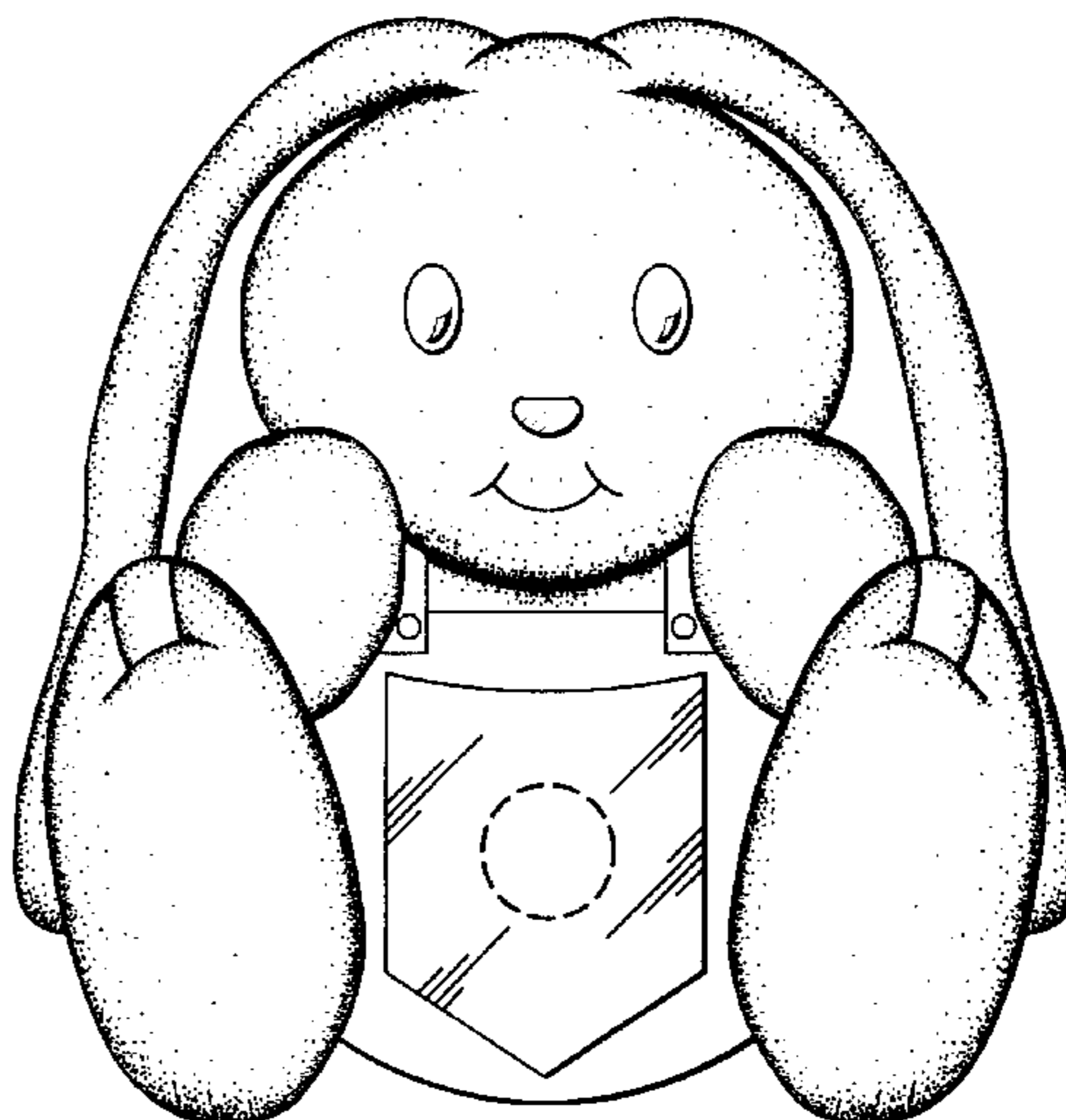
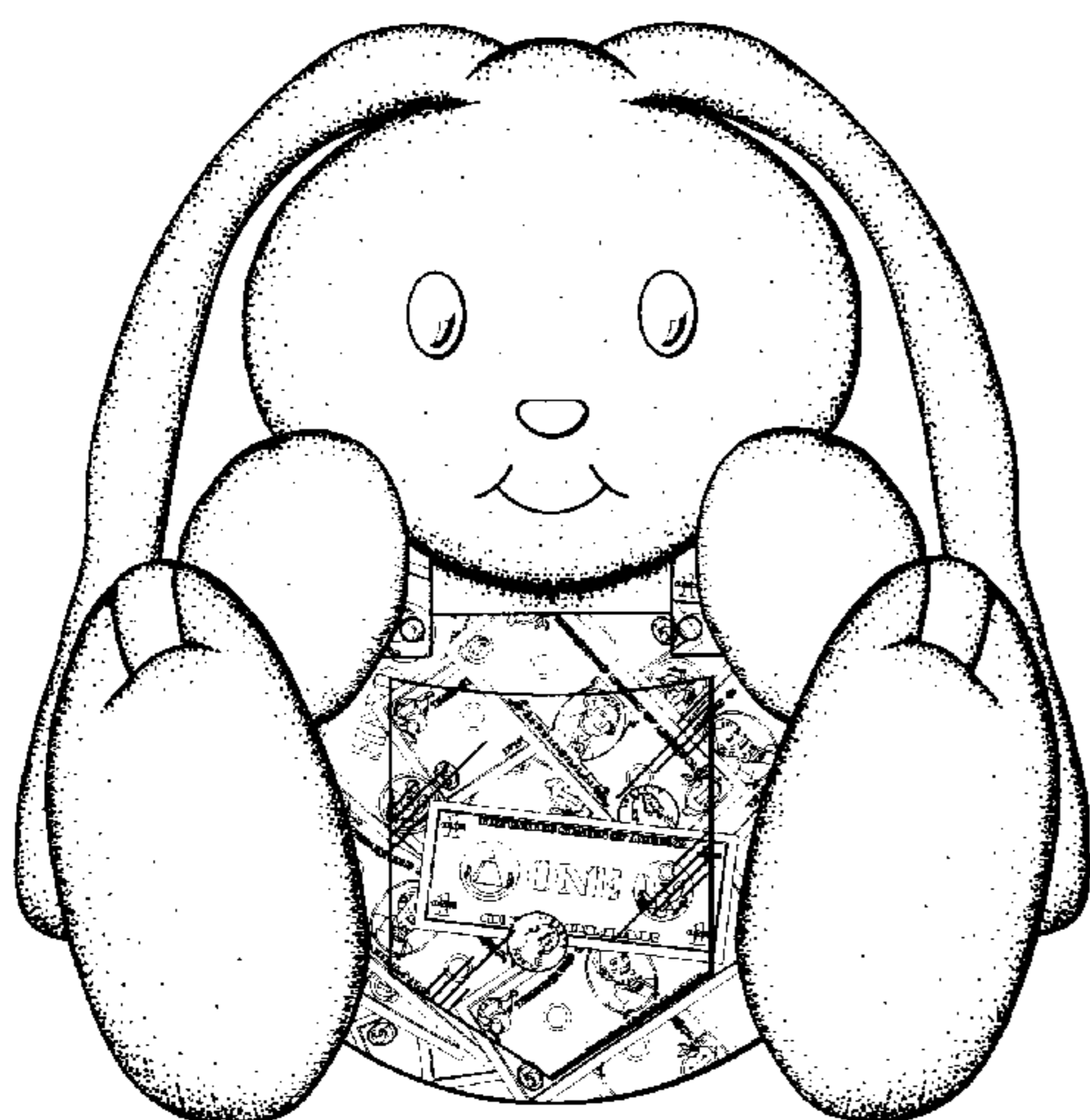

### DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a first embodiment of a combination plush toy and money display, showing my new design;  
FIG. 2 is a rear elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 5 is a top plan view thereof;  
FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof;  
FIG. 7 is a front elevational view of a second embodiment of the combination plush toy and money display;  
FIG. 8 is a rear elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 9 is a right side elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 10 is a left side elevational view thereof;  
FIG. 11 is a top plan view thereof;  
FIG. 12 is a bottom plan view thereof;  
FIG. 13 is a front elevational view of the embodiment shown in claim 1, with a broken line showing of a coin displayed in a display pocket;  
FIG. 14 is a front elevational view of the embodiment shown in claim 7, with a broken line showing of a coin displayed in a display pocket; and,  
FIG. 15 is a rear elevational view thereof.

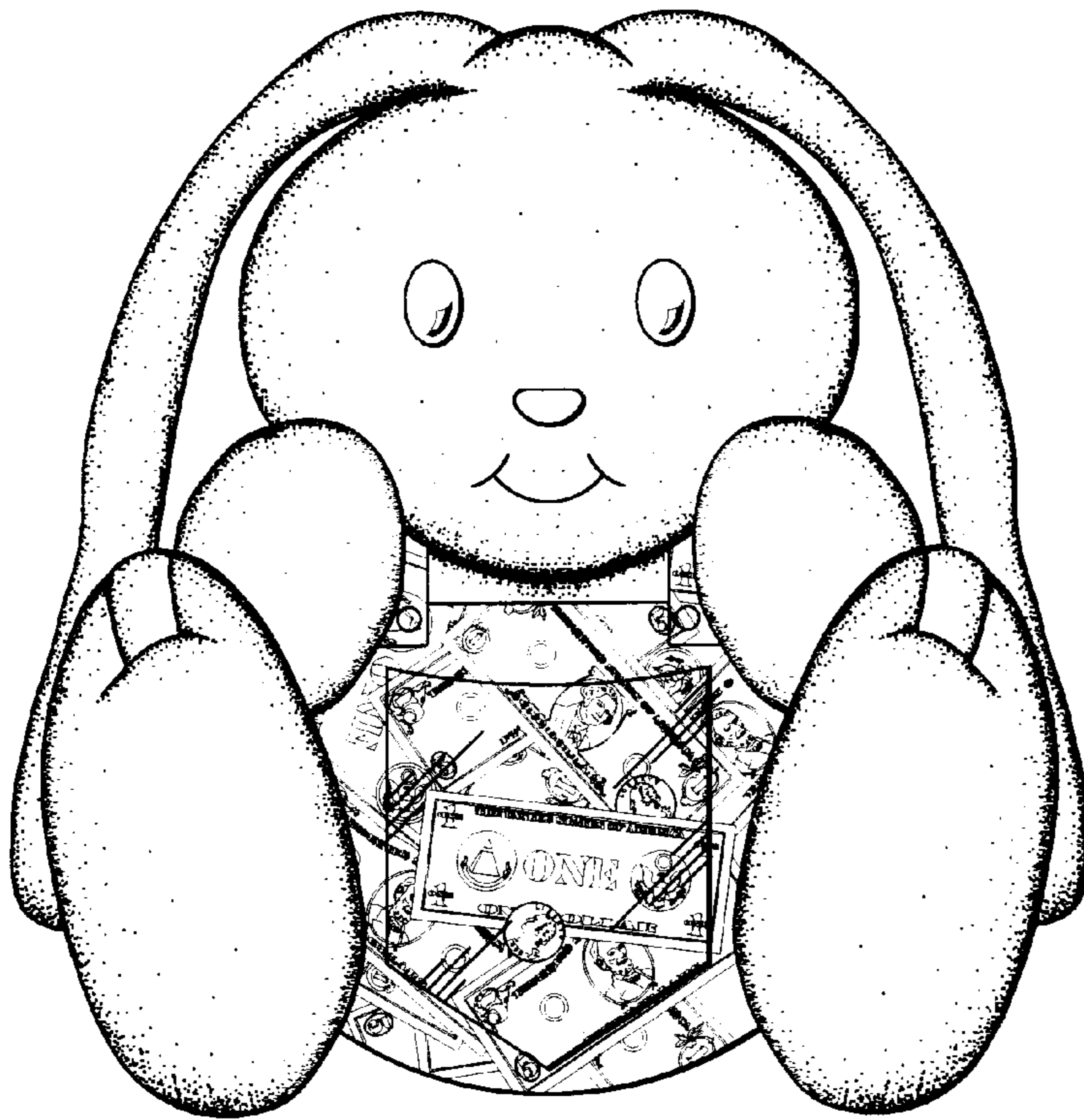

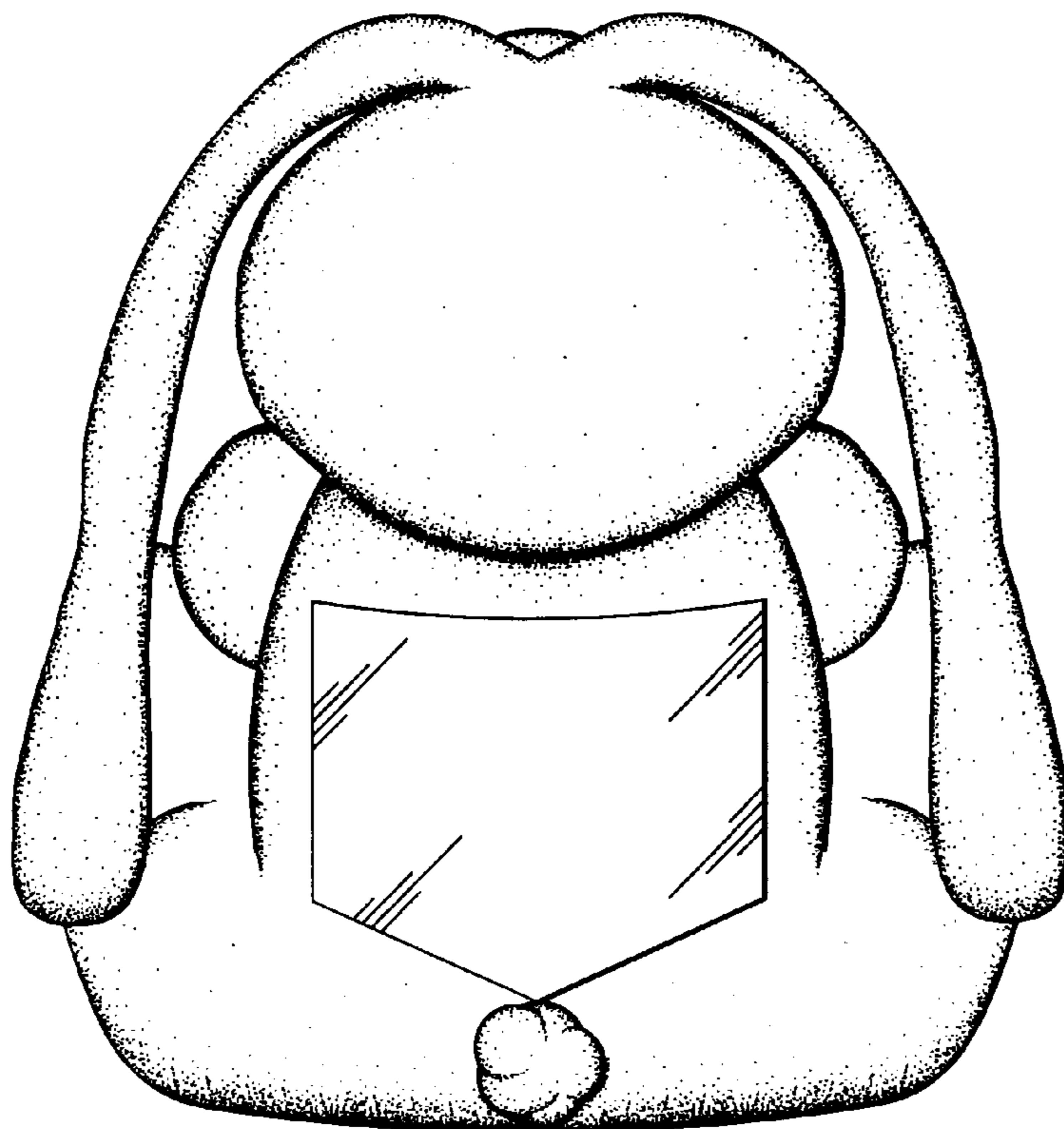

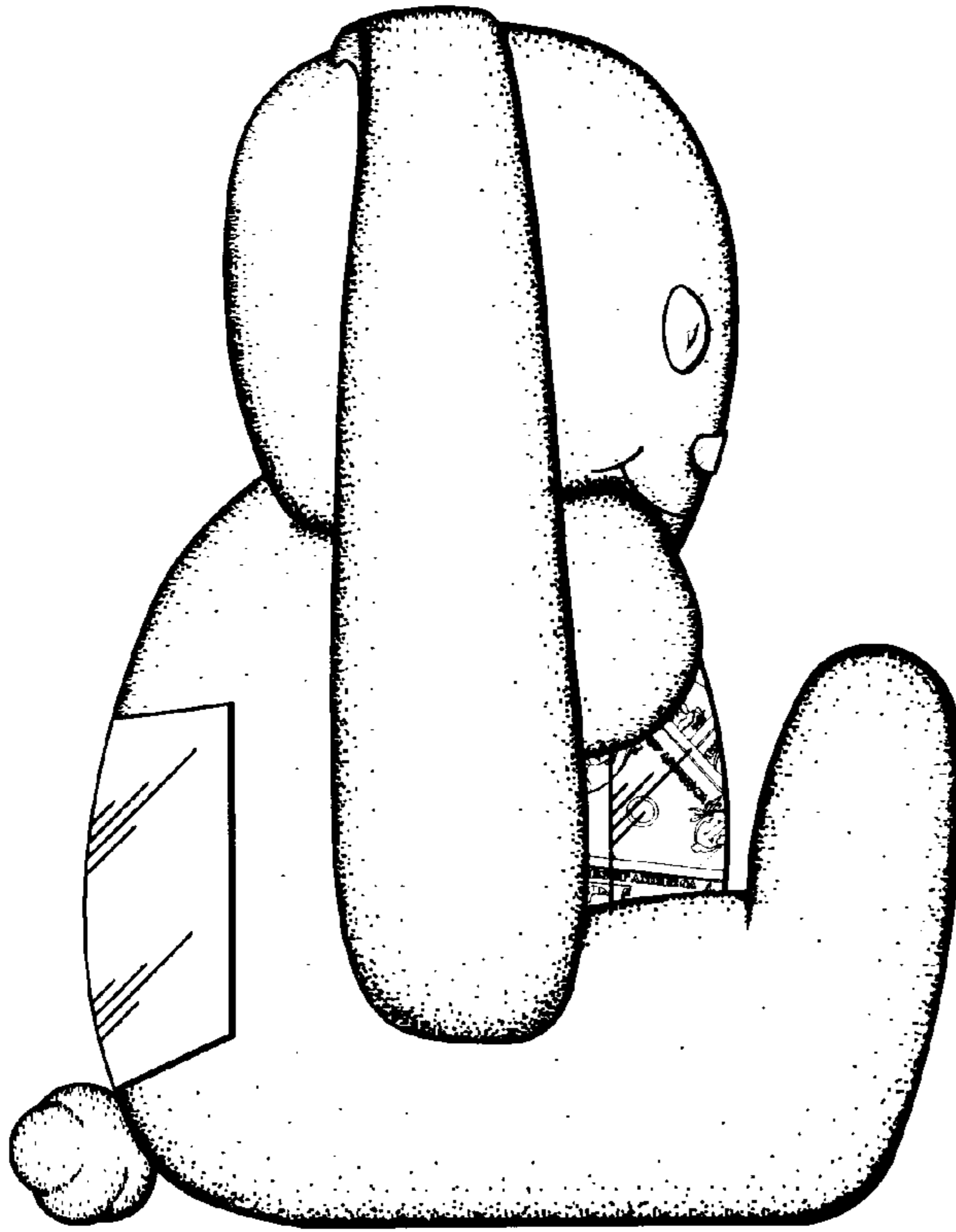

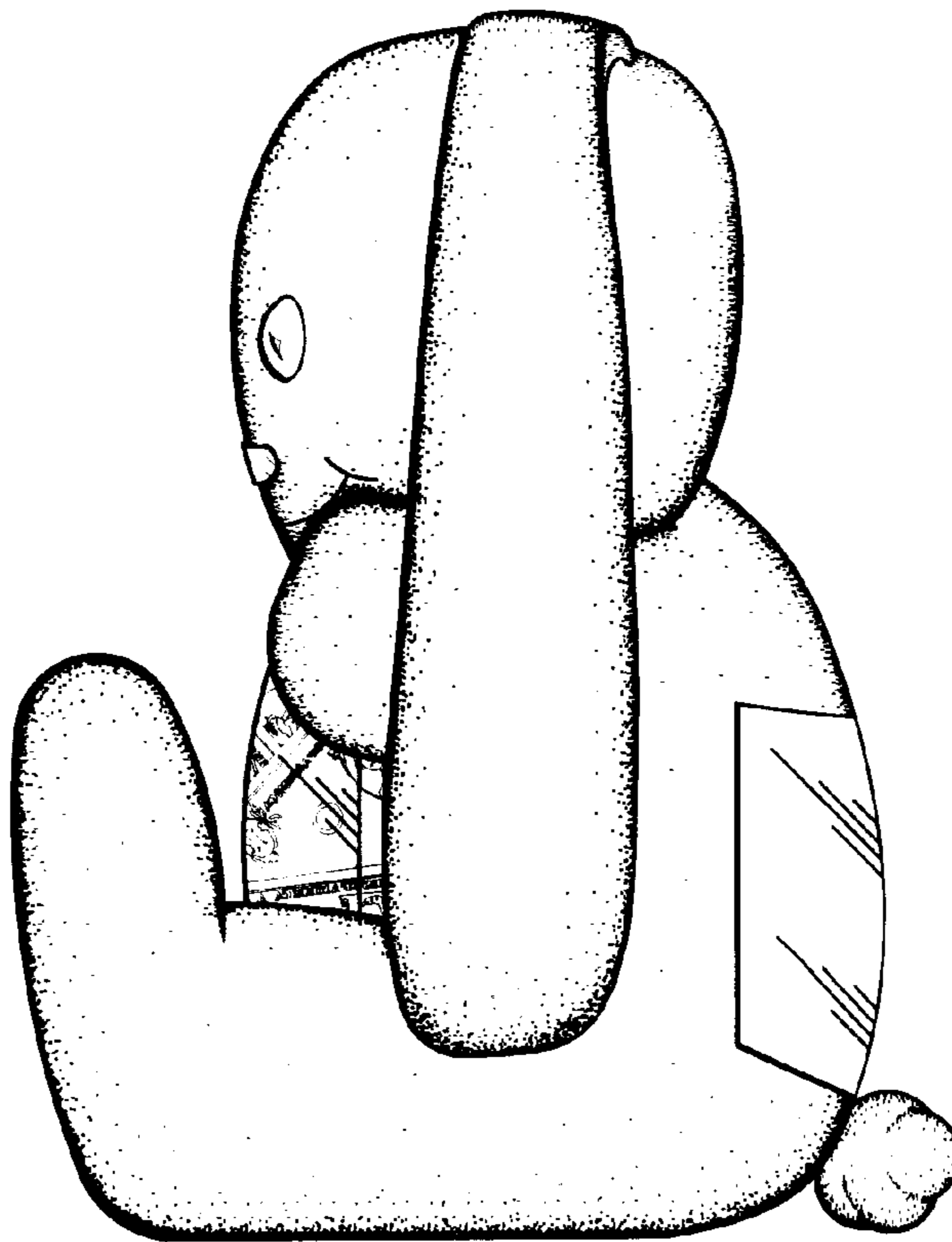

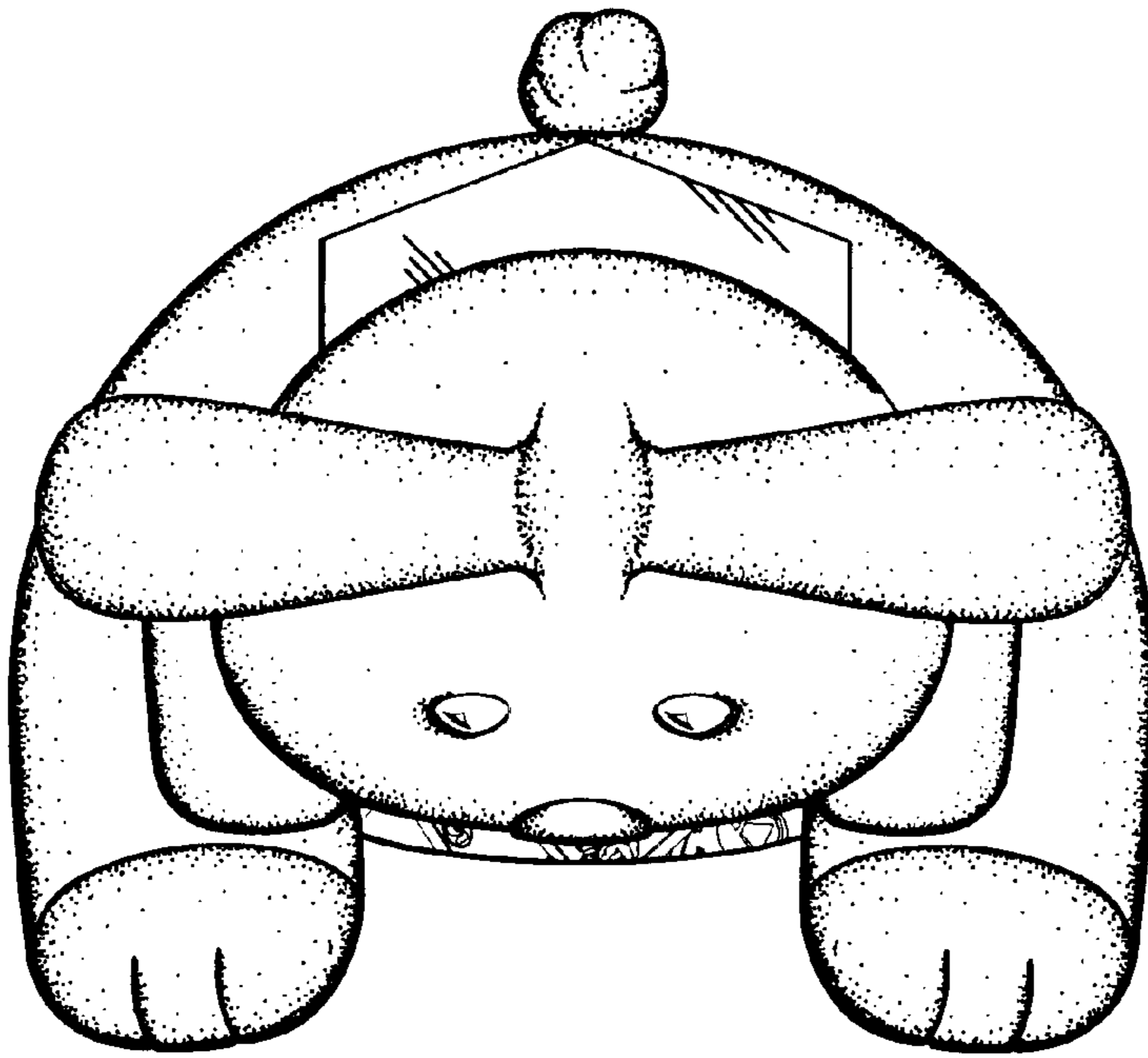

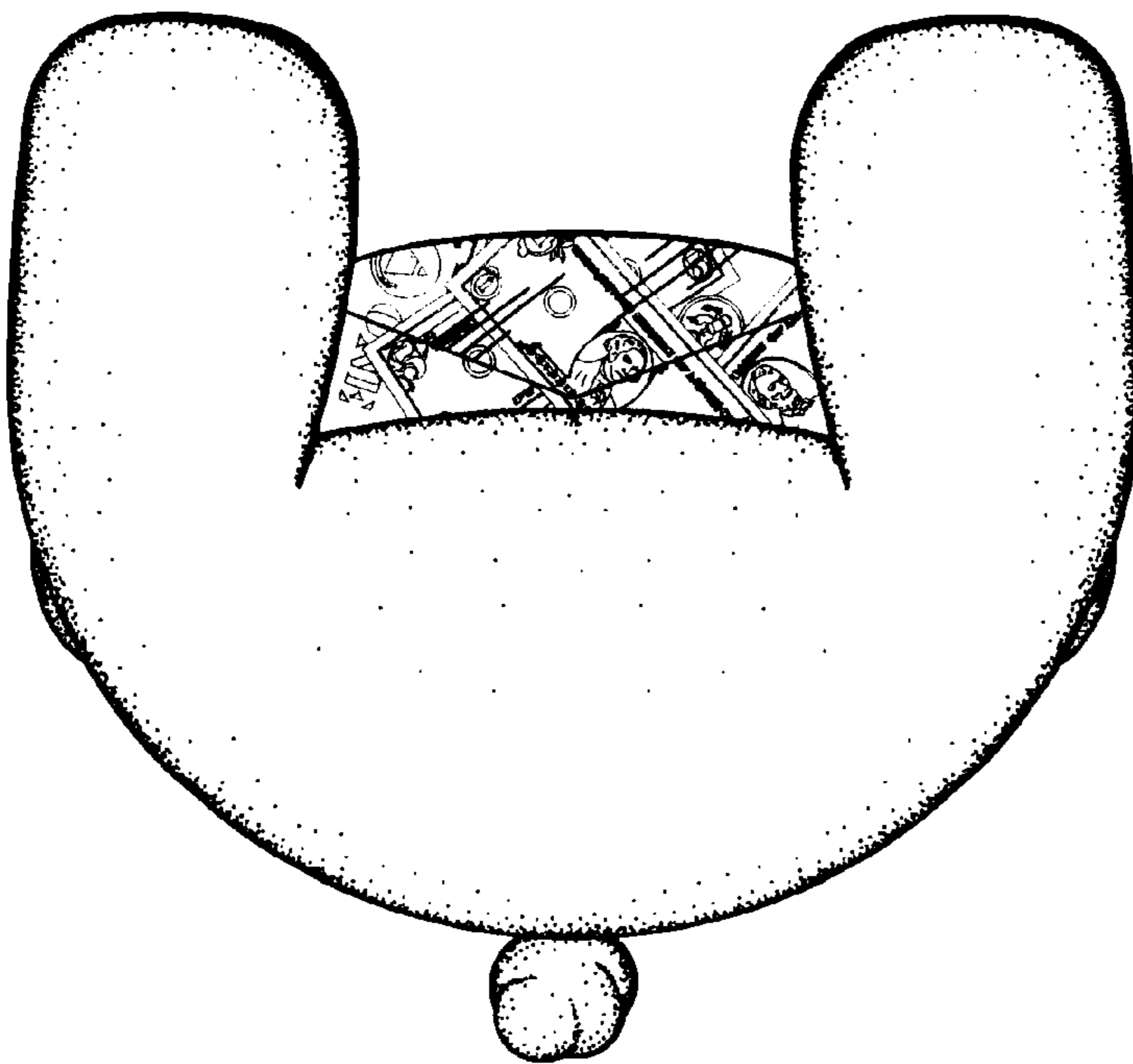

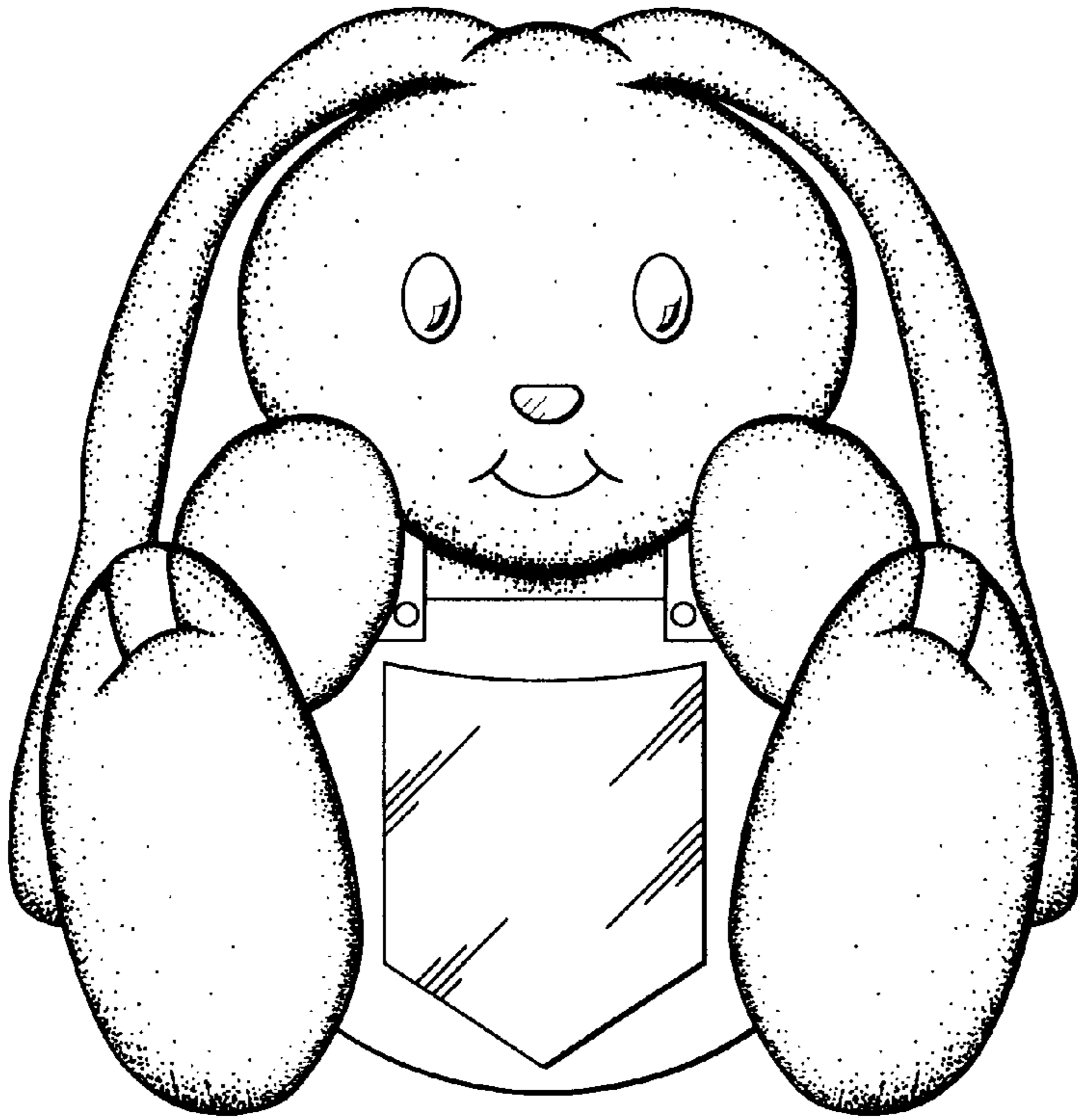

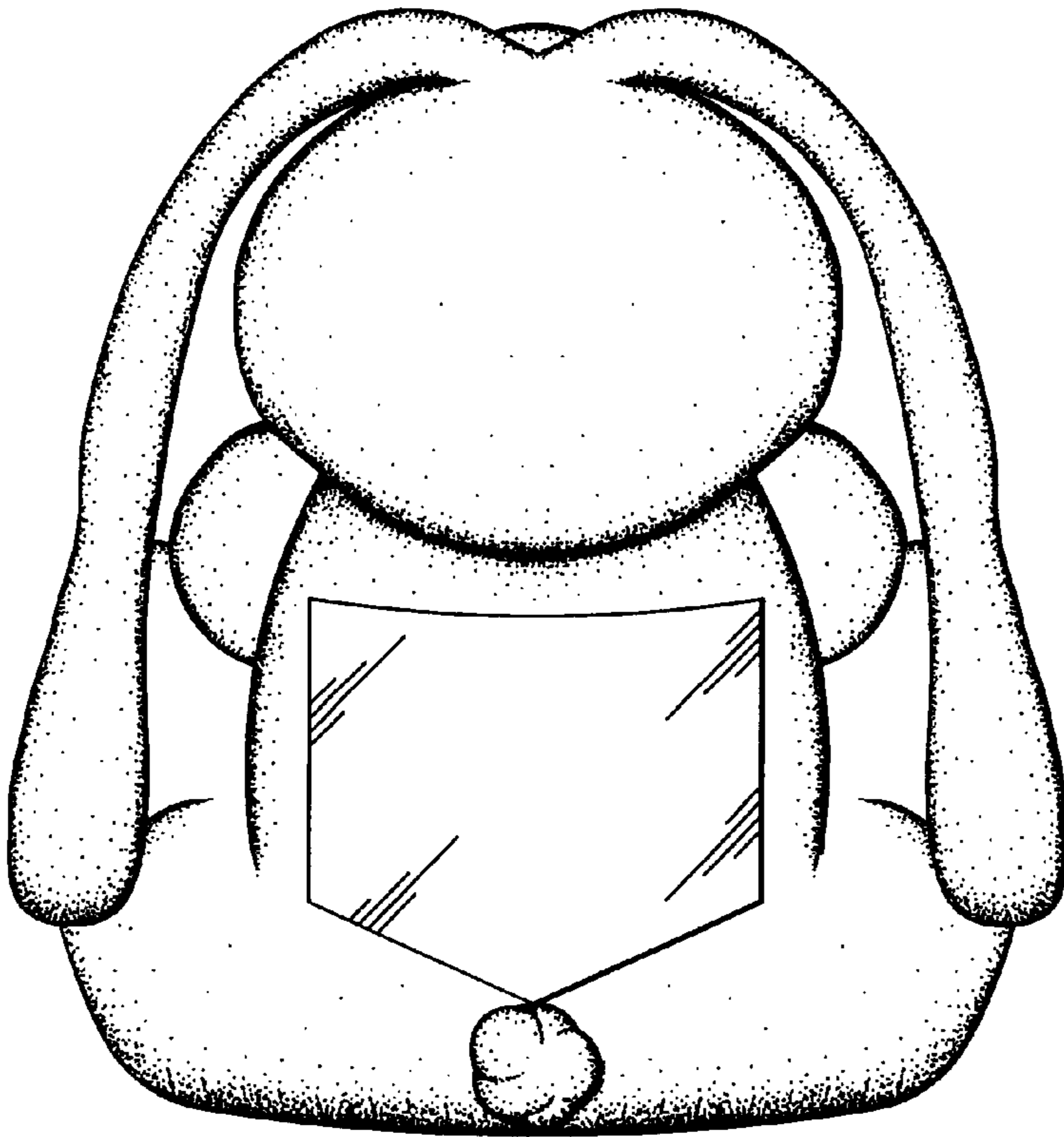

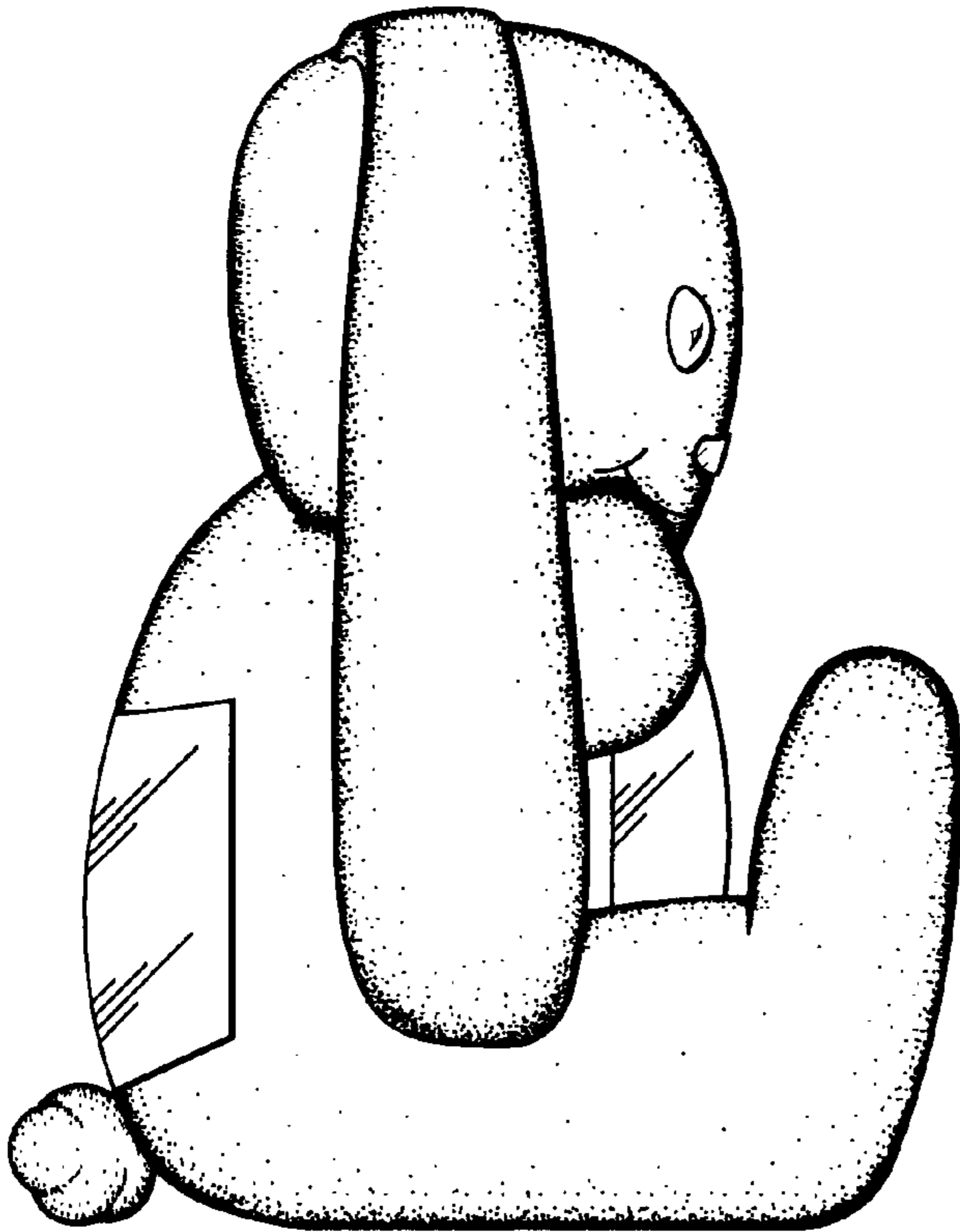

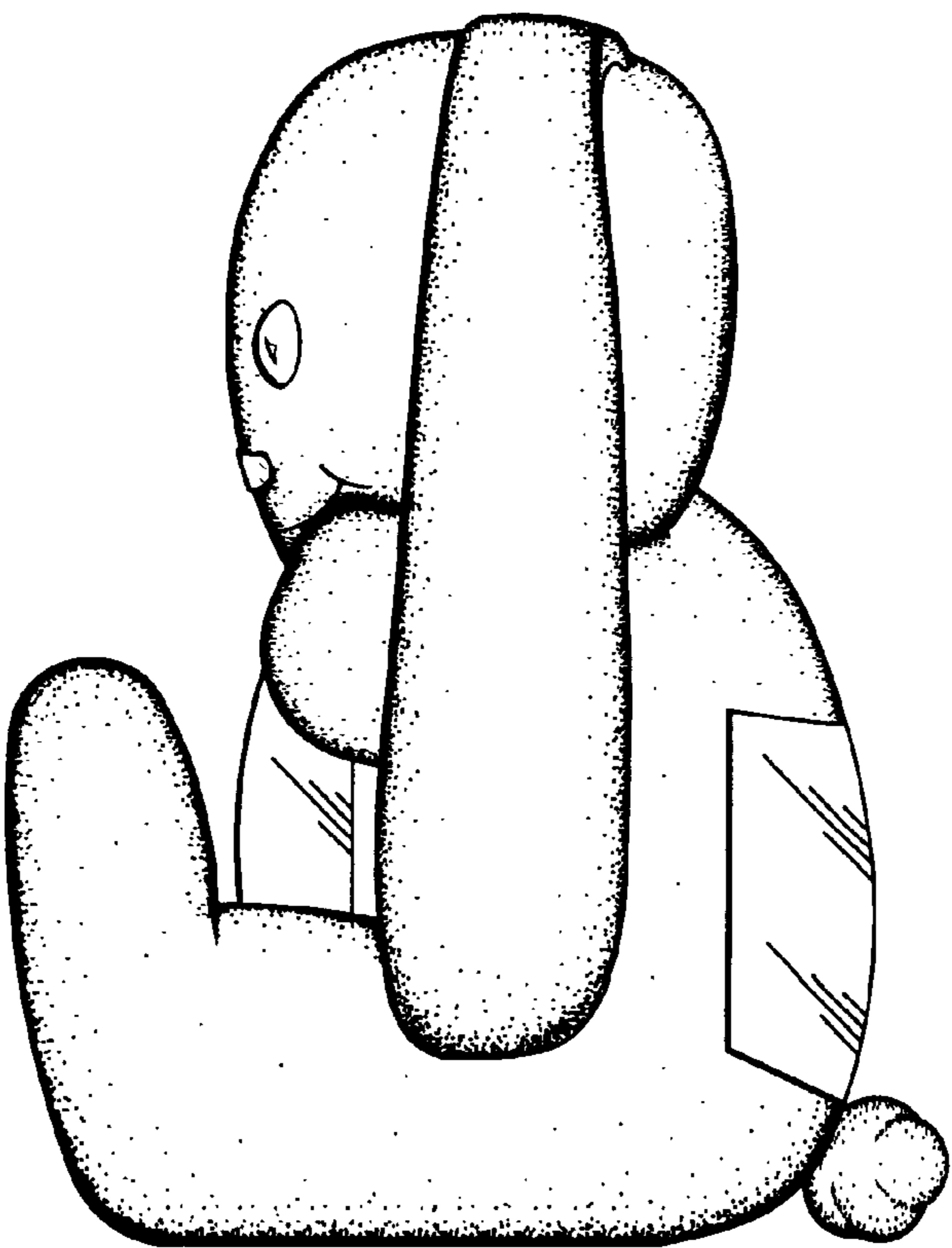

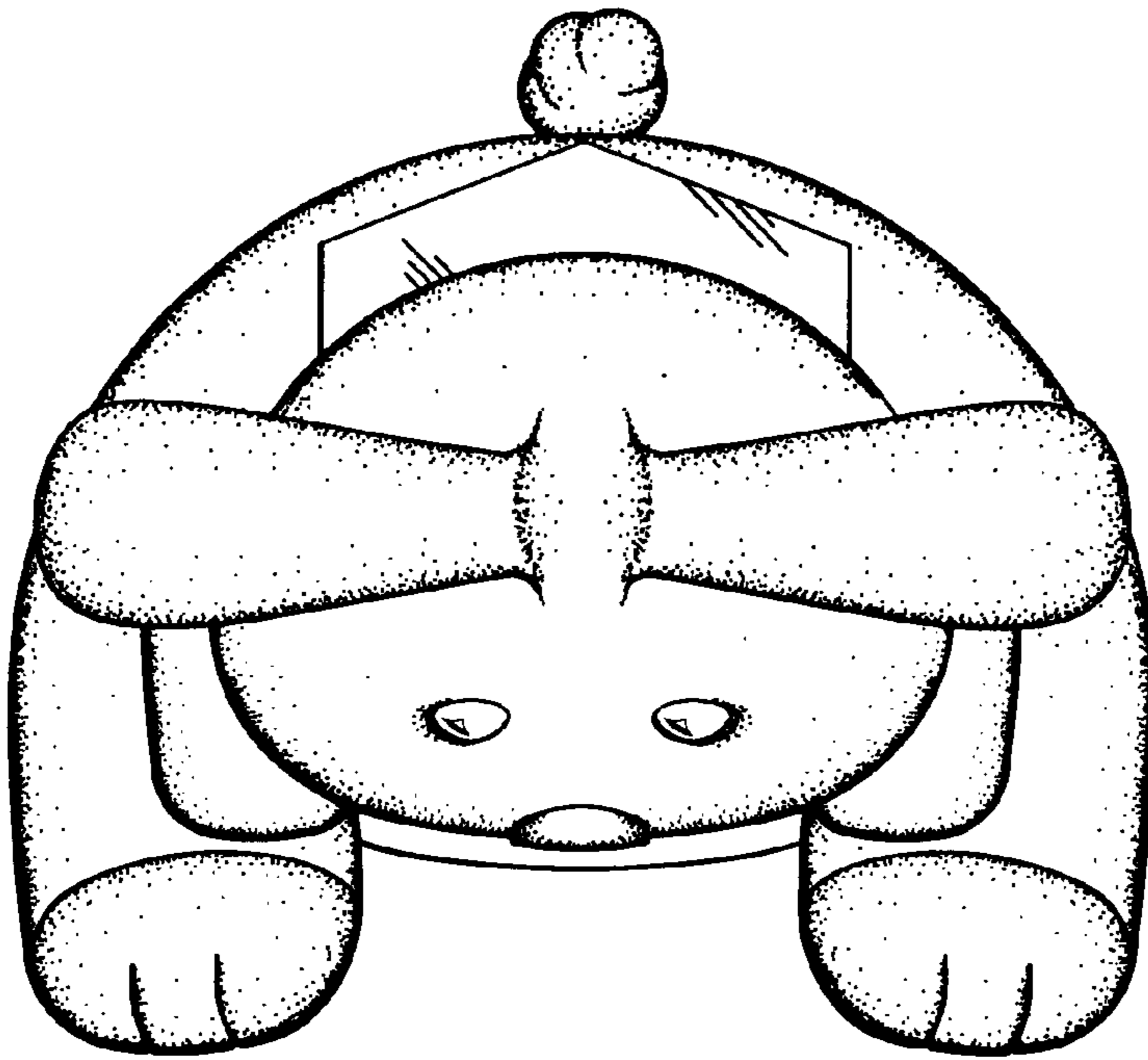

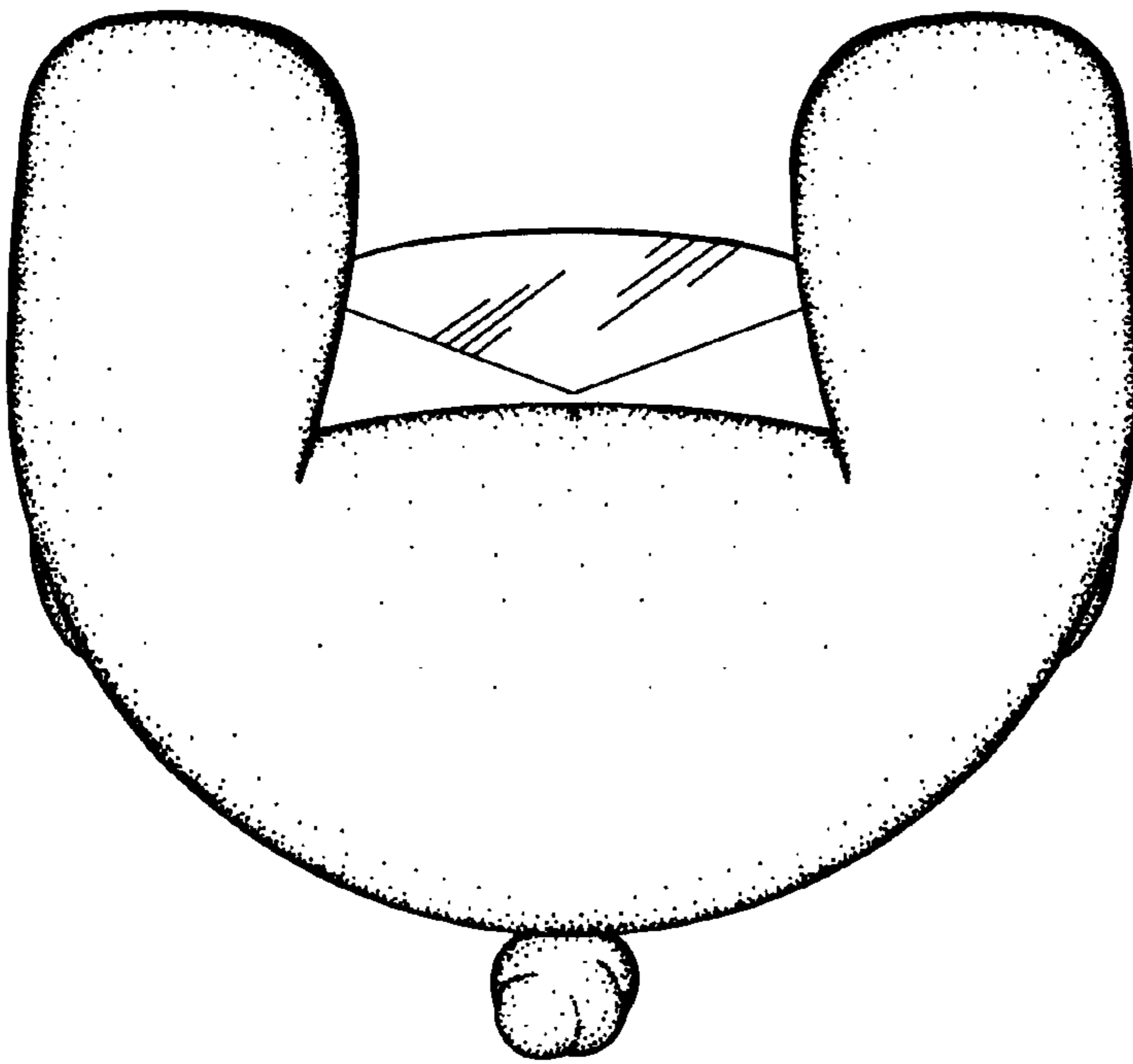

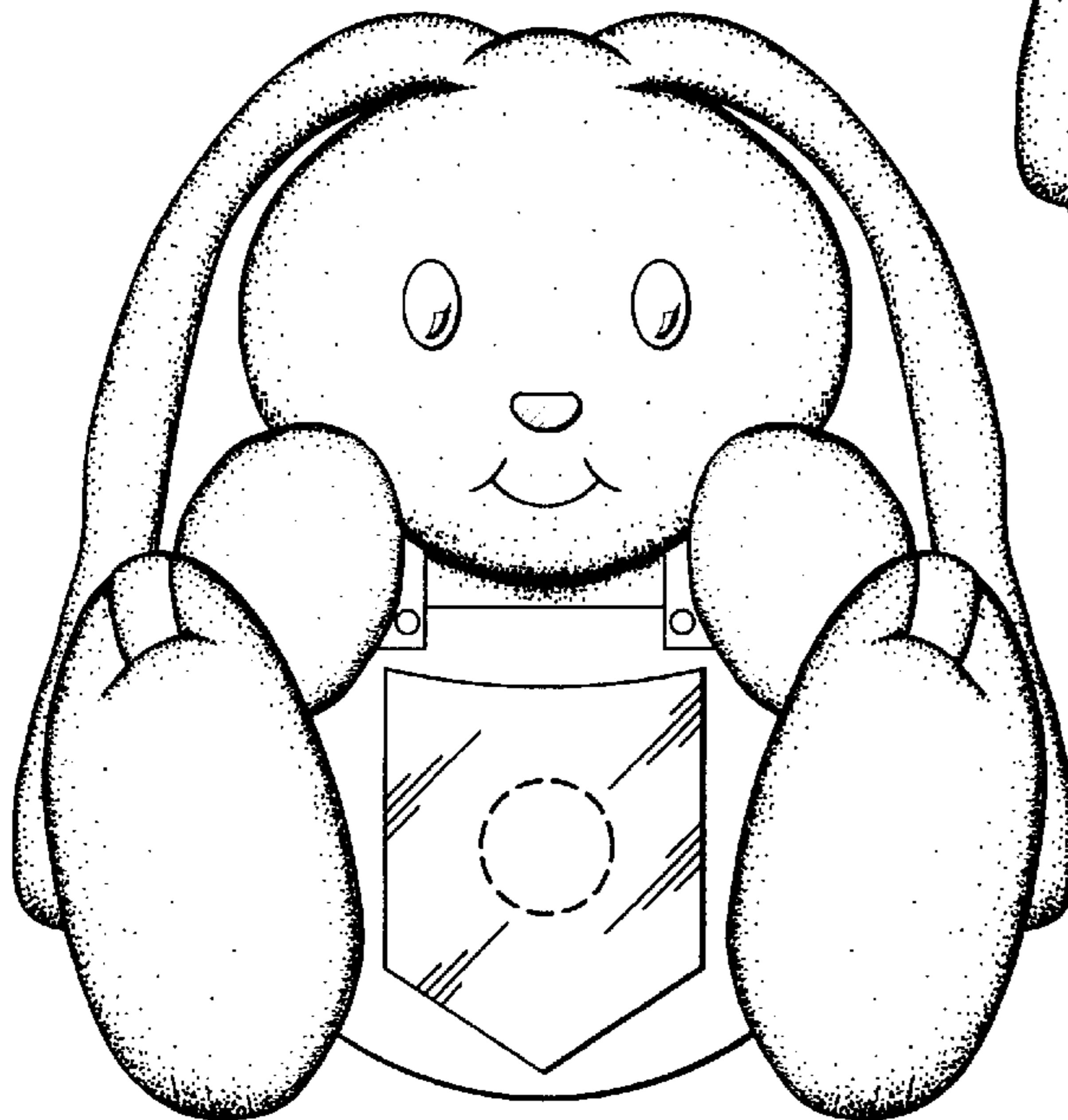
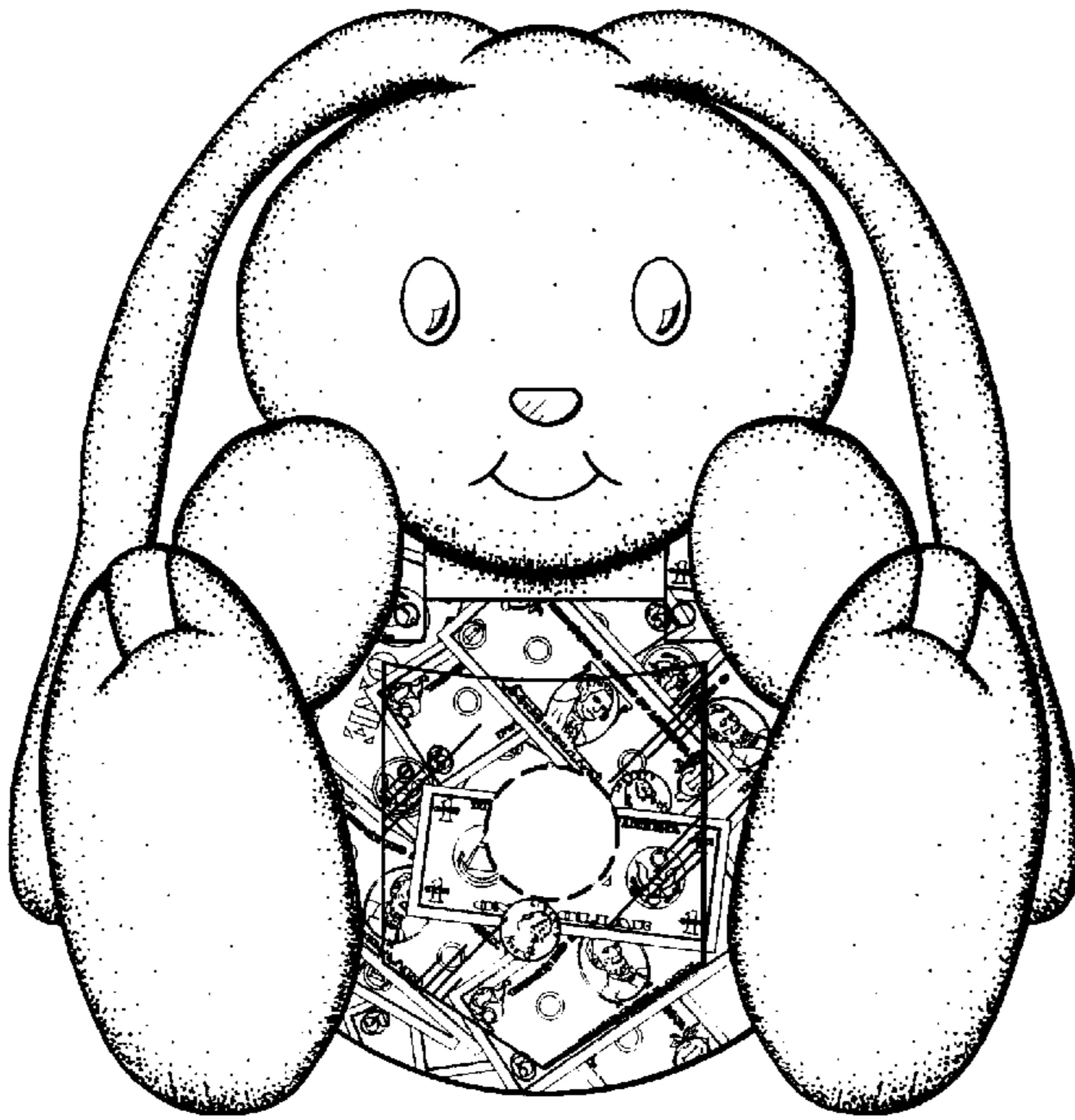

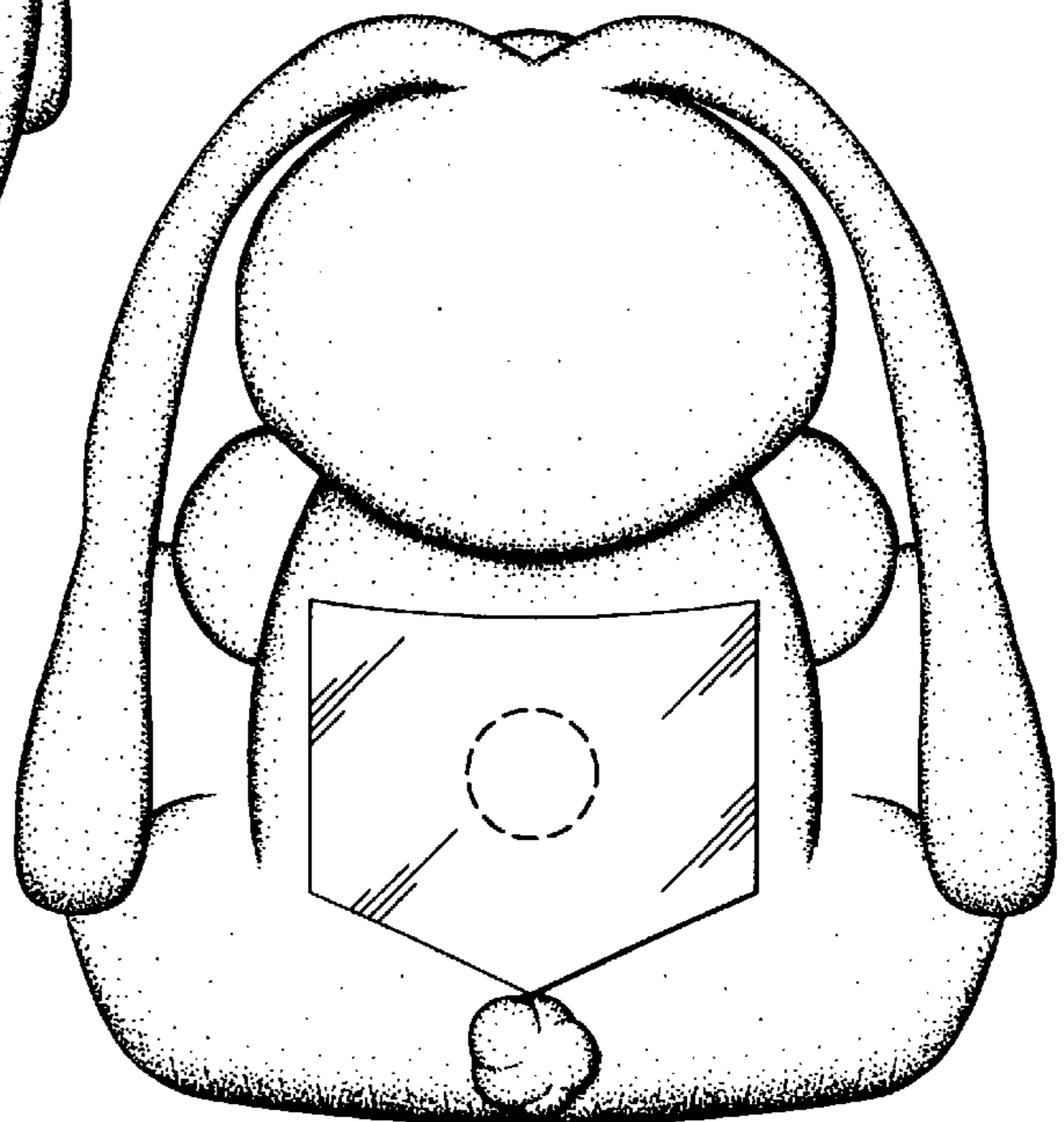
