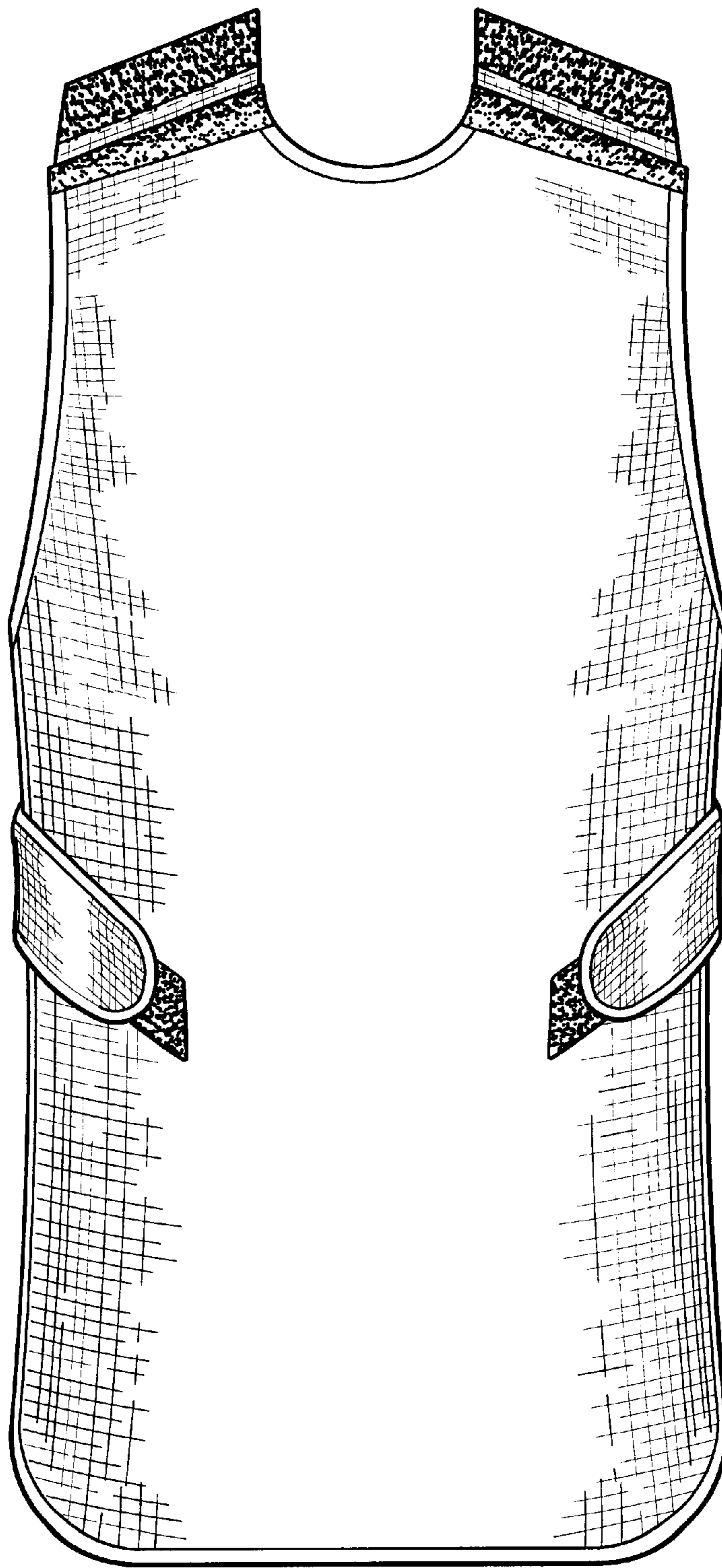

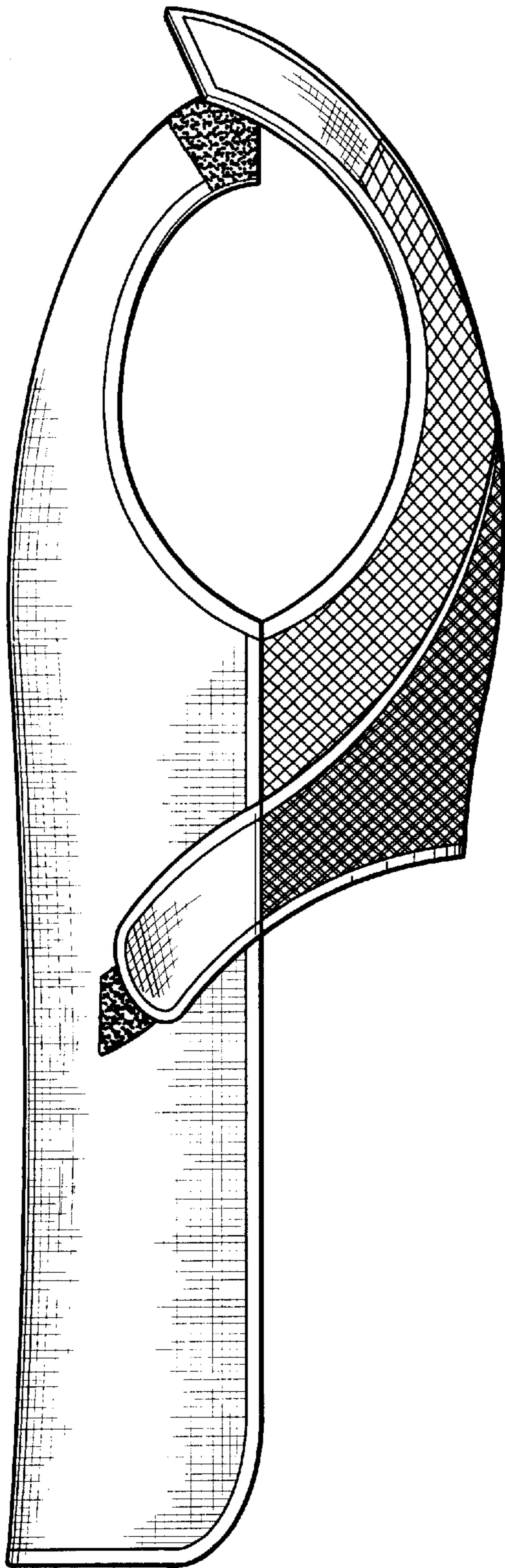

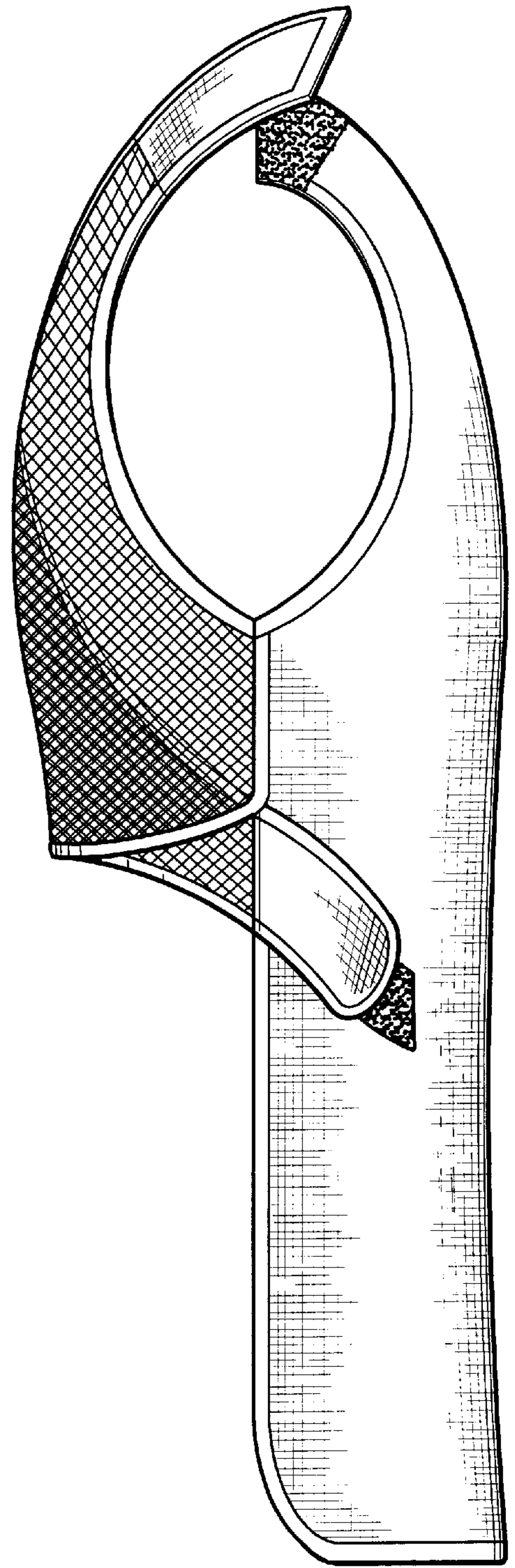

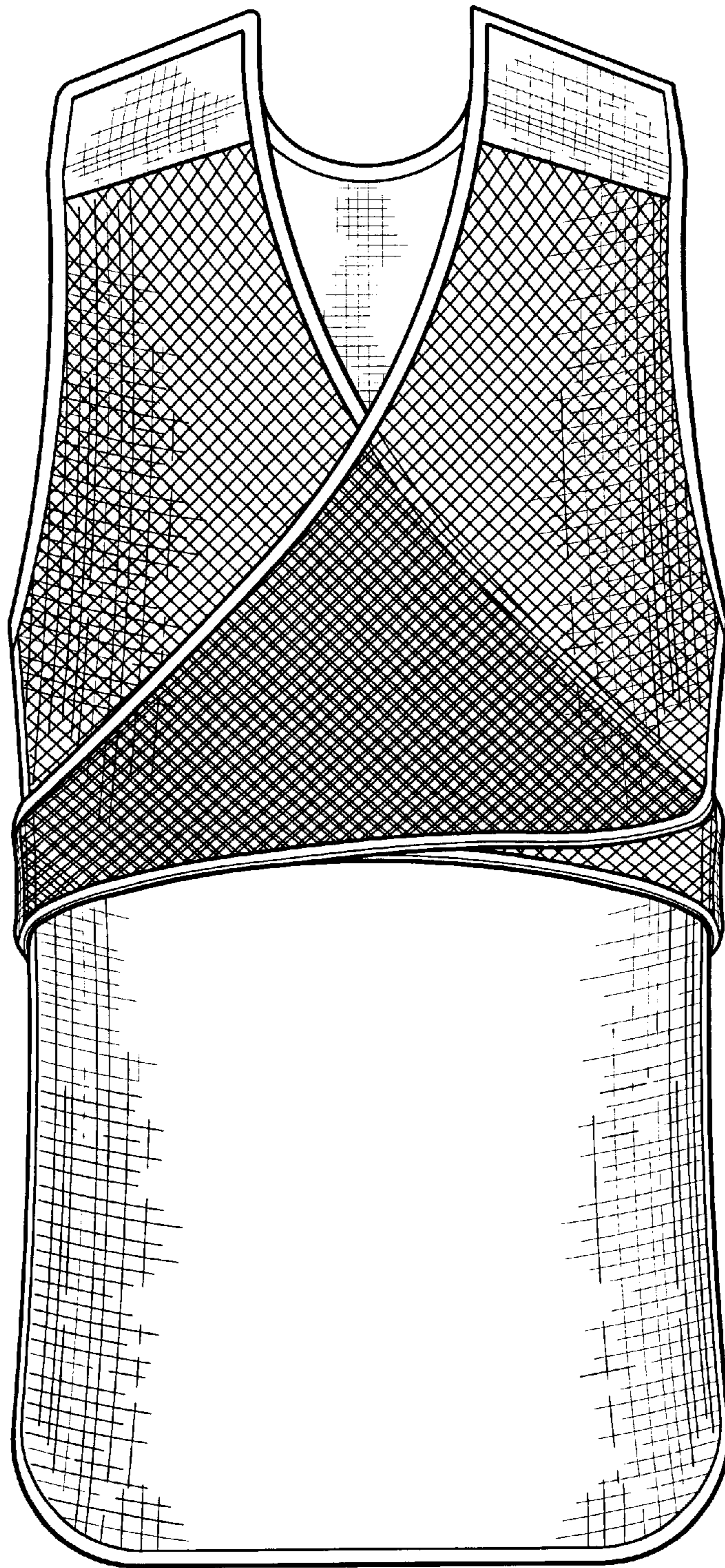
